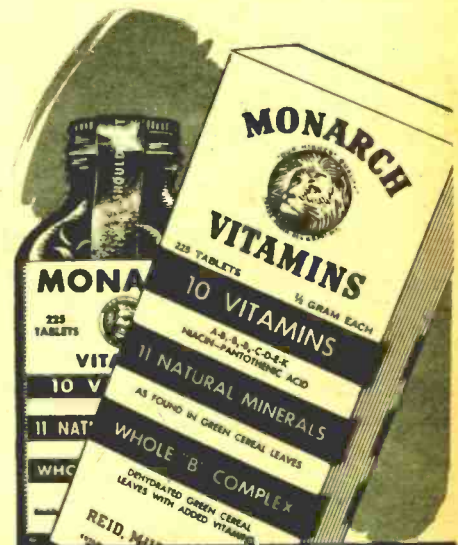

Your Lamplighter

Ted Yerxa, Encyclopedia of Nocturnal Knowledge, Offers Tips on Dining-Dancing Spots

DO YOU KNOW whether the Palm Room of the Senator Hotel serves good steaks on the three dollar dinner?

Whether the floor show at the Neapolitan Casino is good?

Whether the band at the Hobnob plays sweet or hot?

Where to go if you want to dance on something more than a postage stamp floor?

You may not be able to reel off such information, but there's a man who is. His name is Ted Yerxa (pronounced Yurksa) and he's known as "The Lamplighter," Los Angeles' encyclopedia of nightlife knowledge.

In days before war, Ted's Lamplighter office was organized in such a manner that listeners relied on him for their fussiest reservations. "We even used to call Knott's Berry Farm in Fullerton as an accommodation for our fans," Ted remembers. Listeners were organized into a Lamplighters Club which received discounts at fashionable dine-dancing establishments.

"Another thing we had was Lamplighter Night at the various night clubs," continued Yerxa. "We introduced talent to the live and listening audience."

Information about the many nocturnal spots in and around Los Angeles isn't something to be picked up like a drugstore aspirin. It took Yerxa a thousand nights to cover the entertainment realm, with Mrs. Yerxa going along as star reporter. "We were never in bed until four in the morning," they sighed.

Uncovers Talent

When The Lamplighter wasn't covering the major fun palaces, he took time out to visit some small, out-of-the-way places where excellent talent was frequently uncovered. He still maintains this practice.

His discrimination about food comes easily, for Ted used to write menu editorials. After his gradua-

tion from the University of Pennsylvania he started journalizing for the Brooklyn Standard Union, later became food editor for the Boston Post and New Haven Register. Coming to Los Angeles, he started on KHJ for Ace Hi Flour and Sees Candy in 1927. Friends jokingly called Ted the "Fletcher Wiley of Foods." He started his Lamplighter program five years ago over KHJ, recently moved to KMTR, and edits a column for the Daily News on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

Although war has put a sizable crimp in Yerxa's territory, he keeps on pitching and will be in excellent position to resume his pre-war frills as soon as peace comes. He keeps Angelenos informed on best bets for relaxation, covers openings, and plans balanced radio programs for stay-at-homes. His now-familiar theme song, "Lamplighter's Sereñade," was written specially for Ted two years ago by Hoagy Carmichael and Paul Webster. On his evening show, it introduces eight or ten bands by remote control, each aggregation coming in for a few moments to show listeners their style.

At Home

A navy aviator in the last war, Yerxa is fighting on the home front now. He and his attractive wife, Evelyn, live overlooking the beach at Malibu and just now their special pets, besides their beige cocker spaniel, Butch, are twenty-five Rhode Island Red chicks.

"Funny thing about me," observed Ted. "I've spent a good part of my life hanging around night clubs, but I don't drink."

She had been touring Hollywood on a shopping spree in preparation for her forthcoming two-weeks trip. She talked excitedly of the treats in store for her. It would be the first time she had journeyed out of California.

The talented contestant was born in Oakland in 1920, was graduated from Santa Barbara High School, and studied music under the supervision of the blind composer-pianist Genevieve Wiley and Miss Carolyn Allingham. She told us that she was able to continue her studies due to the interest and patronage of her friend, Mrs. E. N. McAdam.

"I love to sing," Miss Sharr enthused, and when asked to name her ambition, she replied quickly, "To sing all my life!" Her other likes include swimming, cooking and walk-

ing. "But whatever I'm doing," she added, "I'm *always* singing."

It was while she was on duty at the telephone company that she received word of her victory in the "Hour of Charm" contest. A call came through for her, and the voice at the other end of the wire advised, "If you're standing up, Miss Sharr, you'd better sit down. We've got big news for you!"

Tuesdays; *Red Ryder* at 7:30 (also Thursdays and Saturdays); Wednesdays: *My Best Girls* at 8:30 p. m.; *This is My Country*, heard at a new time this week at 7:30 p. m. Fridays; *Nero Wolfe*, 7:30 p. m.; *Parker Family*, 8:15 p. m.; and *Gangbusters* at 8:30 p. m.

For Variety: Mondays: *Top of the Evening* at 7:15 p. m.; *Heidt Time* at 7:30; *Blind Date* at 9, and *Court of Public Opinion* at 10:30. Tuesdays: *Duffy's Tavern* at 8:30, and *Let Yourself Go* at 9. Wednesdays: *My Best Girls* at 8:30 p. m., and *Dunninger* at 9. Under the contest rules, twenty-four singers will be presented on twelve consecutive weekly broadcasts over KFI. After the twenty-four contestants have been selected, no more applications will be accepted. Application blanks may be secured at this time by applying in writing to the Director of the KFI-Hollywood Bowl Auditions, Radio Station KFI, 141 North Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles 4, Calif.

Winner or winners in the contest will receive a professional engagement

as soloist with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra on a Hollywood Bowl program in August of this year, at a fee of \$100.

Preliminary hearings will be held at KFI studios and applicants will be scheduled for their hearings in the order of receipt of their applications by the director. An accompanist will be provided, or singers may bring their own accompanist if they desire.

Auditions of those selected by the preliminary jury will be broadcast over KFI each Saturday night at 9 p. m. starting May 13th.

Out On Limb

News commentators at KHJ-Don Lee, so we discovered last week, are currently putting themselves out on a limb speculating on the potential time and place of the D-Day invasion, with theory running everywhere from within the next three days to the end of the month.

To date, Rex Miller, Harrison Wood, and Gordon Burke have put their guesses in the pool, with Glen Hardy, Upton Close and others yet to be heard from.

Miller thinks D-Day will take place about June 1, because he believes it will take that long to complete plans for the invasion. He's unwilling to speculate on exactly what points will be first invaded, but believes that one of the moves the Allied strategists have mapped out is an invasion of paratroopers of the province of Auvergne in Central France. "This part of France is more completely in the hands of French liberationists, who will give us excellent support, than any other part of the country," Miller remarked. "Besides, it will afford a splendid diversion from the coastal defenses."

Wood believes that invasion will be a series of strikes over several days, with the first occurring between the 10th and 17th of May because of the fact that railroads and back-of-the-lines air fields must be immobilized before invasion can be successful. "This is the 6th day of such bombings," said Wood. "General Eisenhower is determined to fight the war with machines and not with men, which is the difference between a democratic and a totalitarian country at war."

Wood cited seven possible locations, one west of Narbonne where the Mediterranean coast turns into Spain, and the other six lying between Bologne and Biarritz. "There may also be an invasion landing in northern Italy," Wood added. "Genoa is being bombed, and it is more than possible that a landing in northern Italy will be effected to cut off German divisions now in central Italy."

"General Emil Ludendorf said that what caused Germany's defeat in the last war was the fact that transportation was worth more than guns. Eisenhower is trying to bring that condition about early in this war."

Gordon Burke, heard on KHJ-Don Lee at 5:45 p.m. Monday through Fridays, believed that D-Day would start three days from May 3, because the best tide and atmosphere conditions

She was summoned to sing at the Ritz Hotel in London during the Duke of Kent's wedding festivities; she became the first popular music representative to sing on Parisian television programs; she toured the English music halls; played in outstanding night clubs throughout the world and returned to the United States for featured radio work and starring seasons at the Savoy Plaza.

Soon came the chance to be mistress-of-ceremonies on the new and novel quiz show called "Beat the Band," during which the members of the orchestra are asked questions to be answered by song titles. was another quick change to New York, and James B. MacDonald reviewed the national scene, from his wide international experience.

Now, a year later, we take stock of the "Blue Newsroom Review."

There has been quite a change. Some of the boys who started with us that day a year ago, now wear the uniform of Uncle Sam. "Hank" is just as resplendent in the uniform of the United States Marines. From San Diego, he occasionally gets back to Studio "H" to visit his favorite "Blue Newsroom Review."

During that year, most everything but a marriage has taken place on the program. The only note of sadness to the gayety was the untimely death of Chapin Hall last year at Fresno, from a heart attack. He was on assignment from his newspaper, the Los Angeles Times.

Names Household Words

Some of the names of the announcers, who stepped in and out of the picture, are almost household words, here on the Pacific coast. Besides Weaver and Browning and Willson, there have been Victor Perrin, chief announcer for the Blue Network in Hollywood, John M. Kennedy, Ralph Rogers, Terrance O'Sullivan (and that's his real name too)—Walter Arnold, who is just about to appear in a new uniform, and Val Brown.

And there were the keen and colorful comments of that remarkable team, Jose Rodriguez and Sidney Sutherland, who graced the first "Review"—a year ago, and who are now heard in their own trans-continental program. "We've had Waves and Wacs, soldiers and sailors, income tax collectors, Russian emigrants, marines and business men, actors and actresses—oh, almost too many to remember, parading before

the microphone for you, in this first year of the program.

Even La Colbert

There was beautiful Claudette Colbert, who sat across the table from me at the microphone, and whose dazzling graciousness threw your humble broadcaster for a double-barreled loop, into fluffing his script when she peeked around the mike and smiled. And who wouldn't forget script, or anything else in this world, when Claudette Colbert smiles at you?

Until there was a change in the program, a few broadcasts back, and Resinol Chemical Corporation sponsored your writer, it was my privilege to be the only one of all who have appeared on the "Blue Newsroom Review," to have broadcast on all of the 250 radio shows. And to those who have listened to me, I give my sincere thanks.

If we have pleased you, if we have informed you on world affairs, if, occasionally we've made you think of the seriousness of the task in which we're engaged, that's all the thanks we need. We feel that it has been a job well done.

A new stream of news has passed under the bridge in the 12 months the "Blue Newsroom Review" has been calling on you at one o'clock in the afternoon. There have been many pronounced changes in the war. It is by looking backward, and balancing the past against the present, that we can see the strides our country has made toward winning our way toward peace—and victory. For instance, on the day the "Blue Newsroom Review" was born, Allied naval chiefs held a conference in Washington on means to beat the rattlesnakes of the sea—the U-Boats—that were tearing down our Bridge of Ships to Europe—torpedoing our ships within sight of our own Atlantic coast. And now, a year later, the First Lord of the Admiralty, A. V. Alexander, tells us that only one ship in a thousand to cross the Atlantic is prey to Hitler's submarines. That's a change—for the better. A change toward victory.

More Contrasts

Then, on March 27, of a year ago, the Royal Air Force put on the greatest raid of all time—on Berlin. Five hundred tons of bombs were dropped, and the world marveled. Today, 28 hundred tons is a common raid on the Nazi capital, raids that are repeated night after night. That's progress—toward victory. On April 17 of last year, American airmen raided Bremen, for the first time. We lost 16 Flying Fortresses. We speculated on our ability to withstand such losses. Now—a year later, the British raided Nuernberg, and 96 planes are lost. We take the loss in stride, with sorrow, but the war marches on, relentlessly crushing Hitler.

It does take a look back over our shoulders, to see how much closer we are to victory, than on that day when the "Blue Newsroom Review," was born on the air.

So many things have happened in the year, in Europe, and in the Pacific, that it's impossible to recount them. But every one points toward this being the year of victory, the year of accomplishments for a peaceful post-war world.

And maybe, when the second birthday of the "Blue Newsroom Review" rolls around in 1945, and we have two candles in our birthday cake here in Studio "H," we can celebrate it with peace in Europe, and the Japanese beast almost beaten back into his Tokyo cage.

I hope that when that day comes, I'll be privileged to say—this is the Blue Newsroom Review—and "I told you so."

manuscripts and clippings concerning strange people, strange sayings and strange happenings the world over, and with this material on hand, John Nesbitt created his new and novel type of radio program. As outstandingly successful as he has been, however, Nesbitt considers his work in radio and movies "just a job." He wants it to be no more than that because his real pleasure lies in his home, his gardening, his wife and their three-and-a-half-year-old son, Michael.

"Besides," grins radio's most famous story-teller, "I'm not so sure of my success. My little boy is bored to death every time I try to tell him a bedtime story!"

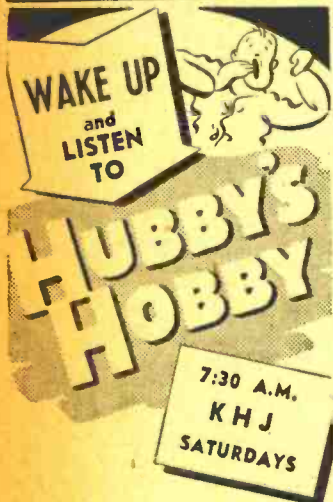

gram is to bring radio favorites to the microphone as themselves, so that airline audiences may become better acquainted with the personalities who provide you with your daily entertainment. An actress like Ann Stone, who appears in "Woman from Nowhere" and other familiar dramatic offerings, is introduced to her listeners for the first time out of character. In Miss Stone's case, the result was severe mike fright. Playing herself was a new experience for her.

"Ann Stone was another person I was surprised and delighted to meet across the mike from me," Ona Munson declared. "Week after week I had stood in line alongside of her at the bank, and I always wondered who she was!"

During the course of their interviews, the guesting celebrities often reveal interesting highlights of their personal and professional lives. Comedian Mischa Auer told of the tragic days when he fought as a young boy in the Russian revolution; announcer Tobe Reed explained how he "barked" his way into radio; songbird Fay McKenzie revealed that she made her debut into the theatrical world playing Gloria Swanson's baby in a movie called "Station Content."

In addition to hostess Ona Munson and the two guest stars presented on each week's show, the program's cast includes announcer Jay Stewart, songstress Anita Ellis and the orchestra of Lud Gluskin.

For the story behind the show, however, Radio Life turned to its creator, Beverly Barnes, wife of mikerman Stewart. Beverly formerly wrote and femceed the show herself, until she retired from radio to devote all her time and energies to being a wife and homemaker.

"G o s h," beamed the actor, "I'll bet the kids are jumping all over the living room with excitement. I can hardly wait to get home to see them!"

When pretty Ruth Hussey guested on "Open House," she told Beverly all about her recent trip east. Madly in love with her handsome husband, Robert Longnecker, the actress had searched all over for a keepsake to bring back to him.

"I couldn't think of a single sensible thing," laughed the charming Miss Hussey. "So what do you think I got? A letter opener!"

ticular appendicitis operation and an ensuing convalescence in the college ward to influence Mills in changing professions. The operation was performed on Mills.

"I thought it was a bad omen, being my own first patient," confesses Billy. "There in the hospital I decided to specialize in operettas rather than operations!" And while still in the infirmary Billy composed his first operetta, "All That Glitters."

Mills' attendance at both Michigan and Syracuse Universities accounts for his activities in the local alumni of both institutions. He never misses a weekly luncheon of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity in Los Angeles; is acting president for Southern California alumni, and is also president of Syracuse University alumni in the Southland.

A man of great energy, he is also an unusually quick thinker. Once, while conducting music for the Nash program in Chicago with Noel Coward and Bea Lillie, he was taken aback when they started ad-libbing in the middle of a rehearsal song. The timing was thrown off, but because of his schooling in vaudeville, Mills was able to take the situation in hand by stopping the orchestra and starting it again when Coward and Lillie got back into routine.

He made his debut on the Fibber McGee program seven years ago. It was Jack Louis, member of the Board of Directors of Johnson's Wax Company, and member of the firm of Needham, Louis & Brorby, who recommended Mills for the conductor's post. He was familiar with the high standard of the maestro's work as CBS Musical Director for the West.

Like all "rotund" gentlemen, Mills enjoys a good laugh—one especially at his own expense.

The one that brings the heartiest chuckles from the batoneer concerns the celebration given him by the

Jordans for his fifth year on the McGee show.

"I had driven out to the Jordan's home "gowned for a gag" in night-shirt, cap, and slippers," recounts Billy. "I shall never forget Marlan's expression when she greeted me at the door holding a cake bedecked with five candles. My somnambulist attire must have been a shocking sight. She nearly dropped the pastry onto the floor!"

Because of the ban on "thank you" wires by telegraph companies, Mills can't continue his yearly custom of wiring a Detroit telegraph office best wishes. Instead, he's keeping up the custom with a letter. At a time when things were going badly for the maestro and he was about to become an automobile salesman, he received a wire which announced he was to report for a booking in Chicago. "But for that wire, I might be selling jalopies today," gratefully asserts Billy.

Sentimental About Suits

The maestro is a sentimentalist, especially about old suits. Stored in a special closet in the Mills' home are suits for all occasions of one-time dashing design. "They're a tight fit today," comments Billy, "thanks to my expanded girth!"

He likes nothing better than to tell an anecdote in dialect. Recently one of his favorite stories which he was telling in Spanish dialect was overheard by two South American seniors at luncheon. Finally one of the gentlemen came over to Mills and started throwing the native tongue around so that Billy had to explain his story telling in broken English. "I was never more embarrassed," tells he, "and the fellow was obviously unamused."

His wife, Gladys, avers the maestro has a "sunny" disposition—the boys in the band give double check on this point. While directing from the podium, Mills has never been known to resort to rude disciplinary measures, but recently at a first rehearsal after his two weeks' absence with pneumonia, the men's humor and continuous conversation became provoking. After repeated requests for "quiet," Mills finally achieved results by asking: "Please fellows. Shelve the comics—the old boy's been sick!"

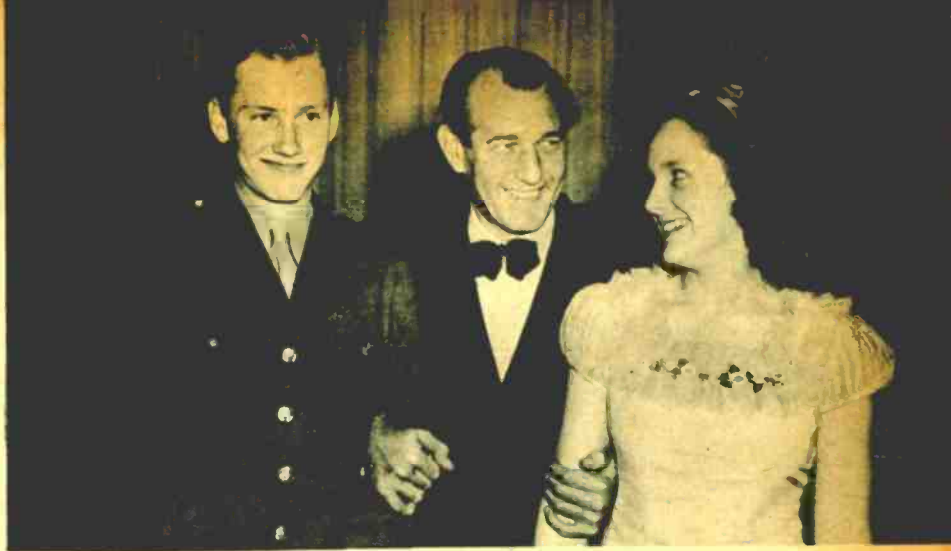

EVEN THE LOSERS are winners in the Los Angeles Philharmonic Young Artists Competition.

When the judges of the 26 weeks' contest, conducted over KFI, named Paulena Carter of Hollywood and Pfc. Robert Jamieson of Santa Monica as winners, the door was left open for added honors for the 56 Southern California youngsters who unsuccessfully competed for the right to appear with the Philharmonic orchestra.

The outgrowth of the L. A. Philharmonic competition is KFI's current stand-out musical series, "The Young Artists of Today." Every Saturday night from 9 to 10, some young musician (all under 21 years of age) is starred as paid soloist with Claude Sweeten's KFI orchestra. In the summer series, some thirteen or more of the competitors will be given their chances at radio fame, and out of the program, music critics believe, may come some of tomorrow's top concert and radio stars.

Paulena Carter, a 12-year-old pianist, and Pfc. Jamieson, a 20-year-old cellist, were picked as winners in the KFI competition by a board of judges which included Louis Woodson Curtis, director of music for the Los Angeles city schools; Dr.

Karl Wecker of the National Association for Music and the Hollywood Bowl Association; Julian Brodetsky, famous conductor and music educator, and Emanuel Bay, famed pianist.

Runners-up in the competition, many of whom will be heard during the summer series, were pianists Beatrice Bell, Jeanne Sholtz, Margery Lamb, Warren G. Henry, Gloria Greene and Natalie Kosches, and violinists Eloise Roessler and Elliott Fisher.

Maestro Mills

His Second Sight Has Made Him a Firster in Many Ways

WAY BACK WHEN Billy Mills (Fibber McGee and Molly maestro) stared in a astonishment at the strange contraption hanging in front of him at Chicago's Marigold Gardens (it was a mike, circa April, 1923), he had an inkling then that something was going to come of it. He beat his baton with a little more authority than usual and next day he beamed and nodded prophetically when friends stopped him to exclaim, "I heard you on the wireless last night!"

Radio then was a toy that a few scientifically-minded gents tinkered with during their off hours. Some newspapers carried radio "columns"

made up of engineers' drawings on "how to build you own crystal set."

But Mills' experience in 1923 set him to thinking and when radio emerged as a commercial proposition he was one of the first to move in.

This "second sight" has made him a "firster" in many ways. He was among the very first to introduce sound effects in the theater, though he didn't know at the time what an influence this department would become in radio.

It happened during the nickelodeon era when Billy was pounding on the piano keys—making, with the music to accompany the hair-raising thrillers that graced the cinema. During a showing of the Indianap-

olis Speedway races, Mills brought in a motorcycle and at the appointed time started the motor to increase the realistic effect.

"It was a hectic moment for the audience," laughs Billy. "Some of the people started for the exits, undoubtedly expecting I would speed right up the aisle."

Another "First"

Billy was the first to institute the "corporal" system of band practice. This innovation called for the band sections to be rehearsed separately, and in each group the best musician was appointed "corporal" with the authority to see that musical orders were carried out.

"This break-down of the sections," contends Billy, "affords the individual musician the opportunity to overcome faulty execution which in mixed instruments practice might not be detected. Consequently, in final rehearsal, the group effect presents a greater unity of performance."

The maestro first employed this method of rehearsal during the last war when he was bandmaster under Colonel Henry L. Stimson (now Secretary of War) at Camp Mead, Maryland. Mills found it difficult retaining musicians because of transfers which invariably upset the band group.

"One day," tells Billy, "I approached Colonel Stimson with my problem and asked for permission to return to Flint, Michigan, as a recruiting officer. I promised to return with twenty-two top-flight musicians, and also asked for the privilege of naming my own officers. Stimson immediately granted my request and in two weeks I returned to camp with my 'musical booty'—twenty-two instrumentalists."

Poring over Hector Berlioz' textbook, "The Art of Modern Orchestration," resulted in Billy becoming the first to use three saxophones in the band. He soon learned the tonal advantages to be achieved by use of the triple saxes and thereby brought "sax appeal" to the notice of the public.

Organized Band

As the one first to organize a permanent orchestra in the public schools of Flint, Michigan, Billy has earned that city's undying gratitude.

But long before Billy had framed ideas for minding musical cues, he dreamed about becoming a doctor and enrolled as a pre-med student at the University of Michigan. Even then he was a capable musician, but was more interested in helping humanity out of its distresses medically than musically. It took one par-

BEA'S GOING to be late," cast members of "The Great Gildersleeve" were warned. Scheduled to be at the "Gildersleeve" microphone in the NBC studios at 3:30 on Sunday afternoon, Bea Benaderet had just three minutes in which to make it. Playing an important part on CBS' "Silver Theater" the same day, she was unable to leave that studio until 3:27, and was to use NBC's small side street entrance to speed her arrival on-stage.

"But when I got there," laughs Bea, "so many people were crowded around the door, waiting to see if I'd make it, that I almost couldn't get in!"

Talking to the busy, versatile actress two days later, we found her still breathless over the schedule which she had to follow that previous Sunday. It reads as follows:

9:30-11:00 a. m.—"Gildersleeve" rehearsal.

11:00 a. m.-1:30 p. m.—"Silver Theater" rehearsal

1:30-2:00 p. m. — "Gildersleeve" script reading.

2:00-2:55 p. m.—"Lux Radio Theater" rehearsal.

3:00-3:27 p. m.—"Silver Theater" broadcast.

3:30-4:00 p. m.—"Gildersleeve" broadcast (for eastern listeners).

4:00-7:00 p. m.—Three hours in which to eat, study her scripts—and catch her breath!

7:00-8:00 p. m.—Red Skelton Show rehearsal.

8:00-8:30 p. m. — "Gildersleeve" broadcast (for west coast).

Wife, Mother, and One of Radio's Most Popular Actresses, Bea Benaderet, Finds Life Very Full

8:30-9:00 p. m.—Red Skelton Show preview.

Is Miss Goodwin

One of the most popular actresses on the air, Bea Benaderet has probably appeared on every major radio show emanating regularly from Hollywood. Currently, listeners have become familiar with her in the role of "Eve Goodwin," the charming school-teacher who has captured The Great Gildersleeve's fancy.

"I like playing Eve," Bea declares. "It is something I've always wanted to do—a straight role, requiring no change of voice, no extreme comedy or dramatic delivery."

The actress started her radio career as a singer. She was a virtual "Girl Friday" on a San Francisco station, doing a little bit of everything, including appearances on "Happy-Go-Lucky," "Blue Monday Jamboree," and "Dear Diary" with John B. Hughes. She read commercials, and was the first woman announcer on a transcontinental show.

"One time," the actress recalls, "I

was on the air almost steadily for several hours—doing comedy characterizations, commercials, singing songs and what-have-you. That was really 'Benaderet Glorification Night!'"

To Hollywood

She came to Hollywood in 1936, and found it "tough sledding" for the first year. To complicate matters, she broke her leg at that time. But good breaks followed that bad one, and in the past several years, radio-dialers have heard this charming, brown-eyed, dark-haired, velvet-voiced actress in every sort of role on all their favorite airshows—among them, her portrayal of the native girl "Inez" on the Lux Radio Theater's dramatization of "Algiers," and her work for radio's wonder men, Arch Oboler and Orson Welles. She was the only Hollywood actress Welles employed on the west coast with his Campbell series of dramatizations. In contrast to her dramatic characterizations, Bea played next-door-neighbor, "Mrs. Snively," on the Roma Wine laugh show with

John Charles (in this instance, his watch wasn't working properly), but being jovial, good-natured and delightfully informal is his customary manner. His geniality creates and maintains the unpretentious, easy-going atmosphere that makes his program such a pleasure for every radio listener.

Is Informal

Although the program combines the talents of an impressive array of unusually gifted artists, there are no clashes of temperament. Typical of Thomas' good-humored antics during both rehearsals and broadcasts was the burlesque ballet step he gracefully executed during a recent broadcast when Victor Young's orchestra burst forth into a lilting arrangement of the enchanting melody of "Molly on the Shore."

John Charles Thomas has a smile that spreads all over his face. Equally impressive is his marvelous physique. Big, tall, and straight, and often wearing a wide western belt-buckled jauntily at his hips, he shows every evidence of his love of the outdoor life.

During his boyhood, however, when he lived and did the daily chores on a little farm in Pennsylvania, he day-dreamed of the time when he could come to the city. The son of a Methodist minister, John Charles, as a youth, sang with his mother and father at the camp meetings at which his father preached. He was wavering between the careers of medicine and music when he was offered a scholarship by the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore and music won his favor.

Beginning his career in light opera, he soon became one of the highest paid actors in this field (not without, of course, the struggle that almost inevitably precedes success). Then the singer set his mind on the more serious forms of his art. By hard study he prepared himself for opera and launched his career in this field at the Royal Opera House in Brussels. Invitations to sing at Covent Garden in London and at the opera houses of Berlin and Vienna followed.

Returning to the United States he sang with the Philadelphia Grand Opera, Chicago Civic Opera, San Francisco Opera, and since 1934 with the Metropolitan Opera. His long concert tours have carried him all over the country. But it is undoubtedly his Sunday Westinghouse radio program, now in its second year on the air, that has endeared his glorious voice to untold millions and helped make listening to good music a habit with the American public.

GRINNING from ear to ear and gesturing apologetically to orchestra conductor Victor Young and the Ken Darby chorus, John Charles Thomas dashed across the stage in his shirtsleeves, hurriedly hung his coat on a music rack, and arrived at the microphone just in the nick of time to sing the opening strains of "Home on the Range," theme melody of each Sunday morning's NBC broadcast starring this great American baritone, and story teller John Nesbitt. Being late for his broadcasts is not the habit of

ing, happy children. "They always tear the house down when they see us," commented Harriet. "Lap sitting is a favorite stunt. Ozzie reads 'Pinocchio' after dinner while each of us is holding a boy. We don't play favorites."

Harriet's mother, Mrs. Hilliard, also lives in the rambling white house on a deadend street not far from Hollywood and Vine. Then there's Grace, the maid.

Harriet goes over the housekeeping details with her every morning. "I have to be organized," she said succinctly. "I haven't got the time not to be organized."

Show Business Background

Mrs. Nelson is a practical homemaker, although she comes from a line of supposedly impractical show people. "I'm the third generation. Father was a director of dramatic stock and mother was the leading lady. They carried me on-stage when I was six weeks old and I had my first speaking parts when I was three."

Convent-bred Harriet, who attended school in Kansas City, also studied ballet before joining Ken Murray in vaudeville and playing straight for Bert Lahr.

Meantime, Ozzie, son of a Jersey City banker, led a more or less sheltered life until he entered Rutgers. The only indication of his coming musical career was the hobby orchestra he organized when he was fourteen. Instead, he excelled in sports, made the varsity and swimming teams, and captained the debating team.

He studied hard and after receiving his B. A., went to law school. It wasn't until after his graduation from New Jersey Law that he organized his band in earnest, in 1930.

Harriet, who was the first girl to sing with a band, caught Ozzie's eye and he engaged her purely because of her ability in front of an audience. It wasn't until eighteen months after that that their romance developed into marriage.

"We had a traditional wedding at Ozzie's mother's home," Harriet recalls. It occurred October 8, 1935.

Busy Life

The young Nelsons lead a full life, working in movies, on the radio with Red Skelton, and with the band. Seldom do they enjoy their country place at Tenafly, New Jersey. Har-

riet, who made seven pictures last year, decided to call a halt on New Year's. Her biggest resolution was "I'm not going to make another picture until I get a good part and a good picture." She's still sitting tight.

That gives her a little more time to spend at home and for evenings doing needlepoint. "I always have some in the car," she said. "As soon as the radio program is over and we start home, I grab my needlepoint and sew like mad. It helps to calm me down."

The other night, David, who attends public school, popped up with another dinner-table question. "Daddy," he asked, "what is a divorce?"

"Why? Who wants to know?"

"The kids at school said something about somebody getting one. What is it?"

"It's when two people don't love each other and don't want to make a home together any more," said Ozzie.

Harriet joined in firmly. "But you don't have to worry. Your daddy and mommy are not getting one."

considerable amount of his time searching through manuscripts of compositions both old and new. Much of his efforts is directed toward singling out songs by American composers, and among the all-time favorites which the singer often includes on his broadcast schedule are these melodies written by our own countrymen: "Sailor Men," "Erie Canal," "Gentle Annie," "I Love Life" and the familiar "Home on the Range," which Thomas sang first on one of his Town Hall concerts. The singer's extensive library of music is located in his Westwood studio-office, where he can study and rehearse without disturbing the serenity of his home life.

His youthful longing for city life has been more than satisfied in his travels as a star of radio, concert and the opera. The demands of his career have made it previously impossible for him to establish any sort of home other than his beloved yacht, which he gave up when war came. It wasn't until less than a year ago that he satisfied his wish to return to a home in the country.

Has Farm

Today, he and his charming wife find their greatest happiness on their beautiful farm in the Pacific Palisades. They have named this country home "On the Hill," and although it is a spacious fifty-five acres of wooded grounds, with oak, sycamore, California holly, orchards of figs, lemons, oranges, apples, avocados, a lovely rose garden and vegetable garden, poultry, bees, and a magnificent view of the ocean, the singer stresses the fact that it is not at all a showplace.

"It is a nice, quiet home," empha-

sized John Charles. "There is nothing flashy about it."

As is the case with his radio program, the singer's home is vastly impressive but with a pervading atmosphere of charming simplicity and delightful informality.

As the motto above the fireplace expresses it: "Let's Be Ourselves."

Is Mrs. Bannon

Away from the microphone, the actress' interest lies in her home in the valley, her "tall, dark and handsome" husband, and their four-year-old son, Jack, who looks "just like his daddy." She is married to Jim Bannon, whom she met at station KHJ when he had just arrived from the middle west. "The first time I saw him," smiles Bea, "I said to myself, 'There is the handsomest man I've ever seen.'" Jim Bannon is familiar to radio audiences as the announcer on such popular programs as "Those We Love" and "I Love a Mystery."

Because the actress' surname has always been a cause for confusion, Bea was particularly delighted that her husband's name was something as simple as Bannon. "But," she declared, "I have never given that name to anyone without being asked 'How do you spell it?'"

Born in New York City of Spanish-Irish extraction, the actress' real name is Benaderet. When Orson Welles was first introduced to her, he muttered the name several times under his breath; then commented dryly, "Hmmm, Bea Benaderet. It sounds like something you should ad-lib in a mob scene."
