

The "Staff" of Radio Life constantly grows, it seems, in everything but intelligence ... In addition to Editor Evelyn, Editorial Director Sudler and the others whose names you see listed regularly on our "flag", there is Shirley Gordon, who has been with us now over a year, and Betty Mills, our most recent addition—both charming young women, and writers of increasing ability.

I think that the growing size of our staff, with its increasing period of service is reflecting itself favorably in the quality of articles we are able to bring to you.

But their lack of complete judgment is evidenced by their request that I, the publisher, write, for you, Radio Life's Christmas message!

What can I, as publisher, say to our readers as the year draws to an end? I can't tell you that the family of Radio Life readers is increasing, because paper scarcity has put a ceiling on the amount of that commodity we can use, and we have religiously curtailed the number of pages per issue and the number of copies printed by the required 25%. Unfortunately, the basic period upon which our curtailment has to be based is the year 1942-the time when Radio Life was enjoying its most rapid growth!

What can I tell you about next year? Only one thing: All the way from the forests of Maine, we have now en route a shipment of extralight paper, weighing only 22 pounds per ream, against the 32-pound paper we are now using in our "News" section. At more than double the cost of our present paper, this lighter stock will make possible our filling some of the many requests for subscriptions from men in the service, and, in addition, we hope, increase the number of c o p i e s available to you through your markets.

Finally, what of the more distant, unrationed postwar future? I can answer that easily, I think. Only today I read an advertisement of the Admiral Radio Corporation, in which it unveiled its post-war model radio-television receiver, a set which will include television with a 51/2 by 8 inch image, FM reception, standard wave reception, short wave, phonograph with automatic record changer, slide-away record storage space, and a home recording aparatus all this in a cabi net 43 inches high, 40 inches wide, and 24 inches deep!"

Radio Life of post-war tomorrow will include for you news of all of these, in page size still 8½ inches wide, 11 inches deep, but unrestricted and unlimited as to thickness or circulation!



HISTLER'S MOTHER was a sweet old lady—don't you believe it! For seven years, illusion-smashing

Cran Chamberlin, writer-creator of CBS's Saturday evening "Don't You Believe It" program, has been entertaining and informing radio listeners by debunking popular beliefs.

"Whistler's mother was a 'battleaxe" debunks Mr. Chamberlin without batting an eyelash. But he always backs up his debunking with facts.

Mrs. Anna McNeill Whistler, mother of the painter, James, was, according to a member of her own family, a very temperamental and difficult person, in contrast to the sweet old soul she is pictured as being in her son's portrait.

On one of his recent "Don't You Believe It" shows, Chamberlin revealed that James Whistler ran away from home because of his mother's violent temper tantrums. Later, when she followed him to Paris, he painted her portrait in a moment of sheer boredom. Upon viewing the finished painting, George Ruskin, famed art critic, declared: "Whistler's mother, on canvas, as in life, is a grim old lady in mournful garb, sitting in a solemn chamber."

George Clemenceau remarked: "Could this be the cat who knocked a wine glass from my hand? She has been portrayed as an angel."

Whistler himself, explained: "One has to try to show one's Mummy as nice as possible, doesn't one?"

"You have to twist your mind to do what I'm doing," grinned Cran Chamberlin when we talked with him about his novel show. "You don't believe anything you're told. You always doubt the facts."

How Ideas Come

Chamberlin gets his initial inspirations for beliefs to debunk in a number of ways. Ideas strike him as he is engaged in a casual conversation, reading a book or a newspaper or listening to some discussion. For instance, on one occasion, he saw a woman on the street with a dachshund. He overheard the woman's friend remark that the dog was "a fine German breed." That set him to thinking. Is the dachshund German, as is generally believed? He found out that it isn't.

Once the idea is born, his research man, Richard Sharpe, sets about to uncover the real story. Chamberlin's own extensive files are explored, in addition to the massive shelves of books at the public library. Chamberlin and Sharpe piece together the real story, bit by bit, from their varied sources of information. They search for startling facts and human interest twists, then work out their method of presentation.

Tobe Reed is the "Don't You Believe It" narrator, with the story dramatizations enacted by such top-flight radio performers as Joe Kearns, Pat McGeehan and Ge Ge Pearson. Reed had worked with Chamberlin on his "Headlines of the Past" airshow preceding the origination of the "Don't You Believe It" series.


Is Mild Person

Writer Chamberlin, who came to Hollywood from San Francisco radio, is a be-spectacled, soft-spoken, somewhat phlegmatic person who seldom expresses a more than mild amount of enthusiasm for anything, but wears a broad grin as he makes fantasies of facts.

Currently, his enthusiasm is at its high point when he talks of two things: A) his tiny six-months-old son, and B) the possibilities of televising his program. He says his "Don't You Believe It" show is set for television.

In the beginning, letters of criticism and contradiction to his expose of public beliefs flooded his office. (Please turn to Page 31)

Also to be continued will be the policy of originating the programs from service camps all over the country. * *



A bomb from a Jap plane landed twenty-fiee feel from a hut in which Roberts and a number of radio and newspaper correspondents were quartered. Rilling one correspondent andblowing Roberts and two others completely out of the hut. Despite wounds in the arms and shoulders. Roberts oblained medical aid for his fellow casuatties.

allies. Not as Clete Roberts, war correspondent, but as Glete Roberts, voice of GI Joe, does the Blue aeuwnnan write the accompanying article. He feels that the things he observed and learned in the Pacific should be brought firsthand to the folks back home, and with this idea in mind, he kindly consented to write this message for the readers of Radio Life.

HIS BRIEF note will have to take the place of the cheery, brightly colored card which I'd be sending to all my friends if I were back there now instead of sweating It out in a foxhole in the Philippines.

You wrote me a letter not so long ago. I remember the day it came. It was the first news from home I'd received in five weeks. When the sergeant called my name and tossed me that envelope, my morale soared upward like a homesick angel. When I sat down on a blasted cocoanut palm to read it, I almost wept at the scene you painted of the preparations you are making for the holidays. I could picture everything: the turkey and cranberry sauce for Thanksgiving, the cool crisp air of fall, the excitement on the children's faces,

A Christmas Message From a Philippine Foxhole

By Clete Roberts

the lucky little kids whose folks can still take them through the toylands of the department stores, take them adventuring in a fairyland that, thank God, still exists there at home. I could see all that as a vision that appeared between the lines. I looked around me at the wreckage of war and prayed that some day again I'd experience that kind of Christmas.

Do you know what Christmas is like out here? I'll tell you. This is my second Christmas under fire. Do you know where I was last Yuletide? Take a look at your map on the wall. Look at the west coast of New Guinea. Down in the southwest corner you'll see a place called Lae and Oro Bay. That's where I was the day before Christmas last year. That's where thousands of American boys were waiting in the black mud and steaming swamps for orders to go aboard ship for an attack against the Jap.

Christmas Eve

All day we lay under the trees, trying to keep out of the broiling sun. We waited while the landing craft were brought in from the sea. We watched them run up on the beaches, open their great bow doors so that we could wade out through the surf and crawl aboard. Our ship finally did reach the beach. We loaded and a few hours later pulled out to sea. There, until night-fall we steamed in circles waiting for the convoy to make up. At dusk our invasion force was ready to steam north for the attack against the Japs at Cape Gloucester on the island of New Britain. That was the dusk of Christmas Eve, your Christmas Eve there at home.

What did we do that evening? We sat around and thought of home. We sprawled on the ship's hot steel deck and cleaned our guns, sharpened our bayonets, tested our flame throwers. We made ready the weapons of death while we talked in low tones about what the folks were doing. Some of us wondered a little. Half-formed thoughts arose in our minds. Why? Why were we here on this side of the world preparing to kill or be killed on Christmas Day? But those were dangerous thoughts. We beat them back. We never voiced them. That's no way to think when you're landing on an enemy-held beach at dawn

I guess most of us felt a little low. Then it happened. We heard the singing. You know how voices carry over water? From another ship, lost in the tropical blackness, we heard the melody of "Silent Night." We sat there saying nothing, listening to the soldiers singing, thankful for the darkness that hid the moisture that crept into our eyes. We heard that song through, then another. "Come All Ye Faithful" was where we joined in, softly at first, just a few of us singing sort of to ourselves, then louder, the chorus swelling as marines in mottled jungle clothing, guns in hand, forgot the tropic night, the war, and the death they might face on Christmas morn.

Men Affected

I think we all felt better for the singing. I know I did. I know that most of us managed to stretch on deck and get a few hours' sleep that we thought an impossibility an hour earlier. I think we could sleep because we'd found some sort of inner peace in the singing of those Christmas carols that reminded us of home and what we were really out there fighting for. Whether we realized it or not, we knew why we were going to land on that Jap-held beach in the morning.

We landed on Cape Gloucester Christmas morning. Some of us died, some lived. Those of us who came through now face another Christmas that will be much the same. Most of us on Christmas Eve this year will be thinking the same kind of thoughts as last year. But instead of New Guinea or New Britain, we're in the Philippines.

You asked me in your letter if I had a Christmas wish.. I have. It's the same wish that's in the mind of every man out here. My wish: May you not forget about us. Try to realize that we are now only reaching the real beginning of our war here in the Pacific. When you gather around the family hearth this Christmas Eve, save a thought for these dogfaces, the doughboys, the thousands of guys like myself who are sleeping in foxholes half filled with water. Think of some of us waking to the howling wind of a hurricane, eating soggy K-rations, wringing the water out of our clothes, then going out to kill Japs on your, on our Christmas Day.

Think of us for a minute, and say a prayer, but don't overdo it. We're trying to make your Christmas happy and we'll be happy, just knowing you are. So don't pull any long faces. Smile, darn ya! Sit around and enjoy yourselves and sing a couple of Christmas carols.

We may be in a foxhole or an invasion barge, but we'll be singing with you.

TATISTICS show that the average G.I. gains fifteen pounds after he joins the Army. Helen Forrest, the songbird G.I.'s like better than food, knows how true those statistics are, for she gained thirteen pounds in one week eating G.I. chow.

"And on me it doesn't look good," said Helen—a statement which would probably get plenty of arguments from boys at the camps in Georgia who came out in droves to hear her sing.

Helen, who parlayed jobs with Artie Shaw, Benny Goodman and Harry James into a top spot on NBC's "Everything for the Boys" show, was something of a dark hor e in the race for G.I. favor until a few months ago when Billboard, the trade maga-

HELEN COMES from non-musical family and has never taken a lesson in her life. Voice teacher whom she visited said, "Just keep on singing the way you always have." Helen got off to a flying start in the musical world. After testing her wings in school plays both in Atlantic City and in New York, where her family moved, she landed on Station WNEW in New York in 1933, singing on five different shows under five different names. The names were Marlene, Bonnie Blue, Helene, Helen Forrest and another, which she can't even remember. At the same time, as Bonnie Blue, she was appearing with Mark Warnow's orchestra, which numbered among its members Jerry Colonna on trombone.

From New York she went to Washington, which she still looks upon as home, to fill a two-weeks engagement at the swank Madrillon Club. She stayed for two years. She had a couple of nibbles during that time. Artie Shaw heard her sing and wanted her to join his band then being formed, but she refused. HE ODDS ARE 10,000 to 1 that it won't happen, but this did. Hoagy Carmichael, one of the most popular of songwriters, gets thousands of amateur music and lyric writers' manuscripts. Almost all of them are returned. But early this fall he received a note from Furniss Peterson, a newspaperman now in a rest cure home (Ansen Rest Home) in Tucson, Arizona. It read, "Dear Mr. Car-michael: I've never written a song before, but I thought that the en-closed lyrics might find favor with you in a song for our boys overseas." Hoagy read it and as he expressed it, "My hair stood on end." He knew he had some beautiful lyrics there, and if he could write a tune to go with them, he'd have the Christmas song hit of the year.

He wrote "My Christmas Song for You," which is well on its way to being one of America's number one tunes. He paid a visit to the Kay Kysers and while there sang the song to Georgia. She and Kay became so enthused that Kay broke all precedent and had his arranger make up the song for the following broadcast, three days later.

Georgia introduced the song on NBC's "College of Musical Knowledge" program on a Wednesday and by Friday morning the Kyser office had received over 400 letters commenting upon the song. From then on, history was made in the song business. The first order put in by the music wholesalers was for 100,000 copies and orders are well past the million mark by now.

GEORGIA INTRODUCED SONG on Wednesday night and by Friday morning the Ryser office had received four hundred letters commenting on the selection. She has sung Hoagy's and Furniss Peterson's "My Christmas Song for You" almost every Wednesday night for the past two months.

Prayer For the People

Gabriel Heatter's Prayer Has Now Become Part of Last Congressional Record

MONG THE records of the Seventy - e I g h t h Congress are the words of a prayer. It was written by Gabriel Heatter and read to his

Mutual Don Lee listeners on 'D'-Day. It became a part of the Congressional Record when Senator Carl A. Hatch of New Mexico read it on the floor of the Senate and has since become a part of thousands of letters sent to the boys who took part in that invasion and the battles that followed it.

These are the words of a man who likes to call himself "an average American" speaking to average Americans:

"Merciful God, watch over these men. They march in a crusade for humanity and freedom. These are not men of war. These are not men of hate or vengeance. These are humble men. Men whose hearts will never forget pity or mercy. They fight to give all the children of men peace on earth. They fight to banish tyranny and fear. Merciful God, our homes are empty—our hearts are torn with this desperate vigil.

"Into your care we give our prayers —our lives—our sons—all that we are and can ever hope to be on this eartn —send these men back to us—home to us—for they are part of man's spirit—of man's dream of a world which is free and where kindness lives—watch over these men—we who are meek and humble—we whose faith is_strong ask this. Send these men back to our hearts and our homes—this is our oraver Gabriel Heatter first became known to the radio audience about eleven years before he wrote this moving prayer, and is said never to. have missed a single broadcast in all that time. For the past seven years he has been on the air five nights or more a week, fifty-two weeks a year! And for three years, he shouldered the additional task as conductor of "We, the People."

Newspaper Background

His first job was in 1907 as a copy boy on Brooklyn's old Times-Union, from which he advanced to fullfledged reporter in the courts, City Hall, and finally to cover New York state news at Albany. A born newspaperman, however, Heatter went with the New York Journal, later becoming London correspondent for the old New York Tribune, serving some time in Britain and the continent.

Returning to the United States, he became a successful freelance journalist and writer, winning for his article, "Children of the Crucible," the equivalent of the Pulitzer Prize of that day. His entry into radio came as a result of one of these articles, which he was asked by a leading broadcasting executive to deliver on the air. Before leaving the studio on that day, Heatter became a radio news commentator, and is widely credited with having developed the technique of news—as it is known today.

Within the radio world itself, he is one of its best-liked personalities and in the homes of his legion of fans. he likes to express the sentiments of the man he is among them—"An average American."

again later on, and again offered Helen a job. This time she took it on a hunch, she says, because Ozzie Nelson also made her an offer at the same time.

"I played my hunch and joined Artie," Helen says.

Hunches Began

That was the beginning of a series of hunches, which have come regularly ever since at two-year intervals. She went with Shaw in 1937. Two years later she joined Goodman, at a substantially larger figure than he could have got her for when he heard her in Washington. Soon after she joined the Goodman band, Harry James left it to start his own orchestra. It was not a successful band at first; in fact, after a few months, odds were that Harry the Horn would be back in the Goodman fold again before very long. However, Harry stuck it out. At the end of two years Helen Forrest had another hunch. She left Goodman and joined James. Within a matter of weeks the James band was a sensation, and Helen Forrest became a sensation along with it.

Her records with the band made history—"I Don't Want To Walk Without You," "I've Heard That Song Before," "I Had The Craziest Dream" and many others.

"After a couple of years, though, I figured that I had gone about as far as I could singing with bands," says Helen. "I had another hunch, this time to go out on my own."

So that was it. On her final radio show with Harry James, she sang "How Sweet You Are" and ran off the stage crying.

Nothing Like It

The following week she opened at the Orpheum in Los Angeles, and her opening was like none that theater has ever seen before or since. Somebody sent her a giant horseshoe made of roses. When she finished her act and was taking her bows, Martha Raye came crawling onto the stage on hands and knees with the horseshoe over her shoulders, followed by Carole Landis and Dick Haymes, The four joined voices in an impromptu song which veteran Orpheum-goers are still talking about.

Helen's next stop was the Roxy in New York, where she saw her name in lights on Broadway for the first time. Then she began working her way West again, and here she is.

She has been too busy lately to have any more hunches. Besides her work on NBC, she has appeared many times on "Command Performance" and the other War Department overseas shows; she is a frequent visitor at the Hollywood Canteen; she is always available for a war bond appearance; and she has made three Culture Rengerer Co. motion pictures. Then, of course, there are her camp trips, including the one to Georgia, on which she gained thirteen pounds in one week. On her trips since then, she has kept herself to a strict diet, no matter how tempting the G.I. chow.

Her favorite story concerns the Georgia trip. She did one of her shows in a pine grove from the back of an Army truck with soldiers crowded about her and far back into the woods. As she sang, she became conscious of a commotion in the rear of the crowd. The public relations officer who was with her noticed it, too, and when she finished her song he called out, "What's the matter back there?"

From deep in the pines came a voice in reply, "I can't see the rorrest for the trees!"


