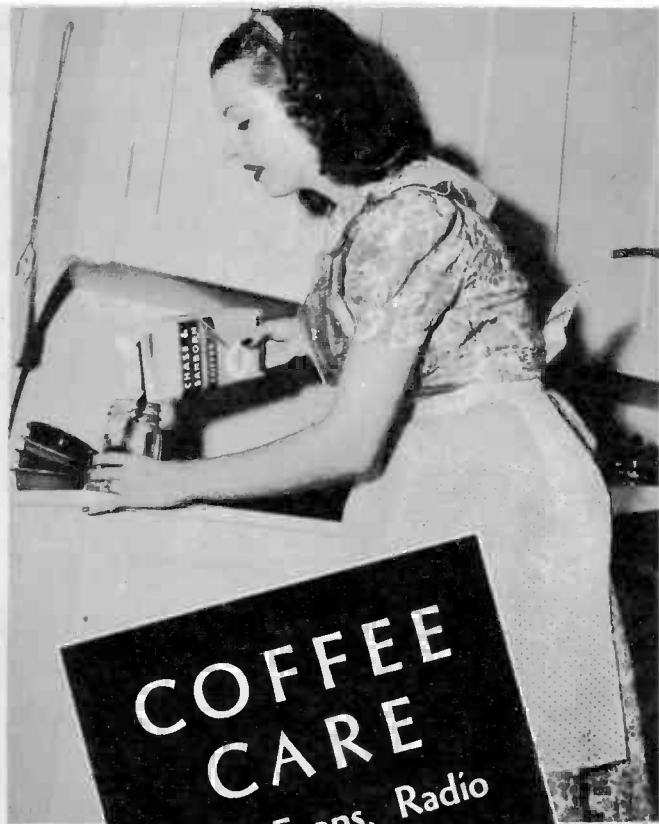

Salary Ceilings Pose a Problem for Performers



WILL movie stars disappear from radio in 1943? That's the big question present salary ceilings, ordered by Uncle Sam, has posed for the industry. As the first wave of this ultimatum broke in Hollywood, there was evidence of panic among high-powered stars. Some are still befuddled, but, as a whole, adjustment to the situation is the order of the day. Yet, for those accustomed to fabulous salaries, there still remains a difficult problem to be solved. What with money necessary for the up-keep of many and varied agents that take a neat chunk of their income, plus

taxes and ordinary living expenses, the remainder is pared down to a very small sum indeed!

However, when the combined movie and radio industries recovered from their first shock, many advantages could be glimpsed in the offing. For one thing, artists will be compelled to make a choice between radio and screen.

Will top performers like Bob Hope and Bing Crosby, whose radio shows run their salaries into high brackets, continue to broadcast, or will they leave the airplanes in favor of picture-making?

As radio stars, they work three or four days a week—are then free. If they stay in movies, they may work on a picture for a month or two and be through for the rest of the year.

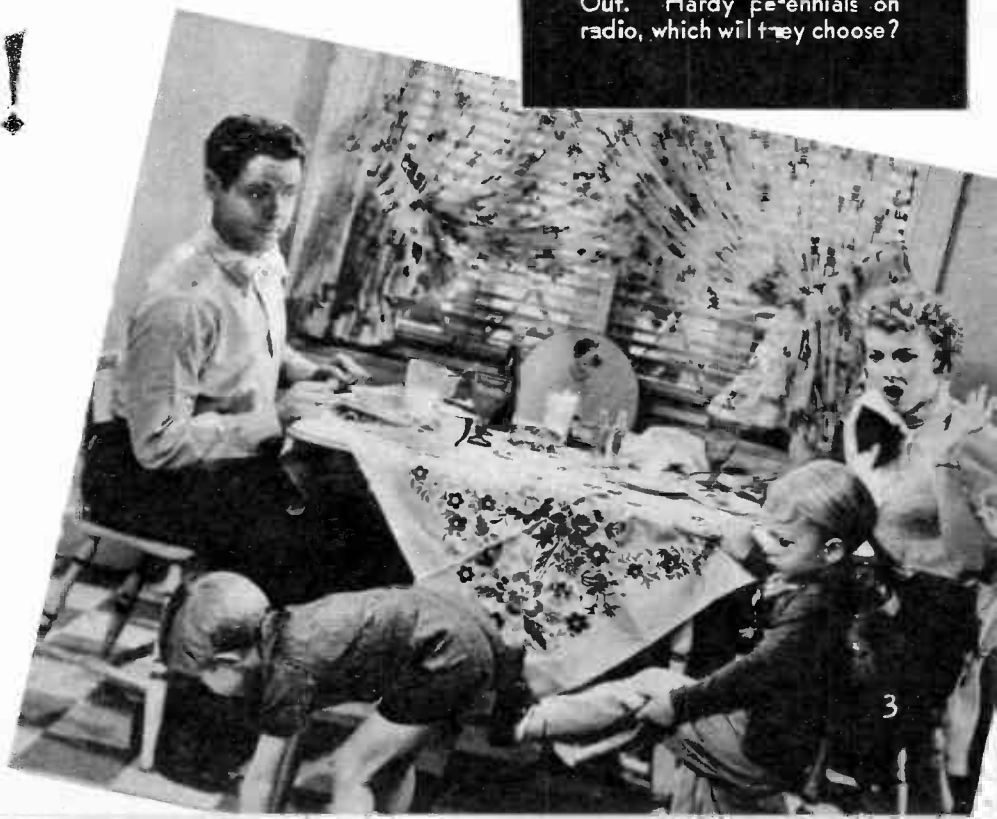

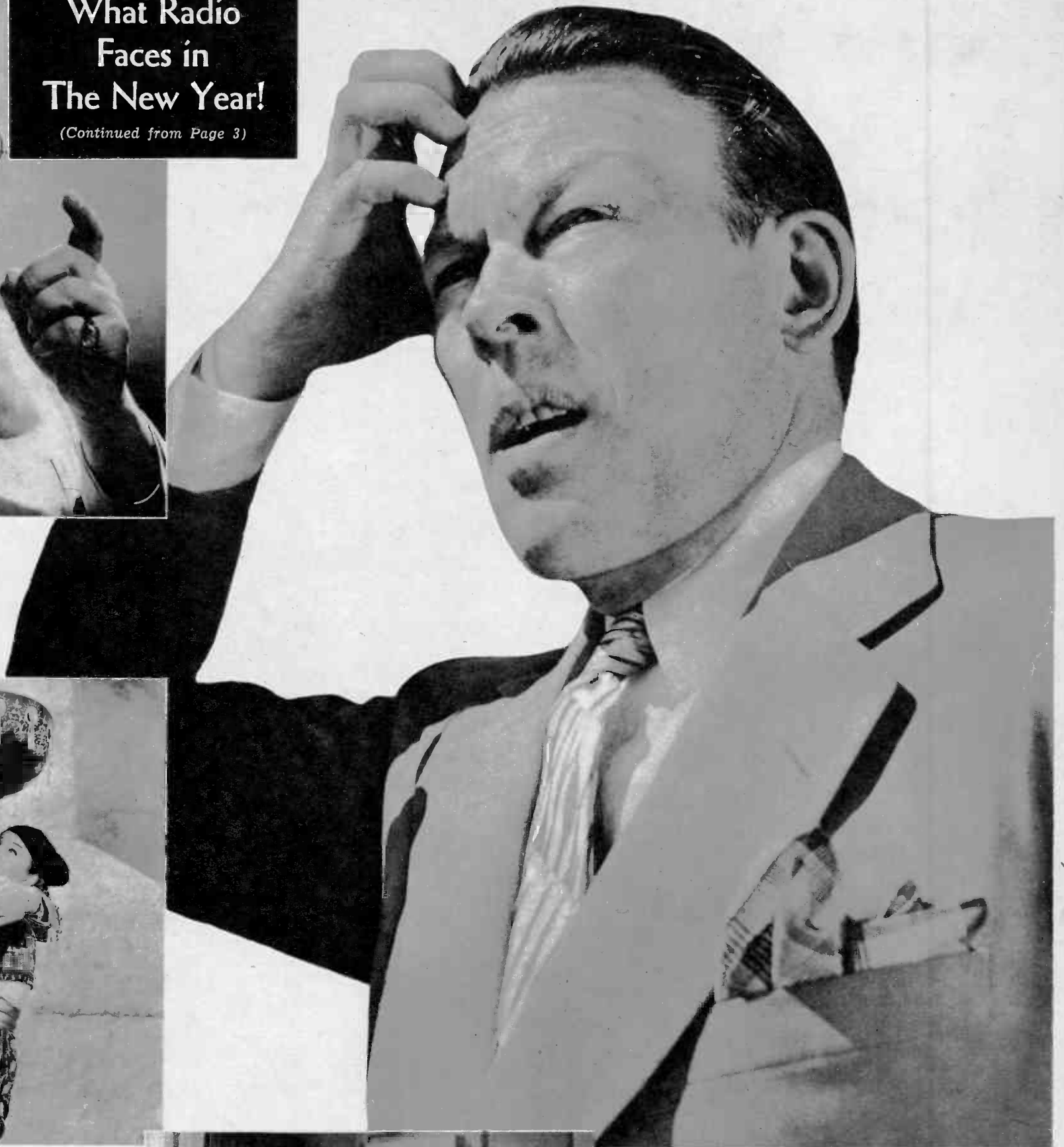

SPARK PLUGS

A Famous Washington Reporter Tells About the Men Behind the Men Who Run the War

IN WHAT you read and hear about Washington you seldom are told the names of the important men behind the scenes who are doing the spade work. The important decisions often come from down below and are accepted by the top headlines who speak directly to the public.

For instance, you seldom see the name of Lauchlin Currie in print. Yet he, more than any individual in the Government, is responsible for keeping alive our aid to China. Through the persistence of this small, quiet, unobtrusive figure we have maintained the fragile supply line to Chungking, and have managed to get enough supplies through to convince Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek of our future intentions to give real help.

Mr. Currie was born in Canada, became a professor of economics at Harvard, was brought into the Federal Reserve Board as an economist early in the New Deal, later became one of the anonymous assistants to President Roosevelt, and finally out of sheer personal interest began to work for aid to China and gradually became the controlling figure in that policy. He went to Chungking twice, and largely through his own initiative and enthusiasm has kept the fires alive until now it is part of our policy to prepare for the day when we can go at Japan side by side with the Chinese. This is a good example of how a man little known to the public can, through his ability and interest, develop a major policy which, because of its soundness, comes to be recognized by the whole Government.

Washington is full of similar instances. Another one of the same character on the domestic side is that of Robert R. Nathan, a thirty-three-year-old economist who is chairman of the Planning Committee of WPB. A big fellow of the wrestler type, Mr. Nathan has one of the sharpest minds in Washington. He has a com-

plete contempt for bureaucratic red tape. He is continually pouring into the ears of WPB officials new ideas for short cuts to maximum war production. For more than a year Mr. Nathan, although scarcely known to the public, has led the campaign in Washington for more rapid conversion of civilian production to war work. Practically all that he has accomplished, however, has become known to the public through the announcements of higher officials.

Spark plugs of this kind are to be found in practically every important agency. Working alongside Harold Smith, Director of the Budget, is his

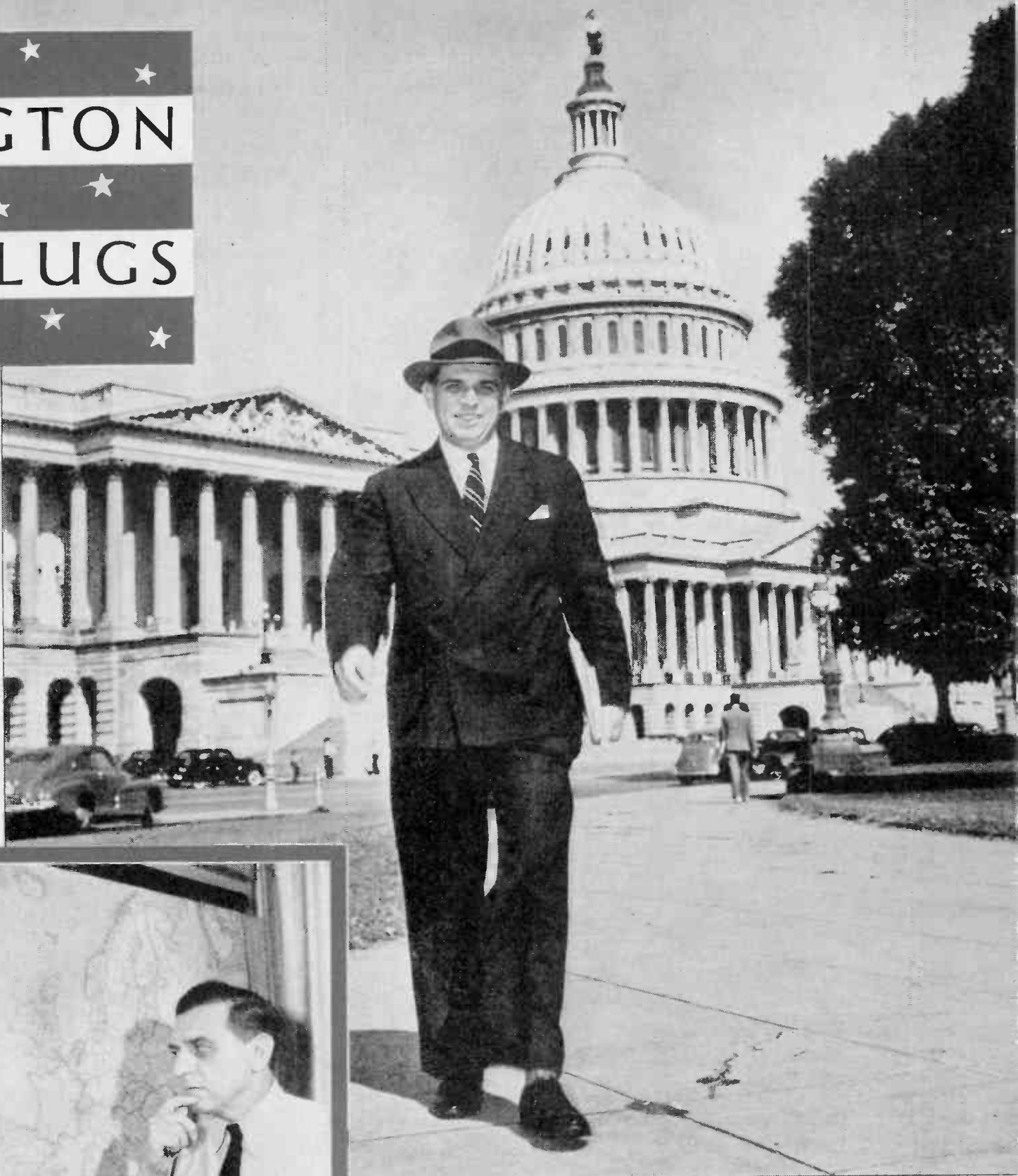
and hard workers and keep out of the limelight. Yet no Government official can get appropriations without first convincing them that the money is necessary. Their recommendations are accepted by President Roosevelt ninety-nine percent of the time.

Mr. Smith comes from Kansas and won his recognition as an authority on budget-making in Michigan under the administration of Frank Murphy, now an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. He was in Washington for a long time before this city became conscious of his real power. He fled from the limelight because he feared that publicity would detract

from his effectiveness. Mr. Smith not only controls the making of the budget which determines who gets how much money but he also controls the drafting of the huge number of executive orders which determine how much power an administrative official has. In other words, he is the man who drafts the laws that are promulgated by the executive branch. President Roosevelt has such confidence in Mr. Smith's judgment and knowledge of the intricate machinery of the Government that the decisions made in the Budget Bureau are seldom overruled, although many times it involves a fight with some member of the cabinet or the head of some big agency.

Wayne Coy, teammate of Mr. Smith, was long associated with Paul McNutt of Indiana. He later became one of

The campaign, initiated by the War Production Board, is seeking every available discarded silk and nylon stocking to be made into gunpowder bags for large-bore cannon.

The importance of this special drive is being emphasized by war production officials, who have pointed out that silk and nylon fabrics are the only satisfactory ones for gunpowder bags, because they leave no burning residue from an explosion. 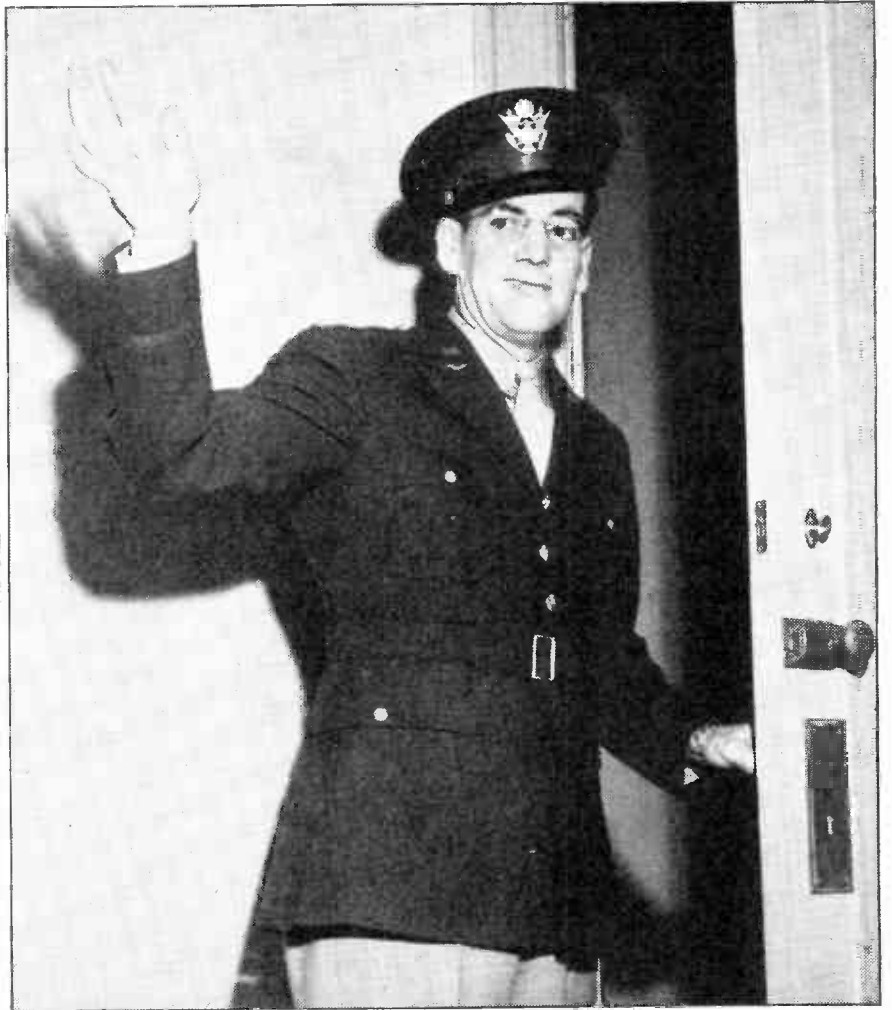

BOSTON SYMPHONY BEGINS BLUE NETWORK BROADCASTS DECEMBER 26

Toscanini Continues Brahms Cycle; Jose Iturbi Makes Guest Appearance With Philharmonic-Symphony; Ormandy Offers Bach's Chorale Prelude

THE very special good news for radio music-lovers is that concerning the Boston Symphony Orchestra. Now that the brilliant organization has made its peace with the music union it is possible for it to appear in radio broadcasts—and under the leadership of the dynamic Serge Koussevitzky.

The debt that this country owes to the Boston Symphony Orchestra is incalculable. From the very first this band under its inspired leader has ever sought to bring the world's best music to its audiences.

The contemporary music of Europe has always found a haven in Boston. The French, the Italian, the German, the Russian composers have been paraded before Boston audiences—and, of course, wherever the orchestra performed. American composers have known a true spirit of understanding and sympathy. To mention the names of two Americans, there are Aaron Copland and Roy Harris, who have enjoyed a particular sponsorship by this world-famous ensemble.

Of course, the magnificent performing ability of the Bostonians is proverbial. Often you hear it said that such and such an orchestra's violins "played like the Boston Symphony's string section last night"; that such and such an orchestra delivered such and such a composition with the "jewel-mechanism precision of the Boston Symphony Orchestra."

Dr. Koussevitzky, with his great knowledge of the classics and his progressive attitude toward all new music, is one of the world's greatest symphonic technicians. He is one of the few conductors of our time who can obtain just what they want from musicians. So that a listener can blame the conductor for an uninteresting interpretation or he can praise the conductor for a worthy one. The musicians, it is understood, do exactly what the conductor wants. Any criticism, therefore, must perforce be directed at him.

The Boston Symphony Orchestra has just signed a long-term contract with the Blue Network. The new series, most of which will originate from Symphony Hall in Boston, will be heard Saturday evenings. The Blue Network also plans to broadcast the Pops concerts under Arthur Fiedler as well as the open-air concerts on the Charles River Esplanade, Boston, in the summer.

This writer knows that many listeners will be elated with the series of

programs in store for them. First concert is scheduled for December 26.

Brahms-Toscanini

Arturo Toscanini continues with his Brahms cycle during his directorship of the NBC Symphony. His program offers this time the Serenade in A Major, Opus 16, the "Liebeslieder" Waltzes and Hungarian Dances.

The last named, among the most ingratiating of Brahms' works, were ideated early in his career, when he was making tours with the Hungarian violinist, Eduard Remenyi. It can be seen that the violinist had a hand in the inspiration. Most of the music is of Hungarian origin, Brahms appearing in the role of editor. In fact, Remenyi, believing that the publishers of the scores had attempted to pass off the works as Brahms' own, launched out on a great campaign of education. He insisted, as well he might, that Hungarian composers had written the original pieces; that Brahms had merely employed them as thematic material.

Toscanini and the Hungarian Dances of Brahms, et al., sounds like a very interesting combination. This listener has never heard them played by the distinguished Maestro, but he promises to tune in.

Philharmonic-Symphony Soloist

Jose Iturbi, well-known pianist, composer and conductor, will be the soloist with the Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra for its Sunday after-

noon concert. Mr. Iturbi appears as soloist in the Gershwin "Rhapsody in Blue" and also in his own Fantasy for Orchestra, a work of recent composition.

The Spanish pianist, who is the regular conductor of the Rochester Philharmonic, has been playing the "Rhapsody" quite frequently of late. There was a time when he was accused of being a jazz-hater. However, the genial musician explained to this reporter that he did not hate jazz, he only hated the way some people played it, which seems to make a lot of sense.

Also scheduled for performance is the Mendelssohn "Scotch" Symphony. The composer visited Scotland in 1829. In a letter written from Edinburgh on July 29, he said: "We went, in the deep twilight, to the palace of Holyrood, where Queen Mary lived and loved. There is a little room to be seen there, with a winding staircase leading up to it. This the murderers ascended, and finding Rizzio in a little room drew him out; and three chambers away is a small corner where they killed him. The roof is wanting to the chapel, grass and ivy grow abundantly in it; and before the altar, now in ruins, Mary was crowned Queen of Scotland. Everything around is broken and moldering, and the bright sky shines in. I believe I found today in that old chapel the beginning of my Scotch symphony."

The inspiration for this ennobling work, which some early observers described as being revolutionary, is self-evident. Perhaps it was revolutionary, but modern ears have heard even more revolutionary music.

Famous Orchestra No. 4

The Philadelphia Orchestra, which appears over MBS, promises an interesting program. The list includes the conductor, Eugene Ormandy's, transcription of the Chorale "Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme," the Beethoven Piano Concerto No. 4 in G Major, and the Brahms Second Symphony. This Philadelphia aggregation has made a reputation for itself in the performance of transcribed Bach music. Its former conductor, Leopold Stokowski, set the style for that type of music and the present incumbent has followed suit. The Chorale we are concerned with here is the first of a set of six which were put together during Bach's later years. It is known in translation as "Sleepers Awake!" The Bach Chorale Prelude, incidentally, is in itself an arrangement of a melody which appears in the Cantata No. 140.

Gus Haenschen: "Cole Porter was grateful to Shaw"

IF IT is radio pioneers you are interested in, do not overlook Gustave Haenschen, conductor of the "American Album of Familiar Music" (NBC). Mr. Haenschen is currently celebrating his fifteenth year in radio. He is said to be a good-luck charm for the pro-

gram he becomes associated with. Mr. Haenschen at work on an orchestration is the picture of frenzied industry. He works in his shirt-sleeves, bouncing back and forth between piano and manuscript, chewing gum madly the while. You won't find an ounce of so-called temperament in his make-up.

Long ago when he was graduated from Washington University in St. Louis, he almost thought he might become an engineer. But he was sidetracked. He took up music, which had been a major interest of his all along anyway. He isn't sorry now.

Mr. Haenschen has seen and heard and played a lot of popular music in his time. He likes to think that good orchestrations help a song immensely. He says, "The semi-symphonic style of orchestration is, in many cases, refreshing. Too many radio songs sound alike, especially when played over and over again. In justifiable attempts to make certain special ones more attractive some conductors add a frill or two, a couple ornaments, some sweeping violin surges, or what have you, and presto, a likable orchestration. The tune has been given a much more attractive setting."

But he insists that the arrangement should not be gaudy. That would hurt the original melody more than anything else. "I know of many cases," he says, "where composers have been extremely grateful for the talents of orchestrators. Cole Porter, for instance, has already expressed his gratitude to Artie Shaw for the latter's wonderful interpretation of *Begin the Beguine*. There are other such instances."

An idea of the tremendous speed, the tempo of modern radio preparation calls for is exemplified by this anecdote. The well-known composer, Kurt Weill, once approached Mr. Haenschen with a very complex score for chorus. Mr. Weill had just arrived from Europe and he knew nothing about American speed methods. He pleaded with the conductor to have the chorus drilled in three weeks.

"Come back tomorrow," said Haenschen the realist, "and you'll hear it sung to perfection." It was.

PUBLIC ATTITUDE TOWARD FM SURVEYED . . .

W45CM'S "CODE CLASS OF THE AIR"

Listeners Recommend FM to Friends; Women Taking Over FM Jobs Vacated by Men; FM Stations Service College "Gaspape" Systems

In Two Busy Years

IT WAS only about two years ago that FM broadcasting began to make a few pioneer friends for itself. Up to then, the letters "FM" might have meant anything from "fire marshal" to "free meals" for the average stalwart citizen—but certainly not a new and different kind of radio called "frequency modulation." People who browsed around in laboratories and read technical publications had heard of it, of course. A few experimenters with home-made receivers tuned in occasionally on strange test programs whose music—even though recorded—had a strange and haunting effect of reality.

Most of the first experimental transmitters were in the East, around New York and in New England. One was the granddaddy station of all FM—W2XMN—built by inventor Edwin Armstrong at Alpine, N. J., a few miles north of Manhattan. Then, near Hartford, Conn., was another, known as W1XPW (now W65H). Two more were located outside of Worcester, Mass. Toward the end of 1939, however, experimental FM transmitters began to blossom all over the country. By March of 1940, about 150 applications to build such stations had been received by the Federal Communications Commission. FM, at that time, began going places.

The reason for delving so far back into FM's short history has an interesting connection with a recent announcement made by the General Electric Company (which also operated one of the first FM outlets). It seems that this organization last month secured the services of an independent research group to make a survey of public attitudes toward FM broadcasting in the following cities: New York, Chicago, Detroit, Philadelphia, Albany, Worcester, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, Columbus, Nashville, Los Angeles, Baltimore, Indianapolis and St. Louis. Each of these places is served by at least one FM station; most of them by two or more.

What Listeners Think

The survey reached owners of many different brands of frequency-modulation receivers, and the listeners who were interrogated had no idea for whom the research was being conducted. After interviewing hundreds of FM set owners in these fourteen cities, it was found that the majority of them (1) believe FM tonal quality is a definite improvement over ordinary broadcasting (eighty-five percent said so); (2) would recommend an FM-equipped set to their friends; (3) tune in on local FM stations at least once a day, and (4) declare that most

of their friends have expressed a favorable opinion of FM broadcasting.

There was a divergence of thought as to the most important of FM's several advantages, with forty-five percent voting for "improved tone quality" and forty-one percent picking "freedom from noise and static." (The other fourteen percent comprised various answers, such as "better music," "fewer commercials" and just plain "don't know.")

Most emphatic of all responses were the ninety-one percent who said they'd recommend a set equipped with FM to their friends, and the ninety percent who declared that their friends enjoy listening to FM whenever the chance is offered them.

People Learn Fast

Of particular interest was the large group of interviewed persons who—although not owners of FM sets—were quite conversant with advantages of the new broadcasting system. This included one-half of the men and a quarter of the women. But a similar survey, held only a year ago, showed that a mere fifteen percent of all persons approached had ever heard of FM, much less owned a set that could tune it in.

This indicates quite a span of progress from the experimental days of two years ago—when there were certainly no more than a few hundred primitive FM receivers in the whole country—to the present, when conser-

vative estimates place the number of sets capable of receiving FM programs at well over the half-million mark.

The Distaff Side

War, of course, is cutting heavily into the masculine ranks of radio personnel. Particularly in demand are skilled technicians of the type that modern broadcasting requires—people who can glibly tell you the difference between a decibel and an ohm, and know all about the innards of a studio amplifier. But radio is also a young man's industry, and the drain has been heavy, too, on announcing and program staffs.

Each month seems to see more and more women take over the jobs being vacated by men at FM stations throughout the country. Both of Pittsburgh's FM outlets, for example, now have girl program directors—Marie Wilk at W47P and Patti Littell at W75P. Anita de Mars is assistant manager of the newly opened W75NY in New York City. Ruth Sherrill has just joined the announcing staff of W67B, Boston, while Gladys Tomajan is a new mikiwoman for WITXG, Worcester, Mass. At W85A, Schenectady, N. Y., Ruth Stone is assistant manager.

The radio industry has some important jobs available for girls who can qualify. Adequate training, of course, is important. Engineering knowledge, needed by control-room operators, may be obtained in a reasonable length of time at many good technical

schools. College and school courses in radio production, script-writing, and even station management can also lead to good positions in the broadcasting industry. It takes initiative and hard work, but the opportunities are there.

Lessons by FM

W45CM, Columbus, Ohio, which recently celebrated its first anniversary on the air, has an FM innovation in its new "Code Class of the Air," designed to provide valuable instruction in the sending and receiving of dots and dashes.

Facilities have been constructed in the W45CM studios to accommodate a regular class, but FM listeners at home are invited to follow the lessons as well. Full information on how to do so, with instruction material, is provided to those who write in for it.

A knowledge of the code is an important accomplishment today, since there is great demand for competent operators in many branches of war communications, civil as well as military.

FM Goes to College

The relay facilities of six well-known FM stations in the northeastern section of the country are being called upon regularly by the Intercollegiate Broadcasting System, a group of low-power college stations that are heard only on campuses of various educational institutions. Twelve of the college outlets are now picking up programs from the nearest FM station and relaying these to their student listeners.

Sometimes called "gaspape" transmitters, the college stations pump their flea-power signals over the electric-wiring circuits into dormitories, fraternity houses and other college buildings. Ordinary radio receivers, located within these buildings, can pick up the programs. Other sets, only a short distance away, cannot. Because of such limited reception, the college stations need no government licenses.

Special broadcasts, designed for students, are now being originated regularly in the studios of W47NY, one of New York's independent FM stations. The programs are relayed via FM to W2XMN, Alpine, N. J.; W65H, Hartford, Conn.; W43B, Boston; W39B, Mount Washington, N. H.; and W47A, Schenectady, and rebroadcast locally in each of these areas. College FM receivers at Brown, Columbia, Connecticut State, Hamilton, Harvard, Rhode Island State, Princeton, Dartmouth, Union, Wesleyan, Williams and Yale are able to tune in on at least one of the six FM stations. The special programs are thus picked up for rebroadcasting over each of the college "gaspape" systems.

JAPS ADD NEW 50,000-WATT TRANSMITTER ... ALLIES USE ALGIERS STATION

NBC International Revamps English-Language Section; Jap Officers' Swords Make Yank Souvenirs; Britain All Out for "Utility" Furniture

Yanks Bid for Jap Swords

ACCORDING to a recent broadcast from the Melbourne short-wave station, a new danger to Japanese officers in New Guinea has developed as a result of American soldiers' enthusiasm for Japanese officers' swords. Sums of \$150 and more are offered for these weapons and Australians are exploiting the market. The manner of the exploitation was recounted by Sgt. H. F. Marmody, a nineteen-year-old Texas rifleman who was one of the first Buna casualties to reach Australia. He said: "We saw the Australians go into action and it was good to watch them. They were always on the lookout for one of those little Japanese officers, who wave their men on with grandiose sweeps of the sword. A Digger would pause for a few seconds, his rifle would crack, and down would go a Japanese officer. Then there would be a concerted rush for his sword. It was a case of possession being nine points of the law. Americans offer \$150 and more for the swords."

Lesueur and Dreier Return

Two of our networks' globe-trotting short-wave correspondents have returned home recently. Larry Lesueur, who has been reporting from Moscow for CBS for the past year, clicked off more than twelve thousand miles on the journey to the Russian capital and back. On one leg of his travels, the plane was forced to detour across the Ural Mountains to the temporary capital at Kuibyshev because Moscow was under heavy Nazi siege. On his return trip Larry left Moscow last October 22, flew to the top of the Caspian Sea and thence to Baku, Teheran, Palestine, Khartoum, Nigeria, Brazil and Miami. Immediately upon his arrival in New York City Lesueur attended to one urgent duty: He reported to his local draft board.

Likewise NBC's Alex Dreier, first American news commentator to cover the war from both sides of the battle-line, returned from London a few days ago to resume his daily news broadcasts for the Skelly Oil Company. He has been absent from Chicago for the past thirteen weeks as NBC's London correspondent. Prior to America's entry in the war, Dreier had been NBC's voice from Berlin, and he was practically the last American correspondent to get over the line into neutral Switzerland just ahead of the Reich's war declaration.

New Jap Transmissions

On December 1, the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan added another new 50,000-watt short-wave transmitter to its overseas service, at the same time adding two new daily transmis-

sions to North America. The new schedule is about as follows (EWT):

2:00-4:00 a.m. to western N. A. and Hawaii over JZJ (11.80), JZI (9.535). English news at 2:00 and 3:30 a.m.
7:55-9:15 a.m. to N. A. over JZI (9.535), JLG4 (15.105). English news at 8:00 a.m.
12:30-2:30 p.m. to N. A. over JLG2 (9.505), JZI (9.535). English news at 12:30 and 2:00 p.m.
2:55-6:30 p.m. to Europe over JLG2 (9.505), JVV (7.257). English news at 3:00 and 6:00 p.m.
6:55-10:45 p.m. to eastern N. A. over JLG4 (15.105), JZJ (11.80). English news at 7:00 and 9:20 p.m.

From the amount of time daily that Japan is devoting to programs designed for North America it appears that they are almost frantically determined to force their crude propaganda down our throats.

Broadcasts From AFH in Africa

The Algiers short-wave station, now identified as AFH (Allied Force Headquarters), is still being heard weekdays from 6:45 to 7:30 p.m. EWT on a frequency of 8.96 megas. It can be readily identified just a hair above COKG (8.955) which interferes with it considerably. In addition to the splash-over from the Cuban station, AFH is also bothered by code interference which seems to be a deliberate effort to spoil the transmissions. CBS usually picks up the report of its correspondent, Charles Collingwood, at about 6:55 p.m. From about 7:00 to 7:15, AFH transmits messages and

news items to the Office of War Information in New York. At approximately 7:15 p.m., NBC picks up a short report from its Algeria correspondent, John MacVane. AFH usually puts on a short broadcast for the BBC at about 7:25 p.m. and closes down shortly thereafter at about 7:30 p.m. EWT. The Algiers transmitter on 8.96 has been broadcasting music and French news afternoons irregularly to 6:15 p.m. EWT.

Shorts From the Short Waves

(Soviet Radio)—From the ruins of its office, the Stalingrad daily newspaper, *Stalingradskaya Pravda*, continues to be published regularly. Special editions and bulletins, announcing the fall or capture of this or that building, or the progress of fighting for the barber shop or ice-cream booth around the corner, are issued frequently. The recapture of a house or street corner calls for big headlines and the news is flashed from one end of the city to the other . . . (Rome Radio)—Cites as an example of poor cooperation between Great Britain and the United States, the prohibition of the showing of a British navy propaganda film in this country . . . (Australian Radio)—According to Prime Minister Curtin, Australia must be ready to repel strong enemy attacks from the island of Timor . . . (London

Radio)—William Holt stated that after January 1, only "utility" furniture will be manufactured in Britain. This furniture is very simple in design; comes in but one or two styles; is made of crushed wood fiber, and can only be purchased by those bombed out, young married couples setting up housekeeping for the first time and those housing evacuees.

NBC's English Language Programs

Following a complete revamping of its program schedule, the English-language section of NBC International is now on the air thirty-five hours a week with a wide variety of programs for the entertainment and information of America's fighting men and our British allies. These broadcasts include domestic network programs ranging from the NBC Symphony Orchestra to the "Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street," and from religious programs such as "We Believe" to the "Everything Goes" show with Garry Moore and company. In addition, the staff of the section produces a number of short-wave features, including more than thirty news broadcasts and over a dozen sports features. News in English is broadcast daily at 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., and in addition on week-days at 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. EWT. Regular sports features are broadcast daily at 2:15 p.m. and 4:45 p.m. The Serviceman's Reporter is radiated each day at 3:00 p.m. EWT. (A complete lineup of all NBC English features will be included in an early issue of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE.) NBC's English language short-wave schedule runs each day from 1:00 to 5:15 p.m. over WBOS (11.87), and from 5:15 to 6:00 p.m. EWT over WNBI (9.67).

United States station WDO (14.47) broadcasts a special news letter to the OWI in Morocco and Algeria at 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. EWT . . . The new Mexico City station, XERQ (9.61), is now operating from approximately 11:30 a.m. to 11:15 p.m. EWT . . . Bern, Switzerland's, program for North America is now broadcast from 9:45 to 11:15 p.m. EWT, nightly except Saturdays, over HER5 (11.865) and a new frequency of 7.21 megas . . . GRK (7.185), a new London frequency, is in use daily, 3:00 to 3:15 a.m. and 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. EWT . . . GSI (15.26) broadcasts the BBC program for troops in North Africa daily from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. EWT . . . An unidentified Lisbon, Portugal, station on 5.905 megas is being heard nightly to 8:00 p.m. EWT, at which time it signs off with the Portuguese anthem and a clock striking twelve times. It carries the same program as CSW6 (11.04) to 6:15 p.m. EWT.

Bob Burns, radio's "Arkansas Traveler," has an ambition. He'd like to play a part in the first hillbilly opera. Burns, American to the core, believes that there is as much material for opera in America as in any nation across the Atlantic and that eventually it will be written. *Show Boat*, in his estimation, is true American opera and *The Cat and the Canary* was great American light opera. *Porgy and Bess* he cites as another real American opera. "Here in this country we've got the stories and we've got the music. Seems sort of funny that the first opera about a cowboy was written by an Italian, Puccini. It was *Girl of the Golden West*. If somebody would just write a real American opera about the hill country folks, I'd even take singin' lessons to get a chance to be in it," says Burns.



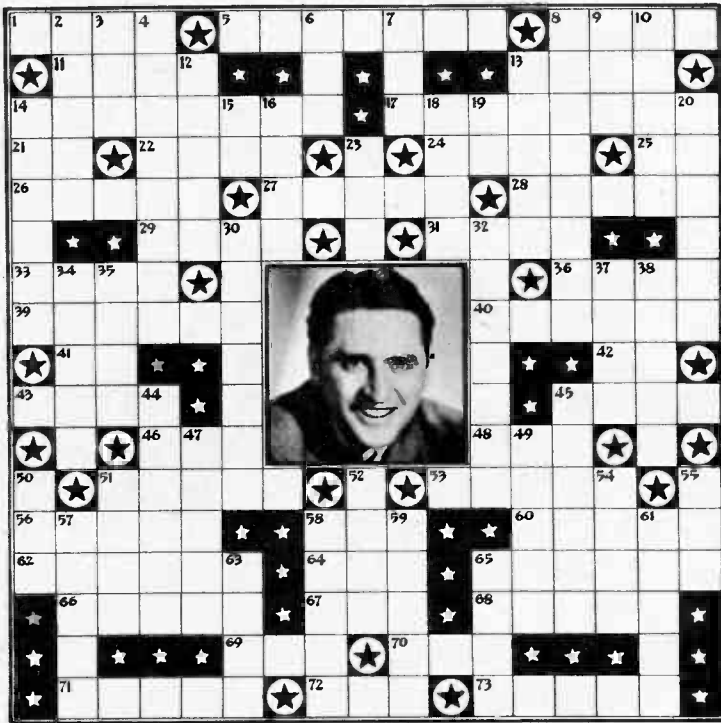

Steve isn't anything to radio today. But he is everything to radio tomorrow. To me, he is the reason for radio, just as he is the reason for Christmas and the reason why we must have victory in our war.

Steve's part of the listening audience already. He'll laugh with the laughter of a studio audience. He'll dance to anything hot, and he can call by name *Anchors 'Weigh* and *Ka'mazoo*. Political speakers incur his wrathful "Daddy, play records, hunh?"

Steve will vote in 1961, but between then and now he will become more and more important to radio, till, say by 1981, he and his kind and his kids will be, literally, the greater part of the radio audience.

I'm glad he'll have radio to grow up with, but that gladness is tinged with alarm at times. It's good to have the richness of Christmas brought to the side of his little chair. The carols, sung so much better than I can sing them to him; the bells and the laughter and the grand tales of Yule; the hearty bluntness, the red-cheeked warmth of snowy wind and crackling fires—he can get something of all these from his radio.

Yes, and he'll get the other, well-worn, human traditions of seasons and holidays and the ordinary days between. Probably he'll get them with pictures, too, as television develops. He'll get the gayest tunes of the gayest years, as well as the grim songs and the solid musical meat of the classics. He'll hear history made on the air, and listen to solemn deliberations. Wise men will help him understand this world and its works. These, too, will be radio's gift to my son.

And yet, as I say, I'm afraid of what radio will be to Steve.

I wonder, for instance, about the impact on him of the superheated blah of some—not all—of the children's serials. I wonder if he'll shed the over-emotional stuff as easily as my dad shed Nick Carter and I shed the early movie serials.

I hope, and honestly believe, that radio will grow wiser, more entertaining. I think that the radio my Steve will demand, along with the rest of his generation, will look back on the crudities of radio in the 1940's, especially on the commercial side, with the same superior scorn we feel when we look back at the days when merchants dragged customers off the streets by force.

Yes, I think my Steve is lucky. He'll

know a brighter and richer world than ours. And radio's part of that world will be something worth hearing—and seeing . . .

To radio folk, as to the rest of you, war Christmas brings problems, heartaches, happiness. There's Muriel Bremner ("Road of Life") waiting for her child's arrival while her husband serves in the Navy . . . the President's anonymous trouble-shooters and has had a hand in the untangling of countless war problems involving production, labor relations, lead-lease and man-power, among many others.

Most of what is done in the Office of War Information becomes known through announcements by Elmer Davis, its chief. But his two main props are Gardner Cowles of the

famous Des Moines newspaper family, and Robert Sherwood, the Pulitzer prize-winning playwright. Mr. Cowles is in charge of domestic operations for OWI and steered Wendell Willkie through his recent tour of Russia and China. Mr. Sherwood is in charge of all foreign operations involving a vast program of propaganda and reaches every corner of the world except Latin America, which is reserved for the Nelson Rockefeller organization.

One could name many others, such as Isador Lubin, Commissioner of Labor Statistics, who is attached dur-

ing the war to the White House as a special economic adviser to President Roosevelt; Mordecai Ezekiel, former economist for the Department of Agriculture, who is doing special jobs for WPB; Stacy May, economist for WPB, who is a kind of doctor watching the pulse of war production and sounding the alarm when it becomes sluggish at any point; Benjamin V. Cohen, who is now at the elbow of James F. Byrnes, the Director of Economic Stabilization. Mr. Cohen has left the famous team of Corcoran and Cohen and has remained in public service

while his former partner is engaged in a heavy law practise.

To the public most of these are the least known men in Washington. But among Government officials they are all known as important spark plugs who have enormous influence on what happens.
