**G**ENE NORMAN'S nightly invitation to the "Eastside Club" is so convincing that he constantly finds himself playing host to fans who have answered his call.

"One night when I announced that Sinatra was going to be our next evening's guest," recalled disc jockey Norman, "bobby soxers in droves appeared at the station to see their idol. I had a hard time explaining that all of our music is recorded and the applause is only inserted."

As the voice of Eastside, Gene and his booming baritone are now a familiar radio mark to dialers. Taking to the air with Coleman Hawkins' "Stuffy", written in his honor, Norman bids you welcome to the mythical "Eastside Club" where for two full hours you can enjoy the latest in sweet and hot recordings.

**Things Move**

No dilettante in his appreciation of modern music, Gene has been praised by national music publications for the intelligence he displays in presenting the better brands of dance music. "I try to keep things moving," says the serious faced young man (he's only 23) who is celebrating his first anniversary as the Eastside's emcee. "We feature four bands an hour with an inter-

mission vocal worked in to offer variety and pace."

Before coming to Hollywood and KFWB, Gene was an announcer on San Francisco and Oakland stations, and before that he speled into mikes in New York and New Jersey. A former student at Wisconsin University and the University of California at Berkeley, Gene, as the possessor of two degrees, is called "Stuffy" by his colleagues.

Norman believes a man's music reflects his social philosophies. That's why he refuses to play records by certain maestros he knows to be reactionaries, race-prejudiced. "Music is democratic. And jazz is the most democratic, the freest music of all."

**His Favorites**

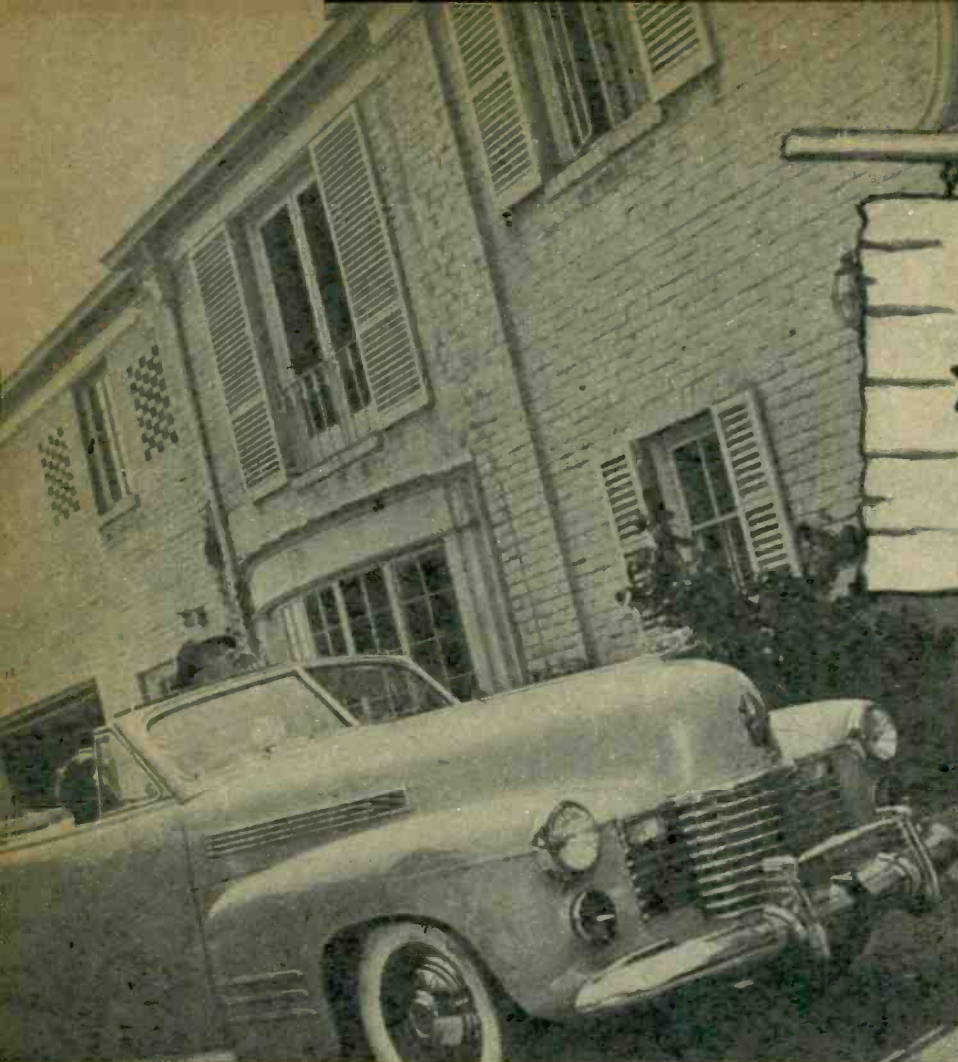
Ellington probably is his favorite bandleader, from the viewpoint of musical quality and harmonic inventiveness. Earl Hines is the most rhythmically exciting, he thinks.

Norman receives requests from servicemen in the Pacific, and from civilians as far east as Ohio and north to Vancouver. He employs transcribed applause and crowd noises to give the effect of a remote program. He smokes cigars as he talks, spends hours arranging his nightly stint.

On Tuesday nights at 11 he presents a jazz concert with the assistance of Dave Dexter, former editor

He was referring to the Paramount picture, "Duffy's Tavern," boasting a host of big star names—headed, of course, by Ed Gardner. "I must be pretty bad," he continued in mock seriousness, "because when I come on the screen, the audience quiets down like I was trying to sell mauseleums or something."

It was quite obvious, that morning, that motion pictures held a tremendous fascination for one of radio's top comics. His first venture, the aforementioned "Duffy's Tavern," had just opened for a local run and Ed was curious as to public reaction.

Asked if he contemplated any more pictures, he answered (between phone calls) that with the start of his new radio season he was all wrapped up in the airing of "Duffy's Tavern."

### Calls Up to Ear

And that's how Radjo Life found Monsieur Gardner, better known to millions as "Archie," when we called upon him at his lavish Bel-Air home.

Lounging, with phone in hand, beside his large swimming pool, he was up to his ears in telephone calls. "Make yourself to home," he drawled in Archie's unmistakable voice, "And I'll be with you in a minute."

Bounding up to greet his master came the Gardner's pet, "Duffy," a huge Irish setter, followed by the mistress of the house, lovely, blonde Simone.

"This is Thursday," she explained, "the nurse is off and I've got my hands full with the baby. He's asleep now, but you'll meet him when he wakes up."

"Baby"—turning to her husband—"will you be home for dinner?"

"I don't think so," answered Ed consulting his watch. "Holy smoke, look at the time! I have an appointment at noon, a Command Performance rehearsal and I've got to get going."—(aside to us)—"You string along with Simone and she'll tell you anything you want to know."

As we followed Mrs. Gardner across the spacious back lawn, we couldn't resist another look at the lovely pool, big tennis court and barbecue pit. "We all swim a great deal," she pointed out, "and Ed plays tennis

daily. The barbecue constitutes our favorite form of entertainment."

### Tour of House

Once inside, we made a tour of the huge home with Mrs. Gardner playing guide. The most lived-in room is the mahogany-paneled den, lined with hundreds of books including everything from Tolstoy to bound volumes of Duffy scripts. Above the fireplace hung an oil painting of Ed, done by John Decker.

Ed, it seems, is an artist, too, and his house is lined with many paintings, the greater part of them by his friends. Now and then a Gardner painting adorns the wall. Those he doesn't like he hangs in the intimate part of the house. This constitutes his "minature gallery."

The living room is done in a warm aqua color accented by a deep maroon. Adhering to comfort, the room is furnished with an abundance of large, easy chairs and sofas, some in maroon, others in quilted chintz. "This is my favorite room," smiled Simone.

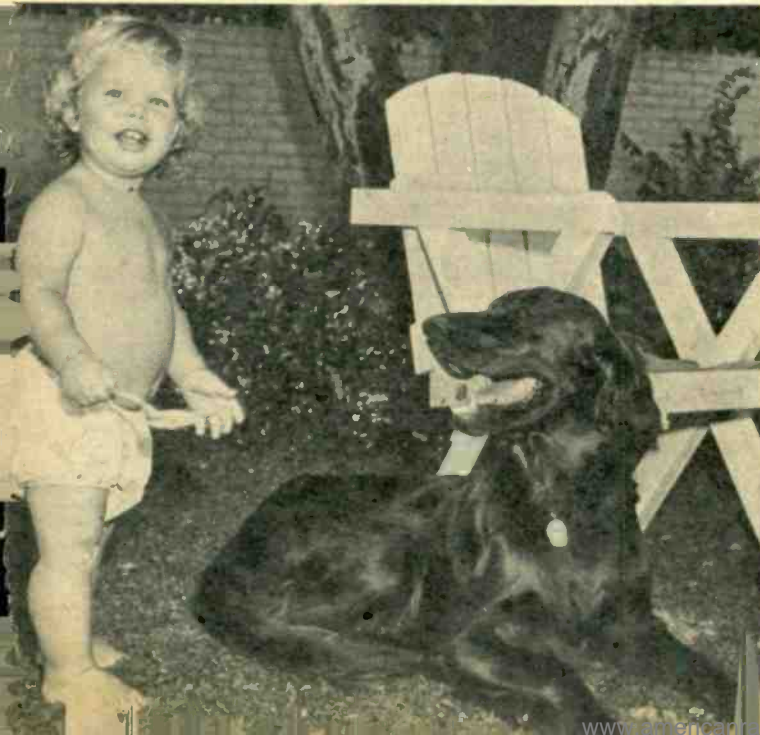
Downstairs is a large (also maroon) game room, bearing autographed pictures of all the guests who have appeared on Duffy's. We

was unheard of and almost all shows were ad libbed.

#### Critical Family

Perry's wife is the show's constructive critic. "She listens in every day and gives us invaluable criticism from the listening audience's point of view." His two little boys, Michael and Bill, are well on their way to becoming critics, too. Both of them have appeared in many recent movies, and if six-year-old Bill doesn't like something on Perry's show, he gives his Dad the benefit of his professional experience and sets him right.

Perry calls them a couple of scene stealers. "We're keeping all the money they've made in pictures in trust for them until they are eighteen," he said. "Then they can divide it equally and decide for themselves whether or not they'd like a theatrical career."

Perry himself did a lot of stage work at one time, and still has a secret yen to be a serious character actor. He admires Charles Laughton and Walter Huston very much, and would like to attempt the kind of roles they play. "But I'm afraid I'd turn out to be more the Lou Costello type." At the Pasadena Playhouse he played a variety of roles including French waiters, little old men and Japs. He still has a little bald spot on the side of his head from putting on and taking off a couple of wigs every night when he doubled in character for one production. ## EVERYDAY IS LADIES' DAY

EVERY AFTERNOON at two, genial Perry Ward gives a party. Of course it's called, "What's Doin', Ladies?" and it's broadcast over KECA, but after visiting the show, Radio Life was convinced that it's really a social get-together. Nobody has as much fun as Perry when a contestant gives a funny or unexpected answer. And no one but an anxious host could cover so much territory and so quickly introduce audience and contestants to one another. Perry tears down from the stage to the audience and back again at a terrifying rate of speed. "There was one time," he laughed, "when I tore down into the audience holding a mike with a short cord. I got jerked back like a yo-yo! People are always telling me that someday I'm going to fall flat on my face, but I won't care if it gives the audience a laugh."

"You have to be a born diplomat and politician," said Perry in answer to our query as to 'how do you do it.' "I'm pretty impertinent at times,

but I try never to hurt anyone's feelings or make anyone angry. They come to the show because they want to have fun, and do something a little crazy—and I help them along," he explained. He admits that nine times out of ten he gets an unexpected answer from his contestants. "For instance," he beamed at the recollection, "one lady contestant was treated to the sight of her husband in the arms of a lovely Earl Carroll girl. 'Well, lady,' I said, 'what are you going to do about that?' Do you know what she did? She just put her head on one side and said sweetly, 'Ah—don't they look cute?'" Perry is delighted when a contestant tops him with an answer. "I don't want to monopolize all the good cracks." He gets his gift of rapid ad lib partly from his early experiences in radio when a script

*Challenge to Sinatra*

We were startled the other day to see big Bob Brown come through our door. If you have not seen nor heard Bob, this will introduce you to the ex-120-lb. weakling who built himself into an amazing physical specimen, surpassing even the measurements of Charles Atlas.

It seems that three years ago, Bob was a Marine serving in the South Pacific. He contracted malaria and T.B. and was discharged without much hope from the doctors. Through methods of his own (including a diet, rest and exercise), he built himself into what you see today—a 240-lb. muscle man, and sporting what he terms in all probability the largest arms in the world (biceps 19"), Mr. Brown has appropriately dubbed himself "The Arms."

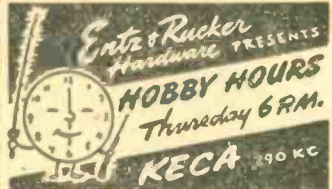

## RECURRENCE

Strange that I should feel again,  
After all these years,  
The old ache, the old pain,  
The old, old rush of tears.  
Strange that just at seeing you,  
Walking in the night,  
My heart still skips a beat or two,

As you read those lines, do you visualize a pale young poet, languishing in his ivory tower, burdened with an unrequited love? Well, if you do—you're wrong. Rene Bozarth, the author of the foregoing verse is an energetic, dark-eyed young man whose three daily radio programs and special events broadcasts wouldn't give him the time to suffer from an unrequited love even if he had

one. As for the ivory tower, the only similarity is that station KGFJ, where he is on the staff, is located on the windswept top of a building in downtown Los Angeles; but there the comparison ends with a bang. The fact that Rene is on deck as program director (the youngest in the country), news editor and promotional director gives him even less time for the traditional poetic affectations.

"I have no hobbies beyond my work," he smiled, "I spend fourteen hours a day at the station and three on Sundays. You see, I wouldn't even have time for a private life, if I wanted one. As for hobbies, I'm fortunate enough to have all in my work." He named them on his fingers "Music, poetry, news, writing and speaking. What more could I want?"

## Fell Into Radio

How did he get into radio? "Well,

After the divorce, my father had been awarded custody of two of the children so one night my mother and I hitch hiked and walked thirty-five miles to the town where he was living, climbed up to a second story window and kidnapped my little sister. I was nine years old at the time. Naturally we had to get out of jurisdiction of the state of Missouri or give up sister, so we went to Washington—the state—where we had relatives. We lived in a lumberjack camp for a while where my mother worked as a cook. Later we moved to town and my mother opened a boarding house. I did the cooking! Once I even read palms at the Washington state fair.

"I got a job as secretary to the manager of a radio station and then went on the air. I was sixteen, and the youngest commercial announcer in the country. Later, I moved to Texas where I did radio and little theater work and also taught dramatics, and then came to station KGFJ in California. That's about it—I'm afraid it's not very exciting," he finished apologetically. Well, we'd just like to know what young Mr. Bozarth considers exciting!

## Will Retire

As for this business of no private life, Rene assured us that it didn't mean he didn't believe in marriage. "Oh, yes, I'm going to be married, you know—I just don't know to whom," he finished anti-climactically. "But I also want to travel. My father was half French and half gyp-

dreams. But it doesn't. It happens every week to Al Paschall, production manager of the fabulous "Truth and Consequences."

## Dreams Solution

"I live, eat and sleep my job," smiled genial Al. "Often when a solution to a prop problem seems out of my reach, I just give up and go to bed. Then, if I'm lucky, I dream the solution—and it all seems too simple."

These "simple" chores are the seven-day a week, 48-weeks-a-year brain children of Paschall. As head executioner of the amazing consequences which delight weekly, thirtyish, tall, good-looking Al has performed approximately 750 of the assignments in the last three years. They aren't miracles, they are logical engineering feats, all of which Al, personally, tries out before "inflicting" them on participants.

When Radio Life descended on Paschall to learn about the production secrets of "Truth or Consequences", we found him ensconced among lovely gowns, chic hats, smart shoes and beautiful girls. He was making last minute arrangements for a style show to take place on the following night's show.

## Has Deserted Acting

"This is nothing," he explained, "wait until I attempt to plant a Link Trainer onto the NBC stage. If we can't get the darn thing in the studio, then we will have a problem."

As possessor of one of the strangest jobs on record, Al finds it fascinating. An ex-thespian, he met emcee Ralph Edwards in 1941, and was persuaded to try his hand as production manager in '42. "I've become so interested in the production end, I'll never go back to acting."

When an idea is thought up for an elaborate consequence, it is submitted to Al for approval. (Or more often, Al is equally responsible for its inception.) After the idea is proven sound, it is Paschall's job to bring it to life.

During the war years, he guarded every bit of rubber, wire, rope and wood as carefully as you did that pack of cigarettes. "I never threw anything away," he laughed.

With carpenters in tow he sets about to materialize the consequence. Maybe it is a special chair or a set of collapsible stairs. They are planned, carefully built, and then personally tried out for safety.

"Often," he pointed out, "we've revised a prop three or four times and some aren't completed until minutes before air time."

But all props aren't custom built.

Some are borrowed, thereby entailing engineering feats. Often such things as airplanes, merry-go-rounds, Link Trainers and tight rope equipment have to be moved into the studio piece by piece. Elephants, bears and seals have to be coaxed in. Paschall is an expert at this. He knows many of the animals personally by now. How he got the elephant into the station is anybody's guess,—he's not telling.

When asked if any of these problems proved impossible, he quickly answered "no." "They entail a lot of hard work, and loss of sleep," he grinned, "but we never give up."

"People," he averred, "cause as many worries as the most intricate of props. For instance we staged a reunion between a serviceman and his family. Keeping the two apart before their meeting on the air was as hectic as executing a circus."

Paschall's most difficult task was building a set of collapsible steps, such as the kind you find in fun houses. The steps were revised over and over and finally the contestant, well-padded from head to toe, mounted them without a casualty.

The only "casualty" was a contestant who had his thumb bitten by a skunk.

Don't all of these "problems" leave Paschall a nervous wreck? He says no. He loves it. But on his last vacation he climbed onto a train, alighted at San Francisco, registered in a hotel and locked his door for four days. He didn't get out of bed. "I slept and slept—and," he winked, "I didn't dream."

Robson, who was born in 1906, joined the CBS staff in 1937 and has done little writing. He is too busy directing. He likes to play the trombone once in a while if there aren't too many neighbors around.

sy, and I think I've inherited the gypsy wanderlust."

He really surprised us by insisting that his eventual ambition was to retire to a monastery. We asked when this would take place—regretfully—because we think that radio is a more interesting place with a Bozarth in it. "Oh, in about thirty or forty years. All my life I've been in the midst of people, and I've got to get away sometime to write the great work I feel that I might be capable of doing. After all, I don't think a man does his serious work until he is past fifty." So Bozarth admirers may relax for a decade or two, anyway.

Rene's interest in classical music led to "The Musical Digest," one of the most popular of the recorded music programs. "We've had some interesting guests, Antal Dorati, conductor for the Ballet Russe, Bruno Walter, Arturo Rubenstein, Giovanni Martinelli. I interview them informally... no scripts, and they have all been charming and entertaining." The Met tenor Martinelli confessed to being a hay-fever victim, Dorati passionately defended Tschaikowski's place as a great composer, and Rubenstein told a funny story on himself. Robert Service and Don Blanding both famous figures in American verse, have guested on Rene's popular program. "Of Words and Verse" reading selections from their own works.

One book of Rene's own poetry has been published, "70 Grains of Same," and a second will appear this fall. As for personal music tastes, his favorites are Dorati, Rubenstein and Tommy Dorsey. "Tommy Dorsey!" we exclaimed.

"Yes, said Rene reverently. "He sends me. I'm part jivehound, too," he laughed.
