## HER PRAYER WAS ANSWERED . . .

WHEN Arizona-born Mary Jane MacConnell appeared in her wheelchair to sing at Blue Network studios in Hollywood Radio City, the event represented much more than just another audition for the "Tune Out Time" broadcasts. It meant, rather, that the magic portals of radio had swung open in answer to the prayer Mary had carried in her heart, from the time she was a little girl, to sing on the airplanes. For from the age of seven, Mary Jane had worked and prayed that she might some day do two things. One was to walk and do the things other girls did, and the other was to sing on the radio. Mary Jane, born with the gift of song in her heart, began to sing before she was three. Then, when she was seven, she was stricken with infantile paralysis. But even that couldn't kill her love for music. She continued to sing through the years, clung courageously to her dream of one day singing on the radio. She worked and got ready for that day, and when the opportunity for an audition came, Mary was ready to deliver. Even though she had never taken a singing lesson in her life, her talent was such that seasoned studio men who listened were impressed by the quality of her lovely soprano voice. Xavier Cugat, broadcasting from the studios that night, heard Mary and asked to be introduced. The rest of the evening she was his special guest. And Arnold Maguire, emcee and writer-director of "Tune Out Time," im-

mediately engaged her for a broadcast of his program, on which she appeared June 20.

Naturally, when her prayer to sing over the radio was answered, Mary Jane was happy; but her biggest thrill was in knowledge of the fact that her radio bow was a network appearance which enabled her father in Arizona, and her brother, a defense worker in San Francisco, to hear her sing for the first time on the airplanes.

Promise of her second prayer fulfillment, in so far as her health is concerned, began a year and a half ago when Mary Jane, then 20, was brought to California by her mother, in the hope that she might be healed. For here, Mary Jane became a member of the courageously active group at the Milton Berry Foundation, the infantile paralysis correction center at Encino, California, which, like the one sponsored by President Roosevelt at Warm Springs, Georgia, is famous the world over. Since that time, Mary Jane has shown tremendous improvement in health, with every day bringing her nearer the goal she achieved when she broadcast on "Tune Out Time."

For her spirit to succeed never wavered. That's why we presume to say that President Roosevelt would commend the courage of Mary Jane MacConnell, the pretty dark-haired girl from Arizona who created a sensation even in Hollywood. For Mary never let the song in her heart die, even when her physical being was stricken; and who, today, is showing the spirit which every American needs in order to fight through this war to ultimate victory!—The Editors.

## A Gob in 1917, Rudy Vallee Sees Little Change in Navy's Discipline Then and Now

MAN has more or less conquered the land, but although he has progressed in means of transportation by water, the inscrutable mystery of the sea still challenges his fighting spirit. The rhythmic beat of waves against the shore still sing a song of unknown adventure in far-away lands. That, I think, is one big reason why service in the United States Navy holds such a fascination for America's youth, now that the world is again at war. Why the man who is already a sailor says, "It's great to be Navy!" Too, radio has made American boys know and understand the importance of keeping the world's sealanes open, and they mean to fight to keep them that way. At least that's how I see it as I look back to the days I was a gob in World War I. These facts were borne home to me in this momentous year of 1942, when it was my good pleasure to be

made an honorary flying cadet of the United States Naval Air Forces by officers of the Naval Reserve Aviation Base at Long Beach, California. Comparing my own experiences in 1917 with what happens to a boy now as he enters the Navy, I found little change in the fundamentals of training. Now, as then, recruits get their first taste of real responsibility. There's the same rigorous discipline which makes a sailor on any sea-going craft know what he is to do, and how to do it with speed and thoroughness. 1942 training still teaches self-reliance in all emergencies. The lessons I learned in 1917 during naval training days I still appreciate for the good influence they had on my later life. And I believe that boys in the naval service today will feel the same way when they look back, as I am doing now, and say, "It's great to be Navy!"

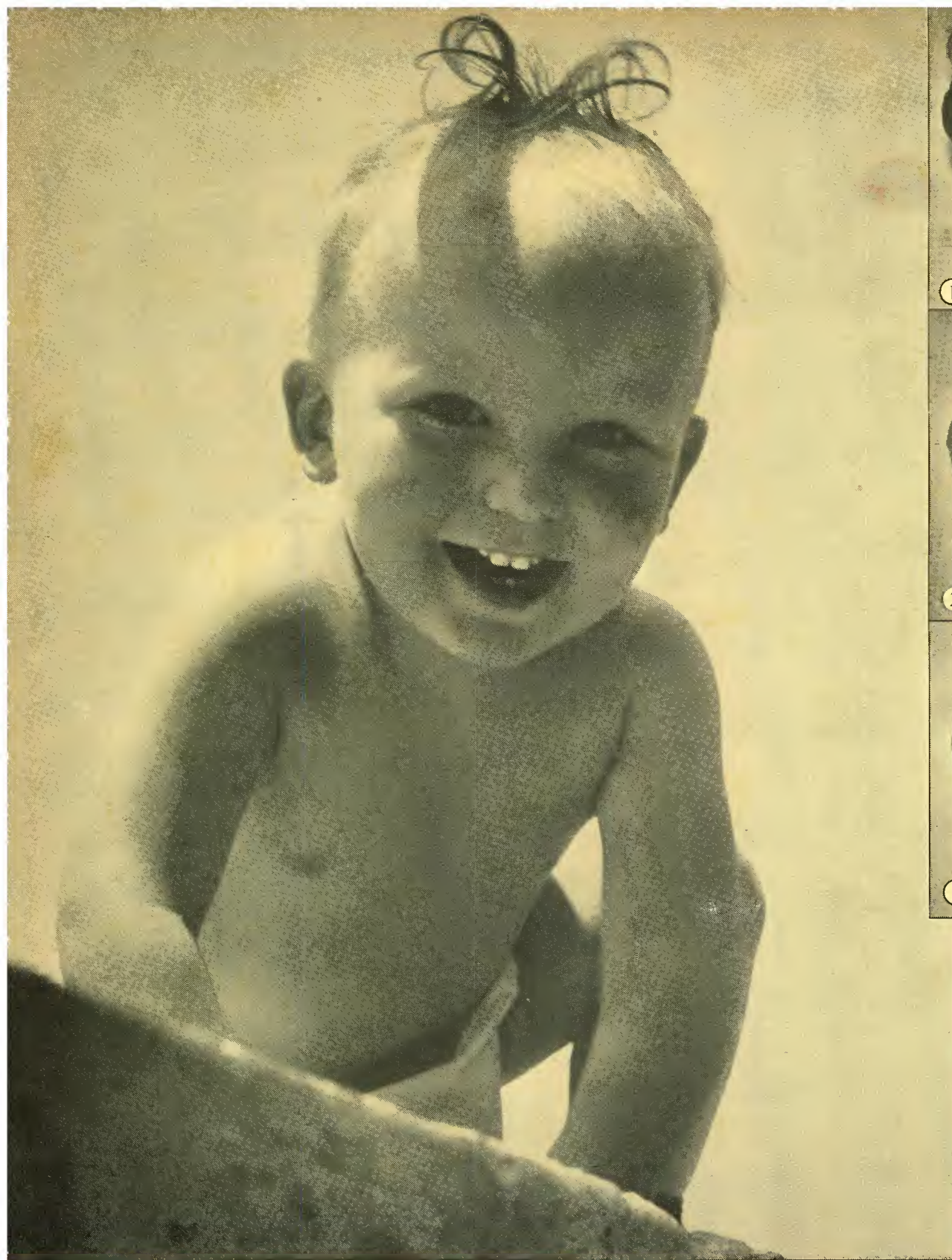
"I think I'll keep it," I said, and I really meant it!

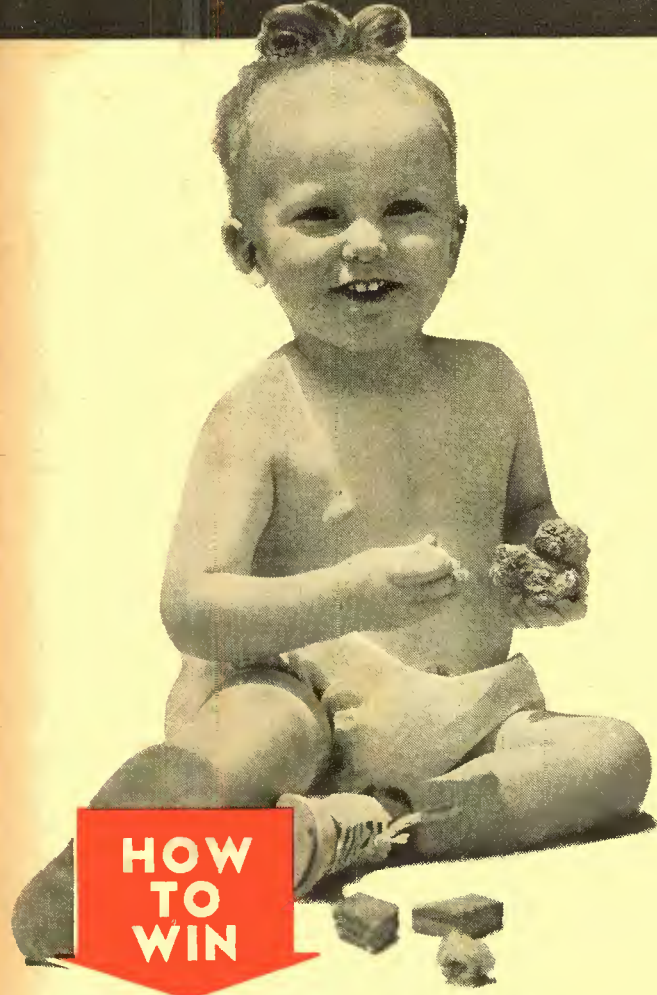

## O'Keefe Lines Up Top Talent for "Star Spangled Vaudeville"; Bernie's Show Gives Engineers Jitters; Important Advertisers Return to Air

### WASHINGTON

Do you remember Munro Leaf, the gentleman who gave us the whimsical character, Ferdinand the Bull? Expect no such timidity from the pen of that gifted writer for "the duration." He is Major Munro Leaf now, a soldier in the Army of the United States, and a person who, when he writes, spits fire and brimstone . . .

Washington is becoming a favorite locale for Hollywood movie-makers. Day in and day out, some director can be seen scooting down some side street with a car loaded with cameras, lights and paraphernalia. Now the town is being combed for glamorous secretaries. Six of the most attractive will be given roles in the new Bob Hope-Dorothy Lamour picture, "They Got Me Covered."

Which, to this writer, is sabotage of the war effort. Secretaries of whatever sort, curvaceous or skinny, are so difficult to find that I promise to shoot on sight any screen-scout seen skulking about the premises. As a matter of fact, any hard-pressed veteran of this stenographer famine will trade you six glamour girls and a second lieutenant for just one good student of Mr. Pitman's pothooks . . .

Note for Hollywood: When you see Bill Wyler next, come to attention and salute. He is Major William Wyler and has already forgotten that he made "Mrs. Miniver," possibly the greatest propaganda film of this war. His assignment will be with the Air Force.

Down here, in the days before Pearl Harbor, there was a tendency for officers to ask each other what they did before coming into the Army. That is over now. Everyone knows that the big job is that of soldiering, that backgrounds must be forgotten now, and the grim art of war mastered in the shortest possible time. Answering questions such as "What did you do before?" is a waste of time . . .

Mark Sandrich is the capable fellow who has teamed with Irving Berlin in his last four musicals. Their new "Holiday Inn" will be on the screen soon. Mark arrived here the other day with two ideas on his mind. The first was to do a picture about the Red Cross; the second was to do a film version of Berlin's "This Is the Army."

Sandrich is a persuasive, intent man with hands and eyes that contribute to the effect of his great enthusiasm. He is terribly earnest about showing the people of this country some of the lesser-known facts about the Red Cross. Perhaps that is the reason that Red Cross officials who talked to him changed one of their basic policies and are now considering a film which will be produced under Sandrich's direction.

As for the Army film, several companies wanted to make it. Up to the last minute, nobody knew who would be the winner. On July 4, when "This Is the Army" raised its curtain on Broadway before a group of the most distinguished people in America, Irving Berlin announced that he had just sold the motion-picture rights for the sum of \$250,000, every

penny of which would go to Army Emergency Relief . . .

A good many years ago I wrote a story on Marlene Dietrich and a fellow named Adolf Shickelgruber, who offered her half his kingdom if she would return to Germany and make pictures for the Greater Reich. Even then, when a part of the world still thought Hitler was not too great a menace, she spurned his offer and made plans to become an American citizen. I haven't the pleasure of Miss Dietrich's acquaintance, but mutual friends tell me she will go anywhere at any time to help sell a war bond which will defeat the Axis. I have run into her in many cities and at odd places, each time giving all of her charm and glamour in order that bonds may be bought by the score. I wonder if she ever thinks of that offer of Hitler's when he begged her to become the First Lady of Germany's theater . . .

Quite a few years ago Harlow Wilcox spent an anxious few weeks debating the problem of whether or not he should go to Hollywood with the Fibber McGee show. He was already a huge success in Chicago, had all the work he could handle and doubted that he could make much of a dent in the West Coast radio world. If Fibber McGee should fold, he would be out of a job and in a town where he was unknown. Of course "Fibber" didn't fold but became the most popular program on the air. Now the news is that Wilcox, who has since collected jobs on other programs also, is announced as signed to play a

part in the RKO picture, "All for Fun." We predict a screen career if the camera catches his personality. It is robust, breezy and gay, just the sort to take a tired audience's mind off the war.

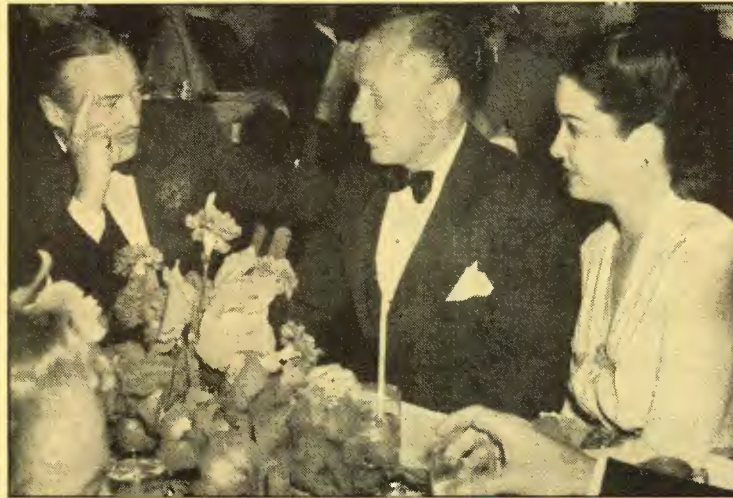

The old-timers said, "Chicago's a dead town for radio news." So I looked properly sad and impressed and went out to see for myself. Maybe they're right. Maybe I'm naive or something. But I find the riverfront beat that covers Chicago network studios newswful, exciting — all right, doggone it, thrilling . . .

Blue seems a good starting place, perched in the Merchandise Mart. Very impressive, the appropriately blue uniforms on the pages (but what a letdown to discover that NBC-Red doesn't have red pages). Anyway, there's a fine story at Blue. Horace Heidt's new show Sundays, is done without a cent of pay, just as an excuse to give servicemen and their gals a chance to come to rehearsals, kibitz with the Heidt crew and then see the broadcast. Incidentally, you get an hour of good music, but Horace is thinking mostly of the boys in uniform . . .

Next stop, NBC. I have trouble getting past the lovely, gadget-packed recording-room that stirs the heart of any electric-train-playing, steam-shovel-watching male. "Bachelor's Children" is rolling smoothly in its morning lead-off spot, and a crowded control-room behind a hand-wagging director is a fine place to sit. After-broadcast chatter produces the following yarn about the show: Few weeks ago, Marjorie Hannan, who plays Ruth Ann Graham, was expecting a baby (in real life). Authoress Bess Flynn prepared to write Marjorie out of the script by giving her character a script-baby at the same time she was having the real one. But the real baby jumped the gun, arrived a month ahead of time, a few hours before a broadcast. Producer-announcer Russ Young was ready for the emergency. He simply punched Mrs. Young in the ribs, pulled her out of bed and took her along to rehearsal to play the Ruth part. Mrs. Young, it so happens, is Laurette Fillbrandt, actress in "Lone Journey." Scripts were writ-

ten so far in advance that it was two weeks before Ruth could be sent to the hospital and the fictional version adjusted to the real-life situation . . .

Next stop is the marble shack on Michigan Boulevard which houses CBS. Bernie's show must be giving engineers gray hairs. The Ol' Maestro's so popular that executives, clerks and page-girls (lovely, too) drift in and out of the studio to grab glimpses of his show. This makes for unpredictable sound-effects such as scuffling feet and the clang of a telephone that stands on a desk just outside the studio door . . .

Across the street, Mutual squats in the shadow of the Tribune Tower. The boys there are tickled because Guy Savage, MBS sports announcer, is clicking as a song-writer. His "Wait at the Gate for Me, Kate" is set for early airing, and four other Savage tunes will soon be published . . .

So Chicago's a dead town! Not by a long shot! I like this beat, and I hope you'll like walking it with me.

# NBC SYMPHONY PREMIERES SHOSTAKOVICH'S "SEVENTH SYMPHONY," SUNDAY

Music by Composers of Enemy Nationality Creates a Problem for Listeners;  
One Audition Won Songstress Nancy Norman a Contract With Sammy Kaye

SEVERAL letters have reached this desk asking the writer's opinion on a subject of topical interest. Question: Are we to continue to listen to German and Italian works, particularly operas, on the radio or elsewhere in this country while we are at war with these peoples? One lady says, "It appears to me that the production of German and Italian operas, or even excerpts from such compositions, is not altogether in the present American spirit. We must cultivate a hatred of our enemies. Do you believe that a music-lover can be truly American if he exposes himself to music by men of enemy nationality? Wouldn't the fact that such music is by a German or Italian—let's skip the Japanese, we never hear their stuff anyway—have some influence which might win him over to an alien way of thinking?"

In answer, the first thing that comes to mind, strangely enough, is a question: Can a listener separate a composer's nationality from the music and reserve for himself the right to enjoy the purely musical thought in a work?

I think he can do so. Let us remember, first, that the great masterworks were written long before the advent of Hitlers and Mussolinis and others of their ilk. And it seems rather obvious, to say the least, that the Wagners and the Verdis were not doing a lot of anachronistic drum-beating for the cause of nazism or fascism.

Perhaps it may not be generally known that Wagner became associated early in his career with a revolution-ary movement, a people's revolution-

ary movement. He was deeply stirred by it, for in this popular uprising he saw the emergence of a new theater of opera, a theater reconstructed to meet the requirements of a reformed society. Both as man and artist he wel-

comed the opportunity to join in a fight against despotic restrictions. That the revolt was short-lived has no bearing on the matter. Wagner, after all, was a part of it and a very active part of it, at that.

Verdi, too, had his strong democratic beliefs. For many years the Italian people, suffering untold cruelties under the Austrian yoke, rebelliously

sang inflammatory songs from his operas. Every opportunity they had they sang them. Those were the symbols of a people's desire to be free.

How, therefore, can one attribute to these men—long dead, and German and Italian, respectively, though they were—the seduction of our feelings for America. Furthermore, their works have become almost too internationally known. If their music has had any propaganda value at all, it has been in the interest of music—which doesn't sound too involved, I trust.

The writers of the letters have been motivated, I am quite aware, by the most noble impulses. They have seen what they thought was a threat to our freedom and they have rushed to safeguard this most cherished of ideals. However, in their precipitate patriotism they have overlooked certain unwelcome implications. To do away with all German and Italian music for the duration smacks, I should think, of something singularly allied with the tenets of a gruesome theory, a "blood and earth" theory with all its wicked ramifications. To employ these means of preserving our liberty would be, in effect, to arrive at Americanism through blatantly totalitarian methods. The American way is not the totalitarian way.

We might as well do away with the Fifth Symphony of the German Beethoven, the "V for Victory" Symphony, you know; we might as well do away with the rich treasure of liturgical pieces written by the early Italians. It has been said that music knows no nationalistic boundaries, that it transcends human confines. We must remember that.

IMAGINE the dismay of a full-fledged chanteuse when a saleslady in a department store says to her, after one look, "Perhaps, you'd better try the children's department." However, the chanteuse, Nancy Norman, must put up with such things. After all, isn't she only

four feet ten inches tall, and doesn't she weigh only 100 pounds, and isn't she only seventeen years of age?

Miss Norman, as you may have learned, is the new vocalist with the Sammy Kaye orchestra. She joined the band last May, but she hasn't given up her education. Just as soon as she gets her bearings in New York—where the band is currently performing—she intends to enroll at a professional children's school.

Born in Los Angeles, which she never left until last May, Miss Norman soon acquainted all and sundry with her musical talents. She did some singing at her mother's lodge and other social affairs. The idea of becoming a professional didn't occur to her till she tuned in to an amateur radio program and decided then and there that not only could she do better but she would make a career of doing better, a professional career. So there!

The young woman walked into the studio one fine day and asked to be heard at one of the "open auditions" given before actual program time. Result was that she made eight successive appearances on that program. She was then only thirteen. For the next couple of years Miss Norman did a lot of singing with "new talent" groups, amateur revues and the like.

The spot of soloist with the high-school band next came to her, and it was while appearing with this unit, at a school prom, that Maestro Kaye heard her. Dropping in on the dance at the suggestion of Skitch Henderson, NBC pianist and coach, the leader saw, heard and departed without introducing himself. Next day, Miss Norman received a brief message asking her to appear at the 20th Century-Fox lot to see Mr. Kaye. The contract was signed (actually by Miss Norman's mother, because of the young woman's age) and thus began Nancy Norman's professional career.

Her pet dislike is shopping, as we have noted above, but one of her pet pastimes is sightseeing. She has toured extensively through Brooklyn and the Bronx, which she considers charming suburbs and just "too, too maligned by radio, press and motion pictures."

## MUSICAL EVENT OF THE YEAR!

Symphony" will be played by the NBC Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Arturo Toscanini and broadcast by NBC Coast to Coast and around the world by short-wave facilities.

Shostakovich sponsors "the curious theory" that music has a political basis, and has created a number of compositions to support this view. His "Seventh Symphony" is an eloquent indictment of Nazi tyranny and despotism, and its Western Hemisphere premiere on Sunday, July 19, stands out as the musical event of the year—and, perhaps, of this generation.



# THRILLING STORIES OF UNIVERSITY RESEARCH DRAMATIZED

War Department Plans High-School Version of "Army Hour"; Nelson Olmsted Builds Entertaining Programs Around Classic Short Stories

**H**OW is science using radio to help us win the war? Jennings Pierce was at the business end of this conversation, so it was quite natural that we should turn to this subject. Mr. Pierce, you see, has played no small part in developing an amazing science program, NBC's "Unlimited Horizons." And developing an educational program of any sort that is amazing is quite a feat. Just ask your local radio-station manager.

"Next to munitions," he began, "food is the most important war industry in the U. S. A. by Government classification. And dairy products are tops on the food list. For many years now the University of California (at Berkeley) has conducted some great experiments with dairy products and has found a great many short cuts to speed dairy production. What greater service could the university perform for the nation than to pass on to the farmers all the benefits of such experiments! It used to take years for such research by a Pacific Coast school to reach the farm producers nationally so that new ways of doing things could be put into practise.

"Radio," he added as an appropriate footnote, "now makes it possible overnight.

"In dramatizing the dairy research of the University of California on 'Unlimited Horizons' recently we did more than tell the farmer how he can speed up his production for war, or where he can find out how to do it. We also helped civilian morale by telling the civilian indirectly what colleges and universities are doing to help our soldiers win the war and our civilians to fight it at home."

By now Mr. Pierce was really warmed up to his subject.

"War," he continued, "sometimes gives words a new magic meaning. Take the word magnesium. Before the war it was just a word meaning a metallic element. I doubt if most of the people knew or cared what magnesium was. But you can bet they know, or are learning fast, today. We know now that eighty percent of the body of the best incendiary bomb yet devised by the Germans is magnesium; that magnesium can burn our house down faster than any other agent except thermite.

"The other night we did a broadcast on 'Unlimited Horizons' that must have popped listeners' ears open—not with fright but with relief. Relief that we have scientists who are seeing to it that we have plenty of magnesium with which to fight back at the Germans. Our story about 'Magnesium Hunters,' developed from Stanford University research records, was as thrilling as anything we have done to bring home a few vital war facts about war work on the scientific front.

"In cooperation with the University of California at Berkeley, Stanford University and California Institute of Technology, we started 'Unlimited Horizons' two years ago as a means of making science understandable to the layman. A few weeks ago we added the universities of Santa Clara, Ari-

zona and Nevada because they had too much good research material to pass up, especially in fields not closed to us by the war.

"You might be interested to know," he concluded, "that sixty to seventy percent of all research work now done in our western colleges and universities is now war research. Most of it we can't touch on 'Unlimited Horizons' because of secrecy surrounding research in aviation, chemicals, new machines, meteorology, the physical sciences and camouflage. But we still have plenty to do."

This is one man's answer to the question of how science is using radio to help us win the war. To this I must add the following observation: Subjects commonly considered too deep for the "average listener" are presented on "Unlimited Horizons" with a dramatic excellence that commands attention and leaves you with a profitable half-hour to your credit.

## Junior "Army Hour"

A knee-pants version of the "Army Hour" is in the making. Designed for classroom consumption in the nation's 27,000 high schools, the series will debut on the Blue Network October 6. The idea has the blessing of the National Education Association and the American Association of School Ad-

ministrators. It is interesting to note that school administrators will be urged to adjust their class schedules, if necessary, to make it possible for the program to be heard in high-school classrooms. Like the "Army Hour" (NBC, Sun), it will be an official presentation of the War Department. A weekly "Map of the World" will be sent to each of the nation's 27,000 high schools.

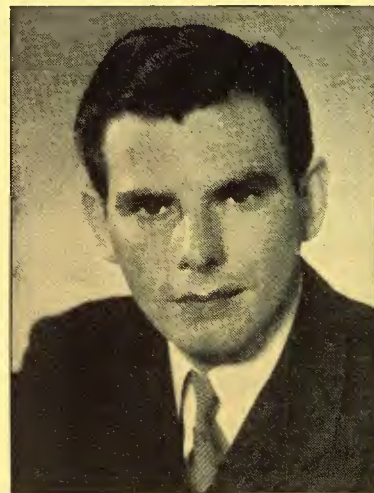
## Story-Telling Gains Favor

Nelson Olmsted's program is a brilliant example of a new type of literary broadcast that seems to be gaining favor with listeners. What makes this noteworthy is the fact that in two decades the industry has developed few outstanding programs devoted to the literary classics. The format of his program is very simple. All he does is read stories—but that's been tried many times without success.

Olmsted came to radio with an appealing voice, a sparkling personality, an idea and the ability to put it over. He began adapting stories by Edgar Allan Poe in 1934 for presentation over a Texas station. Since then he has read more than 6,000 stories over the air. He became so popular in the South that he was brought to NBC in 1940.

His trump card is the knack he possesses for choosing stories from the short classics that appeal to listeners. In his opinion there is no such thing as a mental level for radio listeners. He selects his stories accordingly and the result is an interesting quarter-hour for young and old alike.

## United Nations Keep Airways Humming From Africa and the Middle East; Roster of World-Wide Staff of NBC Foreign Correspondents

### Berlin Seeks Financial Panic

**N**AZI psychological warfare has taken a new turn. Having failed miserably in its efforts to cause distrust and suspicion between England and the United States, having failed completely in its efforts to turn us against our present Government, it now seeks to create a financial panic. Said American-born renegade "Paul Revere," in speaking from Berlin the other night, ". . . the simile 'As sound as a dollar' is no longer true. European stock exchanges and banking circles continue to manifest absolutely no interest in the British pound sterling or the American silver dollar. Soon the silver dollar will be devaluated entirely. It will be worth nothing. You are headed for national bankruptcy. Last year fourteen percent of your national income was devoted to the defense program; this year you will spend fifty percent of your national income on the war effort; next year it will be much greater. I have just one American bill left. It is a crisp ten-dollar bill. I will gladly give it to the first listener in the United States who will send me a dime (line forms to the right). Take your money out of the banks. Buy goods, buy land. In this way you will be able to withstand the crash better." So spoke the speaker from Berlin, and how the Nazis wish this bit of fanciful wishful thinking would come true. Fortunately it takes more than the ravings of a Goebbels maniac to panic the American people. I doubt if this Berlin propaganda drooling will make a single American rush to his bank and take out his money. We know it is costing us a lot of money to wage this war; it will probably cost us a lot more before we are through. We are prepared to sacrifice, to give every dollar we possibly can to win this war. If we didn't win it, we would be more than financially bankrupt, we would be morally and spiritually bankrupt as well, so go peddle your papers somewhere else, Joe Goebbels.

 News bulletins in English are broadcast at 6:00, 8:30, 10:00, 11:00 a.m., 5:30 and 7:30 p.m. EWT \* \* \*

According to London Radio, Greece had, before the war, 1,800,000 gross registered tons of merchant shipping. About 800,000 tons were lost during the fighting there, but about 800,000 tons of Greek shipping are still intact and operating today to help keep the allied shipping-lanes open.

### Radio Andorra

Several times I have mentioned reported reception of Radio Andorra, located in the tiny country of Andorra. William C. Palmer of Parma, Ohio, is the first listener, as far as I know, to hear direct from the station. In a letter censored at Barcelona, Spain, the operating schedule of the station is given as follows: 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. on 6.2 megs, 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. on 7.128, and 7:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m. EWT on 6.2 and 7.128. The exact location of the station is given as La Vieja, Andorra. It is believed that a frequency of 12.4 has replaced 6.2 megs for the summer.

### Programs Rebroadcast in Australia

The weekly short-wave radio program, "Salute to the Men in Foreign Service," sponsored by various news-

papers all over the country, is recorded and then rebroadcast at six different hours over General Electric stations WGEO and WGEA in Schenectady and KGEI in San Francisco on a time schedule arranged by the War Department when the soldiers in foreign camps will be at liberty to listen. This program is also transmitted to Australia each Sunday at 7:00 a.m. EWT over WGEO (9.53). There it is rebroadcast by long wave throughout the Commonwealth.

\* \* \*

The short-wave station at Teheran, Iran (this country may be figuring in the news more prominently any day), is operating on a new frequency of 8.22 megs daily from 12:00 noon to 3:00 p.m. EWT. From 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. EWT news bulletins in several languages including German, Italian, French and English are given. I would be glad to hear from listeners able to pick up this station.

\* \* \*

Listeners to the African service of the BBC may have noticed that two entirely separate programs are now being broadcast. One is prepared especially for British troops in North Africa and the Middle East. This is broadcast from 11:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. EWT over GSF (15.14). The alternate program, designed for general reception throughout Africa, is radiated

simultaneously over GSE (15.26), GSV (17.81), GSD (11.75), GRY (9.60).

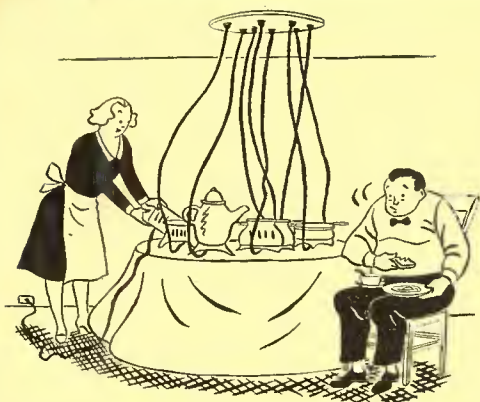

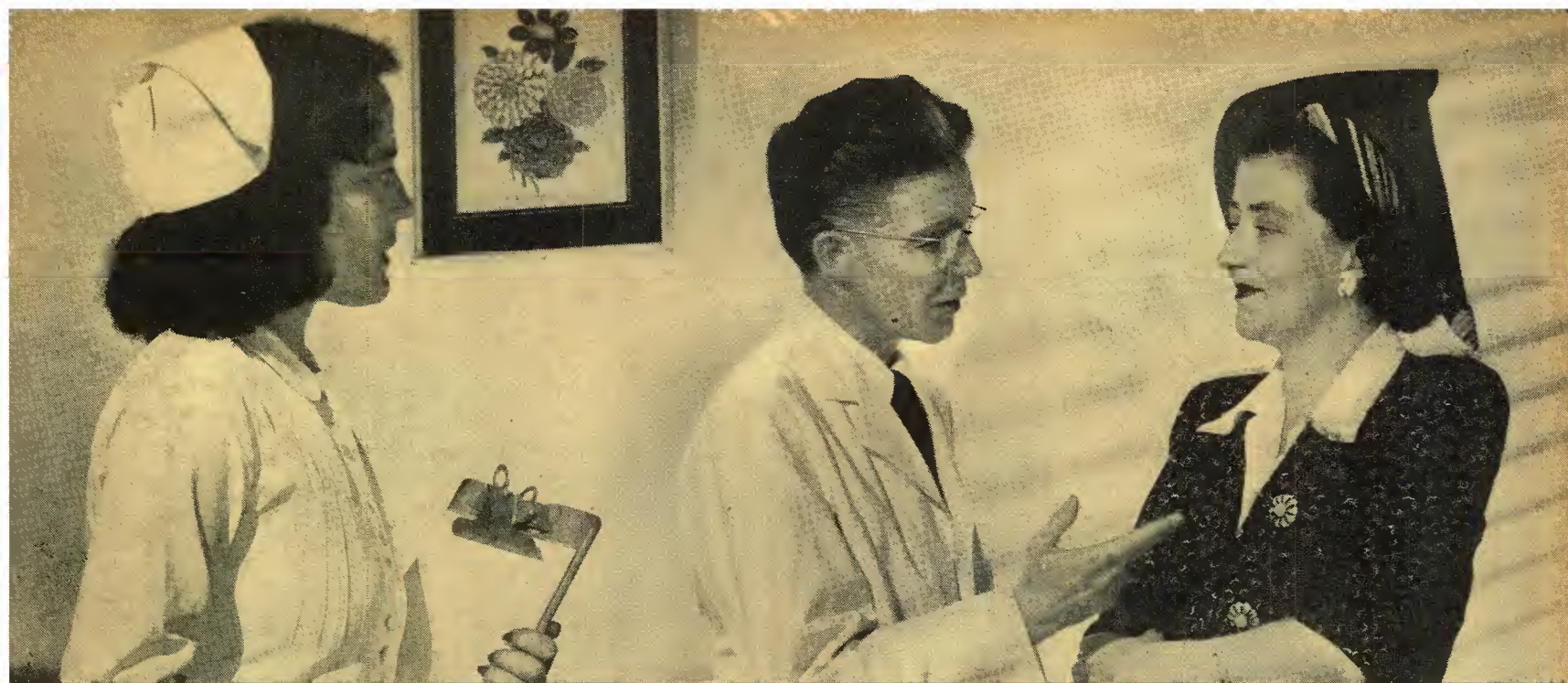

## Beauty Is Your Duty

IF YOU'RE thinking of deglamorizing yourself for Uncle Sammy's sake, consider these immortal, man-mouthed words: "Heck! Who wants to fight a war for unattractive women, anyway!" And if that doesn't take the kink out of your upper story, just remember that the cosmetics you are using—if they are on the market—will probably be tagged non-essential to the war effort. If the generals and admirals need your lipstick to lick the Japs or your cold-cream to whip the Nazis, they'll walk right up and take 'em.

Now, more than ever before, "beauty is your duty." You simply have to keep up to snuff—Uncle Sam and his fighting nephews want you that way. And it's comforting to know that they'll see to it that we have our "beauty as usual" for the duration. Of course, you won't be indulged. Government biggies in Washington are working on plans this very minute aimed to knife away at non-essentials. They're determining just which beauty equipment is important and how much is so much froth. And it's this all-out effort to basket trivia that is spurring American test-tube experts on to developing substitute ingredients and improved formulas.

Just exactly what are the essentials of good grooming? Most of us would hasten to include powder as primary man-getting ammunition. While those of you who've lassoed your male animal and dip your duds in suds cry out for hand-creams. General nationwide surveys are flooding my desk daily in anticipation of WPB cosmetic-curtailement rulings.

And one recently sent me indicated that 90-95 percent of you gals are down on skin-shine. Lipstick, after powder, rates second must. Manicure preparations follow and cleansing-creams pursue pantingly. And so on down the line with eye make-up, permanents, depilatories and perfumes included in the tally.

Washington officials are definitely conscious of your need for toiletries. And they're making an evident effort to avoid the mistake of severe cos-

metic curtailment. England did this early in the war and is still suffering. Bootleg cosmetics (of inferior and poisonous compounds), plus a subsequent decline in morale and the quality of female labor, was the depressing result. Their example is serving us in good stead now. For in America, as long as toilet-goods manufacturers can continue to make beauty aids without using war-needed materials, machinery or men, you'll be able to keep yourself dutifully beautiful.

A few materials used in cosmetic manufacture and cosmetic packaging are priority-privileged. Metals, for one, are taboo. And designers are rapidly introducing attractive wood and pressed-paper substitutes for the metal holders of old. Shulton, the American Old-Spice manufacturer, recently put its paper-board vanity—an attractive powder compact (sifter and all)—on the market. And Madame Rubenstein just rolled her smart wood lipstick tube off the assembly line. Lightweight and attractive, war-born wrappings have tapped the imagination of house designers.

Some cosmetic-needed materials have been reduced—but they have not been cut off completely. Alcohol is one of these. And colognes, perfumes, freshener lotions and scalp tonics are undergoing a series of changes. "Stand-in" body sachets are fast becoming popular for their retentive odors, and cream colognes, like the new Twin Sister variety or the cooling perfume "stick" marketed by Lucien Lelong, are proof that American ingenuity is proving itself equal to the needs of the times.

So keep pretty-pretty through it all and bank on beauty for the duration. But don't hoard your cosmetics! If you're sincerely patriotic you'll be a budget Bridget 'bout your beauty items. Buy money-saving large sizes and refills. Ask for brand-proven cosmetics. Make the most of what you have. And throw your make-up "musts" a longer, better-cared-for life-line. Money saved on beauty will do a war-winning job when converted into War Bonds and Stamps.

# WHAT'S COOKING!

By GEORGIA SCOTT

## Preserve "Patriotically"

IF QUALMS of conscience 'bout using so much sugar keep you from "jamming" this year, take heart! There's a happy solution within kitchen range. You can preserve fruit without sugar or with worthy substitutes—the Department of Agriculture says so! Their most recent Farmers' Bulletin, No. 1762, is chocked full of other precious "preserve" hints and you can add it to your kitchen library for only five cents. This galley-book explains that shape, color and fruit flavor hold better when the sugar ingredient is added, but there's definitely no "must" about including the sweet stuff in your recipes. Fact is, diabetics commonly feed on fruits (canned without sugar) that were jelled in their own juice. But if your sweet tooth aches for saccharine nourishment, s-t-r-e-t-c-h your ration card 'til it turns a patriotic red, white and blue.

Short-boil jelly recipes made with bottled or powdered pectin and using corn syrup as a sugar substitute are Henderson-sent and will definitely help in a jam. For it seems that patriotic pectin will keep your fruit from boiling into nothingness and leave you more jelly per cup for sugar (or substitute) used.

Bought commercially, this packaged natural pectin promises to put the jam in jam and the jell in jelly. It completes the necessary triangle (acid, sugar and pectin), and in properly balanced amounts, "Jekylls" the fruit juice into a Sheba-shivering solid. The benefits of ripe, flavor-full fruits can be completely realized with this preserve aid, for it rules out hit-and-miss inconsistencies and guarantees perfection in texture as well as in taste.

Corn syrup, a so-satisfactory substitute, should never be used in excess of two cups per recipe. When bottled fruit pectin is used, two cups of light corn syrup is equal to two cups of sugar. And one cup of syrup is added for each cup of sugar omitted, if you're using the powder-pectin variety.

In preparing fruit, discard damaged portions. Wash thoroughly and pare section heavy with clinging residue. Stems and blossoms—residue collectors—should likewise be "nipped in the bud," while remaining fruit is knifed into uniform pieces, preparatory to cooking. And be sure to let fruit cores "be"—they're important pectin source. When washing fruit do it quickly and carefully, preventing a loss of juice. Lift pieces out of the water—never pour residue-filled liquid off and over fruit.

Containers must be sterilized immediately before canning. And when jelly is "set," seal meticulously with hot paraffin. Inside rims can be cleaned of jelly overflow with an alcohol-damp cloth. And labels, tagging product and date of preparation are draped into place before storage—in a cool, dry place. Careless sterilization, sealing and storing, are the three most common causes of waste

QUICK and thorough washing is best. Then remove residue—collecting stems and damaged pieces (r.). Fill sterilized containers while they're still warm (above). Store in a cool, dry place to prevent fermentation from setting in

fermentation. Prepare your jams, jellies and preserves in small batches . . . you'll find it makes for interesting work and food variety—spares time and effort!

And please don't relegate your jams and jellies to the tea-biscuit accessory of afternoon hen sessions. Preserves can be positively he-man when they play companion-piece to a meat dish.

The heart of the coldest roast is warmed when you smother it in a mouth-watering tart gravy. Add from two to four tablespoons of tart jelly to each cup of brown meat gravy for a savory sauce what is! And here's a chart to keep as a reminder that meats like sweets too!

Chicken—strawberry jam, plum jelly.

Goose—apple jelly, spiced peach jam.

Duck—orange jelly, cherry relish.

Veal—blackberry, currant jelly.

Lamb—mint jelly, crabapple jelly.

Beef—spiced grape jam, gooseberry jam.

Ham—plum jelly, horseradish mixed with ripe grape jelly.

Pork—quince jelly, cranberry jelly.

Liver—tomato relish.

Mutton—mint jelly, currant jelly.

You can add energy value to your mineral and vitamin-right summer salads by dotting greens with mint-cool jellies. Just whip a tart jelly into mayonnaise and use as a dressing for your fruit or chef's salad. It adds luscious flavor and a glamour gilt to your course. Sweet spreads like pineapple or cubes of raspberry jam are delectable "toppers" for lettuce leaves. And grape jelly sandwiches with cream cheese or bacon make yummy sandwich fillers for your play and work lunch-boxes. Try:

### Concord Grape Jelly

4 cups juice  
2 cups light corn syrup  
½ bottle fruit pectin

Use the four cups of strained juice that was not used in the grape butter. Measure syrup and juice into large sauce-pan and mix. Bring to boil over hottest fire and at once add bottled fruit pectin, stirring constantly. Then bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard one-half minute. Remove from fire, skim, pour quickly. Paraffin hot jelly at once. Makes about eleven medium glasses.

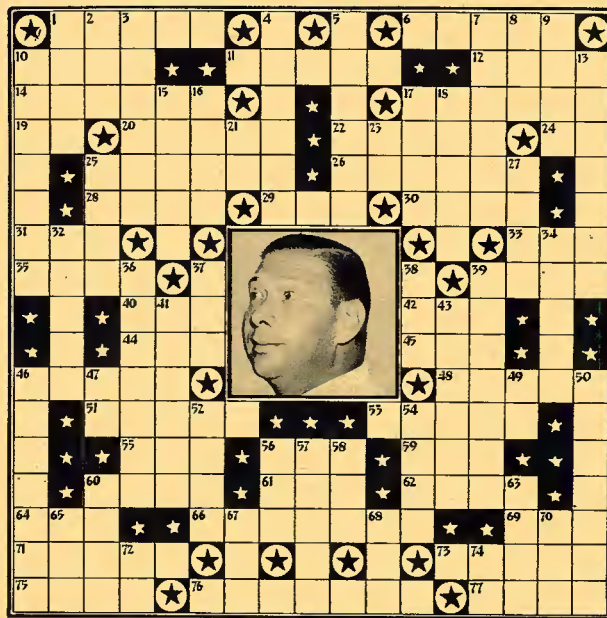
