FEW WEEKS ago when Orson Welles was pinch-hitting for the ailing Jack Benny over NBC, he aired some of the

cleverest scripts we have heard for quite some time. Bill Morrow and Ed Beloin, the Benny writers who composed the script "in spite of Mr. Welles," really surpassed themselves,

The following dialogue is reprinted by special permission and comprises high spots of two s c r i p t s : March 14 and March 21. Here's hoping you'll have fun imitating "Your Obedient Servant," Orson Welles.

GIRL: Pardon me, has Mr. Welles arrived yet?

WILSON: No, not yet.

GIRL: I'm his secretary, Miss Harrington . . . if you don't mind, I'll wait for him.

NELSON: (Very pompously) Studio B, I presume?

WILSON: Yes.

NELSON: I have come to clear the way for Mr. Welles . . . I'm Mr. Tootle-Quirtle, his secretary.

WILSON: His secretary. Then who's Miss Harrington?

NELSON: She's his private secretary, I am right out in the open.

WILSON: Oh . . Well come right in.

NELSON: Thank you ... Miss Harrington, has Mr. Welles' microphone been sprayed?

GIRL: Yes, also Mr. Harris.

NELSON: Good.

SOUND: DISTANT RUMBLE OF THUNDER.

NELSON: Ah, the master approaches.

(SOUND: 1. LOUD CLAP OF THUN-DER; 2 CHINESE GONG; 3 CAR BRAKES; 4 DOOR OPENS.

WELLES: Good morning. This is Orson Welles.

(APPLAUSE).

WELLES: Thank you, ladies and gentlemen . . . Miss Harrington, has this microphone been sprayed?

GIRL: Yes Mr. Welles.

WILSON: Well, Orson, I can't tell you how much we appreciate your coming over here tonight. . . It's awfully nice of you to step into Jack's shoes.

WELLES: I'm glad to do it, Don ... It's a pleasure to step into a pair of shoes nowadays without handing over a coupon.

MARY: Yesterday on the Super Chief. I got off at Pasadena.

WÉLLES: I wish I'd known that. I would have arranged for the Tournament of Roses to be held simultaneously with your arrival.

MARY: Gee!

PHIL: Wow, that Orson really does things in a big way.

DENNIS: Who did anything, he just said it.

WELLES: Dennis, I have spent years inflating the balloon that is Welles. Please do not puncture it.

DENNIS: Yes sir.

WELLES: Well tell me, Mary, how is Jack coming along? Is he up and about?

MARY: Oh yes, he's feeling a lot better. A few more days and he'll be over his nervous breakdown.

WELLES: Nervous breakdown? I thought Jack had a cold in his chest.

MARY: He did. But when he got his doctor bill, he went right from a mustard plaster into a straitjacket.

WELLES: Now Mary, Phil, before we rehearse, I think I had better explain this scene to you.

NELSON: Quiet everybody, Mr. Welles is explaining.

WELLES: Now Mary, in this scene, you as my fiancee and Phil as my brother, have parts which overshadow mine in dramatic intensity.

MARY: You mean we're more important than you are?

WELLES: Definitely. The motivation of the scene, its mood and pulse and tempo rest entirely in your hands.

Girl Organist. Vocal Star Join Procession

OUR HIT PARADE, marching steadily onward each Saturday night on CBS as it presents the "ten top tunes of the week," paused

recently while its procession was re-formed. Into the ranks of marchers came a new singing star to take the place of Barry Wood—sweet-voiced, 25-year-old Frank Sinatra—and a new organist,-red-headed, dynamic Ethel Smith, who can make a con-sole give out with a rumba or samba as no one else ever has done.

Ethel is considered one of the fore-most exponents of Latin American music in this country and she claims the distinction of being the first musician to interpret these rhythms on the organ.

When she decided that her interest in Latin American music was deep, the young native of Pittsburgh went straight to the source for her information-she traveled extensively in South American countries and studied not only the native songs and dances, but the people, the languages, and problems of Latin Amer-ica. While playing at the Copacabana in Rio de Janeiro, a representative of her present sponsor asked her to return to New York for a com-mercial air program. Despite the war, Ethel took the next boat back. Her contribution to the show is considered important, as the program is beamed below the border.

Perhaps more of you have heard of Frank Sinatra, for he was fea-tured vocalist with Harry James and more recently, with Tommy Dorsey.

If Frank had gone to a baseball game one day seven years ago in-stead of to a vaudeville house to hear Bing Crosby, he'd probably be pounding out sports copy for a Jersey City paper today, just as he was then.

But sitting in the vaudeville house that day, Frank decided he wanted to sing for a living. By 1939 he had worked himself into 18 different radio shows, believing that if he sang

"How To Write a Hit Song" By MARK WARNOW

Conductor of Columbia's "Your Hit Parade" orchestra.

A few weeks ago a friend said to me. "If anyone knows how to hit with a hit song, you should know." He was laboring under the delusion that because I play ten hit tunes a week on "Your Hit Parade" I might understand the ingredients of a Number One number.

Of course, I was flattered—so I put down my baton and tried to figure out why a hit's a hit.

There's one school of thought holding that lyrics are the important thing. Another school pounds on the piano and says the melody is more important.

I don't want to get into any such argument as that—so I've developed my own, or "Warnow," school of thought.

The successful song writer, as far as I can see, must know what the public wants. Of course, he has to be quick about it. The public may not want it next week. That is why the average songwriter is an agile fellow with a wild gleam in his eyes. And he's kept worn down by his efforts to follow the public trend in musical taste.

Perhaps here I should define a trend in music. A trend is a taste in music which, by the time the songwriter recognizes it, has changed to something totally different.

From this it might be gathered that I have a sneaking feeling that few songwriters actually know what the current trend is. Well now, that's right. The present taste might be for revivals—at least, the last time I looked out the window we were in the midst of what history will call the "Oh, Johnny, Oh" era but while songwriters are pulling oldies out of the old kit bag, they may suddenly discover the public wants sweet ballads on the sentimental side.

When thus confused, a hit song writer should sit down and read a newspaper. He may find something topical in the news that will make a good song. The relaxation will do him good. A songwriter either knows or doesn't know the trend. He sits down at his piano or paces around his room in the throes of writing a tune which he hopes will land on "Hit Parade." He writes it—and in the due course of time it DOES land on "Hit Parade."

Does he know how he did it? Nine times out of ten he hasn't the slightest idea.

Do I know how he did it? Quite frankly, no. Who, then, knows how he did

Who, then, knows how he did it? Someone must know. Do YOU know? Ah, there we have it. You —the public—know more about it than anyone else.

A songwriter writes a song. A publisher publishes it. An orchestra plays it. And the public decides whether or not it shall be a hit song.

be a hit song. And here I am, trying to tell the public how to write a hit. I think I'll just pick up my baton and get back to work.

You keep right on telling me what they are, and I'll play 'em.



Like the Mississippi River, Paul Whiteman "keeps on rollin' along." Of all the guys in the band bush-ness, no one has been "washed up" more than portly P.W. He's been "washed up, all thru" at least a dozen times that we recall. But some-how or other, he always seems to come back greater than ever.

We hadn't heard of Paul for some time, when all of a sudden Capitol Records kicked its shiny, new hat into the record business ring. That was about a year ago. Paul Whiteman, the great up-and-down man of the band business, was exploited as an EXCLUSIVE recording artist for the new company.

We didn't ask Glenn Wallichs WHY Capitol had contracted Whiteman. We KNEW. Whiteman is an institution. His name gave the company needed PRESTIGE. True, his records didn't sell as big as Ella Mae Morse's "Cow-Cow Boogie" or Johnny Mercer's "Strip Polka," but his name got the new company attention in the record and music trade.

Paul Whiteman always has been a LEADER. He has brought out NEW THINGS. You might say he fostered "symphonic jazz." He made jazz palatable for the masses. He brought out some of the greatest of modern singers and musicians-Bing Crosby, Morton Downey, Mildred Bailey, John-ny Mercer, the King's Men, Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey, Henry Busse, Jack Teagarden, Matty Malneck, to mention a few.

In fact, a few years ago a musician really didn't hit the TOP until he played in Whiteman's orchestra.

In 1919 at the old Alexandria Hotel Whiteman band earned here, the around \$350 a week. Just a few years later it moved on to the Palais Royale in New York at \$7,000 a week. It might sound like a lot when we hear that Tommy Dorsey earns in the neighborhood of \$100,000 per picture nowadays, but old "Pops" dragged down close to \$600,000 in "The King of Jazz."

At a charity concert in Carnegie Hall, he grossed \$65,000 in one night, the highest on record.

Then, first thing we knew, he was back at us again, playing one of his numerous engagements at the Cocoanut Grove. He had decided he wanted to be an orange raiser in California.

We don't know what "Pop's" latest ambition is, but his latest "comeback" was auspicious, when he played five concerts within a week in Southern California for the benefit of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra fund -each of them a sellout.

No, you can't keep a good man down, and P.W. is one of those kind of guys!

Radio City—(BR)—Just managed to make Madame Chiang Kai-shek's Los An-geles Press Conference. Arrived breathless, but the Chinese consul courteously showed me in, after I'd presented my credentials.

The large hotel room was jammed with representatives of the press associations, local newspapers, and national magazines, famous writers. Almost at once, Madame Chiang appeared, greeted us, and composed herself to answer our questions.

It was a press conference on the style popularized by the White House. We were placed on our honor to make no direct quotes of what China's First Lady said. It was her seventh press conference and probably her last on the present visit.

The usual questions were asked: What about China and India? China and Russia? Did Madame Chiang believe that we could arrive at an enduring peace? The same questions this gracious lady has been kind enough to answer from coast to coast.

But I assume you've read about that or heard it over your radio, so I'd like to mention a few things that haven't been printed or broadcast. At the conference, I met Mrs. Louise Roberts, sister of NBC's Upton Close, a

brilliant woman who also is an authority on the Far East and who lived with the Soong family in China for many years.

Soong was Madame Chiang's maiden name. There were three girls in the family, all of them beautiful and talented, and, in conformance with an old Chinese custom, they took a first name in common. Just as if three American sisters were to be called Rose Jean, Rose Anne and Rose Marie. Instead of Rose, the little Soong sisters were given the name "ling." Madame Chiang's given name is Mei-ling, meaning beautiful understanding, and the sister who married Sun-yat-sen, father of Free China, is Ching-ling or clear understanding.

Turned out that Mei-ling was well named. She proved to be the most beautiful of the three, and, auspiciously, the Mei part of her name is also the Shanghai Chinese expressions for America: beautiful country.

When I heard Madame Chiang reply to queries from the press, I detected just a trace of a Southern accent. She went to school in Georgia for a while before becoming Wellesley College's most distinguished alumna.

China's lady wore pearl ear-rings at the press conference. She also likes jade. Dressed in a black gown. I wondered about that since most of the press descriptions have placed her in that color. Mrs. Roberts explained:

Black is considered more ceremonial and better befitting a married woman of official family. The color is also appropriate to Madame Chiang's age. How old is she? Old enough to celebrate her birthday and that's clue enough if you know what that expression means in China.

Mrs. Roberts described the Madame as dressing in the modern Shanghai style. As far as fashions go, Shanghai used to be to China what Paris was to the world. In Madame Chiang, this style was typified by American shoes ... I'm told she prefers and always wears them ... and the black gown: short sleeves, length from shoulders to ankles, and split on the side. They say that modern dress styles have done more than anything else to unify China. Be-fore they were introduced by just such returned students as Madame Chiang, the differences in Chinese dress and dialects had kept the people from a firm But the Shanghai style swept the country, thus uniting the women on union. a solid front of fashion.

China's Ambassadress of good will, as I saw her, is of slight build, as most Chinese women are, except those from the North. She has dainty feet and hands, trim ankles, a face as beautiful as a full moon, and bone structure of the kind that's a sculptor's delight.

About her illness: she looked weary rather than ill at the press conference. About her timess: she tooked weary rather than in at the pless contributed She's had a long siege of travel. I understand her present condition is not se-rious. It's the result of an old injury. Sometime ago she and the generalissimo were out in their car inspecting the Chinese lines. A Jap plane dropped a bomb, machine-gunned the car, and it overturned. The generalissimo escaped with bruises, his wife suffered the injury which still troubles her. But I'm told she insisted upon walking back to another car. insisted upon walking back to another car.



"Of course she's good looking," we conceded. "She used to be a Powers model."

"Naw. Do tell!", exclaimed the prop man.

So we did. We told him all the things Georgia had confided in us a few days previously when we had huddled over chicken a la king in a corner of the Derby. How McClelland Barclay had come through Dallas and had said, "You ought to go to New York." She was just 17, just out of high school.


What to do! It was after banking hours. Of course a station wouldn't cash a personal check.

Cocky Doodle Maestro

Here's a Conductor Who Employs Doodles to Get Results From Musicians

HE clarinet player stopped, squinted, scratched his head, and finally called out euce's this thing?"

"what the deuce's this thing?"

Felix Mills, conductor, composer, arranger and about everything else musical, dropped the baton, walked off the podium, and approached the musician. He was a new man in Mills' band, which is one of the high spots of the Tommy Riggs-Betty Lou weekly NBC airshow.

"What's this here business doin' on my score?" the clarinet player pointed to a drawing—a very good drawing—of a harpie bopping a guy on the noggin with a mallet.

"That," said Mills, "is a doodle. I do a lot of doodling".

As most of you Radio Lifers know, music from which orchestra members play is not the usual sheet music variety. Every number must be "arranged" to suit the particular orchestra which is playing it, and each musician has a special copy of his own part.

There are certain rather positive effects that Mills demands of his musicians in the orchestrating and arranging that he does himself. He learned early that the best way to achieve this was to draw a "doodle" over the note or bars affected. Not bad "doodles" either, because Mills admits that one of the main reasons he managed to finally get out of grammar school was be c a u s e his drawing teacher also happened to be the school principal.

If you were allowed to prowl Mills' spacious music files and library which occupy huge rooms of his Los Angeles' home, you would note that the "doodle" effect runs through most of his lighter stuff even to the varying shades of blue to bring out how much of that Harlem quality he seeks to ellcit from each score. It does make sense, too. The older members of his musical ensemble say Mills' doodles help no end to put over a point and Mills has figured out that it saves a lot of wear and

tear on his vocal chords.

His men call him "cocky-doodle maestro" for the same reason that most seven foot guys are called Wee Willie. Mills is a quiet, mild-mannered gent, but he is a driver on the Toscanini order and insists on the ultimate in perfection. Once he taps the baton on the wood, the boys all know that the head-man is facing them. In his long career in the field of music Mills has played every instrument except the violin and tells you confidentially that one day he'll get around to "Love in Bloom" on that cat-gut viaduct, too. He started as a sprout of six, beating the bass drum in the Sunday School band at Fort Collins, Colo.

"I was not good, but boy! Was I noisy," he laughs. Then he went to the snare drums and on and on and up and up to the leadership of many musical organizations.

His right "handle" is Gordon R. Mills--not Felix.

The Felix nickname came early in his career as a leader. When rehearsals went sour on him, he had a habit of fuming within but refraining from bawling out his musicians. He would pace back and forth, hands locked behind his back with shoulders stooped.

One day an observing French horn playe: leaned over to the oboe player and remarked: "Felix, the cat, he looks like!" The name stuck.

But back to the doodling that mystified Mills' new clarinet player the doodle of a harple bopping a guy (Please Turn to Page 37)

Mousand Jeaks in Radio

> orchestra came up on the elevator into the pit, catch their first number for my audience, then cut out and go around back stage and down underneath to set up my microphones to complete the narration. I couldn't see what was going on, of course, but I'd memorized the script, and knew how to time it hy the sound, of the feet on the stage floor over my head.

As background for the prologue, a fountain with running water, was set on the stage. The water from the fountain was drained off by a large pipe that terminated about three feet from my broadcast set-up. Yes, one night the drain in the floor became clogged and the water from the fountain started to seek its own level, and pretty soon, my level.

I kept right on talking about the adagio dancers, the comedian with the little dog, and the street urchins of Paris, as the water kept coming higher and higher. It was well on the way past my knees when one of the stage hands happened to look down my way and saw my difficulty. He brought me a rickety but highlegged table, and from that vantage point, literally, I finished my broadcast.

One long remembered is the broadcast of the blessing of the animals and pets at Olvera Street—a beautiful ceremony, beloved by all Southern Californians. On the occasion referred to, I arrived at the fountain a little late and though the Padre was there, and the crowd assembled, the animals were still back in their pens, where their owners were tying flowers onto their halters and freshening the gilt on their hooves. There were cows, and goats, beautiful huge horses, bulls, and children's pets, all excited, yet all very well behaved.

My wife walked past the engineer's remote set-up just as he turned to me and said "if you don't get those animals on the move, you won't have them on the broadcast." She took him literally. Without saying a word to me, she went down to the end of the street, opened the pens and started pushing the animals out. She speaks Spanish very well, so as she turned the heads of the cows, goats and horses toward the gate she'd say "Time for the blessing and the broadcast." Of

N A FEW days there'll be another Easter Sunrise Service in the Hollywood Bowl, and as usual KHJ-Don Lee will have microphones out there to pick up the ceremonies for broadcast. How different it will be from the first one I took part in. Fifty thousand celebrants were there and to this day I think the sight of that microphone and the remote equipment we carried enthralled them as much as the glory of the sunrise.

Unfortunately, the implied tribute didn't thrill me, the announcer. For just as I was in the midst of my own contribution to the radio service, one of the fifty thousand stepped on my microphone cord and I went off the air. Nowadays, of course, microphone cords are built to take the pressure of a crowd, but that day it meant a repair job on the spot, with a very frustrated announcer commentator doing the repairing.

Actually, when I sit down with my scrap book, and "remember when," it does seen that it has been 18 times 18 years since the day I first read stock market reports on the air, and so became identified with radio.

When I see the youngsters who come into the studio now, all professionally pollshed, trained by radio listening experience if not by conventional radio schooling, I look at them and wonder what they would have thought of that first broadcast of mine, with my script clipped from the newspaper, the microphone set up in a room where people hung their coats and waited for appointments to see the doctor down the hall, and worst of all, my voice so colored with doubt that anyone could hear me, much less understand me, that what I read must have sounded even duller than I thought it was.

Maybe some of you remember when one of Hollywood's radio stations broadcast the prologue to the weekly presentation of "Seventh Heaven," with Janet Gaynor and Charles Farrell. It was my job to narrate that prologue, week after week.

I'd sit out in the auditorium as the

When James did form his own group, Sinatra went with him for six months before switching to Dorsey. Sinatra left Dorsey's band to accept tempting offers for solo work and pictures.

Radio considers Sinatra a fresh, interesting personality. His voice is universally liked and he has brought a large following to "Hit Parade."

Remaining as regulars are Mark Warnow and his orchestra, and Joan Edwards, femme nightingale, who have lent their popular interpretations to many a favorite.

And speaking of favorites, we thought you might like to check up on the progress of the "Parade" so far this year. Consequently, Radio Life obtained the record direct from New York and lists for your information the top tunes from January 1 to March 20, 1943: "There Are Such Things," six times top; "Moonlight Becomes You," two times; "Brazil," two times; and "I've Heard That Song Before," one time.

through his control board. He turned to Olmstead, the producer—"You know, last night when we went over the program it sounded bad—this morning it's swell." Olmstead laughed a genial laugh and remarked: "That's what a good night's sleep will do for you."

As we looked out over the orchestra, it was interesting to note the number of women that have taken places. Seven of them. A thing almost unheard of in pre-war days.

Ken Darby, leader of the Westinghouse Choir, never removed his eyes from Victor Young. He led his group in exact coordination with the orchestra, in order to form the combination of metal instruments and human instruments all blended into one.

In order to keep up with the six microphones, and different ranges of tonal aualities. Engineer Brooke's hands flew back and forth from one modulator to another on his control board with an eagerness to help create that for which Producer Olmstead was striving—perfection.

As one sat in the control booth, saw the sensitive faces of the musicians, heard the well-modulated voice of story-teller John Nesbitt, thrilled to the great baritone voice of John Charles Thomas—it was impossible not to feel the greatness of this program—greatness which does not come from formal attire, but from honesty of soul, and a determination to bring to the people the finest music possible.

Tingles of emotion ran to the very tips of our fingers as the music and songs poured out unstintingly over the air waves. This was the "Westinghouse Program." ... This was a program typical of America.

S we passed good-looking Clarence Olm-stead, producer of the Westinghouse Program, in the NBC corridors on Saturday afternoon, d in his groups for the particular S

he stopped and in his gracious man-ner said: "We just finished our re-hearsal. Why don't you come to the 'dress' tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock?"

We hadn't seen this show yet as it had just been transferred from New York, but we had heard that it was a program that usually rates the name of "long hair." We en-visioned at the dress rehearsal baritone John Charles Thomas standing so straight and tall, with a black tuxedo. We imagined master storyteller John Nesbitt wearing a dark blue double-breasted suit, and Vic-tor Young, the leader of the orches-tra in ... well, it certainly would not be in a colored shirt, but a very neat white one.

This, in our mind's eye, would be the one rehearsal, in an otherwise casual Hollywood, that would rate the name of "dress rehearsal"

Did they dress?-But then we're getting ahead of our story.

Our curiosity had the better of us. So at 10 o'clock sharp we were at the "dress rehearsal."

When we arrived musicions scurried out. Studio D, the largest auditorium at the National Broadcasting Company, was all confusion and chatter.

Then gray templed producer Olmstead clapped his hands. Almost as if by magic, chaos became order. The musicians, all 44 of them, moved to their seats.

Victor Young, the maestro, stepped upon the podium, tapped his baton twice lightly for attention, and from that orchestra came almost heavenly music. But the light trills of the flute, the stifled sighs of the horn, the singing notes of the vio-lin, were soon drowned out by the full, rich baritone voice of John Charles Themas Charles Thomas.

Later, Thomas joined us in the control booth and confided, "it feels grand to be back in California. Now • I can dress like this."

Perhaps we wouldn't have been so surprised at Thomas' garb if we hadn't pictured him dressing as he sounded. But, oh my! Here was Metropolitan Opera Star Thomas pointing to a pair of burgundy slacks and shirt, polka dot tie, leather jacket, and a black beret!!

At that moment, in walked John At that moment, in walked John Nesbitt. Did he wear the double-breasted suit?—(that question al-most sounds like the ending of a soap opera). No, readers, in walked dashing Mr. Nesbitt in green slacks, gray-green open-necked shirt, and a plaid loafer jacket. This was set off by gray gun-boat shoes!! by gray gun-boat shoes!!

Perhaps Mr. Nesbitt noticed we were looking rather quizzical at his clothing and he commented with a wry grin, "I always dress this way. It started years ago. I was the announcer on a show which featured a large orchestra that dressed formally. On one very warm evening when we were rehearsing, I asked if they minded if I removed my coat. of the artists'! It was at that moment I decided never again would I wear my blue serge suit ... I'd dress just to please me ... comfortably. Every week after that, since I wasn't one of the artists, I'd come in opennecked sport shirts and tennis shoes. I guess that's what started me dressing this way ... and I love it."

Our attention was then called to Victor Young, the conductor of the orchestra. He is not just a wrist or arm conductor, he throws his whole body into the rhythm, until you no longer see a small, dark-haired, bespectacled man—but the living embodiment of music.

By this time we no longer expected to find Mr. Young in the white shirt, but were ready for anything he looked so comfortable in his brown slacks and short sleeved shirt!

When the number was finished, and pronounced good, he radiated a satisfied glow that was contagious to all members of the orchestra who took such a visible pride in their work.

The rehearsal had stopped because Thomas' music was nowhere to be found. So engineers, sound men, writers, directors, all went in different directions trying to locate "Kay" Thomas' secretary who had the music.

In a few moments the lost was found, and the program continued. Engineer Bob Brooke listened with a critical ear to the notes as they came (Please turn to Page 37)
