

Gay Writer Turns Comic

Fred Brady Pens Own Jokes, Wrote His Own Screen Test, Pounds Typewriter All Night But Considers Himself Lazy

HAT'S ONE THING about me," pointed out Fred Brady, "I've always got to be doing something."
At the moment, in the cramped office quarters we had camped in to conduct our interview, he was pacing back and forth across the limited floor space with quick, nervous strides. It was less than a week before the premier airing of the new Gracie Fields show on which he appears as the program's featured comic. He had been working all morning on script changes.

"I got a swell gag I want to use for the opening show," he told us excitedly. "It goes like this: It's the day after the election, and there's Dewey sitting in the White House. He's writing a postcard. It says, 'Having wonderful time. Wish I were here!" Brady grinned, and resumed his pacing back and forth.

"Do you pace the floor like this when you're writing your material?" we questioned him.

"Yeah, just about," he acknowledged, "stopping just long enough to type."

Fred Brady is the gag writer who decided he could deliver his own jokes. He proved his point when he wrote himself into the script of "Uncle Walter's Doghouse," the Chicago airshow on which he debuted as a radio funnyman. Since then, he has been starred on his own program for several series—once to take over Kate Smith's air time during the summer, and in 1943, to replace Bob Burns in the hot weather months.

In appearance, Brady is a towering, muscular six feet, one inch, one hundred and eighty pounds. He is youthful, fair-complexioned, has blond hair and blue eyes. He loves sports,

plays tennis or golf almost every day, and likes horseback riding and swimming as well.

"I love California," he beamed, adding in exaggerated golden, pear-shaped tones, "because I am such an outdoor man."

Was Bread-Winner

Brady was born in New York City and got his start in show business there, as an actor with the Greenwich Village Players. Before that, he had attended Columbia University, and worked at odd jobs (everything from ditch-digging to aerial photography). His father, a New York stock broker, died in 1929, and Fred was called upon to support his family—his mother, twin sisters and a brother.

No other member of Brady's family is theatrically-inclined. "They all think I'm terrific," smiled the writer-comedian in answer to our query. "In fact," he added, "if all my audiences were as enthusiastic as my mother, I'd be the biggest success in the business."

While he was performing with the Greenwich Village group, Brady began batting out radio scripts—eventually as many as five a week. "I've always written, ever since L was a youngster," he told us. "I used to write poetry—serious stuff."

But his radio-writing was comedy material, and soon he followed a suggestion to try out as a scribe for an up-and-coming young comic named Red Skelton. That writing chore took him to Chicago, and in time, to that spot at the mike on "Uncle Walter's Doghouse:"

Movie scouts spotted Brady too,

and in 1942, Fred wrote his own screen test and won a film contract that sent him to Hollywood. Moviegoers have viewed him in such screen offerings as "Stage Door Canteen," "Swing Shift Maisie" and "Stepping Out"

His initial scene before the cameras found him panicky, Brady admits, but since then, he hasn't been nervous. As for going out on a stage for a radio show, "It's my life's blood," he enthused, "Getting out in front of an audience is great!"

His Ambitions

Brady has two chief aspirations in regard to his work: A) to develop his character of "Rhinestone Fred Brady" (an unreasonable facsimile of Diamond Jim) on the air in situation comedy, and B) to sell the screen plays he is now preparing.

As for a personal ambition, he has thoughts of a Hollywood home: "I'm going to get a swimming pool, and build something around it."

Brady admits a passion for clothes. "I love to buy 'em," he exclaimed. But he never wears a hat.

"Somebody once told me I'd go bald if I wore a hat, so I never put one on my head," he went on, rubbing his fingers through his luxuriant red-blond thatch. "My hair hasn't stopped growing since!"

Fred Brady has two youngsters—five-year-old Fred, Jr., and three-year-old Christine. He calls his daughter "a little doll," and says his son is "the spittin' image" of himself. "He is like me in a lot of ways," Fred continued proudly. "He already swims, rides a horse and likes sports."

"Is he a comedian?" we asked.

"He sure is!" beamed Brady.

Fred Jr. has one passion his father doesn't share, however. "He's hathappy," smiled Fred Sr. "He has every sort of hat in the world, and loves them all." Fred told us he loves to buy clothes for his youngsters, too.

Asked to confess his eccentricity, Brady admitted that he can never throw away a piece of paper. "I always think there might be a joke on it," he told us. "I keep an extensive file."

Brady does most of his writing at night. When he's working on a picture, he has to be up at seven in the morning, but when he's not making movies, he added quickly, "Don't ring me before eleven!"

He eats just two meals a day—always bacon and eggs for breakfast, "Something simple for supper," added Fred. "Say—just a steak."

Asked if he would call himself lazy, Brady answered, "Yeah, I sure am, although I seem to be working a lot of the time. And when I'm not working, I'm out running around a tennis court or a golf course.

"Hey, whaddayuh know," he did a double-take, "maybe I'm not lazy."

Thirty Five Girls With No Secrets

NE MAN, who thinks one woman can be difficult, should change places with Phil Spitalny, director of thirty-five girls in the "Hour of Charm" orchestra.

One man, who blows his top when the little lady picks up a bargain sale dress, should see Spitalny's ladies spend (as did the Charmers recently), a cool \$18,000 on one set of evening dresses.

But wait, gentlemen. Don't pity Phil Spitalny. He likes his work and he's making a fair-sized pile of money in it. "It's easier to handle thirty-five women than one," he remarked knowingly the other day while your Radio Life reporter was watching the orchestra play before the cameras at Universal City. "With one woman, it's a personal matter," he continued. "With thirty-five, it's commercial."

Rugged-faced Spitalny, who came to America from Odessa, Russia, when he was nine, won't tell his age but says he has been in the entertainment business since he was eight years old, has hit upon something unique and certainly moneymaking in his all-girl orchestra enterprise. While maestros with male music-makers have seen the draft knock irreparable holes in their organizations, Spitalny has rolled on unworried with an abundance of expert material at hand—in fact, he's

increased the number of girls in his orchestra.

Excel Men

Commenting on the superiority of women musicians over men, he continued: "Girls are loyal. They never come late to rehearsal. They don't drink as much as men. They take more pride in their success than men."

The orchestra, which has been in operation for eleven years, still has five of its charter members: Evelyn of the "magic violin," who is also assistant manager; Velma, first trombonist; Jenny, assistant concert mistress; Maria, trumpet player; and Grace, guitarist.

Smart Spitalny has handed the government of the girls over to the girls themselves. They have a committee of five which passes on important matters and which decides whether or not the girls may date. "They know where a girl's going to eat and who with," said Spitalny. "Everybody knows where everybody is tonight."

Own Stock

Each girl owns stock in the enterprise, her number of shares being commensurate with her position. For example, Evelyn owns four shares, the drummer has three; at the end of the year the stockholders cut their



melon-last year it was \$40,000 to be apportioned among the group. Replenishing the exchequer are radio appearances, movies (each girl re-ceived \$270 for her work at Universal) and concert appearances (they cleaned up a gross of \$101,000 during a twelve-week tour last season).

On the other side of the ledger from money and glamor are fatig-uing travel and interminable re-hearsals. The girls have done fiftyeight camp shows from coast to coast. It usually takes two train cars to accommodate the large organization and the 200 pieces of bag-gage generally require a special car. When they are on long trips, the orchestra members must practice energetically, especially the brasses, who must keep up their wind. The powder room is a favorite place for such rehearsing.

The amount of rehearsing depends, of course, on the show. "There's no limit until its perfect," Spitalny said grimly. "Usually five to fifteen hours."

He chooses the numbers compris-ing each week's program. "My style of music is between symphonic and popular," he stated. "It's music ev-erybody would like — even bobby sock kids can't say they don't like it. This style is the conclusion of all my experience. At one time I wanted to play a variety program. Open with a symphonic number and then do 'Wabash Blues'. We've tried all popular programs, and all musical comedy programs. But from the mail and from our rating, which, I belive, is tops for a musical program, I've come to the present style, which also includes never playing an un-accepted number" (one not on the 'Hit Parade' or otherwise known).

Arranging the numbers is the work of three of the girls in the or-chestra. Limit of the difficulty of arrangements, said Spitalny, is not the skilfulness of the musicians, who are all tops, but the selections themselves, which are usually simple. "I like to keep things simple," the maestro said. "That's why I ask the girls to wear their hair down no fancy up-swept hair-does."

The group now boasts a tremendous musical library, one of the largest in existence, according to Spitalny. "We repeat numbers only for definite reasons," he observed. "A few Sundays ago, we switched (Please turn to Page 30)



Young Larry Stevens Never Had A Lesson in His Life, Thinks He Owes Singing Break to Luck



Sunday, 4:00, 9:00 p. m. NBC-KFI HEY SAY that the story of Cinderella only happened in a fairy tale-

and that was a very long time ago. They say that Hollywood is no land of magic-that's another fairy tale, too, dreamed up by press agents. But somebody forgot to account for the story (all true too!) of young Larry Stevens, Jack Benny's new singing discovery.

Larry is the twenty-one-year-old. handsome six-footer who was introduced to the coast-to-coast Jack Benny audience early in November. His script introduction was as Aladdin-like as his real introduction to the ether waves. Guesting that night on the Lucky Strike show was Dun-ninger, the "master mentalist.". Written into the script as reading Benny's mind and assuming Jack was looking for a singer to replace Dennis

Day, now in the United States Navy, Dunninger advised him to hasten to a filling station at the corner of Third and La Cienega where he would find the answer to his prayers. Jack, accordingly, found singer Stevens as the station's attendant, and listen-ing to him sing while he worked, offered him the job, Poor Jack had been 'auditioning' everybody on the program, even John Charles Thomas and Frank Sinatra, only to find they were already working. Funny as this may seem, It's even funnier to realize that Larry's introduction in the script was almost based on truth. It nearly happened that way.

"Golly, it's so wonderful, I have to pinch myself to see if I'm awake," enthused Larry. "I just can't imagine this happening to me—why, I'm just like anybody else."

Is Different

Looking at Larry over a small table

in one of NBC's deserted script rooms, Radio Life decided that in spite of what he says, he isn't like everybody else. He's different because of what he calls his "gift"—his high baritone voice. He's different because he is that success story that happens to one out of a million people.

On February 23, 1923, Larry was born in San Francisco. When he was a one-year-old, his family moved to Los Angeles, where they have lived ever since. Larry, his brother, mother and father, used to form their own quartet and sing for pleasure. Although Larry never had any music lessons, his mother, who once sang professionally, encouraged him to develop his voice.

He lived a very normal childhood, went to Fairfax High in Los Angeles, where he was more interested in atnletics than singing, and appeared in all of the school's extravaganzas. From high school he went to work for the Turnabout Theater, opening with it in 1941 as a puppeteer. Atthough he longed for a singing career, he was contented to wait and gain experience through singing with the Turnabout's chorus. This lasted for a year. Then came the manager-ship of a filling station—yes, the same one at Third and La Cienega. This lasted until he was called into the Army Air Forces in 1943. He was discharged seven months later when his father died, and he became the sole support of his family.

Happened at Grove

Larry went to work in a defense plant—and then it happened! One night he and a party of friends went to the Cocoanut Grove where maestro Freddy Martin conducted a weekly bond drive, "Melodies for Uncle Sam," via the Blue network. If one bought a bond he was entitled to perform in any way he wanted. Larry sang—and a star was born. The audience wouldn't let him sit down, and he sang encore after encore. Agent Lou Irwin asked him if he would like to meet Mary Livingstone, who was in charge of finding a new singer for the Benny show. Mary liked Larry and wanted Jack, who had just returned from overseas, to hear him. He was signed and now fills the singing spot.

"Mary and Jack are the most wonderful people in the world. I owe everything to them," he smiled. "I have always listened to their program and finding myself a part of it is almost unbelievable.'

Asked if he were scared on his opening night, he laughed and said "Sure," but guessed everything went well. With the exception of the fact that he is a high baritone instead of a tenor, he fills the traditional role of Benny singers. He is red-headed, has blue eyes, and weighs 165 pounds.



For Over Thirteen Years KFAC's Oldest Recorded Program Has Brought Public Music It Loves

Monday-Saturday, 4 p. m. KFAC

ACH DAY music lovers receive the crisp, concise commentary of Dr. Carl Weker on KFAC's oldest recorded program of classical music, "Musical Masterpieces." Perhaps here is one of the foremost authorities on musical education, a man who knows his music as well as the rest of us know our ABC's—but do you know what Dr. Weker likes to call himself—"The poor man's Milton Cross"?

Last October station manager Cal Smith jokingly advertised for a "reasonable facsimile" of Mr. Cross to conduct the daily doings of "Musical Masterpieces." Dr. Weker seriously answered the ad and explains that upon filling the requisites he has become the "poor man's Cross."

Since 1931, when "Musical Mas-

terpieces" began to break precedents by starting a trend toward presenting recorded works of the old masters rather than modern music, it has accumulated fans who know they can count on hearing the music they want.

KFAC regards "Musical Masterpieces" as the forerunner of recorded classical programs for local stations in the city. Its popularity has grown throughout the years and not long ago the station received its first proof of this. A San Francisco agency wanted to buy the "Masterpiece's" time, but before the station would sell they asked the public's opinion on the matter. Thousands of telephone messages and letters of protest poured in; convincing the station it would be foolish to relinquish the time.

It was not until the advent of the combination of Dr. Weker and the

sponsorship of the Slavick Jewelry Company that KFAC consented to sell its time. And in turn, through the courtesy of KFAC and the sponsor, Dr. We ke r found a channel through which to express his thoughts in musical form on the air.

His Appearance

The listening audience might visualize the eminent Dr. Weker to be a somber-faced, reserved individual, but Radio Life. calling on him at his Hollywood Boulevard office, found him possessed of an unmatchable sense of humor. He is tall, bespectacled, has dark hair streaked with gray, and is a constant smoker.

He actually started his musical career at the age of ten with aspirations to be a concert violinist. But with the paralyzation of one finger his interests turned to conducting. Upon graduation from the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music he took up the duties of a symphony conductor at Grand Rapids, Michigan. After seventeen years of constant conducting, he gave up the work and devoted his time to "musical education."

"Music belongs to all people. It is a democratic art and should be accepted as such. I should like to see everyone enjoy music for itself and not for its fine settings. Highly paid artists barricaded behind admittance fees are not good for the art."

He went on to explain that it was this factor which appealed to him a b o u t "Musical Masterpieces." He endeavors to present the most enlightening facts in the briefest possible time.

He feels that a person who enjoys popular melodies possesses as much appreciation of music as the symphony lover. He intends to present on the program some of the most representative contemporary works.

Some Pop Tunes Fine

Dr. Weker smiled and said, "Of course I fail to see the elements of beauty in such pieces as "Cow Cow Boogie" or "Lost My Sugar In Salt Lake City" but I do find "Star Dust" as hauntingly beautiful as the opening strains of Schubert's "Unfinished Symphony." He thinks that someday "Star Dust" will be given a symphonic treatment and made to live forever as an example of American folk music.

In addition to his various activities in musical education, Dr. Weker is the managing Director of the Hollywood Bowl Association. He has been in California only since 1940, but looks upon it as the "finest place in the world." He claims that for thirty years he has been contriving to make California his home. "Even if it meant giving up everything and

amazed airlane audience with her dual portrayal of Arch Oboler's presentation of "Alter Ego," but, in that instance, the two voices she employed could be as different as night and day. The "Alter Ego" script presented a problem in one scene in which Miss Davis was to be heard crying with one voice while talking with the other. On that occasion, Lurene Tuttle was called in as a voice double to do the crying.

Now a radio veteran, recognized as one of the airlanes' most accomplished actresses, Lurene encountered a similar problem in the script of "Death Sees Double" when one sister is heard laughing hysterically while the other is talking. Producer Allen solved the situation by having Lurene record the laughter before the broadcast—the recording to be skilfully inserted on cue by the soundman, Berne Surrey. Sound girl Becky Barnes assisted Surrey during the show, and supplied the sound of feminine footsteps in the initial murder scene when one sister kills the

Particularly difficult for actress Tuttle was this death scene, during which, with the pitch of her voice and the position of her head in rela-tion to the microphone, she had to switch the sisters' personalities—making the previously positive character become the negative one, as the weaker girl became the stronger of the two. In enacting the murder, Lurene found the death struggle of the victim written on the bottom of one page of her script, while the dialogue of the triumphant murderess continued immediately at the top of the next sheet.

The Impossible

"I don't think I can manage," the actress protested, "to choke myself and turn the page at the same time." So the sheets were stapled together to form one long page. In all, Miss Tuttle did six pages of solid, rapid dialogue with herself!

She worked with two microphones, holding her mouth close to one for the role of "Martha," turning her face toward the other mike, placed a few feet away, when speaking as "Mona." The intricate task of engineering the show was handled by Robert Anderson.

The dual role necessitated a fivehour rehearsal for the broadcast, in contrast to the usual three hours spent in preparation for a "Whistler" airing.

"The extra two hours," smiled producer Allen, "were spent in seeing if this could be done."

Memorable Broadcast

The girls still talk about their broadcast from the North Carolina as their most impressive. It took place on the deck the evening before the vessel was launched.

Members of the orchestra have proved themselves fine bond saleswomen. In Cleveland they sold \$30,000,000 before they performed their concert. Each girl was alloted a quota of \$100,000 and had to make her amount before the program began. One little musician couldn't sell past \$40,000.

"Who'll help out this girl?", Spitalny pleaded.

Up shot a hand in the center of the auditorium and up spoke a gen-tleman: "I'll buy \$60,000 and let's get on with the music!"

Some of the girls' appearances have been at hospitals where wounded from World War II are trying to piece broken bodies together again. One of the most touching experiences occurred at Treasure Island where a Negro whispered to Evelyn: "If you'll just play 'Deep River' for me I'll be ready to die.

Stern Taskmaster

Although he is a strict taskmaster. Spitalny is obviously proud of his orchestra's achievements. He told about one girl, his tuba player, Jan Baker, who can perform on sixteen instruments; and about Ruth Winchell who can play "practically every instrument." In order to maintain the maximum of efficiency, Spitalny bars all visitors from rehearsal and how amazed he was to discover that Radio Life had sat through one session after obtaining authority from a certified source! "Why, I've even kicked a big NBC executive out of rehearsal," Spitalny said vehemently.

The maestro is an avid collector of ties and has more than two thousand in his wardrobe. He is especially fond of neckwear made specifically for him by a New York haberdasher (cost, \$25) and was wearing one specimen the day Radio Life interviewed him. It was a handsome brown satin figured in red with the various instruments in his orchestra. Speaking of ties reminded Spitalny of the blue one with gray stripes he was sporting the other day on the set. Members of the company broke for lunch and when they returned, the leader couldn't find his tie. The entire group of two hundred hunted for half an hour, at a cost of thousands of dollars in waiting time, until a similar tie was unearthed that would allow the shooting to proceed without a discrep-

hard-working man, Spitalny claims he has no secretary, no agent, and no lawyer. He hates to write letters, usually using the phone or a wire. "I have written only ten let-ters in my life," he laughed.

He stands travel well, because he says he is hardy and seldom sick. "But I was sick the other night after my birthday," he grimaced. 
