About that nickname, Jo told us that this is how it happened. It seems Miss Gilbert is very fond of slack suits. She would wear them everywhere until her friends began kidding her about never dressing up. She felt she had had enough of their joshing and donned a flat tam in matching color with every slack outfit. "See, I'm dressed now," she laughed. But her friends, determined to have the last word, wouldn't give up. "Ah, ha," they taunted, "who do you think you are, Lili Marlene?" And with her long dark hair, big black eyes and French beret she did look like their mental picture of the now-famous Lili.

"So you see," Jo said, smiling, "that's how it has been ever since. My 'new name' has been shortened

until it sounds something like 'Lee-lee'."

Is Musical, Mechanical

Besides acting, Jo loves to tinker and to write music. The former is an ability, if you can call it that, to take apart her car, her clock, or her radio. The latter, she explains, might be a hangover from her early love of music. She is quite good at both, and recently built herself a radio out of spare parts.

Jo lives at the Studio Club in Hollywood. She was born in Chicago, but "adores" California. She can't resist spicy food, although, she explains, "I know it will make me sick."

She is pretty enough to be in pictures and hopes to get a chance to do a character part in one some day. She is a great collector of things, among which are rare old books and gigantic albums of all types of music. She can't understand anyone not liking pets.

She introduces everyone to her constant companion, Sgt. Muttgomery. If you haven't met the Sergeant, he is her ten-year-old part terrier, part bulldog. Jo has had him since he was six weeks old and regards him as one of the dearest members of her family.

"You know," she said, "I think he is the only one who really likes my 'Lili' garb. He completely ignores me when I am 'dressed up.' Gosh, a girl has to please her dog!"

What You Don't Know About Danny

Danny Kaye Is Radio's New Sensation; In Person, He Fancies Himself a Cook, Plays Practical Jokes, Is a Shower-Singer, Fish-Eater and Feet-Massager

Saturday, 5:00 p.m.
CBS-KNX

THIS MONTH brought to radio-dialers what they've been waiting for—Danny Kaye! The sensation of Broadway in "Lady in the Dark" and "Let's Face It" and the delight of movie-goers in "Up In Arms" and the soon-to-be-released "Wonder Man," Danny Kaye has, at long last, come to radio as the versatile star of his own CBS Saturday night, high-budget variety show, directed by Dick Mack and featuring the music of Harry James and his orchestra.

Danny Kaye (his real name is David Daniel Kominski, but his brother made "Kaye" their legal family name twenty years ago) is six feet, one inch of hard muscle, topped by bright blue eyes and a thick thatch of yellow hair. After years of knocking about the world in vaudeville, he was discovered in 1939, at a rehearsal for a little theater revue, by the girl who is now his wife, Sylvia Fine. It is she who writes most of his special material.

When in Hollywood, Danny and Sylvia live in a house rented from the Chester Morrises. The house has a patio and a swimming pool (Danny calls it "the backyard"), where the comedian swims in warm weather. He took up golf just last year, but plays in the eighties. When he's filming a picture and has an hour's free time between scenes, he rushes to the nearby golf course to shoot a few holes.

In addition to golf, Kaye likes to bat a ball or play "catch" as often as possible to keep himself in trim for his strenuous song and laugh routines. He is not a meat-eater, doesn't like steak, prefers fowl. But he frequently goes on food binges

swer to any one of the questions being enacted by the dramatic cast or orchestrated by musicmaster Ray Bloch and his men, all he has to do is press the buzzer and the show is stopped while he takes his chance at answering for prize money. Each contestant can take part in every question, no matter how many times he wins. Of course, if he tries an answer and it's wrong, he drops out of the running on that particular question, the dramatization continues and the other contestants try their skill and wit.

Winners Spurred

It's interesting to note that a victory on one of the early races gives a contestant courage to try the succeeding games. One victory seems to breed courage. For three successive weeks, during last October, winners in the first event have gone on to win the next two. Incidentally, in all three cases, the contestants were evidence that an important part of every "Quick as a Flash" guest lineup is from the ranks of servicemen and women. These three three-time winners were all in uniform—one was a sailor, one a soldier and one a marine.

There's another distinctive touch to "Quick as a Flash" that has earned it the tag of "radio's class quiz." On race number five, the "Sponsor's Handicap," whodunit questions are featured and guest stars are invited to play the leading roles in the dramatizations that furnish clues to

Jarvis' Poll

Woody Herman's orchestra has been chosen as most popular music group in radio's third annual popularity contest, it was announced last week by Al Jarvis, originator of KFWB's "Make-Believe Ballroom" who conducted the balloting.

David Street was winner in the male vocalist division, Helen Forrest in the female vocalist group, and the King Cole Trio in the novelty group classification.

Jarvis made the announcement of the winners as he left for New York to present the orchestra award to Woody Herman on the stage of the Paramount Theater in the metropolis. Simultaneously he revealed that at Herman's request, the plaque awarded annually to the poll winner will be inscribed with the name of Major Glenn Miller, reported missing in action. Miller placed fourth in the voting, but as a mark of respect to the missing orchestra leader, Herman conceded first place to him.

Second place in the orchestra division went to Spade Cooley and third to Freddy Martin. Bing Crosby won second place in the male vocalist com-

petition, with Dick Haymes ranking third. Frank Sinatra was fifth, trailing Andy Russell. Emma Lou Welch and Billy Anderson rated second and third, respectively, in the female vocalist group.

Second place in the novelty group competition went to Juan Rolando, with Six Hits and a Miss third.

Idea of the annual popularity contest originated with Jarvis. Votes cost ten cents each, all proceeds going to the Children's Hospital.

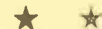

attaching himself to one outfit and wearing it to shreds. He loves sports clothes, never wears a hat and loathes overcoats. He hates veils and earrings on women, so Sylvia has given them up. In return, he eschews bow-ties for her sake. He buys expensive suits and neckties, likes "Tweed" toilet-water, sleeps in striped silk pajamas.

He loves to go to the opera and the ballet, and is a serious student of the theater. He is constantly gathering material for his satires from varied sources, and is fascinated by "drunks," following them on the streets to study their mannerisms. Someday, however, Danny Kaye hopes to do some serious acting.

He always wanted to be a doctor, will drop anything to watch a case of difficult surgery, and prides himself on his ability to massage feet!

Danny has most of his money invested in bonds, and lives on a relatively small allowance. He and Sylvia borrow from one another when they run short, and on one occasion last winter, Sylvia couldn't imagine why he never seemed to have even enough money to go to the movies. Then, one day, she discovered he had saved two hundred dollars in an old shoe to buy her a garnet necklace. He loves to give presents at odd times, rather than the customary occasions.

Are Opposites

He and his wife are complete opposites, and they think that is what makes them so happy. She is even-tempered, he's volatile. She is analytical, Danny goes by instinct. She likes steak, Danny goes for lobster. She walks, Danny runs. She talks, Danny listens. But they laugh at the same things and like the same people.

The Kayes are admittedly bad letter-writers, but they indulge in long-distance calls to their many friends in the middle of the night when the lines are clear.

Danny fancies himself a great cook, and frequently takes over the kitchen with great flourish. He and Sylvia tune in to the radio regularly for newscasts, and are great fans of the platter-spinners, believing that radio doesn't fully recognize the latter's importance.

Danny abhors gambling, smokes little and can't take more than a glass or two of beer. His two pet aversions are badly-informed "arm-chair generals," and laymen who insist on giving unsolicited theatrical advice.

Is Shower-Singer

A shower-singer, mostly operatic, he takes great delight in singing, note for note, famous coloratura cadenzas. Gifted with an infallible

ear, he convulses musicians with his ability deliberately to sing a quarter tone flat or sharp. He loves the sound and rhythm of foreign languages and can double-talk them perfectly although he doesn't understand a word of them. He has given some of his best performances on the spur of the moment for his family and intimate friends, or for his household help. Sylvia says that much of his best material has been inspired by the things he has done spontaneously in somebody's living room.

The comedian knocks himself out doing camp shows and benefit performances. Recently, two years of it landed him in the hospital three times. He likes to keep on the go, but makes sure he gets his sleep when he is working on a film. He often falls into bed in a state of complete exhaustion, but wakes up in the morning amazingly re-charged with energy.

He is seldom talkative, often moody. His spirals are usually either very high or very low. He loves to play practical jokes on his friends, with the aid of the studio make-up department. Disguised as an odd character, he rings his friends' doorbells, posing as a long-lost uncle, a Russian refugee or an escaped lunatic. Once, in the guise of an undesirable hobo, he knocked on the back door of his own house and scared the cook so badly that she shrieked for Mrs. Kaye.

His friends and family are fast learning, however, that when a bedraggled, blood-smearing tramp appears on their doorstep, it's only "Danny again!"

Ideal Quizzer

Because he has been a quiz master for many years on many radio programs, Ken Roberts looked upon "Quick as a Flash" as the perfected quiz show. There is the spirit of competition equitably developed, there's good music, fun, suspense, and of course, wonderful radio drama in each question enacted by a cast of five or six persons. And then, there is the famous guest from other radio mystery shows for the climax event.

"And right there," Roberts pointed out when the series first began, "was a point we never took into consideration. One of our very first guests came up to me after the show was over and ruefully explained that he knew the answer several minutes before the winner of the event rang the buzzer. Naturally, I asked him why he didn't signal that he was ready with the answer. And what do you suppose he said? Well, believe it or not, he told me he was enjoying the dramatization so much he hated to end it by solving the problem. He just listened so long it cost him the \$10 prize.

"And then, there was the poor girl who flashed the buzzer on one of the other events, and then was so startled by the noise that she forgot the answer and had to forfeit her chance at that prize."

Smart "Cookie"

GO "COOKIE" FAIRCHILD, Sunday is just another work day. With his arranger, he toils at home setting up the music for the Tuesday Ginny Simms' show, of which he is musical director. Parked on the piano bench, he improvises hour after hour as his deft arranger translates the musical sounds into little black notes on huge sheets of yellow paper. Monday, "Cookie" supervises the musical backgrounds during the show's first rehearsal; Tuesday, he works with the orchestra from late morning until mid-afternoon; does two broadcasts. Friday afternoon he devotes to a conference with Ginny and Producer Cal Kuhl when the following week's songs are chosen. His remaining time is allocated to being musical director at Universal Studios, to composing, and to cutting records. "In between," he observed facetiously, "I loll at Palm Springs or go to the races!"

Seldom it is that he finds himself in his favorite pose: a book, a pair of soft slippers, a pipe, and a crackling fire, for Edgar Fairchild, a short, compactly-built, nervously ambitious man, is seldom relaxed. "My wife and little girl have a picture of me at home in case they forget what I look like," "Cookie" remarked jocosely, then continued soberly, "There are very few pleasures in life—your home, your family, and your work. Yes, I count my work as a pleasure. I'm unhappy if I'm inactive."

How Nickname Started

Edgar (who has borne the nickname, "Cookie," since he was two days old and who received the catchy appellation when his five-year-old brother looked at Baby Edgar and exclaimed, "Why, his eyes look like cookies") began bustling around a keyboard when he was five years old. By that time, his big brother was an unwilling piano pupil, but "Cookie," the ardent musician, was picking out his brother's pieces on a toy piano. Sizing up the situation, the music teacher informed the Fair-

childs, "You're teaching the wrong boy."

Today, the brother is a smart business man and "Cookie" is a smart musician. "When I was fourteen I played Rubenstein's Concerto with the New York orchestra," he recalls. "When I was fifteen, I played Beethoven. When I was sixteen, I played Tchaikovsky."

Turns to Popular

For several years, "Cookie" was strictly a highbrow concert pianist. It wasn't until he became Recording Manager and Education Director for Ampico that he was forced to take cognizance of another kind of music—popular. "I engaged in an intensive campaign—and my only campaign—to familiarize myself with the kind of music played in night clubs and dance halls," he remembers. "I haunted the places to find out what was cooking in this other new world. Today, ninety-eight per cent of my work is in the popular field. But my classical background is still there and comes in mighty handy, especially in arranging the background spots for Ginny's program. Since we switched to the Purple Heart format, the orchestra is more important than ever. Out of

the whole show, we're inactive only eight minutes of the thirty."

Fairchild throws his ample musical background into balancing the music on the program because Ginny sings but three numbers and they are always taken from three categories—there's a sentimental, nostalgic number which was popular a quarter of a century ago and which is placed on the program because many of the listeners are in the age bracket of fathers and mothers of men in service featured on the broadcast. "I Love You Truly" is an example of this type of song. Then, there's always a currently popular number of the more restrained kind, for instance, the jolly "Trolley Song." And last, there's always an inspirational song like "American Prayer" or "In God We Trust."

"The music on this show is as broad and as flexible as you'll find anywhere," remarked the batoneer, summarizing.

How He Composes

Hard-hitting Fairchild views his work very matter-of-factly and dismisses the intricacies of composing by saying, "I see something on paper and it suggests a tune. I play it on the piano and boom! That's it. Just give me three notes and I'll write a ten-minute composition with them. Just as English is the language of the reporter, music is my language."

FIFTEEN HUNDRED PEOPLE sat in the darkened Earl Carroll Theater Restaurant and concentrated on the great silver lame curtain. A hush had fallen over the audience and a feeling of expectancy filled the air. Then the moment they had been awaiting came—from the recess of the vast stage a three-foot high by three-foot wide birthday cake was wheeled into view. A chorus of "ah's" and "oh's" greeted the appearance of the three-tiered, blue and white slash of frosting. The giant curtain parted and a lone man stepped forward to receive the plaudits of the crowd. He smiled, bowed, and seemed genuinely touched by the cheering audience.

Thus had Hollywood come to celebrate the first anniversary of radio's most impressive program and to honor its maestro, the Dean of Modern American Music, Paul Whiteman.

The "Hall of Fame" came to the entertainment capital and the capital went all out for the "Hall of Fame." No glaring klieg lights or blatant music heralded the event, but Hollywood put its heart into that massive birthday cake.

The first creamy tier bore the blue frosted words "Happy Birthday, Paul!" the second tier proclaimed "First Anniversary," while the last tier completed the greeting, "Philco Radio Hall of Fame—Blue Network." Atop the tremendous cake was a frosted shrine which was the resting place of a single candle. And around the candle devilishly peeked a caricature of "Pops" Whiteman.

Since its initial performance a little over a year ago, the Blue Network's Hall of Fame has brought the best of the united talents of the show world to its listeners. Today the show world's great and near-great had come to pay tribute to the Hall and Maestro Whiteman.

Chosen to inaugurate the first gala one-hour, all-star program from Hollywood was a list of its most capable citizens. Because his nimble feet and easy-going charm have made him a favorite of the boards, the flickers, and the kilocycles, George Murphy was the first of a series of emcees to start the Hall of Fame off on its eight weeks stay here. Murphy, attired in a light gray suit, tapped his way into the huge audience's heart by humming and dancing throughout the afternoon's festivities.

Other Performers

Because he is the leading teller of tall hillbilly tales, Bob Burns was chosen to bring to the Hall his own

Fleetwood Lawton Is So Busy Broadcasting That His Night's Sleep Approximates Three Hours

He Went to the War Front to Rest

RECORDS, which belong to Lawton personally, present war in a vivid manner, describe bombing missions, hazardous rescues, even an appendectomy performed at sea.



Nor is there much sleep when, off the air, he returns to the charming home maintained by Mrs. Lawton (Virginia McGee, an Oklahoma girl) and stows away fried eggs, bacon, tomato, and tea. Every week he receives more than two hundred letters which he conscientiously answers. "Only if I'm lucky do I get a couple hours' sleep," Lawton yawningly told your Radio Life reporter.

For he must consume a light lunch, wind up his correspondence, and bee-line it for NBC to start preparation for his evening broadcast.

Between 9:30 and 10:30 in the evening, the Lawtons enjoy "their hour" —meaning they eat a leisurely supper and chat about the day's activities.

It's an inexorable grind, and even Saturday evenings are what Lawton terms "merely technically free," for news has a way of barging into the smuggest plans and a man like Lawton must always be ready for this exigency.

Trip Is Vacation

That's why trips, such as the recent one he made to the South Pacific, seem almost like a vacation, albeit he travelled 30,000 miles on an observation tour which occupied two months and during which he cut eighty fifteen-minute, on-the-spot re-

THE HIGHER his Hooper rating, the lower his quota of sleep, is the conclusion drawn by Fleetwood Lawton, commentator with the precisely clipped English accent. A short time ago when his 8.2 rating made him the most widely-heard commentator on the Coast, Lawton admitted that he goes to bed about 11 o'clock and gets up at 2:15 a.m. By 3 o'clock he's ensconced at KFI weeding out the news bulletins and settling down to write the script for his 6:45 broadcast, followed immediately by another released at 7:15 a.m.

"I was so run down when I left here that I was taking longer and longer each day to write my scripts," Lawton remarked. "I was a victim of accumulative fatigue and it required three or four hours to write what I can now do in an hour and a half."

Discussing the extensive swing in the Pacific, Lawton declared it was fruitless from a political and diplomatic angle, but that otherwise it was a revelation. There were not more than 500 Japs on the entire Island of Halamahara at the time he visited there and concerning them he observed: "If you drag them into a phone booth, they will fight. Otherwise, they do not have the will to fight."

Of the Japs on New Guinea at the time of his visitation he remarked: "They are a fugitive group of starving, diseased men trying to rejoin their equally demoralized forces."

From his observations resulting from the Pacific tour (and also his visit to the European theater of war last year) Lawton received the conviction that the war with Japan will continue for at least a year after Germany is defeated.

Value of Records

The eighty SoundScriber discs which he recorded on the spot are invaluable proof of what radio can do to familiarize the home front with actual battle conditions. Now being released over KFI Lawton's records describe bombing missions, hazardous rescues under fire, and even an appendectomy performed aboard a transport en route to Morotai. Wrote the patient to his mother back home: "Be sure to listen in on my appendicitis when it broadcasts over our local station."

In doing pioneer work with the SoundScriber, Lawton displayed the same aggressiveness and intelligence which have distinguished him

ever since he was four-and-a-half and could talk in English, Portuguese, French, and Spanish. (he was born on the island of St. Vincent, the Portugese colony off the West African coast, where his French father was employed as a cable engineer). As the listener today tunes to Lawton's precise, carefully-drawn comments, it is easy to picture the commentator as a youth of sixteen at an English college, where he was the one chosen to read daily to the priests—books on travel, economics, history; or to see him shortly after, as a young student of Oxford, discussing world affairs with the picked brains of India, England, and other countries. Later, after his graduation, when he joined the staff of the Buenos Aires Standard, Lawton became the first regularly-scheduled radio commentator on world affairs in Argentina, later travelled and wrote in Chile, Brazil, Uruguay, and Peru before coming to the United States in 1935.

Home Is Here

Now an American citizen, Lawton and his wife have bought a home on Muirfield Road. The commentator waxes enthusiastic over the one room which is devoted to his files. Speaking of his material, he laughed: "I don't know how I manage to walk so jauntily when my brief case is so loaded down. I clean it out every month, but in a couple of weeks, it's ready to explode. I always carry my portable, too."

Now back in the harness, Lawton exhibits interest over another trip, because he'll catch up on his sleep. The thing that's puzzling him about his Pacific tour is the fact that he gained weight while he was hopping those 30,000 miles, but when he got back home, his waist measurement had dwindled from a 34 to a 29. "Actually smaller than my chest," Lawton gloated.

Hall of Fame has invaded Hollywood with plans to present the finest entertainment that the cinema capital has to offer. Such names as Bing Crosby, Bob Hope, Orson Welles, Judy Garland, Alan Jones, Lum and Abner, Jerry Colonna, and Charles Winninger are being added weekly to the star-studded honor role.

Hollywood is not a novice in the procedure of the variety show. Some of the Hall's most memorable moments have emanated from California. Last fall radio went "spectacular" to pay tribute to a great American, Wilson. Motion picture's three hours of inspiring entertainment were capsule-paralleled in thirty-five minutes with the collaboration of one hundred and fifty people.

A cast of twenty-five, a fifty-piece orchestra, a choral section of forty, and the picture's original players combined their efforts in Hollywood to present in one afternoon an hour's

blending of Eastern and Western entertainment.

Every Sunday afternoon a line of a thousand or more people, half of them service men and women, may be viewed outside of Earl Carroll's awaiting their turn to enter the portals through which "pass the most beautiful girls in the world." Once inside they find the proceedings more thrilling than a stage show—one can never tell who's coming next.

The Hall of Fame still lives up to its reputation of being a program that pleasantly combines an air of impressive dignity with an atmosphere of relaxed informality—as witnessed by the fact that after the show is over genial Paul Whiteman clears the deck and gives members of his audience a chance, literally, to tap their feet to his tunes.

"Gee," smiled Whiteman, affectionately tagged 'Pops', "imagine a thousand people and me on one little stage!"

Among "Cookie's" most recent compositions are the songs for Abbott and Costello's "Here Come the Co-Eds" which includes the Hour of Charm All-Girl Orchestra in the cast.

Chunky, dark-haired, swarthy-complexioned, the maestro is seldom to be seen in anything but leisure clothes, and one reason he likes Southern California, whither he came but two years ago from New York, is that he can wear comfortable garb without attracting attention. Blue is his favorite color, followed closely by tans and grays. "Red's a favorite, too," he laughed. "My seven-year-old daughter, Joan, has red hair."

Although "Cookie's" career has never been anything but musical and includes vaudeville, an engagement in London's Cafe de Paris, and seven years on Cantor's radio program, he's happy that his wife, Hortense, has given up her concert singing to devote herself exclusively to being Mrs. Fairchild, mistress of the couple's Beverly Hills home. Ask Mrs. "Cookie," and she'll tell you that her talented mate is a nervous man who eats six times a day, who smokes a great deal, but shies from drinking.

"But I'm such a fiend for coffee that I even like bad coffee," "Cookie" vowed. "I can't sleep unless I've had a coffee night-cap and I always bring a big thermos bottle of hot coffee to the studio on Tuesdays. It invariably happens that I knock over the thermos while I'm directing, and scatter the pieces in every direction. Those cleaning men at NBC must hate me!"

Admittedly one of the best musicians in the business, when Fairchild was asked about his singing, he grimaced, "I have absolute pitch, but I can't sing on key. I guess I'm the only man in the business with such a wide vibrato that when I sing it sounds like a trio."

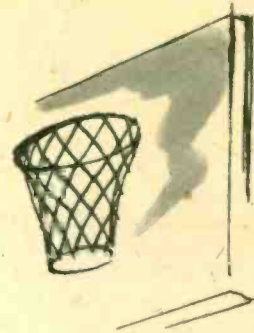
