


# Tom Breneman: Still Wows the Women

His Antics With Hats And Sardi's Visitors Continue to Convulse HE brand new baby boy crinkled his button nose, puckered his button nose, puckered his button mouth and gazed drowsily up at the lady who was holding him. "Oh, he's going to have beautiful, great big eyes!" she said, and kissed him. She was the first woman to see him after his debut into the world and she lost her heart to him completely.

Tom Breneman—for, of course, it was he—has been quickening the heartbeats of ladies of all ages ever since. That "way with the ladies" has made him one of radio's most celebrated masters of ceremony and has built the Blue network show, "Breakfast at Sardi's" into one of the most popular morning programs on the air. Its November Crossley rating was 9.5—highest of any morning show for that month.

Friendly, informal, affable, a past master of repartee, Breneman is always the same and always just himself. His radio personality is 100 per cent genuine—the same Breneman his friends and family know. And he's won so many loyal followers that if he chose to run for mayor of Los Angeles, Governor of California or even President of the United States, he'd probably collect more votes in this section of the country than any other candidate you could

## 100,000 Requests

It's harder to get tickets to "Breakfast at Sardi's" than to any other radio program in Hollywood, for there's a small backlog of more than 100,000 unfilled ticket requests. The show's coveted invitations are sent out to fans who write in for them. Ninety attend as invited guests each week-day morning. To see Tom Breneman in action and enjoy the fun, over 400 others each morning join the crowd for breakfast at Sardi's swank Hollywood Boulevard cafe. The guests come to the restaurant at 7:30 o'clock in the morning and are served coffee and rolls. Mondays through Fridays, they stay through two broadcasts, with breakfasts between—the early edition, 8 to 8:30 a. m. PWT, for the East, the second at 9:30 o'clock, for the West. On Saturdays, only the Western broadcast is heard.

The show revolves around Tom Brenneman. The handsome host of the program—a big chap with dark Mair touched with gray and with large, alert black eyes—has no script to cramp his style. Portable microphone in hand, he just roams from table to table, gabbing with his guests as informally as he would over his own breakfast table at home. And he lets the consequences of his queries fall where they may.

## Attracts All Ages

The breakfasters, mostly women, are from every state in the Union, from every walk of life, and range in age from 18 to 100. But, however drab their lives, Tom Breneman finds a little color in them; however prim their mien, a little gayety underneath—and he draws it out. He doesn't try to elicit sensational remarks. He just wants to bring out the familiar human traits that make life the most fascinating entertain-



Remember hearing Jane and John Doe chanting that provocative "Oh What An Easy Job You've Got; All You Do Is Wave a Stick Blues?" The idea is that most people at one time or another have had the urge to lead a band. It seems so easy. It looks like fun. So Sammy Kaye gave' the public a chance to try it. It turns out to be not so easy, but

in the nation's musical spotlight is the story of a nice guy who has the right

EVERYONE WANTS, AT HEART, to wave a baton at a bunch of musicians, and here, one young lady realizes her ambition. Guest "conductors" receive gifts of batons and



plenty of fun. And with his promo-tion of the idea, "So You Want to Lead a Band?" and the creation of accompanying contests, Sammy has become America's new ambassador of good will.

For he has given music-loving Americans the opportunity to release the yearning for rhythm and melody that has always beat within their hearts. And they find in Sammy the sort of geniality and kindly good humor that puts them at their ease and enables them to enjoy themselves completely.

Last summer, on a blistering June day in Chicago, people stood five deep, in a ticket line two blocks long, waiting to get into the famous Chicago Theater to hear Sammy Kaye and his band. The week's engagement they played there broke that theater's boxoffice record for bands presented in June. The next week, Kaye and his musical boys broke the record at a Milwaukee theater.

Their popularity has grown tremendously in the last year, with their weekly Wednesday night program for "Old Gold" on the Columbla Network fast adding to their fame. Almost everyone who listens to the radio is familiar with the catch-phrase, "Swing and sway with Sammy Kaye," and now people who have only a mild interest in popular music are beginning to ask, "Who is this Sammy Kaye?"

# "Sweet" Exponent

Well, to start with, he's an exponent of "sweet" music and the composer of "Remember Pearl Harbor," "Until Tomorrow," "Good Night, bor," "Until Tomorrow," "Good Night, bor," "Until Tomorrow," "Good Night, My Love" and "Hawaiian Sunset." None of these is a tune which has been heard on the "Hit Parade," but they've all been extremely popular and give promise of having a more linearing vogue than some of the big smash tunes.

Sammy, a slim, ash-blonde, blue-eyed baton-wielder, with high cheekbones and conspicuous ears, is now in Hollywood with his band to make a movie and play an engagement at the Palladium, starting February 8. Kaye's will be the first "sweet" band ever booked at the local dance pal-

Born 33 years ago in Rocky River, Ohio, Sammy didn't plan to make a career of music. He was graduated from the University of Ohio in Cleveland as a civil engineer, but he never used that technical knowledge. He had been taking violin lessons since he was 12, and began to play the guitar, banjo and saxonhone when

he was in high school. The paper route he had when he was going to high school in Athens, Ohio, didn't bring in enough money to cover his needs, so he began to play with small bands.

Kaye went to college on an athletic scholarship, but it paid only for his tuition. So he organized a band and established the Varsity Inn, which became a popular dance spot for the college boys and girls. He took his band out on the road in the summer. "And all the money I made at the Varsity Inn during school months, I spent on the band in the summer," Kaye recalls.

Sammy had every intention of becoming a civil engineer after his graduation. But he had a chance to lead a band at the Cabin Club, a Cleveland tavera, and he grasped it. That lasted the season. Then he took his band to the Hotel Statler in Cleveland. It was there, in 1935, that his music first went on the air.

Key to the kind of a fellow Sammy is lies in his ideas on the organization of an orchestra. He does not feel that the greatest musicians make the best orchestras. Believing that men who must work together for long periods of time should have more fellowship than ability, he has formed his musical unit around that ideal. And as long as Sammy is the director of his orchestra, the ideal of good sportsmanship and sociability shall form his decisions as to the addition of new members to his organization.

As far as the selection of new members is concerned, Kaye's orchestra operates on a fraternal basis. When a new member is needed, or one applies, the entire group holds a meeting and votes on the applicant. If all the boys feel that the prospective member is a "good mixer," and the type of person that they would introduce to their parents, they welcome him into their circle. Since coming to Hollywood, the band has organized its own bowling team.

## All Is Happy

This atmosphere is carried over on Kaye's airshow, "Everybody's Inn," heard every Wednesday night over KNX. A well-rounded offering of music, comedy, and present-day drama, it pleases the listener's palate to perfection.

Ushered on the airlanes by the smooth strains of "Swing and Sway," Sammy's original theme which he composed several years ago, the program is highlighted by the sweet swing melodies of the orchestra, with lyrics supplied by such stellar soloists as the lovely Nancy Norman and Sally Stuart, baritone Billy Williams and tenor Arthur Wright, with the popular Kaye choir of 10 blended voices. And, although it is currently not being broadcast, Sammy still uses his "So You Want to Lead a Band" stunt to "warm-up" his studio audiences before airtime.

Because of the impromptu nature

of 'So You Want to Lead a Band,' many side-splitting situations have arisen during the course of the contests, especially during the time Sammy is interviewing the contestants, asking them why they want to lead a band. Some say simply that they love music. Others are in the market for more money. The night life of batoneers appeals to still others, while one fellow wanted to front for a band so he could put his brother-in-law, a drummer, to work. One girl explained that she would make a swell appearance on a podium, while a middle-aged man admitted that he would like to lead a band in order to have a good excuse to stay out every night!

# Convention Coverage

Elaborate arrangements have been completed by the National Broadcasting Company to bring to its millions of listeners in this country and our troops abroad complete coverage of the coming Republican and Democratic national conventions. All of NBC's top-flight commentators and news reporters have been assigned to the conventions, along with editors and writers from news staffs in New York, Washington and Chicago.

In addition to giving the world dayby-day reports of the proceedings and special pickups, the network has installed facilities to bring into the convention hall the latest war news news which potentially might change the tenor of the proceedings at some crucial moment.

This year for the first time NBC will shortwave full accounts of the conventions to our fighting men in all theaters of operation throughout the world. Special attention will also be paid to the "women's angle" in the convention proceedings, and every effort will be made to introduce to the nation the women whose husbands hold positions in American political life.

Where did the name "soap opera" come from—"soap opera" meaning those five a week, quarter hour dramatic serials, the best of which are on KFI. We suppose we could sound mysterious and come up with a lot of fancy-sounding explanations, but the truth of the matter is, the explanation is fairly simple.

If you'll tune your radio to KFI some-week-day and listen to these little 15minute daisies you'll find more than a few are sponsored by various brands of soaps. The name 'opera' was tacked on naturally because some of the serials had a story format which resembled remotely the type of dramas the old stock companies dreamed up. If you're old enough to remember those traveling stock companies who came to town, pitched a tent on the vacant lot just outside of town, you'll see the similarity between those early thespians and our modern radio variety.

And that is about as close as anyone can come to giving a definition to "soap opera."

"Soap opera" is really fine entertainment. If you don't believe us, make a check in your own neighborhood. Ask any dozen housewives you happen to know and the chances are you'll find at least 10 who will tell you they think they are 'swell.'

Most of these Monday through Saturday serials deal with problems that are every-day, down-to-earth situa-tions which could occur in any American home. For that reason, house-wives have been known to project themselves into the heroine's role and literally suffer with her. Some peo-ple enjoy that sort of thing.

Sometimes judgment is upset by emotional strain."

"Don't get mad at other motorists," said Dr. Thompsoson, "because anger disturbs your judgment. And don't drive when you are worried about your income tax."

"Traffic Tribunal," doesn't always take the viewpoint of the law. Frequently it is the police who are put on the spot, as it was in the fifth anniversary program of the KFI series last July. Then Judge Leroy Dawson, as Quizmaster, put three traffic officers through the third-degree of the kind most motorists would like to try. The results, however, were much in favor of John Law. On questions of traffic safety the police scored 100 per cent. But nobody gave a satisfactory answer to the question, "Who are most belligerent when stopped, men or women?" Even a supposedly hard-boiled motorcycle cop side-stepped that one!

# Putting the Skids on Death!

Thirteen Thousand Traffic Accidents In 1943 Give Air Program Huge Job

> Saturday, 5:30 p.m.: KFI

FFICERS CREWE and Woods, who conduct the "Traffic Tribunal" series, don't have to worry about a script. Their listeners provide them with more ideas than they can use.

From the hundreds of letters they

From the hundreds of letters they receive every week, these police officers cull questions, dramatic ideas, real-life stories about traffic problems. These are built into a quarter-hour show with students of L. A. City College and U.C.L.A. assisting in the dramatizations. All letters are checked by the police department. If John Public has a beef, it is investigated and answered on the air.

For six years, the Traffic Education Department of the Los Angeles Police Department has been trying to prevent injuries and deaths by this radio program, "Traffic Tribunal." Today, the show faces a bigger job than ever before.

# Bad Record

Last year, traffic accidents rose alarmingly in Los Angeles. The increase in population, estimated from three and a half to five million, the rise in number of pedestrians, presence of hordes of servicemen unfamiliar with the regulations—all have contributed to the upswing of accidents.

Last year in Los Angeles city, there were 783 traffic accidents involving Army personnel only. Up until December 21, 1943, 395 persons were killed in traffic, an increase of 15.9 over the 1942 total. Pedestrian deaths totalled 265, a sharp rise of 18.3 per cent over 1942. Injuries in all traffic amounted to 13,631, an upswing of 13.6 per cent, of which 4,022 were pedestrians, an increase over last year of 39.5.

Thus has "Traffic Tribunal's" chore augmented.

To give Producer Jack Edwards a cops-eye view of the traffic problem which the program tries to attack, Officers Crewe and Woods recently took Edwards on a tour of duty in a police car. Back came the producer with a healthy respect for the law, a head full of ideas for vivid drama, a better knowledge of the worries that keep police traffic men awake nights, and a couple of gray hairs.

At another time "Traffic Tribunal" called psychiatry into conference to decide "what makes a jaywalker."

In their broadcast of October 2, the twin voices of the police department interviewed Dr. George N. Thompson, chief psychiatrist of the Los Angeles County General Hospital, to discuss the causes and cure of jaywalking and careless driving.

# Trouble Shooters

Get Radio Tickets, Listen to Crackpots, Engage Hotel Rooms — These Comprise Only Part of Salesman's Chores

WO years ago when it was separated from NBC, the Pacific Coast Division of the Blue network had one 15-minute commercial per week, which it lost shortly after through contract expiration.

For the recently completed year of 1943, the Pacific Coast Blue rolled up a gross commercial billing, exclusive of program sales, amounting to \$444,000!

The network branch responsible for this achievement is the Sales Department, and the man heading this operation is dynamic, nervous-gesturing Tracy Moore, ex-advertising man and publisher, Moore entered radio 11 years ago in Portland.

Said he, "Every day is a crisis."

"Every commercial (sponsored) account on our air comes through Sales," Moore explained. "Hence, we reach every department. We're really the trouble shooters."

Technically, the Sales Department is through with an account when it is sold. But being the sponsor's chief contact with the network, Sales is called upon to engage hotel rooms for clients, listen to complaints about shows, wangle radio tickets, Rose Bowl seats, be patient while crackpots air their ideas for programs, see that political candidates fork over the money before they go on the air, decide whether a timepiece-maker who wants to give away a watch on "Breakfast at Sardi's" is motivated by generosity or by the desire to get a free plug from Breneman.

# Romance, Too

"The other night I was listening to a well-known comedian," Tracy said, "and got to thinking that Sales was probably responsible for him being married to a certain singer, now retired. This story just proves how Sales tangles into every ramification of radio. We needed an emcee for a certain show and we looked high and low for a comedian who was not too expensive but still had some reputa-

In instances like this, Sales works hand-in-glove with the Program Department, for Sales must satisfy the client in order to keep the show sponsored.

The case of Vera Vague illustrates this point. Some years ago Barbara Jo Allen, now famous as the screwball Vera, was best known for her work as Beth Holley on "One Man's Family" and for parts on "Woman's Magazine of the Air." She had only performed her zany role a few times.

"Down here in Hollywood," recalled Moore, "'Signal Carnival' wanted a gabby telephone operator-

# A-Medical Accounts

Specific standards have been established placing the most cautious restrictions on the advertising of medical products (no copy advertising habit-forming drugs, no copy dramatizing distress or morbid situations involving allments).

# B-Unacceptable Accounts

- No profession in which it is considered unethical to advertise; for example: doctors, lawyers, etc.
- 2. Reducing agents, as well as food and beverages when advertised as such.
- 3. Products purporting themselves as color restoratives for the hair, eye-brow dyes, wrinkle-removers, and similar products.
- 4. Mouthwashes, or so-called antiseptics to overcome or prevent bad breath.
- 5. All forms of fortune-telling and any such service.
- 6. Forms of speculative finance

and real estate intended to promote the purchase of specific stocks, bonds, etc.

- 7. Cemeteries, casket manufacturers, etc.
  - 8. Firearms and fireworks.
- 9. Organizations and services whose functions are the dissemination of information dealing with general subjects of a controversial nature. This includes: Groups of organizations formed to promote or defeat legislative or governmental issues; religious denominations or groups. (The latter is given a generous portion of sustaining time).
- 10. Horse races or race tracks when sponsored for the purpose of publicizing forthcoming races or to advertise racetrack as amusement park. A specific horse racing event may be offered for sponsorship if it is considered of sufficient importance from a news standpoint, and if sponsored there will be no reference to odds or betting.

type of comedienne. The one we signed upped her price after the audition. So Sales called Barbara Jo in San Francisco and asked her if she would come to Hollywood. She agreed and, of course, everybody knows how she went on from 'Carnival' to a big spot on the Hope show. Sales takes satisfaction in her success."

# **Near Miss**

A year before Pearl Harbor, Moore recalled, there was a deal pending to sell the beauties of Japan. The Nipponese had used only three-fourths of their appropriation for the Golden Gate Exposition displays and a bright young American-born Japanese promoted the idea of a quarter-hour weekly program to be paid for with the unused balance.

"We even had the order for the deal," Moore said. "But when we met the very polite, low-bowing Japs behind it, we turned the show down. We didn't think it would clear with the State Department."

Moore then went on to explain the modus operandi of Sales. The Blue tries to sell for keeps, rather than for a short-range. So-called "transom sales," where an undesirable or inexperienced sponsor throws an account into the Sales office, are assiduously avoided. The procedure in selling runs about fifty-fifty: sometimes Sales spots a likely sponsor, someone in the money and ripe for a radio campaign. Then the department tries to find a suitable program. At other times, a program idea develops and it becomes apparent that it is just the ticket for a certain product. The job then is to sell the sponsor into bankrolling the show.

Sometimes the fireworks explode. Moore recalls a well-known cigaret outfit which asked for a 48-hour option on a show. While the option period was still in force, another client, a soap concern which had been interested in the same program, gave Sales the order. True to its code, Sales allowed the first client an opportunity to exercise its option.

portunity to exercise its option.

"A year later," Moore said grimacingly, "another man from our Sales Department and I went to a San Francisco night club for dinner with two representatives of the disappointed firm.

# Stranded

"Everything went along swell until I took out my cigarettes and offered some to the soap representatives. When they saw that the brand belonged to the clients who had taken the show they wanted, the two men got up and left us—with the check!"

When Moore first entered radio, he wrote the commercials, sold them, and then played the Irish policeman on the program. He remembers one client who always had to cry before he would accept a script. Every week the same problem arose: to find a script which would provoke the tears. The week eventually came when no script could perform this

OBODY knows Kay Kyser!

Making this statement were five of The Old Professor's closest friends and co-workers; his producer, Paul Phillips; his writer, Carl Hurzinger; his arranger, George Dunning, associated with Kyser for 16 years; his statuesque, ex-model featured femme singer, Georgia Carroll; and baritone Sully Mason, college pal who has worked with Kay for 17 years.

They were clustered around a big oblong table in a special "mass interview" from which Radio Life hoped to squeeze out a newly-slanted story on the energetic, bespectacled orchestra leader, who, with his entertainers has played to three-fourths of our armed forces and has raised 300 million in bonds.

Each was contributing an observation about the strawberry-locked maestro.

"I ought to be able to say a million things," drawled stocky Sully. "Mam, I can remember when Kay and I were together at the University of North Carolina. He sure proved that he was a natural-born organizer. His marks were good and he made the honorary fraternities. He was a wonderful cheer leader. At Chapel Hill they say they've never seen anything like it. Three years ago when he went back, Kay got out in front of the bleachers and led the cheers. That was the last time North Carolian beat Duke," Sully remarked a little wistfully.

# Limited Repertoire

"While he was in college he organized a band," spoke up the arranger, George Dunning, who was perfunctorily copying a sheet of music while Sully was reminiscing. "The band knew six pieces. Just six. We were engaged to play at the Oxford Country Club for an evening's dance and we did the six numbers over and over again. I remember two of them were 'Deed I Do!' and 'Everybody Loves My Baby!"

And now it's the best paid band in the business!

Neither Sully nor George cared to talk about the years between college and success. They shrugged off the hardships almost impersonally, had almost forgotten the time the boys lived on popcorn for three days.

Instead, they turned to the lush years which have followed since Kay and the band made a hit at the Bal Tabarin in San Francisco and a few years later thought up the "College of Musical Knowledge" idea which brought Lucky Strike as a sponsor almost instantaneously.

# Punches Jokes

The conversation switched to the show. "Kay," remarked his writer,

The producer chimed in. "Kay knows you better than you do yourself. He majored in psychology and he expects everyone to be sharp. One thing he can't forgive is carelessness. But on the other hand, if you do your work well, he always gives credit. On the show he always introduces the performers by name. The teamwork is remarkable.

"To Kay," continued Producer Phillips, "the listening public is the most important thing in the world. He's on the air to entertain, and if he and a contestant happen to get into a funny situation, Kay completely disregards the script and tries to make sure that everybody has a good time. He often calls me 'Mother' Phillips because I worry so much, especially about getting him off the air on time.

"When I come to Kay and he gives me a swell idea, I say 'I should have thought of that originally'."


"Kay kids me and answers, 'That's why I'm Kay Kyser!"


# Is Considerate

# Tom Breneman: Still Wows the Women

ment in the world. Occasionally, he matches wits with a famous guest star in an ad lib interview.

In the course of each broadcast, Breneman awards several gifts. The gifts are, of course, an attraction, but the most powerful magnet is Breneman himself. The program is the child of his own fertile brain. He was lunching at Sardi's with a group of friends one day three years ago when it struck him that the famous cafe, with its tiered rows of booths surrounding a large open space, would be an ideal place to stage a program. Six weeks later, on January 13, 1941, Tom emceed the first broadcast of the breakfast show, sent out by remote control from station KFWB.

The rainy season was at its height. The show was absolutely dependent upon an audience. Taxicabs were sent out each morning to pick up the 60 guests. Breneman and John Masterson, manager of the program ever since its start, lived in constant horror of finding themselves without an audience some rainy morning. "But we discontinued the taxicabs two months after the first broadcast," Breneman reminisces. "The requests for tickets began to exceed the accommodations."

When daylight saving time went into effect, they wondered, "Will women be willing to brave the dark on winter mornings to come to the show?" They were. No matter how dark the morning, nor how rainy, there was always a crowd waiting to get in when Sardi's doors opened. Nine months after its first broadcast, the show was bought by the Blue network.

"Considering all the writing and rehearsing that goes into other radio shows, the success enjoyed by this program, with no preparation at all, is amazing," remarks Manager John Masterson.

Uncle Corny's jokes, now written by Vance Colvig, are the only lines prepared in advance. Telling them, Tom Breneman is both himself and "Uncle Corny."

# Models Hats

Tom Breneman's modeling of women's hats highlights the hilarity on every program. He borrows the wildest looking piece of feminine headgear in the room, discusses it with its owner and eventually, tries it on at the angle that will make him look as ridiculous as possible. He prefers hats that are flattest on top because he thinks they make him look the silliest. Almost invariably, he opines, the woman who wears the hat regards it as quite conservative and when he asks to borrow it, gasps, "You don't mean my hat!"

Gag hats, obviously worn to attract his attention, Tom usually ignores. He loves to find an extreme hat on the head of a woman attending the broadcast with her husband. He puts the two of them on the air,

asking the head of the family how he likes the hat. "Were you with her when she bought it?" queries Tom. After the husband's vehement denial of his presence and approval, host Tom pursues, "What did you say when she came home with it?" "Do you really want to know?" asks the husband, warningly. And that's when Tom walks off with the microphone and a knowing, "That's all, brother."

Tom finds the women from every part of the country equally good subjects for interview, but the elderly ladies prove the best. "Women seem to lose their self-consciousness and their inhibitions as they grow older," he observes.

A 92-year-old Van Nuys woman was frank to admit she had come to get the orchid which is always given the oldest woman present. She received the orchid. "Do you use Minute-Man Soups?" asked Breneman. She caught on fast. "I certainly do and I'm all out of it." Breneman presented her with a case of the soup. "Do you use Old English polish?" "Yes, I do, and I'm all out of that, too!" She got the polish. Then she smiled up at him impishly and said, 'I want to take you home with me, too!"

"You never can tell what kind of an answer you're going to get," Breneman declares. "Some of the replies certainly ought to prove that the show isn't prepared in advance. For example, I asked an elderly lady, 'Do you use Minute-Man Soups?' 'I never eat store-boughten soup,' she replied, emphatically. 'I make the best soup in the world!'"

Not an answer to make the program very popular with the sponsor. But Tom turned it to good advantage by asking the lady a series of questions which brought out the fact that making soup in the old-fashioned way takes a long time and is lots of drudgery.

# "Yes"-Women

One morning, Breneman questioned a nice-looking, large gray-haired woman who had eyes as big and black as his own. "Are you a fan of my program?" he asked. "I certainly am." "Do you listen in every morning?" "I certainly do." Then he walked away, and talked to someone else. After a bit he came back. "Do you think I'm a good-looking man?" he inquired. "Yes, I do." "Do you think I'm a good master of ceremonies? Do you think I'm underpaid?" He got an emphatic "Yes," to every question. "You sound like my mother!" observed Tom. "I am your mother," said the subject of the interview. It took a minute or two for the truth to sink in, and then the crowd howled with glee.

Tom's sociable, 74-year-old mother and his petite, vivacious blonde wife are two of his most valued critics. Both listen in regularly, the elder Mrs. Breneman from her home in North Hollywood, the younger from the Tom Brenemans' rambling white, green-shuttered Colonial-type home in Encino.
