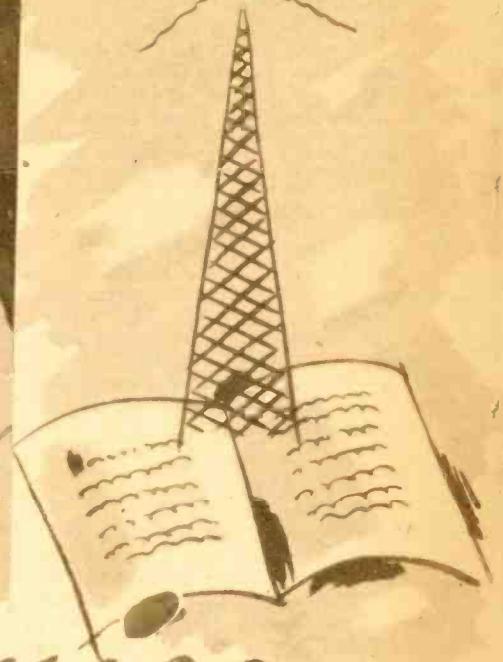
"Radio is a relaxation for me. It's fun, you see," she smiled, "because I can tell the nice things about my friends to so many people."

"He always has a pipe or a cigarette (in a holder) in his mouth (but he never inhales). I bought him many good pipes, when they were to be had, but he doesn't collect them. He smokes them. He doesn't like to shop, and doesn't mind my doing it for him. He says I have a gift for buying the right kind of neckties.

"He likes to eat out frequently—at the Brown Derby when he's working, at Chasen's, or good steak places, otherwise. He wants to see only the best movies; he liked 'Gone With the Wind' and 'Going My Way.' He enjoys the radio, listens to Jack Benny, Edgar Bergen, "Lux Radio Theater," "Cavalcade of America" and "Information, Please." He reads Life, Newsweek, the New Yorker and the Saturday Evening Post.



go unshaven. He's always Oscar Levant. He's very natural, but gets nervous and excited during the rehearsal. After he's played a number—perfectly—he starts running himself down. "I oughta quit trying to play piano." He's always sure he'll give an inferior performance.

Played It!

Well, Jascha Heifetz *did* play "Mairzy Doats"—but only at rehearsal! The great violinist had told Wallace Magill that he'd do anything Wally would ask if he'd only get hold of a wall pencil sharpener for him—and Wally did. It was presented to Heifetz when he walked on the stage for rehearsal—to the strains of "Mairzy Doats" as played by the entire fifty-seven-piece Bell Symphonic Orchestra.

Heifetz looked pretty flabbergasted. Wally reminded him of his bargain and Donald Voorhees, placed the first violin part on Heifetz' stand. Heifetz started to grin and said, "You expect me to play these little notes?" The orchestra guffawed.

But the violinist was a good sport. Don gave the downbeat and Heifetz gave a spirited rendition of last year's musical plague.

As I said, I found out a long time ago that the age past and approaching three-score-and-ten is worth looking forward to. And while no one wants to run through his years any faster than time requires, I have found out something that should make the third score easy to accept—we Americans seem to have a talent for growing old gracefully. At least, I've learned this much about it—sourpusses die young. Yes, for all the good things of a good life, especially the laughs, no matter what our calendar age, we're just never too old.

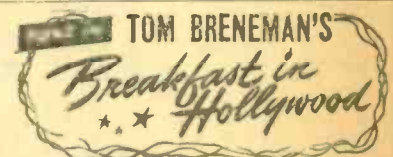

TUESDAY is a very special day for nine-year-old Dawn Bender. Because she's no longer Dawn Bender—who wishes her name were Cecil Ann—but a special person named "Margaret Barbour." And on that day she belongs to a wonderful radio family which has become as important to her as her real family in Sunland.

But the other six days of the week, she's just plain Dawn who loves to go ice skating and finds school "kinda" dull; who is a "normal everyday little girl" in spite of the fact that she has been an actress since she was two years old.

When Radio Life met the youngster at a recent "One Man's Family" rehearsal we were enchanted by two things. Her ingratiating charm and her pigtailed which were half as long as she was. As she talked, the large red bows on each braid saucily bobbed back and forth. And it was delightful to watch little Miss Bender use them to help her think. She pulled all two-and-a-half feet of them out from her head at right angles when she was pondering a problem.

Strangely enough acting—which is a part of that special Tuesday—is an everyday thing to Dawn. Mrs. Bender says it just comes naturally, for Dawn had her first speaking part at the age of two in a movie with Kay Francis. "She's always been able to read well, and we're never surprised at anything she can do."

Oboler Gave Start

It was Arch Oboler who introduced her to radio. He saw her picture in a Screen Guild magazine three years ago and upon investigating found she read unusually well. Carlton E. Morse sent for her to audition for "One Man's Family" and credited her with being one of the few children who reads with feeling—plus very little prompting. Today she is starting her third year as "Margaret Barbour."

"Radio is lots of fun because you see I'm going to be an actress when I grow up," Dawn emphatically said hugging her flaxen-haired doll. "I love all the 'Barbour' family. They almost make me forget I have a real family. And Dix Davis is just swell to me—Mommy and I are going to see him on 'Date With Judy' this afternoon."

One doesn't chat long with Dawn before becoming aware that ice skating and young actor Dix Davis are very influential factors in her life. Her conversation is frequently sprinkled with—"Oh, I'd rather go ice skating than do anything else—Mommy, how long till it's time to go see 'Date With Judy', Dix is on the show, you know."—until one begins to wonder if ice skating and puppy love aren't rolled into one.

On every day but Tuesday she is a regular attendant of the Vista Colina School in Eagle Rock where she's "best" in arithmetic and spelling but "hates" English and Geography. "I have to learn English because I write stories," she said earnestly.

Her Real Life

Her real family consists of Mommy and Daddy—who tells her a story every night—sister Ada May and brother Dewey. She has her own dog, "Tiny," and one of her favorite

duties is brushing his teeth. She is proudest of the fact that she's an aunt and also once rode in a police car. (The police car came to pick her up when she did a "Traffic Tribunal" program.)

When Dawn was born, the Benders drew names for her. It was a tie between Cecil Ann and Dawn. Dawn, in honor of the family friend, actress Ann Shirley, was the winner. "I still wish it had been Cecil Ann," the youngster declared with disgust.

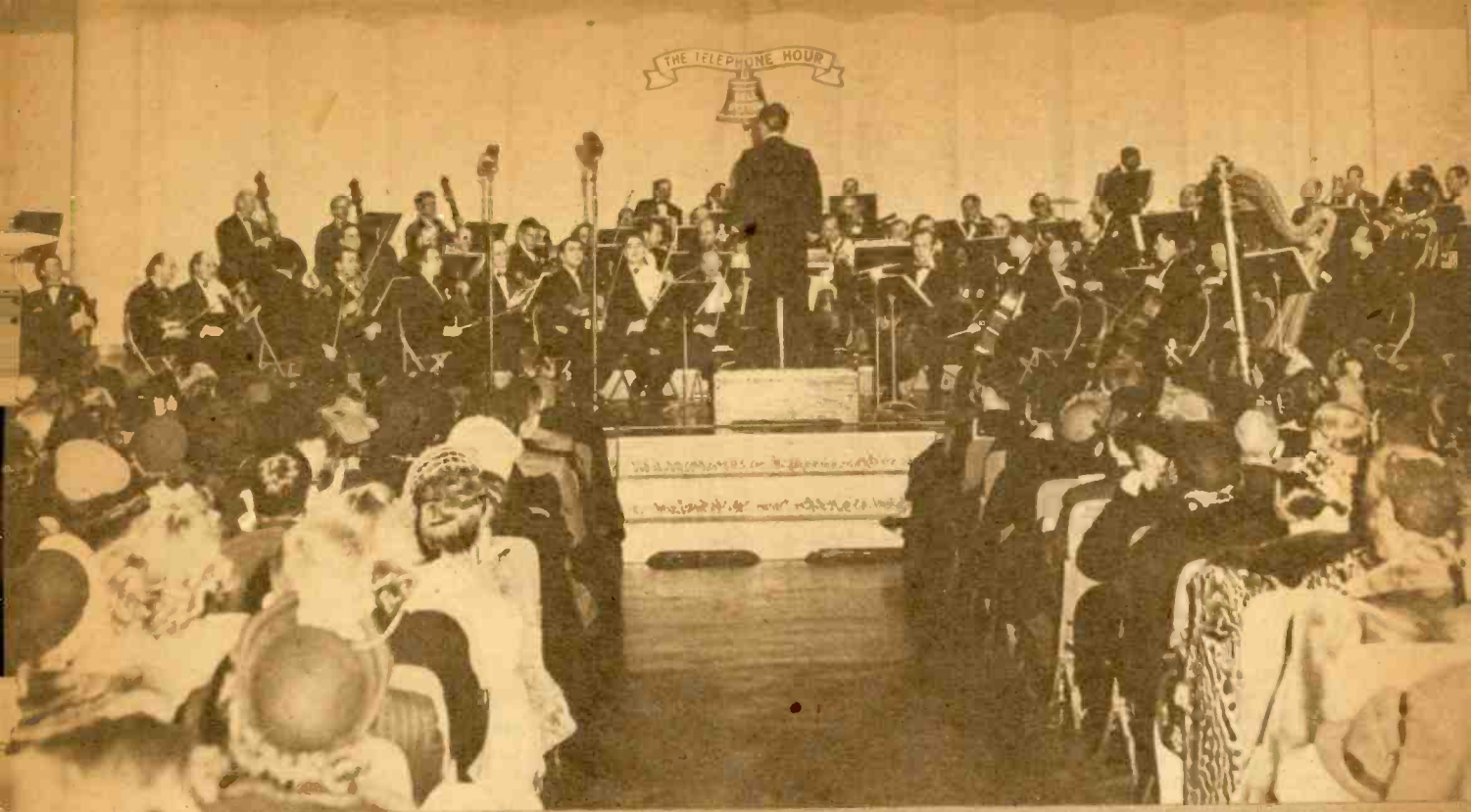
As she says, she is an everyday little girl who has not been affected by the praise heaped upon her. Because Mrs. Bender believes in as normal a life as possible for her youngest daughter. Dawn's favorite indoor recreation is listening to the radio—that is all programs prior to 8:30 p.m. because this is little Miss Bender's bedtime.

Everyday but Tuesday is spent in doing the things that most little girls do. Going to school, playing with the neighborhood children, and of course going ice skating. But Tuesday is different—because there are rehearsals, broadcasts, interviews—and if she's lucky, going to see "Date With Judy."

WHEN Fritz Kreisler made his premiere radio appearance, he chose NBC's popular "Telephone Hour" for his ether debut. When asked why he had decided to play for millions of radio listeners, he answered, "I would like to bring what happiness I can to listeners. I chose the 'Telephone Hour' because I like and respect the program."

For five years, the majestic "Telephone Hour" has brought its listeners the best in artists and music. Once a week the small studio audience views conductor Donald Voorhees piloting his fifty-seven-piece orchestra through the intricacies of Bach, Beethoven or maybe Berlin. Several times an evening the distinguished guest star steps to the microphone. And when the half-hour performance is finished, a satisfied audience, thankful that such an

eminent program still exists, files out of the studio.


But if that same audience were allowed a glimpse of the previous hour's rehearsal, they might not witness such a picture of decorum. For gone is the business-like attitude which characterizes the actual performance. And often in its place are laughter, lots of backstage mischief—and just plain fun.

Iturbi Idiosyncrasies

Jose Iturbi, for instance, never rehearses without a pipe or a black cigar. He comes into rehearsal, removes his coat, either pushes or rolls up his sleeves, lights up and starts working. He uses an unusually low piano stool and when he starts playing, his arms are like steel bands. He literally becomes part of the piano. Often times he comes out onto the stage while the audience is being seated and runs over a few phrases of what he's going to play on the program. Then, when he is

introduced normally to the studio audience, he bows as though they hadn't been watching him do a bit of rehearsing.

On the other hand, James Melton,

American-born tenor, is so well-schooled in radio habits that he is one of the most casual performers on the air. He is always a fashion plate, even at informal rehearsals. He never removes his coat or disturbs a hair on his head. He always wisecracks a lot—until the moment he starts singing. He'll engage anyone in the studio in conversation during rest periods and generally talks about what he's doing—farming, collecting old automobiles or singing. He mugs a lot with studio folk and likes to keep everybody laughing.

John Charles Thomas comes to rehearsal dressed to the teeth. But immediately, he removes his suit coat and starts to work. He always holds

rehearsal up, to tell Donald Voorhees, whom he calls Toscarvoorhees, and Wally Magill, the program's producer, a brace of new stories. He wears his hat at a rakish angle and never removes it during rehearsal—maybe because he's balding. He very often interpolates strange noises into his most romantic songs during rehearsal, but is very business-like on the program.

Is Most Popular

Helen Traubel is, without question, the most popular singer with the men and women with whom she works in radio. She's the only artist who likes to sit on the stage during the entire rehearsal period and during the program. She likes the intimacy with the audience. The

musicians adore her. She has a very quick laugh and responds to everything. She loves to talk about her Wagnerian appearances in opera with Melchior. They're both large and she says when he and she come toward each other on the stage saying, "Tristan!" "Isolde!", she is reminded of that story of the railroad switchman who missed signals and saw, to his horror, two immense streamliners coming at each other on the same track. He put his head in his hands and moaned, "What a heck of a way to run a railroad!"

In contrast is tiny Lily Pons, who always calls her rehearsals early so that she'll have plenty of time for rest before airtime. She's so petite

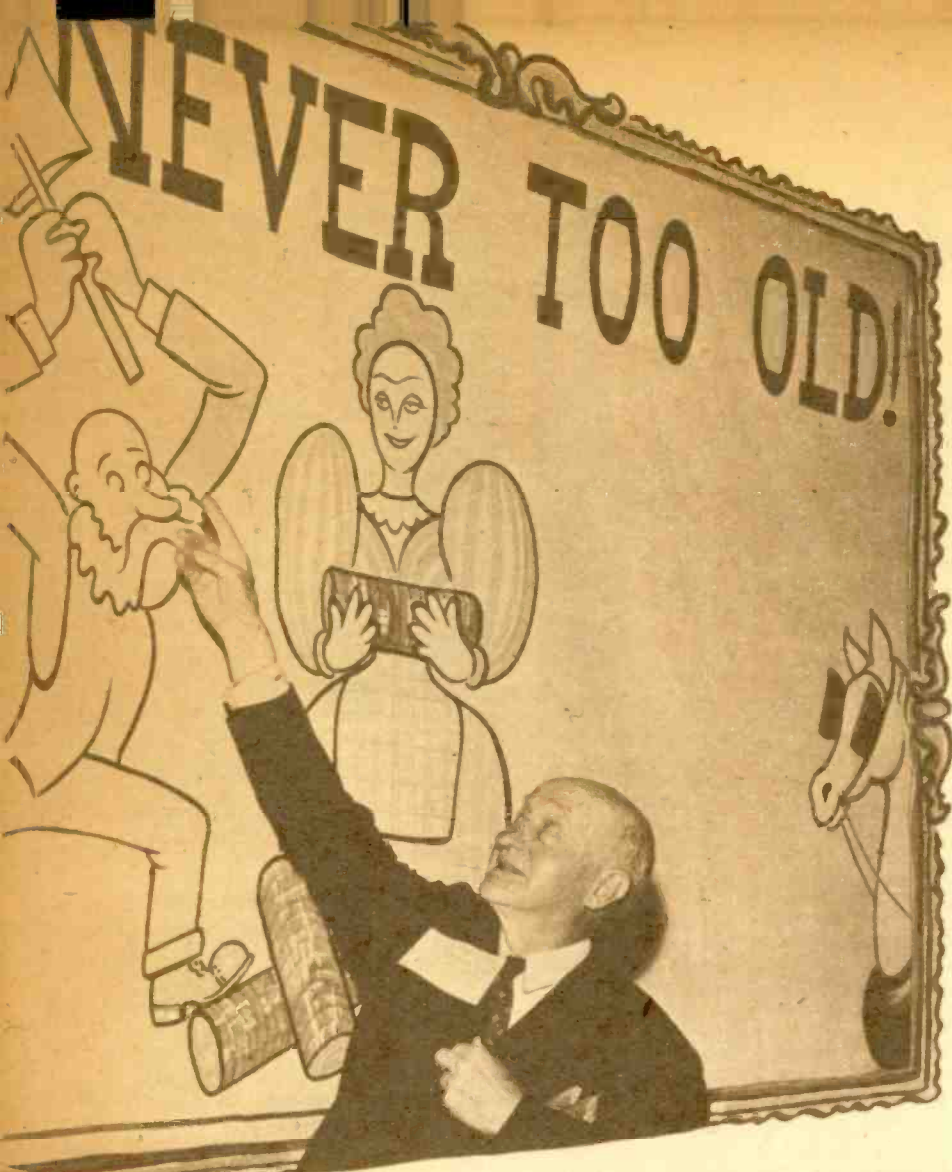

YOU can't be a star on Art Baker's "Never Too Old" program unless you're a youngster of seventy or more. And so, because Baker's guests can dig deep into experience's well, the interviews are delightfully nostalgic and unmarked by the inhibitions which characterize younger persons on the air.

Mrs. Carrie Currie, who won honors for spinning the best yarn on one show, spiced her chat with a description of the old-time party line and commented, "I only listened in on someone else's call when I couldn't help it."

"I'm eighty-eight years young!", exclaimed another guest, Fred W. March, when he confronted Baker at the mike. March's was the fascinating story of early Los Angeles, for he came to the city December 14, 1874, when the population was 6,000 and the site of downtown Naida Hotel was worth \$400.

Memories of the little red school house were revived by another guest, Mrs. Bertha Seamans, who recalled that everyone drank out of the same water dipper, "whether we had colds or anything else!"

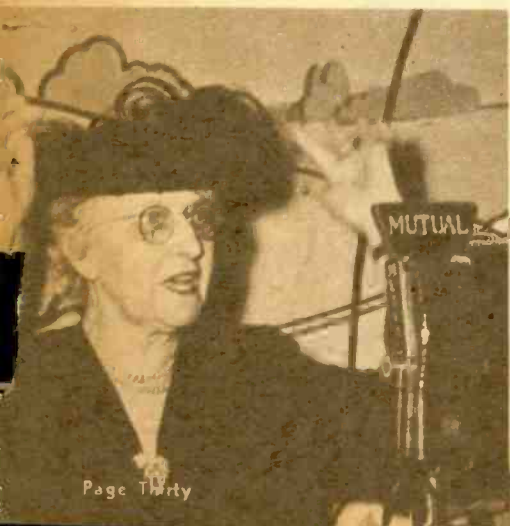
Reporter Reports

Colorful interviewee was Hoosier Horace W. Hanna, born in 1867, who related some of his experiences as a cub reporter back in the eighties. "I did society notes," he told Baker, "and kept shuttling in and out of the dog house as I made one girl mad and another happy with my comments on what they wore and where."

Then, one day, a woman whose thousands of "babies" have become world-famous, added her seventy-three years to the day's impressive age total. She was Mrs. Bertha Corbett Mercher, creator of the "Sun-bonnet Baby" which became a motif for children's books, dolls, bric-a-brac, and embroidery. Recalling the introduction of the automobile, Mrs. Mercher said that though people at one time or another made fun of the horseless carriage, she had noticed that those who didn't have a "gas buggy" were always perfectly willing to accept rides in one, "that is, if they were brave enough," Mrs. Mercher chuckled. She also referred to her creative talent as an inheritance from her mother, a resourceful pioneer woman who had quite a time with her family in 1870, when an eclipse of the sun occurred. Only one piece of smoked glass was available for viewing the phenomenon, so the able-witted mother filled a dishpan with water and grouped her children around the pan's brim where they could see the eclipse by reflection.

One of the four guests to speak her piece with Baker, Mrs. Mercher was recipient of the wrist watch which rewards the participant best expressing the results of more than seventy years of good living. Others appearing always receive ten dollars apiece, while audience members who come up with the right answers to Baker's questions are handed bright silver dollars.

Philosophy of the "Never Too Old" program was aptly expressed by Mercher when she said "I'm reserving the privilege of turning my seventy-three years backward and starting in again at thirty-seven, for I'm never too old for any good things in life that might still be coming along!"

NOW THAT I think back, I guess it's true that I laid the foundation for my new radio program, "Never Too Old," way back in '17, when I was an "old man" of twenty, a buck private in Uncle Sam's Army of World War I. As I remember I wasn't any too happy about it then; at first, that is, but in the years intervening I've found plenty of reasons to be thankful that a natural circumstance of my youth gave me an entry into two age groups—as a matter of fact, almost shoved me into a more advanced age group than my budding young manhood was ready to accept.

You see, this old gray head of mine, really white now, I must confess, has been my trade mark, so to speak, since I was a kid. I was one of those freaks of nature catalogued as "prematurely gray," and before I was old enough to vote, I was called "Pop" by men many years my senior, and many years ahead of me in experience, too.

'At first I resented this trick played upon me by nature. I was certainly not an old man, even if my hair did shine with white, and I resented very much the tendency my friends had, to push me off in the corner when any exciting events developed, or to exclude me from their youth-

ful pranks on the basis that I was past the age.

But when I got into the Army, I found advanced state of maturity had its compensations. I found out that my white hair had invested me with wisdom—that with it I had developed a responsive quality that appealed to my buddies. Men old enough to be my father would come to me to ask advice and counsel. I found myself solving problems I myself had never encountered and making decisions in a minute that they hadn't been able to make in many years.

Fortunately, I did have a sense of responsibility toward this relationship between me and the other fellows, and I began to take my role as keeper of morale seriously. Having accepted the position of "grand old man" of the A.E.F. I began to think about maturity and responsibilities, and oldsters and their problems—especially their place in a busy world.

And very soon I found that I was one of the few persons of my age who really appreciated the fact that old men and women are still human beings—not well preserved specimens to be kept around handy for observing now and then, or, worse yet, to be neglected whenever there was a promise of things doing in a big way. So you see, I've really served a lifelong apprenticeship to my "Never Too Old" program. And am I glad I did—for I've never had so much fun in my life, or met such really swell people. Well, you've been meeting them the last few weeks—don't you agree with me?

I'm sure you listeners understand now what I've come to understand—that age is really a privilege we share with our three-score-and-ten friends. The ripest humor, the most benevolent charm, and the most gracious poise are some of the privileges of old age, and don't you believe our younger listeners don't know it. You should hear what some of our younger guests say to me after the broadcasts—one woman said she'd willingly add ten years to her life if she could turn her head and smile like one of our seventy-eight-year-old guests did. Another young woman comes to about four out of five broadcasts a week as her "personality vitamin—a tonic I can use."

So you can see why I get excited about "Never Too Old" as a radio feature with a future. There are millions of stories waiting to be told—if we can only get around to them. And that brings up a point about the program itself. As you may have heard, there's no set pattern to "Never Too Old," and I hope there never will be. When we first started the broadcasts we set up a few potential formats and decided to let the guests we have each day sort of take over for themselves. And we
