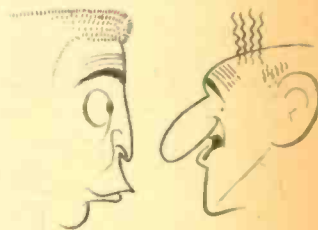

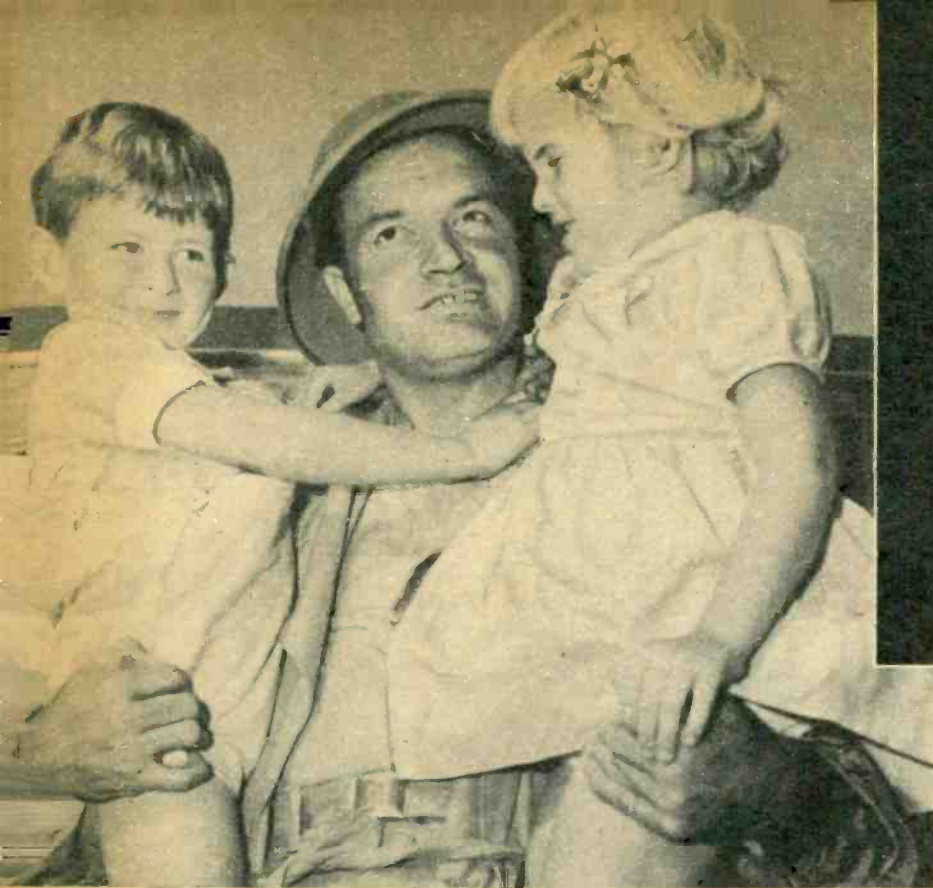

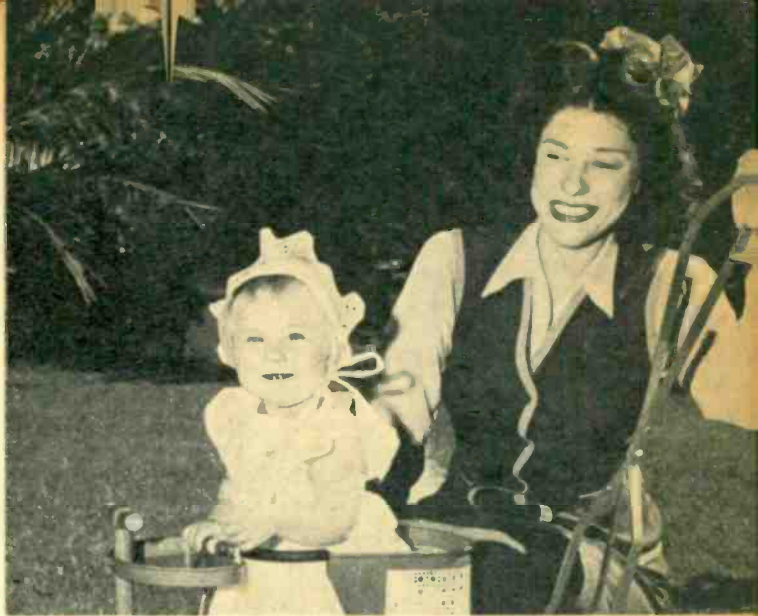

LaGuardia begins his commentary series over 198 stations of the American Broadcasting Company (KECA at 6:30 p. m.) Sponsored by Liberty Magazine, LaGuardia will combine his fiery personality and speech with his keen incisive understanding of events and people in the day's news, to provide radio with a new, vigorous and authoritative commentary.

Also new to the Sunday schedule on Jan. 6th, will be Galen Drake with his unhurried and philosophical view of events of the day. Drake will be heard over KECA at 12:15 p. m. Sundays, in addition to his 9 a. m. Saturday time.

Programs which move to new times effective the 6th, include "National Vespers," to be heard at 11:30 a.m., and the new "Hollywood Calling," musical variety show, which moves into the 4:30 p.m. slot. "Songs of the Nations" takes the 2 p.m. period, with India as the honored country that date.

The first three times, Cass had it slated to be sung on the Frank Morgan show on which she was featured several seasons ago. The first time the lyrics couldn't be cleared with the publisher in time for the broadcast. Then the death of President Roosevelt caused the program to be cancelled, and the following week a talk by Molotov again kept the show off the air. Recently Cass was set to sing it on her "Bandwagon" broadcast when music labor czar James Petrillo banned Artie Shaw's appearance on the program. Yes, she finally made it and the song is doing nicely!

Postmark Europe

Radio Life just received another interesting message from Anita Weber, CBS-er now stationed in Nite, France as a Red Cross worker. Anita writes: "I went to Switzerland recently, and to say that my nine days there were heavenly would be understatement. By all rights I was supposed to remain only a week, but I went two days AWOL—with no dire results, however, as I stayed with my relatives and did not go on the regular army tour. I stayed in Basel the entire time with the exception of two days when I entertained to Zurich.

"I lived in Basel until I was eight years old and had always wondered how I would feel visiting the places I used to know as a child. Art Baker had one of his happiest Christmases playing delivery man and go-between for Santa Claus at Corona Naval Hospital. He arranged for each of the 2900 boys there to write a letter to Santa Claus, then on his Notebook program, appealed to listeners to send in their letters, if they wanted to play Santa to one of the 2900 convalescents. He planned to plug the idea for ten days, but his first announcement brought in a flood of five thousand letters from those seeking to fill the needs of some lad. Eight thousand letters arrived after the second Notebook broadcast and the number jumped to twenty-two thousand within the next few days.

In all, more than thirty thousand had responded when we talked to Art, shortly before Christmas Day.

Typical of those answering the boys' letters was this one: "Here's a knitted piece for a hero, I hope the colors don't have to match. I'm blind."



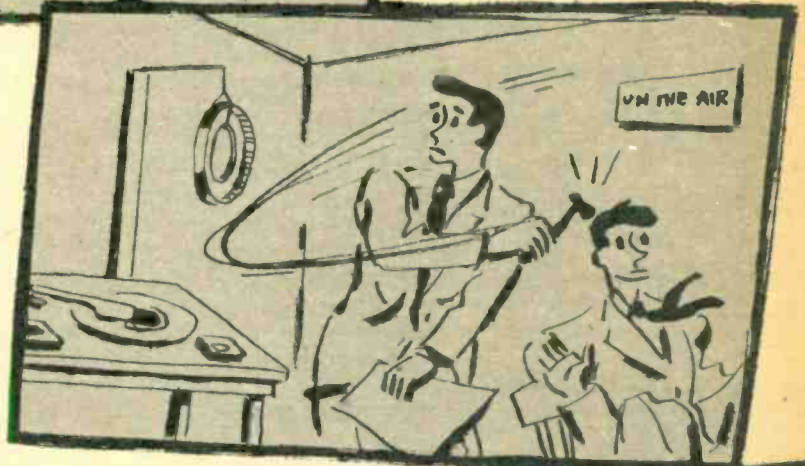
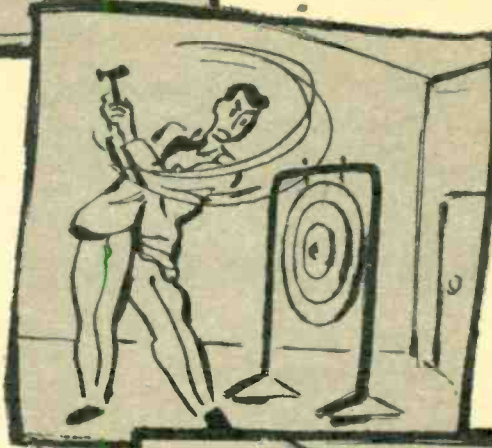

At exactly five minutes before air-time he was confronted by Don Lee news director Les Mawhinney, who showed him a bulletin nullifying the whole thing. Fuller was between the devil and the deep—he couldn't re-write the script, and at the same time Mawhinney told him that if he didn't correct the Berlin report on his news show, Mawhinney would have the bulletin read as a flash right afterwards. So Fuller took the bulletin into the booth with him, read the entire script as originally prepared, followed it with the bulletin, then calmly informed his listeners, "Well, I guess that takes care of that."

Missed the Gong

Jitters over a new sponsor can account for plenty of air trouble. Ruben Gaines and Bob Freed had been doing "The Frolics" successfully for months, yet when they went on the air for Western Auto Supply for the

The Moment That Seemed Like a Year



RADIO'S BAD moments come in all types and sizes... even when you're saying something you've said over a thousand times you can't always be sure how it will come out. "The following program is transcribed" is among radio's more famous phrases, and Ruben Gaines, KHJ-Don Lee staff writer and announcer is as well acquainted with that phrase as any man ever was, and yet it took Ruben to say "the following proscribe is transcrammed."

Sometimes it's a line in the script that becomes an insurmountable barrier. Usually a tongue-twisting line is taken out before airtime as a precautionary measure, but once in awhile one will slip in that won't reveal its lethal quality until the show is on the air. Tommy Dixon, announcer for "The Nebbs," remembers just such a line. It was on a home economics program he was emceeding for KHJ with Norma Young, and the phrase was "cracked crab salad." Three times Dixon tried for it and three times it came out "craped crag." He finally had to serve lettuce and tomatoes and let it go at that.

No! No?

Tommy's only other bad one was when he was delivering the first commercial for a brand new sponsor. The commercial read, "This item is not sold for less elsewhere," but the little imp that sits on the top of announcers' tongues during such critical moments didn't let it come out that way. Instead, to Tommy's surprise as well as the sponsor's, he said "This item is not selled less than elsewhere."

But it isn't announcements alone that are responsible for radio's bad

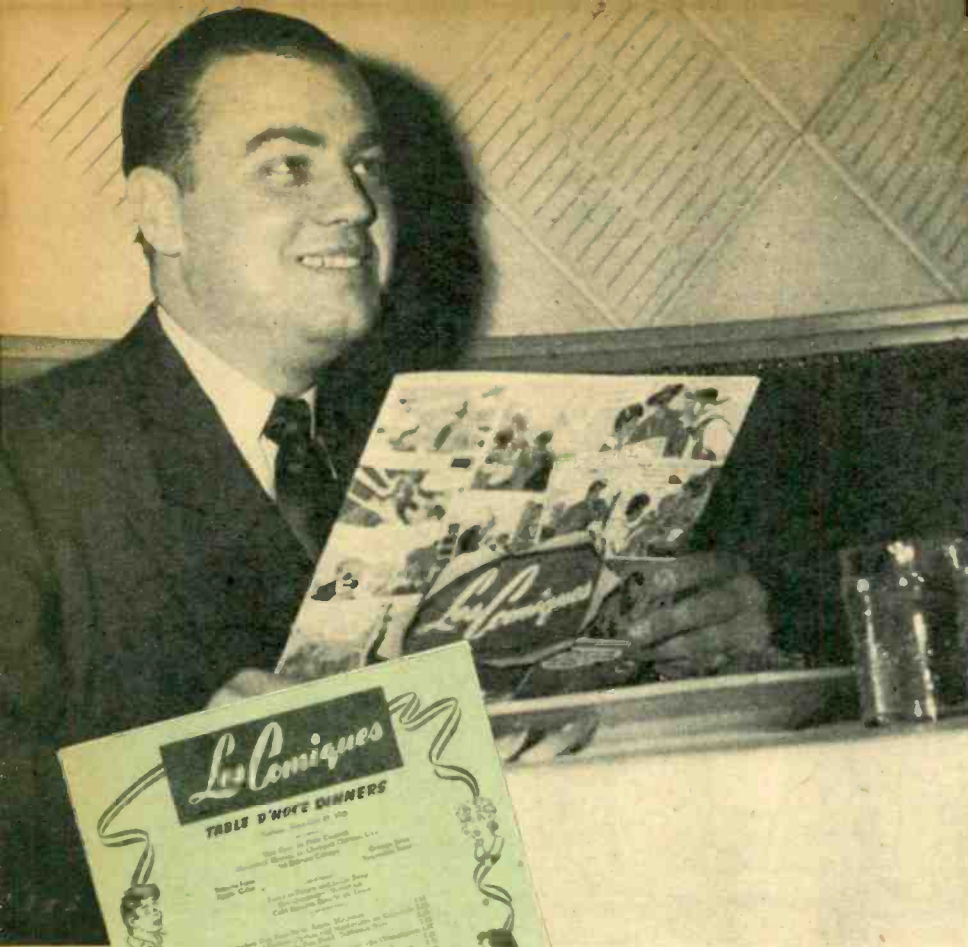
moments. Art Fulton, Mutual-Don Lee sound man, will never forget the time Buddy De Vito was reaching for a high note in a very romantic ballad and a prop pistol Art was holding went off with a terrific bang right on the note. And Syd Fuller, who does the Broadway news for KHJ, is living proof that newscasters have their trying times too.

It was on a Sunday before the end of the war, and as usual on Sundays, war news was slim. But there was a lengthy report picked up from Berlin

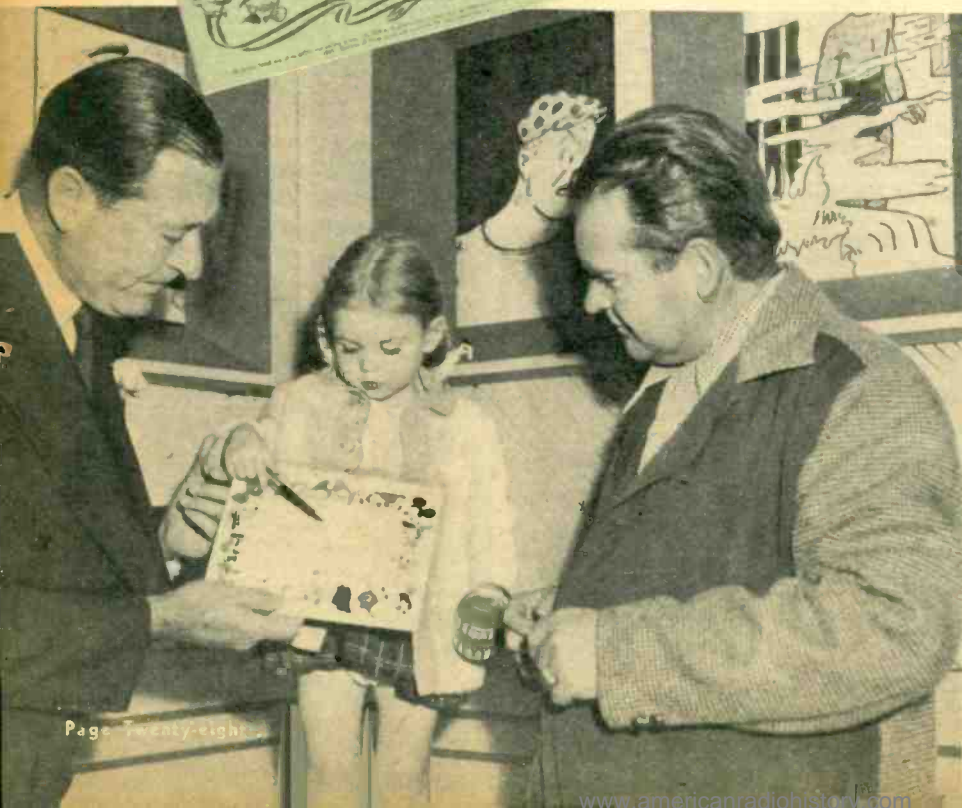

"The Joint" was then known as the "It," recalling Clara Bow once famous "It" girl of the films. Having survived the wrecking party, "It" is flourishing today as "Les Comiques."

Luncheon at Les Comiques always reveals a host of radio favorites. Located in the heart of the cinema capital and nestled in the Hollywood Plaza Hotel, it is noted for its convenience—and its delicious buffet table, a specialty of the house.

The wrecking party and the birth of Les Comiques were the ideas of an enterprising young restaurant man from Chicago, John Schlotter-

beck. Schlotterbeck figured that the party would not only hand the guests a good laugh but draw attention to the new eaterie he was planning. It did.

Notables Help Wreck

Following the party, Schlotterbeck opened the It to the public to see the extent of the damage. Such personalities as Leo Carrillo, Warner Baxter, Alec Templeton, Henny

Youngman, Jack Oakie, Ann Baxter and Martha O'Driscoll contributed to the It's downfall. You were welcome to write on the walls, break the china and glassware or throw a custard pie in your neighbor's face. Anything could happen.

In December of 1944, completely remodeled, Les Comiques opened. Upon its walls it bore the likenesses of nearly every character of funny

paper fame (hence Les Comiques); Schlotterbeck's idea being to present an un-Hollywood idea to Hollywoodians. They, of course, loved it and flocked to frequent its green-upholstered booths and partake of its tasty dishes, especially prepared by Chef Walter Luthe.

Maintaining a staff of fifty, twenty in food preparation and thirty in

ROCHESTER!" shouts Jack Benny into an NBC microphone.

"Comin', boss!" comes the sandpaper-voiced reply of Benny's gentleman's gentleman to end all gentleman's gentlemen—"Rochester Van Jones."

At the microphone is Eddie Anderson, dusky-skinned counterpart to the rib-tickling character he portrays on the air. Your Radio Life reporter attended the Sunday afternoon rehearsal of the Benny crew one recent afternoon and, when the opportunity came, cornered actor Anderson for a chat about himself.

In an idle interval during the preliminary script readings, "Rochester" joined us in front of the footlights, settled down in one of the studio's sea of empty theater seats, squirmed restlessly and tapped his dancing feet as we plied him for a few vital statistics—such as the fact that he is local boy, born in Oakland California, on September 18, 1905.

He smiled fondly on the subject of horses, his pet off-mike interest. He has trained thoroughbreds, owns several horses running at Bay Meadows, has a twenty-acre ranch in the valley on which he keeps a half dozen mares and a stallion imported from South America. He has been trying for years to persuade Jack Benny to be a horse-owner.

Is Hobbyist

In addition to his skill with horses, Anderson is a clever mechanic and carpenter. He has a workshop in back

of his home where he builds model railroads, planes and miniature racing automobiles.

"My model railroad's been packed away since the war, though," he told us. During the war, Eddie financed a friend's parachute factory. "I got a lot of publicity about it," he remarked then, "but it wasn't my idea at all."

He does have ideas of his own, however, and is holder of several patents for mechanical contrivances he has invented. His wife comments proudly, "There just isn't anything Eddie can't do."

The Andersons (Mrs. "Rochester" is Mamie Wiggins, a non-professional) live in Los Angeles with son Billy, whom Eddie says is "quite a sportsman."

Eddie himself enjoys all sports—fighting and football as well as horse-racing and raising. He goes to the movies and listens to the radio infrequently, has a phonograph collection ("that contains classics as well as hot numbers"), and likes to read ("mostly books about horses"). He has little taste for nightclubbing. "I worked in them too much," he reasons.

In school, Eddie had been encouraged to join the band. He took up the alto and had become proficient enough to play marches, but by the time he was out of school his love of rhythm and music had gone to his feet.

Was Dance Instructor

He became a dancer, and during one-time he taught the art. "It's only necessary to learn the fundamentals from a teacher," he explains. "After that, you should get in front of a mirror and work up your own steps and routines. In five minutes, I can tell a real dancer from one who's been taught to dance."

Anderson's family was in show business. His mother was one of the few Negro women tight-wire artists; his father sang with the Richards and Pringle Minstrels, Howe's Greater London Circus and with Fordham's Medicine Show.

Eddie was in his early 'teens during World War I and with his brother, Lloyd, sang and danced wherever soldiers were gathered. They were spotted by Edith Sterling, cowgirl and wife of Art Acord, movie cowboy. The Acords got the Anderson boys a job in a company that was trouping from San Francisco to San Diego and back. Eddie's contribution to the show, believe it or not, was a Russian dance!

Later, Eddie's other brother, Cornelius ("Corny" for short) joined them and together the boys billed themselves as the "Three Black Aces."

It was in 1924 that "Rochester" to-be had his first chance to read a comedy line, in a show called "Stepping High" in the town of Sapulpa, Oklahoma.

In 1935, filmgoers will remember seeing Eddie as "Noah" in "Green Pastures." A series of screen successes followed including a lead role in "Cabin in the Sky." Anderson's forthcoming film appearance is with Phil Harris in "Everybody Loves a Bandleader."

How "Rochester" Born

"Rochester" came into being when the Benny scripters wrote an episode taking place aboard the San Francisco Chief, during which Jack exchanged dialogue with a Pullman porter. An audition was held to cast the part. Eddie Anderson was the second actor heard, and the remaining four were never auditioned. Benny listened to Eddie's "Rochester" delivery, turned to his writers and decreed, "He's got it. Get him."

The listeners felt the same way about Eddie's "Rochester." The Pullman porter became Benny's "man Sunday."

Coming in on cue, at this point in our chat, Benny bellowed, "Rochester!"

"Comin', boss!" smiled Eddie, and "Rochester" stepped to the microphone again.

first time recently, nothing went right with the show. The theme somehow got put on in the middle of the program; the records were spun at the wrong speed; and Ruben, who is supposed to ring a gong, found he'd forgotten to put it where he could reach it. He finally managed to get to it—swung—and missed!

Often the times that an announcer wants to be particularly silk-hat turn out to be his worst moments. Jim Thomas, now producing "Rogue's Gallery" and "Murder Is My Hobby" among others for Mutual-Don Lee, will never forget the time he was once announcing a classical musical program and presented Smetanoff's "Battered Bride." And Bob Freed once ad-libbed an introduction for a very famous group of concert musicians. He got as far as "We are most fortunate to be able to present at this time the So-and-So salon . . ." and then his mind blanked out. For the life of him, he couldn't think of the proper word. The seconds were ticking by and he had to say something . . . anything . . . so of all words he picked on "bunch!"

Sometimes the forces that get shows tangled up are beyond control. On a recent "Red Ryder" program, Red and Little Beaver were supposed to be in a deep, dark cave, danger

lurking around every stalactite, with a dank, unearthly quiet over everything broken only by their hushed whisperings and the faint re-echoings of a few pebbles they were desperately trying not to dislodge. The scene was building itself up to a terrific climax when through the speaker in the control room came the unmistakable beat of a piano hitting out eight-to-the-bar. Engineers and producers went gray before they discovered that Harry Zimmerman and the Four Lyttle Sisters were rehearsing for "California Melodies" in the room next to the echo chamber, and the sound was leaking through.

Bloody Episode

Elliott Lewis, who plays "Archie" on "The Amazing Nero Wolfe," will never forget the time a sound man raised up suddenly under a brake drum which was being used as a gong on the program he was working. The man hit the drum such a crack that he cut the top of his head open. He stood there, dazed, the blood streaming down his face and covering his clothes. Someone stepped over quickly and took him off the stage, and the cast had to continue with the broadcast not knowing whether he was dead or alive.

Forgotten scripts can be quite a problem. Lois January got so flustered by a New York air raid that she left hers in her apartment. There was no time to go back after it; she ad-libbed her entire hour-long show, and had the pleasure of hearing fans afterward tell her it was one of the best she'd ever done.

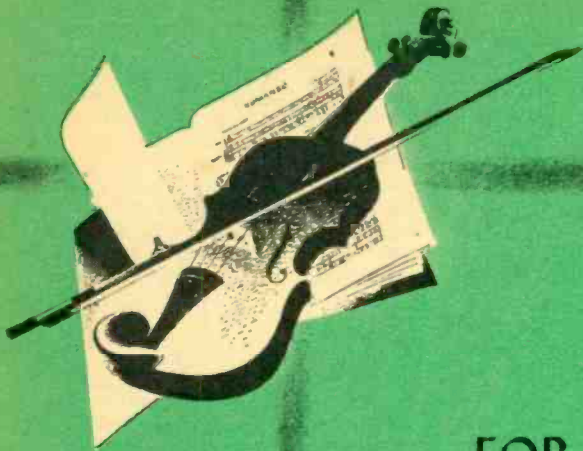
Forgotten appointments can be a problem too. The Andrews Sisters once gave Hollywood commentator Erskine Johnson a bad time by not showing up until the program had been on the air five minutes. But the worst time Johnson ever had was when he was broadcasting on another Los Angeles station. The program preceding his had ended, Johnson was cued on by his producer, and was well into the script when he was suddenly stopped cold by the voice of the producer who had come out of the booth and into the studio.

"I can't stand this stuff night after night!" he screamed.

Johnson's eyes nearly fell out of his head, but he kept on reading.

"How can YOU read it every night?" the producer demanded.

Johnson, sure the man had gone mad, kept on, waiting for the announcer to lead him away to the wagon which must be waiting. But the announcer instead took up where the producer left off, and between them they out-screamed Johnson into the worst time he ever hopes to have. Finally, bested by their shouting, Johnson laid down his script, his radio career ended. It wasn't until they both burst out laughing that Erskine realized that the date was April first.
