WHEN LIMBER, lanky Charlotte Greenwood was a small child, her mother used to send her to the store for milk. "She knew I'd spill it and never come back with it," commented the comedienne the other day in answer to a query about her hyper-active gangliness.

Miss Greenwood, who comes fresh

from pictures to radio this season to hold down Bob Hope's hot weather spot, insists that she is not double jointed. "I've always been limber," she summarizes artlessly.

It piqued a reporter's curiosity to delve deeper into the life and habits of a vivacious woman, who at more than the 50-year mark still retains the sparkle and outlook of 25.

Miss Greenwood was chatting in the living room of her Beverly Hills

home. She had on a simple blouse and skirt, low-heeled shoes, and her hair, a warm blonde, had been freshly dressed. Sizing her up, one realized that she isn't six feet and a bean pole. She just looks that way and probably, by devious tricks developed in her long career, makes the most of her five feet eight, her long arms and legs, and her ability to swing them about in humorously abandoned fashion.

Through the windows, the water in a blue-tiled swimming pool lazed and lapped. Miss Greenwood looked out toward it and said, "I swim every morning."

"You don't in winter!" exclaimed an incredulous reporter.

"Deed I do," affirmed the comedienne. "If I'm on a picture, I have to get up at five. It's quite eerie, because we have a blue light outside and I wear a white suit when I go splashing around."

She continued: "After I come out, I usually have coffee and fruit. We're great fruit lovers. Always have fruit beside our beds." ("We" meant Charlotte and her husband, Martin Broones, who has been married to the comedienne 20 years come next December 22).

Exercise and simple foods may make Miss Greenwood a vibrant person, but when she mentioned her husband, apparently she hit on the greatest reason for her contented happiness. Theirs, it seems, is one of those real marriages.

How They Met

It came about when Miss Greenwood was appearing in a New York revue and her producer asked a long-time friend of his, Broones, to hurry from London and write some special numbers for the star. Broones was engaged to write two songs for \$1,000. Mirthfully, Miss Greenwood says, even today: "It was much cheaper to marry the composer!"

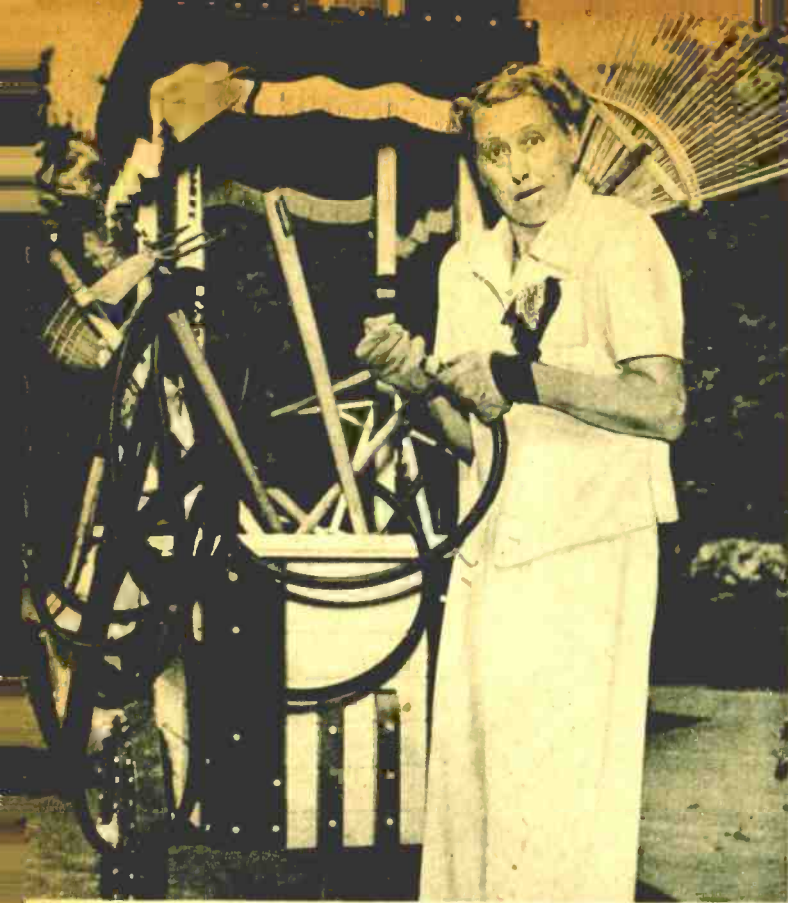
Since their marriage, Broones has served as his wife's manager and has accompanied her on her tours to prepare and supervise new material. In her current radio series, "Life with Charlotte," he is co-owner of the program with John Guedel.

The Broones home shows evidence on every hand of belonging to a popular, cultured couple. In the music room are two handsomely bound books of song, gifts of the comedienne and her husband to one another. Autographed pictures of great in the entertainment world smile at the onlooker from every niche. FOR A MAN with only one dream . . . a life-long ambition to sail to the earth's far corners as a sea captain, Canadian-born Walter Pidgeon does more honest "stay put" living than any star whose home we've visited.

Courteously, the handsome leading man of CBS' dramatic "Walter Pidgeon Show," invited us to his Beverly Hills house one sunny day last week for the rare privilege of taking pictures of his intimate possessions, living quarters and the pride of his "at leisure" hours, his garden. We were delighted with what we found there.

His unpretentious home is just like many other pretty places on a green-treed street in Beverly. Driving up to it, one has no conception of its size, for the front view is fairly small and secluded by vines and trees. The entrance is through the driveway, a medium oaken door, plain and businesslike.

Pidgeon greeted us with the same charm which has fascinated so many women who see him on the screen. He is a quiet man, unassuming, with a surprise "boom" laughter which comes when you least expect it.

Real Home

If his house looks "lived in," he certainly is the one who has made it so. From a small entrance hall, we went into a large, comfortable living room, decorated in gold, rust and blues, and replete with fresh cut flowers, filled book shelves, large comfortable chairs, a beautiful grand piano and a backgammon table which looks much in use.

We had hardly been seated in his living room when Pidgeon invited us to look at his garden. He told us that he spent every free moment available working in his yard and felt that he had a personal investment in what happiness had been realized from his flowers and plants.

He explained that he had bought this house in 1929, shortly after he arrived in Hollywood to work in pictures. At that time, he was be-

wildered by the film city, when talking pictures had turned the industry into a gold mine. Money meant little or nothing then. New stars were being born. The restlessness entered his blood. He wanted to become a part of the nervous, reckless city. Still motivated by his almost fanatic desire to travel, Pidgeon is frank to say that he first looked on a picture career as a means to earning the money which would make his dreams come true.

Has Wanderlust

He likes to work. He is big, stalwart and capable of maintaining the stardom and tremendous popularity which he now holds. But his ambition to travel is still as strong as ever. And someday, he confided, he is going to buy a boat, not a large one, but a seaworthy craft in which he can join four companions for a journey around the world. He hopes the trip will last three years: He wants to prove to himself that the old men on the quays of St. John, New Brunswick (where he was born) were right when they implanted a nostalgic love of adventure and travel in a small boy. It still burns in his heart.

Hughes to Front

Just before KFWB commentator John B. Hughes, left on his recent trip for duty overseas as a war correspondent, Radio Life cornered him long enough to get a little story.

"At last," he sighed, "I am going to the right place at the right time—I think. For years I have been going the wrong way in my projected travels, and so often the projection was so entirely wrong that I didn't even get there.

"Back in 1939 I was headed for the Orient. I was to sail in mid-September, but come September first the Germans marched into Poland, England declared war on Germany, and my sponsor said, 'What Orient! Stay here and talk about the war in Europe.'

"My wife and I spent two weeks in Mexico City as a consolation prize, and I found out about the real facts of Mexican expropriation of oil properties. I got a fine story, but was

anybody interested? No—I went the wrong way.

"Then we were scheduled for the Olympic games in Helsinki, Finland, in 1940. I had both writing and broadcasting assignments. And, so help us, even for sometime after the beginning of war in 1939 we thought we might be able to get to Finland. But that Olympiad gave way to a grimmer contest.

"In 1941 I stirred up the Far Eastern tour again. I was convinced that war was imminent. From January of that year I predicted war in the Pacific before the year was out.

"Almost everything was arranged except the return trip. In that autumn of 1941 the government had taken control of all eastbound space on Pan American airways trans-Pacific Clippers and for a mere touring reporter to get space was not easy.

"But I kept trying. I got some encouragement in Washington and was beginning to feel hopeful by December

7 when the Japs bombed Manila. I wasn't there.

"I wasn't even at Pearl Harbor. I was in a broadcasting studio in Hollywood. I promptly caught a plane for New York and Washington. I always go the wrong way.

"In 1942 I was going to England. I was going to fly the Atlantic in a bomber. But no one would guarantee that I could get back.

"Our government was sympathetic. The British Ministry of Information was eager to be of help. The army said No Guarantee. The people with the contract said no trip. I came back to Hollywood. The wrong way. In 1943 I tried for North Africa and the same things got in the way.

"Oh, there was a proposed South American trip in there somewhere, too, but that got so involved we all gave up in dismay.

"Finally at the end of 1943 I ran out of radio contracts for the first time in eight years and I decided to stay out of them until I could get over there and do some war reporting from the scene of action. Warner Brothers Theaters and KFWB came along with a proposition that made it possible for me to keep in broadcasting practice and still plan my trip. In fact, they've made it possible for me to make my trip.

"I certainly hope I'm not going the wrong way this time."

SO WE SAID, "Spade, what's the routine? You seem to be getting pretty chummy with the platter spinners." He's a modest guy, this Cooley. He's got a warm and friendly smile. "Well, I'll tell you, Jack," he said. "I used to be scared to death of a microphone. I can play over one with my band, all right. But when it comes to talking, I used to get tongue-tied. Well, Al Jarvis invited me over for an interview one time. And then another time I was on with the Lamplighter. Well, I found that the more I talked over the microphone, the less afraid I became of it. As a matter of fact, now I'm beginning to feel right at home."

SMART BOY, this Cooley. That's one way of licking mike fright. But more and more people are becoming conscious of Spade Cooley and his particular type of music. In Billboard magazine recently, critic Sam Abbott wrote, "Spade Cooley has organized a band that is really in the swing of things... If the trend to Western Swing continues its present tempo, Cooley will be the Number One band-leader." So there you have it.

For his Furlough Ranch show, by the way, Spade is adding a harp to his band, he told us. Harpist is one Paul Featherstone. Cooley uses no brass in the band—three fiddles, three guitars, two string bass, drums, piano, accordion, and now harp. An unusual combination, but really solid, strengthened by some swell soloists in Smokey "Oakie" Rogers, Deuce "Ark" Sprigins, Jack "Tex" Williams and Carolina Cotton.

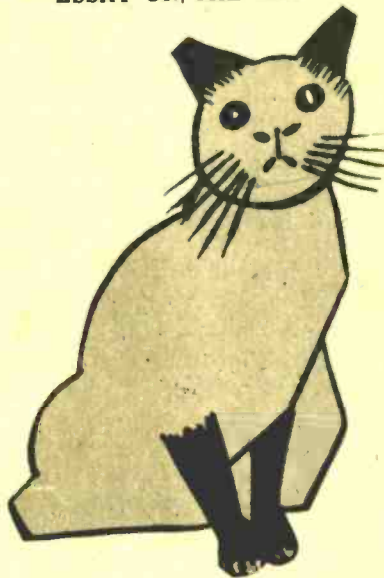
ESSAY ON THE OYSTER

ESSAY ON THE CAT



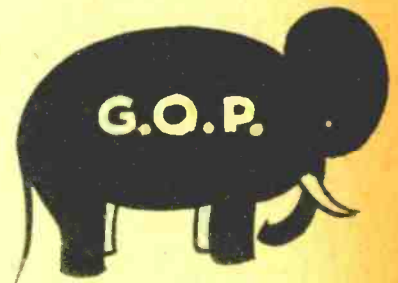

ARE YOU ON the verge of an urge?" queries Milton Berle, zany quipmaster of the Blue Network's riotous show, "Let Yourself Go."

The idea behind the program is based on one word—inhibitions. Participants are given the chance to get rid of them. Thus, on the first show of the series, fluttery-fingered ZaSu Pitts revealed that her great yen has always been to throw snowballs at a silk hat and knock it off. Obliging, Berle donned the topper and Miss Pitts sent it flying through the air with her sixth throw.

On a later broadcast, comedienne Patsy Kelly came to the "Let Yourself Go" microphone to confess her flaming desire to be a fireman. Berle immediately gratified her whim by supplying a blaze-battler's complete uniform equipment, and the irrepressible Patsy promptly went into her act. Then she wound up by squirting seltzer water all over the "burning" Mr. Berle!

But "Let Yourself Go" contestants are not chosen strictly from the ranks of show personalities. It is an audience participation program, and in addition to the satisfaction of releasing a suppressed desire, on-lookers are induced to perform by the offer of cash prizes, ranging from the twenty-five dollars given every participant to the one hundred dollars bestowed upon the individual who, in the judges' estimation, has really let himself go.

Listeners Share, Too

Listeners at home share in the stunt show too, since they are asked to write in their own inhibitions, the best of which are acted out on the broadcasts, with the letter-writer receiving the same amount of prize money as the stunt-performer.

One program presented a contestant who turned barber to administer a jagged haircut with the aid of an inverted bowl and manicure scissors, while a barbershop quartet stood by to render an old-time melody. Another participant had the desire to be a radio announcer and was given a commercial to read that would have tongue-tied even the glib Lowell Thomas.

Most of the time the "Let Yourself Go" broadcasts are loaded with laughs, particularly with the hilari-

ous, uninhibited Milton Berle as chief inhibition-dispenser. But Berle discovered during one program that occasionally an inhibition may be something of a serious ambition. On this occasion, a discharged serviceman who yearned to be a drummer displayed such exceptional skill on the skins that he was rewarded with two audition offers.

It is usually the guest personalities who supply the most comical of suppressed desires, as did Deems Taylor, the famed composer, commentator and critic, who claimed a yen to be top man in an acrobatic act.

Acrobat Taylor

So "Let Yourself Go" brought to the studio stage the famous acrobatic team from the "Ziegfeld Follies," who obliged Taylor by tossing him hither and yon like a rubber ball. 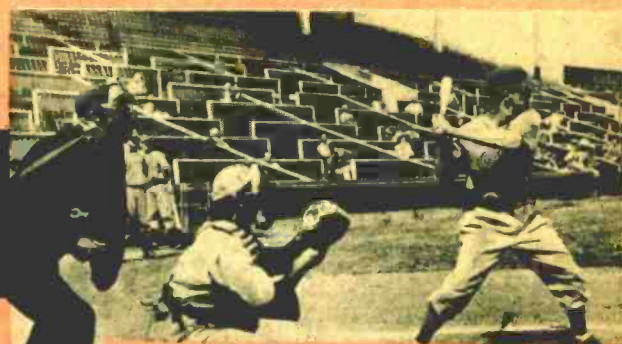
