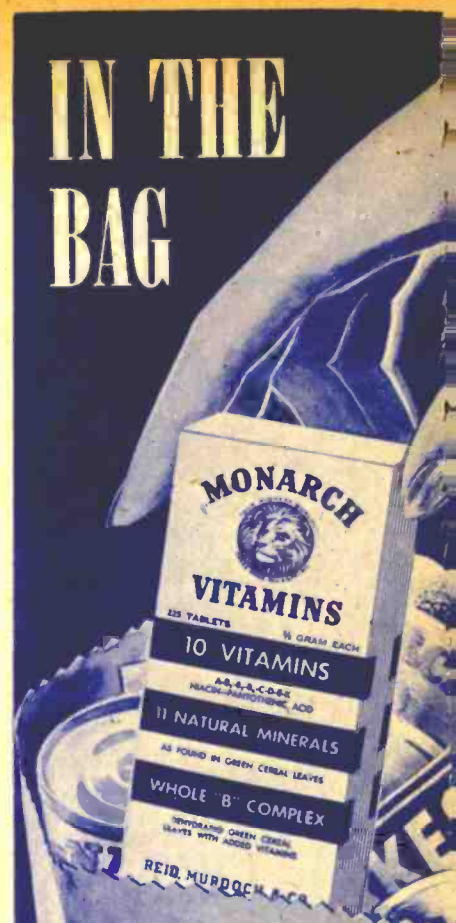

Radio's Theme Songs

What They Are, Who Wrote Them, and Why They've Become Trademark Tunes

THE THEME SONG is a radio program's trademark. It identifies the show in the listeners' minds; it establishes a mood, an atmosphere, an idea. It captures the attention of dial-twirlers, and heralds the approach of something new and exciting, or perhaps, something familiar and nostalgic.

But how many times do you catch yourself saying, "What's the name of that song?" or "I wonder who wrote it?" In spite of being its trademark, the theme song still frequently remains the one unknown ingredient of an airshow.

For instance, how many listeners to the CBS "Screen Guild Theater" have recognized the opening strains of music as the melody that was featured so dramatically in the

movie, "Four Wives." It was written by Max Steiner, and it's called "Mickey's Theme."

Theme of NBC's long-time favorite, "Amos 'n' Andy," is the familiar, well-loved "Perfect Song," establishing a nostalgic note, although the program is primarily comedy. Other laugh shows, more raucous and fast-moving, use lively, lilting tunes that usher the programs on at a high-stepping pace. The Jack Carson comedy show comes on with Kay Swift's "Fine and Dandy," KNX's "Potluck Party" uses Cole Porter's "Anything Goes," and Al Jarvis selected Pine Top Smith's "Boogie-Woogie" to herald his "Downbeat Derby" session of record-spinning.

How Permission Obtained

For permission to use a published song as a program theme, application is placed with the network's

theme department which obtains a clearance from the publisher. The same melody may not be used as a theme for more than one radio series.

Surprisingly enough, the acquisition of a popular, published melody as a theme is of no cost to the program, as set fees are paid to the tune's owners through the musicians' unions.

Some themes are specifically identified with the show's starring personality, as is "Scatterbrain," theme of the Judy Canova show, "Arkansas Traveler," Bob Burns' trademark tune, Eddie Cantor's "I Love to Spend Each (Wednesday) With You," and Bing Crosby's "Where the Blue of the Night Meets the Gold of the Day."

In other instances, the theme conveys the idea of the show, such as "I Know That You Know" does for Joe E. Brown's "Stop or Go" quiz program, and "Hail, Hail, the Gang's All Here" ushers in the friendliness and good fellowship of Tom Breneman's get-togethers over "Breakfast at Sardi's."

Sometimes Originals

Frequently, theme songs are original melodies (or simply a few bars of music) composed expressly for the shows. Trumpeter Harry Geller wrote "Meet Corliss Archer" for the program of the same name. Wilbur J. Hatch wrote "It's a Date with Judy."

Gordon Jenkins composed an original

He Can Make a Good Show Bad

IRRITATED radio-dialers who frequently find themselves jumping out of their skins at the sudden blare of a loud orchestration, or having to race across the room to turn the volume higher for some soft-spoken dialogue, can lay the blame on the broad, long-suffering shoulders of just one man—the engineer. But be careful what you say, for you wouldn't want to trade places with him. Upon his shoulders rests a full load of responsibility, and beneath a perspiring brow, his brain is kept busy with a maze of details he doesn't dare to forget. An engineer can make or break a radio show.

ANNOUNCER TOM CASSIDY has little time for more than a word in edgeways on KFAC's two-hour evening concerts sponsored by the Gas Company. He's kept as busy as a bus driver programming, announcing and changing the discs on the nightly show.

Programming vocalists and opera stars for the Wednesday evening concert and modern music for Friday night are high spots in his week.

"Great music and the artists who produce it belong to the world," Cassidy observed in a serious vein as he played Enrico Caruso recordings for your reporter. "Every year they are now reviving more of the great records of twenty, thirty, and forty years ago so that music lovers today can enjoy the music that belongs to all time." He further stated that he thinks the interchange of master records between this country and Europe before the war was another step in the right direction.

Names Favorites

"My favorite music? It's hard to say. Tchaikowsky's "Piano Concerto" is a great favorite of mine. It's my theme song, you know." He also named "Peter and the Wolf" by Prokofieff, wherein a narrator accompanies and explains the music, chooses this selection "because it clarifies so well what the composer attempts to do." Beethoven's Seventh Symphony is another one on his preferred list—and then opera, practically all of it.

This easy-on-the-ears announcer is well suited to his job as "conductor" of nightly concerts. He has studied music for the past seven years at the California Institute of Music and Allied Arts in Los Angeles, aiming his efforts toward becoming an operatic baritone. It is his ambition some day to sing the role of Iago in Othello. He also has had some dramatic experience—three years in Catholic Theater Guild productions. Although he was born in Indiana, he remained a Hoosier only the first fourteen years of his life and considers himself "practically a native" Los Angelan.

A comparative newcomer to radio, Tom Cassidy has been in the business little over a year. Before taking over the programs he now handles he was a staff announcer on NBC station KIDO in Boise, Idaho. "I really got my training there," he claims. "Broadcast everything from baseball games and news right through the book." He went on, "I feel as if I'm in my element now—think radio's here to stay, hope to stay with it."

Before going into radio Cassidy had a small business of his own—speedometer and tachometer repairing—but was waiting for a break to use his musical background. At KIDO his break came and he soon found himself doing all the musical programs.

Knows Languages

"My study of singing has taught me a smattering of languages—French, German, Italian, in addition to English—which comes in handy when questions of pronunciation arise," he commented, citing the case of the lady who called in to inform him so positively that the name was Ludwig von Beethoven, not Ludwig Van Beethoven, as he had just an-

He Gets a Word In Edgeways

*Your Gas Company Announcer
Can't Say Much On Concerts,
But Makes Up for It At Home*

THE MAN who gets a word in edgeways"

Announcer Tom Cassidy is just that. For it is he who inserts the few well-chosen words in between fifteen minute slices of solid classical music on KFAC's "Musical Masterpieces" program and the Gas Company's "Evening Concert."

In addition to announcing and programming his daily shows, it is his job to select each week several hundred dollars worth of classical re-

cordings for KFAC's record library, of which he is in charge—a collection of over 1,600 volumes. Like the proverbial housewife, he sometimes finds it hard to keep within his budget, he admits. "Last week I had a three hundred dollar limit, but went off the deep end and spent five hundred. All the good ones seemed to come at once that time. That isn't usually the case, though," he added.

Collecting records for the station and adding to his personal collection, especially digging up unusual recordings, he enjoys most of all.

Still Fighting

Last week an underweight, nervous ex-Marine started frequenting Radio City's peaceful corridors preparatory to taking over an important air assignment. The former fighter was ex-radio man Roy Maypole, who gained nation-wide attention when he recorded (by means of the sensational new wire recording device) the actual assault landing on the beach at Empress Augusta Bay. This, says Maypole, was the first record of a U. S. landing on Japanese-held shores.

Combat correspondent Maypole, a fighting, even grave-digging sergeant and a radio reporter in lull moments when he wasn't needed in the bloody fighting, was able to capture a terribly true-to-life account of the battle.

He is back now, after six months at Bougainville, Guadalcanal, New Caledonia, and Tulagi, to air his reports on NBC while radio commentator Fleetwood Lawton, in turn, goes forth

as an overseas correspondent for from four to eight weeks. Maypole, who was given a medical discharge for combat fatigue (he dropped to 110 pounds) and who is obviously struggling to forget the terrible things he saw in combat, pounded a taut fist as he emphasized: "The people at home haven't the faintest conception of what goes on at the front. I plan to cover the news of the European theater, but I also hope to be able to tell people some of the experiences in the South Pacific. I have no intention of pulling punches."

Maypole feels definitely that the difficult post-war adjustment will not be entirely up to the returning fighter, but equally to the folks at home who should already begin preparing for the men's reception. He hopes, by painting factually vivid word pictures, to contribute in his own special way toward the happy realignment of fighting men and civilians after hostilities cease. He is peculiarly equipped

More Originals

A clever song-writer, Dale Evans has also authored other catchy numbers, including the well-known "Will You Marry Me, Mr. Laramie?" and "My Heart's Down Texas Way."

The songbird was born in Texas, but came to Hollywood from Chicago where she did a stint of over two years on the windy city's CBS station, WBBM. Before that, she had toured as vocalist with Anson Weeks' band, and made her radio debut on a program sponsored by a Dallas, Texas insurance company with which she had obtained her first job, as a stenographer, after her graduation from high school and business college.

Now she uses her shorthand skill to write down the lyrics of the tunes she sings.

inal theme of exactly thirty-two bars for Mutual's "Point Sublime" show, specifically to establish the homely, rural atmosphere of the little seacoast town that is the program's setting. Until the arrival of Musical Director Bernard Katz on the show's staff, the cast was thoroughly convinced that the "Point Sublime Theme" couldn't be set to a swing tempo. Katz did it, however, and now the theme is swung on every Monday night broadcast except during such holiday weeks as Christmas and Thanksgiving, when the regular tempo is again employed.

Not Always Hits

It seems surprising, perhaps, that the popular hit of the day, "San Fernando Valley," is not being used as the theme song of Mutual's "Merry Moons of San Fernando Valley." "Haducki" is used instead, because, as Audrey Kuthe, the show's co-writer explains, "it's a gay, lively tune in key with the program itself.

"San Fernando Valley" wasn't selected because hit-parade songs so often become worn out in so short a time, and we wanted a musical theme that listeners would definitely associate with our broadcast."

The theme song for the Blue Network's "Lum 'n' Abner" broadcasts was given birth three years ago, when, in the course of program's story development, "Lum" was smitten with the charms of a school-teacher named "Evalina." Organist Sybil Chism composed a melody establishing the mood of love, titled it "Evalina," and it is still being used as the show's identifying theme.

When a search was being conducted for a suitable melody to identify CBS' "Mayor of the Town" program which stars the beloved actor, Lionel Barrymore, the star himself, who is also an accomplished composer, submitted the music that has been adopted as his program's theme song. It is untitled and unpublished, however.

The Blue's "little variety" team, Andy and Virginia, always use their own theme, titled "Tie All Your Troubles to the Tail of a Kite." "We wrote it," they explain with a twinkle, "with a sponsor in mind. The middle of the tune can be used for a commercial."

The theme for "Midland, U.S.A."

Mutual's daytime dramatic serial, is an original composition written by Buddy Cole. For the program following it, "The Amazing Jennifer Logan," Johnny Boylan, the show's writer-producer, selected "Deep Purple" for its elasticity, and its haunting, poignant, easy-to-remember melody.

Amusing sidelight in connection with the theme music on these two neighboring shows, which are aired at 9:30 and 9:45 a.m., respectively, in adjoining studios, is the fact that both themes are played by the same organist, Joe Wayne, whose mad dash from one studio to the other in fifteen seconds has all the drama of Dagwood catching the morning bus.

How He Manages

First of all, Wayne warms up the organ in the "Logan" studio before "Midland" goes on the air so that it's all set to go. At exactly fifteen seconds before 9:45 a.m., when "Midland" goes off the air, Art Fulton, scound man on the "Logan" show, holds the heavy studio door open. Wayne leaves his post behind the organ midstage on the "Midland" show and bolts for the "Logan" instrument like a frightened rabbit. Cast members are awaiting the day when Fulton forgets to hold the door open and Wayne smashes headlong into it.

To meet all emergencies, Boylan has written two openings to his "Logan" show, which starts with a few words from announcer Bruce Buell before Wayne swings into "Deep Purple." One opening is short. That's for the times when Wayne has made a successful sprint. The other opening is longer—just in case the day ever comes that Wayne trips enroute and sprains an ankle!

WHEN I came out west two years ago," Dale Evans related to us in her soft Texas drawl, "there were two things Hollywood didn't like about me. (A) I was too fat, and (B) I was married.

"Now," she continued with a smile, "I've been slimmed up—but I'm still married, and I hope to stay that way." Hollywood, however, insisted on publicizing her as a single gal at the beginning.

But, being a sentimental sort of person, Dale didn't approve of keeping her marriage in the dark. She wanted it known that she has been wedded to Dale Butts since 1937. Because both their names are alike, Dale (*Mrs. Butts*) is called "D.E." by her friends and family. Her husband is an arranger at Republic picture studios, where she works as leading lady in Roy Rogers western musicals. She has filmed five of them since the first of the year, "San Fernando Valley" being one of the latest.

"They've helped me to keep my waistline down," smiles Dale. "I've really taken a beating during some of the sequences, and of course, I've been doing plenty of horseback riding. I've learned to ride with the saddle, as real riders should, but I still haven't mastered the western mount."

Has Hearty Laugh

Sitting in with Dale at a script rehearsal for the Jack Carson airshow, we were amused by her loud, hearty laugh which took us by sur-

prise, coming from such a tiny figure of femininity. But we liked it. Dale is a delightful person, bubbling with friendliness and enthusiasm, obviously enjoying everything she does.

"Comedy shows are fun," she bubbled. "And I love doing dialogue. In fact, strange as it seems, I'm less nervous about reading lines than I am about singing my song."

She doesn't like having just one number during a program, since it allows the singer just one opportunity to sell herself. She studied a recording of her preceding week's number intently, answering the jibes of her co-workers with a gay acknowledgement of their joking accusations. "Sure, I'm a ham," she laughed.

Her ambition, she told us, is to fence her own show, singing several songs and doing a lot of dialogue as well.

Servicemen's Sweetheart

In addition to her airplane appearances on the Carson program and her movie roles in Roy Rogers films, Dale has given some three hundred shows for servicemen stationed in the States, and has recorded at least a dozen personal albums for the boys overseas. Asked if she would like to go "over there" herself to entertain the troops in person, she replied en-

thusiastically, "Of course! I'd love it!"

Currently, however, her film commitments keep her in Hollywood. Some day, if she could have that radio show of her own, she'd like to limit her screen career to two or three pictures a year, leaving more time for her home and her marriage.

"Hollywood is hard on a marriage," she admits. The only time she and her equally-busy husband really get together, is when she's not working.

Their home is an eight-room house in Westwood. "We have two pets," stated Dale, bubbling again. "A cocker spaniel named 'Susie' and a Persian cat named 'Petey' who weighs seventeen pounds!"

She went on to tell us that she loves to cook, and to whip up delicious green salads. She also whips up her own millinery creations, with flowered tidbits and colorful snoods her specialty.

"I don't start from scratch, though," she points out. "I buy a new hat, then take it home, tear it apart and make it over."

Fond of Green

She wears green most frequently, and we found it becoming to her as it brings out the green glint in her eyes. She also likes pink and black.

She sometimes buys dinner dresses, for the smooth lines of the gowns, then shortens them to wear as afternoon frocks, explaining "I'm too short to wear 'em long."

Dale is intrigued by everything that is Spanish. She loves Spanish songs, enchilladas, and dreams of going to Mexico City.

Bullock's Show Plumbs Uncharted Depths in Field of Air Production

WHAT THERE are still uncharted depths in the field of radio production is being proved each week on "Adventures in Good Radio," the New Bullock's program on KFI.

Not content to present finely written and expertly cast dramatic shows, this pioneer-in-unusual-radio goes to extreme lengths to present the unexpected.

Perhaps the title of the program, "Adventures in Good Radio," best illustrates the format and the aim. The title, however, might go even further to point up that aim. It should, perhaps, be "Adventures In Good Radio *Listening.*"

The success of the Bullock's program is best stated by the fact that it is still on the air after 15 months of continual weekly broadcasting. First conceived in March of 1943 as a 'one time' program in connection with War Bond displays in the Bullock's Down Town windows, the program met with such success it was extended to three additional broadcasts. Then, because of its acceptance by the listeners of Southern California, the contract was extended for thirteen weeks. In March of this year, the Bullock's show celebrated its first year on the air.

Has Been Changed

The program has undergone several

major changes. It was first titled "The World We're Fighting For" and was patterned along patriotic lines. Shortly after the first of the year it was again changed to "Star Performance" and supporting radio actors and actresses were given a chance at stardom.

Then on June 20, the third change took place and the Bullock's show became an adventure series—adventuring into new fields of production.

The pictures printed with this story help to illustrate the many unusual aspects of this program. Written by two young radio men whose identity is a secret and who relegate their position to secondary importance, new and untried methods of production are taking top-billing.

Among these is the original idea of divorcing the orchestra from the cast. It is carried to great lengths on the Bullock's show. Claude Sweeten and his musicians are placed in one studio while the cast works in a different studio. This permits the producers to exercise complete control over these two phases of the program and one or the other can more readily be given predominance. Cues are given to Maestro Sweeten over a speaker system which he hears through ear-phones. Cues to the cast are given in orthodox manner from the control booth.

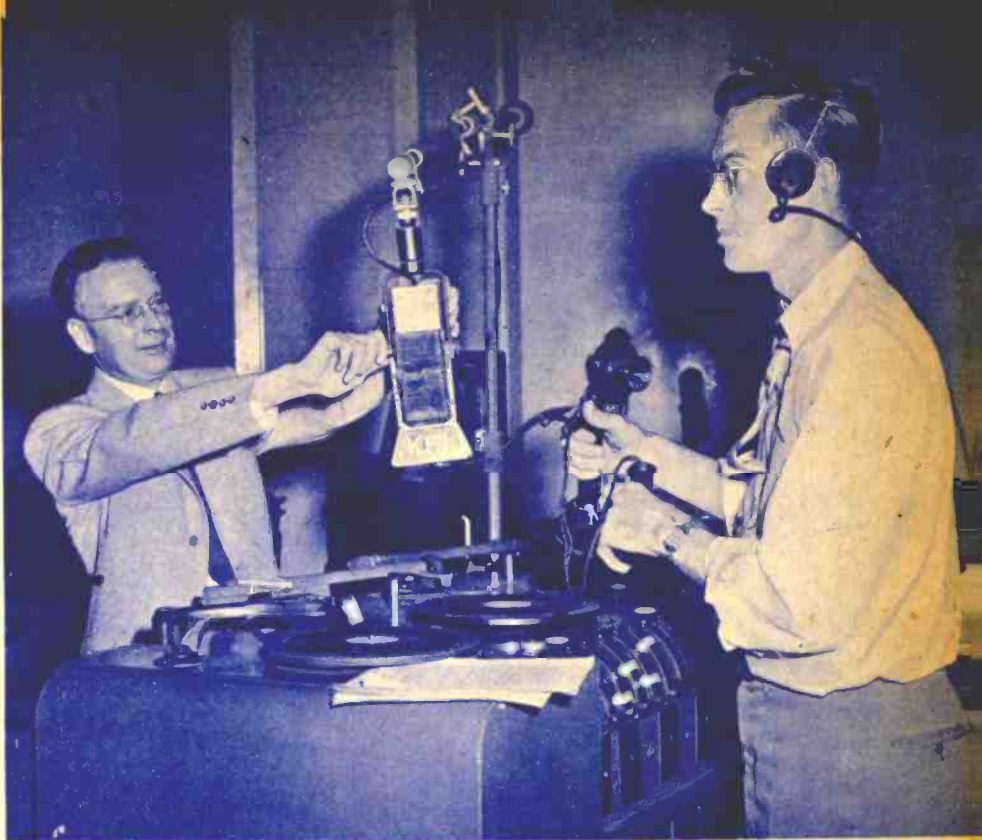
Use Aisles

The picture showing four members of the cast working by a mike situated in an aisle in the large auditorium illustrates another radical departure from usual radio production. This method is used to give greater scope in the reproduction of out-of-doors scenes. In the first program of this series the scene was located in the street of a small Greek village. The townspeople gathered in the street, and their excited voices were faithfully reproduced as they ran about shouting the news of the invasion. Incidentally, the dialogue at this point was spoken in Greek, which helped portray the illusion to even greater heights of perfection.

Sound is another vital part of these programs and the emphasis given to this phase of the production is another step in the direction of cre-

THE "SCRAMBY AMBY" epidemic is spreading from coast to coast. Beginning July 26 the daffy quiz program, which mushroomed on NBC's Pacific Coast network, is being heard over a Blue nationwide hookup every Wednesday night.

All of you who have heard the show know what fun it is to unscramble words. You know, too, that one does not of necessity have to be in the studio audience to share in the merriment. When those two sophisticated sillies with the professorial manner, Emcee Perry Ward and Announcer Larry Keating, go into their hilarious conspiracy to confound hapless contestants, countless members of the unseen radio audience pick up their pencils and begin unscrambling like mad.

Musical clues, daffy definitions and dictionary hints are a happy part of the melee out of which emerges the perkier program on the air.

Is Catching

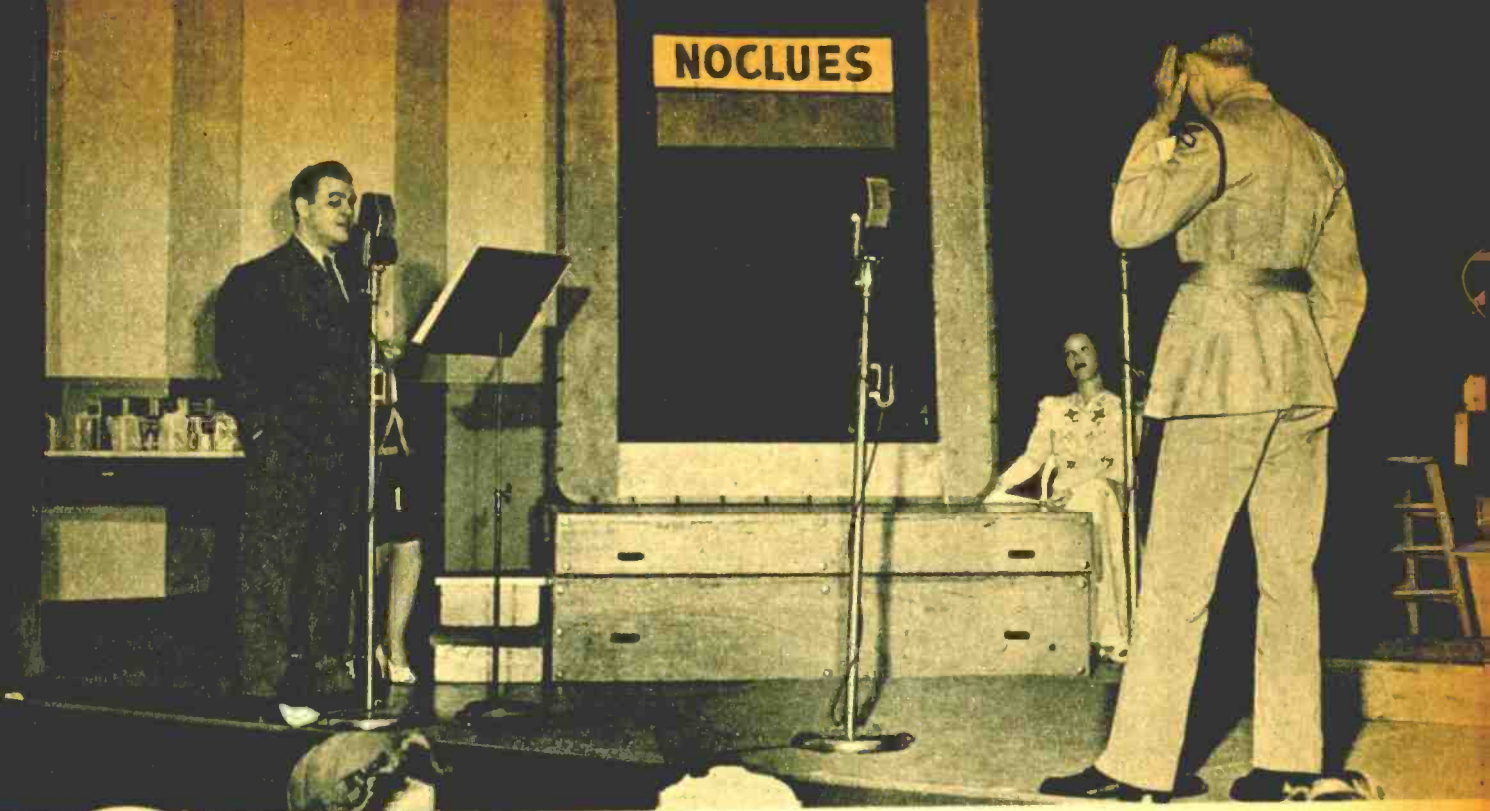
Exposure to "Scramby Amby" seems to be contagious. Thousands of "Scramby Amby" clubs gather in members' homes on Wednesday nights to vie for homemade prizes and jackpots.

Wednesday nighters think it's duck soup to translate a simple scramble like "Egad, Ma" back into the original "Damage," especially if a give-away musical clue like "Humpty-Dumpty Sat on a Wall" and an enlightening daffy definition about British barristers are thrown in.

It all started a couple of years ago on Cincinnati's WLW. "Scramby Amby" outgrew the one-station toddler stage quickly, and elbowed its mad merry way to a foremost position among Pacific Coast programs in no time flat.

The show that skips wackily through a half hour of silly spellings, musical gems ("Never Hit Your Grandma With a Shovel") and dizzy definitions actually has as solid a foundation as the Rock of Gibraltar. No board of directors ever met in more solemn conclave than do the guiding lights of S-A, Incorporated. During a gruelling session lasting many hours the newest program is mapped out in minutest detail. Perhaps two-thirds of the script never reaches the air, thanks to the facility of contestants who make the lovingly provided musical clues and defini-

tions unnecessary by unscrambling the scramble as soon as it hits the blackboard.

A scholastic battery of experts is maintained to evaluate the voluminous scrambles which pour in from every neck of the woods; to determine whether they merit use on an early program, and whether sufficiently illuminating musical clues and daffy definitions are available yet to back them up. "Scramby Amby" archives bulge with scramble entries for which a suitable song has yet to be found, even though an

Imposing library of unusual ditties stands by ready for calls to join in the Scramble. No entry is overlooked; each and every suggestion is put through the "Scramby Amby" mill and card indexed until the day arrives when it can bow to public view to good advantage, timeliness and educational value.

Some Fans Named

David Butler, famed motion picture director, is a Scramby Amby expert. So is Dr. Lee De Forest, renowned "father of radio." And No. 24429 at Folsom Prison. Fans by the thousands gang together in hospitals, hotels and parlors to sink their teeth into "See - Hero - Win" and roll it around until it makes "Eisenhower" (disqualified because a proper noun, but aired on "Scramby Amby" because irresistible).

Frequent repercussions are heard, as in the case of "tranquillity." As spotlighted on the show's blackboard, the word was spelled with two "I's," but hundreds of people wrote in to say only one "I" was correct. The battle raged for several weeks until word came pointing out that the preamble to the Constitution of the United States spells it "tranquillity." "Scramby Amby" was vindicated, and the argument was settled.

*Not long ago a market owner wrote that the market closed up early on Wednesday nights to allow the five Scramby Amby addicts employed there to get home in time to listen in. Zealous for the welfare of Sweet-Heart Soap customers, the storekeeper got reprimanded over the air. Admonished Perry Ward: "Suppose somebody who wants to take a bath is all out of SweetHeart Soap and finds the market closed. We lose a customer!" The storekeeper ended up by installing a radio in the market and kept open.

During our visit to the Ruick home, Lurene showed us the powder room, and pointed to its quilted walls in soft pink. "Mel and I call this our padded cell," she laughed. "When we've had enough of radio, we come in here and bang our heads against the wall!"

From the moment he presses open the line switch to send a show out over the airplanes, he must be constantly on the alert. He must know what is happening every single second, and at the same time, be continually thinking ahead of himself. When a program is being aired, he has the bear by the tail, and can't let go.

Is Chief Mixer

Radio Life sought out CBS engineer, Garry Harris, to tell us more about the plight of this man who *literally* has his hands full as he sits behind the glass window of a studio control booth. There, seated before an impressive-looking instrument panel, he mixes the ingredients of sound into a finished product to please a vast listening network of discriminating ears. With intricate skill, he works upon the panel, weaving a pleasant pattern of sound in the manner that an artist plays upon a keyboard.

When a large-scale show, such as "Command Performance," is being presented, engineer Harris has had to handle as many as eleven microphones on an eight-place mixer. During a "Command" broadcast, aired exclusively to our troops abroad, the studio stage is studded with performing stars and the show is rehearsed in separate units. This makes it particularly difficult for the engineer, who, with no complete rehearsal by which to gauge his operations, must apply his skill ingeniously to the delicate task of blending the units of sound into a listenable, smooth-running program of enjoyable entertainment.

His Troubles

In the instance of the eleven mikes, Harris had to make split-second change-overs to alternate and blend the separate sound units of the woodwind, strings and rhythm sections of three orchestras, the songs of the vocal stars, the dialogue of the comedians and the varying noises of the sound effects.

According to Harris, the bane of an engineer's life are the gag writers who stand at his elbow during a show, discussing a joke that just laid an egg, while a musical number is being rendered that requires a delicate job of mixing. An engineer must have quiet for complete concentration, and silence doesn't always reign supreme in the hectic atmosphere of a busy control booth.

From his own personal experience, Garry Harris considers Arch Oboler's "Lights Out" broadcast one of the most difficult shows he has handled, and a program such as "Dr. Christian" one of the easiest. In fact, he finally forsook the engineering duties on the "Christian" program to take over the control booth chores for the Orson Welles show, because he prefers to work under pressure.

Known to be proficient at almost every phase of radio production, wonder-boy Welles does not dabble in the engineering end of the field, according to Harris. Welles appreciates an engineer's knowledge and ability, and abides by his decisions.

Harris speaks in particular praise of producer Norman Corwin. "He always knows just what he wants, and just what he's doing," enthuses Garry.

Tough Assignments

Toughest tests for Harris have been the CBS Texarkana broadcast and a special events coverage of a housing project near a Long Beach war plant.

For the Texarkana airing, another network had promised to supply the broadcasting equipment needed, but failed to come through at the last minute. With the responsibility resting heavily upon his shoulders, engineer Harris sweated the emergency out, erecting an entire broadcasting unit in twenty-four hours with crude emergency equipment.

For the Long Beach broadcast, he had been told there would be no need for a second amplifier, and was sent down to the remote spot without it, only to discover pick-ups had to be made from two areas widely separated from each other. He solved the situation by stretching a low-level mike line between the two points, taking the risk of its running across streets and alleys carrying traffic.

What is more, on that assignment, he had no incoming line, and had to cue the start of his show by tuning in the preceding program on his car radio!

nounced. Our suave-voiced subject referred his critic to three references at hand—he always has references—and turned out to be right.

"Often people call up when they think I have mispronounced a name or a title. I appreciate their taking me to task if I'm wrong, give them my references as proof if I'm right." He uses the most widely-used pronunciation rather than Webster's preferred in some rare cases, in order to avoid affectation.

Cassidy has a calm look, speaks in reassuring tones, but admits his outward manner conceals a nervousness found in most artistic people. He is tall (a little under six feet), young (a little under thirty), of slender build, has brown hair and steady brown eyes. He is married and has a four-months-old son.

Little over a year ago Mrs. C. got her word in edgeways. And as a result Mr. C. has been announcing on the airways ever since. "It was she who thought I would do well in radio, and talked me into going into it. I feel that I'll go a long way by following her advice." Music and

Cupid in the form of a singing teacher brought him and his small, blond, blue-eyed wife together. In fact, they knew each other casually as fellow students for over a year before they started going together.

Son Dickie almost got a word in edgeways on his birthday, his father relates. "The night he was born I was tempted to say 'This is Richard Thomas Cassidy saying goodnight for your Gas Company, but on second thought, the thought of the sponsor's reaction, I decided against it.'" Coming from such a musical family, the youngest member of the Cassidy clan will probably choose a musical career when he gets a little older, at least that's what his father hopes. "I don't believe in forcing a youngster into a career... besides, he'll have plenty of time to decide."

Is Fond of Home

Home is the place Tom Cassidy likes to spend most of his leisure hours. He likes to do things around the house, is a model airplane fan from way back—has made model ships ever since he was ten and built miniature replicas of the originals down to the finest details, including tiny instrument boards, controls, and even parachute packs. Some day, after the war, he'd like to learn to fly, but purely for pleasure.

Commenting on his early ambitions, Cassidy said that when he was very young he first wanted to be an airplane pilot, then he started taking voice lessons with the aim of learning to sing like Bing. Proving that one thing leads to another, his desire to become an operatic baritone started with those singing lessons.

Tom Cassidy may barely squeeze his word in edgeways on the air, but it's quite the contrary at home. Unlike the usual procedure, he picks out all his wife's clothes. "Sometimes I go into a store on payday, see something that she looks good in, then—there goes my allowance," he laughed.

ating the illusion with high fidelity. It is not unusual to devote an entire afternoon to rehearsing only the sound effects. This part of the production finds Bob Hiestand, in charge of sound, working closely with the musical director and the technical staff.

It will be interesting to follow the Bullock's series each week as "Adventures in Good Radio" continue to bring unusual radio entertainment. While the goal is pretty well established, the format of the show is wide open. If you dial "Adventures in Good Radio" each Tuesday night you are apt to find comedy, tragedy and histrionics each presented in a manner not often found in radio today.
