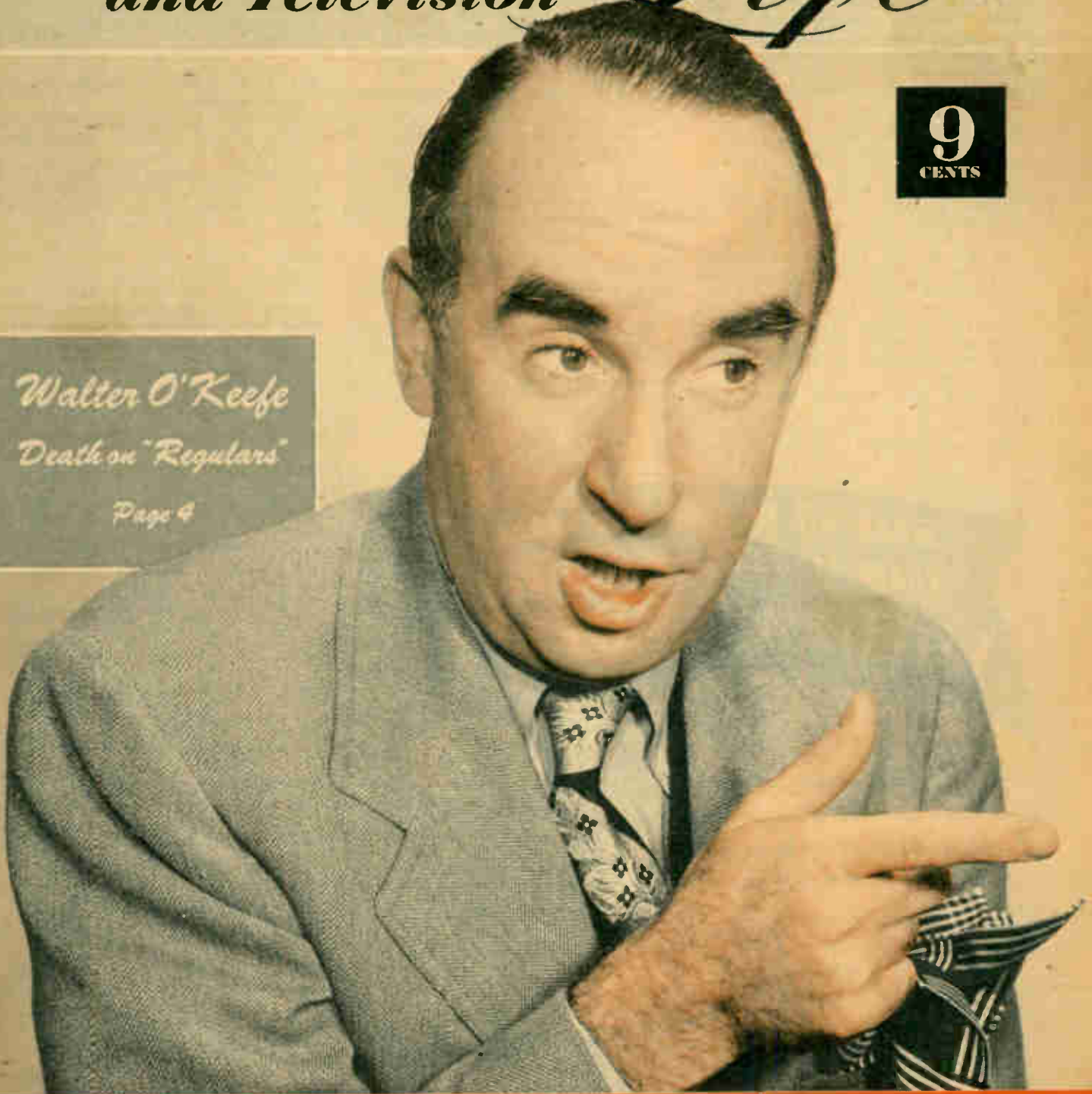

The Aces Skip KNX

"Mr. Ace and JANE," the comedy program starring Goodman and Jane Ace, garnered such appreciative audiences and such rave trade comment that it comes as a blow to learn that the show, although back on the CBS network, is not heard on KNX. The first program in the new series was heard on Tuesday, February 1. February 2. Radio Life readers started checking with us to find out where the program was on their dial. They had all heard earlier network announcements about its availability.

The sad, sad story is this—the Aces series is sustaining and is not heard locally because of sponsored shows in the same time slot. We suggest two possibilities to Ace fans—write letters to the station requesting the program, try to catch "Mr. Ace and JANE" on other CBS stations. Tuesdays at 7:30 p.m. (KCBQ in San Diego, 1170 kilocycles, schedules a playback of the show at 8:30 p.m. Fridays.)

Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

"Comedy Playhouse"

An interesting show that should find an enthusiastic audience for its wares is "Comedy Playhouse," KIHJ, 7:00 p.m. Wednesday. The title is slightly misleading, for the quality of material used on the program, adaptations of such hit plays as "Three Men on a Horse," "Idiot's Delight," "Philadelphia Story," is quite different from that of the usual radio light comedy. Half an hour is too brief a time to put over the full impact of the plays, but the actors and scripters convey the spirit admirably. None of the actors are "names." They are a group of radio players from "The Gold Coast Players," an acting group formed from the speaking cast of the "Chicago Theater of the Air."

. . . To Mary Jane Croft's portrayal of "Mrs. Smith" on the Screen Director's broadcast of "Mr. and Mrs. Smith." Robert Montgomery was excellent, the adaptation and direction of the program were fine, Alfred Hitchcock made a charming host—but radio actress Croft was the big surprise.

. . . To Jack Webb, who was his most "Pat Novakish" in "A Walk in the Rain" on "Hollywood Star Theater."

. . . To the intelligent "Ford Theater" treatment of Edward G. Robinson in "Woman in the Window."

. . . To Helen Hayes and Martin Gabel for their fine performances in "The Enemy," a Nella Gardner White story, astutely discovered and adapted for radio.

. . . To Irene Dunne for a warming character performance on "Theater Guild's" "Late Christopher Bean."

. . . To Herb Polesie on "Twenty Questions" for being hotter than a firecracker on recent sessions.

We View With Alarm

. . . The fact that radio critics, at their most vociferous a year ago, have not bothered to kudos the present season for its improvement in programming, humor, news, drama and its continued high standards in music. Television is exciting, but plain old AM radio deserves some laudatory space to make up for the beating it took in the slick magazines and daily press of the '47-'48 season.

. . . Ralph Edwards's first "Whispering Lady" telephone-call program. So much time was taken up with phone calls, rules and prize-prattling that listening entertainment was neglected. The "Truth or Consequences" stunts, visually entertaining, didn't *listen* either. The transition to television can't be made on an AM mike.

. . . The several dramatic casts that have recently had villains and heroes that sounded too much alike. We were particularly puzzled on last week's "Amazing Mr. Malone." We lost the plot when we mistook the murderer for "Mr. Malohe" in disguise. (Say, maybe we can sell that plot.)

. . . The fine dramatic shows that use so many fine radio actors and then neglect to give them air credit. We'd love to know the names of some of those great characters on "Sam Spade," "Phillip Morris Playhouse," and many of the others.

. . . The whining children in radio commercials who are always nagging their mothers to use this sort of soap or make that sort of cup-cakes. And the most aggravating of all are those tots that bleat, "Well, *Marjorie's* mother always makes sandwiches of Blank's rye bread. . . ." We'll grant you that some real-life kiddies can be pretty nerve-wracking, but never as ghastly as radio commercial writers make them out to be.

Program Views and Reviews from the Tenth District P.-T.A.

By JUNE D. PRAY

The question most frequently asked us is, "How do you tell what is good radio for children, and what is bad?" Our judgments are based on "Criteria for Children's Radio Programs," published by the U.S. Office of Education, generally accepted by broadcasters and listeners alike as setting forth the highest standards. Children's radio should serve three basic purposes, with specific considerations bearing upon each, outlined as follows:

1. Radio programs should convey to children the commonly accepted moral, social, and ethical ideals of American life, by . . .

Building faith in the ideals of democracy.

Portraying honestly occupations essential to American life.

Portraying realistically minority groups of races and nationalities.

Being authentic in historical or factual detail.

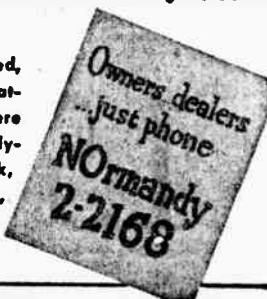

2. Radio programs should contribute to healthy personality development in children, by . . .

Arousing a wide range of responses and avoiding stress upon fear. Fulfilling their need for characters of heroic proportion as models. Keeping the imaginative elements clearly identifiable as unreal. Consistently observing maintenance of suspense and satisfactory resolution of suspense.

Portraying mutual understanding between parents and children, and family-problem situations.

Utilizing radio to lead listeners to hobbies, skills, and knowledge.

Using humor within the comprehension of children.

3. Radio programs should provide children with opportunities for entertainment and pure enjoyment, by . . .

Contributing to listeners' visualization of characters and situations. Using vocabulary and inflections comprehended by the youngest age level of intended listeners.

Not permitting dialogue to undercut the imaginative processes.

Using sound effects to represent things or situations readily visualized.

Using music to communicate emotions, mood, and feeling.

In succeeding columns we plan to review these basic fundamentals in greater detail and with specific examples.

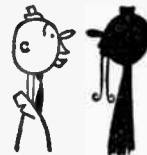

Last week Mr. Mark Woods, president of the American Broadcasting Company's radio-television network, met the press in Hollywood to answer questions about ABC's video plans.

He emphasized first of all that ABC has no negotiations with anyone (including 20th Century-Fox) at the present time for its purchase.

He explained further that his network had spent \$6,150,000 on TV equipment alone in the last half of 1948, and that \$1,000,000 would be spent in developing ABC's Los Angeles television facilities at the old twenty-acre Vitagraph studios in Hollywood. KECA-TV, ABC's owned and operated station in Los Angeles, will be on the air "some time between May 1 and 30 of this year." The test pattern on Channel 7, (174-180 mcs) with 30 kw. ERP of video power, is being currently beamed from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Mr. Woods went on to say he believed eventually all Hollywood movie studios would be producing films for television, and that if ABC is unable to make satisfactory deals with them, his broadcasting organization will make its own pictures.

Commenting on the talent end of the mushrooming television industry, Mr. Woods remarked, "No great star of radio is going to be able simply to walk in front of a television camera and be assured of television success. That would be dull. Television talent is going to have to work, and work hard."

No TV Eyes

Worry no more about getting "television eyes." There just isn't any such thing . . . at least according to Dr. Franklin M. Foote, executive director of the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness.

Maybe your eyes bother you when you watch television, but they would anyway, for there are no rays coming from a television set that will do the slightest harm to a viewer's eyes, he reports.

People suffering from simple astigmatism or near-sightedness may have been doing without reading, movies, or long hours of eye-straining games, but upon succumbing to the lure of watching their TV set, find their eyes tiring.

For both strong- and weak-eyed people Dr. Foote suggests a few rules.

"Do not have the room dark. The darkness makes too great a contrast

between the bright picture and the surroundings. That means more work for the eyes. Keep at least a dim light on, preferably behind you; or an overhead, indirect light.

"Sit six to eight feet from sets with a ten- or twelve-inch tube. Sit in front, preferably, and have the screen at eye level. Tune the set so you have a good, clear picture.

"Magnifying lenses may help, if the bigger picture is clear. Some studies indicate that the main value of colored filters is psychological. The blue or green tints seem restful, but there is no evidence that they are physically more restful to the eye."

Action Films

Don Lee's KTSL, Channel 2, is acquiring from the Navy such fine films as "To the Shores of Iwo Jima"; "Secret Battle," the story about radar aboard Navy ships; "Brought to Action," dramatic episodes from the Second Battle of the Philippines; "They Came to an Island," a filming of Sea-Bee activities during the war; and many more, to be announced as they can be secured. These Navy films are not yet arranged in a definite schedule, but as each appears will be designated in your logs as part of the "Lest We Forget" series.

Both KTSL and KLAC-TV, which has also been running the war films, turned down "Fury in the Pacific," which deals with the invasion of Peleliu and Angaur. Basis of refusals was pic's realism . . . judged to be too rough for home consumption, especially homes harboring kiddies.

Rumors

Edgar Bergen's CBS Coca-Cola debut will be only on radio. The Coke company's plans for Bergen are to put him on TV a year later. . . . NBC is considering establishment of a TV opera company for English-language versions of the classics. . . . Charles Luckman, head of Lever Bros., is "reported" to have "indicated" that if CBS puts a dramatic show on TV opposite radio's "Lux Radio Theater," he would move that series off the air. Talk about the power of the visual!

. . . NBC is getting ready to spring a big Sunday-at-seven (p.m.) video surprise. The TV spread will be strictly big-time, but *what*, is still a secret to all of us. . . . The Andrews Sisters are polishing up their dance routines and dusting off best-liked ditties for their proposed TV show. . . . Screen comedian Hugh Herbert and KHJ's movie chatter lady, Lynn Castile, are teaming for a video film "Mr. and Mrs." series. There will be sixteen fifteen-minute chapters in the film. Lynn, who is heard on "Lynn Looks at Hollywood," plans to hark back to her musical comedy days in a few vocal spots. . . . Dorothy Shay has been offered a long-term contract by General Motors

to star in a weekly TV show on an Eastern network.

Looks Like

ABC-TV, starting in the East this March and later during the summer out here, will present a series of twenty-six two-reel shorts based on General Dwight Eisenhower's best-seller "Crusade in Europe." Films are being made by 20th Century-Fox and the March of Time, out of the millions of feet of heretofore unshown film taken by all the Armed Forces during combat of World War II. . . . The CBS radio series "Suspense" will begin on Eastern TV around March 1, and will follow on KTTV shortly via television recording. . . . Fred Allen is definitely to quit radio next June and will be seen in the fall on a TV show along lines of "Info Please," an ad-lib show. . . . Margaret Whiting, music-man Lud Gluskin and other well-knowns from CBS make their debuts early in March on KTTV. . . . Jack Benny will be the first of the CBS "stars" to appear as a TV emcee, around March 1, when possibly Bergen, Hope, Crosby, and Lum and Abner will appear with him on the one-shot show, originating here in Hollywood and to be kinescoped for the rest of the country. Mr. Hope, incidentally, is in the midst of a set-to with Paramount. Hope wants to do video, Paramount says "No! Only when it isn't on film or doesn't compete with Paramount's pictures!" In fact, any TV venture on the part of either Crosby or Hope must first be "discussed" with the studio. . . . Famous violinist-comedian Joe Venuti and composer-arranger Charles Hatha-way to be featured in a five-a-week TV show that is a broad satire on disc-jock shows. Slots will feature guest-star interviews. . . . Motorola, Inc., underwriting the NBC-TV video series starring that original "Believe It or Not" man, Robert L. Ripley. Show undoubtedly will be heard (woops!) seen out here shortly after it starts Eastern Tuesday night runs. . . . The National Educational Association and city Boards of Education, in conjunction with NBC, starting the most comprehensive program series of telecasts yet devised for children of pre-high-school age. The NBC-TV series "Stop, Look and Learn" to encompass wide range of school subjects—and not a bad idea for adult watching!

Some Sunday night, just as a warm-up to the evening's TV fare, pick up KTLA's Channel 5 and watch the lovely Betsy Mills, noted harpist and vocalist, as she presents "Golden Melodies." The time is 6:50 p.m.

In addition to being a fine little singer and harpist (she has appeared at Ciro's and Larry Potter's, has toured the United States as feature entertainer at many hotels, has made six recordings with Spike Jones, and has written many melodies for the harp), Betsy has a charm and warm friendliness that change a girl sitting

at a harp singing into a very special, intimate bit of entertainment. Betsy tells the viewers how and why she chose each song in the evening's repertoire, all in such a manner as to leave lookers nodding in agreement over her good choice. 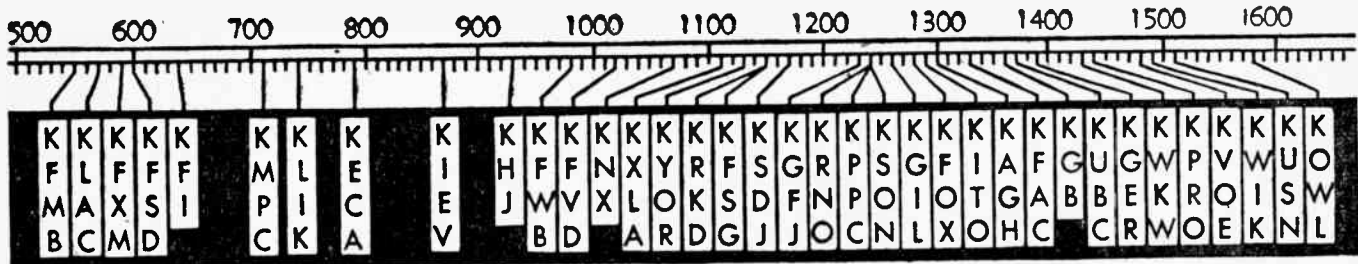

Corn and Chicken a la King

served in heart-shaped timbale cases

- 1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, or
- 1 small can mushroom ends and pieces
- 3 T. flour
- 1 c. cooked, diced chicken
- 1/4 c. liquor from mushrooms, if canned mushrooms are used
- 1 c. whole-kernel corn, drained
- 1 t. salt
- 1/4 t. pepper
- 1/2 c. sliced, stuffed green olives
- 3 T. butter
- 1 c. milk or half and half

If fresh mushrooms are used, slice 1/4" thick, and saute in butter. If canned mushrooms are used, drain, reserving liquor, but still saute mushrooms in butter.

Add flour, milk (using 1/4 c. additional, if fresh mushrooms are used). Blend nicely, season, add diced chicken, olives and corn.

Warm timbale cases before adding the creamed mixture, and serve with this, artichoke hearts sauted in a little butter.

INSTRUMENTAL ALBUM OF THE WEEK:

The waltzes of Johann Strauss, Jr., need no introduction, firmly entrenched as they are in the realm of folk music—but the full beauty of a Strauss waltz must be heard on a full-range recording by a symphony orchestra. Here are three of Strauss's greatest—"Blue Danube," "Acceleration," and "Roses of the South"—under the baton of Josef Krips conducting the New Symphony Orchestra under ideal conditions, and this six-sided London Album will probably stand as one of the best interpretations of Johann Strauss for some time to come. . . .

VOCAL ALBUM OF THE WEEK:

Lovers of Gershwin and Crosby alike will welcome this eight-sided addition to their libraries. Four are reissues, and four are making their first appearance, but each side is good and in the best of Bing's styling. . . . We especially liked the eleven-year-old "Summertime" with Matty Malneck and the newly waxed "Love Walked In," with thanks to Mr. Decca. . . .

DANCE BAND: Woody Herman's first pair for Capitol locked up this department with "Lemon Drop," a bright-tempered Wallington original with ensemble bop vocal and the typical Herman blues vocal, "I Ain't Gonna Wait Too Long," as a strong contrast to the flip-over. . . . Both feature good instrumental solos, but it's the Herd's Ensembles and Woody's vocal that rated but tops. . . .

MALE VOCAL spot belongs to Tony Martin for a pair of neat RCA-Victor waxings—"No Orchids for My Lady" in calm, subdued tempo, and the brighter "We're Not Getting Any Younger, Baby" with fine rhythmic backing by the Earle Hagen orchestra and Jud Conlon Singers. . . .

GIRL VOCAL: Looks like Maggie's got a pair of goodies in "My Dream Is Yours" and the French importation, "When the Angelus Is Ringing." . . . In relaxed true Whiting style, the lyrics are handled smoothly against a very effective orchestral background by Frank DeVol for a Capitol two-some. . . .

NOVELTY: Here's another in the series by Day & Clark for Columbia that should be a fan-producer. In "If you Will Marry Me," Doris gets one of the floweriest proposals on record by Buddy, and in "You Was" they trade some more romantic blandishments. Maybe the romantic isn't strictly according to Webster, but the Day & Clark teamwork is terrific against nice backing by Mitchell Ayres Orchestra.

"The Ear Inspires The Caricature"

IMPRESSIONISTIC artist Lew Landsman arrived at these caricatures of three KFWB disc jockeys by a variety of approaches. The portraiture of Maurice Hart, for instance, is conceived by imagining how the subject would look seen hazily through distorted mirrors. In this case the artist can take any number of liberties, and he generally does.

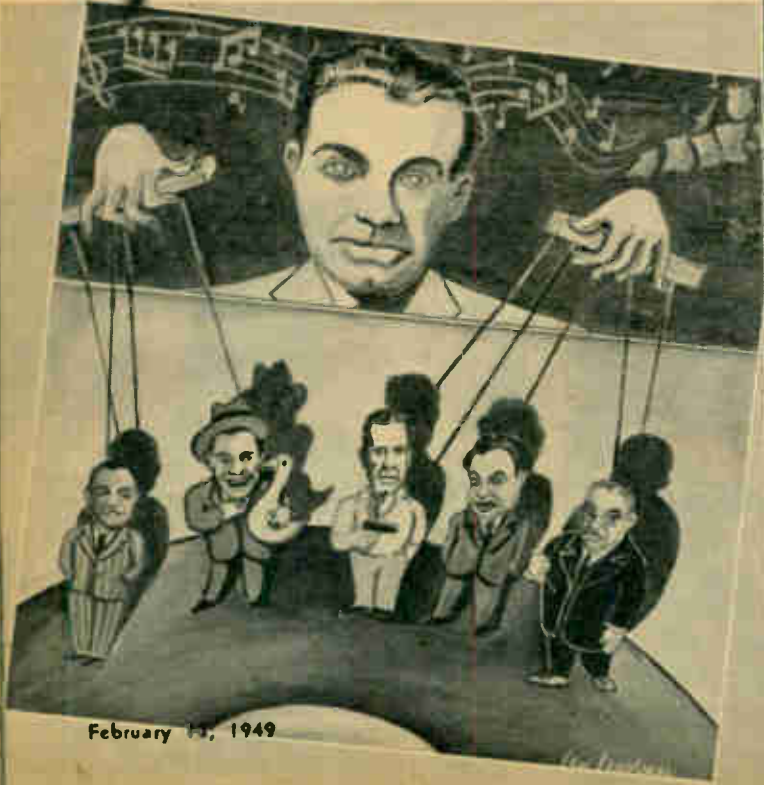
Landsman's conception of Peter Potter grew out of his attempt to crystallize several of Potter's best-known microphone phrases, metaphorical platter parades and a mythical diamond horseshoe through which his disc personalities make their entrance.

Bill Anson's varied talents of song-writing and imitating as well as disc-jockeying found expression in the Landsman treatment in Anson the puppet-master using a radio record for his stage while Anson the song-writer haunts the background.

RIRK ADAMS, six-foot-tall Colorado-born singer, mixes cement for a living. But he took an afternoon off to audition for Don Ameche, and he was given a spot on the CBS "Your Lucky Strike" show.

Attractive Diane Doxie's husband was a fine vocalist before he went into the service. There he became invalided and was told by his doctors that he would never perform again. To forget his great disappointment, he taught his wife all he knew about singing. Now he has one great ambition . . . to see her succeed in his place. And she has had her first radio chance with the Ameche program.

Hawaiian Mel Letman told Columbia's 12:30 p.m. daily listeners of a plan he has, when he becomes an established entertainer. He has discovered that blind youngsters have an extraordinary talent for mimicry; and he wants to teach increasing numbers of them his art, by allowing them to feel his face as he goes through his act.

Blond Betty Jaynes was a member of the Chicago Opera Company when she was fifteen, but she was married soon after and gave up her career to make a real home. Now, she has two children (eight and five years old), and her husband is insisting that she try to sing again. Her still miraculous voice and her selection of a "Show Boat" medley won her first place on a recent broadcast.

Emcee Ameche and his staff possess no nerves of steel, and they are subjected to this sort of genuine human interest by their program day after day. It is hard to select only the 2500 or so youngsters who can possibly be featured during the broadcast year, from the eight or ten thousand who will audition at the

Coronet Theater. But the thrill of being heard coast-to-coast is thoroughly expressed by each chosen boy and girl, and thanks like this are gratifying.

Bigger, Better Daytimes

With "Your Lucky Strike" and his sponsor, American Tobacco Company, Ameche is among the first of the "name" personalities who are making a great parade into daytime radio. His producer is Bernard L. Schubert, thirty-one-year-old "bcy wonder" who has ten shows on the

air (including "Amazing Mr. Malone," "The Falcon," "We, the People," "Gangbusters") and who actually commutes to and from rehearsals in New York and Hollywood. Leighton Brill, West Coast representative of Rodgers-Hammerstein, is in charge of sifting-auditions. L. A. "Speed" Riggs and Frank Martin handle "those commercials"; and Bill Wardell and Al DeCrescent are at the piano and organ. The series is directed by Harlan Dunning.

Winners are given engagements at

the Mocambo, Earl Carroll's, the Bar of Music, or Larry Potter's, or are assigned dramatic parts on CBS shows. A special theater and road revue is also slowly being built, to feature the best acts and discoveries. High point of every program, of course, is when long-distance phone calls are made to three housewives somewhere in the country and their votes taken as determination of the winners. These housewives, incidentally, are suggested by the folks who attend the

an announcer at station KDYL, Salt Lake City. He earned \$125 a month. Now, twenty-one years later, his monthly income runs into four figures . . . and a healthy four figures.

He went east via Chicago, where he announced "Myrt and Marge" in a fragily soundproofed studio which projected out over busy Rush Street. He remembers one script in which the principals were sailing to South America, and the scene was serenely set in mid-ocean. Two trucks collided just beneath the studio, and the drivers got out and yelled discourtesies at each other in well-flavored language which went over the entire network.

At one time Tom was also "Sam Aldrich," father of "Henry," when "The Aldrich Family" was a skit on the Kate Smith program and had not yet become a half-hour show.

In Chicago too, Tom met and married his wife, who was introduced to him, properly enough, by his mother. They have been a very happy and compatible couple. Recently the Shirleys bought a picturesque old stone farmhouse in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. They renovated it enthusiastically, and bought armloads of antiques.

But last year was a cold and snowy one, and Tom had to get into New York often. Dorothy found it lonely. So they've moved back to Manhattan, and are now happily settled in a mid-town apartment, described by Tom as "just a whoop and a holler from Radio City." And once again Mrs. Shirley can accompany her husband to "The Telephone Hour" every Monday, as has been her custom for many long and interesting years.

As "Little Willie" in the Silent Movie "East Lynne," Tom Shirley Made His First Public Bow. You'd Hardly Know Him Now as the Elegantly Growing-Older Announcer of the "Telephone Hour"

THOSE who admire the dignified "voice" of the "Telephone Hour" would hardly recognize it as belonging to "Little Tommy Shirley," child actor.

Because a lot of words have floated out over the air and a generation has grown up since the present Tom Shirley, robust and handsome, was known as the darling of silent movies in pictures with Francis X. Bushman, Beverly Bayne and Gloria Swanson, and considered the juvenile pride of the old Essanay Film Company.

"Little Tommy" is now, in fact, just barely under six feet, weighs 207 pounds and has thinning, jet-black hair.

Tom made his movie debut at seven, as "Little Willie" in "East Lynne." He grew into the starring role in "Let George Do It"; and in his earlier radio days he was "Mr. Skinner" in the serial "Skippy," and "Captain Hughes" in "Jack Arm-

strong." The latter role he inherited from Don Ameche, because Don had been in the same cast with his brother, Jim, and their voices were even then so similar that listeners were confused.

East Meets West

After a year in Northwestern University's school of engineering, and service with the U. S. Army Signal Corps during World War I, Tom worked as a roustabout and tool-dresser in the Oklahoma oil fields, and as a bucker-upper for a riveting gang in Texas. He literally wandered to Hollywood, where he became a swimming instructor. One of his pupils was Agnes Ayres, who gave him the good word on a director opening with Famous Players-Lasky.

Tom was then associated with Cecil B. DeMille for nine years as assistant director, during which time he worked on the epic movie of "The Ten Commandments." When talkies came in, he doubled in voice for many of the studio's less gifted stars.

Mr. Witt has served as a Director of the Los Angeles Advertising Club, and as Director of the Southern California Broadcasters' Association. His associates term him a "smart operator" and a "wonderful guy to work for." Radio and Television Life found out further that Mr. Witt is a devoted family man, that he would rather talk about anything under the sun other than Harry Witt, and that there is nothing under the sun he would rather talk about than television!

"To me TV is a terrifically stimulating, challenging medium. KTTV is going to try to develop programs that are wanted. That old bromide about Hollywood being the center of entertainment is quite true, particularly in the creative idea department. So much that is constructively creative is generated in the picture and radio world out here, and we are confident that the talent, too, matches anything the East has to offer.

"Our current plan is to solve the programming problem . . . controlled, of course, by the great costs . . . through kinescope. Last November CBS brought out a new transcriber of its own, which records sight and sound on two separate cameras, with the two of them re-recorded onto a single strip. This double system provides the maximum in quality by permitting the individual processing of the picture and sound negatives. That makes for better editing of possible imperfections in the original live performance. We can now exchange kinescope recordings with our Eastern outlets, thus utilizing the best talent of both coasts."

"Live Fare"

"As soon as it is feasible, we want to start presenting shows from one of our CBS studios. We all feel that audiences contribute greatly, insofar as the home viewer is concerned, to the entertainment value of a show. And most entertainers of the sort that an audience enjoys coming to a studio to see require that very audience to do their best work. Comics, especially."

The original Times-CBS television workshop in the Pasadena Playhouse is to be retained, and the work done there presented as purely experimental fare to the public.

"This operation will be strictly

non-commercial, and will serve as a base for developing new techniques. Presentations from there will be limited to once or twice a month, due to the fact that many professionals attend the Playhouse for brush-up courses. In most cases their studio contracts don't permit television appearances.

"That personal-appearance clearance, and the problem of getting music rights, constitute just a couple of the smaller knots which we, along with everyone else in television, can unravel only when the time is ripe.

Program Balance a Problem

"That's another reason we are concentrating on the best in available programs now. Operating as we do on a three-hour, five-times-a-week balance, variety is easy. But the minute we step the schedule up to cover seven days each week, our real worries begin. Sports can't be overlooked. They are a definite part of the video picture. Nor can dramatics be overlooked . . . nor comedy. But the second we have a preponderance of any one thing, someone is dissatisfied.

"That's where the careful choice of staff came in. We don't think for a moment that every good idea generated comes from within our own staff, and we can't afford to risk losing a good bet through not welcoming for inspection every show idea. That means a department has to be set up to take care of all the ideas presented to us. And everyone on earth thinks he has the most novel, wonderful idea on earth for a television show, naturally," Mr.

program and who write names of friends or relatives on confidential and distributed cards. In cases where the housewife-judges, filing their ballots by telephone, fail to turn in a two-out-of-three majority in favor of a single entertainer, the studio audience decides.

"Your Lucky Strike," in contrast to most talent hunts, is exclusively a showcase for "professionals"—that is, youngsters who have had some public experience before the broadcast. This condition is not so restricting as it seems. There are virtually thousands of such kids in Hollywood alone, waiting on the edge of the "big time" with no immediate possibility of getting across the line. Amateur shows are no outlet for them, and spots in small night clubs and little-theater groups are sparse at the best. "Your Lucky Strike" is often their first chance to meet the "hirers and firers" (and the American public) who might be waiting to make them welcome somewhere in this great U.S.A.

Witt laughingly concluded. "I have a couple myself!"

"All we ask is that the people who come to us with ideas *really* have one. You can't put little Willie on television just because he's cute!"
