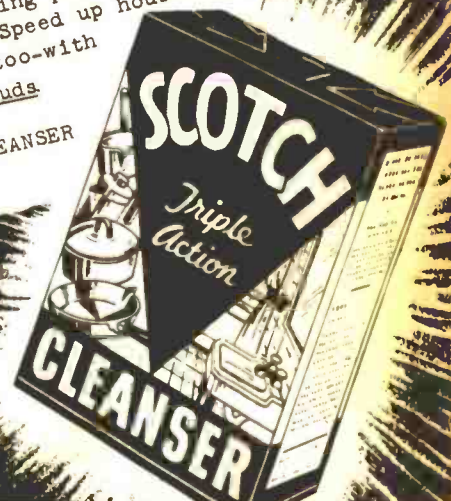

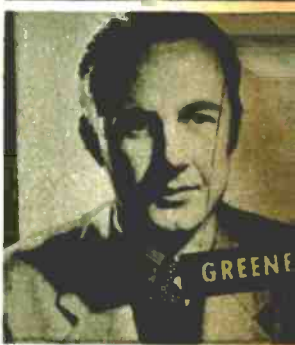

★ NBC's Bob Hope Riots His Way
Into Hearts of Airmen While
Sidekick Crosby Aids and Abets ★

FRANCES LANGFORD came out on the stage and thousands of air cadets howled approval. She was wearing a fuzzy, pale pink sweater and baby blue slacks.

"Your outfit brings out your eyes," cracked NBC's Bob Hope.

"It brings out yours, too," answered Frances.

Bob put his arm around little Langford.

"The last time someone put his arm around me, it was a Boy Scout," she said.

"I used to be a Boy Scout," quipped Hope. "I was a member of the wolf patrol. Ya-hoo, ya-hoo!"

Back from the cadet audience came a unison response, "Ya-hoo!"

Lightning-witted comedian Hope pretended a big "take," then hollered, "What local?"

The cadets guffawed and cheered madly.

Eight-Hour Laugh

They were being entertained with eight solid hours of radio's sharpest humor, just because Bob Hope had met a certain P-38 pilot when he was in Africa last year. The pilot was Captain W. A. Robertson Jr., whose father, Colonel Robertson, is commanding officer at Santa Ana Army Air Base.

Occasion for the festivities was the base's second anniversary, combined with observance of the colonel's 54th birthday anniversary. Captain Robertson was home for the celebration, and when Hope introduced him during the great two-hour, outdoor show held from four to six in the afternoon on the huge parade ground, Bob said, "He gave me a ride in his P-38. My stomach's coming back tomorrow!"

Offered the choice of any guest star from Hollywood's galaxy, the cadets unanimously summoned "The

Groaner," Crosby, to augment Hope's scintillating humor. In his tow, Bing brought a complete camp show bill, one, which unbeknown to most persons, he organized and for which he foots the bill. In his easy-going manner, Crosby emceed the performance which occupied first portion of the afternoon's schedule.

Memorable Sight

It was a sight never to be forgotten. Seated on the parade grounds were thousands upon thousands of khaki-clad cadets (the exact number, unlookers were warned, is a se-

cret). There was a sea of them, and where they diminished in the far distance, an intensely blue sky began—a sky banked with fleecy white clouds hanging low over snow-tipped mountains. To the northeast, Old Glory whipped smartly in the breeze.

Vera Vague walked out on the stage, surveyed the uniformed throng, and gasped: "Oh, my goodness! The jack-pot."

Hope surveyed the scene, spotted Colonel Robertson and Major General Cousins in the front row, raised

The Stars Own Show



Hollywood's Names Act for Free,
But Also for Fun and for a Cause

WHEN Dick Powell was suddenly called out of town, finding it impossible to make his scheduled appearance in "True to Life" on a recent CBS "Screen Guild Players" program, Cary Grant was asked to substitute.

"It's not the type of story or role I'd select for myself," Grant rightly declared. "It's not for me—but you bet I'll do it!"

Linda Darnell likewise stepped into the feminine lead on last-minute notice to replace Joan Leslie.

Hollywood's great and near-great await with anxiety the opportunity to do a "Screen Guild" show. Yet, in contrast to the multi-figured checks they receive for guest star stints on other programs, no reimbursement is given them for the performances they bring to the airlines on these popular Monday evening broadcasts. Their fees are turned over to the Motion Picture Relief Fund which enables the film industry to take care of its own. This is the "Screen Guild Theater" the stars' own show, and they give generously and eagerly of their time and talents.

In the three years that the present

series of "Screen Guild" shows has been on the air, Basil Rathbone has made a record of eight appearances. But if a number of months elapse and Rathbone receives no request to return to the Guild microphone, he phones producer-director Bill Lawrence and queries dolefully, "What's the matter? Don't you like me any more?"

Both Rathbone and his radio film partner, Nigel Bruce, voice a protest when one appears on the Screen Guild show and the other is not called.

Demand Work

"And just in the last couple days," Bill Lawrence pointed out, "Eddie Cantor and Kay Kyser, two of the biggest, busiest entertainers in the business, have called to ask for a spot on "Screen Guild." They're among radio's highest-priced performers, yet they go out of their way for the chance to do a stint on our show for free!"

This is typical of the way radio and filmland's great go all-out for a cause—particularly one as close to their hearts as this fund that cares for the industry's needy unfortunates. So "Screen Guild" has brought to the airlines a big parade of top-flight motion picture personalities including Ingrid Bergman, Katherine Hepburn, Spencer Tracy, Charles Boyer, Joan Fontaine and Brian Aherne.

"Whenever possible," director Lawrence points out, "we secure the original motion picture cast to recreate their film roles for radio."

Then, because this airplane program is the stars' own show and one for which they receive no fee, the film players feel free to take an active part in the planning and production. Often, having already created the role for films, the performers have helpful suggestions for dialogue changes and additions to the script. Bill Lawrence found both Bette Davis and Paul Lukas of great value in formulating an effective air adaptation of the dramatic "Watch on the Rhine." Bette contributed changes that had been worked out on the movie set while Lukas remembered, as well, the best points of production of the stage presentation in which he also starred.

Improve Airings

When "Lucky Jordan" was selected for a "Screen Guild" airing, Alan Ladd pointed out the faults of the film for the improvement of the radio script. On the screen, the story had started out as a farce, then finished with a climactic chase and dramatic displays of heroism. Ladd suggested to Lawrence that in the airing of the story, he stick solely to farce. Lawrence accepted the star's advice, presented "Lucky Jordan" as a comedy, and radio listeners loved it that way.

"As a matter of fact," director Lawrence declared further, "we greatly prefer doing comedies and light romance. A good dramatic play cannot really be presented effectively in so short a time as our half hour show allows. So we stick to the Crosby's, the Hopes and Sinatras."

Of all the "Screen Guild" shows he has presented, Bill Lawrence names "Holiday Inn" as one of the most thrilling. "With the exception of the Gershwin Memorial Concert," Lawrence stated, "it was the first

time Dinah Shore and Bing Crosby combined their talents—and boy, it was really *something!* The way those two sang Easter Parade sent shivers up and down my spine!"

"When it comes to Bing and Dinah," the popular producer director continued, "I'm as much a fan as anybody."

Rehearsals Are Fun

Bill Lawrence is always a "regular guy," and his rehearsals are fun sessions for the stars. In the first place, he bans long tiring rehearsals.

The cast assembles for an hour and a half on Friday and then reports just two hours before show time on Monday.

During these periods they carry on all-around discussion of the play to be presented, each of them offering his own ideas and suggestions. Lawrence lends a receptive ear at all times. The result is Grade A radio entertainment and a show that started out with the high Crossley rating of 15, then soared upward to 25.

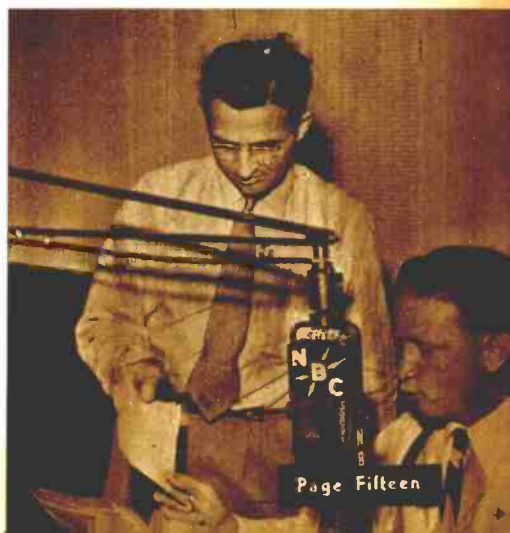



FLASH! We have it on reliable authority that Columbia will be recording again in a few weeks. That means that Victor no doubt will follow closely. Meanwhile, in spite of production handicaps, Decca and Capitol are providing many snappy new discs. It'll take us sometime to catch up on all of them, but let's look at the newest.

KENNY BAKER has a new pair under Decca label in "Marianne" and "Easter Sunday With You," accompanied by Harry Sosnik's orchestra. "Marianne" is Ernesto Lecuona's second popballad and is featured in Warner Brothers' "Uncertain Glory." Its platter-mate looks like the first big Easter song hit since "Easter Parade." Both are done well by Kenny, a favorite of ours.

SISTER ROSETTA THARPE, best-known for her gospel singing, has two well-suited for her style in "Sleep On, Darling Mother" and "I Want to Live So God Can See Me," with guitar accompaniment, for Decca. Collectors of Americana will go for these.

SPEAKING OF Americana, several years ago a friend of mine wrote that he had discovered America's greatest cowboy singer. His selection was a cowpoke named Tex Ritter, then waxing 'em under Decca label. Since then, Ritter has gained fame in the movies and on the radio. Now he's recording exclusively for Capitol. His latest disc pairs: "Have I Stayed Away Too Long?" and "There's a Gold Star in Her Window."

FORMER SIDE is Frank Loesser's tune, which to us looks like Hit Parade material. Latter is Ritter's own song, written with Frank Hartford. Ritter has deviated from his former pattern of such great folk tunes as "Rye Whiskey," "The Chisholm Trail" and "Good-bye, Old Paint," but these two western pop tunes come as near to Americana as any we've heard. Both are getting a terrific juke box whirl.

"MAIRZY DOATS" has had its fling and is pretty well on the wane (thank goodness), but we recommend the Pied Pipers' version for Capitol, in case you can still stomach the tune. It's backed by a really swell ballad, "A Journey to a Star," which gives the Pipes and their Pipestress, Jo Stafford, a chance for some fine harmonizing. So if "Mairzy" don't get you, "Star" will.

LOS ANGELES' own threat to Frank Sinatra, youthful Andy Russell, makes his debut under Capitol banner with "Besame Mucho" and "You're the Dream, I'm the Dreamer." To our way of listening, Andy sounds a bit too intense. He seems to apply a bit too much endeavor, rather than relax and let the song take its natural course. But we feel that when Andy gets more experience and ease, he'll be running Frankie and some of the others a merry race.

song show, Oboler's "Free World Theater" and other large productions, and who is now occupying a similar position on "Everything for the Boys." Although he has several serious compositions to his credit, jovial John Scott Trotter is best known for his deft arranging-conducting of "Kraft Music Hall," for which he may always be relled upon for unique, but melodious effects. He was awarded honors in the popular music division Honorable mention went to Frank Sinatra's arranger-conductor, Axel Stordahl, without whose genius and guidance "The Voice," in our opinion, could never have climbed. Incidentally, the Stordahl influence has been felt on the "Hit Parade," which calmed down its brassiness and sweetened up with more string effects after Sinatra became star of the show.

As best radio producer in the comedy, or variety classification, we selected Tony Stanford, whose vision has guided Chase and Sanborn's opus with Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy. But Stanford also rated acclaim for his outstanding production of the two-hour holiday shows on Thanksgiving and Christmas for Elgin Watch. Responsible for a variety broadcast four times the usual length,

he steered an assortment of prominent stars through well-contrasted spots to comprise a fast-moving, but distinct program on both occasions. For producing "Suspense" with signal competence, Bill Spier received the nod as dramatic director.

Rhythm Boys

There was no doubt in our minds as to the most outstanding guest appearance. It occurred July 4 on the "Paul Whiteman Presents..." show and featured a reunion of the Rhythm Boys, Harry Barris, Al Rinker and Bing Crosby. The sentimental value of this reunion was one of the highlights of the summer. Harry von Zell's last-minute substitution on the McGee show for Harlow Wilcox, ill with the flu, was carried off with a frolicsome flourish typically von Zell and was tops in listening.

Best summer replacement was "Johnny Mercer's Music" show, which held down Bob Hope's time with a tuneful half-hour marked with class and verve.

Dunninger, the Master Mentalist, we thought had made the most unique contribution to listening by performing his brilliant feats of mind reading. "Radio Hall of Fame," with its weekly selections of the best in drama, musical selections, songs, comedy, and "Potluck Party," which achieved the submersion of spot announcements in a frivolous variety show were voted for honorable mention.

Bob Crosby-Les Tremayne were considered the new program most likely to remain, provided, however, that summons from Uncle Sam do not break up the combination. Dud Williamson's "What's the Name of That Song," which recently moved to Hollywood and is now heard coast-to-coast, was runner-up in this division.

"Great Gildersleeve" picked up its program interest where it left off at last spring's sign-off and sustained it to such an extent that it is one show fans hate to miss. Hence, it was voted the program making the greatest advance. Ed Gardner's ("Duffy's") half hour has rolled merrily on, gathering more interest and listeners on the way. While in Hollywood before Christmas, this show took advantage of the situation to engage many big names as guest stars. Bing Crosby was one whom Archie entertained and the script used by The Groaner and Archie on the night of December 7, 1943, was chosen as the best comedy script of the year. There were many others so humorous that we listed a few of them for honorable mention. The Crosby one, however, had the advantage of being delivered in maximum style, hence, merited the choice. It will be published, for your entertainment, in next week's Radio Life. We hope, too, to print the Robinson script, as it was selected as most outstanding dramatic writing. Watch for these special features.

Believe It or Not!

WHEN American fighting men swarmed on to the invasion beaches of North Africa, they distinguished friend from foe by a password. That "password" was a phrase that has become one of the most famous four words in the world—"Believe It or Not." Its renown is credited to a man of adventure and intrigue, Robert L. Ripley.

The origination of Ripley's "Believe It or Not" dates back to the time when Ripley was a sports cartoonist on the staff of a newspaper. One day while searching desperately for a subject for his next cartoon, he hit upon the "Believe It or Not" idea. It proved an immediate success. He joined King Features Syndicate in 1929 and has drawn over 750,000 cartoons in all.

Today Bob Ripley's idea is a big business. The personnel of Believe It or Not, Inc., includes nine experts who do nothing but handle mail, a linguist who speaks and reads thirteen languages, Ripley's personal secretaries plus their secretaries, research experts and business controllers. This extensive staff aids fact-finder Ripley in formulating his daily newspaper cartoons, motion picture shorts, best-selling books, freak exhibitions and his new Mutual radio show, heard five times weekly.

Fighting Men Contribute

Highlighting his current series of air shows are the amazing new wonders culled from a world at war and answers to V-mail questions sent to the "Believe It or Not" impresario by United Nations fighting men. On each broadcast Ripley matches the news headlines with a story that occurred at the news point.

On one of his recent airings he told of a British patrol of World War I which was trapped in the very same valley in which the Israelites were surrounded by the Philistines thirty-two hundred years ago. Just as it looked as though the entire battalion of six hundred British soldiers was doomed to death, the army

chaplain read from the Bible the quotation that pointed out to the men the passage to safety taken by the Israelites.

At the conclusion of his dramatization of this miraculous incident of the first World War, Ripley presented to his radio audiences, T. Stuart Miles of La Grange, Georgia, who had been with that doomed British patrol which had been delivered to safety by a verse in the Bible—believe it or not!

On another of his broadcasts Ripley accepted a serviceman's challenge to prove his "believe it or not" claim that "the shortest distance between two points is not a straight line." Ripley pointed out that the ideal straight line is an illusion because it is based on the apparent levelness of the earth's surface. But the surface of the earth is not level at all. It is curved, and thus the shortest distance between any two points on the earth is a curve—believe it or not!

Amnesia Incident

On another occasion during his current series of broadcasts, Ripley told the story of Ernie Burnett, composer of "Melancholy Baby." During the last war, Burnett was an amnesia victim, and not until years later when he heard Paul Whiteman mention his name in announcing the song on the air, did he discover his identity. Ripley's guests on the program during which he told the story of the amnesia-stricken song composer were Mr. Burnett and Paul Whiteman themselves.

Suspense greets the listeners to Bob Ripley's "Believe It or Not" presentations from the moment the program goes on until it ends, and it is no wonder that as many as 11,000,000 people have had their radio dials tuned to a single Ripley broadcast.

One of the airlines' real veterans, Bob Ripley has appeared as guest on nearly forty other network programs in addition to having his own show for fourteen years. Among the radio "firsts" to his credit are: being the first man to broadcast ship-to-shore; the first to broadcast to every country in the world simultaneously; the first to send a cartoon by radio and telephone; the first to take his entire program to a "remote" broadcast location; and the first to interview famed "Wrong Way" Corrigan.

3,000 Letters Daily

Robert L. Ripley owes his career

IN EAST AFRICA ROBERT "Believe It or Not" Ripley finds a chieftain wearing a heavy wool blanket—despite the equatorial heat of over 100 degrees. And he also "wears" a chair, a little low stool which he carries with him wherever he goes. But what intrigues Mr. Ripley most of all is the chief's unique headdress. Hundreds of locks of hair are tied into individual knots, and then the entire head is plastered with a mud mixture of bright red clay and vegetable oil. It's a knotty problem all right, but the hair stays put in all kinds of weather. Believe it or not!

to the fact that he broke his arm playing baseball. Born some fifty years ago in Santa Rosa, California, he was well on his way to a promising sports career when, after a try-out with the New York Giants, he broke his arm. Then he turned to drawing and was hired consecutively by the San Francisco Bulletin, San Francisco Chronicle and the New York Globe as a sports cartoonist. Today he receives more fan mail than any other man in the world—3000 letters a day. At one time the postman delivered a total of 2,000,000 letters to him within just three weeks. In addition to his vast radio audience, nearly eighty million people read newspapers in which Ripley cartoons are the most popular syndicated feature. Millions more have seen his amazing "Odditorium" exhibits.

In his never-ending search for phenomenal facts, Bob Ripley has journeyed to the four corners of the earth and has viewed all the wonders of the world. He has traveled more than 600,000 miles in 201 countries, and is a member of the Royal

Geographical Society, the Circumnavigator's Club, the Explorers' Club, the National and American Geographical Societies and the Adventurers' Club.

Ripley has been in China more than in his own New York offices. His first job was drawing designs on tombstones, and his first cartoon was sold for a mere eight dollars. He draws his cartoons upside-down!

Believe It!

He still uses the front door of his boyhood home, 3000 miles from his birthplace. He wears only bow ties, and his favorite garment is a dressing gown. He has never played a game of cards in his life, and he has never smoked, though his radio sponsor is Pall Mall cigarettes. He owns five automobiles, but cannot drive a car. He likes the company of chipmunks, and has a passion for moving heavy objects. His collection of treasures gathered in his world-wide travels is valued at \$3,000,000, yet his housekeeper always says:

"The most unusual thing in the house is Mr. Ripley himself!"

What's in One, Anyway?

Names, Names, Names! Radio Uses Scores Every Day, But Whose John Henrys Are They?

THE OTHER Tuesday night, Ed Gardner wanted to use a name of an undertaker on his "Duffy's" show. Cast members wracked their brains trying to think up an amusing, but plausible, name. What they finally settled for in the script was Poggenburg—Ed Gardner's own real name!

Finding names to use in radio scripts is a ticklish proposition because persons with those handles may turn up to sue the show. To avoid complications, most programs do one of two things: either they choose names so outlandish that no human being could ever lay claim to such a fantastic cognomen, or they use names of actual persons who have given permission for such a proceeding.

Kate Smith often refers to Harry Ackerman on her program. There is a real Harry Ackerman who used to be Kate's producer. Sometimes as often as three times a week the name of Tom Harrington is employed for script use. Actually, Tom Harrington is vice-president in charge of radio for Young and Rubicam Agency and you'll find that accounts using the Harrington name are Young and Rubicam client-sponsored shows: Jack Benny, Burns and Allen to name a couple. Hubbell Robinson Jr., whose moniker comes in for quite a play, too, is radio supervisor for the same agency. The Abe Lastfogel and George Gruskin often referred to are William Morris Agency men, the former being head of the Hollywood office and Gruskin being radio talent representative. Cantor and Burns and Allen make frequent use of Lastfogel and Gruskin.

Keith Fowler was another name kicked around the Burns and Allen show. He was always the villain, but in real life, Fowler was one of the show's writers, very much married and a solid citizen. He is now in the Army.

Druggist Is Real

Clifford Goldsmith, who writes the "Aldrich Family," uses fictitious names throughout his scripts with but one exception—the name of the druggist, William DeHaven is in reality the name of Goldsmith's hometown apothecary, and last year when Mr. and Mrs. DeHaven visited New York, they were given front-row seats for the broadcast out of consideration for their generosity with their cognomen.

Robert L. Redd, who authors "Point Sublime," chose the name, August Moon, for one of his characters because he had known a family which had a liking for seasonal names "August" Offert, "June" Offert, "Winter" Offert. Of course, the "Moon" part of Moony's name is a play on the words "June Moon," or as Redd puts it, "Moony is a kind of late season June Moon." Other names on "Point Sublime" are chosen for their euphony. What better designation for a retired Texas cattleman than Howie McBryayer?

Once Redd had an interesting experience when he used a friend's appellation on his program. He thought the fellow would be flattered because he was written into a love story, so Redd told his friend to be sure to listen to the program, but did not tell him why. Even though he was the hero, the friend was peeved because he felt that the big love scene embarrassed him. So thereafter, Redd decided to let his own intuition and invention serve him rather than real titles. One principle he follows in compounding names is to avoid "handsome Harry" or "sugar Sue" cognomens. He wants them to sound natural. Many times, however, he varies the spelling of a name, for example, Myers might be Meyers or Meyres.

Unique System

Rueben Gaines, when asked what system he used for his comedy characters on the "Home-Makers" and other Don Lee shows, said: "I hit myself on the side of the head and the first word I utter becomes the name of the character." A sterling idea, which should be passed on, perhaps, to other writers.

A short time ago, CBS' "Blondie" show introduced a firm competing with "J. C. Dithers Construction Company." The rival outfit was scripted as "Anderson, Sanderson, Henderson and McGonigle." A real Miss McGonigle, who is in the construction business somewhere in the east, made immediate objection to the use of her name on the show, saying that employment of her moniker as the target for gags was very embarrassing. So Writer John L. Greene changed the name of the company to "Anderson, Sanderson, Henderson and Potts." So far, no Potts has appeared to protest.

Unpredictable are individual's responses to hearing their name over the air. An agency executive's father had a euphonious handle which

was inserted for a rather frivolous role one night. The family had prominent social standing in eastern society, but the old man did not seem to mind his contribution to the script—in fact, he loved it.

Often names of persons important to the show are used in clever script spots. One of the best examples of this type of writing was exhibited last year on the Jack Benny show when Benny was ill and Orson Welles substituted for him. The Mr. Mortimer in question happens to be

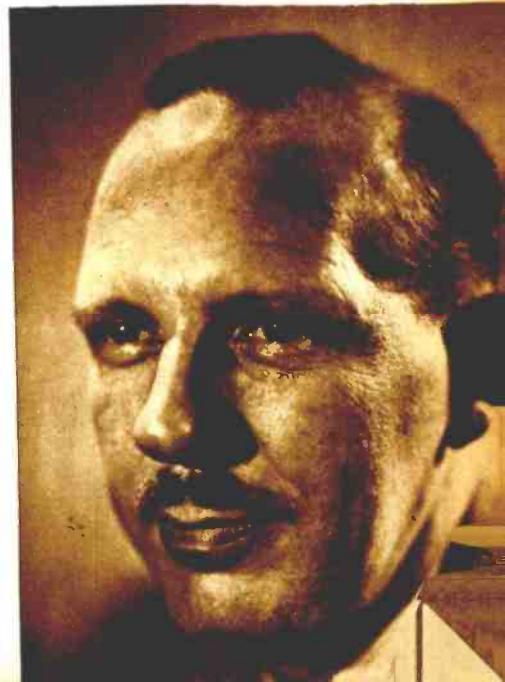

A WAR-WEARY world hereby votes for light entertainment. Radio-dialers tune in for laughs, as is graphically illustrated by the accompanying Crossley rating of the past three and a quarter years. The type of comedy that is ranked as tops by listeners is the homespun humor of NBC's Fibber McGee and Molly, who have consistently stayed on as one of the Big Three. Their show is authored by that master of situation comedy, Don Quinn. Their style has varied little in the past few years. Listeners like the feeling of familiarity and friendliness that surrounds this program. Visiting with the McGees each week is like dropping in on your nice next-door neighbors.

The gags and banter of NBC's Bob Hope have become more popular with each passing year. His is an entirely different brand of comedy—flippant, abrupt and earthy. A large portion of Hope's individual popularity can be attributed to his unceasingly energetic efforts to bring servicemen a steady round of morale-lifting laughter. Like Hope, Jack Benny—who is now in the number three spot—has brought our boys in blue and khaki, both here and abroad, a belly-load of laughs. Whereas Hope's show has risen in popularity, however, Benny's has de-

Recently, when Fibber took a flyer into the jelly bean business, orders were received from the following named firms: Craddock, O'Halloran and Croop of Cincinnati; Murdock, Peasley and Grooblestem of Omaha; Zachary, Finston, Plumtree and Gerch; Frisby, Cantwell and Snagg; Snodgrass, Hanson and Prentwhistle; Plunkett,

Fadiman, Hoople and Frost; Hagstrom, Flanders and Quimby.

Names used by Lum and Abner are those of real friends or co-workers. Organist Sybil Chism, Actress Lurene Tuttle, and Secretary Velma McCall are frequently referred to, while Producer Bob Dwyer, or Press Agents Coy Williams, Bernie Milligan, and Evans Plummer consider use of their handles as real honors. One bona fide name used in the pair's script is that of Dick Huddleston, the real postmaster of Pine Ridge.

Even Hammerschlag

Recently "Great Gildersleeve" included a script-part in which Nephew Leroy appeared in a school play and was scheduled to kiss Ethel Hammerschlag. Gildy attended the performance and later remarked that, after all the complaining Leroy had vented, that he hadn't seemed to mind kissing Ethel Hammerschlag after all.

Promptly came a letter from a young girl by the name of Ethel Hammerschlag. She lived in a well-known town in Imperial Valley and pointed out that she was not so unattractive that kissing her would be disagreeable.

That no name is beyond the pale of impossibility was demonstrated on a recent Burns and Allen show. Written into the script was a character, Joe Muckenfuss.

"We can't use that name. It's too screwy!" exclaimed one of the cast members.

Replied George Burns: "Joe Muckenfuss?" I know him well. He's a Hollywood actor's agent!"

They substituted Joe Bloke's name in the script.

clined slightly since his occupancy of the number one position in 1941.

The Edgar Bergen-Charlie McCarthy comedy on NBC has also taken a rear seat among the Big Three, but is still all-important in the Top Ten. CBS's Lux Radio Theater remains the listeners' favorite dramatic offering on the airwaves, with "Mr. District Attorney" zooming into the number nine spot as a surprise "dark horse." NBC's Red Skelton, another of radio's favorites for laughs, has risen to the prominent sixth position. "The Aldrich Family" and the Maxwell House Show seem destined to linger longer in the public's favor, since both are top-flight fun shows, one in the category of variety, the other a comedy-drama.

Newcomer to the Big Ten is band leader Kay Kyser's "College of Musical Knowledge," which combines both mirth and melody to please the listener's longing for entertainment escapism.

Supplementing the results of the past three annual polls are the timely tabulations covering the first three months of this current year.

Still in the top spot is the comedy of Fibber McGee and Molly, and Bob Hope. The drama of Lux Radio Theater has jumped from fifth to third place in listeners' favor, with Jack Benny still hovering near his place in the Big Three circle. The Maxwell House Show, "District Attorney," and Kay Kyser are out of the running again, being replaced by the comedy-variety offerings of Joan Davis, Kraft Music Hall, and Abbott and Costello.

Comedy is still king, by listeners' choice.
