ENJOY INEXPENSIVE PRIZE - WINNING ORANGE MARMALADE

It's Easy To Make Anytime
With This Simple Recipe

- 6 Medium Sized Oranges
(2 lbs. Sliced)
- 6 Cups Water
- ½ Cup Lemon Juice
(About 6 lemons)
- 1 Package M.C.P. Pectin
- 9½ Level Cups Sugar
(Measured ready for use)

1. Cut oranges in cartwheels with very sharp knife to make slices thin as possible. Discard the large flat peel ends. Sliced fruit should weigh 2 pounds.
2. Put sliced fruit in 8-quart kettle. Add the water and lemon juice.
3. Bring to a quick boil; boil gently for 1 hour (uncovered). If peel is not tender in 1 hour, boil until tender.
4. Measure the cooked material. Due to boiling, the volume will be reduced below 7 cups. Add water to make total peel and juice exactly 7 cups.
5. Put back in kettle. Stir in M.C.P. Pectin; continue stirring and bring to a full boil.
6. Add sugar (previously measured). Stir gently until it has reached a full rolling boil, and BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire; skim and stir by turns for 5 minutes.
7. Pour into jars. If you use pint or quart jars, seal hot and invert jars on lids until Marmalade begins to set. Then, shake well and set jars upright. This keeps the peel evenly distributed throughout.

NOTE: This recipe works equally well with Navel Oranges or Valencias. When either variety is over-ripe and peel is soft, use ¾-cup Lemon Juice instead of ½-cup. (Be sure to discard any seeds.) This recipe makes 7 pounds of prize-winning Orange Marmalade.

INTRODUCING Fanny Brice to the public is like saying "Soap, meet water." Behind her is a stage career rivaled by few present day entertainers. Behind her, too, are six years of radio stardom. Before her is her new show for which she is enlarging her repertoire with three brand new characterizations presenting new talent and in general making a big splash in 1944-1945's impressive list of air entertainment.

So, this is a re-introduction of Fanny Brice in honor of that new show—"Post Toasties Program"—which makes its debut on CBS September 17.

But it is not a simple thing. Fanny Brice is many people. She is the poor girl from humble beginnings who made good. She is the ugly duckling who became attractive. She is the romantic figure of "My Man" days who has proven that allure knows no age. She is the singer who will go down in broadcasting history as the creator of one of the industry's most memorable novelties—radio's terrible tot, Baby Snooks.

Poor Girl

Probably more than any comedienne on the air today, Fanny Brice exemplifies the theatrical aspect of the good old American saga of success. The first four years of her life were spent in New York's lower East Side as one of Charles and Rose Borasch's four children. Later her parents separated and the mother took Fanny, sister Carolyn and brothers Lew and Philip to live in Brooklyn.

The poignant longings of Francine in "A Tree Grows in Brooklyn" were almost a generation less severe than those of Fanny Brice. But Fanny had a goal to work toward from the day she first entered a theater. She was seven and she and brother Lew had sneaked into a Newark, N. J. playhouse while it was being aired. Hours later, when the audience began to collect, the two children rose timidly and took the best seats in the balcony.

Wins First Prize

Fanny's first step in the right direction was to find acceptance with the newsboys in her neighborhood. From them she learned a few dance steps—and the current popular songs and performed on the streets for stray pennies. At twelve she went to work in earnest—selling bright gewgaws behind the ribbon counter in a department store. The next year, however, she began her career. She debuted in an amateur night contest at Brooklyn's Kearny Theater, singing "When You Know You're Not Forgotten by the Girl You Can't Forget." She won first prize.

She also achieved self-confidence. She went all over New York City entering amateur nights. When that game was milked dry (she won too often) she joined a traveling show. That job fell through when the woman manager skipped with Fanny's money and the few nice clothes she

and her mother had made. Next came a job as a girl-of-all work at a local theater. When she wasn't selling tickets she was ushering. Sometimes she was permitted to sing the saccharine songs accompanying the lantern slides. It was in this period that she achieved her first fan. He was a mild-mannered young man who came to the theater often and who later became one of America's most beloved composers — Irving Berlin.

Next on the ladder of success was a Cohan and Harris revue. That lasted until George M. Cohan discovered that, although she was in the chorus, Fanny's dancing hadn't improved since the curbstome days with the newsies.

After Fanny improved her terpsichorean technique, she joined the Hertig & Seamon Trans-Atlantic Burlesquers. By the time she was eighteen she had progressed from the last to the first row and one night a Ziegfeld scout saw her there. A few weeks later she made her first appearance in the Ziegfeld Follies. She was called back for eleven encores.

That was the big beginning of Fanny Brice. It was the beginning of a friendship with Florenz Ziegfeld, Eddie Cantor, Will Rogers, W. C. Fields, Ann Pennington and many more outstanding names in the American entertainment world. There were days of friendship, too, with fabulously wealthy John Wanamaker, Jr. who once brought the Prince of Wales to her home. The star was on Fanny Brice's dressing room door. Poor girl had made good.

Ugly Duckling

Fanny Brice was a thin, gangling youngster. She had a too-wide mouth

and eyes too big and too expressive for a child's face. Fanny was born without beauty, but she had something much better. She had personality and she was an observer. The Follies taught her a lot and in time she brought those disadvantages of face to the credit side of the ledger. She developed a fine figure and learned to clothe it well. With her natural artistic tendencies toward line and color she soon became one of the smartest dressed women in her profession. Fanny Brice once said, in reply to a question from a national magazine as to what kind of man appealed to her:

"I can't put it in an adjective. Let me say it this way: Say my man and I have only \$25 between us and we have nothing to eat and the rent's due. Well, he goes out to buy some food and to pay the rent. He meets an old pal from show business down on his luck. My man falls for the pitch and gives the guy our \$25. I raise hell with him from now

The House That Dick Built

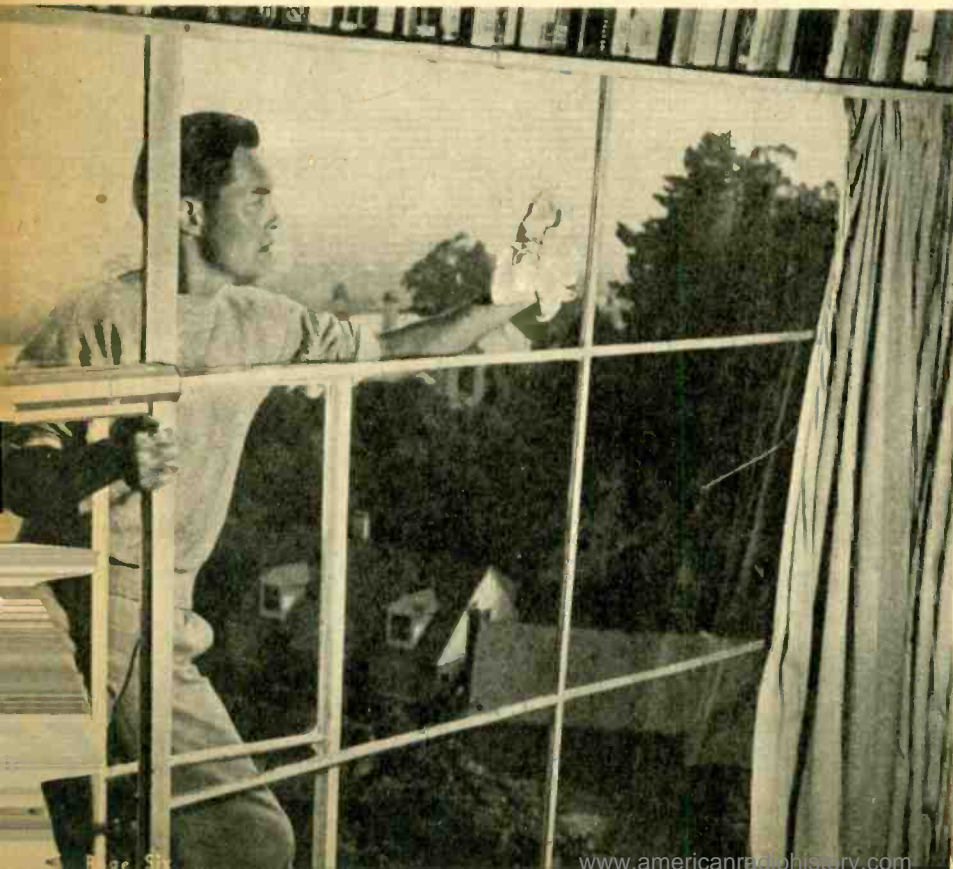
One of Radio's Most Avid Antique-Seekers, Richard Cromwell, has Built, Furnished His Own Home With Rare Curios In Every Corner

I'D like to write for a living, and paint for pleasure," Richard Cromwell asserted as we talked with him in his fabulous home overlooking Hollywood. Cromwell is the handsome young radio-movie thespian who has recently returned to the role of "Kit Marshall" in NBC's popular dramatic serial, "Those We Love," after a year and a half of service in the U. S. Coast Guard.

Abundant proof of the actor's artistic taste and diversified creative talents is to be found in the fascinating furnishings of this house that he has built and furnished himself. Starting with six hundred dollars cash and a selected spot on a hillside above the Sunset Strip, Cromwell has created one of the show places of the film capitol, a home valued at some \$25,000. It is filled with rare antiques, and as we examined the curios in every corner, Dick narrated their histories.

He showed us a rare old miniature Victorian clock; two tiny figurines delicately carved of wood and ivory; paintings by Suzanne Eidendieck, whom he believes is now imprisoned in a Nazi concentration camp; a couch covered by worn green cloth that came from an historic old English castle. We noticed that an an-

ancient cobbler's bench served as a coffee table.

"It's comfortable," smiled Dick. "You can stick your feet on it."

Collects Coffee Pots

On display in the dining room are his collections of beautiful Bristol tear glasses and small French drip coffee pots. "But it takes so long to make coffee in them," he told us, "that I usually use a modern one, then pour it in these to serve." Next he pointed with pride to his assortment of pistol-handled knives.

"Some day I'll get some forks, too," he said. "Then we'll eat with 'em."

In the living room, he showed us the collection he treasures most—a beautiful display of forty colorfully-patterned glass paper weights. Now reminders of a lost art, they were delicately fashioned by skilled glass-blowers as many as a hundred years ago. Cromwell started his collection with one he purchased in a Flea Circus in Paris.

At the early age of fourteen, and for four years thereafter, Dick diligently devoted himself to the study of painting. He has now given most of his work away to his many friends and acquaintances (among whom are numbered such names as Linda and Cole Porter, Sally and Norman Foster), but a piece he has kept is one of his mother which he painted from an old and faded snapshot of her. "When she saw the finished

MGM's "Screen Test" Gives Radio Fans a Chance to Pick Their Future Film Favorites

Monday-Friday, 6:15 p.m.

WOULD you like to have a hand in picking next year's crop of movie stars?

Would you like to hear the entertainment world's best bets for Hollywood success showcased for your approval over the air-planes?

And would you like to hear your favorite radio, night club, opera and stage personalities make their bids for film fame?

If this appeals, you should tune in on MGM's "Screen Test," heard over the Mutual network five nights a week, and hear top-notch performers try out for motion picture contracts long distance—in front of a microphone instead of a camera.

Here are a few of the top-flighters in other phases of show business than motion pictures who have thus far been aired with an eye toward a Hollywood contract:

Sunny Skylar, baritenor and lyricist who wrote the words to "Besame Mucho" and "Amor, Amor, Amor"; Louis Prima, dusky exponent of "le jazz hot," trumpeteer extraordinary, bandleader and author of such tunes as "Worry Blues" and "Where Have

We Met Before"; Bret Morrison, long-famed as "The Shadow" on the air-planes, who is also a new singing discovery; and Muriel Rahn, who sang the title role in the Broadway hit "Carmen Jones."

Airs from New York

"Screen Test" is aired from Radio City in New York; the idea being to spot, test, then channel westward the best bets for Hollywood fame from the wealth of bigtime entertainers there. Through this program professional singers, actors, comedians and musicians who have already achieved good local reputations elsewhere are given a chance to make their mark on celluloid.

Recently aired was Eddie Mayehoff, Manhattan supper club headliner, whose first taste of the entertainment world was with the Yale Glee club, who played front man for a knife-thrower in his early professional days, and who more recently has been an actor on numerous Norman Corwin radio shows, had his own network program for over a year, and was featured comic in the Broadway hit "Early to Bed."

Another recent bidder for an MGM contract with an unusual background was Dutch dramatic actress

Sidelights On Sherlock

Probably radio's most expensive sound effect is that heard on the Blue Network's "Hollywood Star Time" broadcasts. Those high-pitched notes that herald the program on the air are done on a violin—a \$30,000 Stradivarius played by RKO concertmaster, Harry Solloway.

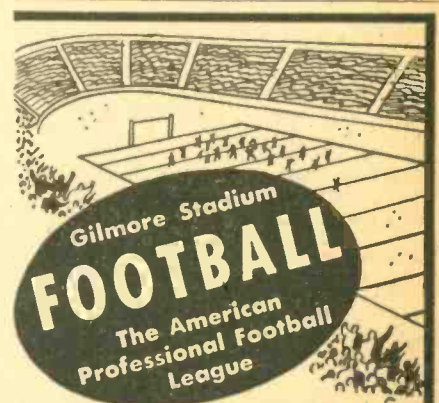



portrait," related Dick with pleasure and satisfaction, "she said it looked perfectly natural. Somehow, I had even chosen the colors just right."

Has Sculptured

Visual evidence of Cromwell's distinctive skill as a sculptor is to be seen in other attractive furnishings in and around his home. He has molded the unique fountain figure-heads which adorn the four corners of his swimming pool. Hanging in his bedroom are wall plaques—life-like masks he has molded from the faces of famous women. He showed us those of Ann Sothern, Katharine Cornell and Greta Garbo.

Also in this room is his extensive collection of phonograph records, and his home recorder. He and his friends and family wax discs of their festive get-togethers. "I've got a large family," he told us. "They come to see me in relays."

The terrace of Cromwell's picturesque abode has been fashioned of brick, by the actor himself. He also built the outdoor fireplace. "And I was amazed when I found out it worked!" he laughed.

The swimming pool and terrace are supplemented by a wooden dancing platform that overlooks the wide expanse of the city below. Dick tags it "the world's smallest make-believe ballroom." There is also his garden in the back of the house which he tends himself. But he confessed a feeling of uncertainty when he showed us his six tomatoes and one lone cucumber—the first fruits of his labors on the land.

Another distinctive feature of the Cromwell domicile of which its owner-builder is particularly proud is a novel "secret door" behind the what-not shelves in the back bedroom. "I've always wanted a house with a secret door," explained Dick. "This one opens on a back stairway."

The stairway, however, has been caved in by a landslide during Cromwell's absence from the house. "I've been busy doing repair work ever since I came back," he remarked.

He declined to dwell much on the subject of the war and his period of service, other than graciously to answer our questions. He had studied and taught aeronautics before donning the uniform of the Coast Guard, and he obviously found it regrettable that severe sinus trouble caused him to receive a medical discharge. Just recently he had an operation performed on his nose.

"Now there's a hole in it," he told us. Once, when he was doing a quiet, emotional scene during a broadcast, he looked up to see the engineer gesturing frantically from the control booth. Unknowingly, the actor had been whistling loudly through

the hole in his nose! "Now I can call dogs with it!" he laughed.

Cromwell is a bachelor, thirty-four years old, and yes, he can cook! "But only because I have to," he pointed out quickly. He doesn't like to dine out, and seldom indulges in night clubbing. Everything he likes to do can be done in his own home. He says he'll never get enough of swimming, eating, reading, laughing and acting.

But writing seems to be his chief ambition and he is working on the fulfillment of it, currently preparing a script to submit for a popular mystery program.

"But my girl has to punctuate it for me," Dick chuckled. "If I'm going to write, I guess I'll have to be a team!"

Sings "My Man"

Fanny meant that when she first sang "My Man." She had been doing her comedy characterizations for Ziegfeld a long time. She was known strictly as a comedienne—a funny-looking girl with lusty lungs and a comedy dialect. Then Ziegfeld put in her hands a copy of "Mon Homme, a French song for which Channing Pollock had written English lyrics. It was a great bit of showmanship. A comedienne doing an about-face and singing a tune such as "My Man" looked good before it ever happened. But that bit of showmanship coincided with the biggest heartbreak Fanny Brice had ever had. She lived the spirit of the song she sang with tears when she stood by her husband through his series of troubles.

But that was long ago. Fanny brought their two children, Frances and Bill, when she settled in California seven years ago. In the meantime the boy became an accomplished artist. Young Frances married a radio man, Ray Stark.

Her Talents

First it was as a singer that Fanny Brice made her mark on the theatrical world. She took up dancing because it meant holding on to a job. Then, with Ziegfeld, she began her long list of famous characterizations that she presented via song parodies. She became too, with "My Man," a torch singer. But, for all her talents and her versatility, undoubtedly the most remembered contribution will be Baby Snooks.

Baby Snooks, with all due respect to Daddy, was accidental. It was during a vaudeville tour that Snooks became the gleam in her mother's eye. Fanny was doing a burlesque of the song, "Poor Pauline"—singing it in different dialects and as other celebrities might do it. At a party one night after a show, she continued with the parody, singing it as

a small child might. Before the party ended, she and the other guest had named the characterization "Babykins."

Many years later Babykins was taken out of the Brice party repertoire and with a new name—Schnooks—brushed up for a debut on Broadway. She first appeared in the Ziegfeld Follies of 1932 in a skit written by Moss Hart. Some time later she got her first touch of radio in a New York broadcast, "The Follies of the Air." Then she went back into retirement.

Snooks Reappears

But you can't get a bad little girl down. When Fanny was invited to guest on the "Good News of 1938" air show, Snooks (without the 'ch') reappeared.

Snooks was a sensation. Snooks was here to stay.

So in reality Baby Snooks is many ages. Fanny says she started doing a baby character when she was fourteen. "Babykins" debuted at that party about 21 years ago. Theatrically Snooks is 12. And, she's been a radio star six years.

But the Snooks you hear is seven. She'll never be any older because she wasn't meant to grow up. She captures that happy period between babyhood and little girlhood. She is a mischievous cherub with a curiosity that would kill a 18-lifed cat. Her universal appeal is her direct approach to each and every situation—something we all once had before adulthood taught us subtlety.

Real Fanny Brice

All these people are Fanny Brice and this you find out if you can hold her still long enough. Vital, energetic, preoccupied, Miss Brice is rarely quiet. Considering that she has done and seen just about everything during her fascinating career, that's quite a tribute. Once she had conquered every medium of her profession she turned to interior decoration and painting. She became so interested in children's primitive-type drawings and paintings that she became a collector of child art. So intrigued is she in clothes she designs many of her own. The owner of one of the most palatial-looking homes in Beverly Hills, she also relaxes at her beach house where she does all the cooking and cleaning.

Little Fanny Borasch of Brooklyn has come a long way. Lucky?

"The worst thing that can happen to you," believes Fanny Brice, "is to get the idea that you are too good, that you can't be improved. And another way to defeat yourself is to say, 'It's all luck. Mine happens to be bad luck.' You make your own luck."

Predictions

With the end of the ball season in the offing, we asked this man who has watched ball clubs from the close range of the broadcasting booth for the last six seasons for his selection of the top teams in the country's several major leagues.

In the Coast League Hattic predicts that the Angels will come out on top, with Seattle, Hollywood and Sacramento trailing in that order. With his associate, Fred Haney, who is a former manager of the St. Louis Browns, Hattic hasn't wavered in his loyalty to that team all season. He thinks the Browns will win the American League and meet the Cardinals, his nomination for top spot in the National League, in the first all-St. Louis World Series in history.

We asked Hattic to name his selections for an All-Star Coast team, and he did it as follows: he put Jim Steiner of Sacramento in the catching spot, Dolph Camilli of Oakland on first base, and Rip Russell, Los Angeles, on second. He'd have Todd Davis of the Hollywood club at short stop and Dick Gyselman of Seattle on third. Frank Kelläher of Hollywood is his choice for left field, Cecil Garriott, Los Angeles, for center field, and Al Libke, Seattle, for right field. For the pitching department Hattic named three ace moundsmen: Tom Sietz, San Francisco; Frank Dasso, San Diego; and Ray Prim, Los Angeles. And there you have it—the cream of the coast.

From the South

Woody Hattic is a Southerner, but he hasn't a trace of Southern accent. He began his radio career in 1930 with station KWKH, Shreveport, Louisiana, where he did announcing over Southern and Southeastern hookups. Then he went to station WWL in New Orleans, where he was

sports and public relations director for four years. In 1942 G. A. Richards, owner of KMPC, wanted to strengthen his station as a sports outlet and persuaded Hattic to come west to California. Now he's director of internal station operations and oversees all sports and special events broadcasts for the "Station of the Stars."

Sportscaster Hattic is a big man, of medium height, has blue eyes and dark brown hair, is 34, and has been married six years. He is apparently indefatigable, for during the baseball season his regular 14-hour day of work doesn't seem to phase him. From 9 in the morning until 11 at night he's on the job—busy with operations management in the daytime and covering the ball games four nights a week. Friday nights he broadcasts the main event at the fights held in the Hollywood Legion Stadium.

Likes People

To revert to the personnel, people and their problems are of great interest to our subject. He likes to hear what other people have to say and is a shrewd appraiser of human affairs. This quality is put to good use in his personnel duties at KMPC.

As might be expected, Hattic's other interests in his leisure hours are sports—tennis, bowling and golf. His avid interest in baseball traces back to three years of the sport when in high school, followed by one year in a semi-pro club.

A gourmet of long standing, Hattic claims his chief hobby is eating. Foods of all nations are his dish. He is especially fond of French cooking and old fashioned Southern barbe-

Rosemary keeps her recipes in a file box, and has selected her three favorite hot-weather dishes to be reprinted here for Radio Life readers.

September Suppers

Three Hot-Weather Dishes As Prepared By "Dr. Christian's" Able Assistant, Rosemary De Camp, and Daughter, Nana



Jellied Salmon Ring

1 cup clam juice (canned)
 3 cups water.
 ¼ cup vinegar
 Cayenne, add to season
 1 heaping tsp. salt

Bring above mixture to boil.

Dissolve two heaping teaspoons of gelatin in a cup of cold water. Place in hot water until dissolved. Add to boiling mixture above.

Set aside to cool.

Wrap three salmon tails separately in cheese cloth. Tie with cord, and drop in kettle of boiling water. Boil for 45 minutes. Lift out, cool. Unwrap and skin. Divide in quarters lengthwise. Remove quarters whole from bone. Lay in bottom of ring mold. Fill with gelatin mixture when it has cooled. Place in ice box until firmly set.

To serve, turn out on platter. Fill center with bowl of cottage cheese and chopped ripe olives. Garnish with egg circles, pepper rings, pimiento, as desired. May serve with lemon juice or tartar sauce.

QUICK MACAROON DESSERT CUP is a delicious finale to a September meal. Start preparing it by dissolving a package of marshmallows and $\frac{1}{2}$ cube of butter in a double boiler, add one 11-ounce package of corn flakes.

Quick Macaroon Dessert Cups

1 package marshmallows
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cube butter

Dissolve in double boiler. Pour over one 11-ounce package corn flakes. Stir. Put large ball of mixture in

center of custard cups. Press quickly against sides of cups while hot. Allow to cool. Remove from cups and fill with berries, custard or ice cream.



ICE CREAM TOPS the dish after luscious berries have been heaped in the marshmallow-corn flake cup. Other fruits such as peaches, cherries, apple sauce may be used instead of berries.



Mixed Green Salad

Thin Roquefort cheese with salad oil. Prepare dressing ($\frac{1}{3}$ vinegar, $\frac{2}{3}$ oil, seasoned with salt, mustard or cayenne). Add to cheese until thoroughly blended.

Pour over bowl of chicory lettuce, celery, green peppers, onions, or other ingredients preferred. Toss in bowl until greens are covered with dressing.

Hyphenated Hollywood Czar

Home Movie Maker Cliff Arquette
Writes, Produces, Directs, Acts,
Scores, Films, Edits, and Projects



HERE IS KHJ's HOBBYIST-FILM CZAR, Cliff Arquette, who writes, produces and projects home films. Two epics from his lab are "Fool's Gold" and "Goon with the Wind."

RADIO Lifers know him as "Ben Willet," the chief citizen of Robert L. Redd's "Pt. Sublime" series on KHJ—Don Lee, but most of Hollywood knows Cliff Arquette as a hyphenated-film-czar: motion picture "writer-producer-director-actor-cameraman-musical scorer-film editor-projectionist." He's the film industry's mogul-tycoon who carries his talents into every department of the business but one.

To date, two films have been turned out by "Arquette Productions, Unincorporated - and - Uninhibited." One is "Fool's Gold," a super-Western-musical, the other is "Isle of Bali," a spectacular South-Sea-Island-romance-musical. Each runs one quarter of an hour in length, credits included. Now in production is "Goon with the Wind," a super-war-between-the-states-epic-musical.

With the assistance of Hollywood's embryo actors and actresses and as-yet-undiscovered-stars, Arquette produces his films as a strictly non-profit, non-taxable venture. Showings are at the homes of Arquette and his Hollywood friends, with an occasional special presentation at a Hollywood-personality-party, such as a going-away-to-the-Marines-Corps-farewell.

Same Problems

Speaking as a producer, Arquette says that his pictures entail about the same problems as any conventional Hollywood release. He finds, on checking, that true to form, the first take is usually the best, and that about fifty per cent of his film winds up on the cutting room floor.

As director, Arquette has an edge on his professional prototype. His actors and actresses are seen but not heard, for no sound tracks are cut during the filming. Such things as

flubs or twerps, short memories for lines and inadvertent comments during shooting don't bother director-Arquette.

Because he is both actor and cameraman, he does run into a difficulty not met by many Hollywood players and craftsmen. Actor-cameraman-Arquette sometimes has to be on the double-quick to get from behind, to in front of the camera, to take his own pictures. If the drama is too demanding, Arquette gets one of the other actors to sub as cameraman for him till that scene is completed.

Musical scoring is done while the picture is being shown, so that's a problem that can be handled without strain between shooting and showing, but when it comes to editing his pictures, Arquette really has a job.

That's because Arquette-productions incorporate the use of ready-made and about-to-be-discarded-by-the-film-companies film as well as the film Arquette as producer-director-cameraman shoots.

How He Makes "Epic"

For example, in making "Goon with the Wind," Arquette will utilize old film from "Birth of a Nation." After viewing the reels on hand from this 1920 opus, selecting what he needs from it, Arquette will write the script from which he'll do his own shooting, and then, when he has his own camera work done, will splice the old film with the new to make the finished product.

Well, not quite finished, for there's the sound to do. Arquette is all the voices in his pictures, relating the dialogue while he runs the projection machine and keeping his eye on the turn tables that broadcast

his music and background sound effects. This part of Arquette-productions really takes talent—the same sort of talent required by a window flap-jack artist who calls his own turns.

While Arquette, projectionist, keeps the reels turning, and as sound-man, keeps the tables turning, as "voice" he keeps the dialogue flowing by taking all the lines from the cowboy calling to a four-of-a-kind to the heroine yodeling to the cowboy. All the sound, music, voices and background effects are fed into a microphone and released through a speaker behind the screen on which the picture is shown.

Deviations

While he does try to follow a prepared script for the dialogue, there have been occasions when Arquette has adapted his lines to the audience at hand, and given them a greater topical interest to the production. Suggestions for such deviations from the script usually come from the audience, a procedure which in conventional picture houses would be described as heckling, but in Arquette-productions-on-review is just good clean fun.

This just about sums up Cliff Arquette's picture taking activities, except for one department into which his talents are not carried. The stay-aways who worry Hollywood's film industry have no role in Arquette-productions, for you'll notice that in the title line describing his motion picture production activities, "writer-producer-director-actor-cameraman-musical scorer-film editor-and-projectionist," there's no credit for the box office hawk—the hyphen stops short of comptroller.

Inge Adams, who is the daughter of a distinguished ethnologist and was brought up in Java, Holland and Austria. She has done impersonations, little theater and Shakespearean acting, and has appeared on many of radio's "Great Plays," plus numerous soap operas and evening shows.

Even Jingle Teams

Lanny and Ginger, two more "Screen Test" aspirants, are the writing-singing combination responsible for hundreds of commercial jingles heard on the airlines. Lanny is also the author of numerous song hits, among them "I Would If I Could But I Can't."

Jazz king pianist Art Tatum, Harlem's contribution to Carnegie Hall, Decca records, and night clubs all over the nation was another recent testee. So was Jean Sincere. "Arsenic and Old Lace" actress, Broadway comedian Billy M. Green; song stylist Kay Lorraine; and ventriloquist Paul Winchell.

Likely film prospects are given a chance to win celluloid stardom in this unique way for several reasons: to avoid needless travel during wartime; to save film, now so vital to the war effort; and to preclude disappointments which may be the outcome of an Eastern artist's trip to Hollywood for a screen test. This way an entertainer's potential screen popularity is fairly well assured before any film is shot, having been tested by audience reaction to his airline screen test and passed the close scrutiny of MGM authorities.

You May Write

Here in Hollywood MGM executives listen in on each broadcast.

As soon as the show goes off the air recordings of the tests are rushed to the West Coast where talent scouts further study the testees' possibilities for stardom. A poll of radio audience reaction also figures in the picture. When listeners like an entertainer's performance they are urged to write in to the studio and say so.

previously spent in announcing names of letter-writers to give his listeners the latest news of the day. He figures a greater majority of his listeners are satisfied that way.

"News coverage, more music and less talk make people happier," he reasoned.

Proof of "Maytime's" popularity has been shown in many ways. Once, Marcelle asked his audience if they would like to hear pianist Frankie Carle make a personal appearance on the show. In reply, he told us, he received a grand total of 11,000 letters!

Mail Response

He has received mail from people in all walks of life, from teen-age high school students, soldiers and war workers, to business men and movie stars. Once, a request asked him to play a tune for a young girl who was going to enter a beauty contest. The girl's name was Rosemary La Planche, a final winner of the nationwide Miss America contest! "She still listens to the show, too," smiled Lou.

Marcelle doesn't confine his radio activities to the "Maytime" program. In fact, he manages to make his weekly schedule so full that even on his day off, he has shows to do. He is announcer on Chef Milani's daily "Kitchen Kollege"; he portrays villains on the "Red Ryder" series. He told us he was radio's original "Fu Manchu," and has done leads in other serials, including "The Adventures of Dan Dunn" and "The Life of Clyde Beatty."

In addition to his varying radio chores, he does the narration for many Warner Brothers films and their "trailers." His voice was heard in such outstanding action movies as "Casablanca," "Background to Danger" and "Destination Tokyo."

His experience for the work he is doing now has been gained through many fields. He did tent shows, rode the "blinds" on roaring freight trains in freezing weather, vagabonded around the country to become better acquainted with all kinds of people. He became a "hooper" in vaudeville, often played "heavies." He was assistant program manager of KMBC, Kansas City, Missouri, and learned to select outstanding talent and to plan listenable airshows. At one time he studied violin for four years, and in another period of his checker-

board past, he earned money as a prize fighter.

His ambitions today are to be a good character man on the screeper, to do the type of roles William Powell does, to produce and star on his radio show.

Grateful to Radio

He is especially grateful to radio for the good deeds it has performed for him and his family. "When my son was born," Lou explained, "Fu Manchu' paid for him. When my wife needed an operation, 'Dan Dunn' paid for it. When we decided to build a home in the valley, 'Maytime' paid for it.

"Things have always seemed to come to me," he went on, "but never when I go out looking for them."

Marcelle's wife, Martha, is a non-professional. They were married in 1936 and have a five-and-a-half-year old son named Ronald Edward. "Ronnie's a real radio fan," Lou smiled. "In fact, he wants to be an announcer."

Lou, himself, listens to the radio avidly, and names the Fibber McGee and Molly show as his favorite. He has a prized record collection. "But it's pretty small," he said. "I don't think of bringing records home because I listen to them all the time at work. My wife's always asking for more."

In addition to his interest in radio and music, Lou likes to play bad-

minton, bridge, gin rummy and poker. He is skilled at building things, and has fashioned an attractive redwood table and chairs for the patio of his home. He also tends to the flowers there. He likes to wear "the oldest clothes" around home, and his Mrs. claims his worst fault is leaving things strewn all over the house. He enjoys dancing, and going out to dinner one night a week.

He has to get up at five a.m. for his "Maytime" show, uses an electric alarm clock to do so, setting it fifteen minutes ahead and sometimes going back to sleep. Once, when the power was cut off during a storm and the alarm clock was rendered useless, his wife sat up all night in order to awaken him on time in the morning.

Water and Pill

Lou told us he never eats breakfast until after his morning show. "I just drink a glass of water and take a vitamin tablet," he said. His wife seldom listens to his programs, reasoning, "A truck driver's wife doesn't ride along with her husband."

Having heard Marcelle's smooth advice to shoppers on the air, we wondered, of course, who does the shopping in his family.

"Not me!" frowned Lou. "My wife does. She's much better at it than I am!"
