**AFTER ONLY THREE MINOR ROLES** ("little more than walk-ons"), Myra Marsh was called upon as an emergency substitute in a featured role in the play, "Hottentot." The part called for thirty pages of dialogue, which she delivered so satisfactorily that the role became hers for the entire run of the play! That was the start of Miss Marsh's colorful dramatic career.

I WASN'T particularly interested in dramatics; I merely wanted to spend three or four years in Boston," Myra Marsh explained with a smile that added to the merry charm of her twinkling eyes and saucy tilted nose. Having just emerged from NBC's Studio B and a script reading as "Mrs. Foster" of the "Date with Judy" series, Miss Marsh met us by appointment in the artist's corridor and graciously gave us an account of the acting pursuits that have brought her to her present-day place at the microphone as one of etherdom's favorite actresses.

Born in Maine, Miss Marsh's aforementioned desire to live in Boston was fulfilled when she enrolled at Emerson College there, majoring in dramatics, but with her mind on her forthcoming marriage.

It was when the latter didn't materialize that Myra turned seriously to the stage, working in stock companies in and around the baked bean-metropolis. Surprisingly, her parents did not voice the usual parental protests to the greasepaint trial, but a close friend did. The friend, Mrs. Catherine Osborne, was actively engaged in work of a social service nature and greatly wished Myra to do the same.

**Met Challenge**

By this time, however, Myra Marsh's mind was set upon a theatrical career, and during the next ten years she made rapid progress in a series of stock company produc-

tions, followed by both radio and movies. In fact, after only three minor roles—little more than "walk-ons"—Miss Marsh suddenly found herself called upon to step in as an emergency substitute in a featured role in a presentation of the play "Hottentot." The part comprised thirty pages of dialogue, which the aspiring young actress delivered so satisfactorily that the role was made hers for the entire run of the play!

Following this production, she travelled throughout the country, appearing in stock companies and working with such familiar fellow performers as Jane Darwell, Barbara Luddy, Lurene Tuttle and Mel Ruick. Her stage successes led to movie and radio assignments—more than forty screen appearances to date and long-time roles at the microphone in William Farnum's "Drums" and Kay Van Riper's "English Coronet" series.

Fifteen years ago, the actress met and married real estate man, John Van Pelt. Since then, her life has been filled with other interests of an importance equal to her dramatic pursuits. There is a son, George, now in the Army Field Artillery and stationed on Okinawa.

#### "Blondie's" Opinion

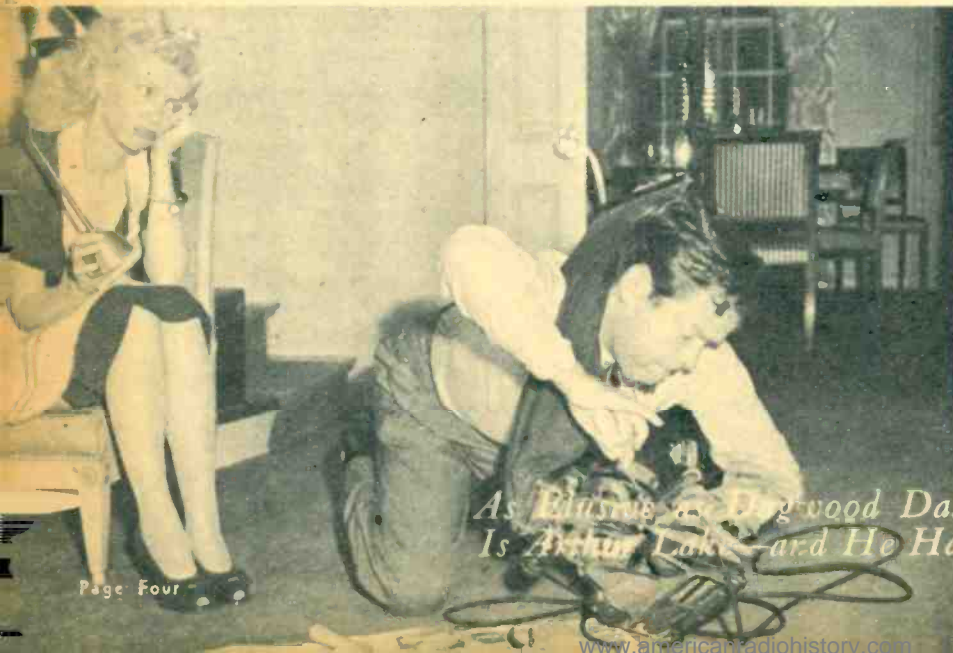

**G**ENE and Kathleen Lockhart sat in the restaurant after their Sunday broadcast of "The Nebbs." Gene ordered half a dozen oysters, raw, and an omelet with jelly. Kathleen shuddered. She reached over and patted his hand.

"Goodbye, dear."

"That," said Gene, "is Fanny talking."

"That is not. That is Kathleen Lockhart, and I wish you wouldn't."

Kathleen was right . . . and so was Gene. For the secret of "The Nebbs" is that they are not just two radio characters adapted from the funnies for broadcast over KHJ-Mutual Don Lee Sundays at 1:30 p. m. PT. The

Nebbs are the Lockharts and several million other American families, including yours.

"'The Nebbs' is like a lot of other shows Kathleen and I have done for the stage," said Gene. "It's pure farce, but like all good farce, it moves so fast that the audience never has time to think. It's that tempo of farce that makes it believable . . . the tempo and the down-to-earth realism of the characters.

#### Secret of Formula

"If you take people who are real people . . . who have humanness and sincerity . . . and put them in a situation that's exaggerated, the situation becomes believable, provided it moves quickly enough. If it slows down and the listeners get a chance

# Radio Life Lines

**SHANGRI-LA:** Along with 750,000 others, we celebrated Navy Day by visiting the Harbor, but ours was a special party with the Dick Haymes show which broadcast from the 39,000 ton carrier. Stage was the huge elevator used to lift planes from the hangar to the flight decks—which left all the performers out in the open. Gordon Jenkins and the men in his band who'd forgotten to bring their top coats tried to keep warm by turning up the edges of their coat collars. The music generated some heat. Dick had come prepared in a windbreaker and Helen Forrest was swathed in a bulky fur coat.

The ship was as interesting to us as the broadcast was to the entertainment-starved men, who said they found it hard to get used to having women around. Lieut.-Comm. John Fraser, assistant air officer with the ship since it was commissioned (a "plank commander") escorted us. Most interesting was his description of how the Japs and Americans tried to out-smart one another in using radar. Both dropped tinfol in an effort to lead the enemy into believing a swarm of planes was coming over. Radar equipment on the 80-million-dollar Shangri-La, said Fraser, came to half a million dollars. One night it helped

them shoot down two Jap planes sight unseen.

His praise for our logistics was unstinted. While the Shangri-La was hovering about a couple hundred miles off the Japanese coast last spring, its 2800 men were getting mail from home within ten days after it was sent.

When we sat down to dinner in the officers' mess it gave one a peculiar feeling to realize that this very ship, just a few weeks before, had been lying at anchor in Tokyo Bay.

Dick and his folks put on a good show for the boys. The control room handled things smoothly. It would have been perfect if Helen hadn't dragged her numbers and if Haymes would try NOT to talk like Crosby with his slick patter. Isn't Dick a clever enough boy to invent his own style?

That vivacious blonde songstress, Betty Rhodes, heard each Sunday at 7:30 p.m. on the "MEET ME AT PARKY'S" program is really quite a gal. She began her career as a ghost singer in motion pictures which means

that while leading ladies of Hollywood merely moved their lips and looked pretty, Betty was knocking herself out doing the actual singing. Being a sensible girl, she saw the utter injustice of this arrangement and decided to tackle the radio field. And we might add that her decision not only

Prior to joining the great cast on "MEET ME AT PARKY'S," Betty appeared with such luminaries as Fred Allen, Johnny Green and Burns and Allen. to think it over in their own minds, you're lost, but if you keep the drama moving, the story line can be pretty thin and still you'll have good comedy."

The oysters arrived. Kathleen, confronted with the inevitability of a lost cause, ignored them. Gene did not.

"Rudy, for instance, has a boat," he said between oysters. "It has seven holes in it, and Rudy has filled these holes with corks. Now nobody else would think of plugging a leaky boat with corks, but these are special corks invented by Rudy to plug boats. When they hit the water, they swell up and keep the boat from leaking."

"Is this a story, or are you improvising?" asked Kathleen.

"I'm improvising. Rudy goes out on the lake with his boat, but he forgets that the boat has been in the garage all winter, and that the corks have shrunk and lost their life. Pretty soon he hears a 'Piiing!' and something hits him on the back of the head. 'Who's got that pea-shooter?' Then another 'Piiing!' and one by one all the corks pop out, and there he is, adrift in a boat with seven holes.

"That's not much of a story, but with the proper build-up, it becomes believable. Farce doesn't have to be logical, but it does have to be sincere."

### Copy Must Be "Seeable"

Gene Lockhart should know. For not only has he acted in practically every media there is . . . radio, stage and screen . . . but he has written many radio scripts and many of his own stage productions. He's convinced that dramatic experience can make a world of difference in dramatic writing.

"Too many young writers today can write beautiful readable copy, but it's not seeable copy. It's not enough to have a mental picture of what's happening in a script; you've got to have a mental action picture of it. When you stand up in front of a mike and try to read a script that doesn't have that quality, you're bucking every line you deliver."

That's Gene Lockhart's version of why "The Nebbs" is a successful comedy script. Gene explains it from the technical point of view . . . but Kathleen Lockhart tells it another way.

"It's just that Rudy's so human," she said, after Gene had finished his oysters and his omelet and gone back to a script conference. "Gene doesn't know it, but he's exactly like Rudy. All men are, I think. Take marketing, for instance. I ask him to go to the store for me and he's all business. 'Sure, sure, where's the list . . . where's my hat . . . right away!' He thinks it's only going to

take a minute; he comes back in an hour completely dragged out because he always manages to make a major expedition out of going to the corner for a light bulb. He can't decide which kind he should buy, so just to be sure he comes home with all of them . . . enough to keep us in light bulbs for the next five years, plus anything and everything else that's taken his fancy en route.

"I sent him after some milk the other day, and he came back pleased as punch. 'Got a half-gallon,' he said. 'Enough to last us for awhile. You women don't know how to shop. No use fooling around with small quantities. Buy a lot at once . . . saves time, saves money.'"

"Well, he's right about that."

"He would have been . . . if he'd bought milk. But what he brought back was a half-gallon of butter-milk, and none of us can drink it!"

concise and straight to the point. And are completely fool-proof before tried out on you."

How, we queried, did Mr. Holtzer go about choosing his contestants?

### How Contestants Chosen

"They write in to us," he explained. "From our files of letters we select a family, who in their letter has told us all about themselves. Then we go about selecting a second family comparable in size, and as nearly as possible in age, to the first. We call upon both families and learn more about them. From the information derived we set about to dream up gags for them."

As each week's contestants differ, the program is of course never the same. "But we do have a family tug o' wits and the Phonocord historical spot every week," explained Mr. Holtzer.

The tug o' wits consists of each family's taking the end of a long rope, and as questions are called to them, the group answering correctly first is rewarded by the \$50 pot in the center moving to their side. After a certain number of questions, the family which is closer to the pot receives it.

The historical spot, Mr. Holtzer averred, is more consistently won by the children of the family. From a transcription of a recent well-known speech, the contestants are asked to identify both the speaker and the occasion. The lucky winner receives a Gruen watch.

### Twin Search

But the gags are amusing, fresh and varied each week. There was the time that emcee Bob Purcell and writer Holtzer decided upon playing hosts to a family boasting twin girls. Quite naturally this would involve finding a matching set of twin boys. "That was the toughest task to date," said Purcell.

"Before we were finished we not only had the original girls, but an-

other set of girls, and two sets of boys (through the courtesy of the navy department), twin rabbits and twin chickens. What a time!"

Purcell, who is the "family man" of the Family Party, doesn't always find himself as only the interlocutor of the fun. Once all 6'5" of him made it very difficult for a nurses' aid contestant to make a bed. He was in it. Another time while advising a group of men contestants to shake the sticky dough from their hands into a biscuit tin, he kept shouting "in the pan, in the pan." "I got it in the pan, too," he laughed. "I was wiping dough out of my eyes and ears for days."

"The contestants and the audience are wonderful," related Holtzer. "They have been 100 per cent cooperative and it has resulted in as much fun for us as for them."

The gags are usually conceived by the Holtzers and the Purcells, who get together to try the ideas out on one another. "So it really is home-spun," smiled Purcell. "From our living room to yours."

# Associated Grows Up

*The Associated Broadcasting Corporation Is No Longer the Infant Network of Radio; Is Now Engaged in Full, Peacetime Coverage*

**O**N SEPTEMBER 16, radio took note that its infant network, the Associated Broadcasting Corporation, was growing up. The first broadcast over the facilities of the Associated Network had been launched in January of 1944, when independent radio stations throughout the nation joined to form what was to become the fifth na-

tional full-time transcontinental radio network.

On the aforementioned September 16, the newest network came into its own, featuring auspicious dedication day salutes from the armed forces and entertainment field alike.

Paul A. Porter, chairman of the Federal Communications Commis-

**D**ON QUINN, chief scripter for the Fibber McGee and Molly show, is a well-fed looking gentleman with a mild, relaxed manner. No one can believe him when he says he has ulcers. His assistant writer, Phil Leslie, is the one who looks as if he had them, but Phil boasts a hardy digestion that, loaded to capacity, never puts more than 140 pounds of flesh on his lanky, six-foot frame.

When Leslie pounds out script all night every Friday, he nibbles incessantly — on crackers, candy, cheese, ham, and peanut butter, especially "anything with peanut butter." But the most he's ever weighed in his 36 years is 148 pounds. That's when he despaired of being a writer and took a job as timekeeper at Lockheed, where no smoking was allowed. He's sure his abstinence added the eight pounds.

It must be Phil's restless disposition that keeps his poundage down. He has an extremely hard time concentrating.

A car passing the door, a pair of birds fighting in the tree beyond the window, the chatter of his four youngsters—all distract Leslie. He calls it "my natural reluctance to go to work."

He's kidding, in his way, because Phil is a hard worker. When Fibber and Molly signed off for the summer, Leslie had a new contract for two more years and nothing to do until October. But because he'd had to borrow some to buy a new \$30,000 home in Hollywoodland, Phil decided to keep his rather prominent

nose to the scripting grindstone—for a consideration—\$1,000 a week—writing the "Beulah" show.

## Worried Fat Off

Even Leslie admits this is a fabulous turn of events, because up until two and a half years ago he was worrying off any fat while he wondered how he could keep the Leslie brood operating on the \$35 a week which he drew as secretary to a cosmetic manufacturer.

He doesn't take it too seriously, but does think it a startling coincidence that five has always been his good luck number. "The greatest five in my life is my wife, Helen, who was born July 5. Our baby, Sue, was born July 5, 1941. Helen and I were married on May 5. I joined Al Pearce on the fifth, came to California on the fifth, and left Lockheed on the fifth."

Six years ago, Leslie was an accountant for St. Louis Amusement Company's theater chain. Just to be different from other figure jugglers, he started a two-page weekly mimeographed bulletin for the enjoyment of Phil Leslie and fellow workers. Then he sold a couple of articles to the Brokers Club "Ball Street Journal," a yearly take-off on Wall Street Journal. This supplied him with sufficient encouragement to syndicate (to four country newspapers outlying St. Louis) a weekly column of hodge podge comments about anything striking the Leslie fancy.

Radio scripts which he wrote and sent to leading Hollywood air comedians came back unopened. (Curiously enough, he didn't submit any to the McGees). Finally a pull with Al Pearce resulted in two of Phil's gags being used on the air. Helen and Phil still recall the thrill of the \$25 apiece those gags brought. The money helped pay for their newest baby.

When Phil signed as one of Pearce's writers, nine weeks remained of the season. By the time the Leslies arrived in Hollywood, it was four weeks before the summer lay-off.

## So They Stuck

The next two years are "kinda confused" to Writer Leslie. An off-the-cuff assignment to write monologue material for Bob Hope . . . two weeks' writing on Joe Penner's staff ("sort of a bone thrown me") catch as catch can. "If I'd had any sense at all, I'd have gone back to my \$40 a week job in St. Louis. But Helen was just as stubborn as I was, so we stuck."

The year at Lockheed was one of the roughest in Phil's life. "Big machines making big noises" weren't conducive to creative writing. Leonard Levinson, then writing for Gildersleeve, always remained a friend, loaning Leslie money and finally offering him a writing job on the "Gildy" show in the spring of 1942. When fall came, Phil was asked to write for Victor Borge, then appearing on Kraft, also was offered the writing job on "Major Hoople" at \$100 a week.

"Two shows appalled me so much (I wasn't sure I could write ONE) that Helen and I just sat around and talked about it for three days, leaving me only four to write the things."

In March, 1943, when Don Quinn's assistant went into service, Leslie got the job as Quinn's assistant. "It seems as if I've always been with Don. He's a wonderful fellow. I'd work for Don for \$40 a week, I'm so sold on him." (Leslie has turned down bigger weekly offers to stay with the McGee group.)

On Tuesdays, Phil sits in while Don and the Jordans go over a one-page synopsis of the coming week's

show. Between Tuesday and Saturday, Phil develops the one page into approximately 20 pages of script, typed in triplicate. Saturday afternoon the group meets again, with Jim and Marian each holding a copy and reading their lines and Don Quinn acting out Alice Darling, Doc Gamble, and all the other characters. "If I typed in quadruplicate, I'd have to read, too," laughs Phil. After his all-night, non-stop writing run, starting Friday noon and ending in

time for this Saturday meeting, Leslie rests over the week-end, while Quinn carries on from there. "Don usually follows my story line," remarked Leslie, or maybe he rewrites completely. I spend an average of 50 to 60 hours weekly on my part of the script."

#### Few Movies

Already a tense person, Phil is at high pitch when Saturday night comes, but lack of sleep makes him

willing to turn in for 12 or 13 hours' sleep. Under his present schedule, he and Mrs. Leslie have about two nights a week for relaxation. Their close friends are few, because, as Phil explains, "I've never found anybody I like better than Helen." Often they ride up and down Hollywood Boulevard looking for a picture they'd like to see, and end up going home without seeing any. "We went once, last summer, and saw 'The Un-

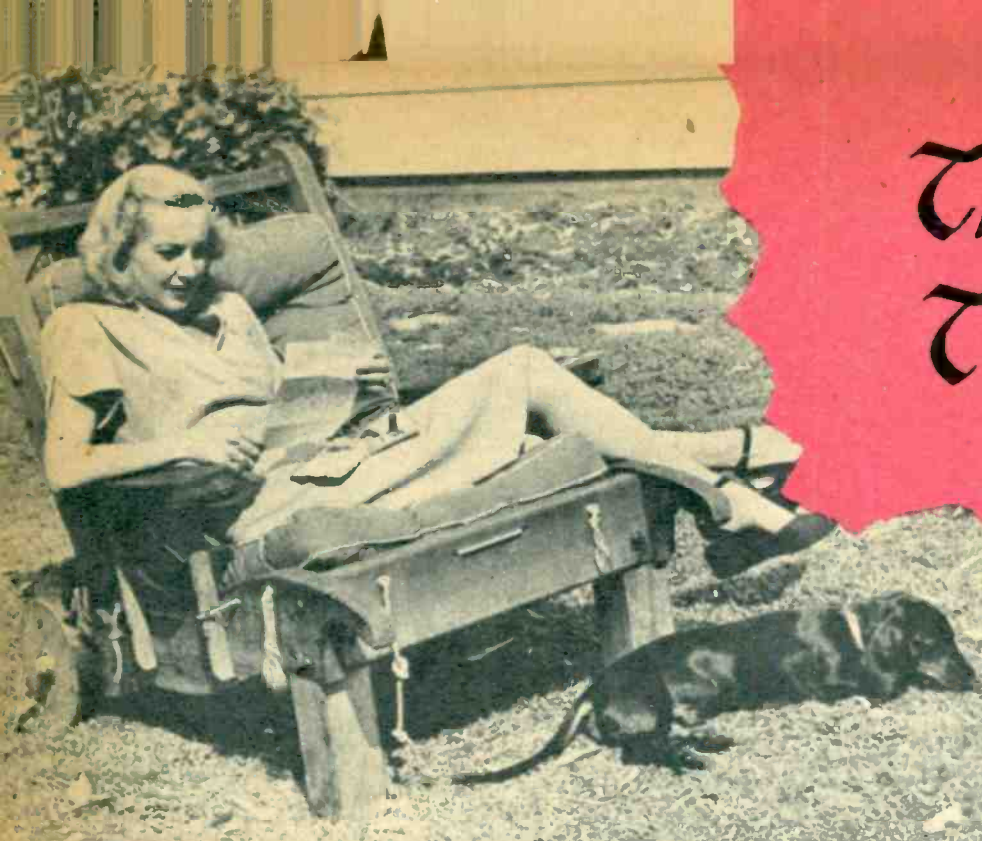

The Leslie children, Ann, 14; Janie, 12; Phillip, 11; and Sue, 4, are always left behind on these unplanned journeys. His relief at getting away from routine family existence causes Phil to remark facetiously, "I wonder whether I'm a natural father."

Asked if he has any extravagances, Leslie answered, "With four children, how can I?" But his serious luxury is expensive ties. He loves, above all else, to fish.

Last summer, Phil and Helen went back home for a visit—a sort of triumphal return to the folks who best remember Leslie as an expert accountant for twelve years.

Of course Phil will never forget his figures. "I'm probably the only writer in radio who can make out his own income tax," he quips.

sion, in dedicating this fifth chain of the major networks said:

"The formation of a new network at this time by the Associated Broadcasting Corporation is consistent with our spirit of progress. It is a symbol of the American determination to face the post-war period, not timidly, but with courage to push on to new goals of achievement. Coming as it does with the echoes of war still ringing in our ears and with no blueprint for the future neatly spread out before us, this event is in line with the finest tradition of the American spirit of free enterprise."

### Personnel

Begun as a partial answer to the need for an additional national radio network, the Associated Broadcasting Corporation was formed by President Leonard A. Versluis, and Executive Vice-President Roy C. Kelley, who together own and pioneered the Wolverine Network. As the network grew toward full-time operations, west coast radio personalities, Richard F. Connor and Van C. Newkirk, because vice-presidents in charge of operations.

Pledging itself to deliver the full-est and most complete network coverage, Associated is now serving twenty-two markets or one-third of the quota for which it is striving. Operating on a sixteen-hour sched-

ule, its local outlet at present is Station KFOX.

The next step in Associated's expansion is to house itself on Radio Row, 6000 Sunset, boasting four studios, will soon be its new home, with headquarters located in Grand Rapids, Mich.

Associated is accumulating an over-all coverage in the field of radio entertainment. From Hollywood emanate such programs as Graeme Fletcher, ace newscaster; Robert Dillon and his "Reported Missing"; Al Jarvis and the "Hall of Records"; John B. Hughes' "News and Views." Sports, a highlight of the network, are represented with up-to-the-minute reports of events as they happen.

Associated points out that where once the letters A B C were merely symbols in the primer, they now stand for the network's adopted motto, "Coverage for All Big Cities."

At this writing, controversy between the Associated Broadcasting Corporation and the American Broadcasting Company as to the use of the initials, ABC, as network identification is in court in Grand Rapids, Mich., where it will be decided whether or not the injunction restraining American from the use of ABC will be handed down or not.

Thus, officially dedicated to full-time operations, after a year and a half of occasional broadcasting, Associated is added to the entertainment media of the nation—the newest of the networks.
