Sirs: Saw your Radio Life with a two-page spread on "Queen for a Day." So I have a gripe to make. Why did Don Lee Mutual send out thousands more tickets for the Jack Bailey "Queen for a Day" broadcast that originated from the Pan Pacific than there is seating capacity (6300)? Studio police were there pushing the people around as if they were pickets. None of these people would have been there if they had not had tickets. It was such a sad state of affairs that it was surprising that no one was injured.

One line that was in the center went in—the complete line. Others that had waited for hours only got pushed back. Many that came just before the doors opened went in first. There must be an explanation somewhere, but I can't think of any.

"Queen for a Day" extends you its apologies and this explanation: Over sixty thousand requests for tickets to that particular broadcast were received. Sixty-three hundred tickets only were sent out, as that is the limited seating capacity at the Pan Pacific. Ten policemen were recruited to keep the expected crowd in order. But ten policemen proved not enough. Many applicants for tickets assumed that their tickets had been lost in the mail or delayed en route and they arrived intent on entry regardless. A goodly number en masse forced their way through the gates without tickets, with the result that many well-meaning ticket holders were crowded out.

As it has been announced on the air, "Queen for a Day" fans may use these October 12th tickets for any other airing of the show they wish to attend.

Next time, announces "Queen for a Day," there will be forty policemen on hand to maintain order.

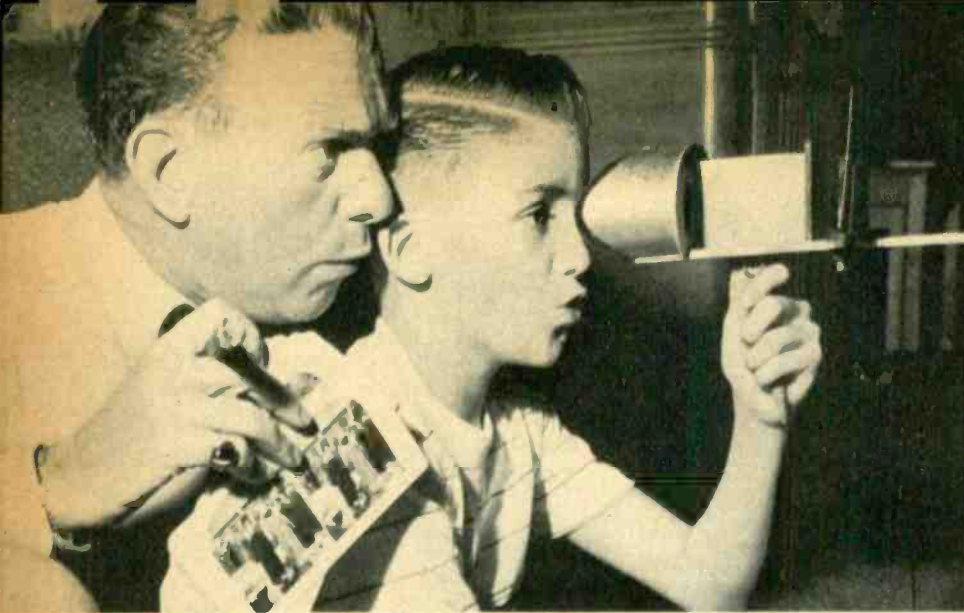

**DINNER IN THE DEN.** But it's not really gagged up like this. Actually, this is the only time the four Burnses get together. ➡

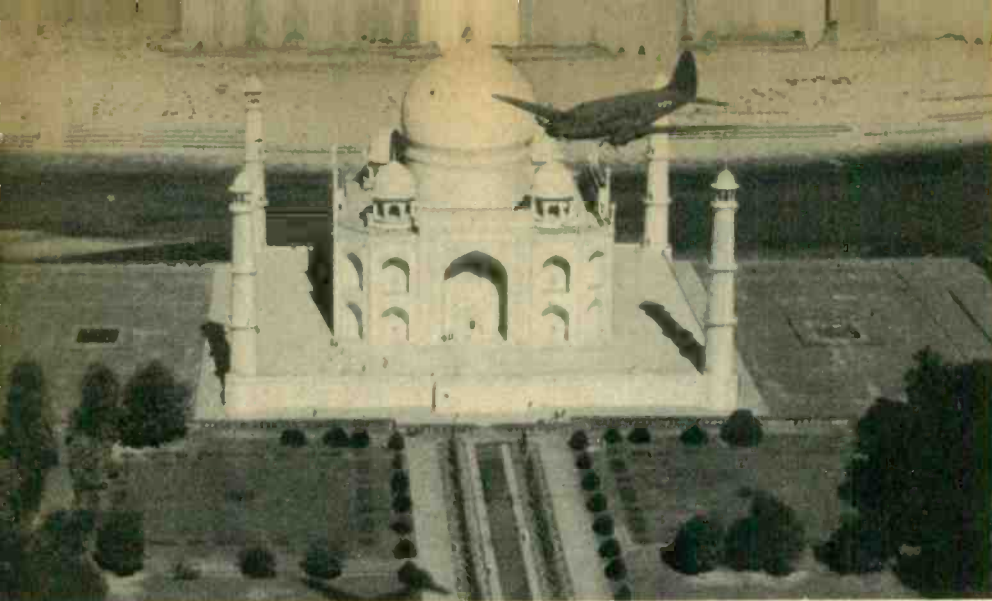

# Forty Thousand Miles in a "Plush Job"

*Harry Flannery Here Talks About His Recent Flight to Eighteen Eurasian Countries With A Four-Motored C-54 as his Seven-League Boots*

**J**ULES VERNE wrote a famous book called "Forty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea." I have recently completed a trip of some forty thousand miles over the seas.

This trip, through the Air Transport Command of the War Department, made in a "plush job," a four-motored C-54, was made to order for a radio analyst who has to talk about the world, its leaders, its peoples, and its problems. The speed of air and the prestige of the ATC and the United States government provided the opportunity to visit eighteen foreign countries in two months and talk with the leaders in most of those lands, as well as to live with and talk with enlisted men and officers all over the world, including those who occupied Germany, who guarded German prisoners behind barbed wire in Italy, SS behind double electrified barbed wire at the notorious Dachau concentration camp, veterans from the ETO being returned by air through Casablanca, the Negro troops who drive the Stillwell road, the men who fly the Hump, and those who went forth in the combined Chinese-American wing from Chekiang to bomb and strafe the Japs.

The project enabled me to have an audience with Pope Plus XII as he made his first pronouncement on the ethics of journalism, to meet with and learn to know General Lucian Truscott who succeeded Patton in Bavaria, Mountbatten in Ceylon,

Hurley, Wedemeyer, Chennault, Bowman, Randall and General Ho in China, Sultan and Wheeler in India, and to have luncheon with Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek in Sian, and ride with him and his second son to the Yellow River front at Tungwan.

### Ran Globular Gamut

Naturally much can be said of such impressions as the way the Germans looked curiously at us, sought to talk with me and looked bewildered as we strolled through the ruins of bombed Munich—about the threats of winter to restless Italy, the burning ghats, Parsee towers and squalor in Calcutta, India; the sensations of flying the Hump during the monsoon, and the destiny of a China with new opportunities.

China remains most in my memory because of the natural admiration for a hard-working, cheerful people, and because of the receptions we were given by applauding Chinese who with up-raised thumbs cried "Ding Hao," and the banquets we were accorded by the governors and generals as we entered each new Chinese province.

The Chinese receptions were accorded us because our party represented their friend, the United States. Because Chinese food in interior China is not Cantonese, a variation of which we get in United States Chinese restaurants, and because Chinese rice wine—jing pao juice—is the most difficult drink I've ever tried to quaff, making vodka, tequila and pure alcohol taste like smooth nectars, the receptions became somewhat of an ordeal. You get used, after a while, to trying to go through twenty courses, in eating soup and everything else from the same bowl in the middle of the

table, but I never learned to like jing pao juice.

### In a Spot

That was especially true because I somehow was maneuvered into being the party's toastmaster. When General Ho welcomed us in extravagant terms and proposed a toast to President Truman, I made the mistake of rising to speak in even more superlative terms of the Chinese and drinking to the Generalissimo. It was a mistake, I say, because on such a toast it is only proper to add the flourish, "Kan pei," which means bottoms up. That means you down the whole glassful at a gulp and then turn your glass upside down to demonstrate your faithfulness. The man who proposes the toast is stand-

ing and can't very well pass observation if he dared to spill a little on the tablecloth or floor, or toss a bit into a convenient fern. One toast would not be bad, but they continue in succession, a Ho for a Wedemeyer, a Soong for Hurley, another General-



**I**F THE Browns Derby had spread a huge welcome mat before its swinging door, it would have been well-trod by now. For nearly every great name of radio has sampled its delicious Turkey Derby (a specialty of the house) and gazed upon its fascinating portrait-lined wall.

To any stranger, tourist, and native of fabulous cinemaland, the Derby is a familiar by-word. And in radio circles, it's included in every vocabulary. So off went Radio Life with pad and pencil in grasp to give our readers a first-hand report of what's cooking at the Derby (ouch!) throughout the radio week.

A namesake of the squat-shaped Brown Derby on Wilshire Boulevard, the Hollywood eaterie is less spectacular in appearance. Located on Vine Street one block north of the NBC studios, it is the home (literally speaking) of every familiar face in Hollywood. Hundreds of bold black and white etchings peer from their tiers upon the wall at their flesh and blood counterparts dining below . . . or visa versa.

### Interesting Service

It is here that the public and celebrities alike eat their steaks and pie on uniformly patterned plates and drink their coffee from thick brown mugs. Pudding comes in an especially prepared dish and hash sizzles beneath a silver covering. Glassware is etched in miniature derbys.

But the topic of conversation is similar to that which can be heard at Brittingham's, Breneman's or the Paris Sweet Shop—Radio.

Upon chatting with amiable maitre d'Bill Chelios, Radio Life found that George Burns and Gracie Allen, Eddie Cantor and Jack Benny hold the record for being the Derby's oldest patrons. But at one time or another during the week, the Derby is visited

by nearly every radio celebrity, technician and executive.

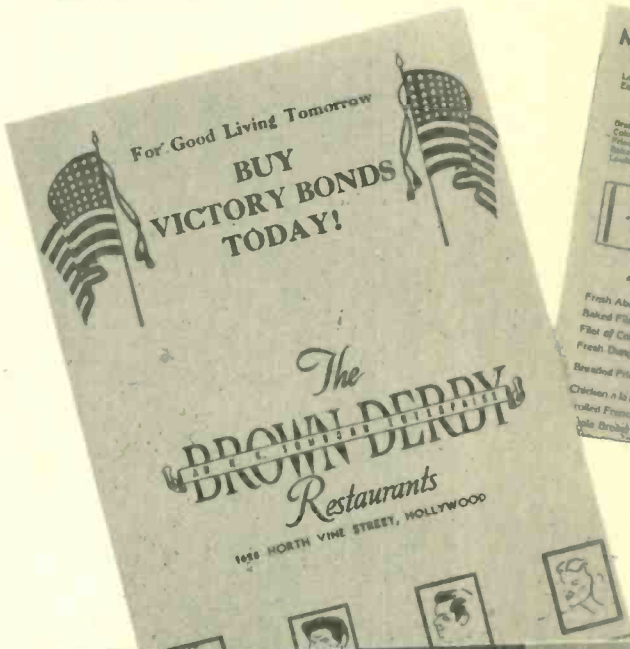
Joan Davis, Jack Haley, Hal Peary, Parkyakarkus, Ginny Simms and Fibber McGee and Molly have their favorite choice of table—and food . . . Hal Peary, "Great Gildersleeve," and his writers frequent the first leather booth of the Derby each Friday noon. Hal, it seems, has no preferences, but is a hearty eater. . . . On Saturdays, Jack Benny and his writers may be viewed in their favorite booth, surrounded by ham and eggs. Chelios confessed that Jack has ordered the same dish for years, and pointed out that ham and eggs is a standard dish for a major percentage of all writers. "Maybe it's brain food." On Tuesday, Amos and Andy prefer a booth in the rear and each invariably orders a dish of chicken broth, topped by a sandwich . . . Eddie Cantor is to be found at the Derby several days a week . . . while Ginny Simms weekly visits the eaterie between her radio shows, usually accompanied by her guest of the day . . . Sid Strutz, vice-president of NBC, Don Thornberg, vice-president of CBS and Don Searle, vice-president of ABC, each reserve their favorite booth daily . . . and Jack Haley may be seen supping following the completion of his Thursday night show.

**Program Born**

From a booth in the Derby grew radio's first big guest star program, "Hollywood Hotel." Many years ago when Louella Parsons was interviewing Clark Gable, she realized that here was a fertile field for an innovation on the ether, and discuss-

and habitues of auction galleries. Elman says "they know value and will not let me down." . . . Those in the studio have one minute in which to get in their bids after an item is announced. . . . When the highest studio bid gets under the wire, the radio audience is invited to submit its bids. . . . Elman calls this "Throwing the bidding open to the nation."

Two weeks are allowed for these bids to come in by mail or wire. . . . If none of the outside bids is better, the high studio bidder gets the item.

Here are some of the most famous items auctioned off on this program: Mark Twain's personal writing desk . . . a complete set of documents bearing signatures of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, including the rarest of all 56 signatures, that of Button Gwinnett . . . a bronze statuette of the poet Ruskin, by noted sculptor Gutzon Borglum . . . a letter from the late, great George Gershwin to his fellow composer Irving Caesar . . . an ancient theater "programme" listing author Charles Dickens in his only known appearance as an actor; a letter signed by Dickens . . . the will of Dolly Madison . . . a pair of dice belonging to Adolph Hitler . . . Reichsmarshal Hermann Goering's Iron Cross decoration . . . the original musical score of Rubinstein's "Melody in F" . . . the personal notebook of great Scottish poet Robert Burns . . . Abraham Lincoln's draft of the 13th amendment . . . a gold locket presented by Lincoln to General Grant, and bearing miniatures in gold of the two men.

Elman has twelve paid assistants aiding him in tracking down worthwhile items and he also gets the free-will services of a lot of experts interested in the show who know where and how certain things can be secured. Charles Masser Stowe, antique editor of New York Sun, is one of his experts. Museum people, art critics, even art teachers in colleges are among those to whom Elman goes for advice on authenticity of items. The critical opinion of Dr. Roy Chapman Andrews, famed explorer, was recently sought and obtained by Elman.

A special feature of "Radio Auction Show" is the surprise auction in which a participant purchasing a

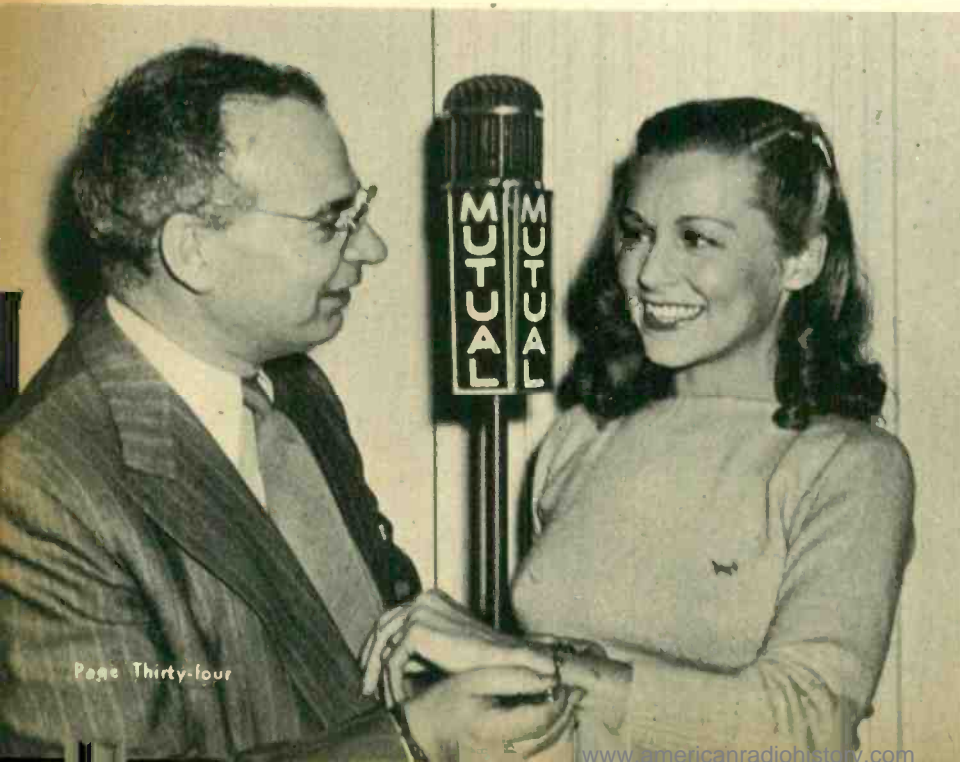
