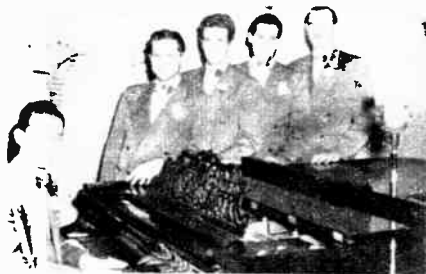

And the BEST of Godfrey is so delightful that it's not too hard to overlook the second best.

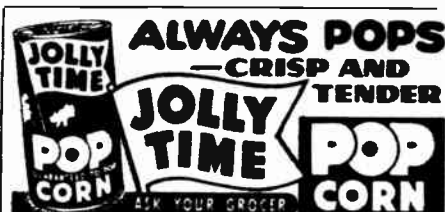

No. 33 of a Series

## Fibber McGee and Molly

*Remember When With the Wistful Vista Couple?*

▲ **1918. MAIL CARRIER** Jim Jordan went into service five days after his marriage to piano teacher Marian Driscoll. He had already had a disappointing taste of vaudeville as top tenor of an act, "A Night with the Poets." On Armistice Day he was sick with the flu in France. He spent the next eight months staging shows throughout France as part of the Army's Entertainment Division. When Jordan (second from left, above) finally got home, Marian was teaching piano again for a living.

▼ **JIM TRIED HIS LUCK** as machinist's helper; washing machine, vacuum cleaner, insurance salesman; day laborer. With a chance to tour in vaudeville if they raised \$1000 for wardrobe and scenery, the Jordans sold their car for \$125, borrowed \$500 from Aunt Kate, and mortgaged their small home. With baby Kathryn in tow, they toured until summer, 1923, when Marian returned to Peoria for the birth of Jim Jr. This picture shows the pair as they appeared in their "Cycle of Songs."

▼ **JIM ATTEMPTED** to solo for six months, failed; he and Marian tried vaudeville again, went broke. Back in Peoria they played club dates, Jim clerked for \$10 weekly until a dare made them audition for WIBO and a \$10 weekly job as the O'Henry twins. Broke again and back to vaudeville. Back to radio, three shows weekly at \$60 a week. In 1931, they met a cartoonist, Don Quinn, who thought he could write. Together, they inaugurated a live-a-week NBC show, "Smackout." Quinn is still with Jim and Marian.

▼ **"FIBBER MCGEE AND MOLLY"** came to life in 1935 when Johnson Wax decided the Jordan - Quinn combo could move its products. Marian and Jim, who always did their show in costume, caught on so quickly with dialers that by 1937 they were acclaimed as "national radio stars" by the Peoria Morning Journal. Asked then about their fast-rising success they said, "Do you know what scares us most? We're afraid it'll go to our heads!"





▲ **JOINING OTHERS IN THE WESTWARD TREK**, the Jordans and Quinn moved to Hollywood, where their program continued in top popularity. Surrounding themselves with capable talent, Jim and Marian garnered the nation's laughs with such stunts as the hall closet whose contents are shown here submerging "Fibber."

▲ **THIS PICTURE WAS TAKEN ABOUT 1942** (note short skirt). Marian is waiting for the familiar clatter of the cluttered closet while dialers are waiting to laugh. Shortly after this, the Jordans made three RKO pictures based on their radio characters.

**T**HEY SAY a picture is worth ten thousand words. . . . We doubt it. Here-with are seven pictures of Marian and Jim Jordan, which can't begin to tell the fabulous, struggling, successful, discouraging story of the "Fibber McGees."

But coupled with a few words, perhaps these prints can convey something of the heartache, something of the relentless purpose, something of the never-say-die climb to fame these two have packed into the past thirty years. To us, a glance through Marian and Jim's scrapbook, with subjects ranging from programs on which they got fine-type billing to the splash of their tenth anniversary NBC party, was more potent tonic than a Dale Carnegie tome on "How to Get Where You Want to Be."

**DON QUINN, MARIAN, Jim**, announcer Harlow Wilcox at the Jordans' tenth anniversary party, April, 1944. The Jordans and Quinns now live in Encino. Jim and Marian also have 1,000 acres near Bakersfield where they raise cattle. Maybe "Wistful Vista" should be changed to "Blissful Vista!"

CHET LAUCK and Norris ("Tuffy") Goff, who behind that Pine Ridge accent are better known as radio's "Lum and Abner," are all ready to welcome television into the entertainment field—but they are doing it with reservations.

To the average actor, the change from radio to television isn't going to be too difficult. It means a dab of make-up here and there and one is ready for the cameras.

Not so Lauck and Goff. They have a make-up problem which science will have to simplify for them in time.

Whenever they want to appear in character, Chet and "Tuffy" have to sit patiently for three hours and twenty minutes while experts alter their countenances to represent the Pine Ridge characters they portray. That's one of the main reasons they continue to do their new half-hour show sans make-up, although there has been talk of televising the broadcast in the near future.

Incidentally, "the boys" are just as much fun to watch as to hear. A good combination.

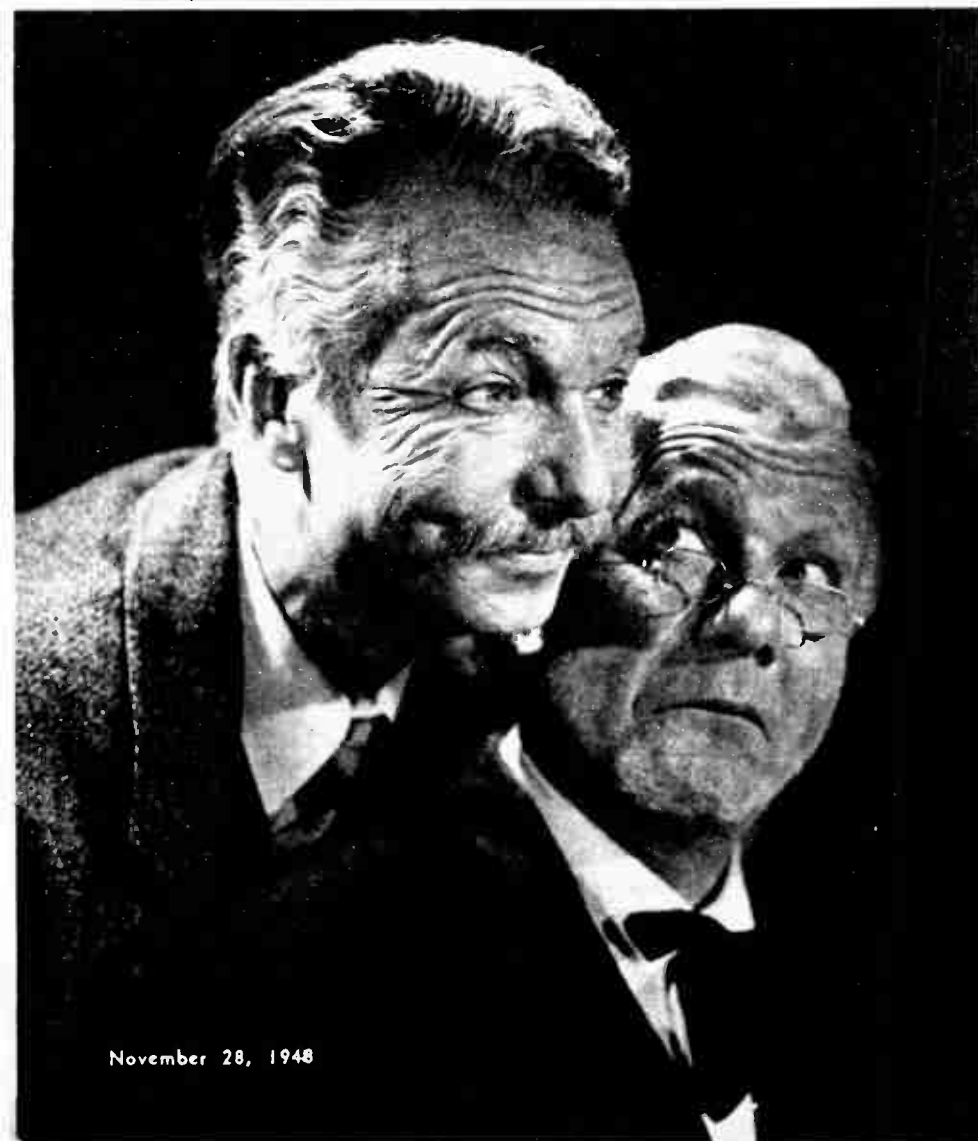

During her many intelligent months on KFI, Joan Schafer "upended" her mailbag to read countless listener letters addressed to her "What Do You Say?" program. Since she and her scintillating series have been hatched off the station's schedule, we're beginning to get some idea just what her mail-count must have been!

"Her voice was one of the few women's voices that was pleasant on the radio." . . . "Hers was the only program that was an absolute must for me on KFI in the morning." . . . "Tell me where my favorite has gone,

and when will she be returning to a rabid fan of hers?" . . . "I, for one, can say that no other daytime program fascinated me as that one did."

George O'Hanlon and his "Joe McDoakes" show have sponsor interest... Shirley Mitchell may rejoin the "Great Gildersleeve" permanently as "Leila Ransome." Una Merkel would stay on as rival love-threat, "Adeline Fairchild."... CBS is preparing "Pursuit of Happiness," a "Doorway to Life" type show — only with adults... Another audience-participationer auditioning is "Listen to Grandma," emceed by Cliff Arquette, who should be very good at it. Another interesting CBS venture is "American Diary," heralded as a combination of documentary re-creation and actual recording of the reality... "Be Funny for Money" is the title of a new Ben Brady idea, written and emceed by him. Members of the audience get a chance to act out comedy situations with professional comics for cash awards... The Boston history teacher, Lee Morris, who wrote the hit song, "If I Only Had a Match," has two more tunes headed for the hit circle... Joan Davis may inherit the "mr. ace and JANE" spot if the latter show is dropped... Unemployed radio actors may be hired to impersonate Santa Claus at various Christmas shindigs this season in New York... Norris Goff ("Abner" of "Lum and") won a blue ribbon at a Northern California fair for the wheat grown on his ranch. . . . Mercedes McCambridge will make her screen debut in "All the King's Men." She'll arrive in Hollywood later this month. . . . Paul Frees replaces Hal March on "Newsweek Looks Ahead," as Hal comes up with too many commitments — hope that one of them is the return of the Sweeney and March show. . . . Page Gilman, "Jack" of "One Man's Family," is the father of a very new baby boy. . . . Robert Emmett Dolan, formerly of the Dinah Shore show, will do the music for two Broadway-bound musicals. . . . Benny Goodman's new band is his largest crew to date. . . . Earl Wild, one of the star pianists of ABC's "Piano Playhouse," has sailed for Europe to do a concert tour. This show, incidentally, is practically a must among local musicians, we've discovered. . . . "Little Herman," new mystery series, starts on ABC January 1.

Bob Hope's next movie will be "My Favorite Redhead." And then what's left? . . . Lou Costello to sell his racing stables in order to devote all his time to entertainment and his Youth Foundation. . . . New tune being published bears the title, "Stop the Music." . . . CBS has installed "phonotape," a device for recording the stories phoned in to the newsroom. . . . "It Pays to Be Ignorant" will be filmed as a series of short subjects, Herb Polesie producing. . . . Sam Balter will handle the KLAC game broadcasts in place of Fred Haney. . . . Rolland Morris, the young radio actor who got up a brochure on his experience and talent

(Radio Life did a story on the Morris organization), has landed a movie role in "Bitter Victory" because of it. . . . Frank Graham and Van des Aultels are auditioning an exciting psychological mystery idea, "Satan's Waitin'." Johnny Green, musical director of some notable radio shows, will baton the Academy Award shindig coming up soon. . . . ## Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

### "Ted Malone Calling"

Ted Malone has added a Sunday show (2:00 p.m., KECA) to his Monday-through-Friday chores (also KECA, 10:00 a.m.). The simplest idea in the world is turned into the intriguing business of listening in on a telephone call. Each Sunday Malone makes as many calls as time allows, with the lines rigged so that dialers can hear both ends of the conversation.

A week ago Ted called Captain Eddie Rickenbacker. The Captain had difficulty, for just a moment, in recalling what he was doing exactly six years ago at that time. On November 14, 1942, Rickenbacker had just been rescued in the South Pacific, where he was adrift in a rubber raft for three weeks.

Anticipating the arrival of Princess Elizabeth's baby, Ted Malone also called Buckingham Palace and spoke with Mr. Peterson, secretary to the British Home Secretary, who traditionally, until this year, had the duty to witness all royal births. Peterson told of the elaborate preparations underway for the great event.

But when the reporter called the Kremlin, the Moscow operator said that Stalin refused to talk, and asked if Malone wished to talk with anyone else. "Molotov," replied Malone. Molotov could not be reached, so Malone

asked to speak with Litvinov. Strangely enough, the operator said Litvinov was "unknown" there. An appointment call was placed for Molotov again for the program of Sunday, November 21. If that call is uncompleted, chances are Mr. Malone will keep on with his interesting attempt to pierce the Iron Curtain.

No matter whose conversations Mr. Malone may choose to parade on this fifteen-minute Sunday period, dialers can be sure of newsy, human-interest talk, first hand. As long as we can't hear "Candid Mike," this sounds like a good replacement.

## L.A. County Medical Association

Being daytime workers, we are apt to miss many of the excellent a.m. programs that deserve special mention in these pages. That is why the fifteen-minute program listed in our logs as "L. A. County Medical Association," 10:45 a.m. Thursday on KFAC, is just now coming to our attention. It has been heard at this time for some months, and doubtless is familiar to many readers interested in the medical profession and the myriad human-interest stories that color it.

We heard a recent program, the narrated story of Florence Nightingale, and were impressed by its presentation, simplicity and appeal. The stories of famous people who have furthered the aims of the medical profession are narrated by Stanley K. Cochems, a story-teller who employs sincerity instead of dramatic effect. Writer Les Ecklund deserves a share of the credit for making the fifteen-minute straight narrative compelling listening.

Most interesting quality of the program to this listener was its ability to make the twice-told tale of Florence Nightingale much more touching than any of the pretentious dramatizations of it we've heard. Maybe that's what radio needs—more simplicity.

That qualification rests on the discovery that while most of the records we heard were big band, full arrangement, and definitely not extemporaneous music, they were jolly listening. Real disappointment at the inclusion of only one side that wasn't almost pure "pop" stuff (the two-beat hit was Condon's "Swanee") melted during the half-hour that included an old Woody Herman side; Benny's band of old playing "Don't Be That Way"; "Blue Mood," by the gentleman who has always been ahead of his time anyway, the Duke; Dorsey's "Song of India"; Hampton drum and vibe sides; Glenn Miller's "Tuxedo Junction," and finally Illinois Jacquet and his screaming saxophone playing something unidentified.

We're not complaining. Fact is, we are new followers who will make a point of hearing more of these half-hours made up of ninety per cent American music, ten per cent jazz... but one hundred per cent good listening.

# DIALAGNOSIS

Program Views and Reviews from the Tenth District P.-T.A.

By JUNE D. PRAY

Whoa, there! It has occurred to us that we've been galloping ahead with this series of columns, telling you about programs that we like or don't like—and that it might be well for everybody concerned if we stopped long enough to give you a little background.

The Radio Division of our own Tenth District P.-T.A. has taken the lead nationally in attempting to see to it that programs listened to by the whole family are programs worth listening to by the whole family. We operate on the simple principle that the air waves belong to the people, and that we have both the right and the responsibility to ask for what we want. We believe that broadcasters generally are willing to provide us with the programs we want, if it can be done within the commercial sponsorship system under which American broadcasting operates—in other words, if they can also make it pay. So, further, we want to prove to advertisers and their agencies that our support or lack of it is a potent thing—that 190,000 members in this area alone is a factor in the consideration of programs for sponsorship.

It is well then that we should set down a general statement of our poli-

icy, especially in regard to children's programs, since those are our main concern. We don't ask that all radio entertainment be tailored to the tastes of ten-year-olds, but we can and do ask that programs designed for ten-year-olds be something better than juvenile versions of murder mysteries. Our criteria for children's programs are simple: that they are not based on crime; that they do not use cliff-hanger techniques; that they are not unduly excitement-arousing; that they teach respect for the institutions upon which our society is built; and that they are well done from a production standpoint.

Programs can meet these requirements and be good entertainment, too—specifically, "Adventure Parade," "Books Bring Adventure," "Let's Pretend," "Jump-Jump of Holiday House," "Twilight Tales," and many others. Let's be specific a little further—such programs as "Tom Mix," "Jack Armstrong," "Superman," "Captain Midnight," and the like, we do not want our children to listen to, and the sponsors and broadcasters of these programs should know it.

Now we can get off our soapbox and go about our daily routines again. But let's keep these things in mind as we listen to the radio during the coming week. Just remember that the simplest and most effective way to get desirable programs on the air is to write a letter about it. Write to the stations—write to the sponsors—write to us if you'd like to. We'd enjoy hearing your views.

This fine dialect comedian takes all the roles himself (he can do as many as twenty-two) as he tells stories to Little Miss Missy, who is really his own seven-year-old daughter, Gail. Jimmy, you know, plays the whole group on radio's "The Johnson Family."

★ "Uncle Remus" is part of the seven hours weekly KTSL is adding to its programming. Another program to be added for children's early evening listening is the old favorite, Baron Keyes "Clickety-Clack Revue," a puppet series. 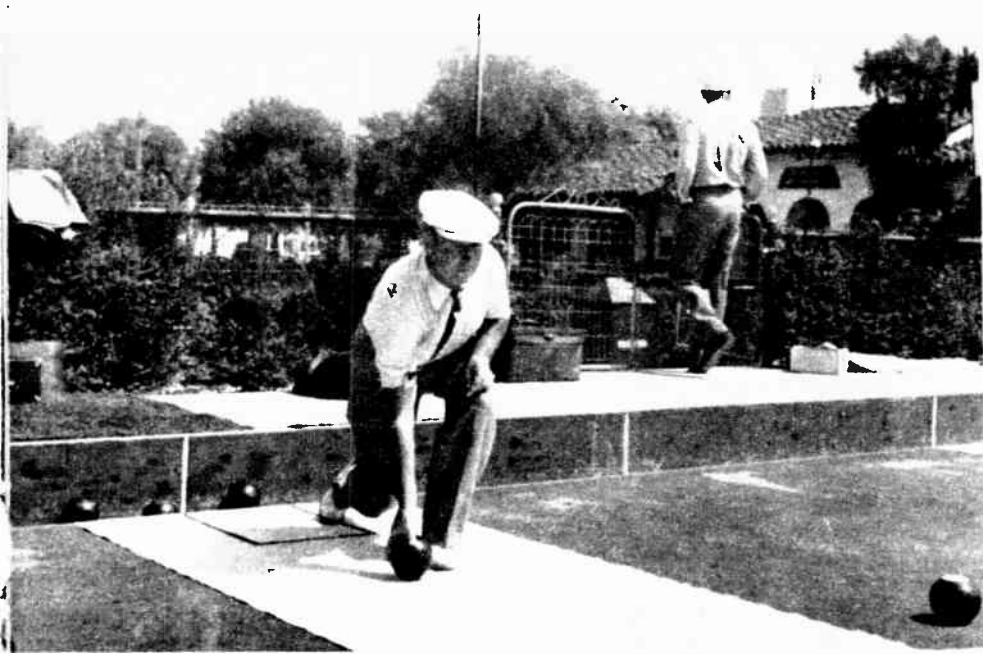

# Anybody's Game

*Seven to Seventy Can Enjoy This Outdoor Game That Combines Gentle Exercise With Skill and Great Fun*

**O**NE DAY, eight years ago, veteran radioite Bill Hay stopped his car at the side of a lawn bowling green and watched the game in progress. Mr. Hay was on his way home from a golf match, his favorite sport at the time, and a pastime he found completely satisfying.

Further insurance against the lure of lawn bowling should have been set up in Bill through having witnessed his father's lifetime devotion to the game. But no. Today, golf is a forgotten game, and Mr. Hay has recently accepted, for the third time, his election as the President of the National Association of Lawn Bowlers.

The Hays recently returned to Southern California from a four-month tour of the British Isles. They had gone, in company with twenty-two other U.S. lawn bowling enthusiasts, on the first official tour of the British Isles at the invitation of the International Bowling Board.

Upon Mr. Hay's return, Radio Life allowed the busy man what must have seemed a mercilessly brief time in which to catch up on mail, food and sleep, then rushed out for an

interview while his memories and enthusiasms were still fresh.

Through the tale of trips, renewed associations, entertainment and bowling matches ran an account of the startling privations and courage the American team witnessed. Yet all during the attempted destruction of their countries, the British Isles have held onto their cheery love of sports, particularly their favorite, lawn bowling. It is a game indulged in by people from seven to seventy. Small boys are trained young toward championships. Each player has his own set of four balls, the appearance and price being based on the sort of wood burl from which a ball is cut. "Some of the real nuts on the game have three or four sets," smiled our enthusiastic interviewee.

"The game itself is a flexible one," went on the charming accents so easily recognized on the air as Mr. Bill Hay's. "Two people can play, four can play in teams of two, or six can play in teams of three. In turn players roll one bowl at a time down the grass toward the 'jack.' This jack is the tennis-sized white ball centered at the far end of the green strip termed the rink. Then, for each of your own four bowls lying nearer

to the jack than your opponent's bowls, you score one point.

"Set your jack up in the other end, and start over, by turns. You can play to fifteen, eighteen, or twenty-one, just as it pleases those who are in a game together.

"Too, those bowls weigh no more than three and a half pounds, yet stooping to pick them up, lining up the opposite end of the green with your eye, then delivering the bowl with enough force to roll that far gives you just enough exercise all over so that you feel good without being exhausted.

"As far as expenditures go, the price of a set of bowls just about covers it. Most sets sell for around thirty-five or forty dollars. There are no expensive clubs you must belong to. The greens around here are all public.

"I had a stroke of luck when we were playing in Scotland. That was my former home, you know, and my father had been a bowling enthusiast and expert for years. I remember a silver mounted set of bowling bowls with which he, as champion, was presented back in 1899. Well, that set had been lost for years, and I didn't dream of ever finding it. But when I was over there this year I asked around about the set, and sure enough, I heard of a man who had them, still using them! That owner and I effected a little trade. I gave him the finest set of lawn bowling bowls that could be made, in return for that set of my father's."

Bill terms the highlight of the trip the day the American team was invited to play at Windsor Castle with the Royal Household Bowling Club. His eyes still shine as he recalls the condition of the castle's greens.

"But don't ask me if we won," he twinkles. "After all, we weren't as used to going without food as were our hosts. They were much sturdier fellows."

**J**'M A STICKLER for not making things fancy," admits Columbia's Jack Gregson, whose show, "Your Stand-In," is probably one of the most appealing, though uncomplicated, participations on the air.

Instead of trying to give a seven-room house to one contestant per broadcast, Jack and the gang who work with him concentrate on "several gifts for several winners." The scribe at home, who writes a folksy letter telling about herself (himself) and an experience in her (his) life, is given one prize for each of the three questions which her (his) studio "Stand-In" answers correctly. The "Stand-In," chosen for a similarity to the letter-writer's personality or problem, rates a gift for the guesswork.

This simple framework allows for a very elastic and homey program. There are no stunts to make con-

testants look foolish, and no far-fetched attempts at gags. Jack and his cast keep "the vaudeville" confined to their warm-up, which is a clip-along routine of novelty songs, fan dances with decks of cards, and beguilements to "Laugh, Laugh, Laugh." By the time the program hits the air, the audience is having itself a time.

### Past Un-tense

Jack Gregson is a young man who certainly ought to know about putting on a show. His dad was an auctioneer, and when Jack was six

he too began working on the block. At seven, Jack was the youngest licensed auctioneer in the United States. (Ripley featured him as such in his "Believe It or Not" cartoon.) A "Stand-In" listener in Colfax, Washington, recently wrote that she had seen a man and his son sell at auction twenty-five years ago, and was Jack that boy? Jack answered by doing a special auction sequence on the show.

His family moved to Spokane, Washington, when Jack was about to enter high school, and as an en-

terprising freshman of twelve, the Boy Wonder Gregson wrote a juvenile "Hi Jinks" show for local station KGA. It was sold and remained on the air four years.

Jack sang with Lee Macky's band in Portland and finished school at Moran College, before going seriously back into radio in Salt Lake City as assistant producer, manager at the station's playhouse.

Not long ago he came to KSFO, San Francisco, where his "Kid's Quizaroo," "Yawn Patrol," and own "Jack Gregson Show" were great radio favorites, and where CBS spotted him for the new "Stand-In" show opening in Hollywood.

#### "Also Heard"

Jack also has a syndicated series called "Platter Party," sponsored by General Electric on many independent California stations. On that, he plays a quiet collection of records and talks about his wife, "Lovely," (they've been married for nine years), and little boy, "Packy the Rat," a two-year-old who has a passion for making off with loose articles about the house and depositing them in the strangest places.

"Packy gets more fan mail than I ever did in my life," adds his Dad.

The Gregsons still have a house in San Francisco, and had almost found another one down here when a problem developed. They own an Arabian horse, "Golden Boy," which

Jack broke and trained himself, so they have been searching for a home with a stable. But "Lovely" recently became sick, the illness changed her allergies and she's now allergic to horses. Since neither Jack nor "Lovely" can bear to part with "Golden Boy," they're locating a house which will at least be in the neighborhood of a stable, if not possessing one.

"Lovely," (whose real name, by the way, is Evelyn) helps Jack on "Platter Party," which is written and recorded as a six-a-weeker. For "Stand-In," Jack has an appreciated bunch of fellow workers and an office at KNX. Sid Singer and Dorothy Deere write the show, Ted Robertson

produces it, Lois Tilley is in charge of prizes, Joe Walters announces, Ivan Ditmars is at the organ and Jim Lashaum at the engineering controls.

"But they all do more than that," adds Jack. "They contribute ideas, and good ones."

This anxiousness to make broadcasts a real pleasure for their listeners is sincere with Jack Gregson and crew. "Stand-In" attendees also need never fear rudeness at the hands of this likeable young emcee.

"I always tell them I won't ask them anything I wouldn't ask my own mother," smiles Jack, "and it's true."

I'VE CHOSEN a network radio producer to inaugurate this new "Behind the Scenes" feature because his work is interesting, important and a little mysterious to the uninitiated.

In order to answer the questions of those who've been wondering, we cornered NBC's Warren Lewis, staff producer-director.

Lewis gave us a recital of facts that clarified the whole picture. The network producer, he explained; is concerned with both the NBC-produced house shows and the big-name agency programs that—to complicate matters further—usually have their own producer.

The first group contains the NBC

package shows and the NBC staff and service programs—serials, news, special events, staff orchestra musicals, etc. On these the staff man is in full charge. He plans the program, supervises the writing, casts the show, hires the actors, sets the rehearsal schedule, rehearses the program and directs it on the air. "Very gratifying," is Lewis's comment, and he cites the work of producer Andrew Love of NBC's "University Theater" as the most interesting and unusual of the staff-produced shows.

### Agency Show Duties

Of the big-star agency shows with their own producer and schedule set, the question may be, "Well, just what is there left for the network producer to do?" The answer may range from "almost nothing" to "just about everything." In other words, the staff man is present to be used

in whatever capacity the agency may need him. The NBC man is mainly the contact between the network and the agency. He is familiar with the workings of his whole organization and so is able to introduce the agency man to the NBC facilities available, and with his own practical experience in working with the network, aid him in effects to be achieved through use of NBC's properties. In other words, he carries out the work in any capacity in which he is needed up to, in some instances, actually directing the program.

### Stop-Watch Sentinel

The network producer times the program—in any Radio Life picture he is the man holding the stop watch. This duty frees the agency producer for the job of direction. NBC charges its man with the responsibility of getting the show on and off the air

at the proper time. He makes notes of judicious cuts in musical bridges, lines and episodes with an eye to time. At twenty-nine minutes and thirty seconds after the program has started, it must be off the air. The show is automatically terminated at that time, but the staff producer tries to do this without losing the important words of a comedian's gag-line, courtesy of a few seconds' leeway on the actual fade. He is also present to see that NBC and FCC policies are carried out. He must insure that material that is politically or legally objectionable is deleted. Not that any program is willing to argue the point, Lewis insists, but the heat of rehearsals and working against time is a potent argument against changing the script and re-writing when every moment counts.

Homer Canfield, program director of the Western division and head of the NBC production staff, assigns his staff producers to their shows. Programs on which Lewis does the aforementioned duties are those of Red Skelton, Ozzie and Harriet, and the Jo Stafford and Peggy Lee nights on "Supper Club." Occasionally the staff man may be called upon to jump into almost any spot on the program. Recently Lewis stepped into Rod O'Connor's considerable acting role on a Skelton preview when O'Connor was unable to appear. The staff man, as company representative, is head troubleshooter in all emergencies on his assigned show.

### Producer's Background

Lewis's background in show business has gone a long way toward fitting him to his job—and any emergency that might arise. A native of Boston, he has lived in Los Angeles since the age of twelve. He received

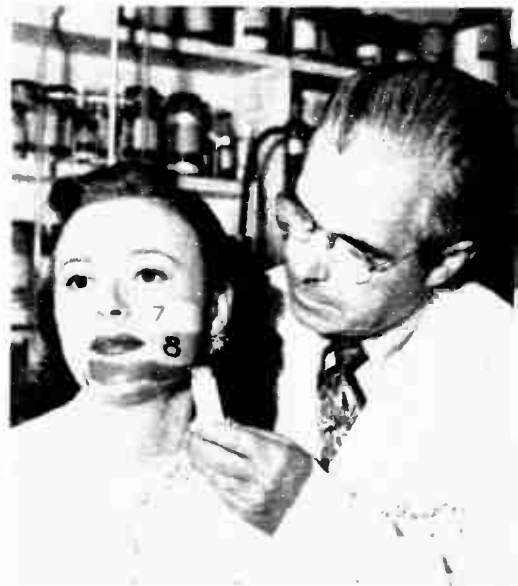

his higher education through the U.C.L.A. Extension course. While still in high school he became a night-club singer, and long-time residents might be able to recall him as ballad singer at the Jail Cafe! Singing emcee at the Pantages Theater was his first vaudeville job. In the transitional years of the talking picture, Lewis was a "singer on call," meaning that he supplied whatever vocalizing was needed incidental to the particular movie plot. "Then came my cultural phase," he laughs. He directed opera and operetta productions at City College, the Philharmonic, Hollywood Bowl and the Shrine. He became interested in the theory of applying the method of motion-picture cutting to the musical stage, through the use of lighting groups of isolated performance on the stage, a job which should make him a television natural.

In 1938 Lewis became a staff writer on NBC. Throughout his "cultural phase" he had been selling free-lance radio scripts, an outlet that had become more profitable than local opera productions. The army interrupted his civilian radio career for three and a half years. During most of that time he produced and wrote many of the official radio programs, including "Soldiers with Wings." He also acted as General Arnold's radio aide (the General was very anxious to sound professional on the air). Lewis also developed the system of combat wire-recorder teams used in action. As a mere master sergeant he found himself associated with the biggest brass in the Army and the biggest names in Hollywood!

After the war Lewis came back to
