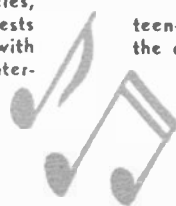

## "Week-End With Music"

*And Deems Taylor, Who Plays Host to Musical Teen-Agers Chosen to Visit CBS's New York Philharmonic Concert*

Sunday, 12:00 n.  
CBS-KNX, KCBQ

**L**IKE falling into a musical heaven, that's how one teen-ager has described "Week-End with Music," radio experience confined to musical high-school seniors of America. Each Sunday, during the intermission of the CBS Philharmonic broadcast, the high-school students gather at a microphone with host and symphony commentator Deems Taylor to reprise the exciting experiences they've encountered during a three-day whirl among New York's musical riches.

Two local students, Hank Grady, 17, of Los Angeles, and Barbara Woodward, 17, of South Gate, have been among those honored with this exciting musical trip. Hank, in company with two seventeen-year-olds from other parts of the country, was taken to meet opera stars Nadine Conner and Jan Peerce at the Metro-

politan, where he attended a performance of "La Boheme"; met and heard British concert pianist Dame Myra Hess; met Ray Bolger backstage and attended the musical comedy "Where's Charley?" and attended Bruno Walter's concert at Carnegie Hall. With Deems Taylor as guide, the youngsters met many other musical celebrities and dined at New York's finest restaurants.

On her visit, Barbara had the added thrill of meeting Lawrence Tibbett backstage at the Met before a performance of "Rigoletto." High point of each three-day visit, however, is assisting Taylor during his intermission broadcast.

### Perfect Guide

This remarkable man is the perfect musical guide for the enthusiastic teensters. He's likable, talented, sees the world through the eyes of youth and has a celebrated sense of humor. His background is a fascinating jumble of foreign correspondent, magazine editor, translator of prose and poetry, painter and opera composer. Very nearly a self-taught musician-composer, Taylor traveled a roundabout path to his "Week-End with Music" chores. While in New

York University, he wrote four comic operas, one of which was given a Broadway production. After graduation, he became a free-lance writer and worked on the staffs of several encyclopedias. Franklin P. Adams recommended Taylor for a job as assistant editor of the Western Electric News, a house organ. Taylor in turn became assistant Sunday editor of the New York Tribune, a World War I correspondent in France and associate editor of Collier's. In his spare time, he composed.

#### The Master . . .

By 1922, he was established as one of America's most promising serious composers with his "Looking Glass Suite." He was appointed music critic for the New York World and in a tradition-shattering gesture became the first American commissioned to write an opera for the Metropolitan. The result was "The King's Henchman," first performed in 1927. The brand-new Columbia

Broadcasting System offered a performance of it that year and invited composer Taylor to serve as commentator. He proved to be delightful. He became editor-in-chief of Musical America, but resigned to write his second opera, "Peter Ibbetson," for the Met. He became known to the radio public as narrator of the opera broadcasts, musical adviser to CBS and emcee on many music and variety shows (notably Paul Whiteman's famous series).

By being gently humorous and still musically wide-eyed, Taylor ushered in a new era of musical commentary with his work on the CBS-New York Philharmonic broadcasts. He pursued the subject in two best-selling books, "Of Men and Music" and "The Well-Tempered Listener." One of his articles, "The Monster," remains a classic of its type and is often found in anthologies. He also edited the delightful "Pictorial History of the Movies." He's been seen

on the screen as narrator of Disney's "Fantasia" and the American showing of the Italian opera film, "The Barber of Seville." He has honorary Doctor of Music degrees from five colleges and has served as president and board member of ASCAP.

#### . . . and His Guests

The three musically talented teen-agers who appear with Taylor each week are chosen by a national advisory board of musicians and educators to represent each state. The "Week-End with Music" broadcasts are marked by the complete ease and joviality displayed between Taylor and his guests. This is all the more remarkable considering that the composer-commentator was born in 1885 and his guests are usually seventeen years old. The answer lies in a remark that a Taylor contemporary once made to us while discussing the accomplishments of this remarkable man—"Deems," he said, "is the *youngest* man I ever knew!"

# Edwards Means Business...

*Big Business, That Is. Ralph's Staff Has Grown From a Fledgling Operation To a Crowd of Twenty in Busy Offices*

AL PASCHALL, production manager for both shows, is called "Mr. Impossible" by co-workers. Al thinks some of the "impossible" things he has accomplished have included getting Doubleday to promise to publish a not-yet-written book; putting an actual merry-go-round on a stage at NBC New York; and chartering a Hudson River boat during the war to give 50 GI honeymooners an \$8000 trip.

**I**N A large building at the corner of Hollywood Boulevard and Cherokee Street, Ralph Edwards's two radio program operations require the entire north end of the second floor. Here, twenty persons mingle as a busy family, staff for nine-year-old "Truth or Consequences" in the rooms on the left of the corridor and the new "This Is Your Life" in offices on the right. Ralph himself occupies a spacious room on the west corner, while his production manager, Al Paschall, who works on both shows, appropriately enough has an office which straddles the dividing line.

Five years ago, when Ralph moved from New York to Hollywood, the office force consisted of Ralph, Al, and a secretary. When he bought a home in Beverly Hills, Edwards utilized

space over the driveway and settled his helpers here. This was outgrown within a few months, however. Then Al and the "T. or C." publicity girl, at that time Martha Curry, found office quarters over Billingsley's Restaurant on Sunset Boulevard. Within a year this space was so cramped that Al hunted and found quarters in the Hollywood office building where the "family" now "resides."

Within the past two years as new staff members have been added, the phone company has been summoned to enlarge facilities five times. A

new desk and office space have been annexed practically every month. Recently the suites were redecorated, each one according to the occupant's taste. Ralph's was done over in gray, green and chartreuse. True to his thespian leanings, Al had a mural painted on the wall facing his desk. Jane, the office manager, chose Early American. Others picked coral, brown, blue.

Another air possibility is a summer musical series co-starring Andy and Della Russell, the young marrieds who have turned into such a successful night-club and vaudeville duo. . . . Never-say-die Mickey Rooney still has his audition record, "The Boy Next Door," spinning at ABC. . . . And there's a new CBS thriller titled "The Green Lama" headed for front burner. . . . Milty Berle will continue on AM radio next season, contrary to previous reports that he would drop it in favor of TV. His summer replacement may be the Berle show sans Milton. . . . "Johnny Dollar," dropped by the net, may return as a CBS summer replacement—if they're not careful. . . . Shirley Booth, Broadway comedienne and the ex-Mrs. Ed Gardner, may be the summer replacement for "This Is Your Life" in a series titled "Hogan's Daughter." . . . Joan Edwards, niece of Gus Edwards and former star of "Hit Parade," rumored to be returning to the air via Mutual and a musical quiz. . . . Another addition to the soap-opera ranks is "Other Women's Children," now being considered by CBS.

### *Looks Like*

Lurene Tuttle, Sheldon Leonard (who's getting awfully popular) and Willard Waterman will be in the cast of the George O'Hanlon show, which replaces the Alan Young series this summer. . . . The "Winner Take All Home Quiz Book" will be in the bookstores in July. It's the work of Bill Todman and Mark Goodson of the CBS show. . . . James Roosevelt is among those planning a European visit this summer. Guest speakers will take over during the eight-week trip. . . . "Hit Parade" emanates from New York starting in June. Bill Harrington takes over the Sinatra spot; Eileen Wilson continues. . . . The Dorothy Lamour show will be dropped after July 7 in favor of a low-budgeter. . . . "Call the Police" replaces "Amos 'n' Andy" during summer vacation time. . . . Abe Burrows will develop and star in a new half-hour comedy for CBS in addition to cracking wise for the "This Is Broadway" panel. . . . Sinatra starts as a disc jockey on Mutual in Septem-

ber, filling a fifteen-minute five-a-week spot with records. What's etiquette in a spot like that—do you lean heavy on your own discs or other people's? . . . "Hollywood Calling" is the name for the new NBC giveaway.

## Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

### *"This Is Broadway"*

A pretty classy entry into the talent-show ranks is the CBS house-built "This Is Broadway," KNX, 6:30 p.m. Wednesday. The class is supplied by Clifton Fadiman (late of "Information Please"), the gracious Miss Helen Hayes, George S. Kaufman, author and director of several decades of Broadway hits, and (in his own peculiar way) Abe Burrows. This distinguished lineup functions as a panel under the wise and sometimes whimsical direction of moderator Fadiman, the purpose of which is to comment on and supply advice to professional performers who strut their abilities before the mike.

During the hour-long broadcast, each of the participating guests tells Fadiman of his problem, performs his bit and then accepts informal counseling from the Hayes-Kaufman-Burrows combine. On the first broadcast, this premise functioned as little more than a format. "Problems" presented by the visiting talent were either imaginary or insoluble, ranging from Phil Foster, the Brooklyn comic, who wanted to learn another language, to Mary McCarty, who revealed that her hometown boy friend married an air-lines hostess because Mary became a Broadway star too fast. Advice from the panel in this case was "forget it." To the Brooklyn comic, Abe Burrows offered, "Geez, I don't see nuttin' wrong wit' the way ya talk." And Miss Hayes cautioned Miss McCarty that personal relationships must naturally suffer if one works for stardom in the theater.

Unlike other talent shows, "This Is Broadway" presents name stars, most of which, like Foster and Miss McCarty, are better known to New York theater-goers than to Hollywood radio listeners.

Two of the better-known names were Artie Shaw, the clarinet prince, and Frank Parker, the radio tenor. Both presented interesting problems that could have called forth some bonafide professional advice. Shaw revealed that his audiences won't listen to the type of music he would like to play. The fact that he had recently tried to present some classical music to some wild and woolly be-boppers and received a royal frost wasn't men-

half to death trying to get the emcee to pick you for an on-stage exposing and a crack at the "Treasure Chest."

You play from your radio-side at home. A "buck" is hidden some place, or on some man or woman, living or dead . . . but any of the three alternatives is well known.

A poem tipping off listeners as to the hiding place is read. The poem we heard (it will undoubtedly have been solved by the time this is in print, so we aren't giving anything away by the printing) went:

Prophet's prince, religious voice  
Palace born, beggar's choice  
A movie queen, a vatican clue,  
Two centuries bring his fame to you.

In addition to that broad set of hints, Virginia Maxie and Wilbur Hatch's orchestra musically delineate five countries. A song about wooden shoes and tulips naturally suggests Holland, and so on. The "buck" is hidden in one of these countries.

If you can guess who has the mythical buck and where it is hidden, hot-foot it out to the nearest mailbox with your answer. Earliest postmark, plus the correct answer, wins.

Now, if you include one of sponsor Roman Meal's box tops, you are also eligible for the \$250 jackpot. If you haven't a box top, but win anyway, you get the "Treasure Chest" full of wonderful electrical devices (washing machines, ironers, dryers, toasters, and other swell time-savers); then the second earliest postmark that does contain a box top gets the cash.

After the fact that the game itself calls for some ingenuity, the most attractive feature of the evening was the show's lack of contestants on stage talking about Brooklyn. Maybe not having lived there left some void in our make-up, but mental quirk or no, we'll stay happy never hearing an audience member take up show time by mentioning that good city again!

### "Scattergood Baines"

Each Sunday afternoon at 4:00, over Mutual's network (KHJ, in our case) the delightful Clarence Budington Kelland adventures of "Scattergood Baines" are reproduced in radio form.

Real "radio magic" is brought into play right down the line, from scripter Jerry Holland, producer Herb Rice, Wendell Holmes as "Scattergood," and Parker Fennelly in each Sunday's major supporting role, through their absolute preservation of the flavor and whimsy that made Kelland's original stories beloved nationwide.

The portly "Scattergood" is a do-gooder with tongue in cheek. Most of the radio fixer-uppers we harbor a tendency to avoid. Some of the dear old aunts and kindly doctors on the airplanes have succeeded, as they straightened out lives, in generating such dislike on the part of listeners that subsequent listening becomes well-nigh a chore.

But the Kelland character's sly, humorous guile and general attitude of "it may or may not work out right, but no harm done" leaves no place for the smack of a busybody.

A recent Sunday's chapter found "Scattergood" taking an at-a-distance interest in a young crippled boy whose father was determined that his handicapped son should never be exposed to any humiliation through the son's attempts at playing the games of his schoolmates. Father suggested science as a compensatory measure, and had rigged up a marvelous lab for his offspring.

Through "Baines's" efforts, the boy utilized his yearning for and love of baseball by taking over a sports column in a daily newspaper. Writing served to satisfy both boy and wishful father, who found a place in the Fourth Estate as admirably erudite as a life of science.

The script blessedly refrained from any post-mortem hash among the principals, by means of dialogue, about what a good deed had been done, and "how glad everyone was that things worked out just right." The plot had resolved itself happily, and that was that. Only "Scattergood" knew what had gone on . . . just like Kelland's stories!

### "Yawn Patrol"

You have to enjoy your work in order to imbue it with enthusiasm seven nights a week, especially if your working hours are from 12:00 midnight to 3:00 a.m. And Johnny Grant, who monitors KGIL's "Yawn Patrol" at those wee hours, manages to make a happy time of it, for both listeners and himself, every time.

The show is a record-playing session broadcast from a busy restaurant on Vine Street right smack in the middle of Hollywood. What makes it different is that every a.m. but Saturday is guest-jockey night, and Johnny has friends who drop by to cheer him on, take a turn at announcing the platters and interview the other guests.

Mr. Grant's friends include just about every well-known music maker and comedy star in town. Frankie Laine, Bob Hope, Artie Wayne, Jimmy Durante, Margaret Whiting, Alan Young, Kay Starr . . . all have been on the early-morning deck. Some nights it sounds like a talent convention at the "Ham 'n' Egger."

It isn't our policy to recommend an eating place, primarily because we don't really care where folks get their "ham and" or what-have-you. But it is our policy to suggest entertainment for radio listeners when we stumble across a time segment we find particularly pleasant.

And hearing the good records (which Johnny personally lines up each evening beforehand with attention to the old and the new, the hot and the sweet) is just that . . . particularly pleasant . . . providing you have to be awake during those hours anyway. And one night or another you are sure to get in on the guest fest to hear some favorite personality make with the disc-jockey lingo.

But being on hand is better. We

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Looks Like

The Television Film Producers Association has re-elected Hal Roach, Jr., as their president. Term lasts one year. . . . Comedy team of Patti Moore and Ben Lessy is being set up for a video show on NBC. . . . Lou Place recently had his KTLA "Musical Scrapbook" kinescoped for eastern showing and sales. . . . Television is currently employing ten per cent as many workers as does the radio-FM industry. That is with only fifty-seven TV outlets on the beam; 3,456 full-time, and approximately 1,000 part-timers are happily ensconced in the new medium. . . . Margaret Whiting auditioned for the lead role in a televised serial version of "Meet Me in St. Louis"

for NBC-TV. . . . DuMont TV is preparing a series of grand operas for video. The dialogue will be in English, but the costuming will adhere to the traditional lines of "opry." Length of each feature will be fifty minutes. . . . William McLean has signed for a role in the new Fairbanks TV series called "Nobody's Perfect." . . . Rita LaRoy's KTLA program, "You're the Star," is to go off the air for the summer season. After May 31, all the television stations throughout the nation will have to use only BMI and public-domain songs. No more ASCAP tunes can be played. The TV outlets have been using ASCAP tunes on a temporary license-fee basis of \$1 monthly during the negotiations—which failed. . . . Three more movie folk moved before the video cameras recently. Barbara Britton, Gene Raymond and Rod Cameron went into a series titled "Hollywood in Person," twelve-minute TV

reels made by Gene Lester Productions. . . . Teleplay Productions, Inc., contracted to produce thirteen video films for Procter and Gamble. . . . The shortage of turns that has been assenting itself on video fare on both coasts has brought about a revival of old vaudeville and burlesque sketches and blackouts. Let's hope some of the old timers are performing their own stunts. . . . Looks like Lever Bros. as the sponsor-to-be for Martin and Lewis. Comic pair will do both AM radio and TV this summer for NBC. . . . Converting their big backlog of motion pictures into TV fare has been abandoned by Universal Pictures. Ban against the use of the musical soundtracks proved the stumbling block. Scissoring and bridging film to leave out music proved more expensive than was feasible. Company's big stock of J. Arthur Rank film is exempt from the Petrillo ban, so may go on the video market. . . . The American Tobacco Company to pick up the tab on Jack Benny's once-a-month video show, which will go for \$15,000. . . . The film studios have no intention of dropping their ban on player appearances on video. . . . RCA has abandoned its idea of sponsoring a show on NBC-TV opposite CBS-TV's "Arthur Godfrey and Friends" in the 8:00-to-

KMPC's news director Larry Smith begins the afternoon coverage of world and local activities during the broadcast of "Home Edition" at 12:45 p.m. Another phase of this show is Charles Lee Stone's information on agricultural developments and citrus industry activities. At 4:00 p.m., mickeman Bill Harpel is introduced with a 15-minute news program while Phil McHugh summarizes the news in a five-minute program, seven days weekly, at 5:00 p.m. A special program is that offered at 5:15 p.m., when radio-newspaperman Virgil Pinkley, editor and publisher of the *Mirror*, brings you the news direct from the editorial room of his newspaper.

That psychological hour—6:00 p.m.—when al-

most everyone spins his radio dial for a news program is excellently filled with KMPC's "Six O'Clock Final." During this special feature, Rex Miller comments on economic and legislative movements. . . . Bill Harpel covers the international and national scene and Howard Flynn brings you the latest in local events.

Rounding up its eighteen-hour day, KMPC summarizes the past twenty-four hours activity round the globe at 11:45 p.m., seven nights a week.

Special News Features: Charles Lee Stone and the "Farm and Ranch" show each morning at 6:30 a.m. . . . Market Reports direct from the Eastern Stock Exchanges at 9:15 a.m. . . . Not strictly news (but applicable), the "Bargain Broadcast" at 9:15 a.m., when news of interest to buyers is outlined. . . . News of Hollywood on the "Eddie Oxford Show" Saturday night at 9:00 pm. . . . Activities of "Your Neighborhood Church" are described by Al Salter at 8:30 p.m. on Saturday.

For news of your city, your county and your state, KMPC airs "Your City" program at 6:15 p.m. on Sunday. . . . "Your County" as conducted by Supervisor Leonard Roach at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday and "Your State" with James Bassett of the *Mirror* at 8:00 p.m. each Sunday.

9:00 hour on Wednesdays. . . It also looks like **Robert Q. Lewis** has been set to replace **Arthur Godfrey** and the same "And Friends" show during the latter's eight-week summer vacation time starting in mid-June. . . **Warner Bros.**' big shout about not buying **KLAC** at all because of the **FCC** delay might be merely a bluff to spur the **FCC** on to clearance of the deal before another year or two has run out. . . **KTLA** is offering nine of the station's regular video programs for participating spot commercials. Three or four spots sold in each show would provide more coin for the station than a straight package buy might.

## Second Glances (Critical Comment)

### "Editor's Round Table"

Each Sunday at 8:30 p.m., **KNBH** brings viewers moderator **Virgil Pinkley**, editor and Publisher of the *Mirror*, and his guests of the eve who join the Editor's Round Table to discuss a controversial subject.

The groups generally have stayed away from questions that might find the participants bringing their punches up from the floor. However, one recent Sunday when the question for discussion was "Will Be-Bop Revolutionize the Jazz World?" the best-laid plans of video almost went agley.

Upholding the contention that bebop will revolutionize the jazz world were **Paul Weston**, music director of **Capitol Records** and conductor of the **NBC "Supper Club"** orchestra, and **Gene Norman**, well-known **Los Angeles** disc-jockey and sponsor of many Southern California concerts, both jazz and bop.

On the negative side of the question were **David Rose**, noted conductor, composer and arranger heard on **NBC's Red Skelton** show, and **Red Nichols**, famous trumpet player whose jazz combo is still doing s.r.o. business at **Hollywood's Hangover**.

Excerpts from both jazz and bop records were played to illustrate, presumably for the viewers, the difference between the two, and the discussion was off. One of the gentlemen upholding bop's questionable merits seemed pretty upset whenever his word was disputed, but after having heard him utter the statement . . . and we quote . . . "When I am writing a jazz arrangement for . . . such and such . . ." we immediately and automatically disqualified him from the discussion. If it is "jazz," there isn't any written arrangement, or so **Louis Armstrong**, **Belderbecke**, **Sidney Bechet** et al thought, and that's good enough for most of us.

We thought it was the one of the quartet most used to addressing the public who, oddly enough, waxed terribly ponderous. Half the time we simple folk couldn't understand what he was talking about. **Red Nichols** kept it simple and neat, and to our way of thinking made the most sense. Possibly because we can't understand bop anyway.

The point we started out to make was that even with a seemingly un-

loaded subject, a pre-show screening might be in order. A debate is an impersonal thing, and if a show is to come off well, the little ladies and gentlemen involved must realize their personal integrity isn't being challenged. No one needs to get mad.

### Boxing

**KNBH** recently announced that **Buddy Clark**, one of the top sports fans of the country and singing star of **NBC's "Carnation Contented Hour,"** would be behind the **KNBH** microphone to describe the **C.Y.O. (Catholic Youth Organization)** boxing bouts from the **Hollywood Legion Stadium** each Wednesday.

Our interest in boxing whetted as never before, we eagerly warmed up **Channel 4** and awaited the events. The first one-hour telecast gave us the shock of our video lives.

Almost without exception, the **NBC** telecasts have hitherto displayed a brand of camera work and production surpassing any other outlet in this range. Understandable when you realize the net for several years has been training crews in this work with an eye to having its early work on the **West Coast** the very best possible.

Obviously the schooling the trainees received concentrated on studio emanations. Their remote work doesn't measure up. We forgave and forgot **KNBH's** efforts at televising a rodeo and a dog show. Those events cover a lot of territory, and **mikeman Arch Presby** did yeoman duty at filling voids with entertaining chatter about what was going on outside of camera range.

But boxing areas are standard in size, remain in one place, and are usually brilliantly lighted. Why then, was it necessary for the **KNBH** cameras to concentrate half the time on the fringe of spectators surrounding the ring . . . or, as we unhappily watched, swing for a few moments to an empty corner of the stadium?

**Buddy Clark** was in evidence only briefly. Unless you are all wrapped up in the ring sport, his presence could have been the viewer drawing card, yet **Clark's** mellifluous voice calling the events was the only thing that made us sure he was on hand most of the time.

Even when **Major General David H. Hudelson**, Commanding General of the **Fortieth Infantry Division**, made an appearance to comment on boxing and its beneficial effects on youth, the presentation didn't exactly bring the general and his hosts into our living room.

It is a safe bet we'll be among next **Wednesday's** viewers, for we are sure **NBC** is not going to allow its enviable record of telecasting to be marred further. Incidentally, the bouts themselves are lively bits of business.

## Off Lens (Personalities)

### The Hard Way

If and when you video viewers see the film shot around the attempt of

**Riverside** millionaire **James A. Forbes** to find the buried treasure of the **Cocos Islands**, remember this story. The film will be the most unusual **TV** film shot to date.

The **Cocos Islands** are off the **Costa Rican** coast in the **Pacific**. Some months ago **Forbes** and his good ship "Bolivar" took off on **Forbes's** fifth attempt to raise the sixty-some million in gold believed lost there. Producer **Paul Perry** decided to make a **TV** film location trip of the affair, and sent along a crew to take the pix. En route, the group in the "Bolivar" were six days without radio communication. They encountered a near-collision with an oil tanker; were swept 100 miles off course by a tropical hurricane; and experienced four engine breakdowns. The treasure seekers and film crews arrived at the **Cocos** only to have an actor get hit on the head by a falling beam, thus become incapacitated.

The actual excavation for the gold was a near fiasco. The pilings and timber for the excavation jumped their moorings and were swept out to sea, and rugged tidal waves later tore away sections of the caisson.

Then, during the recent **Costa Rican** revolution, the "Bolivar" was mistaken for an arms-carrying boat and almost fired upon by the government. Spiny sea urchins managed to poison three of the ship's crew, and **Virgil Mack**, director of the hoped-for picture, was laid up with an infected jaw following an extraction he underwent without benefit of anesthetics.

For ail of that, the filming went at a cost of only \$50,000. High for video, but the publicity occasioned by all the misfortune suffered has stimulated great station interest.

## On Lens (About Studio Happenings)

### Hollywood Park Fire Scoop

Exclusive **KTLA** films of the **Hollywood Park** fire surprised televiewers **Friday, May 6**, when they appeared at the earliest possible time on **Channel 5**.

Mere minutes after the \$6,000,000 blaze broke out, **Klaus Landsberg**, **KTLA** station manager, and studio cameraman **David Hansen** arrived at the scene of the fire. They remained there throughout the night, shooting 700 feet of exclusive film for the new scoop. The pictures of the multi-million-dollar blaze were rushed through processing, edited, and run first of all on **KTLA** at 6:00 p.m. **Friday**.

That marks the second time in the past month that **KTLA** has scooped newsreel and local television with film coverage of spot news. **Mr. Landsberg** dispatched **KTLA** film cameramen to the **Santa Monica** reservoir cave-in in **April** when it was learned rescue work would be completed before a telecast could be made. **KTLA** ran exclusive pictures five hours after the disaster—before many newspapers carrying the story hit the streets.

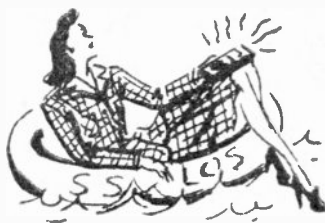

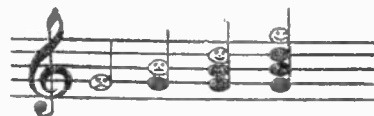

In the record world, she's had two discs that have passed the million mark in sales—"You Was," with Buddy Clark, and "It's Magic." In the realm of movies, she's one of the unique personalities that became a star with her first film, "Romance on the High Seas," with Jack Carson. In radio she stars with Bob Hope each week as songstress and comedienne.

### Career Switch

Though Doris had always planned a musical career, it seemed for a time that fate had outwitted her. Trained as a dancer in ballet, tap and acrobatics, she had given singing little thought. An accident between a train and a car in which she was riding changed everything. She suffered a badly broken leg and was in a cast for fourteen months. Her dancing career seemed over. Her exciting singing career had its beginning when she started studying during her convalescence. After her recovery, she sang for free on a local radio station. That's where the

astute maestro Rapp discovered her. She also sang with Bob Crosby's and Les Brown's bands before taking the screen test that landed her in movies with a bang.

### Agile Actress

Doris, long-legged and athletic, today gives no hint that her ability to dance and walk was ever impaired. She loves sports of all kinds—tennis, golf, hockey, swimming, riding and best of all, volleyball. "I could play twenty games, one right after another," she insists with typical Day enthusiasm. Someone who once played on a team with her relates how the dashing Day raced across a yard chasing an out-of-bounds ball. "It sailed over a fence and Doris didn't stop—she sailed over the fence too. Why, I would have had

to use a ladder," he gasped. Doris's face still brightens like that of a little girl when she thinks about dancing. # "Stars Know Their Business"

*So Says Anton Leader, Producer of "Suspense," Thrill Show Spotlighting Unusual Star Casting.*

**A**NTON M. LEADER, producer of CBS's "Suspense," is bent on exploding a prevalent radio myth that great stars are not necessarily great actors. "The stars know their business," he states. "The reason they are big and good is that they *work* at it." He grants that some may work more than others, but that the majority have combined hard work with out-of-the-ordinary ability. The pictures taken during "Suspense" broadcasts rather bear out Leader's contention. Exciting dramatic performances have made for exciting pictures.

Leader, casting on the theory that all comedians yearn to play Hamlet, has come up with some unusual combinations. Gene Kelly and Ethel Barrymore teamed in a thriller in which he tried to scare her to death.

Marian and Jim Jordan stepped out of their "Fibber and Molly" characterization for the first time in decades to do a melodrama.

### Direction Theories

The high quality of the performance is a testimonial to Leader's method of direction. He never reads lines for his actors in an attempt to interpret for them. He himself was once an actor, and he believes that the profession knows what it's doing. He believes in surrounding his players with as much realism as possible. Once, in an effort to get the effect of soldiers in a slit trench, he had his actors sit with their feet in boxes of dirt. Every time they made a natural movement during the broadcast, their feet made a perfectly realistic sound effect. They acted more like weary soldiers, because they were weary actors who were tired of sitting with their feet in small boxes of dirt. Another time he put six cast members on tables with the mike

suspended over them. The program was a dramatization of the story of six men on a life raft. "Every time the actors moved, they groaned," smiles Leader. To get the effect of action in a French train, he once used telephone-booth compartments for his cast. Charles Laughton appeared on a "Suspense" show that had him trapped under cellar stairs. Leader used a platform and stairs to give the illusion of people walking overhead. Laughton enjoyed it, was only sorry *he* couldn't have been one of the actors to use the stairs and platform during the broadcast.

Leader (everyone seems to call him Tony) came to CBS from New York a little more than a year ago. He

had done "Murder at Midnight" ("that stamped me"), "Words at War" and "Radio Reader's Digest" among other series. He has been in radio for fifteen years, ever since he left his work as director of a Boston stock company to go to New York. "I found out that New York had never heard of Boston," he smiles. That's when he became a radio actor, specializing in dialects, and laid

# Televising the Nines...

*Isn't an Easy Job. One Play Missed by the Video Lens Will Bring Cries of Rage From the Rabid Fans Of One of America's Most Popular Sports—Baseball.*

**M**ANY a romance has suffered during baseball season. Strong men quail at the prospect of explaining a game interestingly to the girl on their arm. Usually the little woman who can't get with the game is left at home. "Following the plays for someone else is just too tough," most fans insist.

But imagine following the plays for more than 300,000 possible viewers, six days each week, and keeping it interesting for every one of them. KLAC-TV tackled this job.

True enough, there is a percentage of the uninitiated in the diamond-game audience who might not anticipate every play, and should the camera miss a few, they would never detect the omission. But legions of baseball-happy fans do know what to expect, and should camera work during a televised baseball game not suit them, their howl would literally shatter the transmitter of the offending telecasters.



KLAC-TV months ago contracted for all the Los Angeles Angels' and Hollywood Stars' home games, as well as for five major-league games that were played here in Los Angeles earlier this spring.

#### Two Fields, Many Men

Because either the Stars or Angels team remains in town while the other is on the road, every day but Monday finds Channel 13 carrying a game from Gilmore Stadium or Wrigley Field.

That means that all season long, each day, three cameras must be carted to the field and their cable laid to the mobile control unit in the truck. Three directors have to be on hand each day, two regulars and one stand-by in case of a double-header. KLAC's program director, Fred Henry, is combining his Eastern television training and his intense en-

thusiasm for baseball into daily stints as director-producer.

All season, six days a week, Fred sits inside the mobile unit, facing five screens. Three of these carry pictures directly from each of the three cameras. The fourth, the monitor, carries the picture or combination of pictures Fred chooses from the work of the three cameras. The fifth screen brings director Henry and announcer Sam Balter the picture at-home viewers are seeing.

Mr. Henry definitely does not regard baseball as one of the sports least difficult to televise.

"For one thing, you have so many possibilities to consider. Baseball works in all different directions. If a heavy hitter is up, you can gamble on a long fly and tighten up on your long lens. But it is still a gamble.

"If it looks like a bunt coming up,

you have to choose between sticking close to the plate with the screen, or focusing on a base runner and where he is headed for

"You can imagine the difficulty of covering the whole diamond when the bases are full . . . someone is bound to be disappointed in not seeing all the bases at once. But a video camera, or three video cameras, such as we use, just can't do it. We have to leave out something part of the time. Talk about worry! And we always have on our minds the three cameras planted in the stands. Those are pretty expensive instruments to stand among a lot of excited fans, and let's face it, they do take up room that several other spectators would be enjoying.

"We figured that, roughly, there are twenty-four plays we simply

must get to keep the game right on viewers' sets. For instance, when a fielder running deep snags a would-be homer . . . that we *have* to catch."

#### No Time Out

When sponsor Pabst puts in his several thousand dollars' worth each day, the commercial is performed back at the KLAC-TV Cahuenga Boulevard studios and presented right over the screen on which the baseball game or the between-innings activities are still being pictured.

"We wouldn't dare remove the field from the screen for a second," Mr. Henry smiles. "The fans don't want to miss a single thing."

He went on to explain that televising a game uses the services of twelve people, at the minimum.

These include the announcer, the producer, the assistant director, the director, three cameramen, an audio engineer and the camera control men inside the mobile truck, and the men managing the scoreboard for KLAC-TV.

The scoreboard which television viewers see is not the one belonging to either Wrigley Field or Gilmore Stadium. KLAC-TV built its own, one suitable to television's complexities, and one that could also carry the banner of the sponsors who bring the thousands of watchers a daily game.

One Sunday recently Fred Henry had a day off work. This meant that he didn't sit inside the metal truck with the letters KLAC-TV boldly blazoned on its side. He didn't watch the series of screens and work at assembling the best composite picture of them all.

On Mr. Henry's precious day off he spent the free time by hustling off to Wrigley Field to watch a baseball game.

This ardent fan who keeps the games interesting for viewers lounging at home wistfully explained, "This one game may easily be the only one this season during which I get to do any rooting . . . out loud!"

*The program is compiled several weeks in advance by myself and others who do research work on the facts and figures which are to be used. Material is also sent to me from Washington, D.C.*

**5. What is your favorite reminiscence of your father?**

*I think the cruises that he and*

*my brothers took in the thirties off the New England coast . . . I believe he got more enjoyment out of them than anything else.*

**6. What advantages have you enjoyed being the son of a president?**

*Oh, I'd say an extra interesting life, the privilege of meeting many people both at home and abroad, and the honor of taking part in events that I wouldn't have been in otherwise. I also was able to get a close look at the way government runs.*

**7. What disadvantages?**

*Well, it's like living in a gold-*

Well, many have said that I look like both my mother and father, while there are others who say I bear a closer resemblance to my mother.

13. What are your tastes in clothing . . . social life . . . reading?

I wear whatever is suitable to the occasion, and am partial to gray suits. I enjoy the movies and having the neighbors in for an evening's chat.

For books, I choose historical and political pieces, and once in a while even a good mystery.

14. Do you have any television aspirations?

Not at this time, although I have been on television—at the National Convention last summer. I think it is a marvelous medium and have no objections to offer against it.

15. What is your prognosis of the economic trend in the United States?

I am not a prophet.

16. What, in your opinion, is the difference between a liberal and a communist?

In my opinion, a communist is one who believes in the Marxian Communistic philosophy, which believes it is the only one that can provide a satisfactory life for the majority of the people.

While an American liberal, not afraid of changes, believes that democracy can perform and function for improvements and that there must be a continual strive for these improvements, in economics as well as government. Changes are not to be dreaded, as the conservatives feel, but as something that will improve the system of the way of life.

17. Do you think the American radio is doing an effective job in selling democracy to the world?

I think it is doing a good job. Programs such as "Voice of America" are exceptionally well done. The effort is, of course, varied and spotted, but on the

whole it is doing a great job. I do wish that some of the radio ethics could be applied to the newspaper world.

18. Do you anticipate any further difficulty with Russia?

I think the whole world has to face the fact that there will be difficulty with Russia until they agree to the philosophy of "live and let live." I do not think that war with Russia is inevitable, but I do agree that it is possible.

19. What one question do you most dislike being asked by interviewers?

I don't dislike any sincere questions, although I find at times that some of them are impossible to answer.

20. What do you expect to be doing twenty years from now?

Visiting my sons and daughter in college, and of course I hope that I will be capable of living a useful and interesting life.
