**B**ARTON YARBOROUGH, TV-Radio Life's Distinguished Achievement Award winner for the year 1950's most outstanding supporting actor in radio, has played the gamut of the theater from the "Tab" shows of 1910 to Eva LeGallienne's Civic Repertoire theater in New York. Bart's varied experience in the theatrical world has had one salient point. He has played the role of Clifford Barbour in "One Man's Family" for nineteen years. We wondered if Bart might sometimes become "Cliff" in real life. But our speculation came to an abrupt halt when "Cliff" (we mean Barton) assured us that he only became more critical of his portrayal with the passing of time. Critical of perfection?

#### Start in Radio

It all started when Bart was in his teens and had a hankering for show business. He ran away and joined a carnival and has been weathering the ups and downs of his profession ever since. He made his radio debut in 1930 when he ac-

cepted an offer to appear on NBC in San Francisco. He was between stage shows at the time and fully expected to do no more than fill in a few weeks with microphone appearances. Instead, his radio work kept him so busy and he became so intrigued with the new field that he decided to remain with it. Texas-born Bart often boasted of his nineteen accents in the early days of radio and made good his claims by constantly being mike-side.

His list of credits is staggering. Current activities are confined to the soft-spoken Sergeant Ben Romero in the popular "Dragnet" series; the lovable thirty-nine-year-old freshman, "Calhoun Gaddy," of "Halls of Ivy," whose homespun humor and earnestness have won the admiration of faculty and students alike. Bart also portrays "Sleepy Stevens" in the "Hashknife Hartley" series of W. W. Tuttle's famed Western stories, and of course he continues in his role of "Clifford Barbour."

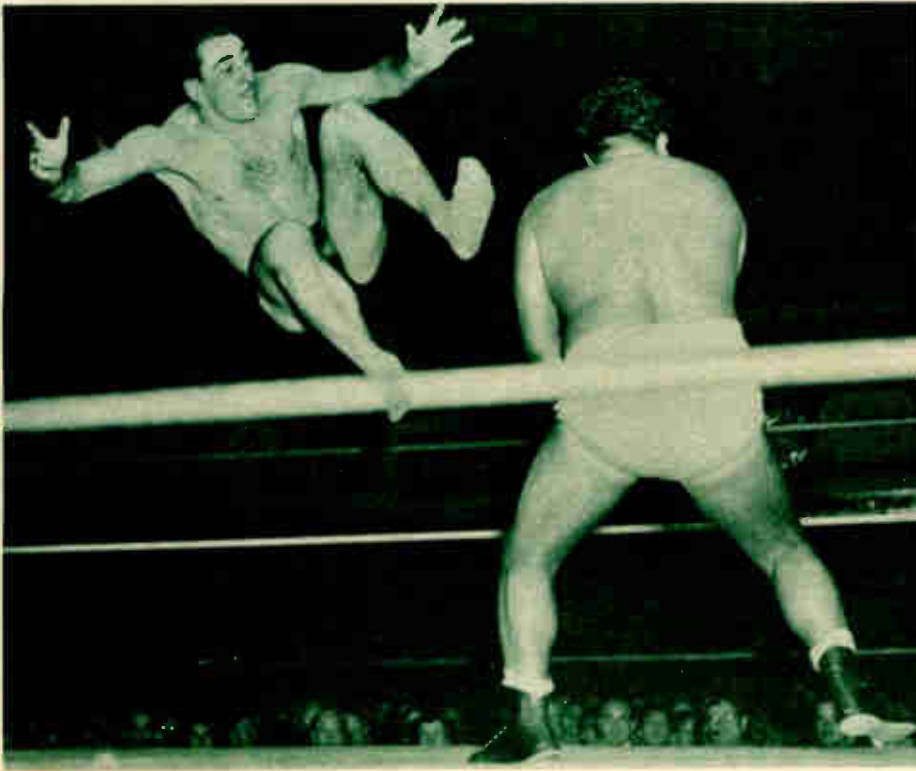


# One Man... In "One Man's Family"

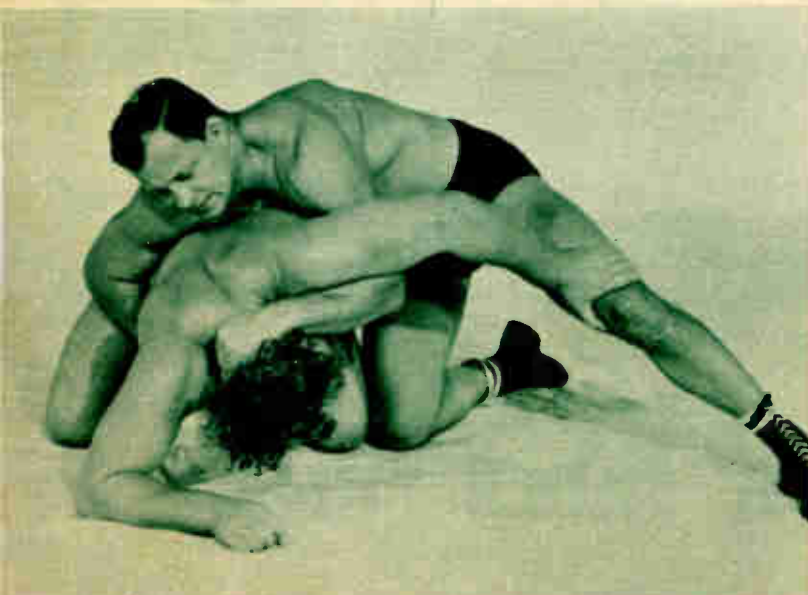

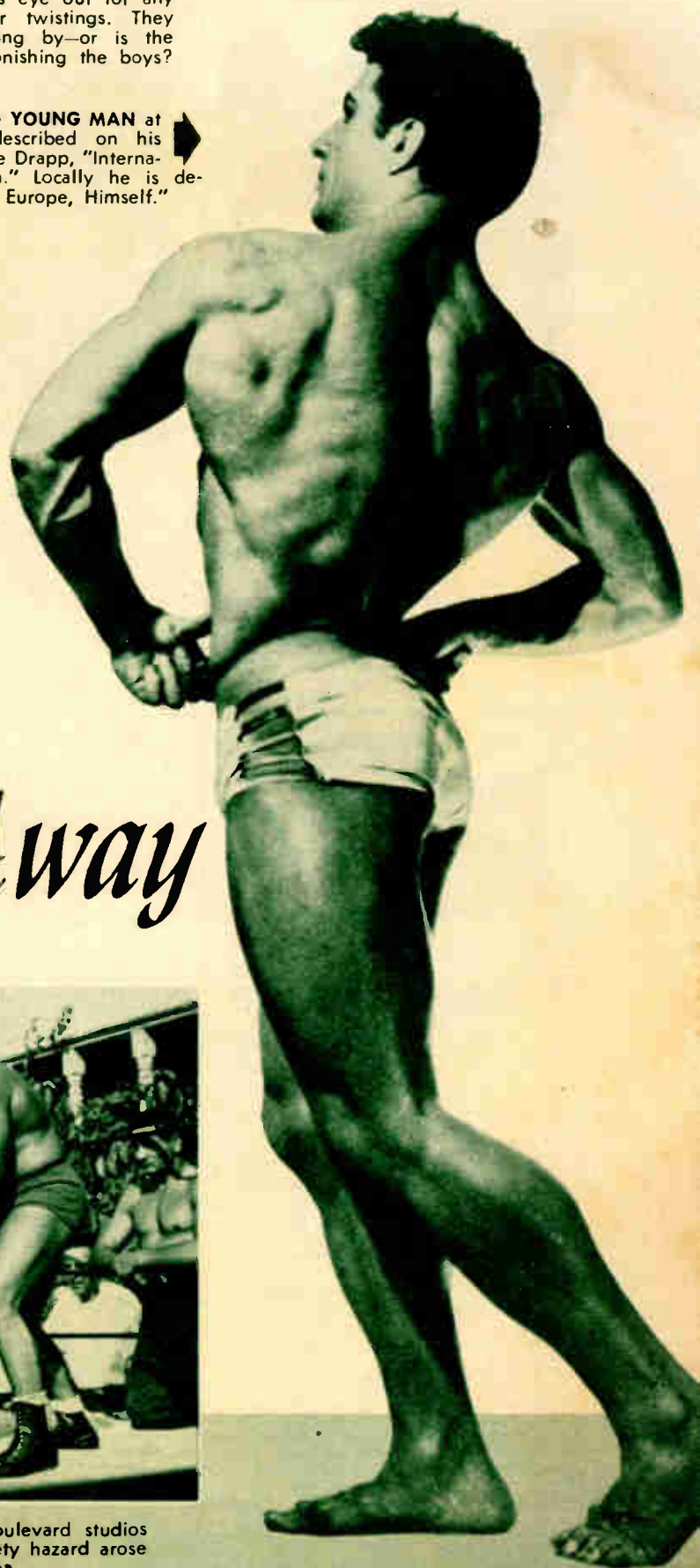

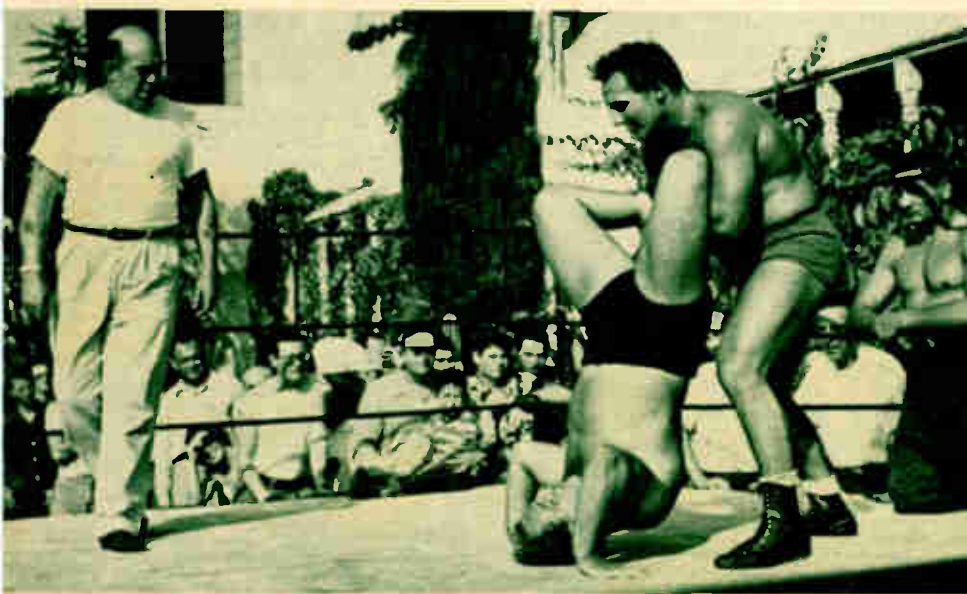

# What's Hollywood To an Englishman?

*Microphone Mimicry That Allows Him to Play General MacArthur*

**N**EXT TIME you hear an English dialogue emanating from your radio, chances are that Britisher Ben Wright may be at the mike in some Hollywood radio studio. This is the Ben Wright who, after forsaking his dear England, played "Sherlock Holmes" last year for American radio audiences.

In one way, Ben Wright is like that famous gentleman of "The Man Who Came to Dinner," except he came for a vacation in 1946 and decided to stay on indefinitely. And he has gotten on very well, now having more than fifty radio credits, plus a number of both movie and television shows on his record. Strangely enough, Hollywood is not all glamour to this Englishman. He has found it a serious town, where show people are seriously at work. A place where he has been treated more kindly by actors than he has in any other place. Actors in Hollywood, Wright claims, "have given me the breaks, ever since I started as a Limey to break into American show business... they have told directors and

producers about me, and this has led to good radio spots."

Speaking of acting brings up the dual personality role which Ben Wright plays both on and off stage. He carries around a dual nationality... American and British... wherever he goes. This was laid on his shoulders during his infancy, when his father, who was an American citizen, registered his birth and subsequent reaffirmation at the American Embassy in London, when Ben became twenty-one years of age. And of course, having been born in England and having resided there most of his life, he is also a British subject. This arrangement puts him in the uncomfortable position of being subject to call by both the U.S. and British Armies, depending on which country he is living in at the time of the call to duty.

Before coming to the West Coast, Wright played roles in front of the TV cameras when video was in its early stages in England. In those days, he said, "You couldn't move in or out of focus more than three or

# This Week in TV

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Looks Like

There will be at least twenty-six new features and forty-eight new serial episodes to be seen in the future on **KNBH**. The station is working out a deal with Republic. Only hitch is a five per cent that goes to AFM. Petrillo wants a second five per cent, on top of the regular fee incorporated in the sale price, if the sale of the picture for sponsorship exceeds the purchase price. That is being "worked out." In any event, we won't have seen the pix eight or nine times before. . . . When **RCA** last week unveiled its new, vastly improved color TV system in New York, the colorcast was picked up on hundreds of thousands of black-and-white receiver sets, without the addition of extra equipment. The show, picked up in black-and-white, possessed an even greater fidelity than two-tone broadcasts, according to the mail received. The color show received is said to have exhibited exemplary tone reproduction and no flickering, and **RCA** is expected to approach the **FCC** for another review within a few months. . . . **Hawthorne's** midnight air show, **KNX**, is to be given the kinescope treatment. Program heads think the show good enough to be translated, verbatim, to TV. . . . **"Lolly" Parsons**, too, comes in for a kinnie-ing soon. Her film series, when and if, will be all about Hollywood, naturally. . . . **Los Angeles** moved up to second in the TV-set-ownership sweepstakes. New York is first, but with the installation of 933,000 receivers, we are firmly in second place. . . . **NBC's** research department places national ownership, as of June 1, at 12,769,300, as opposed to a year ago, when only 6,214,100 were in business.

**John Guedel Productions** (which does the excellent **Groucho Marx** TV show) is to film the **Art Linkletter** TV show for the forthcoming season. The sixteen films will be shot on thirty-five-millimeter at a cost of \$11,000 each, and an added feature to the old show will be a six-voice chorus under the direction of **Muzzy Marcellino**. . . . The man who is the living image of what most of his fellow Brooklyn Dodger fans think a baseball umpire looks like, **Phil Silvers**, will occupy the emcee chair vacated by **Bert Parks** while that congenial Southern gentleman takes a summer hiatus, starting July 25, from the TV show (**ABC-TV's** "Stop the Music") which made the words "Mystery Melody" a household phrase. . . . "Scatman" **Crothers** is back entertaining **KTLA's** "Dixie



Showboat" viewers each Monday. "Scalman" just completed a triumphant public-appearance tour of the East.

... Latest hand-clasp between TV and Hollywood took place at last week's annual meeting of the Society of Independent Motion Picture Producers where the thirty-man group, including some of the biggest names in the industry, gave its president, Ellis Arnall, former governor of Georgia, a unanimous go-ahead on petitioning the FCC to license all video subscription systems. This gives Phonevision, Telemeter, and the as yet untested Skiatron a portion of film-land's sanction. Perhaps we'll soon be dialing operator for the latest films while the show house around the corner does a slow fade? At long last, the motion picture industry has evidently seen that the video light can't be hidden beneath their celluloid bushel. Phonevision's undeniable success in the recent Chicago tests may have opened film-land's "eyes," and Telemeter's theater screenings of the Louis-Savold and La Motta-Murphy fights apparently caused the cinematics to take off their dark glasses and come into the picture.

*New Faces*

That's twelve-year-old Jimmy Boyd who is now seen regularly playing guitar on the Al Jarvis KLAC-TV show, Monday through Friday. . . . And it is Jeff Donnell who is now seen at 7:45 of a Tuesday p.m. on KNBH, rather than Don Budge. The new show is called "Feature Story," and turns out to be interesting as can be. . . . Still too new to be seen is the face of Gary Cooper, who is going on with plans to make TV films starring himself. . . . Dennis Day has both TV and radio shows of his own being set for fall.

*"Camera No. 6"*

KFI-TV's mysterious "Camera No. 6" continues to astound TV viewers.

The new technique, capable of bringing a live actor smack into the middle of a motion picture, is being used every Wednesday night on Channel 9's 8:00 o'clock "Frigidaire Theater."

So many viewers have written to KFI-TV asking how it is possible for a person in the TV studio to enter into a movie and actually mix right with the film actors and move about the movie set, that Wayne Johnson, Channel 9 engineer and inventor of the system, has been working overtime answering his "fan" mail.

"'Camera No. 6' does not involve any optical illusion," said Johnson. "What television viewers actually see on their sets is all done electronically.

"The live actor in the television studio is not in front of a specially built scenic background, but does all of his movements in front of a plain backdrop. His actions are then electronically added to the camera that is picking up the motion picture in such a way that no super-imposition results. The actor actually becomes a part of the movie scene.

"The uses for 'Camera No. 6' are un-

limited, and we are constantly working on additional ideas that will not only be novel but will possibly play an important part in the future development of television as a more entertaining medium," Johnson said.

Bill Rapp, producer-director for the Channel 9 station, works out the live action details to be used with the film during the Wednesday night showing and Paul Knight, also of the KFI-TV production staff, handles the part of the actor who gets into the films.

### Old Game—New Medium

An enterprising group of gentlemen have formed a film production company appropriately titled "Taurus Productions." "Taurus," as you know, refers to the Zodiac sign of the Bull. The Production company films the Tijuana, Mexico, bull fights for United States television consumption, as was mentioned several weeks ago when the rumor of the new enterprise came our way. At the time of this mention, our enthusiasm was nil. A little further information on the projected TV series changed the picture, however.

The best parts of this skill-requiring sport, which is currently drawing the Hollywoodians below the border each Sunday, are retained on the film. The fights are caught on four Mitchell cameras bearing telephoto lenses, for the obvious reason that no cameraman in his right mind is going to prance into an arena with a whole gang of beef bred and trained to fight. Nor is the arena about to relinquish to each of four cameramen the space of five or six seats at eight-fifty a crack. That's what those ringside chairs go for on bull-fight day.

The best of the fights are kept for the televiewer. The caperings that fill time while the bull plans his particular strategy are left on the cutting-room floor at editing time.

You put out no money, you watch from your own living room—and if in a tizzy of righteousness you forget that you probably had steak for dinner and decide not to watch at all—you're out nothing. This series should go on TV better than hotcakes.

### Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

#### "Racket Squad"

CBS-TV, KTSL, Channel 2  
Thursday, 9:30 p.m.

This fine version of cops and robbers is produced on the Hal Roach, Jr., lot, with Ben Kline, whose hand and camera film the "Fireside Theater" series, making the shots. The stories abound with familiar faces, always interesting to see, and Philip Morris thinks the half hours are good enough to replace Ralph Edwards for the summer.

Judging from the few "Squad" chapters we have so far seen, these recommendations are the strongest we can honestly make.

The thirty-minute weekly series presents "Captain John Braddock," as played by Reed Hadley, nabbing con men just at the point of no return.

Their victims have been neatly duped and the plots of the bad-doers neatly consummated.

We're all for that—make no mistake. Nabbing the crooks who do innocent oldsters out of their life savings, poking revealing holes in the pernicious punchboard racket or breaking up the false-arrest gags are commendable bits of business. But why the dupes of the story situations invariably wait until they have been thoroughly hood-winked before calling in the "Racket Squad" always leaves us wondering. We have begun to suspect that the scripts, while well executed, aren't as free from holes as they might be.

Oh, well, if the plots get too cagey, no one will understand them at all, the series will prove unpopular, and we won't get to see them next fall. Subsequent showings are contingent upon the success of the summer run.

The acting, incidentally, is among the best we have seen on television on the part of every stanza's participants, in big roles or small.

motion-picture screen, and the man who was not only first to bring the race to television, but who has made the appearance of his Indian friends a looked-for feature on Southern California television, is setting a record. In the second year of combining live shows with feature-length motion pictures, Tim McCoy has seen to it that his weekly entertainment gets better and better. He is also instigator of a new fad—Indian sign language.

Each week members of the Indian race appear with McCoy.

While the demonstrations of Indian lore include such things as clothes, bead work, dances and other ceremonies, the sign-language lessons are a weekly feature. These McCoy himself teaches. And any viewer can be certain that the cowboy Colonel didn't himself learn them just before the cameras were turned on him.

Before World War I, Tim McCoy was a young Wyoming ranch owner and range rider. It was here he first learned Indian sign language. The Indians couldn't speak English, and young Tim found it facilitated his work of finding lost herds and getting correct directions if he could speak their way. Today, McCoy is the world's greatest expert on sign language, and is known far and wide as the only white man ever to master the difficult signs.

And can you think of a better language to pick up via television than the one spoken by the first settlers of our own country?

## "Faye Emerson's Wonderful Town"

Saturday, 9:00 p.m. KTSL, Channel 2

Take Faye Emerson, who has bounce, add Benny Goodman, Teddy Wilson, Cornelia Otis Skinner, Dave Garroway and Kay Armen, and you have sparkle. Faye and her aggregation of guests saluted Chicago on her initial CBS-TV ainer. Next week, Philadelphia, and so on around our fair country. What the program lacked in geographic and municipal history it made up in abundant entertainment.

Faye introduces her guests, who are individually backgrounded by appropriate sets. She doesn't linger as she did in her interview-format telecasts, but graciously withdraws, permitting the spotlight to fall where it may. Monologist Skinner and jazz musicians Goodman and Wilson were especially delightful. Miss Skinner's versions of the pioneer woman who crossed the plains to Chicago hit a high note. As a contemporary Chicagoan there were words of praise for the heroic ancestor, but as the ancestor, in retrospect timid, unheroic behavior was mirrored. Garroway was Garroway. In his usual collegiate manner, he grinningly confessed that this show about Chicago was televised in New York.

Producer Gil Fates and director John Donohue have integrated a smooth half-hour of entertainment built around energetic, captivating la Emer-son. Skitch Henderson and orchestra

adequately supply the background music, helping to keep the show rolling at a merry pace.

**Second Glances** ( *Critical Comment* )

*We Point With Pride*

... To Bill Stulla's infinite patience without condescension as he makes a "Happy Birthday" for the small fry who daily visit his KNBH afternoon doings. Not all of the little guests speak too clearly, but Bill's translations never make the speaker ridiculous, as some of our more self-conscious emcees do.

... To the effects obtained on the "Garroway at Large" Sunday-nighter, also on KNBH. Imagination and good camera work are the chief components of this excellence. Also, to our way of thinking, Garroway is the only living individual on television who has ever presented Louis Armstrong in a fashion and setting that befit the King of the Trumpet.

... To Jackie Gleason in his KTTV "Cavalcade of Stars" emcee role. Gleason's singing, appearance, manner, timing and patter—all things that should be, and are not always, developed to near-perfection in any TV personality—are superior to most of his contemporaries, and we can't for the life of us understand why he hasn't been headlined on more of the highly touted extravaganzas that seem to mark television these days.

... To the manner in which Peter Potter treats his Friday-night-on-KTSL guests. He remembers they are guests, gives them the floor and courtesy, and doesn't fill the air with his own opinions, which, after all, are pretty authoritative. With Potter at the helm there is no loud, vituperative arguing and talk from two or three participants at the same time to annoy watchers who can't get into the act.

*"The Adventures of Ellery Queen"*

Saturday, 9:00 p.m., KTTV, Channel 11

Lee Bowman stars as "Queen" in this new TV mystery-cracking series.

To date the "Adventures of Ellery Queen" have found him embroiled in a Chinatown garotting and in a zoo tragedy in which poisonous snakes, murderous tigers and a diabolical human killer showed to great advantage. The Norman and Irving Pincus productions are loaded with competent casts; the teleplays happily defy the wearisome norm by having the last person you could possibly imagine wind up in "Queen's" clutches as the apprehended criminal, and the settings are elaborate and fascinating.

"Ellery Queen" and his dangerous exploits have proven immensely popular in print, and should hook every TV viewer who likes it hard to figure out. Lee Bowman has worked in pictures for years, turning in fine performances. Maybe once he gets used

## "Hollywood Theater Time"

The thirty minutes open on the Channel 7 line at this time carries new ideas in TV fare. Comedy, tragedy, and whatever lies between are brought in a package and presented to see how the idea would shape up as regular fare.

A week or so ago we watched one of these always good presentations with unusual interest. Robert Fenkel, ABC-TV director, presented the package of the evening, "Joe's Place," written by John Vlahos, produced by Leo Lefcourt, and directed by the packager.

The story line followed a coffee-and-sinker counterman's narrative about a returned, blinded Korean veteran and his noble resolution to avoid hampering the love of his life by avoiding her! A good, solid story with a wallop that just missed the boat because of what seemed to us the writer's apparent preoccupation with Clifford Odets. Had the returnee addressed the counterman as "Joe" at the beginning or end of one more of his sentences, it would have been ludicrous. As it was, all sympathy was pushed aside by a furious impatience. On a second run this overdoing would have gone the way of all good direction, and we are sorry the show was a one-shot.

All to the good were the superb camera work, direction, acting and the sets. Both interiors and exteriors were the finest we have seen on a local show. Snow "danced" outside (there we go!), and each time the door opened so the principal could address "Joe" as "Joe," actual gusts of winter seemed to hustle into the warmth of the small cafe.

Had it not been for the irksome trifle of dialogue portions trying for the stark and emerging tiresome, this show would have been, to us, one of the finest offerings of "Hollywood Theater Time."

Rosemary Clooney has a zinger in the calypso-flavored "Come On-A My House" (Columbia), with its melody adapted from an Armenian folk song; could be the gal's best to date. . . . **Modernaires** (Coral), after many assists with other artists, finally hit the bell with their own "Whoo-ee Loo-eee-siana," a rhythm tune that bounces right along with this fine vocal group giving just the necessary swing to make it a goodie. . . . **Jack Owens** (Decca) has first chance on a tune called "Crossroads" that might click, since material is the type Jack does so well—melodic, moderate tempo, simple arrangement, plus warmth of style is all this lad needs and "Crossroads" has 'em all. . . . **Johnny Desmond** and **Monica Lewis** (MGM) have a cute pair of novelties in "I'm Glad I Gave It Up for You" and "Out of Breath." Working well as a team, you'll probably hear more from this duo in the future. . . . **Camarata** (Decca Gold Label LP) has long been a fine interpreter of Gershwin, but one of the finest performances of "American in Paris" and "Rhapsody in Blue" in their entirety is this waxing that features English-born **Arthur Sandford** as piano soloist with the Kingsway Symphony of London—it's forty-five minutes of sterling Gershwin! . . . **Bing Crosby** (Decca) has a quartet of sides with various assists that are good and fair—the goodies being "Black Ball Ferry Line" (with the Andrews Sisters) and "I've Got to Fall in Love Again" (with Dave Barbour's Orchestra). "Yodeling Ghost" and "Shanghai" on the flips could be taken or left with no regrets. . . . **Toni Arden's** "Invitation to a Broken Heart" (Columbia) is another fine group of grooves in torchy style, given the individual touch by this little gal. Forget about the reverse "If You Turn Me Down," for tunes in novelty vein just ain't for our Toni. . . . **Carmen Cavallaro** (Decca) gives you plenty piano on "Every Little Movement" and the maestro's own "Wanda," both with the rhythm touch strictly for dancing. . . . **Voices of Walter Schumann** (Capitol) have a top choral version of "For All We Know," with quiet arrangement, so typical of the Schumann style—it's beautiful music without blasting for showiness. . . . (P.S. . . . Watch for Frankie Laine's next Columbia release, another from the same session that produced "Jezebel." The wax is so hush-hush that six vice-presidents guard it. . . . A.M.)

## TV-RADIO

## Lifelines

**SELDOM HAVE WE AT TV-RADIO LIFE** encountered fans as avid as those of **Korla Pandit**. Reason I say seldom is that from observation I know Nelson Eddy and Gene Autry have admirers almost equally as enthusiastic as the turbaned organist's. Months after we run a story on Eddy or Autry, requests for copies of the magazine dribble in from all over the United States.

**SOME OF PANDIT'S FANS** HAVE done more than call or write TV-RL since the musician's sudden departure from Channel 5 . . . they have called in person at this office. I am sure you can understand why we cannot give a detailed account of all the charges and counter-charges, for space forbids. But since quite a few readers have asked for additional information, here is a little.

**KORLA CLAIMS HE WAS UNHAPPY** because he had fruitlessly tried to negotiate for "better production and dramatic effects." He told TV-RL he felt he was being paid inadequately, instead of on a "personality basis," that his popularity is proof of his personality appeal and his remuneration should be the same. He felt his technical assistance was inadequate. He also played the "Beany" show, but, according to Korla, he was "forced personally to appeal to the musicians' union for increased pay after the program went T.C." He plans a vacation before starting on a new TV deal as he has "not had a vacation in over two years."

**ONE STORY GOING AROUND** WAS that Korla had to supply his own instrument at the studio and that when he saw fit to move it to his home, the station fussed about a replacement. KTLA, however, points out that Pandit insisted on using his own instrument and even accommodated by moving it around for him when he made personal appearances. No fuss was involved, says KTLA, in getting a studio organ when Pandit removed his. Apparently KTLA tried its best to select a good time spot for Korla, for he was successively scheduled every night of the week without pulling much rating, then was slotted into the Sunday time and improved, rating-wise, to about a 5. His pay, around \$300 a week, was considered adequate for a sustaining show plus "Beany," which he did with practically no rehearsal.

The station refutes Pandit's claim about no vacation, no publicity, and not being willing to give him added production, and has a few points of its own to make about his being consistently late for rehearsals, if any, and outside interference. Now you can see what I mean when I said I didn't want to go into the subject. There seems to be an accumulation of big and little grievances, and to plunge into a "he said" and "they said" is murder, space-wise. Why don't all you Pandit fans relax and watch TV-Radio Life for any news of his TV return?

**POSIES TO JEFF CHANDLER AND Mer-say-dees McCambridge** (I remember when she was "just" a good sup-

porting radio actress called Mercedes) for their fine performance on "Screen Directors' Playhouse" . . . Hurrah! A great spot has been found for one of my favorite shows, "Piano Playhouse," right after "Lolly" signs off Sundays, KECA, 6:15. Such delectable listening kept me tuned to KECA, where I was able, piano tinkles still in my ears, to withstand **Paul Harvey's** ominous commentary ("high taxes are crushing incentive . . . hold onto your pants, taxpayers, the tax collector has already got your shirt") . . . **Bill Tusher** puts out a good meaty show on Sunday nights. Only thing that marred it last week was a difference in voice levels when he came in with his transcribed ad-lib interview portion. . . . Hear that **Herb Rawlinson** will be missing as host from "Hollywood Star Playhouse" when it switches to ABC, and that, to my way of thinking, is a stupid shame. Let's have some letters, you fans, asking to have this swell thespian kept on.

**I GUESS CBS IS TOO BUSY FRYING** big fish to pay any attention to a fifteen-year-old amateur chirper, but I'd suggest the powers-that-should-be give a listen to **Georgianne Garner**, ten times a winner on **Jay Stewart's** "It's Fun to Be Young." The hint is:

**IF YOU HAVE A BARBECUE AND FIREPLACE OUTSIDE, YOU'LL LIKE THIS HINT.** You probably like to keep the wood handy to the fireplace but you have found that on damp nights the wood tends to stay wet when it's on the floor of your patio. If you re-build one side of the barbecue and set in cement three iron prongs about six inches from the floor, the weight of the wall of barbecue, plus sturdy prongs and good cement, makes this an ideal way to keep the woodpile dry. Prongs may be secured at any machine shop.

**HERE'S AN IDEA FOR OLD COOKIE JARS WITHOUT LIDS.** Turn them into planters. They can be placed in the kitchen or breakfast room and look most attractive. The same idea is good for odd creamers or sugar bowls.

**A TEMPORARY BED TRAY CAN BE MADE FROM A CARDBOARD BOX.** Fold the flaps inside and staple. Cut each side so as to fit across the patient (make a half circle).

**THIS IS A TIMESAVER FOR MOTHERS.** When you iron your little girl's dresses, select matching socks, hair ribbon, etc., and pin them together with a large safety pin and hang on the hook of the hanger. Then place them in the clothes closet. When the dress is selected for the day everything else is ready too. No scrambling through drawers or closets.

**WHEN WRITING WITH INK AND YOU MAKE A MISTAKE,** instead of using an eraser (which just makes your paper messy) try this. Wrap cotton around a match or toothpick, dip it into a bottle of Clorox or white bleach, and rub the word or words gently. You'll find they completely disappear.

Radio Newsmen

Ned Calmer, CBS Rome correspondent, flew to Iran on special assignment to cover for airing the daily developments in this tension spot. He reported that "Events in Iran are moving toward a final showdown, and within a very short time it will be too late for either side in the oil dispute to change its mind and make a concession." Calmer is not making predictions as he, too, wonders whether the Iran government will stand or fall . . . and he wonders if the change in oil ownership would lead to fresh negotiations or Communist chaos, or possibly even the calling in of Communist Russian technicians to run the refineries. He did say in one broadcast: "So far, it looks as though the only winner in this perilous game of international poker is Russia."

CBS is keeping open circuits to Japan to cover all eventualities in connection with the Korean cease-fire negotiations. They are ready for any special developments important enough to be bulletined by cutting in on radio or television programs. CBS Tokyo Chief George Herman cut his vacation short to fly to Tokyo from Idlewild Airport, New York. Besides Herman, other CBS correspondents in the Tokyo-Korea area are John J. Jefferson, Robert Pierpoint and Robert P. (Pepper) Martin.

"Kings Row" Sagas

With the resurgence of popularity of "Kings Row," a noteworthy addition to CBS radio serials, Katherine Bellamann, whose late husband, Henry, authored the original story, and who herself penned the "Dr. Parris Mitchell of Kings Row" sequel, is currently preparing another volume on the famed literary figures which will give CBS enough story line for at least another ten years of broadcasting.

Producers are also eyeing the series for a possible fall telecasting which should also keep Mrs. Bellamann busy.

Winchell's Substitutes

A host of celebrities will take over on ABC's Sunday night Walter Winchell spot during the newsman's vacation . . . Tony Martin, July 22; Robert Alda and Isabel Bigley of "Guys and Dolls" fame, July 29; Jimmy Durante, August 5; Martha Raye, August 12; Patti Page, August 19; Bob Hope, August 26; and Frankie Laine, September 2, with each pinchhitter closing the broadcast with a two-minute news summary.

Radio Is Not Down or Out

Radio men who are standing pat on radio's possibilities and its future have listed the reasons, most recent ones that is, to show that the elder airwaves medium is still very much alive. First is the fact that the U. S. Army and Air Force is taking time on all the webs . . . the TV onslaught has resulted in only a two per cent decline in 1951 network billings . . . big sponsors like Procter & Gamble, although having cancelled some airshows, still carry twenty-one hours and twenty-one minutes of radio, and Lever Bros. continues its five hours of radio time . . . and there were 14,500,000 radio sets sold last year as compared with 6,500,000 television sets sold . . . also Kingan Foods, never before on the air, has backed "Arthur Godfrey's Digest" . . . "Dr. Pepper" has been signed for the mike after a four-year absence . . . and "Lux" has been renewed for its seventeenth consecutive year . . . plus naming other big-time sponsors who have not turned their backs on radio.

News without nonsense is good radio fare about 10 o'clock every night, no matter who the radio voices may be. When the announcers are Dick Joy, Tom Harmon and Carroll Alcott it is just that much better listening.

Dick Joy takes the spot news stories on the nightly release and covers them pointedly, at the same time covering as many news sources as possible. It is nothing for him to touch the nation's leading stories on defense, economy, and the political picture in Washington, besides going into some detail on the events in Iran, Korea and any other world tension spots. His approach to the news is straight, uncolored and uncluttered. He seems to be very much aware that the listener wants to understand what is said on a newscast, as well as wanting the presentation to be stimulating.

Tom Harmon, the Michigan football hero of some great fame, has no trouble highlighting the sports news. As one would expect, he speaks about all the sporting events as if he were there and certainly as if he knew what he was talking about. His rapid-fire coverage of everything from sailing to tennis is easy to listen to and gives one a complete picture without dwelling over-long on any one sport.

Carroll Alcott goes behind the headlines to analyze the news. Facts, figures and predictions often back up his news analysis. He aims to give the listener an informative picture of what is happening and why, and does not merely depend on opinions he has latched onto to give authority to his news interpretations.

These three newsmen are experienced in their fields and demonstrate very nicely what men in their profession can give to set-siders who only have to twist the dial to KNX at 10 o'clock.

"Escape"

Wednesday, 6:00 p.m.  
CBS-KNX

"Escape," CBS's out-of-this-world adventure series, returns to the air with definite promise of becoming a bright spot in our summertime listening lethargy. Opening show, "The Island," by Millard Kaufman, while not quite up to the exciting "Escapes" we remembered in seasons past, was far and away above other current drama fare.

An absorbing adventure of two Marines on Okinawa during World War II, "The Island" was set in a realistic era which perhaps contributed to the incredulity we felt about its main theme. "Corporal Robert Lacy," cleverly characterized by Harry Bartell, was the leading character whose recurrent dream of an exotic, unknown island and its beautiful inhabitants materialized during a lull in battles, when he and his sidekick found themselves behind Japanese lines. They were approached by natives who, instead of proving to be Japanese enemies, were people from "Lacy's" personal "Bali Hai." The pair were wafted via canoe to a strange and lovely coral isle which proved to be the reincarnation of "Lacy's" dream, with one exception: the island's beautiful people were lepers.

While the script did deliver a punch ending, the escapism it projected might have been more effective if the war aspect had not been so prevalent in such an incongruous way, for the head of the leper colony revealed that the Japanese had taken as prisoners some of the loveliest women lepers and were planning to leave them on nearby Okinawa as a departing "death trap" for conquering American forces.

Producer Norman Macdonnell's talent for sustaining startling elements and Leith Stevens's musical punctuations are two attributes which will lead us back to "Escape" again and again, because no "escape" from reality can be a perfectly logical one, but as long as it's as imaginative and exciting as "The Island," we'll gladly go along.

The Chicago Star's ace reporter Randy Stone has a penchant for interesting off-beat assignments. On a recent broadcast, a planted phone call sent Randy to meet Bill Perrin, a Korean veteran, at a nearby bar. Bill is a discharged amnesia patient who wishes to restore his memory with Randy's help. A picture in Bill's wallet of a woman identified as Mrs. Alice Perrin fails to spark his memory.

Randy manages to locate Alice. She is at first violently opposed to a reunion with her husband. Her bitterness is based on his weaknesses—gambling, late hours and indifference to her. However, Randy finally persuades Alice to accompany Bill and himself on a tour of old familiar spots in an attempt to lift the veil clouding Bill's memory. Visits to formerly frequented bars, road-houses and gambling spots failed to help Bill.

Just when all is about to be given up, Bill dangerously drives the trio to the outskirts of town, stopping in front of a yellow stucco house. Then, breaking down, he confesses that his amnesia was all a hoax. He wanted to prove to Alice that he had changed and had no desire to return to his former mode of life. He had purchased the yellow house (the one she had always longed for) and fully intended to settle down and start all over again, if she would have him. She did.

As we said, Randy was taken, but this time he liked it. Frank Lovejoy, veteran radio actor, stars in the role of the "understanding" reporter. He doesn't try to outsmart the police, nor does he have a sidekick. Killings are minimized in this dramatic series, and Randy Stone is more a humanitarian than the man from homicide.

The supporting cast, all excellent Afraites, included Joan Banks, Ted de Corsia and Tony Barrett.

Ray Bloch Presents

Monday, 9:30 p.m.

Bill Haworth does an exemplary job on the weekly spinning of Ray Bloch's music. With some attention to the selection and more than average attention to the in-between-records chatter he puts over a pleasant half-hour's listening. He does it with what is obviously budget radio programming, too . . . and this is all the more credit to him.

Ray Bloch's music serves as a stable and colorful springboard for tunes which "reflect the tempo of the times." In keeping with its theme, forgotten hit-parade songs and tunes that are still spinning around in your brain appear frequently on this airshow. Haworth makes it a lively session that sounds as though it is definitely going somewhere . . . and not in a circle, as is apparent in many other disc-jockey spots.

Monica Lewis is the vocalist on the Ray Bloch platters, plus vocal arrangements by the "New World Singers." A recent airshow included an almost forgotten song, "Chinatown, My Chinatown," which brought back memories of the pace of living at the turn of the century. A rendition of Brahms's "Hungarian Dance No. 5" added a quality of music which was pleasingly a notch or two above popular waxings. Cole Porter's "I Get a Kick Out of You," with wonderful violins coming through, and Jerome Kern's "Don't Ever Leave Me" must have been greatly appreciated by more than one set-sider. Monica Lewis was heard in "It's the Bluest Kind of Blues" and that old Eddie Cantor number, "Making Whoopee." A spiritual entitled "Ezekiel Saw a Wheel" done by "The New World Singers" added nice contrast.

After spending time and talent to set an enjoyable musical mood, Bill Haworth did not ruin things by jarring the listener with unsavory commercials. The plugs were to the point and in very good taste.

It is all the more to radio's credit when it can put on low-priced airshows with a freshness and comforting appeal to all types of listeners, such as "Ray Bloch Presents" . . . in its struggle to keep TV from hogging the field.

"Passing Parade"

John Nesbitt, the man who made his product popular on film, loses none of the charm captured so effectively on celluloid when he steps before the radio mike. He has brought it all back to the airwaves . . . the familiar theme introduction, the colorful vocabulary and the enchanting stories.

Without support of emotional dramatic performers or slick dialogue, Nesbitt makes his story-telling session as interesting as some of radio's regular dramatized serials. Out of the past and from the remotest parts of the world he has gathered sad and happy tales which put all other storytellers' efforts in the shadow. What is more amazing is the wealth of "hidden" facts which he has uncovered to substantiate his plots.

On a recent airshow Nesbitt told the uncanny story of Molly Thatcher, a young girl who remained in a state of coma for nine years. He related the weird and supernatural characteristics which were attributed to Molly after she regained consciousness. It seemed that Molly, who lived in an invalid state for fifty years, was able to foresee events before they occurred. From all over the world people came to talk with Molly, according to Nesbitt's yarn. What was most astounding about his story personality was her unremitting optimism and happy nature even in the face of her incurable illness.

After weaving this intriguing story about a person who lived in the 1800's, Nesbitt informed his listeners that facts, even though traced down religiously, may sometimes be far from the truth, and to take such stories (as that of Molly Thatcher) with only a grain of salt. Nesbitt pulls the listeners' attention, and holds interest in his stories to an extent that one does not question their credibility . . . but follows it for the very same reason he would listen breathlessly to the neighborhood gossip or read an intense short story.

Without a doubt, John Nesbitt is almost without equal in his profession . . . but no one can help but wish that the airwaves were populated by more such storytellers.

"Robert Q.'s Waxworks"

Robert Q. Lewis, Q-rator of rare records and chief spinner of same, takes to his latest disc-jockeying spot in his usual casual and entertaining manner. What he doesn't know about the music he puts on the turntable, he finds out quickly in off-handed interviews with any music men who happen to appear on his airshow.

His particularly unique programming consists in a weekly "pluggers' paradise" spot. Once a week he rations out a couple of minutes or thereabouts to three song pluggers . . . who prefer to be labeled contact men . . . so they can boost their special recordings to the skies. He allows them time to talk about singers, composers and arrangers. Since Robert Q. Lewis is not one to stand by convention . . . even the allotted time for song pluggers to do their respective plugging . . . he steals part of their numbered seconds to ask each guest about his personal history in show business. When you add this interesting chatter to the hand-picked platters Lewis puts on, you get a pleasant half hour of entertainment.

A recent transcribed show included Benny Goodman's brother, Gene, offering vocalist Tony Bennett's rendering of "While You're Young," Moe Shulman's praise of Maggie Whiting's singing of "Ever Lasting," and Joe Santly's plug for Perry Como's latest crooning record. After he gave the contact men a chance, he turned to some memorable oldies by Al Jolson, Ted Weems, Martha Raye and, of all things, a novelty by Robert Q. Lewis himself.

The greatest thing about this recent CBS music program is the host's off-the-beaten-path selections. One week included guest appearances by Patti Page and Frankie Laine, featured records seasoned in Paris from the collections of Jacqueline Francois and Andre Claveau, a salute to George M. Cohan, a group of odd tunes from the Orient and a guesting by Joseph G. Csida, editor-in-chief

Onion-Stuffed Hamburger

(For the patio dinner)

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/2 c soft bread crumbs
- Salt and black pepper to taste
- 1 egg
- 1/2 c medium onions, boiled or canned
- 1 can tomato soup.

Method:

Mix hamburger with salt, pepper, beaten egg and bread crumbs.

Divide into 6 portions.

Press one portion of meat mixture around each onion, leaving the tip of onion showing, then place in a shallow baking dish.

Pour tomato soup around meat.

Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees, about 35 minutes, basting occasionally with the tomato soup.

Instead of using egg and bread crumbs, you may use potato meal and 1/4 c milk or water.

As long as oven is going, why not bake potatoes and top them with sour cream and finely chopped onions.

Off Mike (Personalities)

Jon Arthur

When Jon Arthur stepped to a microphone and recited "Three Little Pigs" as a time-filler on a West Virginia station, it marked the beginning of his career as a youngster's entertainer. He pleased the small-fry audience that day in 1939 and he's still pleasing the children with a full two hours of fun and music on "No School Today" every Saturday morning at 8:00 over the American Broadcasting Company.

Big Jon has the respect and love of thousands of the younger generation who eagerly await his program. They are fascinated by his "Magic Spy Glass" which enables him to see into homes for periodic check-ups on health and cleanliness habits.

No less appealing to the youngsters is Big Jon's small pal, Sparkie. The latter spent the first two years of his radio life as an utterly invisible echo—a recording trick. But Sparkie's fans started mailing in letters asking what he looked like. So the children were asked to send in their idea of how he looked. The request, made on two broadcasts, brought in 25,000 drawings. From these, Leon Jason, well-known children's-comic-book artist, made a composite which is the official Sparkie.

In 1947, Arthur went on the air at WSAL, Cincinnati, with permission to develop any new program ideas he liked. With no fanfare but with a wonderful collection of children's story and song record albums, "No School Today" went on the air.

Kindness, tolerance and good behavior are taught painlessly by means of entertaining stories and songs. And incidentally a little knowledge is rubbed off on the listeners.

KTLA, which telecasts from Long Beach, has Dick "Whoa, Nellie" Lane calling the plays. KTTV, which covers the matmen from Hollywood Legion Stadium, has sportcaster Bill Welsh dodging bodies from his ringside mike.

KLAC-TV, in addition to its regular telecasts, started televised "workouts" on its Channel 13, for a while erecting a ring outside its main studios where passers-by could stop, watch, and collect autographs. Following the tying-up of traffic on Cahuenga as a result of these telecasts, the station moved the program to Ocean Park, where its regular matches are televised.

four inches, even when trying to put on a three-act play. It was all very experimental . . . pretty static . . . those were frantic days in TV." When he formerly had his own video show over KFI-TV, in which he enacted many Shakespearean roles, he was reminded of those "frantic" TV days in England, the time he donned the armor to play King Henry V, only to be practically carried bodily around the set, when the arm and leg portions of his iron-clad suit refused to budge an inch.

### His Opinion

This Englishman who has grown up echoing the lines of the master Shakespeare "likes sensible scripts, the kind you can get your teeth into" . . . thinks Norman Macdonnell of CBS is a fine director because "he throws you more character cues in a few minutes than does any other director I know" . . . and that Bill Conrad and former TV-Radio Life award winner Jeanette Nolan are "fantastically fine radio performers." For one of his acting jobs with Armed Forces Radio—an organization which he labeled a sort of latter-day Voice of America—he played General Douglas MacArthur.

When asked if he thought Hollywood would eventually become the TV-radio capital of the world, he said, "I'm sure of it . . . I don't see how it can be otherwise . . . all the talent, space and technical know-how are here . . . and those studios are not buying up property here for the kicks, you know."

His one regret is that Hollywood does not have any legitimate theaters of the type found scattered so enthusiastically and generously throughout England. But from all appearances this fact will not pull him away from Hollywood, which at times he still considers to be "extraordinary."

**L**IKE THE inimitable Bob Hope, there are many radio, video and film artists who have never stopped entertaining the troops since the first U.S.O. caravan was dispatched during World War II. But the Korean crisis has also brought into prominence a set of "service" stars who, with little or no acclaim, make weekly trips to out-of-the-way bases to bring songs and laughter to raw recruits and veterans alike. Broadcasts and telecasts have originated in many a military installation, and film folk comprise week-end "starlift" flights to California bases where they spend their Saturdays and Sundays putting on stellar shows and making hospital bedside visits.

It was Bob Hope who summarized the need for current action on the entertainment fronts when he said: "People ask me whether I notice any difference between the GI's of World War II and now. The only thing I've noticed is that in the last war they were all expecting Dorothy Lamour on a South Pacific island, now they're looking for Mary Martin and Ezio Pinza. . . ."

"The GI's of World War II were fighting for something that didn't quite come off. A lot of them, plus a lot of young fellows who were just kids when the fighting was going on at Wake Island and Bizerte and Salerno, are trying to finish the job now. I hope none of us will ever forget them or what they are doing. I know I won't."

his emcee tasks by Governor Warren, Nevada's Governor Charles Russell and comedian Walter O'Keefe.

Duly honored for their roles in making the "Reporter" the "respected journalistic institution it is today" were announcer John Wald, the "Richfield Reporter's" voice during most of its twenty years; Collette Burns, assistant scripter; commercial announcer John Latham; and "Richfield Reporter's" editor, Wayne Miller.

Governor Warren presented a scroll for "two decades of unbiased, complete and objective newscasting" to Charles S. Jones, president of the Richfield Oil Corporation. mention a few other "sidelines," including two thirty-thousand-mile personal-appearance tours, regular recording sessions and six studio-type motion pictures he's completed during the past year.

Like many entertainers who have been eminently successful in the older media, he welcomes the challenge of video. At Pioneertown, a Mojave desert locale, he has set up headquarters for production of twenty-six half-hour telefilms annually. In eighty square acres, replete with Joshua-tree and pine forests, desert wastes emulating Death Valley, river beds lined with willow; flatland sprinkled with cactus and sagebrush and mountain peaks, gulches, canyons, as well as hillsides laden with huge boulders, he's found every imaginable Western setting in which to grind his thirty-five-millimeter cameras. In fact, Pioneertown terrain can duplicate the scenery of seven different West-of-the-Rockies states.

### The Old West

The town itself is an old-West settlement, also perfect for his purposes. He quotes an old sign that hangs in the town when he boasts "There is no place just like this place anywhere near this place."

Autry relies on much of the knowl-

edge garnered from radio production and movie experience in his telefilming. He believes that production for video is far more exacting than for straight motion pictures, since the actors and the scenery come in for much closer scrutiny. Actors like guitarist Pat Buttram, his radio comic sidekick, appear in Autry's video pictures, and many of the dramatic vignettes which radio producer Bill Burch and writers Stanley Davis and Elton Packard helped Autry to broadcast have become valuable plot material for his current projects.

### Wider View

Aside from the production angle, Autry feels that through television he's reaching an even wider audience than before.

"My video films are being shown in the larger cities where formerly the market for them was small. Also I'm getting reacquainted with the youngsters who came on the scene during the war years." (Autry abandoned the screen temporarily for a three-and-a-half-year sojourn with the Air Transport Command.)

He's emphatic in the view that "If any one thing is causing motion pictures to suffer because of television, it's the distributors who will not release better pictures for videoing."
