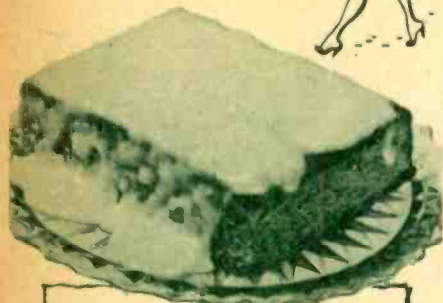

Madman Morgan

*Madcap Henry Morgan Has Hit the Big Time
Now by Biting the Hand That Feeds Him!*

HE'S A big star now—perhaps destined to be the biggest comedy name in 1947—but the faithful Henry Morgan fans are keeping their fingers crossed. They've followed the incorrigible Morgan's career long enough to know that sometimes the sponsor and the station can't take it. And Morgan just doesn't care!

Here's a glimpse of Morgan's past hilarious history in radio—read it and then join us in crossing fingers. Henry became the youngest announcer in radio at the age of seventeen, became a newscaster and was hired and fired all in the space of five weeks. He just couldn't get to broadcasts on time. He went to a station in Philadelphia and worked for one year, signing off the station at night by announcing the names of everyone who happened to be in the

studio including the janitor, elevator operators, window cleaners. He was finally fired for listing station executives whom he seldom met in the missing persons bureau broadcast. Happily Morgan comments, "It was days before they discovered it."

Worked at a station in Boston for two years and was doing fine until he got interested in a law course. He started attending law school at night and was fired for cutting a broadcast to take his examinations. Oh, well, as Morgan says, "Time Marches Sideways!" Our hero finally wound up on station WOR in New York, where he did the remotes from the out-of-town dine and dance spots. Cracks like "Hop in your car and drive to 'Blank's Silver Slipper'. It's only fifteen minutes from New York as the crow flies—that is if the crow happens to be driving a super-charged motorcycle..." made officials decide that this wasn't exactly the sort of thing to induce confidence in the remote broadcasts. Instead of

firing Morgan, they gave him a weekly spot where he could do his kidding on his own time.

Is "Discovered"

Listeners discovered him and soon he was doing his famous "Here's Morgan" broadcasts three times a week. This was soon expanded to six a week. If the listeners could take it Morgan could! But alas, the poor sponsor! The Adler Elevator Shoe people were perhaps Morgan's most famous and most heckled sponsor. Three times they withdrew sponsorship, but Morgan was in their blood—they always came back. Morgan persisted in referring to his sponsor as "Old Man Adler" and one time after delivering a rhapsody on Adler's Shoes, in an aside, he confided to his listeners, "Frankly, I wouldn't wear them to a dog fight." The sponsor was upset and asked Morgan to retract his statement. Next day on the air, Morgan repeated his set-to with "Old Man Adler". "I said I'd take it back and I will," stated Morgan. "I would wear Adler's Shoes to a dog fight." It was tactics like this that had men of above-average height buying this brand of shoe. Morgan lost the sponsorship of Life Savers when he confided that they were milking the public by putting holes in their candy. He also referred to their six delicious flavors as "cement, asphalt, asbestos . . ."

Radio took a step backward when Morgan went into the army in 1943. Happily, "Here's Morgan" came back to the airways in 1945. And now look! Coast-to-coast on a sponsored show! In deference to the actors and musicians on his present show, Henry is using a script. Formerly he used to work from notes he had

made shortly before air time. An expert ad-libber, he could take off from anywhere following his famous opening, "Hello, anybody, here's Morgan." Newspaper items, remarks overheard in an elevator, people talking to themselves on the street, billboard and bus advertisements, signs in store windows, magazine articles and movies are all stored up in Morgan's wonderful memory ready to be used as material for his show. But it's always been the commercial that's the spice of the program. "People don't care about where and how a product is made," says Morgan, "they just want to know if it is good . . . The trouble with the average sponsor is that he's just average. I know more about radio advertising than the guys in the business."

Phone Marathon

Morgan always kept his address and phone number a secret to avoid angry sponsors. If the sponsor was enraged he'd have to call the agency, who called the network, who called the only person who knew Morgan's phone number. She called Morgan, and if the complaint hadn't died down by that time she would recite it to Morgan, who didn't care anyway.

He has never liked studio audiences, and if he tells a joke he thinks isn't funny, he will glare fiercely at anyone in the audience who dares to laugh. He is a versatile dialectician because he worked alone for so long that he had to learn to do his own characters. His Russian, British, French and German dialects are hilarious.

Here are some Morganisms: He invented Broonsday, the eighth day of the week. It's the day that people take old gold and convert it back into sea water—the day we take

nylons and make coal out of them. Started a medical school for doctors who don't practice medicine—just pose for ads. "One of my doctors," says Henry, "has invented Gonfalon's Enormous Liver Pills because he discovered that there are various sizes of livers—they're not all little." Morgan is also the discoverer of the town of More. "There are only two housewives in that town," he explains, "so when you see an advertisement that says 'More housewives recommend . . .,' you know it's these two women who live in More,

"Aw, ANYBODY Can Be An Announcer"

Everybody Wants to Get Into Their Act, So Let's Take Some Time to Re-examine The Careers of These Veteran Mike-men

ONE of the phenomena of this post-war world seems to be the desire of about one out of every ten of our male population to become a radio announcer. Somehow, sometime in the last five years it has occurred to an awful lot of people that the announcer's life is the life for them—glamorous, well-paid, easy . . . Um-huh!

We came up against these hard facts when we called on Thomas Woods of AFRA, the radio actors' guild. According to Mr. Woods there are about 125 staff announcing jobs in this area and about 450 names of professional announcers on file in the AFRA office. This isn't even counting the great number of peo-

ple who are studying or hoping to become announcers and who are not registered with the guild.

Is there no ray of hope in all this? Well, yes — Mr. Woods further informed us that many times an unknown out-of-towner will audition and win a staff job on the local stations where many experienced local people have failed to connect. "And a staff announcing job is not to be sneezed at," says Woods. "It's still the best opportunity to get somewhere in radio."

We've gotten many letters from frustrated people who have made tentative efforts to break into the announcing field. Here we print a hypothetical letter which includes most of the statements and queries

that are usually contained, together with answers gleaned from the careers of three of our most successful mike-men, Ken Carpenter, Harry von Zell and Don Wilson.

"Sirs: I think it's time some of the big-name announcers moved over and gave someone else a break. While I was in the service (or working in a war plant, etc.) they got into radio and got all the soft jobs. You have to have friends and a pull to get anywhere. Why don't they give someone else a chance for the fame and easy money—they've had theirs.

I have a good voice and anybody could read from a script the way they do . . . etc. . . . etc. . . ."

Veterans All

Well, let's see now—"while I was in the service, etc. . . ." Harry von Zell went into radio twenty years ago, Don Wilson's voice was first heard on the air from KOA, Denver, about twenty-two years ago, and Ken Carpenter, the baby of the bunch, started his mike career locally over sixteen years ago. Hardly what you'd call getting into radio while *anyone* was in the service!

"You have to have friends and a pull to get anywhere . . ."

Yes, Ken Carpenter had a friend who got him his initial audition. The only thing wrong with this argument is that Ken didn't get the job. During a lean period, Don Wilson applied to a guy named Harry von Zell for a job at KMTR. Don was turned down cold. Many years later he asked friend von Zell why he hadn't gotten the job. "Your job?"

Always A Family

"Those Websters" a Jolly, Interesting Unit Whether On or Off the Ether Lanes

THOSE WEBSTERS," Mutual's family comedy drama, has been on the air so long the cast has taken on the aspects of a big family. And that feeling of family solidarity has been increased as "Those Websters" has twice followed the advice of H. Greeley and gone West.

Originally aired from New York, the show moved to Chicago, stayed a few months, then shifted again, this time to Hollywood, where they broadcast their first show from California October 6.

Shifting an air show with as large a cast as "Those Websters" is no small chore, and Producer Joe Ainsley didn't know until airtime whether he was going to have a program or not. Ainsley, Music Director Frank Worth, Connie Crowder and Jane Webb played it safe—they came by train or plane. Writer Frank

and Doris Hursley, not being requisites at the final show in Chicago, took two weeks to make the trip, doing a little vacationing in Estes Park, Colorado, en route. But with the others it was a different story.

Gil Stratton, Jr., who plays Bill Webster, Willard Waterman, who plays Dad, and Johnny Jacobs, the announcer, made up a three-car caravan and started driving. Lou Krugman was to fly to Denver, pick up a new car, and join them. He never did catch up with them. On top of that, Johnny Jacobs was driving a brand new car. He pulled up in a gas station somewhere in Wyoming, the attendant lifted the hood, took one look, and informed him he might as well leave the car right there.

Expensive Jaunt

"Why?" demanded Johnny.

"There hasn't been any oil put in this thing since they drove it off the assembly line."

It cost Johnny almost \$100 to repair the damage.

Clarence Hartzell had his troubles, too. He didn't get into Hollywood until about one minute before show time, while Ainsley once more held a breath that was showing considerable signs of wear and tear.

"Those Websters" next problem, now that transportation is taken care of, is housing. Chicago, it seems, was never like this. So far, Krugman, Ainsley, and the Hursleys have bought houses; all the others are either paying hotel bills, trying not to wear out their welcome with friends, or staying shakily in sub-sub-leased apartments which they

expect to have to give back any minute.

Like all modern happy families, "Those Websters" has its wits, its sports fan, its intellectuals, its veterans. Back from the wars are Gil Stratton, who was with the AAF, Johnny Jacobs, Merchant Marine, and Lou Krugman, who served in the ETO.

Its intellectuals include the Hursleys. Frank is an associate professor on leave from the University of Wisconsin, holding a doctor's degree in American literature. Doris is a practicing lawyer, who resigned from the industrial commission of Wisconsin in order to concentrate on her script writing. They have three daughters, one in grade school, one in high school, and one in college. Naturally the girls contribute no end to "Those Websters" script ideas.

It was the type of offering that we used to revel in, on such satisfying ether fare of old as the fondly-remembered series titled "The Circle"—a capsule skit with the brevity required by the limited time of an airshow, and bright dialogue that shows off most effectively the talent and charm of its performer.

More of such spots as "The Happy, Happy Bennetts" would make for more happy, happy listeners!

Tea For Millions

Last season, we became such regular customers of "Joannie's Tea Room" that we practically held our breath all summer in the fear that it wouldn't be the same this Fall. Miss Davis, in our estimation, is an incomparable comedienne and we consider that she had come upon the perfect format with her "Tea Room" show and its participants. It wasn't that the show was flawlessly funny, but its comedy characterizations were good, its situations entertaining, its atmosphere one that established a warm contact with the listeners. In other words, it was a program that gradually became as welcome and familiar each week as an old friend.

This autumn, we tuned in with trepidation to see if Joannie, her "Tea Room" and its happy inhabitants were still intact. Save for a few changes, they were—and are—which means an enjoyable treat for dialers who tune regularly to CBS-KNX, Mondays at 8:30 p. m. We emphasize *regularly*, because we think it almost a requisite that, to get full enjoyment from the Joan Davis program, the listener should hear it consistently. Its comedy is good for one-time dialings, but its characters and laugh situations are far better enjoyed as a steady diet. After several weeks' listening, "Tea

Room" dialers have the feeling of "belonging" in Joannie's shop and "knowing" its zany proprietress and all her friends.

The latter include Wally Brown as Wally Brown, S. M. Williams as "Serenus", Verna Felton as "Cousin Cornelia", Sharon Douglas as "Barbara Weatherby", Ben Gage as "Doctor Crenshaw" and Pat McGeehan as the "narrator" on "Swanville" happenings.

the series this season. Last year, Andy Russell and Harry von Zell were among those present. The former two, as yet, haven't as much to contribute to the show as did the latter, but both deliver capably and, given time, will undoubtedly establish their characterizations more strongly. Verna Felton has switched roles, from "Mrs. Hipperton" to "Cousin Cornelia". Veteran character actress Verna is at her best as either—or doing almost anything else, for that matter. Sharon Douglas has replaced Shirley Mitchell as the uppish "Barbara Weatherby" and is doing very well, save for an occasional fluffing of those broad "A's", seemingly caused by nervousness. McGeehan's voice sounds like a "March of Time", which is what it's supposed to do, and his versatile acting talents are frequently put to added use in irregular roles. Last, but far from least, Joan's "brother-in-law", Serenus, is a sure laugh-getter.

Frank Bingman rates kudos for able announcing, Dick Mack for production perfection, and Nat Linden, Joe Quillan, Bobby O'Brien and Si Wills for superior scripting.

The talents of all of the above people combine harmoniously to make the Joan Davis show the bell-ringer that it is, but its most vital ingredient is its star, herself. She gets the most out of hers and everybody else's dialogue, puts fluffs and ad-libs to riotous use, and throws in surprise Davisisms for good measure.

Joan has been officially tabbed radio's "Queen of Comedy"—but she doesn't need her crown to prove it!

Long-Time Lease

It would appear the only restaurant these days not suffering from headaches caused by food shortages, inflation, and a return policy of being nice to customers is NBC's "Duffy's Tavern." Furthermore, it appears "Duffy's" will be in business for as long as "Archie" continues dishing out his own bon mots of comedy. And, who knows, that may be forever.

Ed "Archie" Gardner sounds in pretty good form to us, while the Tavern, itself, is attracting more and more big name guests. Then there is a great deal of audience interest aroused by the program's consistent plugging of "Archie's Little Love Song," which will probably enjoy more or as much popularity as achieved by the previous "Leave Us Face It." This brings us to the subject of good showmanship.

Ed Gardner, who knows all about showmanship, is an ex-radio producer who doesn't miss many other tricks. His timing and delivery as

"Archie" couldn't be perfected. Kudos is equally due Sandra Gould as "Miss Duffy," Charlie Cantor as "Finnegan," Eddie Green as "Eddie, the waiter," producer Tony Stanford, orchestra leader Matty Malneck, writers Vince Bogart, Larry Gelhart, Sid Dorfman and Al Johansen.

Duffy's "where the elite meet to eat" premise could be worn thin with repetitious serving, but, like the meal of a good chef, has been carefully planned before each air offering. As far as we can tell, there aren't too many cooks to spoil the broth. We sort of imagine Mr. Gardner is head chef, which to our way of thinking makes for a consistently good menu of ether entertainment.

"Supper Club"

If you're a dialer in search of palatable melody, interrupted but briefly with bits of banter by happy, talented personalities, NBC's "Supper Club" (Monday through Friday, 8:00 p.m.) is the airshow for you.

Three nights out of the five, the program stars the smooth song patterns of Perry Como, and on the other two evenings of each week, Jo Stafford takes over with her equally smooth tune renditions. Backing both songsters (at least, until Miss Stafford's forthcoming sojourn on this coast) are Lloyd Shaffer, his orchestra, and a voice ensemble called "The Satisfiers" (taken from sponsor Chesterfield's cigarette claim).

Every once in a while, guest stars supplement this line-up and allow their specific abilities to blend harmoniously into the pleasing program pattern.

Incidentally, one of the most amazing ingredients in evidence on this series, in our estimation, is Joe Stafford's personality. Having interviewed her a few years back, and watched her way with a song at the microphone, we had come to the conclusion that she was musically good and personally nice—but nevertheless, a "blank." Her personality was "blah"—in other words, nonexistent.

Now miraculously, with her appearances on the "Supper Club," she not only offers ample proof of the much-touted Stafford vocal ability but also supplies abundant "sparkle." This Stafford "sparkle," sharing honors with the personable Perry, makes this quarter hour offering one of radio's pleasantest.

"Bullock's Show"

A Tuesday night favorite which consistently comes through with good listening is KFI's Bullock's Show (Tuesday, 9 p.m.). No blatant publicity reminds you that Tuesday is Bullock's Day, yet by maintaining a high standard of entertainment, the program has received approximately the best local rating for a broadcast of

its type. One contributing factor, we feel, is the program's current dramatization of "Favorite Story," which has been airing since June.

Since we all have a favorite (you do, don't you?) the Bullock's Show can't help but please everybody at one time or another. In fact, the Board of Education is so pleased with the series that it is thinking of presenting it in classrooms as part of the curriculum. And we can't think of a nicer tribute than to know that the average listener shares the same pleasure with school heads from these skillful condensations of all-time masterpieces.

A Bob Lee-Jerry Lawrence Production, "Favorite Story" is currently under the directorial reins of True Boardman, who is in charge while his ex-Army buddies are in New York. Boardman, himself, a radio veteran, casts the weekly show, does some of the writing, and occasionally handles an acting chore if it strikes his mike fancy. He feels that the airer has a nation-wide future and pointed out that it operates on one of the largest budgets employed by a local radio show.

From a list of fifty stories, a number of prominent people have been requested to state their favorite. Among those participating have been Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, who asked for Bret Harte's "Luck of Roaring Camp"; Deems Taylor showed a preference for a Robert Louis Stevenson short story; Lowell Thomas asked for

"Arabian Nights"; and Sinclair Lewis named Thackeray's "Vanity Fair" as his choice. The selections of other celebrities will be dramatized in coming weeks.

Boardman averred that the classic novels presented the most difficult problems of condensation. In trying to reproduce the plot of an extensive book in a half hour, "Favorite Stories" wisely avoids detail and attempts only to capture the essence of the story, itself.

Skillfully written scripts call for equally skillful actors. Depending upon the type of show in question, "Favorite Stories" frequently seeks the services of Janet Waldo, Peggy Webber, Ben Alexander, Sid Miller, Howard Duff, Joan Loring, Wilms Herbert, Herb Butterfield, Barbara Eiler, Lila Webb, and numerous other top air performers. Until his recent illness, Claude Sweeten composed and was in charge of musical production. At present Robert Mitchell is waving the baton.

Perhaps your favorite story will be presented next week—or maybe you've already heard it. We wonder if *we're* going to wind up with *fifty* favorite stories!

The Squeaking Door

Although you may be among those who regard with disapproval murder on the radio, the fact remains that dialers, in the majority, delight in a well-concocted dish of gore—such as

CBS' "Inner Sanctum" (Monday, 9:30 p.m.).

Hi Brown, producer-director of the squeaking door series, has this to say about the popularity of mystery-murder ether fare. "People crave excitement. Mystery and detective dramas satisfy this need while at the same time offering an 'escape,' because the persons and situations in these dramas lie outside the experience of the vast majority of the listening audience. The listener knows the things he is hearing couldn't possibly happen to him, or to his children, or to any of the people he knows. And therefore, though the dramatic incidents portrayed may be gory and harrowing, people can listen objectively."

In fact, the producer points out, as gory as "Inner Sanctum" may get, its listeners continue to ask for more blood. "I can never make the Sanctum dramas gory enough," claims Brown. "The mail keeps pouring in, asking for still more gore. And incidentally," he grins, "women fans are more bloodthirsty than the men. I seriously doubt that they are the 'weaker sex.'"

Aiding Brown in delivering the spine-tingling episodes of "Inner Sanctum" are an ingenious outlay of sound effects, an eerie organ, the voice of Paul McGrath as "Raymond, Your Host," keeper of the squeaking door—and in addition, some of radio's

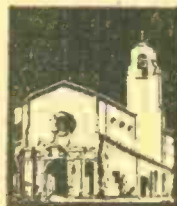

top acting talent, whose abilities are well showcased in these thirty-minute emotional thrillers.

It is "Raymond" who keeps things moving at a blood-chilling pace, and at the same time offers mocking, tongue-in-cheek commentary that is both hair-raising and rib-tickling.

His mannerly greeting to you at the opening of the show is usually some remark such as, "Come in, won't you, and have your blood curdled?" Later, just as your blood has been pretty well curdled by a series of corpses, "Raymond" returns with another chuckling comment—such as the time when the murderer of the story encountered a corpse with its finger pointing straight at her. "Raymond" interrupted the frightening episode to say, "Tsk, tsk, tsk! Such manners. Doesn't that corpse know that it's impolite to point!"

With this carefree companionship of "Inner Sanctum's" happy host and with the excellent dramatic deliveries of the fine radio artists regularly featured, we find the weekly offerings of this ace thrill show entertainment to our liking, and—if you can take it—we suggest that you, too, join us each week inside the squeaking door!

Thanksgiving Feast

Just about the time Mr. and Mrs. Listener are relishing that last morsel of Thanksgiving turkey, CBS will dish out a tasty dessert treat in the form of its fifth big all-star Elgin Show. (1:00-3:00 p. m. P. S. T.) In perusing the impressive cast list, one wonders how a mere two hour broadcast can offer time enough to air the talent of the celebrities on hand.

Top other names comprising the list include genial Don Ameche as host, announcer Ken Carpenter, Jack Benny, Red Skelton, Jimmy Durante and Garry Moore, Lauritz Melchior, Peter Lind Hayes, the Charloters, Vera Vague, Burl Ives, Ginny Simms, Margaret Whiting, Desi Arnaz, the Elgin Chorus, and Vera Jean Vary, twenty-year old winner of the 1946 Atwater Kent Foundation Auditions. (An interesting sidelight is the fact that Miss Vary, guesting on the Elgin show, is from Elgin, Illinois.)

In contacting co-producers Billy Wilgus and Johnny Christ, we learned that 130 people will be involved in producing 120 minutes of holiday entertainment. In breaking down the extensive list of workers backstage and onstage, we ascertained that twenty guests, one producer, one CBS contact producer, four AFRA players, one announcer, forty musicians, three script girls, two soundmen, twelve ushers, five stage crew, seven writers, one engineer, an eight-piece novelty musical group and fifteen members of the

chorus all add up to the grand total of 130 participating members. Whew!

Judging from past years' performances, both Elgin holiday shows are eagerly awaited by the radio public. And we know that Thanksgiving wouldn't seem like Thanksgiving if we didn't have those interesting two hours to feast upon.

Playbacks (Critical Comment)

"Pot o' Gold"

We didn't win the "Pot O' Gold" prize last week, so forgive us if we sound a little peeved about the show. (ABC, Wednesday, 6:30 p.m.)

Half an hour of indifferent clowning by Happy Felton that sounds like a take-off on Bob Hope is the price you pay for finding out who *does* collect the grand. Happy's comedy leaves us cold, but if you happened to catch the show on which he sang "Allegheny Al", we hope you were as pleased as we were. He has a fine slap-dash singing style.

Very Holly's vocals are pleasant and Jimmy Carroll's sweet Irish voice would be an asset to any program.

The thing we don't understand about the program is why it doesn't fall under a "no lottery" air rule. There is no skill connected with winning the "Pot". You just sit quietly in your front parlor, if you have a listed phone, waiting to collect. Joan Davis wanted to start her air series this season with a somewhat similar gimmick. Joanie, as an amnesia victim, was supposed to have remembered only the serial numbers on five one dollar bills. The bills had been planted in different sections of the country and, you guessed it, the lucky people who happened to get them could contact the program and collect. Her network, however, refused to allow it on the grounds that it was a lottery. Each network, we understand, makes its own rules about this type of program.

Maybe one network's lottery is another network's poison?

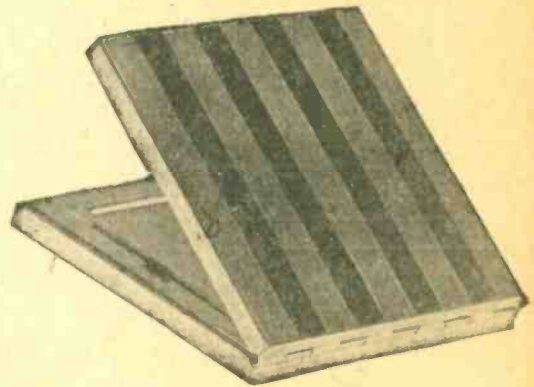

"Aw, Anybody Can Be an Announcer"

Harry exclaimed. "I was scared to death of my own job!"

"Fame and easy money, etc. . . ."

Harry von Zell handled announcing chores on twenty-one New York shows a week at one time—for less than \$100 each week. He didn't become the full-fledged emcee comedian he's famous for being now until the summer of 1945 on the Eddie Cantor show, though he did perform similar duties for Fred Allen. That's only nineteen years after his initial start in radio! Ken Carpenter sat in the lobby of KFI for over two weeks until chief announcer Don Wilson hired him. This same Wilson got a job as staff singer locally in 1928 and became a member of an early bird program. He worked early and late at the station and then got fired because he bought a different make car than that which the owner of the station carried in his agency.

"Anybody could read from a script . . ."

When Don Wilson became a staff member of NBC in New York he did half-hour newscasts cold. That means he had no time to check pronunciations (and you know the pronunciations that show up in the news!) or read the copy through before he went on the air. Don had been a football star at the University of Colorado and when he decided to forsake his singing career for one of announcing, he was fitted for becoming one of the best-known sports announcers on the coast. Though Harry von Zell was one of the best announcers in the business, it was Harry's own natural flair for comedy and his great sense of humor that prompted Fred Allen to start writing Harry into his comedy scripts. Ken Carpenter has been pushed through a plate glass window while covering a parade, tackled and trampled by players during a Rose Bowl game, hit in the solar plexus with a bat while describing a baseball match, kicked by the race horse, Alcazar, at Santa Anita; went alone into a lion's cage to interview Leo, the lion; slipped off the top of a mountain in Elysian Park while telling the folks at home about the famous "moving mountain." "Believe me," says Carpenter, "it wasn't in the script!"

So there you have the fame and easy life that have marked the careers of these three announcers! It adds up to perseverance, hard work and a great natural ability. And it can still be done. If anything, Harry, Don and Ken will leave their field in radio a better one than they found it. Don, through his wonderfully natural reaction to Benny's comedy and his humorous handling of the commercials; Harry with his

great flair for comedy, and Ken, who made ringing the NBC chimes for "Kraft Music Hall" a national institution not so long ago, have proven that a good announcer is a very important part of the whole show. If you become an announcer, you'll find that these three have already paved the way for you to become a real radio personality in your own right!

In the athletic department, the laurels go to Gil Stratton, for Gil is undoubtedly the only member of AFRA who also has a card in the Umpire's league, and he treasures as the greatest compliment he ever received not the time some radio producer praised his acting, but the time that Joe DiMaggio, on having the third strike called, turned to Gil and said,

"It's okay, kid; even the experts make mistakes."

Gil, of course, is happy as the proverbial mollusk in Southern California, where baseball's a year-round pastime. From the minute he got here, he's been making trips up and down the coast between shows umpring games.

Natural Wit

The wit, of course, is Connie Crowder, who is that delightful type of person who not only has a deep well of conscious humor, keeping the cast in stitches throughout rehearsals, but also manages to fumble herself into a good many situations nobody else could possibly get into.

On one occasion, Connie was going down in the elevator at Mutual's Chicago station to meet her mother in the lobby. On the way, she picked up several people, all of whom she invited along. Once in the lobby, she encountered a few more, and in the course of introducing everybody around, wound up by introducing herself to her own mother.

Connie worked for a long time on programs for Minneapolis' General Mills. When Chicago's Quaker Oats took over "Those Websters," executives and agency heads invaded the control room for the initial broadcast. Connie, vague about the sponsor but most anxious to put her best food forward, laid a pall over the entire proceedings by announcing:

"It was SO nice of you folks to come here all the way from Minneapolis!"

Yes . . . "Those Websters" is a family show on the air and off. Cast members are even doing their best to continue the tradition of the Great American family statistics-wise. They've had three babies in as many weeks—future Websters for future generations.

Nebraska." "Do you suffer from acid stomach?" asks Morgan. "Well, stop drinking acid."

One of Morgan's recent shows started out with the announcer screaming, "And, now, the star of our show, America's number one funny man, Bob Hope!" Morgan came on quietly with, "This is Henry Morgan. The reason the announcer said Bob Hope was we figured we'd get twelve million more listeners. If you tune out now, you're a sore loser." And who else would urge you to "try CBS to see if there's anything better on?"

Morgan used to refer to his girl friend as the "ninth most beautiful girl in New York." But said he didn't like women because, "if they're smart, they argue—if they're dumb, you can't stand them!" Unpredictable as always, he recently got married!

A Conformist

On his first half-hour night-time broadcast Morgan told his audience: "The other joke shows aren't on the air yet so I have no one to steal from. Now that I have my own half-hour I'm going to conform. I've shaved my head for a toupee, and I'm going to get a brother-in-law and a mother-in-law and an announcer who giggles and a closet with a lot of stuff in it . . . and start a feud . . . with Toscanini." He also claimed that he'd tried to think of another name for his show—"I was going to call it the 'Jack Benny Show,' but I found out someone else was using it."

"Here's where the commercials would go," he said later, "if I were foolish enough to sell this valuable program." Foolish or not, the program has been sold to the Eversharp Company. Asked how he liked his new sponsor, Morgan replied, "Eversharp has nice, blue eyes." Fans who were fearful that Morgan would be too impressed with his new position to take the same pot shots at the hand that feeds him knew they had nothing to worry about after they heard the first program. Henry was talking about the Schick Injector razor. "I told them the name was too long," he complained. "I told them they ought to call it the 'Morgan' or the 'Snazzy,' but . . ."

He ended up his first show in the new series by pleading to the air audience, "Don't hate me. I did the best I could."

Of himself Morgan says, "I'm intelligent but misguided. If I had any real talent I'd go straight."

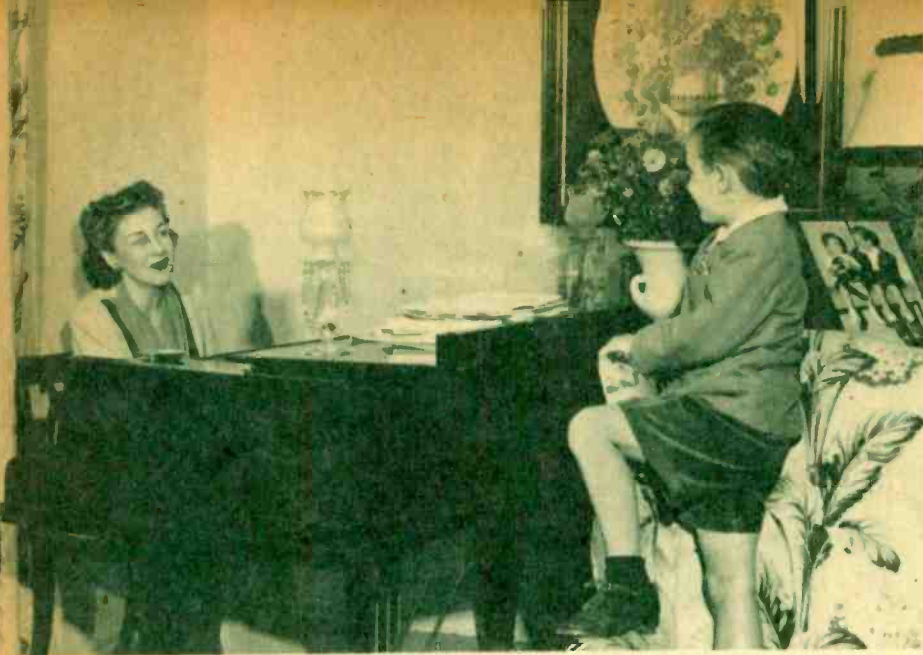

gan giving lessons on the instrument at the age of thirteen!

"In fact," Shirley remembered, "when I made my very first singing appearance in public (I'd just sung in my own parlor before that), I was originally scheduled just to play the piano—as usual. But so far, he doesn't have the chance to speak his

When we asked Shirley to bring us up-to-date on the doings of Ross, she made a face and demurred, "There's nothing to tell—that's the trouble. I guess I shouldn't be in this business—I'm awful copy. I can't even make up things to say!"

Six or seven years ago (he can't remember dates) Bostonian Brown was a headliner on the stage and in vaudeville. But radio audiences weren't acquainted with him, and, frankly, Mr. Brown knew very little about the mechanics of radio. When he was invited to guest on Vallee's show, he was delighted, but terrified.

"I was doing an act at the time which called for an old battered felt hat. Naturally I took it along to the broadcast. After the dress rehearsal, the producer called me over and asked if I had to wear the hat. I wanted to please so I assured him I could work without it. But I didn't think I could.

"Right up to air time, I was fighting with myself whether I should wear it or not. Finally I realized I was on and dashed out of the dressing room, leaving the hat behind. I sweated out those first few minutes, literally feeling undressed.

"After it was over, I knew the spell was broken. I didn't need the hat and to this day have never worn it. So, you see, the producer's simple request changed my whole routine and, consequently, I developed new types of characters."

The Wally Brown who now appears as star Davis' confidant and pal on CBS' "Joannie's Tea Room," is very much like the off-mike Wally Brown. They're both easy-going fellows, great performers and great talkers. "Ah, come on, now," grins Wally. "You mean a ham!"

Wish Fulfilled

Wally receives a tremendous thrill from the weekly airer. "Maybe because I've always wanted to work with Joannie. It's been one of those things. For years we've been talking about getting together on the radio, but, something always intervened. This year we thought we'd try again — and guess what? We made it!"

Prior to helping in Joannie's Tea Room, Wally has dished out laughs for the Dinah Shore Show as well as on numerous guest spots. "I feel I can learn a lot from my present show," he averred, "because I'm a consistent character. I don't use dribble-talk and I don't depend on visual gags for laughs."

Wally's dribble-talk is his specialty. Perhaps you've heard or seen him do it. Goes something like this: "I, ah, well. I went to—and then he came—and I said," etc. Believe us, it sounds much funnier when Wally does it. After all, we're no dribble-talkers. It's an art.

You can take the dribble-talk away from Wally, but you can't take Boston. He loves that place and, aside from the Boston accent, the references to Boston living and Boston food—you'd never guess he was from Boston. He's been a permanent resident of California (three years now).

A proud possessor of a new home (he had an old one to sell), Wally loves to entertain. He's quite a cook and barbecue is his specialty. "And we don't have a swimming pool any more!"

Contrary to what you may think, swimming pools do play an important part in the Browns' entertaining plans. "We used to own a four-and-a-half-acre place in the valley, complete with a big pool. We'd ask friends to drop in on Sundays—and pretty soon they'd invited their friends, who, in turn, would bring their friends. It was a vicious circle and ended up with my wife and me knowing none of our guests. That had to go—so did the pool!"

The Browns are quite happy in their new home, sans pool, and love spending all of their time beside the fireplace with books in hand. "I guess we got fed up with night spots," related the master, "after having worked in them for so long." (Mrs. B. is an ex-dancer.)

The little Browns, five-year-old Ronnie and three-and-a-half-year-old Barbara, look as if they might inherit mama's and papa's love for the theatre. Ronnie already shows signs of becoming quite a "ham" and although Barbara is more reserved, she can sing a wicked song.

Returning to the subject of his present show, Wally not only is grateful to radio for helping him, but is equally happy over the opportunity of still learning show business. "And let's face it, radio is another medium of the business to master. I'm crazy about it—after all, I've thrown my hat into the ring!"

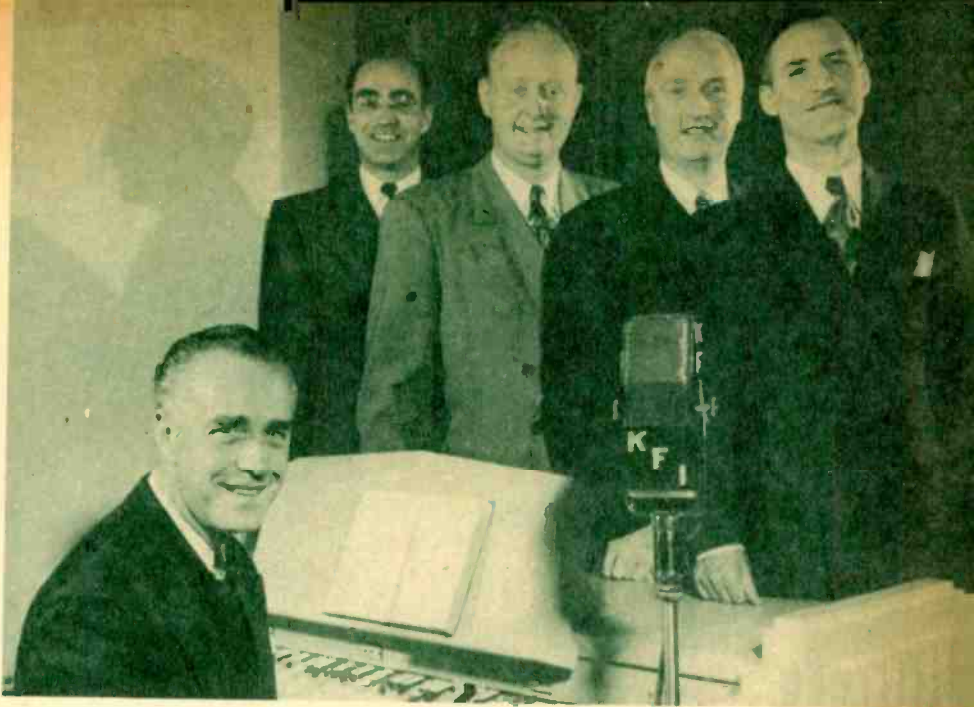

At Five, She Taught Herself to Read, and At Eight, Auditioned and Won Role on Jack Benny Show Over Professional Competition

WHEN the now nine-year-old Jeanine Ann Roose was five, her biggest ambition was to be able to read. At Christmas time, she begged her parents for a new book, and when she received it, she bent her head to its pages with such studied concentration that she had read it through in just a short time. In fact, she became such a prolific bookworm that, by the age of six, she was reading third and fourth grade books!

In the same manner, simply through her own determination to do so, little Jeanine has become a radio actress. Asked when it was that she made her initial appearance at a microphone, Jeanine replied, in the soft child's voice that dialers now identify with Phil Harris' "Baby Alice": "It was on October 21st, 1945."

Her assignment to the Jack Benny show was her very first radio work!

"A friend heard that an audition was being held for the little girl's part on the program, so I tried out for it, and Mr. Benny seemed to like me," is the child actress' summation of that initial triumph of her career.

In addition to her occasional appearances on the Benny show, Jeanine now does her "Baby Alice" portrayal on NBC's new "Fitch Bandwagon," which stars Phil Harris and Alice Faye in their own show.

But being on two of radio's top airshows hasn't changed the youngster's sense of values. "I have a letter from her school principal telling me that Jeanine's attitude in school hasn't changed a bit since she has been on the radio," the actress' nice mother reported. "I'm very grateful and relieved about that," she added.

Unspoiled

As for our own observation of Jean-

ine's attitude, we noted with admiring approval that she displayed equal pride and pleasure in all of her pursuits. Her face lit with enthusiasm as she talked of her swimming lessons, her horseback riding and ice skating. She seemed as proud of being a "Brownie" scout as of being a member of two big coast-to-coast radio shows.

When we asked her what her classmates at school have to say about her appearances on the air, she answered shyly, "They think I do good."

Her most critical radio listeners, however, are her two older brothers, thirteen-year-old Ronald Ivan and twelve-year-old Douglas Kaye. We asked her what they had to say about her radio work. "Well," mused Jeanine, "sometimes they say nice things."

Most of the time, though, Jeanine readily admitted, the boys give her a rough time. "They keep her in her place," summed up Mrs. Roose indulgently.

Jeanine has always liked to "play-act," according to her parents. "Especially in the bathtub," smiled her mother. "My husband and I often eavesdrop from the hall on the dramatic shriekings and imaginary conversations that Jeanine carries on while she's taking her bath."

Even at her age, Jeanine displays domestic tendencies—likes to play games with her roomful of dolls, looks forward to learning to sew and already helps her mother in the kitchen.

She is clothes-conscious, too, and names the red dress which her mother recently made for her as her favorite. "Incidentally," put in her mother, "she takes forever to dress in the morning because she reads while she's doing it. She reads all the time—except at meals because we've established a household rule

against it. After all, we have to talk to her *some time!*"

Otherwise Accomplished

Jeanine names the Heidi and Dr. Doolittle books among her first choices. The miniature actress' busy schedule also includes piano lessons (she's in the third year of classical instruction and plays the instrument in the school orchestra), and singing lessons (she duets with Phil Harris on his record release of "Onesie, Twosie"). She formerly took dancing lessons and has done some professional modeling.

"Her natural stage presence and her love of people were her main assets when she auditioned for the Benny show," her mother pointed out, "but Mr. Benny was wonderful to take a chance on a youngster so inexperienced."

Jeanine's professional studies and activities don't keep her from such normal childhood pursuits as roller skating (which she loves), stamp collecting and playing games in the playhouse her parents have erected in the back yard of their Los Angeles home.

Jeanine also confessed to the normal child's antipathy for brushing her teeth. "I have to keep a watchful eye on her toothbrush," agreed her mother. "She'd like to forget about it altogether."

Jeanine is a radio fan, names Jack Benny as her favorite air star but admitted to being a Fred Allen fan, too. "This Is Your F. B. I." is her most frequent dial choice, along with "Life of Riley," "Lone Ranger" and Gene Autry.

"I like to listen to the re-broadcast of the Benny show, too," she told us, "whenever mother lets me stay up that late."

She also likes movies, used to idolize Veronica Lake but recently abandoned her for Ingrid Bergman—and Crosby. "There was a period there," her mother recalled, "when she wanted to look like Veronica Lake. She used to walk around the house with her hair hanging down over one eye. I'm glad that's over."

Actually, with her long blonde bob, fair skin and pert profile, Jeanine bears somewhat of a daughterly resemblance to her radio "mother," Alice Faye. "It's quite amazing," commented Mrs. Roose. "I have a picture of Jeanine taken when she was four and she looks very much like the real Alice, Jr."

Movie-goers have an opportunity to see Jeanine in two new film offerings, a "Screen Snapshots" short and the forthcoming Capra feature, "It's a Wonderful Life."

No one else in the Roose family has displayed any marked interest in any phase of show business, but Jeanine seems quite certain that she will continue her dramatic career.

"I'll either be a nurse," she pondered with serious concern, "or else I'll stick to radio."
