





URT MASSEY was a mass (six foot plus, 200 pounds plus) of enthuslasm as Radio Life cornered him for a chat following his Wednesday night vocal gymnastics on the Andrews Sisters' CBS airshow.

"One show a week," he beamed, knocking on some nearby wood. "Isn't it wonderful!" Life, in fact, seemed to be wonderful all over for this tall, dark balladeer as he commented contentedly about California, his home and family, and his ether career.

A fugitive from sunrise shows and the five-a-day grind of the theater circuit, Curt calls his current schedule "a vacation". He loves radio, is an air veteran, and only worries when he has to inject visual entertaining into his microphone chores. "I don't go much for playing to the studio audience," he pointed out. "I think the microphone should have the performer's undivided attention."

Now delivering modern romantic ballads with his smooth baritone voice, Curt Massey began his musical career as a baton-wielder (at Kansas City's million-dollar ballroom, the Pla-Mor), then became a singer of western songs with "The Westerners", an instrumental-vocal group made up mostly of members of his own family.

#### Louise, His Sister

The youngest of eight children, Curt was born in Midland, Texas, and raised on a ranch near Roswell,

New Mexico. His folks still live in this locale and nearby is his sister's ranch. Louise Massey, feminine member of "The Westerners", retired from radio some time ago.

Music was an integral part of the Massey family life. Curt's father, Henry Austin Massey, is a champion old time fiddler of the southwest. Curt himself plays the violin, trumpet and piano, and has made music a part of his own home life now. His son, Stevie, is only four and a half, but already joins his father in impromptu piano-trumpet duets—with Stevie manning the trumpet!

Curt composes songs with the ease that he sings and plays them. Tunes he has penned include "The Honey Song," "Venuti Blues" and "Draggin' the Bow" (the latter two, special violin numbers).

The Massey manse is located in Beverly Hills. It is a big house ("bigger than we need, but we took what we could get"), with four radios and a loud-speaker system to carry music into every room.

#### **Another Massey**

Mrs. Curt Massey is the former Edythe Williams, a non-professional whom Curt met during his appearance at the Pla-Mor. The Masseys expect a second child come next May, the month of son Stephen's birth. "Stevie," smiled Curt, "tells everybody that he's going to get a baby sister for his birthday."

Away from the microphone, Massey wields a golf club with the skill of a professional player (and has the trophies to prove it!) "I'm a good golfer, and don't have to be modest about it," he grinned. "I've devoted almost as much time to the game as a professional."

Hunting and photography are among Massey's other spare time pursuits, and when we expressed surprise at the fact that this ex"Westerner" and graduate of real ranch life didn't live in the "wide open spaces" of the San Fernando Valley, Curt quickly dispelled our disappointment.

"We're looking for a place out there," he smilingly notified us—and knocked on wood again!

# RADIO: West \* National and International

Television

Television came a foot nearer to rounding that corner around which it's been lurking for so long when NBC set up its Hollywood Television Department last week. Hal Bock, head of NBC's Western Division Press and Public Relations, was named boss of the newly-formed department.

Announcing NBC's plans, John F. Royal, network vice-president in charge of television, admitted that his visit to Hollywood was prompted by a desire to contact motion picture studios with the idea of making tie-ups for television films. Royal stated that television sets would be ready for the public about June 1, with prices starting at \$150 and rising to \$400. Eighteen television applications from this area are now on file with the FCC. NBC, he said, would be able to start regular schedules of telecasting within a year after receiving its local license.

#### AFRS Continues

Radio Lifers whose men-folk are still in service will be happy to learn these facts concerning the Armed Forces Radio Service:

AFRS still has 230 broadcasting stations bringing its programs to servicemen. throughout the world. AFRS program production here in Los Angeles is still being kept at full speed. During December, AFRS wrote, produced and transcribed 362 original radio shows ("Command Performance" "Mail Call", "Jubilee", etc.); it ranscribed 441 top programs from the four major networks; its shortwave offices in New York, San Francisco and Honolulu shortwaved 4,430 hours of news, sports, special events and entertainment, wrote ninety-six scripts for its script kit, added eighty-four new numbers to its basic music library of 3,704 selections, and shipped 119,756 AFRS plastic 16-inch transcriptions, of which the ships of the U. S. fleet received 28,140 discs.

Each GI station overseas is still receiving sixty hours of AFRS special shows and decommercialized network programs weekly via air transport from AFRS headquarters in L. A.

#### Success Story

The sultry songstress who is heard Monday nights on KECA's new halfhour variety show, "Sunset and Highland Fling," is Ginny Sellers of ABC's publicity department. "It was all a surprise—and such a nice one!" exclaimed Ginny when we talked with her on the phone the other morning. "They called me just two days before the show started, so there was no time to be scared."

This is the young singer's first bow on the Hollywood airlanes, but she is no newcomer at a microphone, having worked on every station in Seattle, in a variety of capacities. She has been associated with Bob Nichols and appeared with him on a popular morning airshow in Seattle that was, she explains, "a cross between Al Pearce and Tom Breneman."

Ginny has picked some nice footsteps in which to follow, having studied singing at King Bing's alma mater, and made transcriptions with Crosby's guitarist, Perry Botkin. It was these transcriptions which led to her Hollywood air debut.

He has twenty-four pianos to watch over and it seems every one of them takes a beating every day (average use, ten hours). "We should have new planos every four years", Hei said wistfully, "but our oldest ones are nine, now, because the war more or less cut off our supply." That makes a four-year-old piano "comparatively new."


Whether a show needs one, two, or sometimes three pianos, Hei says he sees to it that every instrument is in tune before it goes on the air.

It would induce instrumental long. evity, he claims, if performers wouldn't drop hair pins, paper clips, cigar butts, and pencils into pianos' innards and if persons looking for places to dump their water, chocolate malts, and coffee would have some consideration for a piano's sensitive nature.

Someday soon, we hope Hei will get whole family of sprightly young pianos that'll require the minimum of nursing along. naturally laughed no matter how serious he tried to be.

Another early ambition was thwarted when his voice changed when he was thirteen—and his beautiful singing voice disappeared. With typical Lee luck—this had to happen the night before he had signed to go on tour with the late Gus Edwards' famous kid act. Pinky clowned his way through school, taught himself dancing. "I've been expelled from more schools and oftener than anybody!"

#### More Soap

Pinky once took a job with a soap company in his home town of St. Paul, Minnesota. It was against his better judgment, but his father insisted he try something besides show business. "An actor is always a pretty good salesman," lisped Pinky, "and in no time at all I sold more soap than anybody they'd ever had." He wound up his sudsy career by selling a carload and a half of soap to a firm because he had given the president's daughter a tap lesson while he was waiting. "I always dance a little bit when I'm nervous," he explained. "I still do. When the little girl asked me to show her a few steps—I taught her in ten minutes what dancing schools take a month to do. So she made her father listen to my sales talk." Pinky got a raise out of this deal, was made district sales manager of three states and was given a two percent interest in the company. Then he decided that it was not soap—at any price, it was show business for him. He's been in it ever since.

It had always been his big ambition to crash radio, but something always happened to jinx it. Back in 1934 he did a comedy spot on the old "Carefree Carnival" and his mother heard him on the air for the first time. She wrote him a letter saying that her one ambition now, was to see him on the Rudy Vallee show. The next day she was killed in an automobile accident. The letter was found on her body. "I still have it," said Pinky. "It's my most precious possession."

It's taken a while, but Pinky has finally realized his mother's hopes for him. Pinky's road to the Vallee show led from burlesque to a Broadway show, "Wine, Women and Song," the movie, "Lady of Burlesque," the Earl Carroll night club and finally his second discovery by Rudy.

It was at Earl Carroll's birthday party that Pinky ran into Rudy Vallee again. "How about using me on the show, Rudy?" said Pinky by way of conversation. He signed Pinky for one show, and, as Pinky says, "the rest is history!"

#### Idolizes Vallee

As for Vallee—"He's given me everything," says Pinky. "Nothing is too big or too small for him to do for me. You just wouldn't believe

all the things he's done. It's like I always say — the bigger a man is, the sweeter he is."

Pinky's in the busiest cycle we've ever heard of, at present. He's still in the cast of Earl Carroll's show, he's got a seven-year contract with Republic and is a weekly feature of Rudy's broadcast. He likes radio best. "It's a gentleman's job," he said. "I go to work and they usher me into the studio—I finish and they usher me out! It's a great business."

He doesn't look it, but he's got a son, Morgan David, ten and a half, and a daughter, Patricia Bonnie, five and a half. It was last year while returning from a camp show at Camp Roberts that Pinky, his children and his wife, Bebe, had a huge truck overturn on their car in a horrifying accident. "We escaped with minor scratches, but the doctor who attended us says he can't understand why we weren't all killed. It was really a miracle. Many of the papers published pictures of our pancaked car with the caption, 'Could You Have Lived Through This?' It was then I decided that something had plans for me—that I had been saved for a reason. I guess you can see why I believe that Fate is helping me on the upgrade after all our hard luck."

We said we certainly could.

"Well," Pinky apologized, "that's about it. I guess that nothing really exciting has ever happened to me, though."

# A Smith To Remember

With a Name Like Wonderful Smith, Who Could Forget Him?

WONDERFUL SMITH IS BACK on the same show he left when he went into the army—in the same suit! The mustache was "just one of those things you do in the army." By now it's gone-and unlamented!

S WON—?" we started to say, on first meeting Wonderful Smith, young comedian on Red Skelton's show. "Yes — Wonderful is my real name," he smiled, before we even got started. Sooner or later, but mostly sooner, everyone asks that question, and by this time, Wonderful can almost beat you to the answer. "My grandmother back in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, named me that. I don't know why. She really gave me a hard name to live up to!"

We think that Mr. Smith is doing a pretty good job of living up to that bright and shinning first name. Just listen to what can happen to a young man tagged with a name that people can't forget:

Wonderful was always interested in dramatics, and took the drama course at Fairfax High School in Hollywood. Very often there were no parts he could play, so he would write one for himself. So while he developed as a comedian, he was also developing as a satirical writer. Later, he joined the Laguna Beach Little Theater, and scored a personal success in a play called "Abduct Me Tenderly." In Hollywood he got a small part in an Earl Carroll show, between odd jobs.

"Jump for Joy," the Duke Ellington musical, was Wonderful's big stepping stone. He had sold himself to the Duke with a monologue he had written in which he portrayed a guileless draftee who calls up President Roosevelt on the telephone. Opening night, the audience laughed so unexpectedly hard that Wonderful says he had a terrible time staying in character—he wanted to laugh, too.

No. One Fan

Red Skelton heard of Wonderful

through a monologue he had written and delivered on an Orson Welles show, and added him to the Raleigh show. Wonderful has certainly become the number one Skelton fan. "I appreciate the way Red has let me work into different characters," he said. "For instance, on one broadcast I played a real estate agent and a Gabriel Heatter type commentator. Red's a wonderful fellow to work with."

Wonderful counts himself fortunate indeed, as far as his career goes. He spent three years in the army (twenty-six months overseas), was discharged on November 18, returned to the same show he had left on December 18, same time, same station. Though Wonderful isn't heard every week, he's what you could call a "Skelton familiar."

Twenty-two of those twenty-six months he spent overseas in a trucking regiment on the Lido or Stilwell Road in India-Burma. Every week he put on a show for his regiment—and when you put on a show in the army, Wonderful emphasized, it means just that, you put it on! He not only wrote and acted, but he supervised and directed, and in the heart of the jungles with a detail of four, he cut down trees and built his own stage!

He's proud of the fact that he was the first to carry a live G.I. show into liberated Burma. After twenty two months in the jungles, Lt. General Wheeler, theater commander at New Delhi, wrote to Wonderful's commanding officer and requested his services as an entertainer at a rest camp in Calcutta. Wonderful worked up a radio show, and was broadcasting when V-J day arrived. It came in the middle of a program he was emceeing with a Negro quar-

tet which was singlng spirituals. The announcer waited until they were finished with their number and then read the news of Japanese surrender. The next spiritual, already scheduled, was "I Ain't Gonna Study War No More." "You can imagine," said Wonderful, "the feeling that went into that song!"

#### Grew Mustache

Wonderful came back to his job on the Raleigh show. "I didn't even have to buy a necktie!" he exclaimed. "All my clothes were just the way I'd left them." The only change was Wonderful's mustache which he grew while overseas. "You do things like that when you're in the army," he laughed. While Wonderful was overseas he ran into Henry Armstrong, the fighter, who was putting on boxing exhibitions for the boys. "We're old friends," he said, "back in the thirties we were in the same breadline together."

Wonderful not only thinks Red Skelton is a great guy, but a great comedian, too. Paul Robson is his favorite dramatic actor and he regrets not being able to get back to the States in time to have seen him do "Othello." His ambition is to branch out into more radio and picture work doing the same type of satirical comedy that he does on the Skelton show.

Wonderful admits that his name has really been a great help in his career. "When people forget it," he laughed, "they call me the strangest things — "Bashful," "Happiness" — one lady even called me "Goodwill Smith."

Well, we don't think she was so far wrong!

You hear the murmuring voice of the desk clerk in the hotel lobby, while the hum of people talking and laughing blends with the clunk of suitcases being eased to the floor. You wonder what goes on back of the scenes, back of the dialogue of the stars continuing in the foreground.

Against the soft music of a dance band, a nightclub atmosphere emerges, with the chatter and clatter of customers enjoying themselves at the rate of a dollar or two a minute. Maybe a noisy swimming party is punctuated with the splash of water.

CATHY LEWIS AND WALLY MAHER are well-known background and character players on the hour dramatic series.

gonna do") has a lavorite role on "Lux". It's that of pitchman or barker for circus or sideshow.


Possibly there is the roar of spectators at a race track or the longdrawn-out sigh of those who watch the high trapeze performers at a circus.

You, as a listener, may not question the background too closely, but it is as important to the rounded-out performance of a "Lux" radio show as the stars themselves, who carry the brunt of conversation, acting and suspense. Back of every Lux Radio production is a cast of performers, never seen in publicity and advertising releases, yet of first importance to the success of the one-hour plays.

#### Indispensable

A genial, youngish, gray-haired, smiling director of this part of the show calls the cues and gives the signals. His name is Charles Seel, an actor of many years' experience, who has spent the past decade in radio. Without-Charles Seel and his

characters, the show could not go on, though the cast were to include the luscious Hedy Lamarr, Lana Turner, Charles Boyer and Bing Crosby.

Working before the microphone, without suffering from "mike" fright is something of an accomplishment in itself. Radio actors must be stage wise, so when asked to ad lib they can think of something definite to say, which fits in with the scene up front. Rehearsals for this part of the show are as essential as those for the stars. Among other things, actors in the background must know how to scream, shout, gurgle, gasp, whisper, speak loudly or softly and they must be dressed attractively, so radio audiences will have a pleasing picture to carry home with them.

When a play for "Lux" is decided on, Seel reads the script with the director and gets busy on the telephone. Sometimes his first list of

O MANY OF THE people who were in radio or were trying to break into radio asked Martha Rountree's advice on careers and marriage, that one of her associates laughingly suggested she syndicate a "romance column." The idea finally bore fruit in a pattern for a radio show, called "Leave It to the Girls."

The format of the show calls for a panel of feminine experts, a mistress of ceremonies and a male guest who takes up the cudgels for the masculine side each week.

The panel is comprised of Florence Pritchett, lecture writer of the New York Journal-American; Robin Chandler, directress of the John Powers School for Models; Dorothy Kilgallen, syndicated columnist, and Eloise McElhone, OPA food division. The prerequisites for membership in the panel when it was formed was that all girls must be successful in their fields, charming, pretty and also able to think on their feet, as it were. Two hundred and ninety-six potential members were interviewed before the four were chosen.

#### Male vs. Female

In selecting a male guest for the Page Thirty-Two

program, an intellectual background is stressed rather than just a name personality. As Martha expresses it she would rather have "thinkers then glamor boys." There is a unique scene in each show wherein the "man strikes back" and outlines his pet peeves against the doings of the distaff side.

Recently Bennett Cerf wanted to know why women carried so much in their pocketbooks. Why did they keep them stuffed with things they would never use? Dorothy Kilgallen challenged this and told Cerf he carried more articles in his pockets than she did in her bag.

The entire studio audience remained after the show as Miss Kilgallen and Cerf emptied their pocketbook and pockets respectively—strangely enough Miss Kilgallen was right—Cerf had much more in his pockets than she had in her bag.

The show is actually a round table discussion of romance—problems of the heart. Questions sent in by listeners are discussed by the girls, who give their reactions and state what they would do to handle the problem. The male guest also has his chance to enter the discussion and

the age-old conflict between the male and female opinion of affairs of the heart gives the program a light and humorous touch.


The questions selected for discussion must have: 1. Human interest. 2. Are there two sides? 3. Does it pertain to romance? 4. Is it a good springboard for discussion? 5. Has a similar subject been discussed?

#### Questions Similar

The questions pour in from all over the country from every age group—teen-agers write about their problems and they recently received a letter from a sixty-year-old widow asking if they thought she was too old to re-marry. The questions are about divided as to problems of single and married people and there is a great similarity in questions from different parts of the country.

None of the panel sees the questions before air time. The program is spontaneous and unrehearsed. During the show's first seven weeks on the air, a guest mistress of ceremonies was used. Paula Stone has been permanent guide of program ever since. Dorothy Kilgallen was ill one week and Miss Stone was secured

She has played comedians on the "Meet Me At Parky's," a villainess on the former "Creeps By Night" series, and "I Love A Mystery," and her first "straight" role (courtesy of her idol, Carlton E. Morse) on last summer's "Younger Generation."

Producer Helen Mack is another favorite. It was she who gave Ruth her first try at radio comedy. As for pictures, the attractive lady has the filmization of a "Suspense" broadcast with Peter Lorre to her credit. The only possible event to lure her from California would be a part in a Broadway play, which the redheaded, brown-eyed actress says she does not see in the offing.

Pie Expert

In her modernistic hilltop apartment, Ruth has most fun when she can whip up a spur-of-the-moment supper for her many friends. She loves cooking and lemon meringue pies are her specialty. She enjoys the theater, ballet, reading, sewing, gardening (she's saving for a quiet little home of her own someday) walking, and dancing.

As great a devotee of the stage as she is, she thinks radio is kind of nice, too. And someday would like a show of her own, offering her a chance to portray the many characters she does so well. "Just like radio," she winked, "I hope I'm here to stay. But if that can't be, I guess I can always be a farmer, or a milliner or a writer."

#### Another Idol

Francis X. Bushman, another screen hero, was once the Frank Sinatra of the younger set. Leo Cleary quit the stage and screen twenty years ago for radio and his is one of the most popular voices on the air. He is noted for his "Boston Blackie" characterizations and for his imitations of Frank Morgan, Adolphe Menjou, Alan Hale and Charles Boyer.

Isabel Jewell, one of the most talented motion picture actresses in Hollywood is heard frequently over the air in strong dramatic or tragic roles.

Verna Felton created a sensation when "Lux" presented "A Tale of Two Cities." She appeared in the role of "Madame LaFarge," the old harridan of the French Revolution, who knitted a long list of the names of aristocrats destined for the guillotine. This is only one of many parts in which Verna has distinguished herself.

Norman Field has become something of a fixture on the "Lux" rostrum. His voice is considered practically perfect for his roles of austere bankers, businessmen, doctors, family lawyers and Wall Street brokers. He heads the radio dramatic department of University of California, Los Angeles, extension department, having taught there for the past four years. Norman Field started a stage career thirty years ago and for the past fifteen years he has been steadily engaged in radio, having made a study of this medium in all its ramifications.

Eddie Marr, one of the better known radio personalities. (Known as "Tell Ya What I'm Gonno Do Marr," because of his characterization of that title), appeared with Bing Crosby on "Kraft Music Hall"; has headed his own show at various times and on the "Lux Radio Theater" show he switches from one part to another—one of his favorite roles being that of a "pitchman," or "barker" for a circus or side show.


