"Chained To A Typewriter"

By Evelyn Bigsby



Helen calls herself a "hack writer" and says she's "chained to a type-writer," but those familiar with her work know her as the enterprising originator of more than half a dozen air shows, with "loads of ideas for more" coursing her cranuim Her current program, "One Woman's Secret," is heard five times weekly at 4 p.m. over NBC-KFI.

Miss Morgan, an ex-newspaper woman who ran a semi-weekly at Carmel, California, broke into radio "cold" in San Francisco by reading an audition part for "One Man's Family" and to her great amazement getting the role. She carried over her writing ability from paper to microphone, gradually adding production to her abilities; but she'd prefer to write rather than produce any day.

Exciting Writing

One of her most exciting assignments came last year before she moved to Hollywood. Eddie Cantor went north to stage a non-stop, twenty-four hour bond drive over the airwaves and Miss Morgan was asked to write his script. She remained to watch the program until 3 a.m., was just making plans to desert the studio for a soft bed at home when the station unexpectedly called on her to write a half-hour script for Cantor to broadcast overseas at 5:30 a.m.

While her co-workers hovered, over Helen's desk and cried "you can't do it," she whipped out page after



writer-Producer Helen Morgan has been alternately accused of resembling Irene Dunne, Greer Garson, and Joan Davis. But her lovely prematurely gray hair is her distinguishing feature.

page, with sips of brandy and coffee bolstering her determined, but flagging morale. As fast as a page was completed, it was snatched from her typewritter—the last sheet being pulled out just in time to rush it to Cantor. After the broadcast, the comic lost no time hustling into the control room to give his writer a vigorous hug for her phenomenal work.

Helen's current air series was born during an extremely sad time in her life—a year ago Christmas. She and her husband, Actor-Producer Ivan Green, had just moved to Hollywood when she was summoned back north by her father's illness. Her temporary quarters there boasted a bed of box springs—and—no typewriter. Her father was critically ill in the hospital; Helen and her husband were spending the holidays apart; it was Christmas Eve—which all added up to a very depressing situation.

Sad Time

Helen left her father's bedside and walked out the hospital doors to confront a pouring rain. There wasn't a taxi within a radius of five miles. Her eyes wet with tears and her feet wet from sloshing around in the rain, she trudged from the hospital gates to the nearest bus. The message telling her that "One Woman's Secret" had been accepted for the air was awaiting her in her make-shift quarters.

It stopped raining; she batted out some scripts on a rented typewriter; her father got well; Helen rejoined her husband in Hollywood; and her show started merrily on its way, which brought a sad saga to a happy culmination.

Green eyeshade? No-o-o. Maybe green allright, but it'll be a saucy veil to a perky Carnegie hat. Sleeves rolled up? Um-mm, they're too short and one doesn't roll lace. Necktie pulled loose? Never! Fe minine throats rarely are covered by such things. Striped shirt? Well, could be, that is, if "Dame Fashion" happens to be dictating such this season for the well dressed lady.

And as for "bawling out" orders—you'd be surprised what a well-modulated, smiling, female voice does to the hard-shelled radio veterans when they pick up their phone to hear "Hello—this is Evelyn Bigsby."

She's as much of a success story as any she has ever written for this magazine. She stands about five feet, six inches in stocking feet, wears brightly-colored suits, and large costume jewelry. She is always very well-groomed, and her mahogany-colored hair is worn in some upralsed, waved, and going-to-a-party manner, that is definitely spiritlifting. Tibbett TALKS

ABOUT THE "Hit Parade"

HAT DO YOUR opera fans think of your 'Hit Parade' activities?" we queried of Lawrence Tibbett soon after the famed Metropolitan Opera star had ushered us into his comfortable suite at the Biltmore Hotel. Muchdiscussed has been Mr. Tibbet's recent venture into the field of popular music with his bow as crooner of the nation's top swing-and-sweet tunes on CBS' Saturday night "Hit Parade." Radio Life lost no time in seeking Mr. T's idea on the subject, when he was in Los Angeles during his recent concert tour.

The singer, friendly, gracious, and looking very suave in casual brown slacks and a boxed sports coat, settled his six foot, one hundred and seventy pound frame on the couch and readily replied to our aforementioned query.

"I should say opera followers are half and half, pro and con the adventure," he opined. "Some believe it constructive and some destructive. The 'cons' say it's degrading to my standards. The 'pros' say my interpretations of the popular numbers will bring out the good qualities of it, that it deserves a real musician's approach."

"What do you think of your 'Hit Parade' singing?" we asked him then.

"I like it," he smiled, "and I agree with the people who take the proside of the question. I believe my school of singing can offer something the popular school hasn't had."

Not Most Thrilling

Mr. Tibbett doesn't consider his debut in the popular realm of music

the most thrilling event of his career, however. He continues to cherish the memory of his first great operatic triumph. It was in 1925 when, as an unknown, he sang "Ford" in "Falstaff" at the Met. The next day, he was acclaimed by critics as a "find."

Born in Bakersfield, California, Lawrence Tibbett came to Los Angeles as a small boy when his mother opened a rooming house here after his father, sheriff at Bakersfield, was killed by a desperado named Jim McKinney.

Young Larry studied music herewith an instructor when he could afford it, by himself when he had no money to pay a teacher. On graduation from Manual Arts High School, he played important roles in a Shakespearean repertory company; then his voice and acting talent brought him into light opera up and down the Pacific Coast.

During the war, he served in the Navy, and following his discharge, in rapid succession came his first marriage, the birth of twins, struggle to keep up his vocal lessons, and a meeting with Rupert Hughes, the famous author who also is an ex-cellent musician. Hughes urged Tibbett, then twenty-four years old, to try his luck in New York at once. The youthful baritone took the advice, borrowed some money, headed for Manhattan where he studied with Frank LaForge. Six months later, LaForge announced that he was ready for the Metropolitan. Tibbett auditioned, won a contract at sixty dollars a week, and after a few minor roles, sang Ford in Verdi's "Falstaff," the role that marked the turning point of his career.

In 1929, Lawrence Tibbett returned (Please Turn to Page 31)

A Lesson in Radio Drama With Arch Oboler

The Old Master of Horror Tales Gives Radio Life the Lowdown on How You Dream up Chill Stories, (And Other Nicer Things), Along With a Little Oboler Family News

N A THURSDAY afternoon Radio Life dropped into Mutual's Hollywood studios to watch Arch Oboler
at work. "Shh!" we had
been warned, "don't disturb
him! He's in the midst of an intensely dramatic scene." A cast of twenty
stood assembled upon the huge
stage. A thirty-piece orchestra sat
poised, eyes upon Mr. Oboler in the
control booth. A deathly still lay upon the room. Suddenly he spoke. He
whinnied like a horse.

"And that," he explained to his convulsed cast, "is, what you sound like in here." Aside to us, he said, "It's no wonder producers have ul-

cers. . . . I'm only kidding, I love

For six long years, Arch Oboler has been regarded as tops in radio circles. And no wonder! his five-hundred or more original plays have made radio history. His tales of horror have curled the hair of thousands, his dramatic narrations have brought a lump to the hardest of hearts, and his humorous stories have handed a laugh to a world sadly in need of laughter. Whoever referred to Oboler as a boy-genius wasn't far from wrong. He, of course, scoffs at the title. "It's something I like to do."

His Aim

When he brought his present series of twenty-six plays to the Mutual

mike he cited his aim in these words:

"My intent can be simply stated—to bring to the radio audience a group of melodramas, and comedies and adventures and mysteries which say something through entertainment, and which admit that the listening public, in this year of radio 1945 has a brain and knows how to use it when listening to radio drama. I hope this series will bring to Mutual the dramatic excitement of plays written for these days when people ask to be amused, inspired, and given new faith."

When calling upon Mr. Oboler, we found the past few months spent in working on a production for MGM had not changed his method of versatile craftsmanship for the ether waves. Nor had he changed in appearance. He was still the same Oboler clad in the inevitable T-shirt, pork-pie hat perched atop his head, and pencil in his hand. He was still the same jovial Oboler who had a way of draining the last drop of talent from his actors by means of gentle persuasion or sometimes with an acrimonious tongue. Needless to say, they loved it.

When a break in the afternoon's rehearsal came, we settled down in the rear of the studio for a chat. Mr. Oboler listened with one ear to the questions we were shooting at him and with the other to the original music for the day's show. "Beautiful, isn't it?" he'd ask, referring to the score.

"What," we queried, "do you do when you aren't writing radio dramas?"

Having A Time

Unblinkingly, he answered, "Break firepaths." It seems he owns a house high atop the mountains overlooking the ocean. Life was serene for the three Obolers, Mrs. O. (as he refers to his wife), three-year-old Guy, and Arch until the Fire Department ordered them to break firepaths—and in a hurry. "What a time, we're having," he moaned.

He is also in the midst of preparing another movie for Metro and is at the same time nearing completion on his first stage play. When asked which is his favorite form of work, he laughed and answered, "It's all work and I like it all."

To Oboler, Mrs. O. has the best editorial mind in existence; After completing a script, he turns it over to her for editing, and runs. It has been said that he prefers working in darkened rooms for inspiration and has regaled his secretaries with dreams of horror beyond the wildest imagination. Then he knows he has a good idea.

He is intensely proud of son, Guy, claims he could pose for one of those muscle-men ads. His chubby little three-year-old body is a mass of muscles and Oboler wonders what will become of him if they leave him to grow up in the "wilds of the

to Hollywood to make his first movie, "The Rogue Song." Worldwide acclaim resulted from his succeeding appearances on the screen, the radio, the concert and operatic stage.

As Farm Owner

Today, the father of three children and married a second time, the gifted baritone is the contented master of a farm home in Westport, Connecticut where he pursues farming as his hobby, when not engaged in the numerous divergent activities that fill to overflowing his newly-leased professional life.

In addition to his weekly air appearances, his concert tours and operatic roles, Tibbett entertains servicemen at camps and hospitals, particularly the latter of late, because he believes the wounded are in the greatest need. The boys like to hear him sing the songs for which he is known, such as "Road to Mandalay," "Without a Song," "Largo. al Factotum" and "Home on the Range."

"The boys seem to resent popular numbers." Mr. Tibbett declared. "They chiefly desire standard classics and religious music. There's a great demand for the 'Ave Maria' and 'Evening Star'."

Asked if he planned to resume his screen career, the opera star stipulated, "If the right story comes along. I can't be an Arrow Collar boy," he laughed, "but I wouldn't like to be miscast. It must be right."

He related then the amusing recollection of his career, which occurred during the making of the film, "New Moon," in which he co-starred with Grace Moore. In one scene, the script required him to lift Miss Moore from the ground to the back of a horse.

Continued Larry: "Grace still laughs at it herself (she's a swell gal!) 'cause she weighed over one hundred and sixty pounds at that time. Brother, the camera can certainly do some wonderful tricks!"

Does Tibbett like radio?

"Sure!" he laughed. "You reach more people, and traveling is bad. It's so much nicer to sit in one place and reach more people."

as due to the fact that I touch more sections of people than the mere bobby-soxers. I touch the public of all ages and Frank hasn't the following among men."

Later, we asked Mr. Tibbett to name his favorite popular singer. "Crosby," he replied, "He's the champ!"

interviewee feel at ease, and her enthusiasm for everybody and everything in radio gets over. All week long her radio friends drop in at her small office in the Otto K. Olesen Bldg.—Mel Blanc, Elvia Allman, Andy and Virginia, John Scott Trotter, Louise Erickson, Shirley Dinsdale. Every morning she sits at the phone arranging stories and picturetaking sessions with the publicity experts—NBC's Hal Bock, CBS' Lloyd Brownfield, ABC's Milt Samuel, Mutual's Fair Taylor, KMPC's Willard Hanes, KFWB's Don Ross and the others—which materialize into writing assignments for herself and the staff.

Three years ago Evelyn had no dreams of being editor, radio star or anything more than someone you sit next to in the bus. She had had a flair for writing in college at Occidental and had helped her husband when he was getting started in the newspaper publishing business. When the war suddenly took Radio Life's able editor, Johnny Whitehead, the only person who knew something about the magazine, and

wouldn't be drafted, and could also write, was Evelyn.

She didn't expect to do a particularly outstanding job, and nobody was looking for it. But today Evelyn Bigsby and Radio Life are one, and she unquestionably has more warm friends in Hollywood—from the front door guards and reception girls to the very top stars and executives—than anyone in her line of work.

As responsible for her success as anything, is the oft-taken-for-granted, but not so universal virtue of being herself. Evelyn never has. Her philosophy is, "No one has a right to behave that way. I don't care who they are."

She sticks up for her staff writers, too; will tolerate no careless inconsideration for them. As for her short-comings (leave us face it, we all have them), even Evelyn regards this as her worst. She's a worrier. When things go wrong at her editorial desk or before her weekly airshow, la Bigsby paces nervously up and down upon the new rug on her office floor and screeches "Holy smoke!"

When she's "doing a story," Evelyn still gets as excited as a young autograph collector. She comes back from each interview with a great pile of notes. "Oh, I've got the most wonderful material," she says. "Listen to this...," thereupon enthusiastically reading a string of notes on Jack Benny's bhicken liver sandwiches, Nancy Sinatra's bedspreads or Penny Singleton's lampshades—the sort of every-day items about the stars which she knows her readers and listeners want to hear. Evelyn is happiest when she has been to one of the stars' homes, preferably where there are children.

She has championed dozens of supporting players and "unknowns" and takes a deep satisfaction from the fact that Radio Life articles have lifted quite a few of them to better jobs.

Successful as she is, and facing what may well be a national career, she hasn't lost her sense of humor. She can still tell stories like this on herself. A year ago, the Bigsby's decided to enter their daughter, Maralyn in one of the fashionable schools in Beverly Hills. They thought it would be just as well not to mention in this rarified social atmosphere, that Evelyn had a job and kept regular office hours on a magazine. On the second day of school, young Maralyn's first assignment was to write a story on the "Highlights of My Summer Vacation." She proudly turned in a paper, "A Day With Mother on Radio Life."
