TELEVISION will see its fastest and biggest changes as the competition for its choice time spots gets tighter and tighter. Then the race for top quality will really be on!"

Speaking was a well-qualified authority—CBS-TV's production supervisor, Harlan Thompson.

Of color television, he declared, "We'll have it as soon as they let us have it. It's ready. I saw it as early as 1945, and even then it was better than Technicolor."

Thompson considers one of video's greatest obstacles to be its inheritance of the prohibitively costly standards of the motion-picture medium. "It's unfair to draw critical comparison of TV to the veteran, prospering movie industry."

As complex as the mechanics of the medium itself are the duties with which a television production supervisor daily finds himself confronted. A man with all the know-how the job requires is Harlan



Behind the Scenes in Video

Thompson. His career background adds up to thirty years of experience as a top stage and screen writer, director, and producer.

Challenge

He terms his present assignment, however, "a challenge." "It's an uncharted sea and there aren't any signposts." His job is "the coordi-

nation of various production problems" with his duties varying from day to day. He is in charge of all the film—both original and TVR ("television recordings," more generally called "kinescopes").

A part of what this entails runs something like this: For each show (CBS-TV's Alan Young, Ed Wynn and "Popsicle Parade" programs),

two picture negatives and two sound negatives (one sixteen-millimeter and one thirty-five-millimeter) are shot, doubling up for protection. The thirty-five-millimeter picture is phoned through the telephone exchange to be recorded on KTLA's Paramount Pictures' facilities, while the thirty-five-millimeter sound is telephoned to the Hollywood Glenn Glen studios where it is recorded on magnetic tape in 1000-foot magazines with overlapping sound patterns for protection. The sixteen-millimeter negatives are edited first, and are processed at Acme. The thirty-five-millimeter is cut at Consolidated, where it is put together "blindly" by a negative editor who doesn't see the film till later when she views it beside Thompson and, Thompson amusedly reports, she laughs at all the jokes because they're all new to her. The original thirty-five-millimeter negative is put on "system" in New York to serve the coaxial cable. "The way it works," Thompson informed us, "it is put on negative and through a series of changes, emerges positive. To service the coaxial cable from New York, the sound is also re-recorded on magnetic tape. Cities not on the coax are serviced with sixteen-millimeter."

The supervision of this vast network of complexities concerning the recording, photographing, printing, editing and servicing of CBS-TV film lies in Thompson's capable hands.

Among his concerns is the tricky task of scissoring all of the above

"The Truitts," New NBC Family Comedy, Is Scripted by a Veteran Mr. - and - Mrs. Writing Team Who Have Their Own Family

IT'S NO accident that an optimistic note about the future of America's families is very much in evidence throughout "The Truitts," new family comedy series recently initiated on NBC.

Not when you remember that the series was scripted by Doris and Frank Hursley.

The Hursleys think that the American family is here to stay. It's their observation that many of the current crop of novels and plays which portray children and parents at each others' throats are somewhat distorted. That they don't present the whole picture is their feeling, and the Hursleys, who have three grown daughters themselves, are in a position to know.

"Family life can be rewarding," says Frank, "and you can have fun in your family and with your family." That's exactly what they set out to prove in their new NBC family comedy.

After reading the first two scripts, Homer Canfield, NBC western regional division head, sent the Hursleys a typographical bouquet saying: "I enjoyed every word."

But influencing network officials and winning sponsors is nothing new for the Hursleys, one of radio's most unusual—and prolific—man-and-wife writing teams.

They've been doing that with amazing regularity ever since 1941 when Ruthrauff and Ryan grabbed up the first show they wrote. At that time Frank was a University of Wisconsin professor and Doris was practicing law.



During the war years, the Hursley talents were enlisted for the duration on the home front.

In 1944, Doris took down her shingle and Frank left the classroom for the rehearsal room. They were in radio for keeps.

For two years, 1943-1945, they wrote two documentary series sponsored by the Wrigley Company. The first was "American Women" honoring efforts of the nation's Rosie the Riveters. The second "Service to the Front" was a salute to the GI Joes in every branch of the armed forces.

For their gallant rear-echelon efforts in "Service to the Front," the Hursleys were given a citation by the War Department.

"And a complete set of 'Yank' magazines bound in leather," Doris mentions proudly. Which makes them the only civilians so honored.

One of their scripts on this show, "Atom Bomb," is included in Margaret Mayorga's "Best One-Act Plays of 1945." Further honors came to it when it was published by the Syracuse University Press making it the only commercial radio script ever to be published in a separate book by a college press.

Came 1946, reconversion — and "Those Websters."

When they wrote their first show for "Those Websters" in March, 1946, it had a Nielsen rating in the neighborhood of 2.5.

During the 1946-47 season, "Those Websters" hit an 11.5 Nielsen tally. By December of 1947 it had zoomed to 14.3 and began crowding such formidable competition as "Ozzie and Harriet."

In January 1948 "Those Websters" scaled the heights with a 19.2 rating. That was an all-time high for the network. What's more, it frequently led the time slot for all four

networks.

But it wasn't all done with mirrors or slide rules.

Responsible are a couple of factors. hard work and the Hursley slant on life in general and family life in particular.

In transforming "Those Websters" from a program which few dialed to into a Sunday afternoon listening "must," they did two things:

Made it an all-family comedy.

Created an amusing and credible picture of family life which listeners would relish.

"We wrote a comedy built upon believable situations and believable characters instead of falling back on trick voices, horseplay and corny gags."

This proved to the Hursleys that believable situations pay off in lis-

tener interest. They're using the same formula in "The Truitts."

"Most so-called family comedies concentrate on a single member of the family. The rest of the family become stooges to the lead character," Frank pointed out.

And Frank, who owns a Ph.D. degree in American literature—he's probably the only Ph.D. writing for radio—has thought a good deal about this type of show. He puts it very unpedantically this way:

"It is a commonplace of American radio that what one member of the family finds of interest is a pain in the neck to the rest of the family."

"The Truitts" is planned to hold the interest of every member of the family above the ripe old age of eight.

FOUR or five hours a day, news analyst Frank Edwards is spending his time deliberately provoking conversations with total strangers. Sometimes he gets pleasant chit-chat, sometimes an argument. Whatever it is, the results are likely to wind up on Edwards's Mutual news program.

Buses, restaurants, railroad terminals, hotel lobbies are fertile grounds for finding out what the man on the street thinks of current happenings at home and abroad.

Edwards is systematic about his probing. He visits every hotel lobby in Washington, D. C., the Union Station, the bus terminals and taxi stands. He always rides busses back and forth between home and the office. Each day he lunches in a different restaurant and always by himself. During the noon rush, waiters seat him with other people, paving the way for interesting conversations. At least half an hour a day he loiters in hotel lobbies, striking up chatter with vacationists and tourists. At least once a week, he mingles with the passengers at Union Station, ostensibly the average man in a crowd.

"Hello, Joe . . ."

"By stirring up conversations," he points out, "I'm in a position to get positive, uninhibited reactions to the

who've spent their lives learning how to entertain), we'll have to admit the portion of this program that Garry spends in an informal question-and-answer exchange with studio visitors comes off as one of the best parts of the show. Remainder of it is filled with jokes that don't draw many laughs. Moore monologues that haven't seemed as funny as they used to be, and so-so song deliveries by a girl and a boy singer. Latter is a particular favorite with many dialers, Ken Carson.

Moore's chief aide in the goings-on is Durward Kirby, who does well, but it seems to us that Garry's got to build the people around him into strong enough personalities to give him more solid support.

Finally, when a show is simulcast, it only follows that the radio listener is left feeling a little dissatisfied. There is a lot of talk on the show about its visual attractions—but non-set owners and West Coast TV fans (to date) don't have the chance to join in the fun.

But don't get us wrong—we love Garry Moore! Nevertheless, notwithstanding.

OLD PROF KYSER is getting a big boot out of being on TV. He had to go to New York to be flashed on the tube, but he's back here for just a few weeks' respite during the summer hiatus. Kay is looking contented and prosperous and his wife, **Georgia**, is just as beautiful as ever. Kay is crazy about his two little daughters, **Kim** and **Candy**, adorable blue-eyed blondes who resemble their ex-Powers model mama. He thinks it's a tremendous joke about Georgia going on his TV show. Everybody in the studio told her she looked terrific and she couldn't wait until breakfast next morning to ask Kim what she thought. "You looked awful!" her four-year-old announced nonchalantly.

GEORGIA WAS FLOORED. Kay, who was dying from laughter, quickly asked Kim, "How did Daddy look?"

"You looked fine!" Georgia is still trying to live that one down. It wouldn't be so funny if his missus weren't so beautiful.

KIM TICKLES KAY with another caper. Out of all the 120 people working the Kyser TV show, Kim has picked singer **Michael Douglas** to have a crush on. This wouldn't be so amusing were it not for the fact that Michael has twin daughters just Kay's age. When Michael brought his twins to Kim's fourth birthday party, she wouldn't sit down at the table to cut her cake until her father persuaded her she wasn't being a good hostess. She pulled him aside to explain that she didn't want to sit down "with those girls. I'm embarrassed," she whispered. Watch out for this 1965 heart smasher.

ONE OF THE BIGGEST YUKS Kay got while in New York was on his first rehearsal day in the studio. He had heard that **Milton Berle** carries a police whistle, fastened around his neck. It's the only way he can get attention during rehearsal when he wants quiet from all the people swarming in the studio. Just by happenchance, Kyser received a bakery man's whistle from **Paul Helms**, L. A. bakery biggie, the very day he was to start his TV rehearsals, so Kay took it along and started things off to a great pace by blowing his whistle first thing. It slayed everyone. Next week, the whole gang showed up with whistles.

TV, SAYS KYSER, is a fine experience. He was assigned a producer named **Laverty**, who told Kay there were two things he planned to do: keep the show's schedule on time during the week and establish echelons (who has what say and when) among the workers. Keeping the show on schedule means Kyser is always two weeks and four days ahead of the march . . . it means that the very next day after he has wrapped up one TV production, he has to take five hours to look over the tentative script for another show. But that means too, that Kyser then has a free mind over his week ends. Establishing the echelons meant that even Kay was not immune to dis-

cipline. Always used to bursting into a conference and spilling a great idea as soon as it struck him, Kyser finally learned to wait until the proper time (a music idea for the conference for music, a dancing idea for the dancing huddle, etc.) to present his brainstorm.

THE KYSERS HAVE their Doheny Drive place for sale. Sorry to hear they liked New York so much . . . they were lucky enough to get a house right near the Waldorf, where the children had a lovely back yard and stayed so healthy they didn't get one small snuffle all last winter. But when I pointed out to Kay that perhaps one reason he liked it so well back there was that he knew he could come home here, he admitted that might be true. He's having a dreadful (and hilarious) time trying to get TV reception where he lives, surrounded cozily by hills. Finally, after one whole crew worked on a new antenna, another offered to string a line from the high hill to the west. Kay found himself one night with two sets—one hooked up to the regular antenna and one to the pole on a hill. Eagerly he tuned a channel on the one—got "Kukla, Fran and Ollie." Dialing the other set, he also got "Kukla, Fran and O," but they weren't beaming the same program. I can't figure this one out, can you?

delivery of several months' supply at one swack. . . . Southern California Broadcasters' Association has blue-printed plans for emergency operation of commercial radio in case of disaster.

Next time Mrs. Gertrude Berg entertains and I'm invited, I'll be disappointed if she doesn't spy me coming in and call "Yoo-hoo," clear across the room. I mean she is just as warm and down-to-earth in real life as her brainchild, "Molly Goldberg," is on radio and TV. For the first time in thirteen years Mrs. Berg is in Hollywood to work on the first "Goldberg" movie being shot at Paramount. With queenly poise she presided over a small press luncheon last Thursday in one of the private dining rooms of the studio commissary. To me she presented a perfect picture of a woman who has achieved success without letting it go to her head. Her dress was dark and plain . . . her hat, a veiled white felt, was tilted over her soft brown hair . . . hair was up on her head, but wisps kept straggling down . . . big brown eyes the compelling features of a placid, plump face . . . diamond earrings . . . large diamond ring . . . plain hands, short nails with no polish. She was so tolerant about answering a barrage of questions that it's a wonder she got to eat any of her lunch.

Time seems to be her most valuable commodity. Her days and nights are so full she has to turn her back on many pastimes she might otherwise enjoy to the hilt. "The Goldbergs" on radio . . . "The Goldbergs" on TV . . . "The Goldbergs" on film. What next? They've already been on Broadway (nine months) and had fine reviews . . . so next, says Mrs. Berg, is the musical comedy version . . . "Porgy and Bess." Mrs. Berg says softly, "Mollie and Jake." It could be done.

"It wouldn't be easy," someone across the table from Mrs. Berg said. "Nothing is easy, darling," she answered. Just the way you'd expect to hear "Mollie" say it.

Mrs. Berg, who entered radio in 1929, sold her show idea by reading the script to radio biggies. She wouldn't let them read it, for as she explains, "There's no dialect in 'The Goldbergs' . . . rather, it's a cadence, a rhythm," and it's this cadence and rhythm which contribute so much to the presentation and which no one, not having heard it, could possibly read into it. Her first script, Mrs. Berg said, was only 500 words long . . . the program director told her to go home and write more . . . she had been doing a monologue for years, using this "Molly" as her character, and to make a script she had given "Molly" a husband and two children. The program director suggested she switch her children's ages, making the boy older than the girl.

It's hard to believe that Mrs. Berg had to fight to get her program on television. She loves TV, though she

Like "Those Websters," the "Truitts" scripts are devoid of farce or gag situations. It is what the Hursleys describe as "a believable situation family comedy."

In it the Hursleys are using a "rotating spotlight" idea. That means the dramatic focal point shifts from week to week from one member of the family to another.

"The Truitts," say the Hursleys, are a Midwestern family. There's Elmer and Gert and their three children, ages eighteen, sixteen and thirteen.

(Any similarity between the Truitt brood and the trio of Hursley girls, Debby, Pat and Bridget, is purely coincidental.)

Locale of "The Truitts" is Hope Springs, "the biggest little city in the world—big enough to have many of the advantages of New York and small enough for the tax collector to call you by your first name."

Since moving to Hollywood in 1946, the Hursleys have written a number of radio shows, including comedies and dramatic stories. Among the stars who have appeared in Hursley vehicles are Gregory Peck, Ray Milland and William Powell.

Though they've written some 600 scripts to date, they work just as diligently over every line as they

has found it terribly time-consuming. She does all her own writing, in long-hand, usually in the morning. Luckily she's a "quick study," and learns her own lines for the show quite rapidly. She also writes the commercials.

TV has taken so much of her time that she doesn't have much opportunity to shop, her favorite hobby. "When I have the money, I have no time . . . when I can shop, I have no money," she laughed softly. Hats are her one extravagance. For coiffuring the brown hair that the hats nestle on, Mrs. Berg has to finagle time. The hairdresser often comes to the TV studio to pinch in a wave or two before show time.

In New York Mrs. Berg has an apartment and a country home ("which I never get time to use"). Her son is now twenty-six, married, and living in the Midwest. Her daughter, twenty-two, is on production staff for Tex and Jinx's show.

In Hollywood Mrs. Berg seemed to be having no more extra time than at home. She is hoping to indulge her penchant for watching people. Since entering TV, she herself has found getting around unimpeded an increasingly difficult problem. People stop her on the street or collect around a store where she is shopping. She is "Molly Goldberg" to half the folks who see her. After meeting her the other day, she is to me, too, more than ever.

did back in 1941. Casual is hardly the word to describe the Hursley approach to their daily writing chores.

"We know you can't write a masterpiece once a week, every week," they say, "but we try to make them as good as we know how."

Every script is written at least twice. And not a word finds its way to paper until there's a thorough—and sometimes heated—discussion about plot and theme.

Then Doris does the first version on her typewriter. Frank takes it from there and usually does a complete rewrite job.

Frequently the Hursleys, who are "Ma" and "Pa" to each other, will wrangle good-naturedly over a single line.

"We never let it go until we're agreed on the way a word or a line sounds and feels," they said.

However, not all of their time is spent working out the knotty problems of "The Truitts" or some other fictional family. The Hursleys lead a wholesome and satisfactory life of their own.

Visitors to their comfortable Bel-Air home will often find Doris sewing and Frank sawing wood or busy at work in his machine shop.

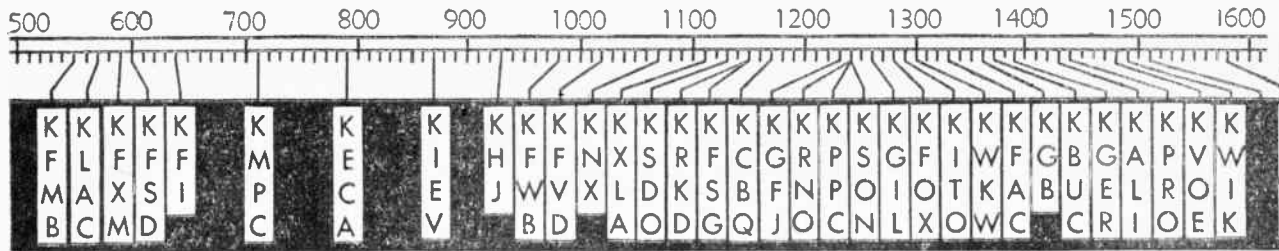
For relaxation they play chess, where Frank usually wins going away.

The Hursleys, who in 1940 had something like ninety acres of good Wisconsin farm land under cultivation, are as much at home behind a threshing machine as they are at a typewriter.

Their advice to young writers contemplating a career in radio is: "Listen to shows, get experience and do some living."

No hillside hermits, Doris and Frank lead an active social life because "we like people."

Here is this week's winner: Miss Fannie D. Stevens, 1123 1/2 W. Santa Barbara Ave., Los Angeles 37, Calif.

The hint is: To rejuvenate your cedar chest or closet, rub the inside surface lightly with sandpaper several times a year. This releases the cedar fragrance and makes for more effective protection from moths.

The next time you wash windows, walls, etc., simply wrap absorbent cotton around the wrist of the hand that does the work. Use a rubber band to hold it in place. The cotton catches those annoying and uncomfortable trickles of water that persist in running down your arm.

A hint for those of you who have trailer hitches on your car. Take a tennis ball and cut in half, then grease ball of hitch and slip tennis ball over it. This will keep hitch ball from rusting.

To make the veil on your hat look like new again, place a sheet of wax paper over it and press with a warm iron.

You can eliminate flying dirt by fastening a large paper bag over your dust mop with a rubber band before shaking, then just burn the bag.

Here is a handy place to keep your rubber sink mat. Just take a large paper clip and clamp it on the rubber mat. It can be hung on the inside of your cupboard or underneath your sink.

BEST SIDE OF THE WEEK is a marvelous new etching of a 1933 tune called "You're Mine You," done up in fine ballad style by Capitol's Margaret Whiting. Frank DeVol's arrangement, featuring the Les Baxter Chorus, provides the right production touch to make this one of Maggie's best. . . Martha Tilton (Coral), with a good assist from the Lee Gordon Singers, sings "I'll Always Love You" with all the warmth this beguine-tempo'd opus demands. Reverse "There Isn't Very Much to Do Now" seemed too slow and a rather weak companion. . . Evelyn Knight (Decca) has another of those brisk discs that moves right along in "All Dressed Up to Smile" and "Cherry Stones." Both are excellent material for Evvie and the Ray Charles Singers without the hand-clapping that usually goes with tunes of this type. . . Sally Sweetland (MGM) lends her lovely soprano voice to "Our Lady Fatima" and "Mother Dear, O Pray for Me" in semi-religious vein, but very timely lyrics with their deep meaning. . . Dinah Shore (Columbia) has a very unusual waxing in "With the Wind and the Rain." Rather exotic and modern, this one is questionable as to hit material. Listen to it several times before you decide its future. . . we rather liked it. . . Square Dance Lessons (Imperial) with instructions by Al McMullen should be appreciated by those who want to learn the simple rudiments in their own home before risking their dignities with experienced hoe-downers. Each of the four unbreakable records has instructions on one side and music with calls to follow those instructions on the reverse. . . Kay Starr and Tennessee Ernie (Capitol): If you can't imagine this combination (and we'll admit it's quite a chore), give a listen to "Ain't Nobody's Business But My Own," ripped out by Kay and Ernie at feverish tempo in that bright sprightly kick that features some fine Western guitar-playing to boot. . . Frank Sinatra (Columbia) returns to his early swinging style for a second chorus of "My Blue Heaven," a little gimmick that sold this platter to us in spite of "Good Night, Irene" or the flip. . . Nappy Lamare (Capitol) dishes out a pair of nice helpings with his Strawhat Seven in "Bag Rag" and "Mocking Bird" as ample proof why Palladiumites like his brand of rhythm for dancing. . . (P.S.: Who is this Yma Sumac? —A.M.)

The novel glass-paneled, multi-compartmented studio is in clover-leaf pattern, accommodates permanent cameras and sets for live commercial announcements, and combines in detailed layout announce booth, sponsor booth and film room. It will instantly associate any studio or remote pickup point with filmed, live, card or slide commercial announcements, and allows constant contact between program directors, technical directors, video operators and sound men. Equipment includes two projectors for slides and films, plus another for cards.

Television Survey

You can quote it to your friends, sound pretty smart and be absolutely accurate, for we got the figures straight from the Electric League of Los Angeles.

June sales on television receivers in the area covered by the Los Angeles signals were 33,207. That brings the total number of receivers extant hereabouts up to 596,673. Just as a matter of comparison, the total number of sets as of June 30, 1949, was only 153,581.

An average of five viewers to each set, including the set owner's family and guests, gives a total of 2,983,365 viewers locally.

Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

The Arch Le Roux Revue

We had heard the name Arch Le Roux drifting out of San Francisco, and knew it had something to do with records, but we weren't prepared for the joy of playing a game old to radio and new to television when we started the Le Roux Revue habit.

Remember war-time Saturday a.m.'s when studio audiences and at-homers gathered round to hear a disc jockey and his panel of guest experts judge records? It was fun whether you were on hand or not.

Le Roux's is the same sort of thing, with the added fillip of watching the guest panel flounder around trying to identify voices on the sound track of three extra records. Viewers feel awfully smart, of course, because they

are tipped by emcee Le Roux as to the identities being guessed.

Television studios now don't permit audiences and their clatter to join such representative panel members as Page Cavanaugh, Jan August, Bill Baldwin and Clark Dennis, to name a few, as Arch parades records old and new. But you can hear and see the arguments, summations and gradings going on, and play your own game among your group.

Le Roux himself has a fresh personality and a crisp way of dealing with the slow ones on the panel that is completely refreshing. Speak up, or let someone who will! And he knows his records backward and forward—jazz, pop or bop.

We are happy with the show, but were we forced to make a suggestion for its betterment—how about cutting down some of the pre-game explanation on how it is done? The viewer finds out anyway, and the more time for music, discussion and Le Roux's own comical, novel delivery, the better!

(An aside to Arch: How about introducing the boom mike to the turntable? We've had our set volume as high as it will go and still are picking up only the treble on the records you play. They are too good for that sort of thing!)

"Hunting and Fishing With Ken Niles"

Saturday, 9:00 p.m.
KECA-TV, Channel 7

Every Saturday night for a half hour announcer and sportsman Ken Niles hold open house at his "lodge," entertains guests from the sports world, shows films of hunting and fishing trips as an entertaining and informative guide on where and how to catch the big ones—and generally imparts to at least the man of the house the feeling that he'd better be up and away next day with rod and reel or sixteen-gauge, in order to be really livin'.

There is little actual description you can give on a show of this sort. The guests are interesting—their stories and pictures entertaining, and certainly all know that Ken, in the light of years of air and stage experience, can hold down an emcee seat on a casual TV show.

We like the show because it deals with things we can all do. Too, there are a couple of gimmicks working there that result in prizes if you do them right and let the show know.

Hoosier Hotshots

The Hoosiers bowed onto television with the most typical of their routines—for our dough, all of it good. Ken, Hezzie, Gil and Gabe were joined by pert Anita Gordon, and all of them benefited from scripts by Larry Hayes, and good direction. There were no lags, fades or loose portions between such songs as "What's the Good Word, Mr. Blue Bird?" a medley of girl songs, a straight solo by Gil and an "old professor" routine by Gabe, Bobby Armstrong (of "Family Theater") and his

seven-piece orchestra backed the Hoosiers to advantage.

It looks as though the familiar signature . . . "Are you ready, Hezzie?" will be around on video for a long time to come, for the boys' comic expressive faces and array of fantastic instruments will set audiences off beyond the wildest reactions of the radio fans.

Movie Matinee

If you have been scared out of watching daytime TV by "Fun in the Sun," get a new grip on yourself and tune to KTTV some week day at 3:30 p.m. Televiewers can enjoy a movie matinee without stirring from the house.

A substantial library of films has been acquired by KTTV especially for "Movie Gems," featuring such stars as Kane Richmond, Buster Crabbe, Bill Boyd ("Hoppy"), Johnny Mack Brown, J. Carrol Naish, Grant Withers, Bela Lugosi, and Elliot Nugent.

"Movie Gems" is part of KTTV's new afternoon programming—and is sandwiched between "Come Into the Kitchen" (a participating half hour featuring super cook Freda Nelson and Ed Reimers—and in our opinion, a show for the birds!) and "Classified Column" (a television market place for those wanting to buy, sell or swap, and a show, in our opinion, for people! It contains plenty of human-interest as well as public-service value), both of which are popular shows.

Movies seem to be an ideal vehicle for advertisers today in TV—so the afternoon venture should pay off. It's easier to take than any of the other daytime TV fare we have seen!

"Hacienda Varieties"

KECA-TV, Channel 7
Friday, 7:30 p.m.

If light Western variety, not followed by a Western motion picture, is your dish, you'll find a varied and pleasant portion in these "Hacienda Varieties."

In the musical department, Dusty Walker and his gee-tar delivery (and anyone who has seen Dusty before or heard his records needs no recommendation!), with an assist in the femme department by Gloria Grey. The duos and the solos both deviate from the sage-and-saddle routine occasionally to hook the pop audiences. The Cass County Boys usually handle the instrumental department. If you caught the show when Andy Parker and the Plainsmen stepped in, you caught a County Boys vacation time.

While the music and continuity are smooth as silk, production doesn't trust listeners to stick by the set-side merely to listen. The show is weekly spiced up with square dances, rope acts, novelty musical acts—just about anything entertaining that is still indigenous to the swing of the West on parade.

"Good Egg"

Some time when you have a fast five minutes to spend finding out

what goes with the rest of the people in this little old world and more especially in your own community, put the treasured time aside until "Good Egg of the Week" hits your video channel.

Participants are what the title implies—"good eggs," a term taken from childhood days when that was the highest gang accolade that could be bestowed. Al Buffington, show packager, serves as host to an outstanding philanthropist, humanitarian, or just plain nice guy whose befriending has won him the title. You might, via video in this brief five minutes, meet the rich-as-Croesus type who turned some of his cash into a string of camps to which kids can go. Or you might meet just plain Joe Blow from down the block, who spends his free evenings building erector sets for a bunch of unfortunate children about whom he knows. Al has scratched up a highly worthwhile, interesting group of good-doers, whose capsule interviews are as interesting as have been their contributions to some branch of humanity.

We thought we had the wrong show, one week. Onto the set tramped a cow. We thought she looked lovely from having been fixed up for video. But no. Bossy was lovely, and was rightly named the "Good Egg of the Week." It seems that this gentle creature had qualified for the title by delivering, during the past year, a frighteningly large number of gallons of milk to the children of America.

"Feature by Feature"

Thursday, 7:30 p.m.
KFI-TV, Channel 9

A young producer-director over at KFI-TV, Allen Buckley, used his wits and the services of some of KFI-TV's favorite personalities to build an entertaining half hour and one of the best of the current live shows seen in the Los Angeles area.

Monty Margetts of "Cook's Corner," Stu Wilson of "Are Ya Lookin'?" and Eddie Coontz and Heidi Olson of the "Eddie Coontz Show" serve as panel members, with Ted Meyers acting as moderator.

The format of the show is the simple contest formula in which the home audience participates and the panel of experts proves its mettle. Viewers are invited to send pictures of familiar objects—people, places, animals and things, etc. Cut-outs giving first one clue, then two, and finally three, are superimposed on a picture, the identity of which the panel members must guess within a limited time. Each one is allowed a limit of five questions per clue, a procedure which is controlled by the use of ordinary poker chips. The time allowed the entire panel on each clue is one minute. All contestants whose pictures are used receive a home appliance, and those whose pictures are not guessed are rewarded with a Longines-Wittnauer wrist watch.

Allen Buckley not only packages and produces "Feature by Feature," he also directs it, so his is the responsibility. He's got a good show going, and one that should hook viewers of several species. Some of us are out

of our minds about games—the show provides a good one. Some of us have TV favorites, and Stu, Monty, Heidi, Eddie and Ted, high on a lot of lists, can keep fans happy whether by a game or just by gab.

This clam-bake is still called "Fun in the Sun." Why, we haven't figured out. Banana Tea Bread

1 3/4 c. sifted flour
2 t. baking powder (double-acting)
1/4 t. soda
1/2 t. salt
3/4 c. shortening
2/3 c. sugar
2 eggs, well beaten
1 c. mashed bananas (about 2 or 3 bananas)

Be sure to use fully ripe or all-yellow bananas. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together. Beat shortening until creamy. Add sugar gradually and continue beating until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat well. Add flour mixture alternately with bananas, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Turn into a well-greased bread pan, and bake at moderate temperature 350 degrees for about one hour and ten minutes.

into a neat, well-integrated package exactly twenty-nine minutes and five seconds in size. Another is the technical one of matching "frames" accurately. "On the first film of the Alan Young show serviced to New York, one frame was somehow lost. A frame is exactly 1/24 of a second. "They told us not to let it happen again. It hasn't." Still another phase of his job is the integration of the program's commercials. In the case of the Alan Young Show, for instance, the program is unsponsored locally and viewers see Alan emerge from the curtains to make carefully timed opening and closing speeches. East of Cincinnati, this time is used for the show's sponsor and it is again Thompson's job to assemble this commercial material and oversee its shooting, printing, editing and servicing.

Distinguished Background

Harlan Thompson's career background adds up to thirty years of experience as a top stage and screen writer, director and producer. A chemical-engineering student at college, he took a summer job on the old Kansas City Post and the lure of printer's ink wedded him to the newspaper world for the four years following his graduation when he worked as feature writer and drama critic for the Kansas City Star.

Two years of military service in World War I as commanding officer of the 167th Aero Squadron overseas followed, and when he returned to New York, he returned to a city-room desk, this time as reporter and feature writer on the New York World. At the same time, his typewriter pounded out saleable one-act plays and vaudeville material, and a full-length musical show titled "Little Jesse James" which went on Broadway in 1923 (starring John Boles and Miriam Hopkins) and ran fifty-two weeks.

For the next five years, he wrote a succession of Broadway musical comedies; in 1928, was Hollywood-bound to pen three silent pictures for Paramount and the same year wrote and co-directed the first all-talkie picture that Fox made, "The Ghost Talks" with Helen Twelvetrees. After that, he made many early talkies and produced and directed "Blessed Event" on Broadway, a hit based on the life of Walter Winchell.

During the next decade, he devoted his talents to pictures, writing, directing or producing more than fifty films at Paramount, RKO, MGM, Columbia and Warners. At Paramount, it was he who made the decision to team those now-famous "Bobbsey Twins," Hope and Crosby. His idea was greeted with the protest: "It sounds impossible—who's gonna play straight?" But Thomp-

son went ahead and put Bob and Bing on that long long "Road" in the pleasing company of Dottie Lamour with the first of the rollicking "Road" pictures, "Road to Singapore."

Other motion pictures that were products of the Thompson talent were "College Holiday" with Jack Benny; "The Big Broadcast" with W. C. Fields; "Champagne Waltz" with Fred MacMurray; "Ruggles of Red Gap" with Charles Laughton, and "The Phantom President" with George M. Cohan, Claudette Colbert and Jimmy Durante.

In 1942, he again went into military service, entering the Army Signal Corps as a captain in charge of training-film production. He made more than 1200 training films at the Astoria, L. I. headquarters and received high commendation from the Army for the effectiveness of his work.

Discharged as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1945, his interest in producing educational films directed him into video's channels of activity and he supervised a television survey for CBS in New York. The next year, he became vice-president and executive producer of the Independent Motion Picture Producers Releasing Organization, where he made some films for TV but "found out that, at that time, it cost more to make them than you got out of them." Last September, he became active in live TV production as producer of CBS-TV's Ed Wynn program.

Thompson lives in Beverly Hills with his wife and two sons, aged eighteen and thirteen. His wife is writer Marian Spitzer, author of two novels, several screen plays and many short stories. She is a former assistant producer at Paramount and once headed the story department for Liberty Films.

Thompson's hobbies include photography, an extensive library of records, tennis, badminton and golf. "And—looking for the man who'll invent a way to record electronic impulses directly. He'll make a lot of money—and he'll make my job a lot easier!"

sampling of his voice and was advised to cut a couple of demonstration records. With this in mind, Jones (his full name is Arthur Ross-Jones) went to the Vancouver radio station to utilize the outlet's recording facilities. Station officials heard him cutting his records, and in less than two weeks he found himself the singing attraction on two big trans-Canada shows. In less than a month, he was featured on a total of four broadcasts.

An agency became interested in his talents and brought him down to Hollywood, where his first professional assignment was the lead in a police benefit show surrounded by the cream of big-name Hollywood talent.

Ross grinned as he talked about this initial Hollywood triumph. "I thought I was off to a really great start."

But then the agency suddenly changed hands and the embryo singer was out on his own. It wasn't easy. Canadians venturing out of their country can take only a limited amount of money and must wait for

their working visas before seeking employment.

Near Misses

Ross has been down in Hollywood now for four years, most of which time has been spent studying, auditioning for shows, and "always just missing." Among the big ones that got away were leads in "A La Carte" and "Allegro."

Engagements he worked included a stint at Larry Potter's Supper Club, where he sang under the name of Steve Damon.

At the same time, to keep eating, he got a job carrying trays at Briggs' (formerly Dolores') Drive-In on the Sunset Strip, where he still works nightly till two a.m. after his evening vocal-chord chores on KNBH's "Cyclone Malone."

The latter assignment came about through his friendship with the program's puppeteer, Bob Kelly, and when the break happened it was another big and *fast* one.

"Bob phoned me one night, told me to go down and audition as the voice of 'Cyclone,'" Jones related.

"The same night I went down and read for the part, I was put on the show. The next night, I was given a second voice to do."

"Cyclone's" fans hear Ross as the voices of "Cyclone" and "Feather" in addition to those of incidental characters from time to time. Ross carries around a four-color pencil and marks the names on his scripts in different color to indicate the changes of voice he is to make. He also makes voice records of "Cyclone" for use on the puppet's personal appearances.

Likes Hollywood

Jones's eventual ambition continues to lie in the direction of musical achievement, but he doesn't limit himself to any one of its restricted fields. "My taste runs from opera to 'Don't Fence Me In,'" he affirmed. He has no desire to return to his more lucrative Canadian career because Hollywood has captured his fancy and because "Canada is somewhat of a lost cause in that respect." An artist there, he explained, can go so far but no farther.

On the other hand, however, he commended Canada's interest in cultural advancement in contrast to our country's "commercialism" approach. Canada's C.B.C. network presented the young singer in recital in addition to his broadcast assignments.

Ross's ambitions still take in the diversified range of popular singing and concert work. Of Hollywood, he grins and insists, "I like it. I think it's a tough town, though. The main

W HERE will the talent come from? How will the demand for acts be met? There are no training grounds! What will be done for "break-in" spots? Where can "they" get the experience and practice necessary to becoming polished performers? How, when and where can show material originate? Will personalities be developed and parlor entertainers ultimately be transformed into professional, acceptable amusement attractions competing for the growing show-wise audiences? There is no vaudeville, no "stock," no "rep!" What ever happened to carnivals, minstrel shows and circuses of which there were once so many affording so much for beginners? More currently, what's happening to night clubs, once flourishing and beckoning beginners? And, at the rate that TV is burning up what exists . . .

These problems were pondered and prophesied upon by the "experts"—including those wishfully thinking about TV in the earlier days of live and learn—in the not so long ago. But now, it appears, TV has furnished its own answers or, more accurately, the amateurs who generated the concern are themselves furnishing the answers. The enigma has been solved in TV opening wide its arm to the "kids" and presenting them frequently in virtually every type of talent showcase, however disguised or embroidered to look like more—or, in some cases, less.

Now we have the spectacle of the tyros, oddly enough, showing the showmen and/or a case of the blind leading the blind. The plethora of

"Neophyte Nifties of 1950" being nightly transmitted from the TV stations of Southern California is testament to this. The unknowns are making themselves known, and among their biggest boosters and helpers is Nils Thor Granlund, "Granny" to Coast viewers and the reputed granddaddy of all "airborne" amateurs. In fact, today's tyro TV events are a monument to him. N.T.G., visionary and originator of the tyro theme on radio, alone was unconcerned about TV's talent future. He knew he could duplicate previous successes—and has! He's proving it nightly on Channel Two with his late night "Backstage With N.T.G." and "Hollywood Road to Fame" shows. He was prepared.

The man—or virtual legend—N.T.G. is affectionately known as "Granny" to viewers and otherwise familiarly to the show world as "Mr Show Business." It was he who first

brought the amateur show to the air- lanes. The time was 1922; the place was Brooklyn, N. Y. (of all places!); the station was Loew's WHN. Then that station, with only 500 watts, was heard over a possible radius of twenty miles. theater, night clubs, vaudeville, ex- travaganzas and musicals. With hardly a change in his original format—but aided by his broad back- ground—"Granny" is at it again in TV—and successfully—with his twin basics of talent and beauty.

On KTSL, Monday through Thurs- day, he offers four pre-selected am- bitious youngsters who compete for top honors on the informal "Back- stage With N.T.G." program (10:00 to 11:00 p.m.). Then on Friday night, from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m., he presents the individual winners from each of the preceding four shows, and heightens the competition by adding eight skilled newcomers who have won other outside contests to his "Hollywood Road to Fame" finals show. 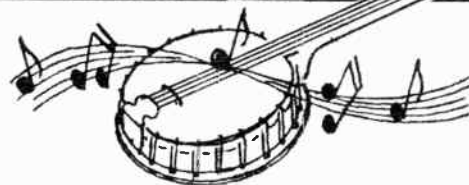
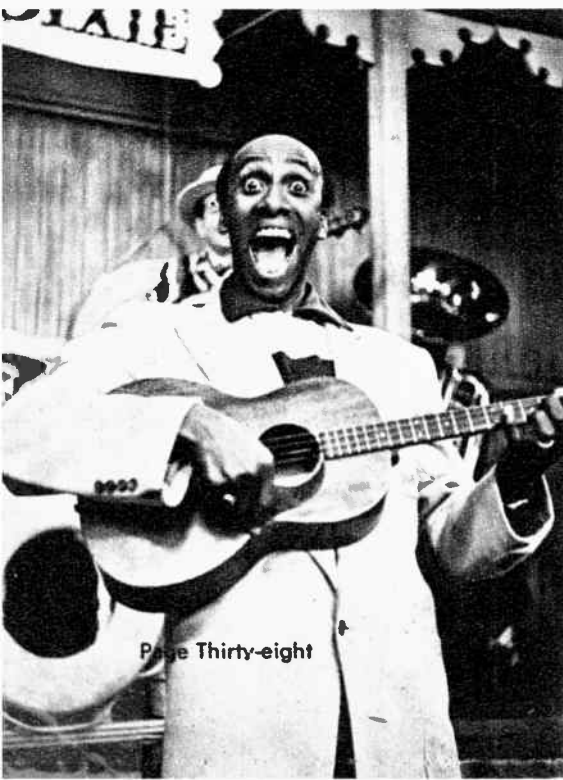

YES, IT'S true what they say about Dixie being the Mecca of jazz exponents, where the land pulsates to the rhythm of two-beat, and where the artistry of music is unequalled.

In the Southland the thrill of seeing a "Dixie Showboat" sail down the river cannot be described in simple words . . . the people, to whom music is as much a part of living as eating or breathing, express their joy by tapping feet, clapping hands and rocking with the melody.

Viewers will feel the same way while watching KTLA's "Dixie Showboat," for here is a program that captures the unequalled artistry of Negro entertainers and features the pure rhythms of the great Nappy Lamare and his "Strawhat Strutters."

Landsberg Created

Personally produced and directed by Klaus Landsberg, West Coast director of Paramount Television, the thirty-minute musical was conceived by Landsberg with the idea of giving

set-siders the privilege of watching Negro music-makers whose talents are unrivaled in true Dixie fashion.

The premiere telecast, patterned from minstrel acts, and completely contradictory to Landsberg's wishes, unfortunately was reminiscent of the slave era when prejudiced lines were drawn between races. Possible thought that the program might ridicule the colored race was enough for Landsberg to pull the show off the channel after the first screening and painstakingly renew the format. Commendably, the present show is now received with equal appeal.

Talented Cast

As the "Captain," affable Dick Lane brings to the "Showboat" many years of show business as a song-and-dance man. He and talented wife Esther appeared in Texas Guinan's company and after sixty-one weeks in George White's "Scandals" came to Hollywood in 1937 to concentrate on motion-picture roles. (Recent credits include "The Big Wheel" and "Everybody's Dancin'.")

thing you got to do is keep earning money—somehow."

With his double working schedule, he declares he's had to give up his favorite hobby of delving into pre-Columbian, early American history. most pressing national problems from a good cross-section of the American people. You see, I never introduce myself to them and they do not know that their comments are being mentally indexed by me. I never take notes—it would be a dead giveaway."

Edwards is from Illinois, attended UCLA. He is extremely popular in his home Midwest territory for his lecture tours, illustrated with news-reel-type films he has shot on his extensive travels. He started his career as a special-events broadcaster, but his unceasing efforts to dig for "the story behind the story" switched him to straight news and finally to commentary and analysis. He has followed the news in such faraway places as Borneo, Alaska, Sumatra, Australia, South Africa, Norway and South America. His hobby, photography, has come in handy to record first-hand accounts.

At present, the news analyst is on the first leg of a projected 40,000-mile, five-month fact-finding tour of the U. S. in which he is seeking un-
