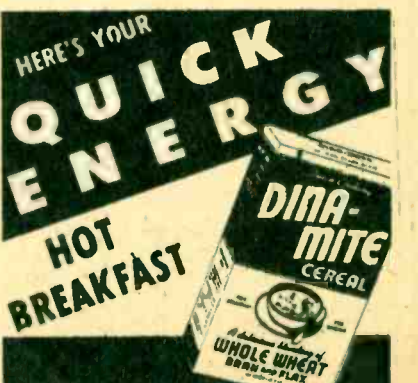

No Garbage At Parky's

Uncle Sam Smiles as "Parkyakarkus" Points Out Ways to Save Scarce Foods

THE DO'S AND DON'TS ARE DEMONSTRATED here by Parkyakarkus and songstress Betty. Explains Uncle Sam: If every man, woman and school child will replace two slices of bread with a serving of oatmeal each week, this will mean 135,000 tons of wheat for the hungry in four months time.

DON'T OVERLOOK BUCKWHEAT CAKES as cereal food for breakfast, Parky further reminds Miss Rhodes, who seems happy about the whole thing. And why not?





TO KEEP BREAD FRESH and prevent mold, store loaves in moisture-proof paper wrapping in the refrigerator. Or if refrigerator space is not available, store bread unwrapped in a well-ventilated box in a cool place, and scald and sun bread-box often. Dry bread can be used—but moldy bread is a total waste.

DON'T HOARD OR waste flour. Parky puts over the point with Betty who obediently doles out only a pinch of the precious ingredient. Advises our government: Buy flour only as needed and keep in a cool and dry place, safe from insects and rodents.

DON'T THROW RICE AT WEDDINGS when it is so urgently needed to feed hungry people! To demonstrate, Betty becomes a bride while Parky restrains an excited guest from carrying out the traditional practice. (That's Mrs. Parky at far right).



BURNED BREAD FEEDS nobody! Parky reprimands Betty: "Watch, when toasting or baking!"

Betty Russell. Betty is a singer who really sings! She's one popular vocalist whose voice has a range. You've heard her on guest spots recently, and her own program, "Curfew Club", on which she emcee'd and sang along with the records was very popular. We'd like her back again.

Clifton Webb. Or are we overreaching? There's no one in radio with Clifton's malicious good-humor. We'd like to hear him as a sort of snide Philo Vance-ish detective. And don't tell us he's too sophisticated for radio — who got all the laughs in "Laura"?

Pinto Colvig. We've been hearing Pinto's voice in radio for almost as long as there's been radio, making like dogs, fleas, crows, in fact, anything that makes any sort of a sound at all. But we're not satisfied, we'd

like to hear him talk. He could tell childrens' stories and include every fantastic voice and sound effect. All alone, we wouldn't be surprised if he could do the twenty-odd books of the Oz series with no trouble at all.

Sydney Greenstreet and Peter Lorre. Two fascinating voices if ever we've heard them! We'd like to hear Sydney and Peter in a mystery comedy-drama series.

And that's just a small sample. We'd also like to have gracious Grace Moore back again . . . hear mad Henry Morgan in a regular half-hour comedy series . . . Donald O'Connor in a 'teen-age comedy-musical . . . Barbara Jo Allen as her own sweet self — not "Vera Vague" . . . Groucho Marx in his own program . . . our old radio crush, Ransome Sherman, who seems to have left the field to less original comics . . . Ginger Rogers doing her gauche adolescent characters (couldn't she do a wonderful satire on "Elsie Dinsmore"?). . . the beautiful speaking voice of Claude Rains who could read the telephone book and make it sound noble . . . Susan Peters continuing her career in a dramatic series . . . and Butterfly McQueen on another comedy program.

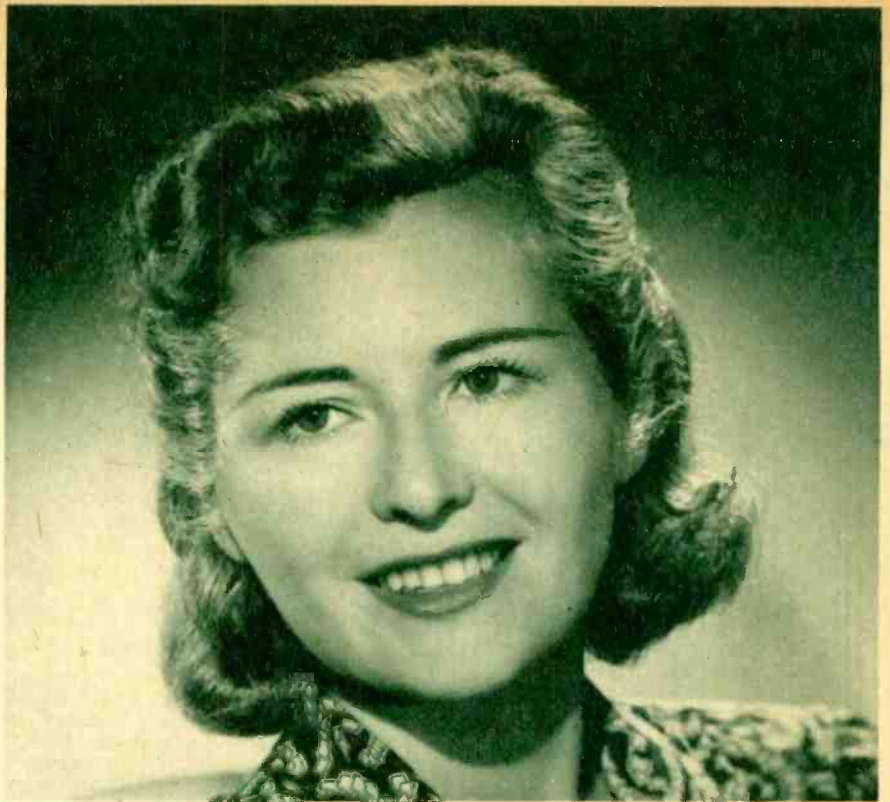

Blonde and Busy

Actress, Writer, Mother, Tennis Fiend,
Sheila Graham Now Becomes Air Columnist

BLONDE and busy is Sheila Graham, whose soft English voice brings the latest Hollywood tidbits to KHJ's listeners. Blonde by nature, with the peaches-and-cream coloring that goes with it; busy by dint of a weekly radio show, a daily newspaper column, and two delightful youngsters, Miss Graham (Mrs. Trevor Westbrook, in private life) still manages to find time for a pleasant social life and an occasional smashing game of her favorite sport—tennis.

Sheila Graham is no outsider to the dramatic world of which she talks. English-born, she trained for the stage at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. One of her teachers was Claude Rains, and she was once cast as Queen in Charles Laughton's King in "Hamlet". "He was much better than I," she recollects; "in fact, they dropped me from

the cast before very long, but I can always say that I played opposite Laughton anyway."

Following the Academy, she was on the stage for two years. But the urge to write was as strong as the desire to act; she spent her time between curtain calls writing about life behind the footlights. Result was two novels, one of which, "Gentleman Crook", was published.

Is Syndicated

Writing and acting together proved a little strenuous; Sheila decided that a good place for a three-month rest was New York. When she was offered a column in the New York Evening Journal, she decided to give up the acting; journalism was much too exciting a medium. In rapid succession came syndication by Hearst and a trip back to Europe as an accredited correspondent.

Ten years ago Miss Graham came to Hollywood for the North American Newspaper Alliance to do her

to be put into effect:

1. No joking or humor by announcers. Short and simple announcements.
2. Band leaders will not be allowed to speak on the air, except in special cases which must be referred to my office.
3. No boisterous applause or yelling. Absolutely no whistling.
4. No lag between the end of a tune and the announcement of the next number.
5. Only three fifteen-second credits to the remote point in a half-hour show and only two credits in a fifteen-minute broadcast.
6. Short opening theme not to exceed forty-five seconds.
7. Opening credit to be read not later than twenty seconds after theme has started and closing credit to be read through to coupling with announcer name and system cue.

Mr. Kent and the work of his worthy organization that we wistfully wish we could carry a tune ourselves, but, since we cannot (not even in the proverbial bushel-basket), we herewith pass along all the data for those of you able to take advantage of this glowing opportunity.

If you're unfamiliar with the mechanics of the AAK Auditions, let us capitulate the requirements. The chief objective is the discovery of young voices which, as they are today, merit public recognition and reward. To encourage young singers, the Foundation is offering eight cash prizes which to

tal \$10,000. Two first prizes (one boy, one girl) of \$2,000 each; two second prizes of \$1,500 each; two third prizes for one boy, one girl of \$1,000; and two fourth prizes for one boy and one girl, \$500 each.

The auditions are open to non-professional vocal soloists who will have passed their eighteenth birthday, but who will not have reached their twenty-ninth birthday by June 1, 1946. Neither race, citizenship, place of birth, permanent place of residence, nor amount of training will have any bearing on the applicant's eligibility to participate. Voices will be judged on the basis of merit.

No entry fee is required. Singers desiring to enter are instructed to write

to the Atwater Kent Foundations, P. O. Box 1511, Hollywood 28, California, for application blanks.

The contestants will not be required to confine themselves to any specific type of music, but may be permitted to sing any three numbers of their own choice.

Contestants will be required to accept as final, without question, the decision of the judges (who, at this writing, have not been named).

Operatic, concert, popular or ballad singers are eligible and will be given equal consideration consistent with their ability to represent a particular style or category of vocal music.

Goering, who seems oblivious of any testimony except when he is directly concerned, listens intently whenever his name is mentioned. From all appearances, he seems to be a disappointed actor. He never stops posing, but it's always a good performance. He and Hess, both wearing rather ill-fitting gray suits that at one time must have been sartorial perfection, sit side by side and occasionally during the testimony of a witness, whisper to each other until the MP taps Goering on the shoulder...

"Raeder, commander of the German Navy, was one of the witnesses. Schirach was indisposed, or as one reporter quaintly put it: 'He has to testify tomorrow and he's resting up for the big event...'"

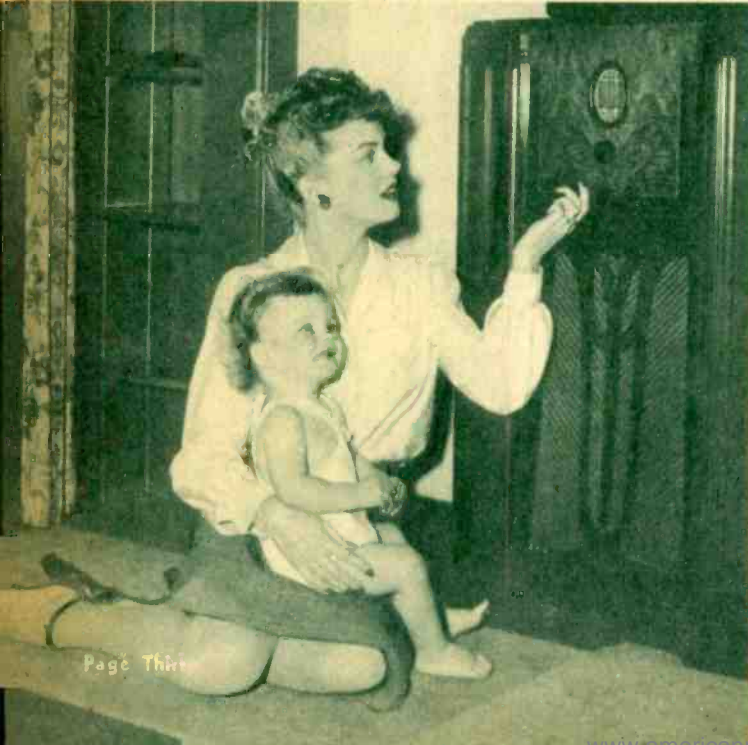

These records were not annexed without expenditure of time, thought, and money. If time and thought don't impress you, just figure out the investment in cold cash.

KGFJ's switch to music "twenty-four hours a day" began when Miss

Thelma Kirchner assumed the post of manager three years ago. She began a planned, gradual cancellation of existing programs and by May, 1944, had the situation so well in hand that the station started to program its music from typed lists. Announcers no longer reached haphazardly into the bins and pulled out any records they wanted to play. Each quarter-hour of the twenty-four was carefully compiled, with a view to af-

Wants Friends

Bill has his hands full operating the bandstand. The present format of three and a half hours of popular music, interspersed with famous guests of the day, is to continue. "My first purpose is to make a lot of friends," he said, "and I don't intend to startle anybody with a lot of sensational innovations right off the bat. But I do have a few ideas which I hope to incorporate into the program as we go along."

In answer to queries about the type of music to be played on the daytime show, Anson replied he'd play what people wanted. "I like everything from Guy Lombardo to a swing band."

If he hadn't pawned that clarinet during his school days, Bill might be playing in a band today. Instead, he became a commercial artist with a gift for mimicry. He heard that Paul Whiteman was conducting a search for a singer and entered as a mimic. Within two weeks he played the Palace with Whiteman and then toured with him for a year.

"Imagine the thrill of landing the Palace on your second week. That made me decide that this show business was here to stay for me."

The Palace led to night clubs and vaudeville and eventually radio.

"And that's the way it has always been. It's just happened," smiled Mrs. A. "But I wouldn't say Bill's breaks have come easily."

"Unless," chimed in Bill, "you mean coming to California. That was the nicest break I ever had."

YA KNOW," said Bill Anson, KFWB's "Hollywood Bandstand" disc jockey, "this is a brand new experience for me. And what's more," he added in a confidential tone, "I'm no disc jockey."

"Oh, yes, you are," we gasped. "'Cause we heard you this very day."

Big, black-haired, blue-eyed Bill smiled modestly and asked, "Ya think so, huh?"

There's no doubt about it. The guy is a good disc jockey. Anson is discovering that emceeing, selecting and spinning the platters, and interviewing well-known guests isn't too far a cry from the type of show he used to handle in Chicago. They just didn't call them disc jockeys there.

KFWB, in turn, is pleased with its new precedent of bringing to its microphone a man who is not only an accomplished announcer and emcee, but also a thoroughly capable entertainer.

Is Good-Natured

When we talked to Anson, he'd been in town but a few brief weeks, and already thought California was a pretty wonderful place. That's the way Bill is. He's easy-going, rarely loses his temper and figures people in general are pretty swell.

Selected by a group of Los Angeles advertising executives and trade editors as the most eligible choice for the head of the "Bandstand", Anson was subject for another quirk of fate. "By now," he smiled, "I've learned to accept them. I entered a record in the contest merely at the suggestion

fording the listeners versatility of musical fare and to segueing from one program into the next with most pleasant result ("a rolling hills effect", Miss Kirchner calls it). By this, she means that KGFJ doesn't sign off a quarter-hour of jive and sign on a semi-classical, predominantly string orchestra. Perry Como makes a better predecessor to Kostelanetz than Woody Herman, for example.

Typical Programming

In the early morning, the music is quiet. "Folks don't like too much noise or corn when they're waking up", commented KGFJ's musical director, Clark Hayden (former Horace Heidt vocalist). For example, Ozie Waters and Riders of the Purple Sage are early ayem favorites and blend nicely into music by Cugat or Carlos Molina, which, in turn, segues into music by orchestras like Richard Himber's or George Olsen's. At 8 a. m., Kostelanetz' semi-classical material is good, and by 9:30, some Jerome Kern favorites fit. Just before noon a little modified jive creeps in. By and large through the day, however, the music is aimed at Mrs. Housewife and is not on the blatant side. The hot stuff is saved for the 'teen-agers, late in the afternoon. Then the transition into dinner music, with semi-classical, dance, South American, Western, ballroom, and sophisticated leading into the nighttime "Starlight and Shadows".

When an average of sixteen records an hour is played, twenty-four hours a day, one comprehends the amount of programming going on behind the scenes at KGFJ. Hayden arranges the popular programs, while David Ballard, with suggestions from Miss Kirchner, plans the "Musical Digest" programs.

Perhaps the most popular of KGFJ's offerings, "Musical Digest", is heard Monday-Saturday, 6-8 p. m. Here is its working schedule: Monday, Forgotten Classics; Tuesday, String Night; Wednesday, Music of the Masters; Thursday, Pot Pourri Night; Friday, Opera; Saturday, Pot Pourri, with special emphasis on music which has been a recent air-time highlight.

"Musical Digest" started from a comment made to Miss Kirchner by her brother, who is employed at Universal Studios. He observed that a man going home from work didn't have an opportunity of listening to good music and catching a little headline news. That gave KGFJ's manager an idea.

She didn't have much to start work on—three or four albums of classical music (the station had hitherto broadcast all such music from prepared commercial transcriptions). Between June, 1944, and September, 1944, the station set out to acquire

a classical library—"we bought records like mad", Miss Kirchner relates, "and started mimeographing the advance programs, although 'Musical Digest' program at that time was still only an hour" (it expanded to two hours January, 1945).

Mail Advance Programs

Soon after "Musical Digest" became a two-hour broadcast, the station started printing advance programs. Listeners, to the tune of 5000, sent in requests to be placed on KGFJ's mailing galley. The Public Library receives 250 advance schedules, U. S. C. receives 250, while schools are also on the list.

- Too bad the supply is limited now to 5000 (called "charter members") but KGFJ hopes soon to increase output of advance information leaflets.

Cataloguing, placing, and replacing thousands of records saddles a ticklish job on the station. There are no duplicates of some of the old records, while some of the classical platters are collector's items. An average of only ten records a month is broken.

Over-All View

The Festival will attempt to give listeners a panoramic view of American music, stemming from its humble origins to symphonic productions. Said George Zachary, program producer: "There have been many programs of American music on radio, but rarely has anyone attempted to cover the entire range of musical endeavor. Some have dealt with classical music exclusively, others with folksongs, and the great majority with the popular tunes from motion pictures and Tin Pan Alley. Then there have been some that specialized in swing music, and occasionally, programs that featured the original scores of motion picture composers.

"It is our intent to combine all these in a single program."

It should be interesting listening, hearing America's tin lizzy tunes riding the same airplanes with its Lincolns.

"Hollywood Today" column, now syndicated to 100 daily newspapers. (In Los Angeles, it's carried Wednesdays and Fridays in the Hollywood Citizen-News.) By this time thoroughly in love with California, she consented to leave it only long enough to make brief trips to England for her syndicate in 1941 and 1943, where she served as a war correspondent.

It was on her first trip that she met her husband, Trevor Westbrook,

who at that time was chief aide to Lord Beaverbrook in the Ministry of Air. "Trevor helped win the Battle of Britain", she says proudly. "He was in charge of buying and repairing planes, and it was up to him to see to it that as soon as the Jerries knocked a ship down, he got it back up again as fast as possible. He was awarded the CBE for his work, and he's still in England for the government."

Has Little Problems

A devoted mother, the columnist does her best to spend as much time as she can with her two children, Wendy, aged three-and-a-half years, and Robert, four-and-a-half months. Wendy loves to talk on the telephone and play with the typewriter; when her mother is trying to use both to get out a column or a radio script, Wendy can make life a little difficult.

Right now Mrs. Westbrook is waiting for the time when she and her husband can be together again. And next time, she hopes it will be in more of a "Stars Fell on Alabama" setting than a "Bombs Fell on Britain" . . . the way it was in 1943.

Her first war trip across was brief, but the second was in the middle of Germany's nuisance raids, and on more than one occasion she came closer to the Black Angel than she likes to remember. "A bomb blew up one end of a bridge just as we were at the other end," she remembers. "Bombs were falling all around us, but believe it or not, I couldn't hear them because my heart was pounding so hard. Yet in spite of all those bombs, my husband meticulously stopped and waited for a traffic light to turn green. That's an Englishman for you!"
