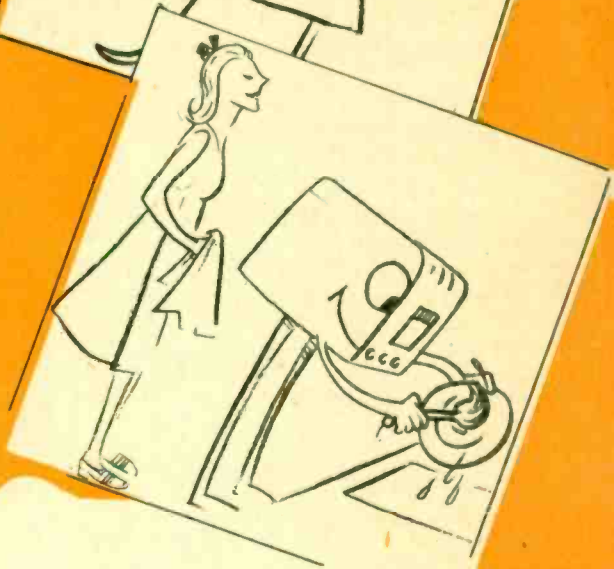




# Are You Normal About Soap Operas?



*CBS' Study of Radio's Daytime Serials Disproves Critics Who "Never Listen"*

**A**LTHOUGH some 20,000,000 women listen to radio serials—and like them—the most positive opinions on the subject, until recently, have come from people who never hear them. In fact, many expressions of opinion begin with the smug assertion, "Of course, I never listen myself, but . . ." Based on this somewhat paradoxical premise of no experience, the opinions themselves

ratings of top radio favorites, and when the program has accomplished all this without paying high-priced stars fabulous Hollywood salaries, the show presumably has something. In this case, that something is public acclaim of the sort that lifts a movie, book, or radio program out of the realm of the ordinary. "Mr. District Attorney" has that something.

Like many other American phenomena, "Mr. D.A." all started when a young man decided to go into business for himself. The man was a talented radio producer named Ed Byron. Byron had a firm belief that an adventure program built around an engaging central character would appeal to millions. The problem was to find the central character.

**Dewey Was Inspiration**

The answer came from the then district attorney of New York, Thomas E. Dewey. Seven years ago, you may recall, the public conception of a district attorney was far from what it is now. Usually, it was of a persecutor, rather than a prosecutor; in the movies it was usually the somewhat dimwitted D.A. who lost his big criminal case to the smart movie lawyer . . . the hero in the picture. Dewey, by investigation, by trying and convicting criminals who had long been at large, helped reshape a public misconception.

Byron sensed the drama inherent in such a public figure. Here was a leading character who could not only participate in tense, exciting drama, but who could dramatize the services of sincere public officials in virtually every hamlet in the nation. Out of it all came a program

# "Mr. District Attorney"

*For Five Years Has Blazed the Trail Of Direct Approach to Dealing with Crime, Lately Has Fought Post-War Rackets and Racial Discrimination*

**W**E COULD begin this story with a slew of mysterious clues and then, at the peak of your curiosity, murder, "Guess what program we're writing about?"

Chances are you'd say "Mr. District Attorney."

When a program has been on the air for more than 364 consecutive weeks without once repeating itself; when in five years that program has never dropped below twelfth in the

that has a firm hold on American listening habits.

The Horatio Alger-like success of the program hasn't been as easy as it sounds. In the beginning there were many obstacles. Censorship officials in stations and networks frequently objected when "Mr. District Attorney" hinted at a crime wave to come. More rigorously, they opposed certain broadcasts which dealt openly with the Nazi menace . . . for this was before Pearl Harbor. Since then, Byron . . . who as a law school graduate seems to have a sixth sense that tells him of crimes to come . . . has had his foresight vindicated many times. Censorship is not one of his problems today. Thus, Byron has recently produced programs which forecast an increase in juvenile delinquency and which, more important, offered concrete suggestions for effective counter measures. Similarly, in the early days of the war, Byron forecast black market operations and subversive campaigns by pro-German followers.

#### Post-War Rackets Bared

The result of this approach has been that throughout its tenure on the air, "Mr. District Attorney" has offered listeners a topical, newspaper-like flavor in its programs. Since V-J day, Byron and his co-author, Robert Shaw, have done programs dealing with many other post-war rackets which have been flourishing lately.

"The Case of the Mournful Dog," for instance, treated bogus employment agencies which were designed to mulct newly-discharged G.I.'s of

their mustering out pay. The program served a double duty, since it not only exposed the rackets, but warned servicemen and their families to seek aid from government agencies or legitimate employment bureaus.

A strong factor for the program's success is that both Byron and Shaw, perfectionists by nature, will give unstinted labor, research and work to insure the show's authenticity.

Both men have legal backgrounds. Byron is endorsed by a brigadier general in charge of Army neuro-psychiatric work in Washington, who has given him vital tips on the functions of the criminal and the dis-

eased mind. A prominent surgeon in Detroit has taught him the various intricacies of surgery and the effect on the human body of various types of physical abuses.

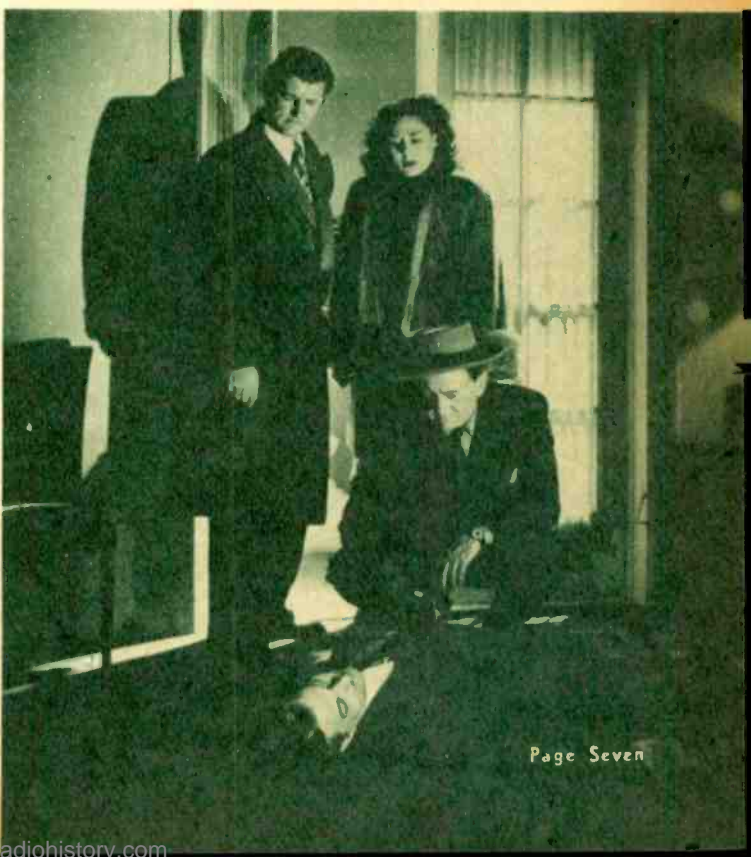
Once a month the team of writers makes a round of "haunts." These are out-of-the-way places where reformed criminals, police reporters, and cops, off the beat, come in to relax after a day's work. Fraternizing with these men who are "in the know," Byron can foresee a crime or a trend of crimes and dramatize them on the air before the public is aware of their existence.

Perhaps one of the most extensive

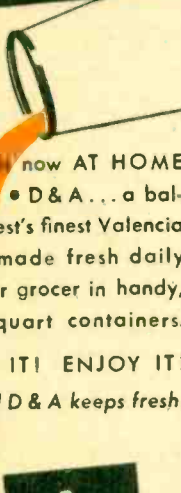

# Relax

# Cal Tinney

Monday-Friday, 10 p. m.  
ABC-KECA

**W**HEN PEOPLE ask me, 'How do you get to be an Oklahoman?' I tell 'em one good way is to be born there" . . . That's typically Tinney! We mean Cal Tinney, whose humor and down-to-earth philosophy, with a smattering of just plain "horse sense" about the happenings in this troubled world, is a five-a-week feature over ABC.

The Oklahoma-born commentator whose cowboy drawl was familiar to radio listeners until about three years ago when he joined the United States Army, has been back on the air since his release from the service in January. He's regarded by admirers as a "professor of philosophy for the common man", and by himself as "just an ole country boy that ain't mad with nobody."

Ex-private Tinney says between 1943 and 1945 he learned how it feels to be both a spy and an enlisted man. In April of '45, he became ill in India and was flown back to the States. Before his discharge, he was promoted to PFC, proving, says Cal, "You can advance in the Army."

In describing his new program, "Relax With Cal Tinney", he says he talks about anything and everything . . . talk which he promises will not do anybody a "lick of good". Cal, in fact, claims to be "the only talker on the air who admits it's a complete waste of time to listen to him."

He spent five years in high school in Tulsa. . . "They wouldn't give me a diploma for endurance, so I quit," quips Tinney. After that he attended Oklahoma University at Norman for one year.

It was in 1932 that Cal quit his job as "hog" editor of the Oolagah Oozings of Oolagah, Oklahoma, (population, according to Cal, 102 people, 92 pigs, six goats and one Republican), and went to New York in his

yellow slicker, bearing a suitcase with a rope tied around it.

### Wrote for Life

On his first visit to New York, in 1927, Cal had to type envelopes for two nights to earn \$10 for bed and board. This time, however, he hit the jackpot by writing articles for the old Life Magazine, which paid him some \$900.

Back in Oklahoma again, Cal got his start in radio in the same haphazard manner which characterizes his career in general. As he explains it, the cowboy band didn't arrive in time for the program sponsored by the local Chamber of Commerce so Cal went on "just talkin" . . . and decided that "maybe I can make a living out of it."

Cal's radio career was launched in 1934 when he returned to New York. His first network job was as an extra on the "Tim and Irene" comedy show on ABC, then the NBC Blue Network. About this time he began to write a column for the McNaught Syndicate, a column he continued writing until 1943. Next came "Cal 'n' Ada", the first in a series of radio programs that established Tinney as a comedian and emcee, followed by "Vanity Fair", "If I Had the Chance", and "Stop Me If You've Heard This One", his own brain-child. From 1941 to 1943, Cal was "Sizing Up the News".

Tinney's droll sense of humor projects itself right through the microphone into the loudspeakers of his fans. He's a good story teller . . . even when the laugh is on him. For example, he says when people ask him if he did anything distinctive when he was young, he replies, "Yes, when I was about nine years old, I set my dad's meadow on fire. About a half-hour later, papa set fire to me. You know how these fire stories in the paper read; they say 'the fire started in the rear' . . . Well, that's where mine was."

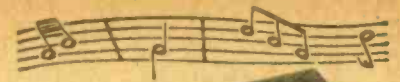

Columbia Broadcasting System decided to study the whole subject of daytime serials more thoroughly than it had ever been studied before. One cardinal rule governed the hundreds of people who were engaged in the study, over the months of testing, field work, interviews, tabulation and analysis that were expended on it: "Get the facts. Base nothing on personal opinion, snap judgment or guess-work."

### Tell Facts

The facts are in. There is nothing sensational about them, for the truth—contrary to the well-worn aphorism—is seldom as strange as fiction. Nevertheless, and for the first time, facts are now available to answer questions that come up about the radio serial and its listeners, either from within or without the broadcasting industry. Here are a few of those facts:

Of the millions of women who are at home in the daytime, 54 per cent listen regularly to serials. They hear an average of 5.8 different serial programs, for a listening total of one hour and 27 minutes per day. And they listen, incidentally, because they like to; not because "there is nothing else on the air." It would probably be impossible to find a radio home in the United States that has no choice between serials and other programs. The CBS study examined the situation in Boston, Columbus and Dubuque—a large city, a medium-sized city and a small city. At all times, there were five or more non-serial programs available.

### Women Differ

To answer the question, "Who listens?", and to make fair comparisons between listeners and non-

criminal libraries in the country is owned by Ed Byron. He refers to it often and many of his broadcasts are actual cases from these leather-bound books.

### Crusade for Tolerance

Tolerance has not been overlooked on the "Mr. District Attorney" program. One of the most talked-about tolerance scripts was "The Case of the Wrong Way to Die." Here was a story that pricked at the subconscious. Anyone guilty of intolerance felt the impact of the script and victims of prejudice felt gratitude in the knowledge that the popular half-hour show was crusading their cause.

The story was about a young, rich and arrogant girl who joined the WAC on a dare. While in service she met and married an orphan whose parents fled from the persecution of the Russian ghetto to the safety of America. The girl's father did everything possible to break up the marriage, but the young lady's experiences in the WAC taught her the American creed, and intolerance doesn't enter into that creed.

On the basis of this script, "Mr. District Attorney" was awarded a plaque by the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the award being made because of the notable work the program has done in fighting discrimination, one of the major social problems of the day.

Letters came in from Mrs. Roosevelt and from editors and publishers of magazines and newspapers encouraging Byron to continue in this all-important work. Principals of high schools asked for recordings to play before their students.

Still another testimonial to the "Mr. District Attorney" program was given by the New York Criminal Courts Bar Association. The only award ever to be presented by this group, it commended the program for its fight against crime and for its efforts in promoting better understanding between the courts and its officers.

Further proof of the program's popularity and all-around public appeal can best be demonstrated by an incident that took place in Wayne County, Michigan.

District Attorney-elect O'Brien, in his acceptance speech said, "My only desire is to be as good a district attorney as radio's "Mr. D. A."

Take the case of Vic McLeod. Vic was writing the Bing Crosby Show. One night late, his phone rang . . .

"Hey Vic . . . it's Hank. I'm in Winnipeg and we're all set to put a show together to tour all over the Canadian Labrador, maybe even to Iceland. Can you leave tomorrow night?"

"Tomorrow night!" Vic hollered, "I'm right in the middle of the Crosby script. I can't get away now . . ."

## Sample Jokes

Two days later, loaded with sweaters, McLeod landed in an RCAF bomber. What a kick the GI's got out of his jokes—like a few of these from his boy-and-girl routine . . .

**GIRL:** You could never get me to fall in love with you.

**HANK:** No, but it would be a lot of fun trying.

**HANK:** Here, have a cigarette.

**GIRL:** Oh, no thanks. I'm a movie starlet.

We started out as GI's, doing a half-hour comedy show over the ABC network. Then Ed went to Officers' School and I was requested to make a tour overseas. We parted and there seemingly went our hopes of ever getting together.

## Wired Helwick

About a year later I located Helwick in far off Nome, Alaska. I wired Ed . . .

"ED BOY! HAVE TWO SWELL ENTERTAINERS YOUR GI'S WOULD

ENJOY. CAN YOU SET UP TOUR AND WRITE SHOW?"

Helwick went to town as always, cleared the entire thing with his command, which in turn, wrote a letter to my command. That takes about a month the way the army does it—but here's the story . . . if you can believe it! I'm still wondering what happened.

Four days after I sent the wire to Helwick, in came a wire from Washington urging that we make the tour. It was signed simply "Ullo." In sixty-seven minutes I'm on my way to Helwick. It wasn't until sometime later I learned that Ullo was Lt. General Ullo, Adjutant General of all the American Army.

How Washington got ahold of it, (Please Turn to Page 35)

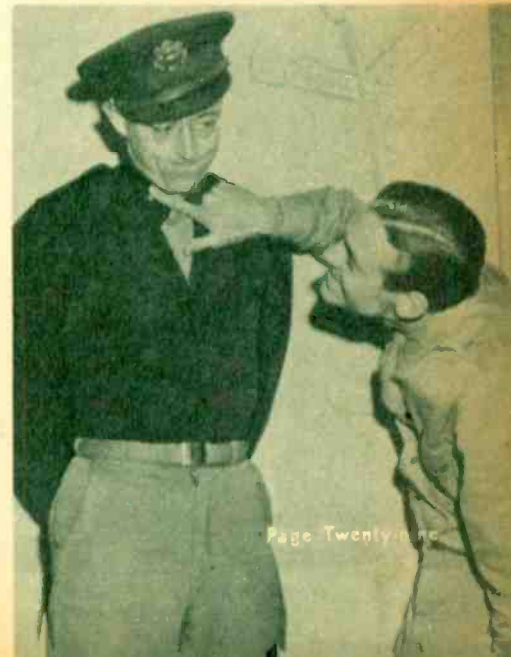

KLAC is undergoing a face-lifting. What used to be a serene little station over on Cahuenga Boulevard is now a bee-hive of buzzing excitement. One has to dodge carpenters, electricians, an enlarged staff bursting with ideas, and Al Jarvis and his company of eight.

Reorganization and redecoration plans are well laid and, at this writing, the independent station is in the final steps of its new expansion. The unique Spanish architectural motif has become more practical by adding two new studios and using a bungalow, which was living quarters, for executive offices. The charming patio has been re-landscaped and is now full of blooming flowers. Many a paint brush has added a freshness to the appearance of the main building, and KLAC's audience studio now seats 150 persons.

#### Month-Old Revision

The day Radio Life dropped in for a visit with Publicity Director Paul Slone was typical, made different only by the fact that it marked the

station's first month anniversary of change of policy. That happened on March 11th.

KLAC changed its call letters from KMTR, tossed its then-existent programs out the window, adopted a policy of everything new from sign on to sign off. "Get it first, but get it right," became the independent's slogan and it regarded new program ideas with a speculative eye. It was a big day for the station when Al Jarvis moved his popular "Make-Believe Ballroom (10 a.m.-1 p.m., Monday-Sunday; 7-8 p.m., Monday-Saturday; 6-9 p.m. Sunday) to 570 on the dial. And it looks as if the Top of the Dial Station's 19 hours of continuous broadcasting will keep on growing. There are that many new ideas.

Mr. Slone conducted us on what he called the "fifty-cent tour with discounts," and we were very impressed with the well-equipped master control room. Chief Engineer

Earl Buchanan has built a console which is so magnificently different that it is being featured in a national science magazine. KLAC's newsroom was alive with activity as Head Newsman Fred Henry pointed out the station's direct line to the Daily News as well as the tie-up with Burbank airport. Just tune in the station's hourly newscast for the latest weather report.

**Become Judge**

Jarvis' "Ballroom" was not broadcasting at the time, but headman Al was conducting a contest for a singer in the main auditorium. Don't ask us how it happened, but we found ourself in a judge's seat with a pencil and paper in hand. It was fun and we enjoyed the way Jarvis helped the nervous contestants over the hurdle of auditioning.

Program Manager Jim Strain pointed out a few of the station's leading shows. KLAC presents a

thorough coverage of sports, including the baseball games and fights; Tex Tyler can be heard every morning at the early hour of 6 o'clock; commentators Averill Berman and Sam Balter are regulars and the Compinsky Trio is one of the newer additions.

What used to be living quarters in KLAC's back bungalow are being remodelled into new swank offices for its executives, including General Manager Don Fedderson. Mr. Slone let us peek into the kitchen which is shared by the station's headmen as well as its five announcers and four newsmen who hold good old bull sessions over the coffee cups.

"I think the most wonderful thing which has resulted from our program of reorganization," confided Don Fedderson, "is our feeling of good fellowship. We work as a unit and like it. We think we're on the road to bigger and better things, and we're giving it all we've got."

# He's Not the Whole Show

**J**IMMY SCRIBNER says HE didn't make his radio show, "The Johnson Family." It was his fans. More than 15 years ago, Jimmy started his program doing four voices—Mama, Papa, and Lucy Johnson and Peewee Ambrose. Listeners encouraged young Scribner. More characters were added to the cast (Scribner can do 22 roles) until the mythical little village of Chickazola, peopled with lovable Negroes, grew into a sizable town, complete with its own theater, bank, grocery, department store and hamburger stand.

Today, "The Johnson Family," widely thought of as a "one-man show," is no longer that. While it's true that Scribner portrays all the characters in his Negro family from The Deacon to Gorilla Joe, Jimmy is far from being "the whole show."

Production of a single fifteen-minute episode requires an announcer, Don McCall; two sound effects men, Tommy Hanley and Art Surrence; a producer, J. C. Lewis, Jr.; an engineer, Jack Allison; a transcription engineer, Johnny Peoples; script collaborator, Floyd Christy. Every now and then actor friends of Jimmy drop in to play character parts especially written for them. Even Les Kelley, Scribner's KHJ sponsor, has appeared on the program.

## Ex-Vaudeville Star

Scribner views the growth of his "family" with happy complacency. An agile and versatile man (he used to be a circus acrobat), Scribner was half the vaudeville blackface team, "Stutter 'n' Whine." From the different voices he did on stage, he got the idea for a radio act using several characters, auditioned in a Baltimore radio station, and went on the air.

Only the limits of Scribner's imagination have circumscribed the activities of the Johnsons and their friends during the years since 1930. Papa Johnson was indicted for murder and reached the electric chair, only to blow the fuses. Once the

family discovered an electric mine which proved to be an underground high-voltage conduit. Under Papa Johnson's supervision, operations caused a short circuit which plunged half the state of Virginia into total darkness. Cruising in a home-made boat, the group was once caught in a storm and thought to be near a cannibal island. Only the capture of a cow, with a bell around her neck, convinced the party it was a stone's throw from home!

Scribner guides his characters in and out of rapid conversations in almost unbelievable fashion. Sometimes he makes it sound as if two persons were talking at once. "I achieve that by changing from one voice to the other on words that have a long vowel sound in the middle," explained Jimmy. "And it's always a word that occurs far enough along in the sentence so that the meaning would actually be understood before I got to it."

#### Signal System

Producer Lewis can't give ordinary radio cues to Scribner, because the latter can't take his eyes off the script long enough to glance at the control room. So a unique signal system has been arranged on the music stand where Scribner rests his script. A series of lights, like a traffic signal, there is amber to indicate the show is moving on time; red to slow down, and green to speed up.

Sometimes as many as three or four different mikes are set up for Jimmy to give listeners the proper picture.

Scribner has been known to go on the air as much as two minutes shy on script. This doesn't bother him—he's an expert ad-libber—but it does put the engineer and sound men on the spot, trying to catch cues on the run — opening doors, creating footsteps, and supplying whatever else Jimmy's ad-libs need to round them out mechanically.

One day Scribner dropped his script in the middle of the broadcast. The pages fluttered in all directions. While Announcer McCall scurried around scraping the papers off the floor and reassembling them, Scribner calmly improvised the equivalent of two pages of script. His was the only sweatless face in the studio.

Beyond the amazing flexibility and ingenuity of Jimmy Scribner and the efficiency of his production unit, there's something else worthwhile noting about "The Johnson Family." Although all the script characters are Negroes, Scribner has contrived to flavor his program with that race's natural warmth and humor, minus the customary burlesquing. Hence, the show appeals universally.

As far as Negroes, themselves, are concerned, they're some of his most enthusiastic fans. Jimmy's played his program before more than 300 all-Negro audiences.

## Laughed at These

McCUNE: Lt. Helwick, Sir, you've got the shinlest brass.

HELWICK: Yes.

McCUNE: The shinlest buttons.

HELWICK: Yes.

McCUNE: And the raggedest underwear of anyone in camp.

And Eddie Helwick really acted wonderfully—played it straight for everything it was worth. Except once in a while he'd break down laughing right on the stage to this tag gag . . .

McCUNE: Gee, Lt. Helwick, you shouldn't talk to me that way.

HELWICK: I'll talk to you any way I please, McCune. Remember, I'm an officer and a gentleman!

McCUNE: Well, make up your mind, you can't be both.

Sam Moore co-writes the "Great Gildersleeve" Show.

Besides this, he's got fourteen other angles cooking every minute. I still don't see how he was able to leave town, but he did . . . Sam wanted to get out and see how the GI's outside the country were living and thinking, and see if he could make them laugh.

He wrote gags, dreamed up sketches . . . even did a break-in routine himself. And the fellows loved him. And why not with a situation routine he wrote for Helen Parish, movie starlet, and myself . . .

HELEN: Suppose you're walking along the street and a girl comes up to you and asks you for a date. What do you do?

HANK: That depends how long I've been here in (We'd name local camp) Big Delta.

HELEN: What do you mean?

HANK: If a guy's been here six months, he stutters. If he's been here a year, he gets the shakes . . .

HELEN: What if he's been here two years?

HELEN: No! Here, now, let's try it. Remember, you push me away.

(THEY CLINCH)

HELEN: Don't just go limp. Try to push me away.

HANK: Look. You take care of your end; I'll take care of mine!.

## Almost Sent Home

'Course Sam Moore doesn't know how close he was to being sent home the very day he arrived. You see, I was called over to the Commanding General's office . . .

"I'm sorry, McCune, but this writer Sam Moore must be sent back immediately."

After all the arrangements Sam made to get away—I just about collapsed.

"Sir, we've got to do something. The show's all set."

And it was finally worked out. Sam Moore, co-writer of the popular "Great Gildersleeve," Sam Moore, National President of the Radio Writers' Guild . . . was hired as a civilian laborer on the Alaskan Highway. It was legal—it worked.

So far as I know, these men were the only big-name Hollywood writers to tour overseas. They write the top shows here in Hollywood. They wrote the very best shows for the GI's on tours I was associated with. So I repeat: Just how lucky can one guy be!

# Are You Normal About Soap Operas?

listeners, all women in the study—and there were thousands of them—were sorted into "Cultural Levels." A woman's cultural level was determined by the amount of education and income she had. As was expected, there were many differences between women in different cultural levels. On the "High" cultural shelf, for example, 50 per cent were active in Red Cross, Bond Drives, USO and the like, while on the "Low" cultural shelf only 12 per cent took part in these activities.

Within the same cultural levels, listeners and non-listeners were compared in some 40 different ways. Were they equally happy, equally gregarious, equally liberal or conservative? How did they feel about government, schools, money; about club membership, family responsibility, books, magazines, movies? Hard as they tried, the CBS researchers and analysts could find no significant difference between listener and non-listener in the same cultural level.

Among college women, for example, 40 per cent were listeners; 60 per cent were not. In the top income group, 35 per cent listened to serials; 65 per cent did not. Both groups were carefully examined for differences in opinions, attitudes and living habits. Between listener and non-listener, none could be found. The simple truth is that certain normal, well-educated or well-to-do women like to listen to radio serials, while some otherwise comparable women do not.

It came as something of a shock to the uninformed critics to learn that daytime serials do not make slaves of their listeners. In fact, the opposite is true. Although the average listener is tuned to her favorite serials nearly an hour and a half a day, 69 per cent of that time is spent in doing something else as well—26 per cent of it in kitchen work; 20 per cent in general housework. Moreover, the average serial is heard two and a half times a week, or only half the time it is on the air. Women find that serials lighten the drudgery of housework by providing them with welcome "company" during the lonely hours that must be spent in household chores.

## Serial "True"

The reason most frequently given by listeners for their enjoyment of a serial is that it is "true to life." Literary critics, on the other hand, have frowned on serial stories as "far fetched" if not "impossible." This difference of opinion between critic and listener is easily explained. Listeners follow the serial's long-range story and get to know its characters almost as if they were real people, whereas critics usually base their judgment on single isolated episodes they may have heard—or heard about.

If a book reviewer were to judge Charles Dickens' "Pickwick Papers" on the reading of a single page, he might, depending on the page selected, describe it as an extravagant ghost story, a romantic novel of young and foolish love, an expose of medical education, or an exaggerated picture of political corruption. "Pickwick Papers" was none of these things. It was written, published and read as a serial. It might, with few changes, be written as a radio serial today.

Serial listeners will not be surprised to hear that theirs is a harmless and often a helpful pastime. The CBS study only puts a stamp of authenticity on what they have known all along. Nonlisteners, on the other hand, may question some of the CBS facts. If you are one of these, the best way to check the facts is to join a serial audience. At the end of a few months, if you think or act differently than you did as a non-listener, you are the un-found exception and should notify the CBS Research Department at once.
