**ANOTHER DAVIS MAKES GOOD!** To the list of Joan and Bette add the name of Los Angeles' own Joel. With nine years' experience behind him, and ambitious to be a star, he can't miss.

**T**HE first thing we spied when we peeked into Joel Davis' scrapbook was a picture of an adorable chubby, bright-eyed, curly-haired cherub of three grinning up at us.

"Ooooh!" we sighed.

"Aw," said the twelve-year-old Joel glancing at the three-year-old Joel and growing pink up to his ears, "that old thing shouldn't be there!" When a man has attained the age of comic books, is in the eighth grade at Mar-Ken school and is heard on a network show every week, he doesn't like having his infantile past dug up again, we found out. But it was at the age of three that Joel Davis informed his contemporaries that he was going to be a star. And it looks as if he knew what he was talking about even then.

He started appearing in pictures at that age. His stage work includes several appearances at Pasadena Playhouse—Saroyen's "Jim Dandy" with Louise Allbritton, "Lady of Belmont" and Ibsen's "Little Evolf." It was in the latter play that Joel proved he was of the stuff that troupers are made. It was his first stage appearance—and he got the mumps! Friend Tommy Cook subbed for a couple of performances and then, with the doctor's permission, Joel went on—mumps and all.

### McGeehan Brings Luck

On Christmas Day, three years ago, Joel made his first radio appearance. Pat McGeehan was in the cast, and Joel shortly afterward worked with McGeehan on many of the Bullock's shows. He thinks McGeehan is "lucky" for him.

When we asked him who his favorite actors were, he looked very thoughtful. "Well—I'll have to consider it for a while," he said, and propped his face on his hand while he devoted some serious thinking to the subject. "I haven't got a favorite," he announced—"I've got four—

Pat McGeehan, Ozzie Nelson, Wally Maher and Joe Kearns." He confided that he was enjoying his work on the Ozzie Nelson—Harriet Hilliard show best of anything he has done. He has met David Nelson, whom he portrays on the air, several times at broadcasts, and at Joel's twelfth birthday party David was an honored guest.

Joel laughed when we asked him if his mother coached him with his script. "She knows even less about acting than I do." Joel's mother admitted that she was woefully uninformed about acting technique. "Joel reads his script cold at first rehearsal with the rest of the actors. Frankly, I don't know enough about it to interfere." This wise attitude probably accounts for the fact that while Joel is in front of the microphone he is a professional actor—who gets no special attention because he happens to be only twelve. And, away from the mike, Joel is a real boy—not a professional child.

### Really Bad Dream

He has never fluffed on the air and has never been unsure of himself or nervous. "Oh—I had a dream the other night," he said, "I had a radio dream about fluffing. First radio dream I've ever had. I dreamt that I was the star of my own network show, and we went on the air without a rehearsal. I went over and picked up my script—and what do you think??"

We said we couldn't imagine!

"Well—it was all written out in long hand in red pencil—in my own handwriting—and I couldn't read a single word of it! I fluffed all over the place!"

"No wonder," said his mother, "if it was in *your* handwriting. No one can read it anyway." Joel sadly admitted that this was the case.

Mathematics, however, is a different thing—it's his favorite subject. As for hobbies, he says that he's started making model airplanes, but has never finished any. "Comic books," sighed Mrs. Davis, "that's his full time hobby." Joel gave an eloquent plea in defense of comic books. "I got an A mark in history once because the test asked something I had just been reading about in one of my comic books," he averred.

"Do you know what my dog, Lady, gave me for a Christmas present," he asked. "A litter of nine puppies! That'll be a sort of hobby." Sort of?

Joel is a native Los Angelen who has never been farther away from his home town than Palm Springs and San Juan Capistrano to see the Mission. "And I'm never going to leave, either," he insisted.

"But, Joel," said Mrs. Davis, "if you want to be a star you'll have to go to New York to do a stage play some day." Joel just smiled and said he'd never consider leaving—star or no star.

Another one sent me two dozen boot-ees, and another one sent me a skunk lapel pin. Bet she thought I stink! Another lady brought me a box of fried chicken and one lady has kept me in bacon for three months. I get about three pounds of fudge a week. I won't need to buy wool sox all winter. sits her down on his knee to drink it. The excitement of this tete-a-tete dispels nervousness, claims Bailey. But here's a tip to all you women hoping to attend "Queen for a Day." Don't, under any circumstances, while Jack is selecting contestants during the warm-up, pipe up and say, "If I'm queen, I want to go out with Jack Bailey." If you do, you have Jack's word for it, you don't get on the show.

Nor do you get on if you follow Bailey on his search through the audience, tugging at his sleeve and trying to get his ear by tweaking it. And if you accuse him of having "plants" in the audience, he might get so mad he'd throw the crown at you. "I talk to sixty or seventy candidates every day," averred Jack, explaining that producer Bud Ernst helps him with half the number to save time. "Lately, they all want to tell what Alka-Seltzer did for their cousin Mamie" (Alka-Seltzer, as you know, recently became co-sponsor of the show with Proctor and Gamble).

At this point of our chat with Jack, he was slowed down to a sip on his fourth cup of coffee. Mrs. Bailey hove

# Talent, Unlimited

THE MOST DIFFICULT voice Walter Craig has ever matched is that of Harry S. Truman. He does the President's voice in a new movie, "Out of the Depths". To prepare for this assignment, he sat in the Newsreel Theater for hours listening to a speech by the Chief Executive.

*Be It Benny or Bergman, Walter Craig Can Match Almost Anybody's Voice, and Also Act, Dance, Sing, Skate—and Cook!*

**I**N SPITE of the fact that he can "make like a push-button radio," versatile young Walter Craig made one request of us. "Don't call me an impersonator." A "voice-matcher," Walter wants it made clear that he does not attempt to impersonate the stars physically, as a night club mimic does. He limits his mimicry to sound alone, save for his take-offs on Joan Davis and Bette Davis. One of his favorites for laughs is to do the latter's voice and exaggerated "swishy" walk.

Radio-dialers heard Walter Craig frequently on CBS' "Which is Which" series, the show that defied listeners to distinguish the voices of star-mimics from those of the real McCoy. On that program, Walter did the voices of a variety of personalities, including Katherine Hepburn, Ronald Colman, John Wayne, Jimmy Fidler, Franklin Pangborn and Talulah Bankhead.

How does he go about duplicating a voice? He studies 1) the voice pattern (in this factor, Fidler and Winchell are, of course, among the easiest); 2) the inflection and/or accent; 3) "then," Walter concluded matter-of-factly, "I just put them together and give it voice."

The most difficult voice he has ever matched is that of Harry S. Truman. He does the President's voice in a new Columbia film, "Out of the Depths." To prepare for this assignment, he sat in the Newsreel Theater for hours listening to a speech by the Chief Executive.

### Without Hearing

Once, when he was called upon to double Dennis O'Keefe's voice he scoured the town to find one of the actor's movies. In most instances, he

tries to secure a record of the performer's voice to study. On a recent show, however, he impersonated musical conductor Robert Armbruster without ever having heard the man talk. "I just did it from a description of his voice," Craig explained. "I was told afterward that it was an almost perfect duplication, but I'm still waiting for the chance to hear Armbruster's actual voice so I can see how close I came."

On many occasions when Walter is called for a radio role, he finds that the producer doesn't want an exact duplication of a personality's voice, but rather the same voice-type. "I frequently do Alan Ladd or Humphrey Bogart gangsters or a Franklin Pangborn hotel clerk," Craig clarified.

Twenty-one-year-old Walter has done parts ranging in age from eight to eighty. He doesn't limit his activities to voice-matching, enjoys straight acting and particularly doing dialects. He is currently studying with dialectician Gertrude HARRISE.

Born in Temple, Oklahoma, and raised in Tulsa, young Walter began his career when he was only nine. He had seen a marionette show at the World's Fair and came home and built one of his own, "using my mother's living room drapes for curtains." In a few weeks, nine-year-old Walter was giving regular performances, taking in substantial box-office receipts and paying three girls to work for him!

### 18 Months in Service

By the time he was fifteen, Walter had done three seasons in summer stock and was heading for New York to do a Broadway show. He played "John" in "Life with Father," then interrupted his career with his enlistment in the Navy. He served for

a year and a half as a yeoman in Ship's Company at Great Lakes, then received an honorable medical discharge and the advice to come to California for the climate. That was two years ago.

In Hollywood, he worked at both NBC and CBS as a page-boy at night, and during the day as a dance-extra in pictures, appearing in some thirty-five films altogether. "I had never danced before," Walter related. "I took lessons in tap, ballet and jitterbugging."

The youthful actor still does movie work, dubs voices in film cartoons, and is currently appearing as an ice-skater in "Till the End of Time."

Ice-skating, bowling and tennis are the actor's favorite sports. His hobbies are music (he plays the clarinet and has a collection of records, ranging from jazz to the classics), and the framed autographed pictures of the stars that decorate the walls of his five-room Hollywood apartment. He does his own housekeeping, washing, ironing and cooking. Irish stew is his specialty. (He isn't married, girls, but there's a girl in the picture who would offer some serious competition.)

In addition to all the foregoing activities, the amazing young Mr. Craig attends college five hours a day, is a stenotypist, and names writing as one of his favorite pursuits. He pens his own audition scripts, authors short stories and works steadily on what he hopes will some day be a best-selling novel. The latter is his biggest ambition.

His biggest problem? Trying to find his own voice after a week of radio work that has him talking like everybody else from Jean Hersholt to Hedy Lamarr!

### Now We Know

The mysterious "Mr. Hush" certainly caused a dead silence in NBC's "Truth or Consequence" studio two Saturdays ago. For five long weeks, thousands of listeners had been asking themselves "Who is he?", but it took a twenty-two-year-old Ensign to supply the correct answer — *Jack Dempsey*.

You know the story of how emcee Ralph Edwards and his clever cohorts cooked up an idea of presenting the voice of an unidentified American. Each week, "Mr. Hush" gave a fifteen second clue about himself, but apparently in vain. Yet it was this which gave the key to Ensign Dick Bartholomew of Fayetteville, Arkansas, and plunked \$13,500 worth of gifts into his lap.

He had no intentions of becoming a contestant and barely knew a thing about "Mr. Hush." When he heard that week's rhyming clue, "Hickory, dickory, dock, the clock struck ten, lights out, good night," he figured it might be a prize fighter and chanced a guess of Jack Dempsey.

He not only stunned emcee Edwards into silence but the studio audience as well. Then bedlam broke loose. The NBC switchboard was flooded with calls asking to talk to Dick and he found upon answering a few that people wanted everything from the nylons he had won to becoming his wife. The latter was out, he told us.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert P. Bartholomew heard the program and called him immediately. His mother is quoted as saying, "I'm not worried about anything except the silver fox coat and the diamond ring. Don't let them out of your sight." (We forgot to mention that Ensign Dick was the recipient of a thousand dollar fox coat, ring, watch, a two-year supply of nylons, a 1946 Mercury, RCA Victory radio-victrola, records, piano, maid service for a year, refrigerator, vacuum cleaner, two complete wardrobes and two exciting trips.

Dick, who is not married, was most excited over the Mercury and the trip to Baniff Springs, which he intends taking after his imminent discharge from service.

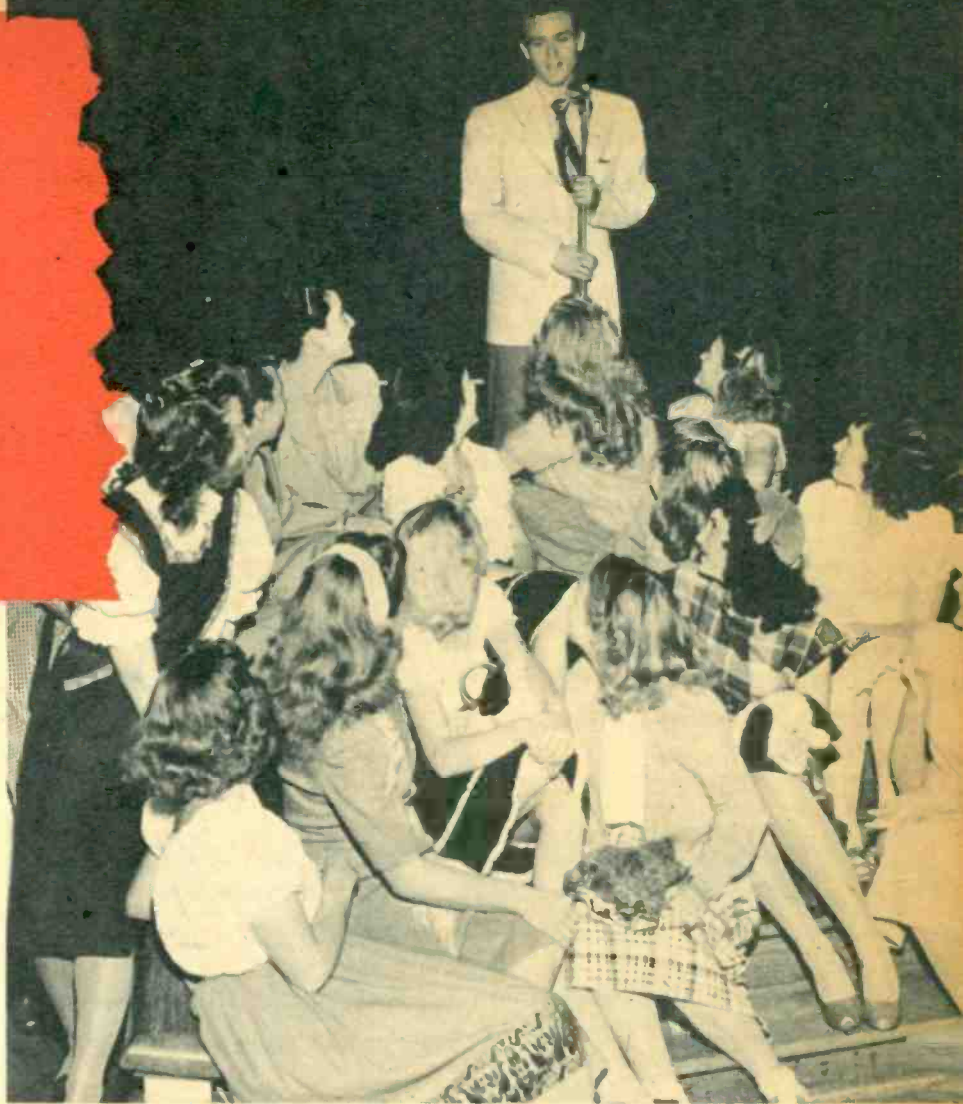

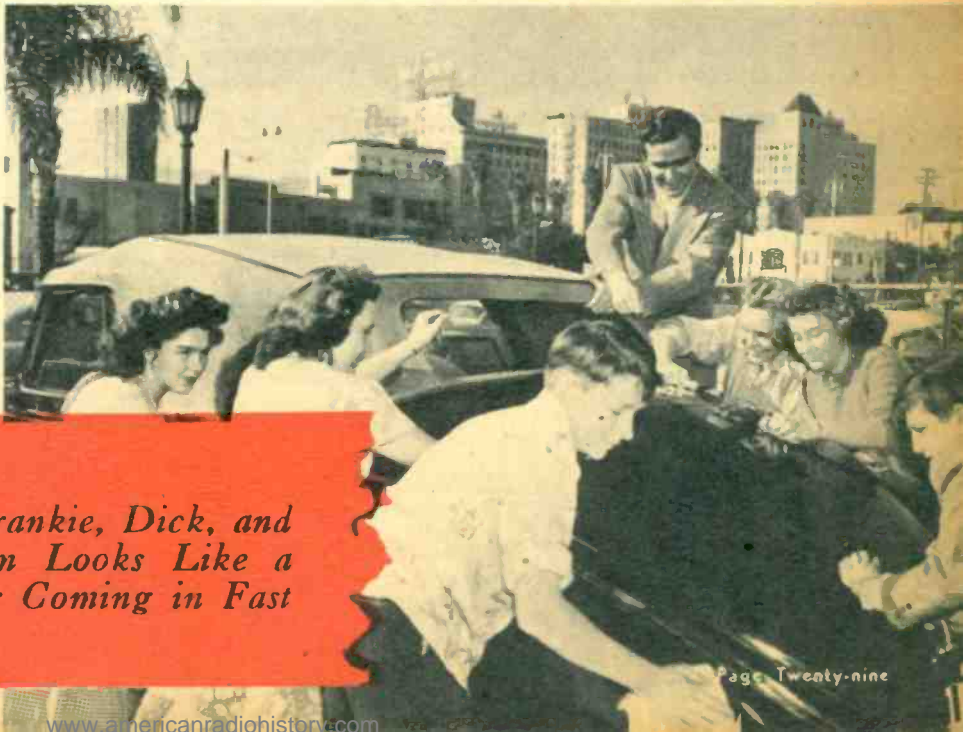

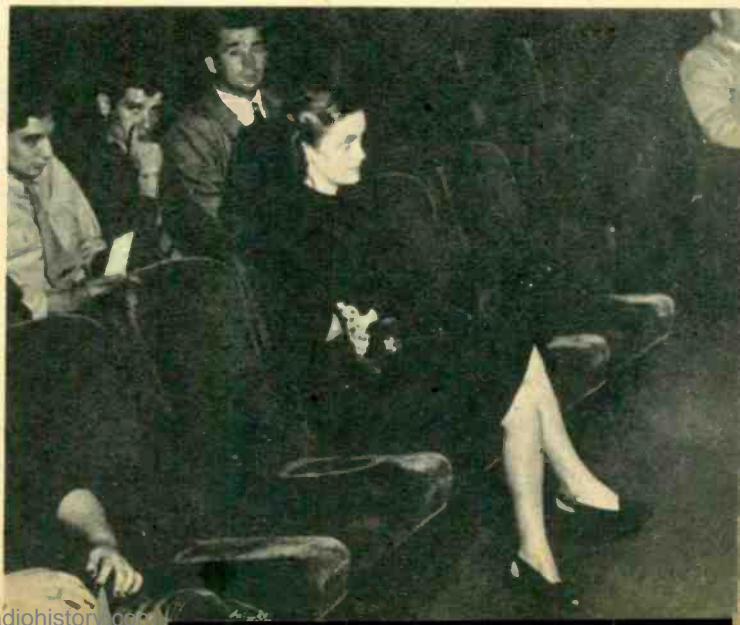

I 'VE never been down, but what I've come up again—swinging with both hands," smiled actress Martha Wentworth. "I've had some hard times (and who hasn't?) but luckily enough there has always been a follow-up for Martha."

Clever character actress Wentworth had dropped by Radio Life's busy office last week (at our request) to tell us about her twelve years of experience. But it didn't take us long to learn that there were many important activities, in addition to the seven-a-day week radio chores, in her busy life.

There is husband Robert Schopfer who is an announcer for Station KFAC; son, Al Otto, who, at this writing is in service, but upon discharge intends to form his own band titled "Alotta Music"; and daughter, Mrs. Milton B. Scott.

We also learned that Martha is the type of person to whom her friends flock with their troubles. "I love it," she smiled, "because I love helping people. It's sort of a hobby of mine."

## Activity At Peak

She confides she's happiest when she's doing something for somebody. "I detest inactivity, but right now I'm busier than I've ever been. In fact, my husband and I go for days without seeing one another. He's a wonderful sport about it and whips up the best can of beans you ever saw."

It's little wonder Martha's rarely home, for as one of the industry's most demanded players, she can be heard on such favorites as "This Is My Best," "Suspense," "Sherlock Holmes," "Aunt Mary," "Cavalcade,"

"Stars Over Hollywood" and many others. Her favorite characterization (one she originated and portrayed for five years) was "Nancy," the Old Witch, on "Witches Tales."

Radio for Martha began in the winter of 1933. An ex-musical comedy star, New England stock player, and teacher of dramatics, she found herself with a wealth of training with which to enter this new medium of entertainment. In November of the above year she had her first part in "Calling All Cars."

"Those days were grand," she reminisced. "There were such novices as Bill Goodwin, Don Wilson and Elvia Allman. We learned together and are the best of friends."

Then followed many years of ether portrayals as a capable dialectician, dowagers, old hags, young women and even crying babies. This made Martha a target for flickers.

## In Welles' Movie

In 1939 she played a cockney in "Waterloo Bridge." More recently

she can be viewed in Clark Gable's new movie "Adventure" and the 20th-Century picture "Fallen Angel." But her best break to date has been the choice role of Sara in Orson Welles' forth-coming picturization of "The Stranger."

Martha raves about the incorrigible Mr. Welles, who, in turn, praises her work highly. She considers him one of the finest artists in both pictures and on the radio. But she wouldn't forsake the ether for the celluloid.

When red-headed, blue-eyed Martha takes time from her duties before the mike, she swings a mean golf club and is an excellent rider. She has no "tangible" hobby, but claims if she had one, it would be doing for others.

"I try not to forget my lean times and how hard they were to bear," she philosophically summed up, "by showing others that there can be good times, too. I'm always willing to share anyone's burden—because I know there is always a follow-up."

ing in an upstairs room on Main Street in 1908, and is largely the result of the work of two men, Lyman Stewart and T. C. Horton.

Teachers were secured and school was begun in the basement of the building of another downtown church, where classes were conducted for three years. Since those early days of the Institute, some 7390 students have worked within its walls.

Among Biola's distinguished alumni are Donald Grey Barnhouse, pastor of the 10th Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia and editor of the Revelation Magazine; Charles E. Fuller, director of the "Old-Fashioned Revival Hour" and nationally-known evangelist; and Percy Crawford, pastor of the Young People's Church of the Air and president of King's College.

The primary work of the Bible Institute of L. A. is the training of students in the day school (seven hundred at present), but its other ministries include: an evening school conducted three nights weekly; a completely equipped Bible Institute in Central China owned and operated by Biola; a summer school offered to ministers, missionaries and lay workers who desire to add to their knowledge of the Bible; a correspondence school offering nineteen different courses by mail to students in all parts of the world; a school of sacred music; girls clubs conducted throughout Southern California by Biola women; a Jewish Department; an extension department offering Bible Conference speakers, missionary leaders and help to local churches; and Biola's radio ministry, the Bible Institute of the Air.
