*Authorities Bearing Down On Subversive Dangers. Fingerprinting Certain, With All Plants Guarded*

More than merely important to a Nation is safety of its communications. More potent, perhaps, than all other forms of communications is space leaping, instant recording, Radio. This week, with a world situation tensing to international straining points, more than rumor scurried through rank and file of big industry, 'Radio,' that Federal government was surveying defensive measures and working plans for protection of Nation's mainstay for direct and instant contact with its people.

Necessarily, impenetrable secrecy masks activities of Government as it weaves a defensive net for far flung national networks, their principal outlets and key indicated major independent stations.

This week this much was known: Federal agents have suggested adoption of certain routines, calculated to reduce to minimum sabotage of any station (2) all copy for transmission in guise of program material was being carefully examined; (3) stations themselves were exercising extraordinary but inobtrusive vigilance against subversive suspects.

That situation is serious is admitted generally by radio officials. In past fortnight one major Los Angeles station went off the air for one hour, due to mysterious breakdown in vital equip-

ment. Puzzled technicians, making report, gave officials reason to suspect sabotage. In consequence, no person in most stations today, however well known, may enter or depart premises without personally signing in and out and noting time of both coming and going. Further reason for more than rumor indicated need for Federal action: The most important western key station of a National broadcasting group was recently "blacked out" for more than 10 minutes, while technicians desperately sought cause of trouble, and, finding it, came to same conclusion—suspected sabotage.

Certainly to be expected is fingerprinting of all station employees. Even now unobtrusive and armed guards watch comings and goings at many stations.

Putting in its place over zealous news magazine that recently reported Government in war would take over all American broadcast facilities, Radio Life through official sources, learned: Government will not take over stations. It will, however, use radio freely for purposes linked to national defense, chief among which, conceivably, will be dissemination of pertinent information to citizens. Otherwise programs will go on as usual.

*McCarthy Goes Aloft To Teach Bergen Air*

Convulsing Union Air Terminal attaches and instructors for past week with saucy admonitions to his friend and employer, Edgar Bergen, a nattily aviation costumed Charles McCarthy this week pridefully announced: "Mr. Bergen and I have taken up aviation as a serious hobby. Personally, I am making a study of bombing technique, with the idea of doing a little practice on that impossible fellow, Fields."

Mr. McCarthy, according to terminal officials, has supervised every step of Mr. Bergen's flying instruction, and, last week, announced himself satisfied that Edgar could go up without him.

"I have to be careful," Charlie said; "if anything happens to Edgar I certainly would be up in the air."

*Jive King Will Strut On Familiar Prairie*

The incident became a solid cornerstone in a musical career, not considered when University of Kansas classrooms were first pushed open by the sleek-haired youngster who was to achieve two distinctions in later life: (1) a nationally known band leader, and (2) husband of Mary Pickford. On Sunday, June 30, from 3:30 to 4 p. m., Rogers and his band will Rednet (KFI) from a place familiar to a callow youth—Shrine Auditorium in Iowa's prairie capital, Des Moines.

A prosperous people are a generous people. Many an American, perhaps most of them, pride themselves on charity and kindness for the less fortunate. Yet, in spite of constant warnings, millions of Americans annually give away to fictitious causes millions of dollars. To all such this week Florian DeDonato, managing director of California Intelligence Service, big business fund solicitation investigation bureau, gave timely advice:

"In times of stress, the promoter of dubious charities and causes ordinarily reaps a golden harvest by preying upon the sympathetic credulous. War suffering, the National Ensign, the Constitution, Patriotism, etcetera, are his stock in trade. With it he mulcts the kindhearted of funds

"All legitimate charities and causes are community affairs, recognized by law and coming within purview of ordinances. Before giving money to any individual, representing himself or herself as a solicitor for any cause, make sure that such individual bears credentials from your local Department of Social Service or welfare, or from familiar community charities."

"The Money Raising Racketeers" is projected title of a fall radio series by Mr. DeDonato. The series will dramatize the Bureau's work in cooperation with the District Attorney's office, police and sheriff's departments, in bringing to book engineers of money raising frauds.

## ★ ★ 'Frequency Modulation' Discovery Will Change All Modern Concepts Of Radio. May Junk Present Sets

Static, household appliance interference, nerve fraying concomitants of even today's expertly designed radio receiving sets, this week moved closer to their ultimate obliteration.

Nearer today to improved radio reception stood the growing figureative figure of 'FM,' invention of radio engineer, Edwin Armstrong.

'FM,' initial short for "frequency modulation" is the result of Engineer Armstrong's determination to so improve reception that now familiar annoyances will be things of a forgotten past within a future's quick coming.

Difficult, at present, for even radio technicians to understand in full detail, virtually impossible for lay radio listener to understand, 'FM,' shorn of scientific verbiage, produces these results: (1) Limits distance range of local stations, (2) widens kilocycle 'spread' (i.e., bandwidth of conventional amplitude modulation stations) and (3) by sharpening tone power excludes interference, now characteristic of amplitude modulation transmission, chief of which are: rasping of telephone dials through ra-

dios, humming of carpet sweepers, grate of electric razors, switching on and off of house lights.

For layman's enlightenment a CBS engineer this week revealed: On local dials stations, of amplitude frequency nature, are spaced approximately 20 kilocycles apart. In many cases such stations ride into each other while broadcasting on properly allocated wave lengths.

With 'FM,' now being worked out for national broadcast assignments by Federal Communications Commission, local stations will take up even more room on band; but, ultra-high frequency, which 'FM' is, will narrow down broadcast distance of each station, thus eliminating situation often faced by dialers who, trying to bring in selected station, find it often impossible to eliminate 'ghostly' chatter of stations sliding close to band of station they have chosen.

Price for this scientific improvement, price to be paid by clear reception wishers, is necessity, so far believed, for new mechanically designed sets to replace those now hitched to conventional amplitude modulation.

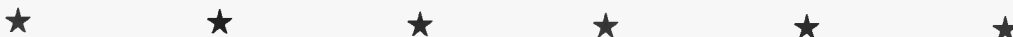

# Danger Is Their Lot

## Being A Tale Of Air's Brave Men And Women

**T**HE shock of desperately fired artillery shook ancient buildings of Dunkerque. To the south in Paris, "City of Light," pallid refugees stared with terror haunted eyes at Parisians, not yet convinced that dreaded panzer divisions of Germany could break through the stiffening resistance of the French Army. Parisians grew restive and uneasy as the stream of refugees crested in a flood of humanity that was without parallel in modern history or old.

Pétain had assured the alarmed country to the south of bloody embattled Dunkerque that all was not lost. Yet, shrugging shoulders, Parisians, bereft of information, witnesses to a fevered concentration of troops, wondered, wondered and planned escape, if escape needs be.

In the French capital, over which the red pall of destruction hung gloomily, was Helen Hiatt, 26-year-old NBC journalist. With her was Paul Archinard, in charge of NBC broadcasts from the threatened capital.

News must be gotten out! But, what news? There was a strict censorship, or if not censorship, uncertainty in almost every mind about what was occurring to the North.

"I've got to find out what's going on."

A French staff officer, behind whom stood amused British officers, smiled tolerantly: "Mademoiselle, it is impossible. The situation at Dunkerque is one not for a woman like you."

A more than ordinarily lovely girl, Helen Hiatt, stared back, smiled resignedly, and walked out of the headquarters.

Later that night, with a complete blackout giving Paris the appearance of a city of the ancient dead, Paul Archinard, NBC bureau chief, raced frantically from military to civil police to learn, if they knew, where his star woman reporter was.

Another night . . . On heights above artillery pounded Dunkerque, an allied lorry grated and jarred to a halt. From out of the uniformed passengers, dropping from similar lorries along an allied column seeking to cover escape of trapped brothers below, a lone figure was separated. The figure took refuge

behind the wall of a building on the south side of the doomed city. Across the heights, oppositely, German guns hammered away. Their constant, ear-cracking explosions, were punctuated by stabbing streamers of flame in the night. Below, unseen in the smoke pall, clouding the night beyond hope of visibility, British destroyers, and other boats of all descriptions, doggedly came racing into shell rocked wharves. On the wharves, fighting desperate rear guard actions, fleeing Allies fought and waited for chances to embark. Morning, dismal with smoke, wreathing funereally over a doomed city. From death-littered beaches, thousands of men waded, or tired to wade, out of range of spitefully biting machinegun fire.

Helen Hiatt turned away and went down the slopes. A stream of trucks and motors jammed a highway south to Paris. From out of the slowly moving line a small car darted; in it a French officer speeding to Paris. Deliberately she stepped in front of the car, pulled off her soft service cap and shook auburn hair down across poilu uniformed shoulders. The car stopped.

In a matter of hours Helen Hiatt, appeasing the wrathful concern of Paul Archinard, was writing for broadcast, intimate glimpses of a scene that must forever remain as one of the outstanding spectacles of modern times.

She is called Marvin Breckenridge, but the name is significant. It stands for CBS's ace woman reporter on French battlefields. Miss Breckenridge is a woman of charm, talent and culture. One would no more expect to find a woman like her courting danger than Helen Hiatt. Yet these two women in their way are writing a thrill packed and glamorous chapter in records of woman's part in man's bloody arguments. They are proving, in common with thousands of American sisters, that in times of emergency our Country has definite assets in its womanhood.

On the day when the German juggernaut crashed through and crushed Belgian resistance Marvin Breckenridge, bored with routine writing of meagre reports of events that were changing geographical lines and ways of living of entire nations, had made her

way into a still intact Belgian village. It was her intention to gather details of the brave, but outnumbered, Belgian army as it prepared to stand in criminal defense of its Homeland. Virtually all inhabitants had fled the village under orders of the military. A Belgian commander informed her that she was present at her own risk, although imploring her to hasten back to comparative security of the French border. She did not demur, but, instead, cycled out of the village and down the road toward France. Suddenly a blasting thunder roared down upon her from ertwhile empty skies. She looked up. What she saw stilled her heart momentarily, but not her nimble brain. That organ clicked with photolike fidelity to the detail of hundreds of German parachutists, falling like leaves from low flying military transports.

She saw a knot of parachutists land almost as a unit; saw, in the twinkling of an eye, a mobile machine gun assembled; saw, too, to her dismay, that the gun muzzle swung toward her and a burst of angry missiles spurted along the roadway near her. She raised her hands. One of the soldiers came running. He was an officer, duly overcome at the vision of a good looking American woman, calmly answering stare with stare and quietly demanding: "Are these troops the German advance in Belgium?" Completely awed the officer could only say: "Ja, Fraulein. But, it is best you go from here fast."

Marvin Breckenridge did go "from there fast." . . . A few hours later on a scheduled short wave from Europe all America knew of Germany's surprising invasion of another country, doomed to fall before a blazing and deadly new type of warfare.

Much more may be chronicled of the part women are playing in the game of red and pain drenched carnage of war. There are brave and cultured other women with Red Cross, ambulance and hospital services. Other women, who, in loyalty to the country to whose defense they have given sons and brothers, are risking their slender necks in ferreting information their men in arms may turn to advantage. But this must be not their story, but the part Radio's women play in times when still peaceful, still free, portions of a mad world must look to courage and resourcefulness to learn what it is they must know, to prepare themselves for the shuddering realisms of possible visitation on them of fire and death and agony, the fearful pennons that stream out from the staffs of the Four Horsemen.

Something must be said, too, of the men of Radio who cling to their jobs under trying conditions. NBC's Paul Archinard and CBS William L. Shirer provide pat illustrations of lengths to which earnest journalists will go to get out the news. And, incidentally, that last statement must go for all news gatherers, of press and air. Paris authorities, it was said, had constructed a mobile short wave unit to broadcast in event the German

**Stukas repeated their destructive assaults on other lands and their cities.**

On the day of the Paris bombing Shirer and Archinard were on outskirts of the beautiful city, making ready to put the mobile equipment to use. Suddenly the first of the Stukas roared out of the eastern sky. A numbing and jolting explosion lifted both men and tossed them yards away. A rain of debris, shattered brick, torn timbers and glass rattled down on them. Wails of wounded women, men and children pierced through the rumbling aftermath. Dazed, but, fortunately, unhurt, save for wrenches and superficial cuts, the two intrepid news casters stumbled back through acrid haze to where the mobile equipment had been. It was there no longer. They made their way to their car and scrambled back to Paris, not knowing but that with each succeeding moments, the still whining Stukas would begin obliteration of Paris. Back in Paris, while flights of German bombers roared in over the city after unloading their deadly cargoes on the outskirts, the two men got on the air and, again, a wondering outside world learned within minutes what had happened to the world's most beau-

tiful city—Gay Paree. . . .

Continental Europe news gatherers for America's giant networks know what it is to stand ruggedly in dangers and carry on traditions of an industry that is still very young as industries go in this world. Marvin Breckenridge, Eric Sevareid and William Shire of CBS may grin at each other with the strange fortitude that is characteristic of zealous workers. So, too, may Paul Archinard, Helen Hiatt and William C. Kerker, of NBC. For, they have been under fire and they know what it is like, because they have seen what happens to people and countries upon whom skies have opened and deluged them with shell screaming destruction. Perhaps, too, they think of their co-workers, Fred Bate, NBC London staffman, and Edward R. Murrow, of the CBS London office. For, being realistic people, they know that Germany, unless stopped, will be loosening 'Blitzkrieg' over the heads of their compadres, giving them opportunities to test the mettle and courage and abilities for which they were chosen, to represent the farflung and potent radio services of which Americans are proud.

To these men and women of Radiodom's and America's finest go the silent admiration of a Nation.

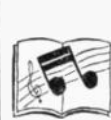

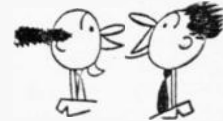

**FOOD FILOSOFY**

**I**NSTEAD of FILOSOFY this week, we feel rather inclined to a little FOOL-osophy, so here goes, and we hope you don't mind.

Our menu consists of a Lycopersicum Esculentum juice cocktail followed by some Apium Graveolens and Clei Europaea. Then we propose to have a Lactuca Sativa salad with mayonnaise, an Australian Lamb Hotpot, some buttered Brassica Cleracea sprouts and creamed Daucus Caroti, and finally, a Citrus Limonum pie with Thea Chinensis for a drink. There! How does it sound? We hope you won't have any trouble getting it at the market.

Isn't it strange how unglamorous a food becomes when you give it its family name? It reminds me of the movie stars. I don't know why it is, but as long as you call a potato "patata" or "pomme de terre" it still sounds pretty good to eat, but as soon as you call it "Solanum Tuberosum" you just don't feel you want any. Imagine calling a waiter and sayin, "Garcon, I'll have another order of Solanum Tuberosum."

Under the circumstances, perhaps we had better translate our strange menu before you lose both interest and appetite. Here it is in plain English:

Tomato Juice Cocktail, Celery and Olives, Hearts of Lettuce with Mayonnaise, Australian Lamb Hotpot, Buttered Brussels Sprouts, Creamed Carrots, Lemon Pie, and Tea. I'm sure you like it better this way, but just for a lark if you're giving a party, you might try typing the menu as it is above and passing it around among your guests before dinner.

As you probably have noted, we haven't bothered to change the name of Australian Lamb Hotpot in the foregoing into anything more foreign than Australian Lamb Hotpot. Australia is on the opposite side of the earth, and when somebody has already gone that far for a name, we would only be coming home if we went any further.

But let's get serious for a moment and tell you how to fit this antipodean

**Australian Lamb Hotpot:**  
 You'll need 6 lamb chops from the shoulder, 3½ tablespoons of butter, 4 cups of scalded milk, 12 very small onions, 12 very small potatoes, 1 teaspoon of salt, one-eighth of a teaspoon of pepper, a dash of cayenne, 2 tablespoons of flour, and ½ cup of parsley.

Having gathered these things together, this is the "modus operandi" (You'll have to pardon us, but we just can't escape our Latin scholarship this week.)

Cut some of the fat from the chops and brown the chops in butter in a frying pan, using high heat. Add milk, onions, potatoes, salt, pepper and cayenne. Cover, and cook for half an hour or until the potatoes are done. Arrange potatoes, chops and onions on a hot platter. Make a gravy with 2 tablespoons of butter and 2 tablespoons of flour by frying in a saucepan. Add the liquid from the lamb and stir. When it begins to thicken, pour the mixture over the chops, potatoes and onions, and serve.

Tomatoes first were found in Mexico and Peru. Your celery originally grew wild in Southern England. Palestine first seems to have cultivated the olive and your lettuce appears to have had its birth in India. As a member of the cabbage family, Brussels sprouts probably began in Italy. Carrots, on the other hand, were originally native all over Europe. Finally, the lemon in your pie dates back to ancient cultivation in East Asia, while your tea very likely still comes from China.

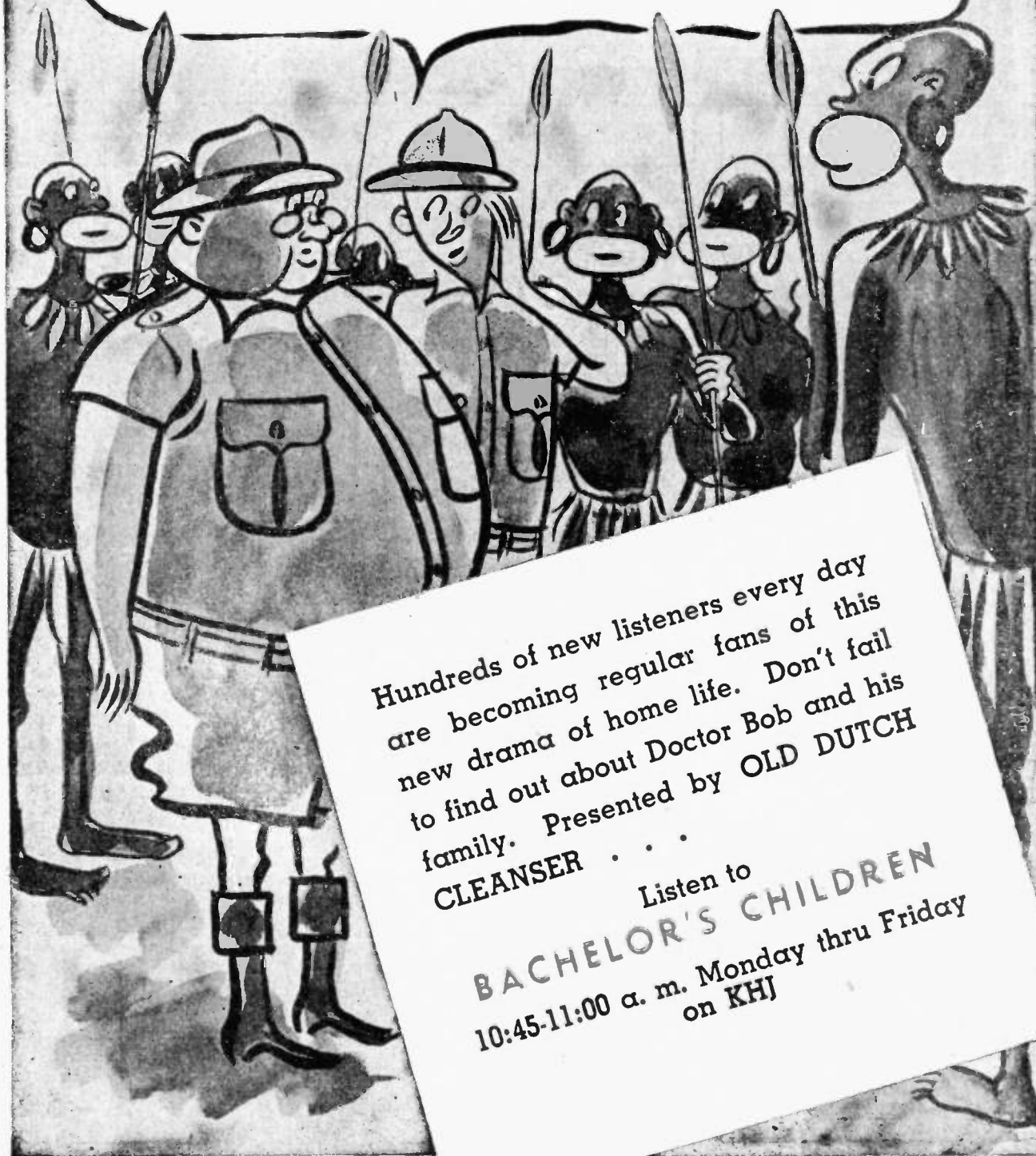
