

"The Medium is the message," Perhaps Marshall McLuhan overstates it; but the Medium sure has a powerful effect on the *quality* of any message. FM gives three times the sound spectrum of AM; and, as Ben Bauer, the learned psychoacoustician points out in this issue of FM Guide (See "Men of HiFi"), FM stereo provides twice as much information to the listener as ordinary FM.

Many of our cultural elitists, as Jack Gould, have wrung their hands over the advent of now hearing the diversity of FM programming - this can now mean rock 'n' roll, the "young sound" and jazz on FM and in stereo.

Listen to Mr. Gould in a recent piece in the NEW YORK TIMES:

"In cities of over 100,000 population and particularly in an area with 90 stations, the need for greater diversity would not seem inordinately pressing. The conversion of FM station to rock 'n' roll and "young sounds" already on AM seems dubious progress."

The Many Voices of FM

The editors of FM Guide disagree: even rock 'n' roll which may not be our personal taste sounds better on FM and FM stereo - and jazz, of course, sounds even better on FM stereo.

The jazz fan is not somebody to be ignored. As a recent study shows, "Jazz fans are far above the national average in income and education, and the bulk of them are in the 21-to-45 year old bracket."

A demographic study of jazz buffs in the New York City area shows that close to 95 per cent own FM radios, and more than 85 per cent do more listening to FM than to AM.

An Editorial Essay or Counselors for Jazz Interactions, an organization whose members include jazz musicians, critics and recording executives. The study was financed by Harry Novik, president of WLIB AM-FM, New York. WLIB FM programs jazz from noon until 11 p.m. seven days a week.

> A total of 2,664 guestionnaires were sent to jazz fans in New York with 1,234 responses – a response rate of 49.9 per cent. Ethnically, 79.2 per cent of the responses were from predominantly white neighborhoods and 20.8 per cent from those in non-white communities - or roughly paralleling the city's population pattern.

> A little over 45 per cent of the responding jazz fans earn more than \$100 a week which compares with a national average of 11.8 per cent. Another 16 per cent-plus of the jazz



fans earn \$200 a week against a national average of 7.9 per cent.

In education, close to 90 per cent of the jazz fans had graduated from high school (against the national average of 28.3 per cent) and 36.9 per cent were college graduates (against the 8.9 per cent national average) and close to 50 per cent of the respondents were married.

FM stereo is the superior medium and improves any musical message. This is why so many new listeners are turning to FM and FM stereo.

The Editors of FM Guide think it is a shame that no major foundation has yet made a grant to improve the popular music culture of our time. Very few of our 'Pooh-Bahs' have recognized the great contribution a Duke Ellington, for example, has made to our culture. To do our bit to redress this imbalance we are proud to run a profile of Duke Ellington by the distinguished writer, Ralph J. Gleason and equally pleased to present this month's station profile - WOR FM, THE station for up-to-the-minute music in FM stereo.



PROFILE OF A STATION: WOR-FM

Almost a year ago, Robert S. Smith, the vice president and general manager of WOR AM and FM, the RKO General flagship stations, made a decision that soon became the talk of the broadcasting industry in the New York Market.

Smith, a taciturn, conservative man, was confronted with a Federal directive that required him to split the programming of the two stations. For many years WOR-FM had been duplicating the programs carried by the AM station and consisting largely of discussion programs and news in depth.

His colleagues at WOR were surprised when the word was passed that Smith had reached a decision-WOR-FM would turn to up-to-the-minute music. It would be reproduced stereophonically by the best equipment available.

There was skepticism about the move in some quarters. For WOR, long a pillar of respectability in broadcasting, the move to rock 'n'roll, folk music and other contemporary sound was a drastic one, indeed.

Smith, however, showed that having made his decision, he was not going to mark time. He issued orders that the new format for FM would begin on July 30, 1966, five months before the deadline set by the Federal Communications Commission for the split.

He reached out to the Far West to recall to WOR Burt Lambert, formerly one of the great salesmen in the New York market. Lambert had left his post as TV sales chief at WOR a couple of years earlier to become a top TV and radio executive in Las Vegas. Smith persuaded him to rejoin the WOR family as manager of the FM station.

For his program director, Smith had only to look down the hall from his office on the 23rd floor of 1440 Broadway. He found his man in Tommy Reynolds, the genial director of TV and radio operations at WOR. Reynolds had impressive credentials, too. Before joining the station he had been an outstanding band leader (with his orchestra he had played eight engagements at the Paramount Theater on Broadway.)

Soon the idea for the reborn WOR-FM became a reality. New studios were built on the second floor of the 1440 Broadway building. More than \$100,000 was spent on the latest in equipment that was to give the station a pure, modern sound. Just before the inaugural broadcast, Smith spelled out his philosophy for the station, telling an interviewer:

"WOR-FM will definitely not be a screaming station but will be modern with a distinctive sound. We want to utilize it (FM) in the best was possible to fill a need on the FM dial for the best in contemporary music. This music will be introduced by an outstanding quartet of disk jockeys. They will be entertaining and informative, but never abrasive.

"We estimate that 80% of the Top 100 charts are rock and roll tunes, but WOR-FM will not be a top 40 station. Our popular music play will cover a wide range including the top selling singles and will also be loose enough to offer exposure to new recordings. We will have regular news broadcasts, too. The station hopes to appeal not only to older teens, but also to young adults, collegians and others who dig the real, modern sound."

Smith called upon his Director of Information, Kenneth Cowan, for a major promotional campaign that was to have as its slogan, The Sound Is.... WOR-FM 98.7." Cowan obtained the services of popular illustrator Milton Glaser to design two posters that would capture the bright, young spirit of the station.

One poster showed a small group of young dancers and the other (later selected to be the official letter-head of the station) focused on a group of contemporary musicians, complete with electric guitars, mod costumes and "in" hair styles. These four-color posters were placed on a number of outdoor billboards in the Tri-State area, as well as subway platforms and side panels of city buses within New York. The response from the public for copies of these posters was remarkable, many requests being made even before the new WOR-FM went on the air. In a few weeks supplies ran out, indicating that the public was indeed enthusiastic about the new sound, as well as about the colorful posters.

Before long there was further evidence that the station had made a hit with an important segment of New York's listening public. Thousands of letters poured in from appreciative listeners.

There was recognition in the press, too. Richard Goldstein, devoting his entire "Pop Eye" column in The Village Voice to the station, described WOR-FM as "the only place to hear vital new music and hear it well."

Not long after the station started the new format, FYI, a house organ circulated among 3,000 employes of Time-Life, recommended WOR-FM as a "diversion to pick up the slack of summer's aftermath."

Rating services (A.R.B. and Hooper) reflected the popularity of the station from the beginning of its new sound. Surveys established that the appeal of WOR-FM was to the above 16 listener, especially college students and other young adults, including married couples.

Commenting on the station's appeal, Lambert said: "The image of FM has been sold in one rigid way for so long. Basically, the young adult market was untapped, but the purchase of FM receivers by this group was increasing. There are 2.5 million FM sets in the metropolitan area, but up to last July 30, no single station was programing in the pop vein. We can't be classified as a Top 40 station, because we don't play a straight Top 40 format. Our strength lies in the stereophonic sound and the highly popular

segmentized programing." The station manager added that "the station is growing. We employ thirty full-time people, including three account executives, a programing and production coordinator and three program assistants."


Lambert is proud of the fact that two major American companies are now advertising radios as "FM-AM," giving top billing to the FM dial.

In describing the kind of music the station offers, Reynolds said: "We are not against taking chances with a particular kind of new recording, such as the ballad, "Society's Child,' which was completely neglected by the AM rockers, but still achieved great success here in New York. Last summer we introduced "Guantanamera" to this area when that recording was being shunned by other stations. We're selling quality music. We don't shout, we don't ring bells, we certainly don't intrude over our vocals."

At the United States Military Academy, West Point, radio station KDET, operated entirely by the cadets, is piping in WOR-FM each morning and afternoon prior to going on the air with its own programing. The selection of the station was a unanimous decision, according to a group of cadets representing the audio club, who recently visited the station on a Saturday afternoon. Their primary reasons for picking 98.7, they explained, were that the station simply plays more music each hour (between 16 and 19 records), the approach of the disk jockeys and, the superior sound quality.

At present the station is on the air 164 hours a week. During a given week350 different recordings are heard, and this is one of the truly unique factors that sets the station apart, since competitors play only one-third, at best, of WOR-FM's figure. New recordings are introduced on an average of 30 per week. Other aspects of the segmentized programing include gold records from the last decade, attitude music (Dylan, Simon and Garfunkel) and "soul music."

The station's four disk jockeys, who had been hired priof to July 30, came on the air October 8. Up to this time, because of union

negotiations, the station had operated without Scott Muni, Johnny Michaels, Murray the K and Bill "Rosko" Mercer, except for taped promotions, and segued from one record to another in an unusual discotheque format.

Listener response for this type of format had been favorable, but with the return of the disk jockeys both audience and advertiser interest became stronger. The sound of the station did not really change. Many letters suggested that, indeed, the disk jockeys commissionned the already established quality sound of WOR-FM.

Beginning at 9:00 a.m. each Mondaymorning, Scott Muni presides over a leases and a few "oldies." Muni, a huskyvoiced performer who was associated at one time or another with the city's two leading AM rock and roll outlets, is also heard each afternoon during the week from 3:00-6:00 p.m. On Tuesday evenings from 5:00-6:00, Muni previews new releases which will appear in the next hour on the WOR-FM 'Great on 98'' chart when it is released over the air. This chart, by the way, is based on record sales from outlets all over the city and includes the top 100 pop records, but often includes up to 30 recordings that just missed making the coveted first 100.

On weekends, Muni's programs are broken into segments, offering solid gold (leading records from the last decade), the top Country and Western tunes, as well as the top 10 pop recordings in England, and international survey of leading records in various foreign countries. Muni also presents an hour called "countdown," in which he plays the first 17 records on the WOR-FM chart, starting with # 17.

Muni, who is an alumnus of Louisiana State University, says he's happy to be a pioneer in bringing popular music to the FM dial. "I think FM is the coming thing in radio," he asserts. "WOR is the only station in New York that has any freedom of expression. And it's the only station where disk jockeys aren't part of a jukebox." Outside of his work as a disk jockey, he has worked on behalf of young people, having twice received awards from the Catholic Youth Organization and produced and acted as host for a Mayor's Stay In School Campaign show held at the New York Coliseum. He has also participated in six Cerebral Palsy telethons in the city.

Smooth-styled Johnny Michaels, who had built a large suburban audience as a disk jockey in White Plains, New York before joining WOR-FM, started his career in the business and sales end of broadcasting, serving as a network account executive before becoming a personality. Michaels, who is heard each Monday-Friday from noon to 3:00 p.m., has been close to the popular music scene for the last few years, having been the master of ceremonies of concerts by The Byrds, The Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem, and for a major Carnegie Hall performance by Herb Alpert and The Tijuana Brass. He also lived in England when the modern sound was beginning to become popular there. Each Saturday afternoon, in his 2-3 segment, he offers new rhythm and blues numbers which he personally feels could go places. Sunday, Michaels emphasizes "gold soul," i.e. rhythm and blues tunes, sung predominantly by Negro artists, which were hits in the past. Such vocalists as Lou Rawls. James Brown, The Supremes and Wilson Pickett are featured. Outside the station, Johnny has an interest in movies and he recently signed for a role in a film with United Artists.

On the WOR-FM dawn patrol, beginning

at Midnight each night except Sunday, is the amiable Bill Mercer, known as "Rosko."

Born in Baltimore and reared in New York, Rosko broke into show business as an MC at the Apollo Theater, the Harlem show business shrine. He also conducted music and interview programs on radio and TV stations in New York and California before coming to WOR-FM.

During a broadcasting hitch in San Francisco, Rosko became friendly with Willie Mays. The San Francisco Giants star used to drop into the studio to chat with Rosko and often phoned in, requests. "He has superb taste in music," Rosko says of the great outfielder.

On WOR-FM Rosko provides individualistic commentary, opening each request by saying: "You want to take a mind excursion? Want a little diversion? Well, stay with us . . . Rosko." "I'll try to keep the audience interested so that they'll stay with us," he says. Sacks of favorable mail show that he is succeeding.

Murray the K, heard nightly from 6:00 p.m. to midnight, is a favorite on college campuses in the New York area. His programing, basically, consists of blocks, an hour of attitude music, featuring Bob Dylan, Janis Ian, Simon and Garfunkel, for example, another segment of soul music, plus two hours each evening of discotheque, from 10:00-midnight. Each Tuesday evening Murray spends approximately four hours divulging the top 30 records on the station's new weekly chart, beginning with number 30. He will also intersperse new recordings in this four-hour segment.

On other evenings, sometimes as much as five times a week, Murray holds a record review in which five or six recordings are picked at random and played over the air, after which listeners are asked to vote on their favorite melody. At the end of the program, Murray announces the winner by playing it once again. Response to these record reviews have been very encouraging. In one Friday-Monday period, Murray received over 10,000 phone calls. Still another block may see Murray spotlighting a particular artist or group. His block scheduling of soul, attitude and experimental sound is unique in New York. To Murray's way of thinking rock'n'roll no longer exists and the term, itself, is archaic. "The music has matriculated," he says. He is often the creator and innovator of new terms and fashion modes, and, to go along in this direction, feels the future of the FM sound is "out of sight?" Not confined in any sense to radio, Murray has been the host of a number of highly rated television specials, including one this past summer from Shea Stadium, and is the author of a current book, published by Holt, Rinehart and Winston, titled "Murray the K Tells It Like It Is, Baby." He has another book in the works for Simon and Schuster.


The economic picture at WOR-FM is a bright one. The station has attracted a long list of leading advertisers including Pepsi-Cola, Thom McAn, Revlon, Clairol, Borden's, Old London, Barney's, The Cheetah, Hohner and Piel's.

Altogether, there is good reason to believe that Bob Smith's decision to try something fresh and different on WOR-FM marked the beginning of an exciting addition to the many new voices of FM.




