## COMING OUT OF the ETHER

Damon and Pythias; David and Jonathan; Weber and Fields; Lum and Abner! Whether those four famous palsy teams shall be mentioned in the same breath by future historians is a matter for conjecture, but recorders of the current scene must inevitably put the popular radio team in the same category. They are as close together as a wad of gum and a restaurant table, or Don Ameche and the telephone!

I had the privilege of watching a recent Lum and Abner broadcast and found it to be the most interesting I have ever seen. The two boys, Chet "Lum" Lauck, and Norris "Abner" Goff have been together so long that they are able to actually read each other's thoughts. This mental telepathy talent was demonstrated when their script ran three minutes short and they were forced to ad lib. They did it so beautifully I couldn't tell where the script ended and the ad libbing started, and I was sitting there watching them!

Lauck and Goff lived next door to each other in Mena, Ark., when Goff was six and Lauck was nine. They have never been separated since that time. They played together, went through school together, graduated from the University of Arkansas together and become a well known local black-face team in 1930.

Appearing together on a flood relief program over a Hot Springs, Ark., station, they developed their present Lum and Abner characters. They have been on the air consistently ever since.

The setting for their story is a little town in Arkansas formerly known as "Waters". The characters in the story are real people. The town became so famous that the leading citizens requested the government to change its name to "Pine Ridge". Lum and Abner actually put that town on the map.

Lauck and Goff today are still young men. There is no reason to believe that they shouldn't continue to be radio headliners for the next 20 years.

Not only have they managed to acquire a top ranking in radio, but lately their motion pictures have been

She will return here for the new assignment with the famous screen baritone by airplane.

Eddy was in rare form on the debut program, but the program was noticeably in need of a feminine vocal touch, which the California soprano will add beginning next week.

Neil Hamilton, cinemactor making his first try at radio announcing, didn't appear very sure of himself on the initial program, and the sponsor is said to be dickering for a new mike-man already. 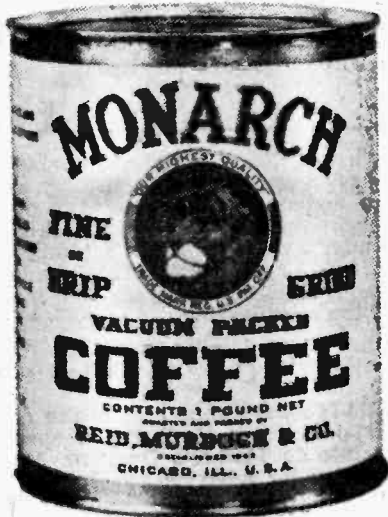

Despite the fact that he was due to leave that night on an extended and exhausting tour of cantonments, Hope went ahead with his plans to appear before the servicemen, and despite the fact that no program was broadcast; he staged an hour-long show after sitting down with the airmen to hear the President's talk.

### Series to Watch

Radio Life's program reviewer tabs as a show to watch for unexpected air entertainment this month the three-weeks-old Three Thirds of a Nation series currently being presented by

the War Production Board from Hollywood over the Blue Network on Wednesdays.

The first two shows, aired under the expert eye of William Robson who has since turned the reins over to Sam Pierce, one of West Coast's radio's most able young producers, were devoted to dramatizations of the whys and wherefores of rationing in sugar and rubber.

The second opus, broadcast on April 29, dealt with an exciting, yet sometimes humorous picture of how the nation's war machine continues to roll onward to Victory on the rubber which once supplied Mr. and Mrs. John Public with rubber tires for their automobile.

The rubber stanza drew upon the talents of a score of radio's finest dramatic actors including Rosemary DeCamp, Frank Graham, Hans Conreid, and Bill Wright.

### James' Big Week

Harry James, the tall, tan and terrific trumpet stylist whose dance orchestra has scored the most sensational success of the season, will recall last week as one of the most memorable weeks of his life if the music lovers from coast to coast ever give the ex-Benny Goodman musician time enough to sit down and collect his thoughts.

James, whose recording of "I Don't Want to Walk Without You" has mainly been responsible for his meteoric rise to nationwide favor in the past few months, finished his Universal film, "Private Buckaroo," in time to open a four-week engagement Tuesday, April 28, at the Hollywood Palladium. 5,000 persons attended his opening night session.

On the following day he was notified that his orchestra had received the most requests from U. S. soldiers overseas to appear on "Command Performance U.S.A.," Vick Knight's brilliant broadcast staged on Sunday for release to America's armed forces abroad by short wave beam.

Saturday, May 2, he was crowned "the King of 'em all" on the finale of the Spotlight Bands series, becoming the first orchestra leader to win the coveted gold platter award for the best selling record of the week seven times. This surpassed his closest rival, Tommy Dorsey, who won five times with "This Love of Mine."

James won six times on the Mutual-KHJ series with "I Don't Want to Walk Without You" and the last time with his recording of a new hit tune titled "Sleepy Lagoon."

The tall trumpeter from deep in the heart of Texas brought a dance com-

Are You a Missing Heir?—program sponsored by Ironized Yeast via CBS airlines—last week passed the million dollar mark in allocating legacies.

Show, based on an original idea by James Waters, New York attorney, and Charles Shebal, advertising agency executive, has located 204 legatees in 418 cases described on 124 broadcasts since its debut.

### CBSStars Get Grants

Norman Corwin, writer-producer-director, and Bernard Herrman, CBS Staff composer-conductor with headquarters at KNX in Hollywood, were named this week as two of the 10 creative workers to receive \$1,000 grants by the American Academy of Arts and Letters and the National Institute of Arts and Letters.

Corwin, currently directing the U. S. government's This Is War program, won his award mainly for his memorable Bill of Rights anniversary radio program, "We Hold These

Truths," which he wrote and produced. He is also the author of a widely-read book titled "13 by Corwin."

Hermann, brilliant young composer and conductor with CBS on West Coast since 1934, is well known for his Academy Award-winning musical score for the film, "All That Money Can Buy." His First Symphony, an original work, was given its world premiere last summer by the CBSymphony under his baton. Both will receive their grants at the Academy's Spring ceremonies held in New York May 8.

### Hope Trio on Tour

The star-studded array of Hollywood entertainers who launched a 14-cities tour for the benefit of the Army Emergency Relief and the Navy Relief Society at the Capitol Theatre in Washington, D. C. last Thursday (April 30) included three of radio's brightest names.

Cast in the dazzling 27-act show which runs two hours and 40 minutes onstage are Bob Hope, master of ceremonies; Frances Langford and Jerry Colonna, all three name fixtures on the Hope Pepsodent show.

In addition to his emcee chores, Hope performs with Claudette Colbert in a comedy sketch, co-stars with Colonna in a skit called "Life With Mussolini," and does a finale with Spencer Tracy.

### Gov't Cut-Ins

Proof that the government agencies will depend more and more upon the audiences commanded by the top commercial airshows for the 'spring offensive' for the sale of bonds and stamps was demonstrated Thursday (April 23) when Price Administrator Leon Henderson was cut in from Washington for last 11-minute spot on Kraft Music Hall. Sealtest Time with Rudy Vallee, on couple of hour's notice, was cancelled locally with time taken up by a special broadcast from Washington with Lt. Commander O'Hare.

# Announcers

## A to L....

**I**T TAKES more than a pleasing voice with personality to be a radio announcer. It requires an ability to do a selling job in a sincere, sparkling manner devoid of obnoxiousness. It demands perfect timing. One announcer may do nothing more on a coast-to-coast show than say: "This is the Columbia Broadcasting System." But this sentence must be delivered on the split second to keep a vast network in synchronization.

Very seldom does an announcer receive credit. His voice is known, his name is not. Some successful announcers become identified as "names" and become part of their shows, like Don Wilson with Jell-O. A few announce more than one big-time show; some do free-lance work on more than one network. To acquaint you with some of the announcers, Radio Life is presenting their pictures and chief assignments. Watch next week for names from M to Z.

## Spotlight on Oboler

Arch Oboler, radio's No. 1 man of letters who has a magic news sense which keeps him ever on the front line of news, was as much in the public eye during the last radio week as any other single personality in the microphone business.

Oboler, NBC's widely-publicized genius who has been writing, directing and producing 'Plays for Americans' every Sunday for the past several months from Hollywood, revealed early last week that he will write and direct a series of 12 morale films for the movies in addition to his radio activities.

The bespectacled ex-Chicagoan who received a check for \$30 in return for his first radio dramatic effort eight years ago and who now is rated about the most expensive radio writer in the country, will be backed in his movie venture by General Motors Corporation.

General Motors, which wants Oboler to produce a film a month for the next 12 stanzas, will show the features in 41 key cities throughout the nation and wherever General Motors has plants and employees. It will be Oboler's initial try at writing for movies.

On the radio front Oboler was in the news spotlight at Columbus, Ohio, where the playwright was addressing the 13th Institute for Education by Radio at Ohio State University. His subject before educators, politicians and radio executives: 'Radio Drama in Wartime.'

## HE KNEW WHAT HE WANTED

SEE that picture in the above right hand corner? That's a picture of a man who's always known what he wanted. His name is Hal Styles and he's been making it a business of entertaining, informing and helping the public via the radio microphone for the past decade in these parts.

From that wintry day in 1912 as a kid in short pants back in upper New York state when he first started operating a makeshift short-wave station, Hal Styles knew his life would be wrapped up in that thing known then as "wireless."

Despite a deep affection for the "wireless", circumstances were to arise during young Styles' freshman year in high school that kept him from following up his ambition to be a broadcaster until almost two decades later.

"I was just 14 when I was called upon to earn my own living," the commentator told Radio Life's reporter in the lobby of KFVB's Hollywood studios the other day just prior to his afternoon program, "and with radio just beginning to cut its teeth there was no opportunity to earn a meal with my 'wireless' ambitions."

So young, adventure-loving Hal set out on a career as a vaudeville entertainer that for the ensuing five years was to take him tramping through every state in the union. Dancing and playing his fiddle, young Hal was billed as "America's Clever Boy Comedian."

After his five-year career on the stage, Hal returned home to enlist in the Navy during World War I. And what did he do? Yes, he became a wireless operator in the Coast Guard. When the war was over and he had

shaken the sea out of his system by visiting over 50 countries and 16 foreign possessions in the Merchant Marine, Hal came back to U. S. shores to find that Dr. Lee de Forest had successfully launched his experiments in the field of radiotelephony with the result that radio broadcasting was on the verge of becoming a real business.

Sensing the possibilities in the new field, Styles traded in his seaman's uniform for a cowboy outfit and organized several of his ex-vaudevillian friends into a unit called "The Original Radio Cowboys" and embarked upon a tour of radio stations throughout 12 eastern states.

Three years as a barnstorming cowboy added up to a yen for a look at the real West, and so to southern California came Hal Styles to try his luck in West Coast radio.

Here Hal found a ready acceptance for his fresh, new ideas. After a brief term as a news commentator over KFAC and as a friendly counselor on KFI, he began making a name for himself as a special events broadcaster on KMTR.

In this new role the young New Yorker with the spectacular imagination found plenty of room to run rampant. First special events broadcast he pulled off was a jump from a plane in a parachute with a pack transmitter strapped to his back. Leaping from the airplane at an altitude of 10,000 feet, Hal described to his radio audience the varied sensations of falling

### New KMPC Feature

Years ago as a special correspondent of Paris Figaro and as a newspaperman roving over Europe, Marc Wilkinson saw and forecast the dangers of nazi-ism and fascism.

In Bavaria, covering the famous Passion Play of Oberammergau, he observed the rise of Hitler from Bavarian obscurity. What he wrote of Hitler did not much bother the German government, for Von Hindenburg and Chancellor Bruning also disliked Hitler.

But what he wrote of labor's persecution, and the danger to the world of aggressive fascist nationalism, brought ire of the Italian government, and his passport visas were promptly canceled.

Later, in America, he came in contact with anti-fascist Italian newspaper editors, and collaborated with them in the fight against fascism's inroads among Italian-speaking residents.

In a broadcast over KMPC, where he talks every Sunday at 10:15 p. m., he recently bared the early life and war record of Mussolini, and the murders of early fascist days, and paid tribute to the leading anti-fascist Italian editor in America, Vincenzo Mas-sari.

Senator Edward C. Johnson of Colorado read a copy of the broadcast script before the Senate. It was ordered printed in the Congressional Record.

For the last five years Mr. Wilkinson has been a writer on Los Angeles dailies. He is content to leave "spot news" reporting to other commentators. Believing radio listeners are interested in "the news behind the news," he delivers the historical background for today's world events.

### FOOD STYLES:

Where do food styles originate? On the side walks of New York, my friends, New York that lives mostly on coffee and cokes, cigarettes and aspirin. But in spite of that, the center for eating is still our City of Sky-scrapers.

Ever since the days of Diamond Jim Brady, king of fancy feeders, New York has been the home of dozens of gourmets' clubs, dating back to the time the Ichthyophagus Society was formed to popularize the eating of shark's fins, squid in its own ink, octopus, and anything else that might inhabit the deep.

Then there's the Wine and Food Society of today that revels in tasting contests at the Waldorf. Added to this list is the Duck Egg Eaters Club in Chelsea Village, the Gourmet Society, Salmagundi Club, and the most honorable Beer and Fried Eel Association of Hudson on the Hudson.

### BUDGETS B'GOLLY:

Your budgets are getting stretched to the utmost these days. And you are probably looking around for ways and means of economizing. Well, we have two suggestions. First use more beans in your menu planning. Beans have a high nutritive value and are listed among the more inexpensive foods.

Suggestion number two. Use Budget Pack Beans. These beans are especially packed so that they are ready for cooking when you get them. And what's more they are put in a cellophane package so that you can see exactly what you're getting. And then if you are looking for new ways of preparing beans, we have special recipes on each package just to help you out.

So far budgeting the wise way, use Budget Pack.

### SALADS:

Now that the salad days are literally upon us, here are a few ideas that may help you to make the most of your salads. After all you wouldn't want to disgrace your victory garden by not using its produce to the best advantage. So here goes.

The first point is washing the ingredients. Of course you do that thoroughly. Then the important thing is to soak them in cold water for half an hour to crisp and dry them on a towel or by shaking them in a wire basket.

Next comes the cutting of the salad materials. They should be cut in uniform pieces and small enough so that they will not lose their shape during the process of folding. If any of the ingredients are tough, such as parts of celery, cut them in fine pieces, while the more tender part is cut in large pieces. In this way the toughness is not noticeable.

And last, if you are marinating your salad, remember to soak each vegetable in the marinade separately. Any ingredient may remain in the marinade for an hour or so.

### STEWED

We mean apples, of course. As a matter of fact this is a salute to one of radio's more interesting Masters of

Ceremonies, who got one of his guests so confused she called him "Stewed Apples".

There are of course innumerable things you can do with apples (besides confuse your guests). You can make apple pandowdy, which is a cross between a pudding and a deep dish apple pie, or maybe you would prefer an apple slump. That's the same as a pandowdy except that it has a covering of shortcake dough instead of pie crust. Or maybe an apple grunt, apple catsup, apple bread, or apple pone would please you.

With our friend it's stewed apples that he likes, so please find below a recipe for "stewed apples" which we dedicate to our friend, Mr. Tom Breneman.

## Recipes of the Week

### Dollar Dinner for Four

- Breast of Lamb with Budget Pack Baby Navy Beans
- Asparagus with Butter Sauce
- Diced Carrots
- Sliced Beets with Oil and Lemon Dressing
- Bread and Butter
- Coffee
- Gelatine for Dessert

### Breast of Lamb with Budget Pack Navy Beans

- |                       |                        |
|-----------------------|------------------------|
| 3 lbs. breast of lamb | 2 tsps. salt           |
| 1 onion               | ¼ tsp. pepper          |
| 1/8 lb. bacon.        | 1 bunch parsley        |
| 3 tsps. Gravy Master  | 1 lb. small navy beans |

Chop 1 onion and 1/8 lb. bacon, and put to braize with 3 lbs. breast of lamb cut into 2 inch pieces. Braize the lamb, onion and bacon until nice and brown on all sides, and season with 3 tsps. Gravy Master, 2 tsps. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper, and 1 bunch of parsley chopped up. Cover the meat with water, about 1 inch above the meat. As soon as the water comes to a boil, lower the fire, cover the pot, and let simmer until the meat is tender. Wash and drain 1 lb. small navy beans, and put in a large pot with 1½ quarts of water, put on the fire and let come to a boil. As soon as the water comes to a boil, reduce the fire to simmer, cover the pot and let simmer until beans are done. When the meat is cooked, drain the beans and then fold in to mix with the meat. Finally, let simmer for 15 minutes, and serve. If you like, season with a little more salt.

### Recipe for Beef Steak a la Newlywed Nelson

- |                         |                                 |
|-------------------------|---------------------------------|
| 4 lbs. top round steaks | 6 tbsps. chopped suet           |
| 2 tsps. salt            | 5 large onions sliced very thin |
| ¼ tsp. pepper           | ½ cup butter                    |

Season steaks with salt and pepper. Pound hard for several minutes, or until slightly flattened. Sear steak in suet in a hot frying pan, lower heat and cook 6 to 8 minutes longer, turning steak once for even cooking. Saute onions in butter over low fire until soft and light browned. Serve over the steak.

### Stewed Apples a la Tom Breneman

Wash and core 8 apples. With a sharp knife cut a circle through the skin around the apple above the center, to prevent the apples from bursting. Place in a pan and fill the hole in each apple with sugar mixed with a little vanilla flavoring and some cinnamon. Put a pat of butter on the top of each apple, and on the bottom of the pan a cup of apple juice. Bake in an oven at 325 degrees until the apples get nice and brown on top—in other words, that they are a la Breneman "stewed."

through space. Later he broadcast from the bottom of the Pacific Ocean off Santa Monica in a special diving suit, and then following that with an 18-day tour through the Los Angeles County Jail during which he presented the voices and talents of many of the prisoners.

As Hal recalled his tour through the County Jail he was reminded of a recent article Radio Life carried on the San Quentin Prison broadcast.

"You know, contrary to what the San Quentin authorities may believe," said Styles, "their recent series were

not the first broadcasts ever to originate behind the walls of a California prison. My series, from June 1 to 18 in 1936, was the first ever presented with the inmates performing."

Styles is probably best known here for his memorable "Help Thy Neighbor" programs begun on KHJ and Don Lee Network in April of 1936. After finding almost 30,000 jobs for listeners almost single-handed, Hal suddenly became jobless himself.

After a period of recent inactivity, Hal found he couldn't sit by during the present conflict without contributing something, so he decided to present his new program, "Facing the Facts," over KFWB at 2 o'clock every

afternoon except Saturday and Sunday.

We talked to the glib-tongued, trigger-thinking Styles to almost within a minute of his airtime the other afternoon and found ourselves wondering why our interviewee displayed no signs of a script.

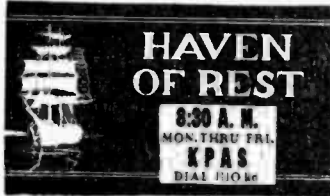
"Where's your script, Hal?" we blurted out.

"This is my script for this program," declared the radio veteran as he pulled a little note book out of his coat pocket. "I always knew that someday I'd be doing a little program like this, so I've been writing down notes about all kinds of things for years."

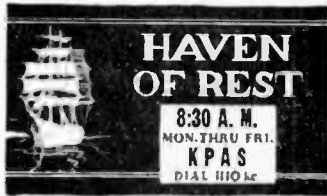
