In the Andrews home in Brentwood, Patty and LaVerne both have beautiful bedrooms, done in soft pastel shades and furnished with frills to delight the most feminine heart. In the center of LaVerne's large mirrored room is a circular bed, and arranged on end tables and soft furry scatter rugs are the kitten statuettes which she avidly collects. (A live feline pet named "Red" was also in evidence.) Brown-eyed, gracious LaVerne is the "dressiest" of the Andrews girls and is usually strikingly attired in stylish sequined ensembles.

Tall, dark-eyed, effervescent Patty has a room that is similar to LaVerne's in its pastel and ruffled femininity, but minus the circular bed and with china elephants on display in place of cats. **H**OUSEWIVES can rejoice that F. H. La Guardia has joined the ranks of network radio commentators. Unlike most other public affairs columnists and commentators, New York City's fiery little ex-mayor, heard each Sunday night at 6:30 over KECA and the American Broadcasting Company, has not let his wide knowledge of and interest in national and international affairs cause him to lose sight of the everyday problems of the average home. He is as likely to have views on the price of soup meat as on the fate of Poland, and to voice them with the same impassioned clarity.

Not that he belongs to the "woman's place is in the home" school of thought. As mayor of New York, he named many women to important executive posts and as judges. And

it was his vote, cabled from Europe, while he was serving as an aviator in combat during World War I, though still a member of the House of Representatives, that enabled passage of the woman suffrage amendment to the Constitution. But he has always realized that the homemaker can only be an active citizen if she can first meet the basic problems of food, clothing and shelter without trepidation.

### **Spaghetti Specialist**

As a boy at the Arizona army post where his father was stationed, his mother taught him to cook and help with the household work. Today he still enjoys showing his skill in preparing spaghetti.

Importance of good food was impressed upon him in a darker aspect during the Spanish-American War when he was forced to take over his family's support at the age of seventeen after poisoned beef felled his father in a Florida army camp.

### Jarvis Switch

Station KFVB called to tell us that Al Jarvis would no longer conduct his daily "Make Believe Ballroom" from their station. Jarvis has moved to KLAC (KMTR) and, with the aid of Peter Potter, will become a regular of the top-of-the-dial (570 kc.) station.

Until further notice, "Make Believe Ballroom" time will be listed simply as "The Ballroom" with various emcees taking over. Within a few weeks, KFVB expects to announce a new disc jockey.

### Old Favorites

Dialers who've been wondering about the whereabouts of Jimmy Cash, former vocal star with Burns and Allen, will be happy to hear that he'll be heard on a new MBS airshow, starting Friday, March 15th, 8:00 p. m.

With him will be sweet-singing Sally Sweetland—another of those voices we've been wanting to hear, Felix Mills and his orchestra, and narrator Carlton KaDell.

### Birthday

Although the character, "Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve," wasn't heard on the air until Hal Peary debuted it on NBC's "Fibber McGee and Molly" in 1935, "Gildy" is twenty-one years old this month. Peary created the role in March, 1925, when he was playing in stock in San Francisco, but didn't christen it "Gildersleeve" until he went on the radio.

### Shortage

CBS news analyst Harry W. Flannery, who currently devotes many of his broadcasts to investigation and discussion of the country's housing problem, is in the midst of a housing dilemma of his own. Ousted from his Hollywood home and unable to move into a newly-purchased house for a number of weeks, Flannery is residing temporarily at the Hollywood Athletic Club, his wife at the women's Athletic Club, and his mother-in-law and daughter in a room rented from the new tenants of his former home—which he is also using as a temporary office!

### Blessed Event

Jimmy Wallington was passing out cigars to his co-workers of the CBS Jack Kirkwood Show last week, for

the usual reason. But the "blessed event," in this instance, was a new equine addition to Jimmy's "Malibu Farms." The filly has been named "Malibu Calorama."

### Radio Robot

George Presby, of NBC's announcing staff, has always had a yen to be an inventor. His special pet is a radio-controlled robot which he has been working on for the past five years. He reports that it is now completed save for "clothes, paint and a few screws."

Presby describes it as a four-foot dummy similar to Charlie McCarthy, whose dialogue is furnished by radio with no wire connections or visual contact with its operator. The body holds all the receivers, relays, batteries, coils and mechanisms which make him work, all of which is controllable by Presby from a considerable distance away. The mechanical figure's head moves in any direction and the mouth is so perfectly synchronized that it follows speech even to stuttering.

Presby uses the radio robot for audience warmups, and employs, as part of the act, a complete shortwave transmitter, microphone, a amplifier and transmitter the size of a package of cigarettes!

### She'll Take Tallulah

When Maxwell visited a veterans' hospital outside New York, he had twenty brand-new radios to give away. Each veteran wrote his name on a slip of paper for the drawing. There was just one radio left when Maxwell reached the bedside of a lad whose condition was so critical that he was unable to move his body.

"Gee, I'd give anything to have that radio," said the boy.

Much as Maxwell would have liked him to have the gift, he couldn't play favorites with eighteen hundred other veterans looking on, but he allowed

the boy to draw the last name for the remaining radio.

The veteran took a slip of paper from the hundreds in the box, read it, looked up with tears in his eyes.

## *Renowned Today as "Truth or Consequences" Glib, Resourceful Creator - Emcee, Ralph Edwards Is Remembered by His Mother As A Lively, Extroverted, Red - Headed Lad*

WHEN Women of Woodcraft were nearing the end of one of their recent conventions, the chairman cleared her throat and assumed that air of royal importance one does when presenting someone special.

"We want," she announced, "all of you to meet one of our most faithful workers. We're very proud to have with us today Mrs. Minnie Edwards, mother of Ralph Edwards of 'Truth or Consequences!'"

Minnie Edwards, mother of Ralph, was more flustered than any of her son's contestants had ever been. She rose slowly to her feet, trying to summon words in acknowledgement of her introduction, then, before the entire convention, blurted out the only thing she could think of: "Give that woman a big red box of Duz!"

Completely wrapped up in her family is Minnie Edwards, and when Radio Life recently obtained from Ralph's mother her virgin interview, we came away convinced that she's always been that way. In fact, one is led to believe that in the close association and companionship which marked Ralph Edwards' childhood, the brilliant emcee's resourcefulness, knack for handling persons, and zest were definitely nurtured.

### **Farm Boy**

Ralph is not an only son. His brother, Carl, is five years older and his brother, Paul, is ten years his senior. When Ralph was small, the family lived on a farm two miles from Merino, in eastern Colorado. In many ways, rural life is advantageous for raising a family—especially a family of lively boys. Paul,

Carl, and Ralph had plenty of room for baseball, football, swimming, and pets.

But, on the other hand, social life is limited. "The evenings used to be long," recalled Mrs. Edwards. "I had to plan games to keep my boys busy." Forfeits was one of the Edwards family's favorite pastimes. Mrs. Edwards still remembers little Ralph "with his big brown eyes and red curly hair" playing "heavy, heavy hangs over thy head."

What did the owner do to redeem his property? Maybe stand on his head in the corner, or leave the room to compose a little piece. But in that cosy circle were planted the seeds for a future radio show, the jack-in-the-beanstalk of audience participation programs.

According to his mother, Ralph was always an extrovert. She remembers his early appearance in a school play, in which another small boy was supposed to crow like Cock Robin. Acquitting himself beautifully, red-headed little Ralph announc-

ed: "I must be a Rhode Island Red!"

### **Mother Punished Him**

Conversing with Mrs. Edwards, one gathers, too, the impression that her husband was an able, but tender-hearted father who delegated "mother" to mete out scoldings. Mrs. Edwards, now known lovingly as "Mama E." to Ralph's co-workers, recalls the time Ralph was caught attempting to catch onto passing autos. She summoned him indoors and ordered him to undress, go to bed, and think about his sins. "If you can't behave outside, see if you can inside," he was admonished, after it was pointed out that he might kill himself if he continued his daring little game.

Ralph, it seems, did some fast thinking about his behavior. His speedy promise, "never to do it again," was never broken.

Mrs. Edwards also remembers one instance when she left home during the afternoon and returned to find

**W**EEKLY, more than one thousand letters pour into CBS' "Request Performance" asking, entreating, imploring—begging for everything from Vera Vague's getting her man to finding a faithful fan an apartment in Cambridge. The latter is out. And the man who says so is dark-haired, be-mustached Bill Robson, producer of the show.

One day last week your reporter lunched with the dynamic Bill and listened, fascinated, to the behind-scene intrigues of this novel ainer. What evolved was a backstage picture of the best-known, best-beloved entertainers in America. And the story of Mr. Robson's broad shoulders, upon which rests the job of balancing talent, requests, what can or can't go on the air and why.

When the famed Masquer's Club of Hollywood decided to air its popular Saturday night get-togethers,

many of cinemaland's biggest names were automatically included in the deal. Up to that time, they had made their weekly G. I. audience think vaudeville wasn't dead. Now was conceived a new program, a sort of civilian "Command Performance." Only it wasn't G. I. Joe issuing the commands, it was plain Joe Doaks requesting peace-time entertainment.

#### Requests Sifted

Robson and writers, Jerry Lawrence and Robert E. Lee, line up the talent for each week's show from

their complete file of requests, taking into consideration the reasonableness of the demands. Some ask for stars who are unavailable for various reasons or some requests are too fanciful to fulfill—such as the one which asked that the originator of singing commercials be found and have his throat slit slowly.

Bing, Alan Ladd, Frank Sinatra and Van Johnson receive the greatest number of requests weekly. Many a nostalgic note creeps into the letters with service wives requesting their husbands' favorite song or favorite singer. Robson tries to take these into consideration.

**Like the Unusual**

One lady asked if it were true

that an actor was only as good as his material. The reply came in the form of Rita Hayworth and Garry Moore reading the telephone directory. Numerous requests poured in for Boris Karloff to do a comedy skit. Veronica Lake made like Mae West, the Phil Harrises (Alice Faye) appeared together for the first time, and Vera Vague played the notorious "Amber," ending up with three men on her hands.

Robson, who has been with the show since December, recalls that no star has refused to appear on the program. They seem to find it fun and have cooperated in every possible way. Those who are asked to perform in some manner unfamiliar

to them derive the biggest kick; such as Kay Kyser, who was requested to do something besides lead a band. He tapped, and quite well, too, he'll tell you.

With only three hours of rehearsal, and a million dollars worth of talent to direct, Robson makes every minute count. There is no time for dinner, so "Request" provides its performers with tea, coffee and sandwiches in a sort of Green Room atmosphere, similar to Lux Theatre.

"In fact, we are so rushed," grinned Bill, "that nobody has time to pose for pictures. Just take a look at those awful candid's of me and you'll see what I mean."

## FREE SPEECH "MIKE"

**T**en thousand dollars in 1946!

That's the slogan of the year at KMPC, and that impressive sum is the grand total of cash prizes the "Station of the Stars" is currently offering its listeners.

Five times a day during the station's schedule of programs, "Free Speech Mike" comes to the microphone to make a telephone call, ask a question and, if it is answered correctly, bestow upon the lucky recipient a generous cash award.

The voice of "Free Speech Mike" remains anonymous. He is symbolized by a small youthful-faced, Uncle Sam-ish figurine, its microphone-shaped torso clad in stars and stripes. One of these little figurines is sent to each person who is telephoned during the contest.

The telephone numbers are selected from a different exchange each day, and chosen blindly from the phone book by a disinterested party. Cash awards from the "Free Speech Mike" treasury start with the amount of twenty-five dollars, then

increase by five dollars every time the telephone call is unanswered ("Mike" lets it ring five times before hanging up), or the busy signal is received, or if the person called is unable to answer the contest query correctly.

### Listener Can't Lose

The contest questions are usually of an informative and educational nature, often in connection with current events. "Free Speech Mike" gives the answer immediately after asking the question, so if the person

**R**ADIO'S "mighty midget"—that's June Foray, four feet eleven inches of as many different radio voices as ever came out of a mike. June runs the gamut of all of them on KHJ-Mutual Don Lee's "It's Smille Time" show heard Mondays through Fridays at 2:00 p.m.—even to the dog that always barks at the end of each show.

Every feminine voice that's heard on the show is June's. She can do anything from ingenues to grandmothers, through and including lady wrestlers. She's one of the best boy juveniles in radio, and she's played so many of these parts that Hollywood's younger masculine radio contingent has threatened to form a union to keep Foray out. On a recent "Murder Is My Hobby" program, for instance, June played the lead supporting role—that of a little boy aged eleven.

Foray's talent doesn't confine itself to radio alone. She's just as proficient with a needle as she is at a mike; just as able underneath a car hood as she is with a sewing

machine; just as efficient with a paint brush as she is with a wrench.

She's been sewing ever since she can remember . . . makes many of her own clothes, designs her own hats to add to her height. She loves wacky bonnets, and nothing pleases her better than to walk along Vine street with a new "stopper."

### Learned Accidentally

She got into the automotive repair business by the sheerest accident. June used to drive an old Model A, whose choke kept getting disconnected from the carburetor. One night on Serrano avenue (she'll never forget it), she couldn't get the thing to start. It was during the war and service-station attendants were being distinctly ungallant to lady motorists in distress. At least, the only one June could find didn't care whether she got home or not. So June poked around under the hood herself and after about thirty minutes of fiddling, found out where the trouble was and got her car started. After that, she kept right on doing her own repair work, and she's one girl who knows the

Pat's producing company, "Pyramid Productions," is a dream in the process of coming true. Pat and his associates, Warren Williams, Joe Ricketts, Del Castillo and Ken Krip-pene, are planning a variety of shows. "We're willing to try anything," averred Pat. He's interested in young talent and has his eye on several gifted young people he'd like to help. He would also like to do a show with his wife, Karen, in which he portrays her father!

"Say," he remembered suddenly, "I'm supposed to be fixing this place up—want to see how I clean the windows?"

"Why, yes," we agreed, picturing Pat dabbing at the window pane with a cute little polishing cloth.

### Pat, the Fearless

"Okay," said Pat, and jumped out the window onto a tiny ledge! The McGeehans happen to live on the fifth floor! We looked out the window just once and then hid our eyes, so we can't tell you what went on from there. Fearless McGeehan scoffed at our apprehensions. "I spent six years on a ship and six in the circus. I'm used to climbing up and fixing the rigging," he smiled.

Pat claims he picked up many of his voices and dialects during those years of varied experience. On one show, "They Say Today," he worked on five mikes and did as many as thirty-eight voices in fourteen and a half minutes! "That's nothing, though," he added. "In the old days I often did ten shows a day and averaged forty shows a week at five dollars a show!" Nowadays you hear Pat as star of his own program, "The Adventures of Bill Lance," and as the old man on the "Red Skelton Show," among many others. In fact, Pat is on the air so much with shows and transcriptions that you probably spend a good part of your radio day listening to him whether or not you know it. He makes up a daily card on which he notes all his shows and appointments and he allots his time down to the minute.

We told him that we had been hearing him lately as Dr. Campbell warning the listeners against lower-plate wobble. Pat laughed, "One day Sharon Douglas' mother called up

here and when I answered the phone she said, 'Dr. Campbell? I'd like to make an appointment!'"

### Pat, the Fluffer

Pat refused to cite his experiences in fluffing before the mike on the grounds that they were so awful that he couldn't repeat them. "What do you do in a case like that?" we wanted to know.

"Just keep right on going," advised Pat woefully.

We're sure that McGeehan could keep right on going if he was struck by lightning. He told us of one time he was reading an award being presented to a Marine. The Marine was standing stiffly at attention opposite Pat on the other side of the mike. A playful announcer (who shall be nameless) sneaked up behind him and unbuttoned his suspenders. He kept on reading. The kittenish fellow then unbuttoned Pat's suspenders from the front. Our hero kept on. Next went Pat's pants buttons and his pants started to slide. McGeehan continued.

Determined to break him up, the villain then struck a match and set fire to Pat's script! With one hand Pat held up his pants, with the other he held as much of the burning script as he could read. When things got too hot, he dropped the script to the floor, stamped it out, and still grappling with his trousers, ad-libbed the rest of the speech!

At the conclusion of the broadcast, the Marine handed his award to Pat. "Here, Mr. McGeehan," he said, "you're the one who deserves this!"

difference between a piston ring and a set of spark plugs.

June's pint size necessitates the use of a riser on most of the shows she works. On "It's Smile Time," she uses a riser AND a high stool, sharing her mike with Wendell Noble's vocal numbers. When she plays on "Red Ryder," however, it's a cinch; Little Beaver's mike is just the right height. Usually she does half-caste Indians on the Western show.

She's been working in radio since 1930; groomed for it ever since she was a little girl. When she was six, her mother thought her voice was too low, marched her off to a dramatic school to bring it up to a nice ladylike pitch. It was that early training in throwing her voice all over the scale that gave her the ability to imitate anything and everything. Famed as the best dialectician in Hollywood, June is the voice behind "Sniffles," "Oswald," and many another favorite cartoon character. She was the parrot in Spike Jones' "Chloe" when the song was filmed; the hiccough of Paulette Goddard and Veronica Lake . . .

the sneeze of Carole Thurston . . . and all kinds of animals. Her hardest imitation was of whooping cough for "Shepherd of the Hills." She spent an entire day in the contagious wards of the County hospital, learning how.

### Pill Pay

Hard work has never bothered June. Her post as a regular on the "Smile Time" show came because she had no objections to getting up at 5:30 a.m. when the show was aired at 7:15 a.m.

Her first radio appearance in Boston was on a program sponsored by a cod liver oil pill company. For three hours of rehearsal and a half hour dramatic show, the cast was paid \$5 apiece and all the cod liver oil pills they could eat.

"The sponsor used to come to the show regularly and make us take the pills," June remembers. "I usually managed to get down two."

At home, she likes to tinker with a paint brush and a hammer and saw. She does a wonderful trick with coffee jars—paints the tops and bottoms, puts a decal on the clear glass between, and uses them as canisters in her kitchen. Not just decorative . . . you can see what's in which!

Finally, she has a mad passion for politics—writes letters to her congressman, spends her time during elections doing house to house campaigns—and reads every book she can find on a discussed subject.

But unfortunately, even though she has learned just about everything else, she's never learned not to take Wendell Noble and Steve Allen seriously. Her one complaint is that she's a perfect foil for every gag they pull. She never knows what to expect next, and even when they dress up an old routine into something new, she still falls for it, hook, line and sinker.

"I've been with the show so long I should learn . . . I should learn," she sadly shakes her head. "But I'm always the straight woman always!"
