

INTRODUCING PHIL MORRIS

There are two main reasons why we at FM GUIDE sought out Phil Morris as our FM "manon-the-scene."

Number one, he's in the pop bag, and he knows his "bag". He lives with it, yet still retains the power to stand away and take a hard, dispassionate reporting look at what's happening today on FM radio, which brings us, quite naturally, to reason number two.

FM GUIDE has championed the cause of diversity of programming on FM more than any other publication in the field. Pop music, or rock 'n roll or the "now" music, by any other name, belongs on FM and FM stereo, for no other reason than it *sounds* better on FM.

"Talk" belongs on FM — news belongs on FM — beauty contests belong on FM — cooking shows, language programs, childrens' shows, adult shows, musical shows, drama and politics, death, war and taxes belong on FM, right next to, and along with, classical music, because FM *is* FM. . . . the superior radio medium.

The biggest trend — or new wave — to hit New York's FM radio is the new rock. And we would be just as remiss in not reporting that scene to you as we would be in ignoring, let's say, the Mahler revival.

Here, then, is Phil Morris.

OP MUSIC is currently enjoying considerable exposure in all forms of mass media. Many of our foremost cultural heroes, as reflected in or created by magazines and television, come from the world of pop; and conversation in most every social circle is invaded by references to popdoms super-stars. The day of the matinee idol is over-unless he has a hit record. And the day of the hit record may even be passing. Or, at least giving way to the hit album. For as any record industry trade journal chart will indicate, one no longer has to have a hit single; indeed, one doesn't have to have a single release at all in order to sell albums, and lots of them. Case in point is Vanilla Fudge, whose first album reached number four position nationally almost six months ago and is still number forty-eight and they have never yet had a hit single, although demand caused a shortened version of You Keep Me Hangin' On, to be released from the album after its initial phenomenal success.

The examples are numerous; Cream, Mothers of Invention, Electric Flag, Blood, Sweat and Tears, Country Joe and the Fish; almost all the "underground" groups who surfaced, did so with little or no AM, Top 40 exposure. Now I'm sure there was, and is, terrific word-of-mouth on these records, but people are *hearing* them somewhere before they rush right out to their record shops. I guess you've guessed by now. FM radio. It started here about two years ago with the "late lamented" WOR-FM; a little before that on the west coast, and has since if not avalanched, at least snowballed across the country.

Progressive rock programming is the only significant trend in radio today. And it's to be found only on FM.

Prior to the "rock revolution" that began with folk-rock and a little later the San Francisco scene, the FM airwaves were the bastion of classical, Muzak-like "easy listening", and occasional jazz and Broadway musical-type programming. As far as the masses were concerned, FM was an ignored area of media. Ignored to the point of many AM stations filling their FM outlet's air time with pre-fab taped background music. I recall visiting a D.J. friend at a Long Island station in 1962 and being shown around. On our brief tour of the premises, we encountered a large box with two tape playback units in prominence. When I said, "What's that?" he replied, "Oh, that's our FM station."

Things began to open up in January, 1967, when an FCC ruling went into effect. This act provided that, in the public interest, stations owning both an AM and FM outlet in cities of 100,000 or more, could not simultaneously duplicate more than 50% of their programming during any given week. Hopefully, this would provide the listening public with a greater variety of programs from which to choose; an aim which was not immediately accomplished, although the ruling did help by forcing station owners to think about what was to be broadcast on FM.

NESHAMINY vs. MEN OF HI FI

We were shocked to read certain inaccurate statements, concerning electrostatic speakers, as made by Mr. Saul White (Men of Hi Fi, New Developments in Speaker Design), and published in the May, 1968 issue of FM GUIDE. It appears that Mr. White, as Chief Engineer of Empire Scientific Corp., should have been more "scientific" in examining the facts before speaking.

As you probably know, we are the oldest existing continuous manufacturers of electrostatic speakers, having produced these units for sale since 1956. We, of course, recognize that anybody is entitled to an opinion, and opinions should be freely expressed in publications such as FM GUIDE. We, however, do not feel it is warranted for an individual described as a "Chief Engineer", to make absolute misstatements of fact which can be irrefutably disproven and which obviously were not thoroughly researched, and which in fact, could not be thoroughly researched without prior consultation with ourselves who, we repeat, are pretty well recognized as the most experienced people in the field.

The particular statements referred to are made by Mr. White in response to the question: It (an electrostatic) has to be cleaned regularly, doesn't it? which Mr. White answers in the affirmative and proceeds with four points of disadvantage as follows:

1. "They are costly" — This is essentially true.

2. "There is not much reliability associated with them". This fact is completely untrue with a well made push-pull high frequency driver such as the Jans-Zen, which we manufacture. Each one of our speakers has been serialized and we have records dated from 1958 showing our returns. These records show that something less than 2% of the electrostatic speakers made by us have been returned for repair, and of this 2%, a large portion of the problems occurred because of customer misuse.

When Mr. Janszen first put the electrostatic speaker on the market, we were aware that customers might be suspect of their durability, so we guaranteed them for two (2) years. To our knowledge, they were the first, or one of the first products ever so guaranteed in America.

3. "They are susceptible to varying humidity conditions". This statement is untrue provided that due care is taken in the design and manufacture of the electrostatic elements. All of the materials used in their construction are nonmoisture-absorbing plastics and metals. Our elements will operate satisfactorily after being submerged in water. This could not be said of a cone-magnetic type of indoor speaker.

4. "The amount of acoustic output is definitely limited" This is true of all types of speakers. That is: there is an output limit on all of them; however, our electrostatics can handle up to 50 watts of continuous sine wave power and 100 watts of musical power. In fact, at our plant, each electrostatic element produced is tested with 50 watts RMS power prior to shipment.

Further, as concerns acoustic power, the speaker admittedly could not be described as efficient, but no speaker which covers a really full sound spectrum is. The JansZen electrostatics' 1% efficiency is equal to that of most other good speakers such as the KLH, Bozak, and AR. Further, it can produce sound levels without distortion more than sufficient for any home installation, and is frequently used in auditoriums. The most recent example was with the Philadelphia Composers' Forum who used them to reproduce their new electronic music in various auditoriums all around Philadelphia.

We realize that you may feel we are reacting subjectively because we are commercially involved, but be assured, our reactions are only because categoric misstatements of fact have been made damaging to us.





MAYNARD: How have recently improved recording techniques contributed to the resurgence of Gustav Mahler's popularity.

BRUCK: I think modern recordings techniques have contributed much to making Mahler's music accessible, certainly insofar as the non-concert-going public is concerned. Mahler's orchestral texture encompasses a wide dynamic and instrumental range, which comes across infinitely better in modern recordings, particularly in stereo.

MAYNARD: Why is this?

BRUCK: Fore one thing the dynamic range of modern recording can be much greater than was possible a few years ago. Also, home reproduction systems are now better able to handle the tonal and dynamic range extremes so characteristic of Mahler's music.

MAYNARD: Do you agree, John McClure?

McCLURE: I think this is probably an operative factor in the sudden acceptance of Mahler, both on disc and in the concert hall. However, I believe the prime factor is emotional and social. We are now ready to hear what Mahler has to say and to accept the emotional impact and power of his music, which I think has previously frightened many people.

MAYNARD: I would describe Mahler as a brilliant orchestrator. With today's excellent recording techniques, his orchestral genius can be properly revealed. Don't you agree. Seymour Solomon?

SOLOMON: There is no question about that. However, orchestration is not the dominant factor in recording a Mahler symphony. Obviously, the performance takes precedence. Basically, I think most people are not aware that microphones and microphone techniques have not changed drastically over the past ten years. There would be a substantial difference between a Mahler symphony recorded in mono and stereo, but there is not a marked difference between an early stereo recording and one made today, except for one factor which Jerry Bruck has touched upon. Today's recording equipment has had a signal-to-noise ratio, on a very good tape recorder of approximately 55 to 60 db. The actual levels of sound in a concert hall, if one is playing Mahler's symphony No. 2 or 8, is about 80 to 90 db. Therefore, any recording made with today's equipment, until recently, has been restricted. One could argue as to whether that restriction is a necessary one, in view of the fact that the Mahler symphony in question is not being played in the concert hall, but under home conditions. For example, we have released a recording utilizing the Dolby system, which gives us the opportunity of expanding the dynamic range virtually to that of the concert hall. I think this has been one of the major advances in recording an enormous array of musical complexities in compositions such as a Mahler symphony. MAYNARD: Jack Diether, do you agree with what Seymour Solomon has said? DIETHER: Recording, of course, is a means to an end. I think Mahler would have been one of the most important composers today even if we had only live performances. His importance today is due primarily to the nuclear age in which





we live. Whether we think about it or not, we are living literally on the edge of extinction, and could be wiped out at any moment. This is really what Mahler is all about. He was concerned with the ultimate problems of existence. People felt this and respond to it today in a way they haven't done in the past when they felt more secure.

MAYNARD: Jerry, do you believe the medium has anything to do with the message?

BRUCK: I do to some extent. But I certainly agree that Mahler's popularity today would have been assured whether or not high fidelity and stereo were in existence. However, I think it is a very happy accident that we have the recording techniques available today to satisfy those people who wish to hear Mahler to the fullest outside the concert hall. MAYNARD: Jerry, you brought us a tape today. What are we going to hear? BRUCK: The tape I have demonstrates

how much sound recording has changed, and with it, the impact of the music itself. The first example is from a really ancient disc. If you can imagine a Mahlersized orchestra with soloists and chorus gathered in front of a huge acoustic horn fed directly into a cutter, you will have some idea of what was going on c. 1924 when Oskar Fried conducted the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra in Mahler's Symphony No. 2, the "Resurrection", for this first recording of a Mahler Symphony. (Record played here)

BRUCK: Mahler posthumously had a hand in this recording. In 1905, he instructed Fried as to how this particular symphony should be performed. Whether we are hearing what Mahler wished is debatable. Would that Mahler had left us some recordings of his own conducting. My next example is from a recording made a few years ago by Hermann Scherchen with the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, again the same passage. I still think this is the most satisfying, both sonically and interpretatively, of the "Resurrection" symphonies recorded so far.

(Record played here)

BRUCK: We spoke a moment ago about the medium and the message. By contrasting the Fried and Scherchen recordings, it is apparent that one hears infinitely more of Mahler symphonic sound in the Scherchen version. This is, however, not always the deciding factor when listening to a Mahler performance. I think a case in point is that of the Symphony No. 1, which is certainly one of his most popular works and one which has been recorded many times. Yet, of the numerous versions available of this symphony today, there is one which for me takes precedence over all others. It is that of Jascha Horenstein on an old Vox disc made some time ago in what even then was not-very-respectable mono sound. But you forget its sonic limitations when you hear Horenstein's performance.

DIETHER: This is a recording I have been championing for a number of years, since Horenstein is about the only interpreter who does not make a certain very "traditional" and very uncalled-for retard in the finale, and since he seems to understand the import and structure of the work better than anyone else. A number of Mahler experts today believe that Jascha Horenstein is the finest living Mahler interpreter. As we now have a very fine complete set of Symphonies 1-9 just completed by Leonard Bernstein, and other series in progress by Georg Solti, Rafael Kubelik, etc., I really think it would behoove someone to record a set with Horenstein while he is still with us. MAYNARD: Jack, how do you feel about Bernstein's interpretations?

DIETHER: I have to make a clear distinction with regard to those passages where Mahler has many tempo changes, which some people think Bernstein exaggerates. I don't think he does. In the first movement of the Symphony No. 2, for example, there are literally more than two dozen tempo changes. Here the sharp contrasts in tempo bring out the musical structure. On the other hand, where Mahler goes straight ahead with no change at all, Bernstein still wants to fiddle around, and here I think he is completely wrong. Another passage I might mention is the point of recapitulation in the "Veni Creator Spiritus" of the Symphony No. 8, where Bernstein makes a big retard, whereas Mahler has no tempo change whatsover. This should be strictly adhered to.

MAYNARD: Seymour, will you comment on that?

SOLOMON: This point is in the realm of aesthetics. I'm afraid that none of us has a crystal ball. Of course, we have the literal printed page of Mahler's music where he has very explicitly indicated his instructions. But we also know, through the various changing editions, that Mahler had a mind that was constantly in flux.

DIETHER: . . . about orchestration, not about tempo.

SOLOMON: The basic question really is, would Mahler have played the same composition the same way twice?

MAYNARD: Well, I favor Bernstein's interpretation's of Mahler. How abut you, John?

McCLURE: I agree with you. However, I don't agree with his interpretations right down the line. There is no recreative artist alive that I would totally agree with or with whom anyone should agree. I think what matters is whether the artist breathes life and spirit into the music and if he communicates this to his listeners. Do people get Mahler's message when Bernstein conducts?

MAYNARD: He gets something across to me. John, Columbia has a new series which includes all the Mahler symphonies except the unfinished Tenth. What is Bernstein's comment on the Tenth? McCLURE: Bernstein is not quite sold

on the Tenth. He doesn't know whether it ought to be performed or not. I believe he is still thinking about it.

MAYNARD: What is your feeling about it. Jack?

DIETHER: Bernstein said Mahler was fated not to complete the Tenth Symphony. Maybe Lenny is as superstitious as Mahler was. How about that, John? McCLURE: That could be. After all, it seems that most composers die in the midst of some work or other.

MAYNARD: Mahler's Tenth is also on the Columbia label, done by the Philadelphia Orchestra conducted by Eugene Ormandy.

McClure: Yes, it is.

MAYNARD: Do you like the recording, Jerry?

BRUCK: Frankly, no. I feel that Ormandy has not penetrated very deeply into the score, or the Mahler idiom for that matter. A short time ago, the Mahler Tenth was performed in a radio broadcast by Jean Martinon and the Chicago Symphony. This was a marvelous example of how well this symphony can be done.

MAYNARD: Are there any commercial recordings of the Tenth available other than yours, John?

McCLURE: No, although there will be, of course.

DIETHER: Martinon did a very fine job with the Tenth, as Jerry has said, and I think RCA Victor made a big mistake in not recording it.

SOLOMON: There is also another performing version of the Tenth, by Joe Wheeler.

DIETHER: Why don't you record that, Seymour?

SOLOMON: Perhaps we will get around to doing it. We are in the process of recording all the Mahler symphonies with Maurice Abravanel and the Utah Symphony. As far as the Tenth is concerned, there is no question that as long as we don't know definitely what Mahler's intentions were, another editor's interpretation would certainly be as valid as Deryck Cooke's. DIETHER: This is something I have been very much in favor of all the time — having more than one performing version of the Tenth in the concert repertoire. This eliminates the pitfall of having only one person's realization accepted for all time.

McCLURE: It is incredible to think that little more than 10 years ago Mahler was very seldom played, whereas today one can count several record companies who are engaged in recording his complete symphonies. These ventures are most expensive, in terms of talent and time.

MAYNARD: John, what is the list price for the Columbia Mahler set?

McCLURE: It sells for \$100. We realized that it was important both for Mahler and Bernstein, but we figured that the price would be prohibitive to the average record buyer. As it turns out, we are short on supply and had to do more pressings because the set is moving so well. We were not able to predict its success.

SOLOMON: Jack Diether and John Mc-Clure both mentioned that Mahler's symphonies are currently in vogue partly because of the fact that they suit the emotional needs of our society. I would like to play devil's advocate for a moment and also point out another reason why Mahler is such a success in the concert hall and on records. The public has become satiated with classical and romantic music. Musical preferences have veered toward the extremes, whether it is medieval, renaissance and baroque or 20th century contemporary. Certain composers who are not necessarily top-flight are attaining a certain amount of popularity because of this surfeit of popular material. The public wants something "new". By this I do not mean to imply that Mahler is not a top flight composer, although I do have one reservation. I cannot state with any conviction that I consider all of Mahler's works to be of equal quality. In this discussion emphasis is being placed on Mahler's symphonies. I think Mahler did his very best work in the small forms, where his tendencies towards exaggeration and lack of discipline in writing for large forms was controlled by a text. For example, I think his song cycles are the most perfect expression of his genius.

MAYNARD: My favorite Mahler symphonies are numbers 1, 2, 4 and 10. Jerry, what is your favorite?

BRUCK: All the Mahler symphonies are my favorites, truly. But if I had to choose I might pick individual movements from the symphonies. If I were on that fabled desert island where we all go in fantasy, I would take the third movement from the Fourth Symphony. Of course, since I have been so involved with the Tenth Symphony, I could list that as a particular favorite.

MAYNARD: I think the Fifth is slightly overrated. What do you think, Jack? DIETHER: I think Mahler gets better as he goes along, in the sense that he becomes more and more himself alone. Musicologists have generally agreed that in Beethoven's late quartets, the essence of the composer is revealed. This same characteristic is true of Mahler. I think the Tenth would have been his greatest symphony if he had been able to complete it himself.

MAYNARD: John McClure, what is your personal preference?

McCLURE: I appreciate Mr. Bruck's hesitation in selecting a particular favorite. It is too dazzling a choice to make. I suppose the Ninth is one of my all-time favorites. I recorded it both with Bruno Walter and with Bernstein. It seems to hold enormous riches for me, although I cannot really visualize living the rest of my life without the Scherzo movements from the Second and Seventh symphonies. The Eighth is also full of incredible things. They are not exactly symphonic in nature, but it is overwhelming music. Incidentally, the Eighth Symphony is the biggest selling Mahler record to date. It has been somewhat of a breakthrough in the commercial sale of his symphonies, pulling the others up along with it. For some reason or other, the Eighth struck a particular nerve with the public.

MAYNARD: I think Seymour Solomon hit on a very good point when he said that many of us are looking for something "new," and Mahler does seem to fill this need. After all, there are innumerable versions available of Beethoven's symphonies. We are now ready for a new repertoire.

SOLOMON: This is precisely it. If I may deviate a little, this would also account for the success of the recorded Nielson symphonies over the last several years.

McCLURE: . . . and Charles Ives.

MAYNARD: I think the recording medium should receive credit for bringing these works to the public. In the past, a tremendous investment was needed just to assemble the forces necessary for a live Mahler performance.

SOLOMON: There is no doubt that since the advent of the LP, the recording industry has been far in advance of the concert hall in promulgating the taste of the musical listener.

MAYNARD: Seymour, you brought a recording.

SOLOMON: I have selected the last minute of the vocal fourth movement in Symphony No. 2, and the opening of the finale, because this demonstrates the extreme contrasts in dynamic range. The performance is by the contralto Florence Koplekoff, with Maurice Abravanel conducting the Utah Symphony Orchestra. (Record played here)

MAYNARD: Jerry, how would you sum up the discussion?

BRUCK: We've left little unsaid. I think we agree that Mahler's popularity may be partly due to social factors which influenced musical taste and brought his music to the fore. However, the fact of high fidelity and stereophonic reproduction in the home has also led a great many people to discover Mahler in a way that was formerly possible only in the concert hall.

MAYNARD: What are your comments, Jack?

DIETHER: I think it is very important that we keep on the lookqut for young singers and conductors. Up to this point, we have been talking only about today. What about tomorrow? We must really keep our eyes on the horizon, so that our children will be able to hear this music properly interpreted for them, and they won't have to listen merely to old recordings.

MAYNARD: Maybe a composer won't have to be dead before he comes into his own in the future, because with the facilities we now have music can quickly be brought to the attention of the listener, both in recording and reproduction. How do you feel about this, John?

McCLURE: It is an enchanting thought that our audiences may someday catch up to our composers. The means for the public to remain in contact with composers is certainly available with radio, television, records, tape, etc. Mahler's appeal today lies in the fact that he tried to encompass everything. I think our younger listeners today are searching for a broader experience, and Mahler's diversity attracts them. His references are not purely musical.

SOLOMON: Basically, I agree with this point. The most significant consideration in Mahler's music is that it reflects the disintegration of romanticism and the search for a new means of artistic expression which reached its culmination in atonality and the twelve tone system. Let me return to a point made before. If I had to select a favorite Mahler symphony I would probably choose the Ninth. because of all his symphonies, the Ninth is the most forward looking. It has formed the basis for a great deal of contemporary musical composition, particularly Shostakovich, Prokofiev and other composers.

MAYNARD: There is no doubt that Mahler's influence has left it's mark on the contemporary musical scene. Gentlemen, I want to thank you for being my guests this evening.



hen Mahler was about five years old, his father took him on one of their frequent walks in the forests surrounding their home in the Moravian village of Kalischt. Before they had gone far, the elder Mahler remembered a forgotten chore to be done at the house. He seated the boy on a tree stump and told him to wait for his return. Meanwhile, unexpected visitors detained the father much longer than he had expected. On his return to the woods, he found Gustav still on his stump, but in a trance-silent and self-absorbed, his eyes staring into the deep of the forest as if fixed on some marvelous vision.

In a way, Gustav Mahler remained in this trance for the rest of his life. His songs and symphonies are filled with a sense of nature. Passages in his scores are sometimes marked "Wie ein Naturlaut"-"like a sound of nature." Yet the music goes far beyond pastoral convention. Invariably, Mahler's music speaks of nature in the grandest and most profoundly philosophical sense. It intimates the elemental forces of the earth, the irrepressible energies of life, the mystery of growth and unfolding, rapacious struggle and snarling fury, the unbound violence of storms. And almost in the same breath, it speaks of inexplicable beauty and quietude and that unfathomed dimension of nature which is death.

The scope is immense. The music carries an enormous freight: the totality of Mahler's world-view expressed as musical metaphor. No wonder his symphonies expand into vast musical panoramas that overflow all established forms. But Mahler, obsessed with his vision of an indivisible mystical wholeness of all life and nature, simply couldn't settle for less. "A symphony is like the world," Mahler said to Jean Sibelius during a visit to Helsinki. "It must embrace everything."

The man who created these vast discourses in the form of symphonies was no recluse pondering in solitude those ultimate questions that so ceaselessly occupied him. He was an international figure-the most widely acclaimed conductor of his time. As director of the Imperial Opera in Vienna he was virtual dictator over the musical affairs of Europe's most musical city. His capabilities as an organizer and executive were as great as his genius as an artist, and the performances he staged and conducted remain a legend to this day. His position was so powerful that he could openly defy for a decade any interference in artistic matters even from members of the Austrian Court. And when he assumed leadership of the New York Philharmonic Society in 1909, he was indisputably the musical mogul of two continents.

Mahler rose to this eminence from the most unlikely circumstances. As a child of a poverty-stricken Jewish coachman he grew up mostly in the small town of Iglau in what was then the Austrian province of Moravia. He hung around the barracks of the local garrison to hear the military bands and bugle calls, and echoes of their brassy clamor were later to resound in his scores. He would follow organ grinders all over town and then hammer out their hurdy-gurdy tunes on an old piano in the attic which he had taught himself to play. These melodies, too, would later be woven into songs and symphonies.

Meanwhile, Mahler's father had risen to the status of tavern-keeper and scraped together enough money for piano lessons. When Mahler was ten, he was taken for an audition to a famous teacher who was so impressed that he arranged for the boy's admission to the Vienna Conservatory a few years later. Graduation from the Conservatory was followed by a quick succession of minor conducting jobs at provincial theaters, most of them with woefully inadequate musical forces.

Even then, Mahler's distinctive cast of mind was already set. "My beloved earth, when, oh when, will you take the abandoned one unto your breast?" he writes in a letter of that period. Or, "I see the blue heavens once more and the quivering flower, and my scornful laughter dissolves in tears of love. And I must love it, this world with its deception . . . and its eternal laughter." The paradoxes, the contrasts that make Mahler's music both disturbing and fascinating are already formed in his character. But he had to invent a new musical language to convey this typically modern ambivalence of feeling. Mahler was the first to formulate in music the now familiar dilemma of the modern artist: his sense of estrangement from the surrounding society, his sardonic mocking of his own alienation, and the inexpressible longing for a mystical reunion of his fragmented self. "I am thrice homeless," he writes.-"As a native of Bohemia in Austria, as an Austrian among Germans, and as a Jew throughout the world. . . .

While Mahler spent every free minute feverishly composing, his incredibly intense conducting, his relentless pursuit of precision, attracted wide notice. Invitations poured in from Prague and Leipzig. And finally the big break: the twentyeight-year-old Mahler is appointed Artistic Director of the Royal Opera at Budapest. At last he commands musical forces capable of being raised to his level of expectation. He mesmerizes his musicians. "There are no bad orchestras," he quips, "only bad conductors." His performances, particularly of Mozart and Wagner, become so famous that even the aged Johannes Brahms, after reluctantly agreeing to hear Mahler conduct a performance of Mozart's Don Giovanni, comes away as an ardent supporter.

But Mahler's merciless perfectionism, combined with his abrupt manner, so irritated his staff that one member challenged him to a duel—a deeply serious matter in Imperial Austria's code of honor. To extricate himself, Mahler had to advertise publicly in the newspapers that he "did not believe in the healing powers of dueling."

Later efforts to curtail Mahler's authority merely brought about his resignation. He left Budapest to take charge of the opera at Hamburg, which under his direction rose to new heights of artistic achievement. Meanwhile, Mahler's own fame had spread throughout Central Europe. The road lay open to what was then the world's top musical position. At thirty-seven, Mahler became director of the Imperial Opera in Vienna. Brahms, himself, remembering Don Giovanni in Budapest, recommended him for the job.

Mahler promptly transformed Vienna's opera from a theater into a shrine. For he could not think of music as an entertainment. To him it was a sacramental rite with implicit power to "redeem" the dedicated listener. To give to music anything less than the full measure of one's mind and skill was sacrilege to him, and he demanded the same kind of total absorption and self-sacrifice from each member of his staff. Everything had to be done anew, thought through from the ground up. Scenery, costumes and lighting—all were residesigned to conform to Mahler's concept of unified *Musikdrama*. To him, every moment of music demanded total commitment. Not even when conducting *Hansel und Gretel* was he able to relax his strenuous standards. On top of his work at the opera, Mahler also served as conductor of the symphonic concerts of the Vienna Philharmonic.

In Vienna, where music has always been front-page news, Mahler became demi-god. Strangers bowed to him on the street when he passed. But the more *gemutlich* faction of Viennese musicians, who liked soft jobs and short hours, simply felt that he was impossible to work with.

No doubt they had a point. Leo Slezak, a leading tenor under Mahler (and father of actor Walter Slezak) relates an illuminating episode. Mahler wanted to summon a singer to

his office, but was too impatient to pick out the right bell button. (It was before the invention of voice intercoms.) So he impulsively leaned his forearm across the whole row of buttons. People started streaming into his office. "Out!" "Scram!" Mahler barked at each one until the right person finally came along. Only a handful of intimates ever knew the gentle and generous side of Mahler's contradictory personality.

Since no Jew could hold high public office in the Austrian monarchy, Mahler had submitted to the formality of a religious conversion. But his baptism very likely was not dictated merely by convenience. At a deeper level, his brooding spiritually, haunted by infernal and angelic presences, had attuned him to the more mystical aspects of Catholicism. The fundamental Christian tenet of redemption through suffering, especially, was central to Mahler's personal beliefs, and echoes through all his works. Yet, this did not deter Vienna's anti-Semitic press from making common cause with his gemutlich backstage opponents. And by 1907, after he had fired an incompetent protégé of the Court, he found himself without political support. In the city whose musical life he had raised in ten tireless years to matchless heights, where he was the idol of the public, his position had become untenable. His letter of resignation was posted on the opera's bulletin board. The next morning it was found torn to shreds.

Mahler decamped for America to conduct German repertoire at the Metropolitan and, in subsequent seasons, to assume direction of the New York Philharmonic. His achievement in New York was no less illustrious than in Vienna. "Mahler has worked a miracle," reported the New York Post in 1910. "No wonder the Mahlerites are growing fast in number." But Mahler's last years in New York were a time of anguish. He knew that he had a defective heart and was haunted by premonitions of death. In addition to conducting a full schedule of concerts, he exhausted himself with feverish work on his Tenth Symphony. "The devil dances with me. Madness, seize me, the accursed. Destroy me so that I may forget what I am ..." he scribbled at the margin of the score. But, of course, Mahler died before the Symphony could be completed.

For a man torn by inner paradoxes, perhaps the greatest was this: his enormous success as a conductor was his tragedy as a person. His real mission, he rightly felt, was to compose. But his conducting left him too little time for musical creation. That he managed to complete nine gigantic symphonies and several major song cycles was in itself a miracle. But the incredible effort never left him any reserves. The vast inner pressures evident in his music were simply unsupportable against the needs of his career. He had no margin for patience or compromise. A driven man, he was the victim of his situation.

Mahler's prominence gave him ample opportunity to have his music performed in his lifetime, often under his own direction. But except for a few loyal partisans, his unique personal idiom, the unprecedented emotional directness of his musical utterance, perplexed his audiences. But Mahler was undaunted. "My time will come," he stubbornly proclaimed.

Today, more than half a century after his death, Mahler's prophecy is coming true. His work is at last winning a firm place in the repertoire. A broad and predominantly young public now responds to Mahler's music with an astonishing degree of personal involvement. This cannot be credited alone to the lifelong pioneer work in Mahler's behalf by the late Bruno Walter, his friend and disciple; nor to Leonard Bernstein's searching and sharp-edged interpretations that are now creating a new Mahler tradition in America. What turned the tide of artistic receptiveness toward Mahler are the deepest currents of human history.

In the dark night of Hitler's era and by the terrible illuminations of the Second World War, a new generation has learned to look unflinchingly at both the abysses and the summits of the human spirit. They learned to recognize the ambivalence of human values. Today's listener is able to accept—as Mahler did—the opposing polarities of joy and pain, faith and doubt, love and death (both Freudian and Christian), doing and enduring as coexistent facts of an embracing unity. The seeming contradictions in Mahler's music are thus resolved for them. The total human experience of our age has made Mahler's musical language consonant with our own most penetrating visions. His time has come indeed.





Finally, after the folk-music revival was well underway, some of it began to creep onto FM. And one may still enjoy a good selection of folk-music shows, particularly in urban areas.

Now things are really beginning to change. It's possible to hear "underground" or "progressive" rock on the radio in most of the major cities in the United States. And not too surprisingly, it is these "underground" groups who are really at the vanguard of pop music. It is they who have brought experimentation and artfulness (along, of course, with some selfdeception and pretention. To be "underground" is not enough.) to popular music. It is they who have opened things up enough to allow some little reality to slip into the mass consciousness. We can now hear songs, even on AM, about what the kids are really doing and thinking, be it drugs, social protest and com-mentary, or even to some extent, sex. And I mean the "sock it to me" kind, not the great WASP delusion "all-I-want-to-do-isdance-with-you-at-the-high-school-prom-and-have-you - wear - myclass-ring, baby bullshit of ten years ago. Of course, there are those groups who have shaved away all the B.S., notably the Fugs and The Mothers of Invention, who still aren't getting much air-play, even on FM. There's a brave soul or two at some listener-supported and non-commercial college stations who play these groups, but as a general rule, the people who control radio aren't ready for that much truth in such explicit terms, even though the former group contains three of the most important poets of the "now generation" and the leader of the latter, Frank Zappa, is probably the only musical genius in pop. We can use "fuck" in movies and in print, but to hear it on radio or television is still obscene. Oh well, someday - but for now, the point is that the music that is the art form of the youth of now is being given mass exposure. Just how

well and to what extent, we shall see in this and subsequent columns.

New York, at present, has two "progressive rock" stations, WNEW-FM and WABC-FM. (WOR-FM with its 50% oldies, 25% Top 40, 25% album cuts policy, falls into a rather individual category and will be dealt with later.)

WNEW-FM and WABC-FM both feature the "now sound" the "new groove", "underground", folk rock, the "new pop", blues and occasionally a forerunner or contributing influencetype of music, such as the Indian ragas of Ravi Shankar. Of the two, only WNEW knows what they are doing or trying to do. WABC admittedly does not. They are making "no policy statements at this time" as their policy is not yet set. They feature only one personality, Bobaloo. The rest of the time they have essentially "underground" Muzak with a minimum of talking. They don't even announce record titles, only artists' names, usually four at a clip, followed by four songs which are, most of the time, by the artists previously mentioned. When such is not the case, no correction is made. Does anyone on their end know the difference?

This format, as we are frequently reminded by one of the world's most offensive jingles, is supposed to provide most music over WABC at ninety-five and a half. Whoever approved this one for airing should be made to listen to it on a continuous loop tape device through stereo headphones while strapped to his chair until, insensitive though he may be, he begins to salivate and drool uncontrollably. Just such reaction is induced in the normal listener after about an hour of monitoring. And, as if the jingle weren't in sufficient bad taste, they also feature "amphetamine newsmen". You know, those darlings of the AM airwaves who can cram a fifteen minute report, two hard-sell commercials, three station promos and several seconds of beeping, clacking teletype machine into a two-minute summary, leaving one suffering from exhaustion, nervous trauma, and nausea at five minutes after the hour. Perhaps I'm unkind. Listen for yourself. You, too, can become a quivering jelly in just five short minutes.

They have also brought baseball to FM. Yea!

On the plus side, I must admit that even though WABC lacks direction, they play a lot of good, significant album cuts. And, perhaps just as important, rarely play anything that isn't good or at least interesting. They could still come through, but I have a suspicion that what they need is a strong and knowledgeable program director. I'll keep an ear on them.

As for WNEW, they're not perfect but they're the best we have. In the first place, they were the ones who took over when WOR abruptly stopped what it had been responsible for starting on the East Coast. So they have had some time to get their thing together. But more important than that; they have Nat Asch, a damn fine and conscientious program director, and they have a good, reasonably hip and varied staff of air personalities. Of these, I believe Scott Muni has the greatest awareness of what's really going on and of what the station is trying to accomplish. He's there afternoon man. Two until seven p.m. during the week and on Sunday, three 'til seven on Saturday. A regular Sunday feature of Scott's show is a "what's happening in England" hour from 3:00 to 4:00, and it's not based solely on charts. In fact, the station policy tends to veer away from chart orientation. The jocks are free to play what they like and are not told what to play or what not to play. New records are auditioned and discussed by Nat and the personalities in terms of what has artistic merit, both musically and lyrically, and also what may be "newsworthy" (i.e. if a well established group were to release a terrible record, WNEW would probably give it some play because it would be important for the public to hear it and evaluate for themselves.) I am in total agreement with this viewpoint. It doesn't imply, nor is it taken by WNEW to mean that one gives air-play to every lousy record that comes out just so the public can decide. Fortunately, there is enough good material around to keep a good rock station busy twenty-four hours a day. In view of these facts, due to his excellent sense of programming continuity and just because he comes across as totally believeable, I feel Scott Muni is doing an exemplary job, even though my tastes run to more blues and funk, which Rosko seems to air more heavily. (Scott tends toward softer, and often, folkier sounds due to his afternoon time slot.)

What about Rosko? He, having the prime-time portions of the station's air, 7:00 'til midnight, appears to be the "star" of the station. And perhaps his popularity is warranted. His voice is pleasant, his taste, good to average with horrendous exceptions, and his overall presentation enjoyable, as long as he does not start to rap (read; talk endlessly, in circles, about nothing while trying desperately to get back where he started). He's also a nice, sincere guy and terrible M.C.

Jonathan Schwartz (10:00 a.m. 'til 2:00 p.m., 'til 3:00 on Saturdays) aside from being a hell of a nice cat and a good D.J., has some sort of aberration for speaking of baseball and childhood on the air, pronounces the letter "W" with particular emphasis and plays some tremendously schlock music that sounds like inane AM garbage, but has a message. He also plays some delightful folk things and leans toward pretty, lyrical songs. And he reads some good poetry.

Alison Steele, according to Jonathan, was asked, when very young, what she wanted to be when she grew up. Her reputed answer — "A night bird." And that's how she bills herself on the midnight 'til 6:00 a.m. shift. "Alison Steele, the Nightbird, flying toward dawn." Her diction is precise, almost eloquent, her musical taste well-balanced and funky and besides, one can have groove sexual fantasies about a hip, sophisticated and unseen (i.e. mysterious) nightbird.

The 6:00 'til 10:00 a.m. slot has heretofore been held down by that perennial pair from WNEW-AM, Klavin and Finch. And while they are probably the most revered D.J. team in radio, they don't fit in with the rest of the station sound. Well, that's all being changed as of July first when Dick Summer, who previously played pretty groovy stuff on WBZ in Boston, takes over.

Weekends see the old "cool ghoul" himself, John Zacherly, sitting in for Jonathan and Nell Bassett in for Alison. Zach is witty and a bit ghoulish and Nell is competent but nervous. (She is also beautiful, but this is radio, remember?)

In all, WNEW could be more. More daring, further out and sometimes even more relevant, but they are pleasant, thoroughly listenable *and* the best we have.

RECORDS

TEN YEARS AFTER

"Ten Years After" is the most exciting and together blues album by a new group in some time. The cover design is awful but once the record is on the turntable, everything is there; musicianship, style (many influences are obvious but the effect is one of having absorbed rather conscious imitation) and some original tunes, though they take traditional form. The vocals are a little weak, but thoroughly believeable and Alvin Lee's guitar playing on this record alone will probably establish him as one of the top four or five blues guitar idols on the current pop scene. He has the speed, the sensitivity and the power. Whether he is *really* in the same league as Clapton, Hendrix, Bloomfield and the old master, B. B. King remains to be seen.

I have favorite tracks on this album but there are no bad performances: I hope the group gets the promotional push they, need. Blues fans should all own this one.

GOING TO MEMPHIS (Columbia CS 9605) Incidentally, "Going To Memphis" by Paul Revere and the Raiders is one of the best blue-eyed soul albums I have ever heard. Mark Lindsay is just so damn gutsy without trying to sound black. One song, "My Way" is a total knockout: vocal performance, writing, horns, the whole song.

EARTH OPERA (Elektra EKS 74016) Earth Opera's initial release on Elektra is so good I had the album for two weeks before I played side two. I just had to hear side one over and over, especially As It Is Before and To Care At All. And further, Home of the Brave is one of the most disturbing and real anti-war songs ever written. When I got to side two, I just had to call the people at

Elektra and rave. The keyboard work by Bill Stevenson is tender and exquisite throughout, and David Grisman's mandolin is salty and

have.

tastefully employed in the arrangements. I won't give you a track-by-track rundown. I'll only say that this is the best collection of song lyrics to ever come out on one album (including Dylan). With a poet the magnitude of Peter Rowan around, who needs Leonard Cohen? Rush right out to your neighborhood record shop . . .

THE JIMI HENDRIX EXPERIENCE: Axis: Bold As Love

(Reprise RS 6281)

This is the record that's been driving reviewers crazy because they can't find anything bad to say about it. It must be described in superlatives - an essential album.

BYRDS: Notorious Byrd Brothers (Columbia CS 9575) This is one of the prettiest rock albums ever. It contains "Goin' Back", a single for the group and a beautiful realization of the lost innocence of youth. "Artificial Energy" is a simply stated, moving speed saga about amphetamine. "Draft Morning" is a gentle protest song that fades into C & W "Wasn't Born to Follow". I could rave on track by track. But no. I'll only say that here is an album I won't be without.

FUGS: Tenderness Junction (Reprise RS 6280) The Fugs records are always important for their "redeeming social value". No matter what musical criticisms are due, the Fugs are without fail, funny, provocative, literate and penetrating. Sanders and Kupferberg are two of the most meaningful poets of their generation. This album is a downright enjoyable musical experience with some moments of real beauty, such as the electric violin playing by Dan Kootch and Ken Pine's fine guitar work. Ed Sanders' vocals are pleasing and appropriate throughout and really gorgeous on some tracks. He also did an admirable production job.

"The Garden's Open", is a beautiful song by Tuli Kupferberg and there's a frighteningly effective "War Song" with chilling, disgusting lyrics. The last section, in five parts, contains a brilliant tribute to physical love. Richard Alderson's superb engineering is prominent in this album and the record deserves attention. There are tracks of questionable interest, but this offering is representative of another stage in the development of one of the most unique and exhilarating groups in Pop. For a complete recorded prospective on the group, pick up the three albums by them on ESP-Disk: The Fugs First Album (1018), The Fugs (1028), the best of the three, and the recently issued Virgin Fugs (1038), which contains some of their best early songs.

U.S.A.

(Columbia CS 9614) An important album in terms of the musical synthesis it represents. Joseph Byrd's outstanding musical credentials are in evidence here in the tight arrangements and genuinely interesting and listenable music. However, his verbal phrasing is awkward, his lyrics pretentious, redundant, obvious, unpoetic and, in spots, corny. Dorothy Moskowitz's voice certainly won't lust in the hearts of men. Not that she can't sing, it's just that she doesn't make it with most of the material on this album. She sounds annoyingly sweet when she should be sweating.

One track is conspicuously more exciting and together than the others. It is poignantly and unself-consciously written by Gordon Marron and Ed Bogas.

This record is spotty but worth having, particularly for collectors of the new pop. Dave Rubinson's production is typically excellent.

MOBY GRAPE: Wow!

(Columbia CS 9613)

As I was saying a year ago, Moby Grape is the best hard rock group on the scene. The exuberance, as well as the excellence of musicianship, comes across on record almost as well as in live performance. (I must regretfully note a terribly dull show by the Grape at Fillmore East, June 1st. Has success spoiled Moby Grape? Skip Spence wouldn't even smile.) This new album (LP's) is exciting and delicious in spots, but track-for-track it's not as good as their first effort. Some standouts are Murder in My Heart for the Judge and Skip Spence's Motorcycle Irene. They also get into a nice, hard blues on which Jerry Miller demonstrates the fact that he is one of the most formidable and versatile lead guitar players in rock.

There is some superfluity on the main album in the form of a 78 rpm cut featuring Arthur Godfrey and ... I won't bother to describe it. It's cute the first time, but after that I find myself wishing for another good song in its place.

The second record of the set is called "Grape Jam." It's comprised of jams that were caught in the studio while the main album was being recorded. Al Kooper (Blues Project, Blood, Sweat and Tears) guests on ore track and Mike Bloomfield plays piano on another. I find this record on my turntable when I want to hear some good, easy blues playing which doesn't demand too much of the listener. David Robinson, their producer, deserves much credit here

for his perception, as well as his ability and taste.

NEGLECTED NUGGETS

(Records that aren't receiving the attention they deserve, either on the air or in the pop press.)

SMALL FACES: There Are But Four Small Faces

(Immediate Z1252002) The first album by the Small Faces is a masterpiece of hard rock The whole group is one, cookin' rhythm section. Note piano on Talk to You.

DR. JOHN THE NIGHT TRIPPER: Gris Gris

Gris Gris is a most unusual record. Cajun rock is music from the Creole swamps of southern Louisiana which consists of lots of unintelligible Cajun French dialect, voodoo-like chanting and rhythms and some weird songs like "I Walk on Guilded Splinters". It's starting to get some air-play - don't miss it.

"SESSIONS" by Fred Neil is one of the most relaxed, natural sounding albums ever released. Fred is in superb voice throughout, including the conversation between tracks. And the playing on several tracks will send shivers up the spines of guitar buffs everywhere. One cut "Send Me Somebody to Love" is classic and well worth the price of the album. Fred has never been recorded so well.

- LOVE: Forever Changes (Elektra EKS 74013) Another fantastic record from the Elektra stable. It seems this label can do no wrong of late. They are really the only totally hip label in the business. And LOVE, with Forever Changes, proves that Elektra's original confidence in the group was justified. But despite the quality of the record, public acceptance is not spectacular. Perhaps it's just too pretty. Perhaps the so-called avant garde listeners have been overestimated. Perhaps tasteful music that doesn't bombard the senses with noise is too advanced for the "now" generation. - Well, I really don't mind. Those of us who know are filled with joy by LOVE.
- **THELONIUS MONK: Underground** (Columbia CS 9632) If you think some of the rock album covers are far out, check the cover photo on the new Thelonious Monk album -then check the music inside. He's still one of the perpetual giants of jazz. Listen especially to recurring phrase on "Raise Four". There's also a nice vocal track by John Hendricks.

NEWS AND NOTES

WBAI is broadcasting the lectures on Indian classical music given by Rayi Shankar at City College of New York earlier this year. They may be heard on Thursdays at 8:15. WFMU is doing a very hip job. Format is similar to WBAI's "Radio Unnameable", only it's more rock oriented and loose all the time.

Next month, we'll look into some related areas such as country and western, gospel, and relevant folk programming; what's happening nationally with progressive stations; more records and live coverage of the New York scene and less verbiage.

CONNOISSEUR SOCIETY: SOUND in the SERVICE of MUSIC

UYING a new stereo system is always a traumatic experience. After weeks of trying to convince your wife that you need the new equipment, after the hectic run-around listening to new amplifiers and speakers, and after finally parting with the cash, you are gripped by a deadly fear: was it worth it? Will the system sound as good at home as it did in the store? When it's installed, all you do is listen to sound music is a minor consideration at this point. You just have to make sure that this complex mess of electronics gives you your money's worth.

To give my system a real workout, one of my friends lent me the Hi Fi/ Stereo Review Demonstration Record, a 12-inch 45 rpm disc which contains several musical selections, each designed to illustrate a different aspect of high fidelity music reproduction. To my great relief, my new system came through with flying colors (more about that some other time) and as my anxiety abated I was aware that the selections I had enjoyed most came from recordings made by the Connoisseur Society, a label I had until then only been dimly aware of. (You don't find these records in the bargain basements I used to frequent as a student.) I decided to follow the matter up.

I made inquiries among friends in the hi-fi business, read lots of reviews, listened to a number of C.S. records, and finally went to see Alan Silver, president of Connoisseur Society. At the end of all this, I came away with the pleased feeling that a couple of technically very able young men who had sound judgment and more than a little business sense could carve a niche for themselves in one of the most hotly competitive industries in the U.S.

If you're a young music graduate with a strong urge to produce high quality records, you might consider starting your own record company. Doing so is not too difficult—but staying alive in the business is. You need more than just the determination to make a "no compromise" quality product. It also takes sound musical judgment, business sense—and a couple of lucky breaks.

The Connoisseur Society label made its auspicious debut in 1962 with the release of two lavishly packaged 12-inch 45 rpm stereo discs, "Flue Concertos of 18th-Century Paris," featuring Jean-Pierre Rampal and Samuel Baron, and "Ustad Ali Akbar Khan: Master Musician of India." The records came with six pages of notes in a special gold-lettered, clothbound packet, and were guaranteed for five years against "anything." In one instance, this meant replacing a record for a lady whose cat had jumped on it and scratched it—hardly a case of "normal record wear."

Quite obviously, the new company couldn't compete against the giants, except by developing a roster of exciting new artists. As Silver put it, "Our long term road is through artists not repertoire. People will buy Ali Akbar Khan, not Raga Marwa." Consequently, C.S. has been responsible for the recording debuts of pianists Joao Carlos Martins and Ivan Moravec, and flamenco guitarist Manitas de Plata.


Martins was "discovered" by James Goodfriend, one of the founders of C.S., who was present at the concert at which Martins made his New York debut playing the Ginastera piano concerto. Though he had never heard the young Brazilian artist before, Goodfriend figured him for a natural Bach player. After many months of negotiating, C.S. signed Martins to record the complete "Well-Tempered Clavier," which became one of their most successful albums. It turned out later that Martins' only two previous recitals in the U.S. (in Washington) had featured the Well-Tempered Clavier!

(Goodfriend, now music editor of *Hi Fi/* Stereo Review, is no longer active with the company.)

Connoisseur Society's next major discovery was the brilliant Czech pianist Ivan Moravec (pronounced Moravets) who had never played in the United States. Goodfriend and Silver first came across Moravec's name in rave reviews in the London Times. As English critics are not as a rule given to effusiveness, they decided to follow through and with much difficulty obtained tapes of Moravec's playing from Czechoslovakia. They immediately realized that here was an artist of the first rank and began negotiations to bring Moravec to New York for recording sessions. This, of course, was before the recent Czech "liberalization," and the mixture of bureaucratic red tape and restrictions nearly brought the whole venture to a halt. At last the way was clear and in a go-for-broke move, Goodfriend sank his last \$1,000 savings into a plane ticket to bring Moravec to New York. The gamble paid off: Moravec was hailed as a major pianist of the generation. His Chopin recordings were picked Best of the Year in 1966 by Hi Fi/Stereo Review and High Fidelity and in 1967 in the Saturday Review Survey. In addition to Chopin, Moravec has recorded Beethoven, Debussy and Mozart, with each release drawing rave reviews. By the time you read this. Moravec will have completed another set of recording sessions here in the City, so don't be surprised to find his name on the 1968 lists.

In 1963 Silver got wind of a phenomenal flamenco artist, a gypsy named Manitas de Plata (hands of silver) who lived in the south of France. With the aid of a borrowed tape Silver was able to obtain some outside backing to take a recording crew and three quarters of a ton of recording equipment to Arles. Again this was a calculated risk: when they left New York, Silver had no guarantee that de Plata would make records - given his mercurial temperament, he might just have gone home to Montpielier to "think it over" for a month or two . . . However, the two did manage to develop rapport and de Plata agreed to record. The sessions were held in a small medieval chapel where, in addition to the solo works, the microphones captured the singing of Jose Reyes (de Plata's cousin) and Manero Ballardo (de Plata's son) and a number of informal "jam sessions." When the records were released, de Plata climbed from an unknown to the top of the flamenco pantheon. His first record won the 1966 Grand Prix du Disque and all subsequent issues have been greeted with great acclaim. One critic called them "probably the most realistic-sounding guitar recordings ever made" and you don't have to be an aficionado to get caught up in the tension, urgency and raw beauty of this passionate music.

Since then, Silver and his Connoisseur Society have not rested on their laurels. They have recently signed a world-wide exclusive recording contract with Ali Akbar Khan who is, for me, without a doubt India's finest musician. His Raga playing is the ultimate in music-making, and you don't have to be an expert to fall under the sway of his mood setting and virtuosity. As the record notes appropriately say: "The main characterrecordings are made with special tape machines using $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch tape at 30 ips (compared to the industry norm of $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch tape at 15 ips). This technique cuts the usual tape noise by three quarters (6 to 10 db), increases the dynamic range, provides



greater transient response (crisper sound), smoother highs and richer bass. But these technical terms are inadequate to describe what your ears will hear. Try any of the Moravec discs, to pick one example at random, on the finest equipment you can get to, and you'll hear a rich piano tone that you wouldn't believe possible from a record. But you don't need "state of the art" equipment to appreciate the difference that "state of the art" recording techniques and quality control make to one's listening enjoyment.

The same kind of taste and care are also put into the record covers, most of which are adorned with the stunning photos of Lucien Clergue, whose abstracts and nudes represent a peak in photographic art. C.S. is now using a special two-step black and white printing process to ensure that all the fine tones of the original exhibition prints are properly reproduced. (My only gripe - and there has to be at least one otherwise this would like like a P.R. rave-is that the records don't come in polyethylene lined inner sleeves. A minor point which if rectified would truly make for perfection all 'round.)

Obviously, all this superb quality does not come cheaply. As I said at the beginning, you won't find these records in the bargain basements. But, if you want the ultimate in artistry and sound, you would do well to investigate the Connoisseur Society catalogue, which truly lives up to its motto: Sound in the Service of Music.

In conclusion, let me mention that several of the C.S. recordings are available in Book of the Month "package deals." These include Martins' "Well-Tempered Clavier," Moravec's Chopin, and Manitas de Plata's "Flamenco."

istic of a Raga is its power to evoke emotion. The mode must seize the listener's mind and hold it enchanted." But, of course, you must be willing to be enchanted. The latest Khan release is "Raga Marwa," which lasts over forty minutes. Its two movements, each complete on one LP side, should be listened to like movements of a symphony. Silver told me that C.S. is planning an eighty minute Raga, which would make it longer than a Mahler symphony. From what I already know of Khan, I can't wait to hear it.

Perhaps the finest example of Eastmeets-West is to be found in C.S.'s record of Baudelaire's "Flowers of Evil." A selection of the poems is read in English by Yvette Mimieux with appropriate musical accompaniment by Ali Akbar Khan. The beauty of the poetry, the sensual voice of Miss Mimieux and the pulsating sound of sarod and tabla blend to make an unsual and highly sophisticated aural experience.

To match these artists, C.S. provides sound of the highest quality. Though the cloth covers and the 45 rpm speed had to give way because of insurmountable production and distribution problems, the "standard" covers and 331/3 rpm sound are both unsurpassed. All C.S.

TIME FOR A CHANGE

FM radio is today the main source of musical entertainment in the home. Pick any station, and you will hear clean, clear, full sound, be it popular, rock or classical music. The music broadcast is from records, the same records one can purchase in any record or department store. The same? - not quite. The records purchased are the same musical content, but not noise free as those broadcast on our favorite FM stations. The records are full of "clicks", "pops" scratches and even surface noise - and all the records we purchase are "factorysealed". One can, in most cases, return tc the dealer and exchange the defective disc for a new copy of same. The replacement copy is, in most cases, no better than the first copy. One can also return the disc directly to the manufacturer for replacement, and if one is lucky, the replacement record can be much better than the record sent for replacement.

It is indeed very strange that a station such as WOR-FM can broadcast an old 45 R.P.M. mono disc, with an altered frequency response (and a good deal of raised treble response on one channel) to simulate stereophonic sound, and do so without a "pop" or "click", or even surface noise present.

Yet, purchase a brand new factorysealed stereophonic disc, place it on your turntable, play it through any good amplifier and speaker system, and you will hear not only the music, but many "clicks", and other non-musical sounds present in the record groove.

I feel that the RIAA should insure that the records sold to the public are of the same quality in all respects as those distributed or sold to radio stations for their use.

The time has come for records to catch up to the rest of the technical advancements in the high fidelity industry.

HE PRICE of the ultimate in dream systems is more than most pocketbooks will comfortably bear. Some compromise must therefore be effected between cost and quality sound, and the answer is frequently a kit.

Eico's Model 3200 "Cortina" Stereo FM tuner at \$99.95 (kit) "delivers quality performance, common to higher-priced equipment at low cost." 1

Designed as a companion to Eico's "Cortina" 3070 70-watt stereo amplifier, it is handsomely styled in a vinyl clad Danish walnut cabinet with a pale gold front. The costly frills have been eliminated. There are only four controls — tuning knob, mono/automatic stereo, AFC and power rocker-type switches. An easy-to-read tuning dial, also has a tuning meter and a mono/stereo indicator which works even when the tuner is in the mono mode.

Most people are scared of tinkering with anything electronic. But, if you follow easy instructions, pictures and simple diagrams there is no reason for you to pass up a \$40.00 saving, even the ladies. "You don't have to be an experienced kit builder to get the 3200 working perfectly. Our man, who was a novice at kit building, took about ten hours. Bue he was extra careful; normally it should take about half that time."¹ "Total time used including unpacking: 2 hours and 45 minutes Total time for actual assembly (nothing to tune up): only 2 hours and 10 minutes — a new record of some sort an experienced builder would laugh at it."2

The front end, IF and multiplex boards are supplied prewired and factory aligned "we strongly concur in the manufacturer's suggestion that the builder not disturb any adjustments." 3

"In tests by POPULAR ELECTRONICS (in mid-Manhattan, a notoriously poor spot for good FM-MPX reception) the "Cortina" was almost the equal of FM tuners that are a lot bigger, a lot fancier, and a lot more expensive." 2

"The frequency response in both monor and stereo modes was within $\pm 2db$ from 30 to 12,000 cps [Hz]. Mono noise checked out at better than 70 db down with a standard 1,000 uv. [microvolt] input signal. (This is 10 db better than claim d by Eico.) Stereo noise level was 60 db down on both channels. Channel separation was 28 db at 1kc kHz and 12 db at 12 kc."¹

The "Cortina" is a quiet, sensitive tuner with "usable sensitivity of . . . 3.7 microvolts, slightly less than its rated 2.4 microvolts. The distortion at 100% modulation was 1% (--40 db). Limiting was complete at 10 microvolts."³

"Because the tuner has virtually no drift AFC is almost unnecessary. Distortion was lower when the tuner was tuned for a peak meter indication rather than when tuning depended on the AFC for pull-in. From 106 to 108 mc [megaHertz], the AFC tended to pull the tuning off center."¹

The multiplex circuit is very effective and no trace of SCA is left. The stereo indicator is lit and switching is accomplished even by weak stations.

The "Cortina" won most reviewers' hearts in the on-the-air tests — "Distortion, noise and a.c. hum were well down below the point of audibility, while sensitivity and stereo separation were perfectly adequate in a location where FM-MPX tuners marketed three years ago have a job gathering sufficient signal for noise-free stereo reception." ² "While not a DX champion, the "Cortina" delivered sound quality equal to that from tuners priced much higher."¹

All of these kudos sound awfully rodundant but they are all well deserved. While devoid of frills that build costs out of reach, Eico has managed to fit into a 3¹/₆" x 12" x 7³/₄" package, "probably the most compact FM stereo tuner presently available" ³ one of the finest medium-priced (\$99.95) tuners available.

P.S. For those of you who are still not convinced that kit building can be easy, the "Cortina" is available at \$139.95.

COLLECTION of critical opinion on popular music has obvious value, since only a small part of the constant flow of new recordings is worth owning. Knowing that critics liked a particular recording is, of course, no guarantee that you will like it-but it does help improve the odds. Still, consensus is not of very much value unless you realize its limitations.

With rock, the biggest problem is time-before a sampling of critical commentary can be put together, a recording is already getting old. Despite the fact that some rock does hold up, the ever-changing trends in rock means that a collection of four-month-old reviews just has to lack immediacy. "Easy listening" music poses a different problem-that of finding any

intelligent criticism. Not that it's really anyone's fault, but there's not much to be said about a new Tijuana Brass album other than: "Here's a new one. If you like the last one, you'll like this one."

And then there's folk music. The audience for folk music is relatively small compared to that for other types of pop. So it's not so strange that there is not much critical interest in it. But I love this unpopular "pop" too much to worry about a lack of consensus. No other music is so vital or personal. Listen to a few really good folk records, and you can't help but be converted into an "eth-nik." And it just so happens that I have a few records in mind to proselytize with. Try one on for size.

KING OF THE DELTA BLUES: Robert Johnson

Simply stated, Robert Johnson is one of the great figures in American folk music. Little is known about him personally, but his music tells what is important-he was a genius. The bits of biography available provide no real clues to explain him. He came from a small town in the Mississippi delta; he recorded less than thirty songs. It is not even sure how old he was when he recorded—as a guess, about eighteen. And within two years he was dead, apparently poisoned by a jealous girl-friend.

This recording has sixteen songs by Johnson, nine of them previously unreleased. The sound quality is poor, as you would expect of recordings that are thirty years old. But musically, and lyrically, these songs stand with the very best. Their influence on other blues singers since Johnson has been so profound that it is hard to hear how original they are. We've heard so many imitations. Nothing prevents you, though, from feeling the painful intensity of the singing or the torment of the lyrics. Song lyrics tend to look a little ridiculous set out like poetry, but the personal desolation comes through in these lines even without music: "You may bury my body down by the highway side/Babe, I don't care where you bury my body when I'm dead and gone/You may bury my body down by the highway side/ So my old evil spirit can get a Greyhound bus and ride."

The guitar playing is tightly woven into the texture; sometimes providing rhythmic drive, sometimes a keening, highpitched counterpoint. Both the guitar and the singing are

rough, without professional polish. There is nothing studied about the performances, never any feeling of reaching for an effect. It is this absolute emotional honesty and directness that makes Johnson so powerful. If you have any interest at all in the blues, you must have this record. It's as simple as that.

THE REAL BAHAMAS: various

(Nonesuch H72013) This has got to be one of the truly groovy records. The songs, mostly religious, range from the ecstatic, through the delightful, to the out-and-out beautiful. The rhythms reach points of maddening complexity while also being just about the bounciest things you've ever heard. For the most part, the lyrics are nothing special-in fact, there are times when they are totally incomprehensible. But the evident joy the performers take in singing is most contagious.

People whose ideas of Island music have been shaped by Harry Belafonte are likely to be shocked by this record. Belafonte does a fine job of Calypso-as-art-song, but for sheer rhythmic excitement he cannot come near the original. The singers are all deeply absorbed into religious feeling of the lyrics and the complexity of the music. They had a ball-so did I, and so will you.

REFLECTIONS IN A CRYSTAL WIND: Mimi and Richard (Vanguard VSD-79204) Farina

If you set out to make a list of the records that were important in the development of current rock music, you would have to include this one. Of course, that doesn't necessarily make the record any good—only "important"—but it turns out to be very good indeed. What importance it has results from it being both an early and a successful blending of

folk music with electric instruments and a rock beat. But historical import needn't concern anyone but historians. Instead, get hung up in the lovely, intricate, delicate sound. Richard Fariña's lucimer provides a droning, ice-like surface to the sound, all blending with the modal-sounding harmonies of the voices.

The lyrics are sometimes poetic-more often they are darkly humorous. The word play is fascinating, and the insights are true and unsual. The hero (?) of Hard Loving Loser (a song that Judy Collins later made a hit), a clutz of extraordinary incompetence in all things but his super-successful way with women, is portrayed with affection and high good cheer. You don't react with disbelief even though the character is wildly improbable because the Fariñas sing about him with so much conviction, that he must be real.

Much of the record has a mystical, almost prophetic quality. The singing seems introverted, meditative. The lyrics are not inanely cheerful-they are impassioned, and never cynical. The cumulative impact of the album is surprisingly strong. It is unique, involving, and very beautiful.

GUARNI SONGS & DANCES: Los Chiriguanos of Paraguay (Nonesuch H-72021)

This is the kind of record that comes along every so often to remind people that "authentic" folk music doesn't necessarily mean badly performed folk music. Los Chiriguanos are a harpist and a singer/guitarist. Both are professional musicians, but their performances are undoubtedly authentic. The singing is fiery, and the instruments are played with virtuosity and zest.

The guitar serves mainly a rhythmic function, leaving the flashiest and most exhilirating runs to the harp. The tone color of the harp changes constantly. Its basic brittle tone can suddenly become like that of a muted koto, or of a weird, tampered-with piano.

The record has a marvelous variety of moods-love lost, love about to be gained, loneliness, pleasure. And all of those moods, the saddest and the gayest, are lovingly presented with charm and vigor. Very enjoyable.

FANTASIAS: Sandy Bull (Vanguard VSD-79119) This one is a bit of a ringer, perhaps. Calling it folk music is stretching a point. It gets mentioned anyway because it is so unusual that it would be even more useless to try classifying it as anything else. Starting with side two, there is a Fantasy for solo banjo based on Carmina Burana, the cantata by Carl Orff. Next comes a version of William Byrd's Non Nobis Domine arranged for banjo and guitar, with both parts played by Bull through the use of special taping methods. Then, a solo banjo version of the old folk song, Little Maggie. Now that seems normal enough. But in a piece barely over four minutes long, Bull manages to go through a progression of banjo-picking styles from the sim-

plest to the most complex and back. Not so normal after all. The side finishes with a piece for electric guitar and foot cymbals, Gospel Tune. The cymbals beat in metronomic steadiness against the freely shifting rhythms of the guitar with a hypnotic effect.

All of one side is taken up by an extended composition called Blend. With the support of Billy Higgins on drums, Bull's guitar produces a psychedelic blend of Indian, Arabian, and American music. The piece has no discernible formal structure-its logic is that of emotional sweep. The music carries you, leaving you puzzled as to how it got where it didbut without any doubt that it should be precisely there. There are moments that seem confusing or repetitive, but the overall effect is compelling.

Bull's technical mastery of his instruments is awesome, and his musical ideas evidence a highly creative, controlled, and original talent. What looks like a gimmicky and purposefully bizarre approach to the music, works extremely well. The great freedoms taken with the music do not result in anarchy. The record is fanstastic, and endlessly fascinating.



Taj Mahal

(Columbia CS 9579)

TAJ MAHAL: Taj Mahal I haven't bothered trying to find out how a blues singer from Harlem got to be called Taj Mahal. It doesn't seem too likely, but then neither does his band-which includes, he says a son of a Texas sharecropper, a Hungarian Jew, a wild-eyed Irishman and a crazy swamp Spade." Well, what the hell, the whole thing thing works fine. Why worry?

Taj Mahal's singing comes out of the tradition of blues shouting. His voice is gruff and strained. The band has a raucous, big-city-blues sound. The beat is jumpy, insistent, hectic. It's rather gritty and tough sounding. But even though the performances are modern in sound, the songs are mostly old country blues classics. Generally old songs that are jazzed up are pretty miserable. This record is an exception. By finding the narrow area that separates sterile imitation from unjustified modernization, Taj Mahal has managed to convey the essence of the song and not just its exterior style.

In the final analysis, Taj Mahal cannot be ranked with the top blues singers. The listener never achieves that degree of complete identification with the singer that leaves him completely convinced. But the virile, energetic style is winning. The music is solid and strong—and very satisfying.

CONSENSUS: CLASSICAL

KODALY: Concerto For Orchestra; Marosszek Dances; Galanta Dances. Philadelphia Orchestra/Eugene Ormandy.

Columbia MS 7034 HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (1/100): The Philadelphia Orchestra is in top form and the results are such that we can only ask for more.

THE GRAMOPHONE (1/377): With his magnificent orchestra he gives most authentically exciting performances and, since the recording is splendid, this record is very much recommended.

AUDIO RECORD REVIEW (1/35): The playing is magnificent but both these compositions for small orchestra sound at times a little inflated and become something of show pieces. The really valuable side here is the Concerto for Orchestra.

FM GUIDE: The lush sound of the Philadelphia Orchestra is an ideal vehicle for this extroverted music. Ormandy has a marked affinity for this music since Kodaly is a fellow countryman with whom he studied. The Concerto and Marosszek Dances are stereo firsts. Well recommended as a memoriam to the late composer.

PAGANINI: CONCERTO No. 8 IN D. Viktor Tretyakov, violin; Moscow Symphony Orchestra/Neimye Yarvy.

Melodiya-Angel SR40015 SATURDAY REVIEW (5/27): The sounds that are reproduced qualify Tretyakov as a violinist of considerable virtuosity and a strong, singing sound, but not much that is uncommon in the way of personality or individual impulse. HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (10/147): The violinist gives a

power-packed interpretation which I can only describe as vulgar.

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (4/670): Aside from a perfect technique, a huge tone and a nice extroverted approach to this extroverted of show pieces, there is little to say about the boy. What I mean is, he is awfully good.

FM GUIDE: This is a hackneyed work which is seldom heard anymore perhaps because the music is less than first rate but requires an absolutely perfect technique which Tretyakov (1966 Tchaikovsky Competition winner) supplies in abundance. One hopes this is the beginning of a big career and, in the meantime, buy this record for a dazzling display of virtuosity.

ELGAR: Cello Concerto; Block: Schelomo. Pierre Fournier, cello; Berlin Philharmonic/Alfred Wallenstein. DGG 139128

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW: The performance of it (Elgar) is absolutely ravishing. It is entirely possible that there are available here better recorded performances of Bloch's "Schelomo" than Fournier's effortlessly romantic but attractively understated performance—but I should be very much surprised if there were.

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (1/68): To state it bluntly, Fournier and Wallenstein have produced the best recording of the work (Schelomo) I have ever heard. In the Elgar, Fournier and Wallenstein again offer a distinguished realization.

FM GUIDE: Fournier gives a stylish, excellent and wellrecorded interpretation of both these works. Unfortunately Du Pre plays the Elgar equally well on Angel while Nelsova is similarly adept with the "Schelomo" on Cardinal, so the final choice will probably rest on which coupling you prefer. You would not go wrong with either of the recordings.

LORTZING: "Zar Und Zimmerman." Erika Koth, Hermann Prey, Nicolai Gedda, Peter Schreier, Gottlob Frick; Dresden State Or-

chestra/Robert Heger. HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (1/102): It is hard to imagine a better performance of this entertaining little opera; at this low price the set seems to me an outstanding bargain for the enterprising operaphile.

SATURDAY REVIEW (3/30): It bears testament to how enjoyable even a minor work can be when served by an ensemble that does not need to condescend or make excuses for the genial music it dispenses. This is not only comic opera but singing at its best.

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (4/664): The performance is excellent and mostly complete. Gedda is marvelous. The others in the cast are thoroughly satisfying. This release is a bargain.

FM GUIDE: The operas of Lortzing deserve a wider audience in America for they are melodious, inventive and quite accessible. This release would have been welcome even at full price for it is excellently sung and conducted by the veteran Heger. It also costs, complete, the same price as the less distinguished DGG set of highlights.

GERSHWIN: Concerto in F; Rhapsody in Blue. Philippe Entremont, piano; Philadelphia Orchestra/Eugene Ormandy.

SATURDAY REVIEW (12/30): The rugged simplicity and homespun honesty of Gershwin's approach to the problems of composition are more than a little disserved by the lavish means and overelaborate interpretative punctilio of these performances.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (2/86): Entremont and Ormandy bring a sweep and ring to their conception that gives it an edge on all its predecessors. But a dimension is missing. There is too much Gallic elegance in Entremont's performances..

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (4/660): If Ormandy seems stiff in the Concerto by comparison with Fiedler on Victor, Entremont is more with this music than Fiedler's soloist, Earl Wild. Some sort of recommendation is in order.

FM GUIDE: Entremont may seem an odd choice for Gershwin but the pairing has yielded very felicitous results. Perhaps more of a jazz oriental idiom would have benefited Ormandy's approach, for the essential Gershwin is sometimes lost in pomposity but only purists would object strenuously. Recommended.

OPERATIC RECITAL: Teresa Stich-Randall (Verdi, Bellini, Donizetti, Boito, Puccini). Orchestra/Brian Priestman.

Westminster WST 17130 SATURDAY REVIEW (11/25): She illuminates everything she performs with the shining light of intelligence. There is not much evidence of this (vitality and passion) in her highly capable but too often colorless interpretations.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (3/114): There is expertise in abundance, and a wealth of beautiful sound, but everything is studied, unconvincing and unmoving.

FM GUIDE: Stich-Randall rates every plus for intelligence, musicianship and elegance of styling. Her decidedly cool, white voice is an acquired taste, however, and most of these arias have been sung better by other sopranos. Yet it would be difficult to find one other soprano who could sing them all as well as she does. I shall admire and play this record quite often.

GUNDULA JANOWITZ: Operatic Recital (Wagner, Weber). Berlin Opera Orchestra/Ferdinand Leitner. DGG 136546 AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (11/243): In sum, the singing is charming throughout, even though we may miss some of the drama.

SATURDAY REVIEW (2/24): The two "Freischutz" arias are the kind of music Janowitz was born to sing and she does it admirably, if, with a little lack of involvement. As the Wagner-experienced listener will anticipate, Janowitz is presently much more an Elsa, vocally, than she is an Elisabeth.

FM GUIDE: Janowitz's clear, vibrato-free soprano is wellsuited to this Germanic music and she acquits herself admirably. The two "Rienzi" arias are particularly praiseworthy. However, it becomes increasingly clear that Janowitz is a lyric soprano and would be wise to avoid the heavier repertoire. Recommended.

OPERATIC RECITAL: Mozart, Verdi, Halevy, Ponchielli, Gounod. Norman Treigle, basso; Orchestra/Jussi Jalas. Westminster WST 17135

SATURDAY REV/EW (10/28): What Treigle does with it (voice) is, in almost every instance, admirable. His singing of the airs from "Nozze" and "Don Giovanni" are in grand tradition, and he is an able exponent of it.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (12/132): Brilliant singing. Treigle's mature mastery of the appropriate styles, his thorough understanding of the character and situations, is evident in every one of these arias.

FM GUIDE: At long last, Treigle is getting adequate representation on records and his rich, vibrant voice comes through with flying colors. As a singer, actor, he has few peers and he projects the dramatic situation behind each aria with a roundness of tone not equalled by many contemporary baritones.

VAUGHAN WILLIAMS: Symphony No. 6; The Lark Ascending. New Philharmonic Orchestra/Sir Adrian Boult; Hugh Brian, violin. Angel S-36469

AUDIO RECORD REVIEW (10/62): This is one of those top priced records that is worth every penny asked for it, regardless of competition — and would still be worth it at a higher price still. This is a superlative piece of work.

RECORDS AND RECORDINGS (10/45): Boult's identity with Vaughan Williams' music seems only to ripen with the passing years and the vividness of communication achieved in this performance is deeply satisfying.

FM GUIDE: A ponderous work, so thickly textured that it needs a good machine for full appreciation. One cannot imagine a more powerfully idiomatic performance for such a high-minded work. The individual will have to decide for himself whether or not this lofty argument succeeds.

PROKOFIEV: Complete Music for Solo Piano. Gyorgy Sandor, piano. Vox SVBX 5408 5409

SATURDAY REVIEW (1/27): Sandor's Prokofiev may not be the Compleat Composer, but his understanding of the complete music discovers the essential nature of the music successfully in probably nine cases out of ten—which is not a bad average for some 5½ hours of performance. HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (3/102): The performance to the manner born. The dominating characteristics are firmness of rhythmic control and very clean articulation of passage work and figuration with a surprisingly fine feel for the lyrical and coloristic elements in the smaller pieces. N.Y. TIMES (3/3): Mr. Sandor plays the music satisfactorily. He can supply both the lyricism and the nervous drive that are essential to its performance. There is no false sentiment. The total set is valuable, not just for musicological reasons, but for lisenting enjoyment as well.

FM GUIDE: Had the spirit of Faure been trapped in Lizst's body and the metabolic rate turned up to the danger point a shadow of Prokofiev might emerge. The demons are cercertainly set loose in his music for piano, for the keyboard was his natural idiom. In this important Vox album all of the great Russian's piano music is captured on discs in one package. Naturally, the results are variable. Not every work is a masterpiece and the nerves become frayed from so much relentless energy. Yet an overriding impression of genius carries the day. Endless inventiveness of rhythm, jerky melody, acerbic counterpoint wedded to a mind of elegance and classic purity-this is the style and a compelling one it is. Sandor's approach is sympathetic and intellectually convincing. Many times I wished for a more sensuous tone and more climactic power, but all things considered he accomplishes this tour de force with flying colors.

BRUCH: Concerto in G Minor; Mendelssohn: Concerto in E Minor. Joseph Suk, violin; Czech Philharmonic Orchestra/Karel Ancerl. Epic BC 1346

THE GRAMOPHONE (8/114): Suk plays both the concertos with warmth and brilliance, illuminating the Bruch, particularly, with the one quality, the Mendelssohn with the other.

FM GUIDE: The Bruch Concerto is such a hackneyed showbiece that we tend to denigrate it and it seldom shows upon concert program. Nevertheless, it is an effective and brilliant example of good second-class music. Suk plays it and the more established Mendelssohn with unabashed romantic fervor and marvellous technical skill. This record should be enjoyed by almost everyone. VERDI: "Ernani." Leontyne Price, Carlo Bergonzi, Mario Sereni, Ezio Flagello; RCA Italiana Opera Orchestra and Chorus/ Thomas Schippers. RCA Victor LSC-6183

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (9/621): Schippers approaches the music with respect and care. Price sings the role with aplomb if not always at her tonal best. Bergonzi sings with his customary elegance and style. Sereni has done nothing better, in the opera house or on records, than his porformance here.

HI FI/STEREO REV/EW (5/90): An outstanding performance Elvira is not the best possible part for Price for it requires repeats descents below the staff, a region where she is distinctly uncomfortable. Sereni's work is stylish and entirely acceptable. Bergonzi's fervent yet unexaggerated delivery, his elegant phrasing and his accurate ornamentation are constant delights.

N.Y. TIMES (5/12): Price's brilliant singing encompasses all the passion, fire, authority and musicality necessity for a memorable performance. Bergonzi is a clean, tasteful singer who seasons his performances with perhaps too much caution. Sereni's singing is impressive.

FM GUIDE: The long awaited stereo recording of "Ernani" is slightly disappointing, largely because of Schipper's less than vital conducting. Price is somewhat below her best form as Elvira but Bergonzi is superb in the title role. Another mistake is the casting of Sereni as Carlo when Cornell MacNeil would have been ideal. Also Siepi would have been preferable to Flagello as Silva. Nevertheless, the recording remains a must for any opera lover. GLUCK: "Orfeo ed Euridice." Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau, Gundula Janowitz, Edda Moser; Munich Bach Choir & Orchestra/ Karl Richter. DGG 139 268/9

N.Y. TIMES (3/24): The DGG "Orfeo" is controlled by the conductor to the last sob. His sensibilities completely dominate, but in this performance they are hard and brittle. Fischer-Diskau sings as stalwartly as ever, and with his usual broad range of expressive devices, intelligently applied. SATURDAY REVIEW (4/27): I find Fischer-Diskau disastrous as Orfeo. Janowitz is superior in both understanding and vocal production to Rothenberger in the Angel set. Richter's conducting is right.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (5/78): Fischer-Diskau's command of expressive nuance is altogether rare and beyond the reach of current mezzo Orfeos. Unfortunately, here he too, is quite uneven. Richter surpasses (Neumann on Angel) him in every way.

FM GUIDE: Regardless of tradition, the use of a male voice for Orfeo provides a valid element of contrast. Since Fischer-Diskau sings beautifully and phrases expertly, I prefer this version to the new Angel set. Also Richter conducts a vital, moving performance as opposed to Neumann's lethargic tempos which are a strong drawback.

GLUCK: "Orfeo ed Euridice." Grace Bumbry, Anneliese Rothenberger, Ruth-Margret Putz; Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra & Radio Leipzig Chorus/Vaclav Neumann. Angel S-3717

N.Y. TIMES (3/24): It (Bumbry) is a deeply personal performance of rare beauty and the conductor of gentle sensibilities who serves her so well is Neumann.

FM GUIDE: This is a beautifully sung performance but there is a lack of tension in Neumann's gentle conducting which robs the score of its vitality and emotionality. Bumbry provides a luxurious sound but lacks complete identification with the part.

SATURDAY REVIEW (4/27): Bumbry is superb, a real Orfeo, and is given adequate support by Rothenberger and Putz but less continuously by Neumann whose conducting of slow passages several times becomes too slow and much too emphatic. I think this version is by much the best I have heard.

HI FI/ STEREO REVIEW (5/78): Neumann's approach is traditionally romanticized, with stately tempos, rich sound and is somewhat unimaginative. Bumbry has the makings of a first rate Orfeo though at present she is uneven: there are instances of failing intonation and inelegant phrasing.

LEONTYNE PRICE: Prima Donna, Volume II (Handel, Puccini, Mozart, Weber, Verdi, Boito, Debussy): RCA Italiana Orchestra/ Francesco Molinari-Pradelli. RCA Victor LSC-2968

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (11/189): Price deserves credit for her overall performance. Even if she does not always illuminate what she sings interpretatively, her voice is of such sheer loveliness that at the very least it guarantees pleasure.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (1/187): The program is varied, provocative, and congenial and Miss Price's work is aweinspiring in its versatility and artistic penetration. Her voice has never sounded more radiant.

FM GUIDE: I am inclined to believe that this is among the finest singing Price has ever given us. What other contemporary soprano could sing Handel's "Cara selve" and Lady Macbeth's "Sleepwalking Scene" with equal assurance plus the requisite style. Nothing but superlatives are in order and a steal at any price. Now, on to volume III.

LUCIA POPP: Operatic Recital (Handel, Mozart). English Chamber Orchestra/Georg Fischer. Angel 36442 RECORDS AND RECORDINGS (11/29): Her singing has a highly professional polish. It leaves me rather cold—there's too little warmth or sense of real commitment in it for it

dom does one hear a voice so perfectly attuned to the requirements of Mozart and Handel as this and so technically assured.

THE GRAMOPHONE (11/278): In general, the Handelian is reasonably well projected by both singer and orchestra. In the Mozart, the way the singer floats her tone at the first and final entries is exquisite. Her range is unusually wide for a high coloratura.

FM GUIDE: An unusually distinguished recital combining some rarely heard and ethereal Handel arias with an equally balanced Mozart side containing concert arias. The voice is well placed with highly competent coloratura facility. Well recommended.

MAHLER: Songs of a Wayfarer; Kindertotenlieder; "Ich bin der Welt abhanden gekommen." Janet Baker; Halle Orchestra/ Sir John Barbirolli. Angel 36465

THE GRAMOPHONE (2/441): I regret having to say that I cannot enjoy this record. Baker certainly sings superbly and with great feeling but she tends to come out powerfully with a full tone when the music needs an emotionally subdued piano.

AUDIO RECORD REVIEW (2/126): The ravishingly beautiful performance ("Ich bin der Welt") alone makes the record worth having. In "Kindertotenlieder" it is a joy to follow the vocal line but there are certain relatively imperfect orchestral details. "The Wayfarer" cycle, too, is most happily done. **RECORDS AND RECORDINGS** (2/58): I must make it clear that I find Baker's performances as lovely as they were moving and she is well supported by conductor and orchestra. In these performances, the effect is consoling rather than cathartic. Baker is in splendid form.

FM GUIDE: It was inevitable that Baker would record this music and if the result is not a complete triumph, it does credit to all concerned. Both cycles are more completely projected and unforgettably sung by Angel's reigning mezzo, Christa Ludwig.

MAHLER:Symphony No. 3. BostonSymphony/Leinsdorf;Shir-leyVerrett.NewEnglandConservatoryChorus& BostonBoychoir.RCA Victor LSC-7046

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (10/101): This is a winner on many points. It is a resplendent sound. This is certainly the best combination of recording and interpretation we have had so far in the Adagio.

HI FI/STEREO REVIEW (3/96): Leinsdorf conveys in his reading little of Bernstein's intense commitment, let alone rhythmic urgency, while the wonderful slow finale gets a decidedly cool and brisk treatment. The two short vocal movements come off well enough, thanks in large measure to Verrett's expressive singing.

FM GUIDE: Leinsdorf is not the deeply committed Mahlerite to compare with Walter, Solti or Bernstein but this is still an excellent, well-recommended album due to the technical proficiency of the orchestra, first rate sonics and smooth singing of Shirley Verrett.

IVES: Piano Sonata No. 1. Noel Lee, piano. Nonesuch H-71169 AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (1/379): Though there is no arguing the greatness of Masselos' Victor release, this does not lessen one's appreciation of Noel Lee's sensitive, poetic delivery. A three star rating.

RECORDS AND RECORDINGS (3/55): Ives' Sonata is one of the longest, most difficult to play, and greatest modern works of its kind. The performance by Noel Lee is wholly admirable. His technique is brilliant.

FM GUIDE: Ives' Piano Sonata is a fascinating work that is easily accessible and very characteristic of the entire Ives' idiom. The Victor/Masselos' version may have the slight edge but Noel Lee is extremely proficient in this genre and the low price makes it a highly recommendable disc in any pianistic collection.

MOZART: Symphonies No. 38 & 39. Berlin Radio Symphony Orchestra/Lorin Maazel. Philips PHS 900-158

RECORDS AND RECORDINGS (6/40): There are more compelling versions of both symphonies to be had but it is possible that Maazel's more relaxed approach may strike some people as preferable.

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE (2/998): Maazel's tempi are unobjectionable and the balance pleasing but the phrasing is diffident. Also, the sound is restricted.

THE GRAMOPHONE (5/580): All in all, I enjoyed much of this Mozart playing. There are, in general, straightforward performances, except that of the "Prague" (No. 39) where, in the first movement, he loses momentum to a dangerous degree. Tame, yes, that's the word for a lot of what I have just been listening to.


FM GUIDE: While these performances can be recommended as generally good, I doubt that they will become anyone's favorites. Maazel is undoubtedly a first class conductor but his cool, intellectual approach, somewhat similar to Erich Leinsdorf, works to his disadvantage in Mozart.

hat the experts report is the best of musical, dramatic and other events — as reviewed by prominent publications in the field.

MAY 7. "Slaughter on Tenth Avenue" — N.Y. City Ballet — New York State Theater.

FM GUIDE: If the revival of a 1936 Broadway musical "ballet" succeeds in showing the remarkable growth of our most talented choreographer, the versatility of one of our most promising ballerinas and prompts an usually undemonstrative benefit audience into nostalgic applause, it perhaps deserves a showing or two. But as a serious entry into the New York City Ballet repertory during the entire Spring season, it accomplishes little mode. Jo Melziner's devil-red barroom set accentuates the sexy dancing of Suzanne Farrell and Mitchell but the choreography presents no challenge, except exuberance, to this youthful but seasoned pair. The silly-plotted ballet seems even sillier outside the framework of "On Your Toes" from which it was taken. If "camp" is your cup, "Slaughter" can be fun for the less discriminating balletomane.

N.Y. TIMES: "Slaughter" is certainly an oddly puerile work to put into a ballet repertory. It was a joke ballet to start with. And the strange thing is that today—whatever it was when it was first created—it is not even good of its kind. Balanchine choreography is musical but here very dated. If the magic name of Balanchine were not attached to "Slaughter" it would be very probably mocked off the stage.

NEW YORKER: "Slaughter" represents Balanchine in a more robust and slightly less exacting style than the style we have become accustomed to. The cast danced agreeably enough but Mitchell was no match for Ray Bolger nor was Miss Farrell anything like Tamara Geva, though her high kicks were charming.

VARIETY: "Slaughter" seemed subdued by everything that has since followed in dance show biz and in Balanchine's own career and emerged mostly as amusing nostalgia, theatrical memoribilia and a showcase for the Balanchine favorite ballerina, Suzanne Farrell. On his own merits, Mitchell showed impressive versatility. He was jazzy, free, authoritative if "simulating" tap rather than producing the beat and sound. MAY 2. "Cyrano de Bergerac" (Rostand), Robert Symonds, Philip Bosco, Dennis Cooney, Suzanne Grossmann, Nancy Marchand—Vivian Beaumont Theater.

FM GUIDE: For their fourth and final play of the season, the Lincoln Center Repertory Theater has come up with a new English version by James Forsyth of "Cyrano de Bergerac" that ranks with their Saint Joan and is superior to their "Tiger at the Gates." In the title role, Robert Symonds, stepping in on short notice for the ailing Richard Basehart, is excellent and offers further proof that in a good solid repertory company, there is probably no need for outside stars in the first place. Though he can hardly be considered a memorable Cyrano, he portrays all facets of the tragi-comic hero with a competent, polished style. These same words migh well apply to the entire company for competence and a certain professional style is what we have come to expect of this company rather than dazzling performances or dramatic innovations. While everything they have done this year has been worthwhile, there will have to be a raising of standards and more variety in the repertory if the interest of the public is to be sustained. In the large supporting company, Philip Bosco must be mentioned for his excellent Comte de Guiche. Only Suzanne Grossmann, as Roxanne, failed to realize all the potentialities of her part. The settings by David Hays and costumes of James Hart Stearns were most commendable and Carl Weber's skillful direction compensated for the limitations of the thrust stage. This "Cyrano" is worth reviving and worth seeing.

VARIETY: The Repertory Center has given the Rostand swashbucklers an excellent production. Symonds is a good, solid actor and give a strong performance that builds steadily to a stirring and affecting climax. His portrayal has dimension and progressive conviction.

N.Y. TIMES: The acting, while never as much as brilliant, is never less than adequate. It is unfair to say it, but as a performance Mr. Symonds' portrayal lacked magic. Admirers of "Cyrano" should find this new production not too disillusioning but it is unlikely to draw many new adherents.

N.Y. NEWS: This is a satisfactory revival. Symonds is not as tall as he might be, or as dashing, but he has a crisp command of his role. "Cyrano" is still capable of maintaining a hold on an audience today.

NEW YORKER: It is a charming toy of a play and also, I would have thought, an irresistible one, but the Lincoln Center Repertory Company has proved me wrong—The production currently on view at the Vivian Beaumont Theater is very easy to resist. Symonds' Cyrano has something of the air of a Yankee cracker-barrel philosopher. The rest of the cast runs the usual repertory gamut from good to bad. MAY 3. Philadelphia Orchestra/Eugene Ormandy; Martina

Arroyo, soprano; Rutgers University Choir—Carnegie Hall.

FM GUIDE: The two major portions of this program, which began with a beautifully balanced reading of Beethoven's "Coriolanus" Overture, were Poulenc's "Gloria" and Bruckner's Fourth Symphony. Both are considered among the most popular and accessible works of each composer. "Gloria" is a modern masterpiece and contains some very moving and ethereal music. Ormandy, predictably enough, gave it a very lush interpretation that was excellent on its own terms but I felt a somewhat leaner tone would have been more appropriate. Also the Rutgers Choir gave the allimportant choral sections a bouncing, cheerful sound that was more weighty and outgoing than I prefer in this work. Martina Arroyo, who is fast becoming the most versatile soprano around, was superb and sang the difficult, high lying passages with total aplomb and equal loveliness of tone. In both recordings and live performances, Bruckner has come into his own today and I can think of no better introduction to his music than the unaffected and splendid interpretation that Ormandy gives to this relatively brief, for Bruckner, and noble work. It will be interesting to judge Mr. Ormandy's qualifications as a Brucknerian if he decides to program some of the more epic symphonies next season.

N.Y. TIMES: "Gloria" was beautifully performed. Ormandy projected both the buoyant and tender sides of the score. Arroyo sang with becoming restraint and sensitivity, while the vibrancy of her voice added an appropriate glow to the music. Ormandy's reading (Buckner) was as near to being impeccable as is humany possible.

NEW YORKER: The chorus sang as well as usual and Miss Arroyo managed the difficult solo part with beautiful vocal quality, displaying again the extraordinary richness and spectacular range of voice that she has shown many times in the past. The concert concluded with a suave performance of Bruckner's Fourth Symphony. The orchestra could not have played better.

MAY 8. Mildred Miller, mezzo-soprano-Town Hall.

FM GUIDE: Like all really fine recitalists Mildred Miller has the ability to communicate the heart of a song. She did this especially well with Berg's tempestuous "Die Nachtigall" and Hugo Wolf's coquettish "Singet nicht in Trauertönen" (Philine's song from the Mignonlieder). In terms of diction and vocal color Miss Miller is an artist of considerable merit, but it is certainly lamentable that she has permitted shallow, hooty breathing to mar an otherwise commendable technique. A large and affectionate audience demanded many encores, among them a flawlessly sung Strauss "Ständchen".

N.Y. TIMES: The irrepressible mezzo took on a formidable all-German program and could have carried the day on her healthy charm alone. Some of the richness is gone from Miss Miller's voice these days and some of the Schubert was rather broad. She reached interpretative heights in just those songs that required the most probing. Mignon's "Kennst du dast Land" proved to be the emotional crest of the night.

MAY 14. The Jewels —; N. Y. C. Ballet — State Theater.

FM GUIDE: Balanchine's highly polished, beautifully faceted "Jewels" continues to triumph even with many cast changes. Kay Mazzo and Suki Schorer lacked the ultimate ease and elegance in "Emeralds" (the Fauré music demands a languid grandeur), but danced with vivacity; John Prinz, in the same work, astounded with his brooding intensity and virtuosity — he is clearly the next "big" dancer in the company. Paul Mejia, replacing Villella in "Rubies", missed some of the comic buoyancy of his role, but danced very well indeed as did the stylish Patricia McBride. Suzanne Farrell's beauty and control in "Diamonds" defy superlatives. She has gained new authority since the first performance and the savage technical requirements of the role are brilliantly met. Jacques d'Amboise was a perfect partner.

N.Y. TIMES: "Jewels" is lovely and fantastic. It lifts the heart. Miss Schorer seemed all aqueous glitter, like rippling blue and green water in bright sunlight. Mr. Mejia, replacing Edward Villella, bounced with a good natured finesse. He stressed the mercurial nimbleness of the role and did very promisingly indeed. The "Diamonds" pas de deux (was) proudly and authoritatively danced by Suzanne Farrell and Jacques d'Ambroise.

MAY 15. New York City Ballet. "Pas de Deux and Divertissement"; "Strawinsky: Symphony in C"; "Jeux"; "La Sonnambula" — New York State Theater.

FM GUIDE: Why is it that when dancers perform abstract ballets these days, they tend to be so abstract themselves that those watching feel no rapport with them or response from them? Just because there may not be a story line, per se, does not mean that there should be a lack of emotional value or communication. Unfortunately, I have found that the bodies may move perfectly, perhaps even brilliantly, but that nothing glows from the movement into the face and into the personal quality of the dancer. Therefore, in watching John Clifford's clever and wittily

Therefore, in watching John Clifford's clever and wittily conceived ballet to Strawinsky's Symphony in C, with the exception of Marnee Morris' warmth in the First Movement and the fleeting archness of John Prinz in the Allegretto, I failed to feel anything that brought to mind the word, "theater". All the soloists were technically outstanding, but they just did not perform in the true sense of the meaning. Ballanchine's Pas de Deux and Divertissement should be a tongue-in-cheek spoof of the Delibes style of ballet, but there was a shade too much exaggeration in its presentation to carry it off. Allegra Kent forced the humor more than she had to but Jacques d'Amboise "kidded it" gently, and as a result, he was more successful. The costumes of the corps were extremely garish and unbecoming which also helped to lessen the needed light effect.

The moment that the principals entered the stage in "Jeux", magic took over. Melissa Hayden is still a marvel of projection and dances now, even more beautifully than before, if that is possible. With an intense Edward Villella and a most perceptive Allegra Kent, she joined in making this ballet so poignant and touching that it made the whole evening worthwhile. John Taras' evocative ballet never looked better.

La Sonnambula closed the program and was lifted above the the ordinary by an incandescent Suzanne Farrell who floated so exquisitely that it was a dream.

N.Y. TIMES: This (Strawinsky: Symphony in C) is a choreographic monster—a work of such feebleness that one takes into account the youth of the choreographer, contemplates it, and decides, after all, who, at this particular level, is counting. Clifford has failed in a manner that can only charitably be described as miserable. "Jeux" is a ballet that, with Proust-like music, powerfully evokes a place and period, and the cast, Miss Kent, Miss Hayden and Mr. Villella give it with an effortless polish.

MAY 16. New York Philharmonic/Leonard Bernstein; Sena Jurniac, Betty Allen, John Alexander, McHenry Boatwright; Schola Cantorum — Philharmonic Hall.

FM GUIDE: Elizabeth Schwarzkopf once told me that every great singer has a vocal timbre that is immediately identifiable after the first few notes and I have found this statement to be true whether you are speaking of Corelli, Tucker, Price, Milanov or Tebaldi. Strangely enough. Sena Jurniac, who is a major artist, often sings well without making any impression. Such was the case last evening as she made her New York Debut in Strauss' "Four Last Songs" and as part of the quartet in Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. She was most disappointing in the former where she seemed bothered by the high, floating tessitura of the music and was unable to project her voice over the orchestra. Yet, one felt that if she could have been heard, the style would have been appropriate. Things were much better in the Symphony where all the singers were excellent and Bernstein gave a balanced reading that carefully blended the lyric sections of the music with the more extroverted and vivacious sections. The chorus sang with impressive strength, particularly the sopranos and the finale was the exciting climax it should be.

N.Y. TIMES: Jurinac is a very special artist. She sang the Strauss songs with a poise and serenity that matched their elegiac mood. They were a well-matched quartet. The chorus served its purpose well. Mr. Bernstein gave the symphony a mature, balanced reading that still held all the excitement of which he is capable.

SATURDAY REVIEW: Her (Jurinac) performance of the solo part in the "Last Songs" of Strauss (was) among the best that have ever been heard here. Temperamentally, it (Beethoven's Ninth) was more often theatrical than dramatic and showy rather than compelling. Jurinac did well what the soprano is required to do, but the other members of the quartet tended to go their own ways with coalescing into an entity. MAY 22. Bolshoi Ballet — Metropolitan Opera House.

FM GUIDE: Incredibly enough, within a period of five days New Yorkers had the opportunity of seeing the New York City Ballet, the Royal Ballet, Covent Garden, the Bolshoi Ballet and the Martha Graham Dance Company. What a feast for balletomanes, particularly with the American Ballet Theatre also in town rehearsing for an upcoming season. Actually, we are not seeing the entire Bolshoi Ballet but stars of the Bolshoi in a program of excerpts and highlights. The extended portions of this program were Act II of "Giselle" and "Ballet School." In the former were Marina Kondratieva as Giselle and Nicolai Fadeyechev as Albrecht with the ballerina especially outstanding. Maya Plisetskaya, the undisputed star of the company, danced with complete bravura and confidence in the vulgar choreography of "Don Quixote" and the excellent but overdone "Dying Swan." I could not help but feel that other excerpts would have displayed her virtuosity in a better light. Ludmila Vlasova and Stanislav Vlasov repeated their highly popular "Doves" to great applause but the audience favorite was Yuri Vladimirov who danced with his wife, Nina Sorokina, in "The Flames of Paris." His every appearance was greeted by gasps and bravos from the audience which was spellbound by his dazzling leaps tnd turns. How he would fare in more classic roles is a moot question but the technical proficiency and tremendous athleticism of his performance would be difficult to surpass. "Ballet School" brought the long evening to a charming and most entertaining end.


N.Y. POST: If last night's program is an example, the audience is getting as much dance as anyone would want. The only dull moments last night were in "Giselle". Most spectacular of all are Nina Sorokina and Yuri Vladimirov in "The Flames of Paris." He does things you've never seen before. Kondratieva is superlative. "Ballet School" gives everyone in the company a chance to astonish with their superior technique.

N.Y. TIMES: To be sure, it can dance as well as any company in the world, but in a town like New York choreographic artistry and completeness are expected as well as sheer dance virtuosity. If we were sensible we would be thrilled. But if we were honest, we would be a little disappointed. Let me rush to add that for lovers of great dancing there was a quantity of great dancing to love.

MAY 23. New York Philharmonic/Leonard Bernstein; Eileen Farrell; James King; Michael Langdon — Philharmonic Hall.

FM GUIDE: This program offered a welcome opportunity to hear Roy Harris' brief, one act Symphony No. 3, a work with which Bernstein has been increasingly identified since he reviewed the work at its 1938 premiere by the Boston Symphony and only recently recorded. It is a beautiful work, very American in its mood and at times, very reminiscent of Ives. Bernstein's Act I of Wagner's "Die Walkure" was at the other end of the dynamic range of Karajan's chamber style interpretation. This was the traditional big sound approach and it was a delicious treat to hear the music played with such richness and accuracy. The vocalists were another matter. Neither Farrell nor King have ever been noted as highly emotional performers and their lack of involvement, coupled with the normal inhibitions of a concert performance, robbed the music of a great deal of its tension and impact. There were also portions of the score where Bernstein opted for some very leisurely tempi. However, both Farrell and King were in excellent voice and the end results were highly gratifying.

N.Y. TIMES: He strove for the line, for the color and drama of the score, and he managed to achieve it while remaining

on a high level of musicianship. This is the way Wagner should sound. It was some of the finest singing Farrell has done in years. King's voice is a trifle small for the role and when he tried for a heldentenor quality, he merely forced. Elsewhere his work was admirable—in pitch, in style, smoothly projected.

MAY 28. Ernst Haefliger, tenor - Carnegie Hall.

FM GUIDE: Ernst Haefliger, who has established a formidable reputation as a lieder and oratorio singer, was heard in a program of Franz Schubert's *Die Schone Mullerin*. The songs were a perfect vehicle for Mr. Haefliger's beautifully controlled tenor voice. With seemingly effortless vocal dexterity, Haefliger brought Schubert's musical genius to full realization, injecting each song with beautiful interpretation. His dynamic range was clearly evident in *Morgengruss* and the final selection *Des Baches Wiegenlied*, which was exquisite. The songs, performed without intermission (applause being held until the end) resulted in a wonderfully sustained mood throughout the recital. Paul Ulanowsky provided Mr. Haefliger with sensitive and excellent accompaniment. **N.Y. POST:** Haefliger, as he has proved to us many times before, is a superb artist. The combination of his fastidious musicianship with his blend of intensity, discipline and restraint, made the evening something to be long remembered. Paul Ulanowsky at the piano was a most sensitive collaborator. This was chamber music in the best sense.







The woofer cone in a very small enclosure must move a long way to provide all the bass you want to hear. In the new E-V EIGHT, for instance, the 6-inch cone moves back and forth over one-half inch. But in most woofers something strange happens as it moves. It whistles!

You see, the air trapped inside the speaker is literally "pumped" in and out past the voice coil. The whistle is almost inevitable. Except, that is, in the E-V EIGHT.

We did two things almost nobody else bothers to do. First, we vented the woofer. Air can't be trapped inside. Then we punched six big holes in the voice coil form. Air can't be pumped back and forth. And that's how the E-V EIGHT lost its whistle (and gained almost 2 db extra efficiency in the low bass in the bargain)!

The E-V EIGHT tweeter was another story. We aimed to eliminate the "buzz" and "fuzz" so typical of modestly priced speaker systems. What was needed was a better way to control cone motion at very high frequencies. And it literally took years of testing to solve the problem.

The answer looks deceptively simple. We put a ring of short-fiber polyester felt behind the cone, and a precisely measured amount of viscous vinyl damping compound under the edge. Plus a light-weight aluminum voice coil to extend the range to the limits of your hearing. Highs are remarkably uniform and as clean as a (oops!) whistle! Even the E-V EIGHT enclosure is unusual. Examine the walnut grain carefully, especially at the corners. It's a perfect match because we have one long piece of wood, folded to form the cabinet! And we add a clear vinyl shield on every finished surface, to protect the E-V EIGHT from the mars and scratches of day-to-day living.

There are so many good ideas inside the tiny new E-V EIGHT, you may wonder how we found room for them all. Chalk it up to top-notch engineering talent and facilities, plus a very real dedication to the ideal of better value in every product.
