How NOT to Get Into TV!

*An Old Friend of Red Skelton's and
A New One Tell of Breaking All the
Rules of Auditioning and Tryouts to
Land Two of Television's Dream Jobs*

THE BEST way NOT to get onto at least Red Skelton's top-rated TV show seems to lie in following all the prescribed methods. Especially if you are blonde, beautiful, and talented.

Positive proof is the experience of Lucille Knoch and Shirley Mitchell.

Lucky Lunch

Lucille is the statuesque blonde who regularly stooges for Red in his comical skits. Her arrival at these scenes is every adolescent aspirant's wildest dream come true. The lovely "Lucy" was lunching one day at the Tail O' the Cock, a Hollywood restaurant frequented by artists, agents — and tourists. Also being stared at that day were Red Skelton and his business manager. Red's eyes lit on Lucille, and his laments began. Here was the perfect type for his show, and he didn't know her — didn't know if she could act, or even talk! But the business manager *did* know Lucille. She had been under contract to Paramount for some time.

An introduction to Red Skelton and the right answers in a soft Nashville accent led Miss Knoch right to NBC-TV's studios for her "test." This test meant merely walking on stage two or three times so Red and his production crew could see how she looked on camera. That was thirty-some weeks ago.

Lucille calls her work with Red "a dream job." She says the comedian who introduced her to TV is "just about the most wonderful person Ah ever worked with, around — or even met." She echoes a horde of Skelton acquaintances in tabbing him "considerate."

Red, on the other hand, benefits greatly from being able merely to tell Lucille a routine, then sans script and learned lines, run through it, with her following instructions to the letter. A perfect memory is augmented by the eye-catching sort of loveliness that has resulted for her in a flock of fan mail and major-studio interest.

Old Role — New Medium

Shirley Mitchell is the other beauty of the show, but her good looks are many times disguised by the

"Mrs. Willie Lump Lump" garb she affects. And Shirley couldn't care less.

The Mitchell voice has been a familiar one to radio audiences. A few years ago, among myriad other roles, she played Red's radio show when a girl named Harriet Nelson bowed out to appear with her husband, Ozzie Nelson, on the Nelsons' own regular — and successful — air offering.

Shirley married, moved away, and became a mother. Two years ago she and her family returned to the Coast, and by this time TV had not only reared its appealing head, it was firmly entrenched in hearts and homes. And Shirley's baby was grown enough so the pretty mother could once again return to the work she enjoyed.

It was a call from her agency that prompted Shirley Mitchell one day to see Red. It seemed he had been look-

ing for an actress to fill a regular role.

"I thought I was going to an audition, probably with a couple of hundred girls," Shirley laughed. "Well, no one was there, and Red almost died when he saw me. He told his director that I was 'it' without even a tryout. It' was the 'Mrs. Willie Lump Lump' role I did with him on radio for so long! And Red had completely forgotten about me!"

Both the blondes of Red's television life are completely fractured, Sunday after Sunday, by the big clown star. They explain that neither ever knows for sure just what Red is going to say. His ad-libs are as new and as funny to them as to the audience.

Red never tries to discourage their merriment at his antics. He feels that when the people on the show are having fun, the audience does, too. The blondes, as one, say . . . "I've never had more fun!"

For Presidential Year of '52
"Meet the Press" Proves

TV Won't Play Second Fiddle

DURING ORDINARY times (if there is such a thing any more), NBC-TV's "Meet the Press" provides millions of viewers with "on-the-spot" front-page news.

Now, in this very important presidential year of 1952, the significance of such a program becomes even greater.

During a special TV-Radio Life interview, Lawrence Spivak, co-producer and frequent panelist on the show, sat in his New York office at 570 Lexington Avenue and in his soft-spoken, assured manner explained some of the points about the program.

"Ever since Martha Rountree and

I started 'Meet the Press' we have been interested only in front-page news.

"We never take anyone who will withhold information. That's one of our cardinal rules. And it's one of the main reasons the program has made front-page news with amazing regularity."

The Record

These were not idle words on Mr. Spivak's part. The record of "Meet the Press" speaks for itself.

Starting in June 1945 as a radio show, special interviews with Henry Wallace, Secretary of War Robert Patterson, Dr. Robert Oppenheimer, Senator Theodore Bilbo, James Far-

DINAH SHORE: Did She Go Hollywood?

I'VE KNOWN Dinah Shore ever since she came to Hollywood ten years ago, and since she seems the same now as then, an idea for a story hit me. It was to be called "Dinah Shore Tells WHY She's Never Gone Hollywood."

When opportunity came to sit down for an hour with this very busy star, she rather knocked me off my rocker when she stated matter-of-factly: "But I DID go Hollywood for a while. I think it's impossible not to, when you first come here—all the attention you get. When I made my first picture I had MY wardrobe lady, MY press agent, MY make-up man . . . everything was I, I, I, my, my, my. I grew careless. I was never on time . . . the world could wait for me, I thought. I got so tired I neglected to sing well. . . . It was hard—doing my own show, the Cantor Show, five shows a week for the Armed Forces. 'Well, they don't seem to mind,' I said to myself when I turned in a halfway job. Even my agent called me to know what was the matter, but I thought I could get away with it."

What brought Dinah back to her senses?

"The war and meeting George," she claimed. "I was doing a lot of camp shows . . . went overseas . . . slept in pup tents, slept outdoors . . . traveled with the First Army, traveled with the Third Army. Nobody did anything for you. You had to do it for yourself. And then I got to liking it that way and realized how spoiled I'd grown."

"It took me a year to snag George. That'll take a girl down a peg when

she has to work that hard to get her man."

Dinah paused a moment and reconsidered. "If you mean have I ever gone Hollywood, I'm not sure I know what it means. I've never brushed off my fans. I've never wanted a fancy car. I've never wanted a bigger house nor more grounds. But I must admit I've always been extravagant with my clothes and spent money on my hobbies."

Did or didn't Dinah go Hollywood? Maybe all that happened was she became a little careless and inconsiderate. But one thing you can be sure of: She'll never go Hollywood now, after one narrow escape. Why? "Because of my basic sense of values," she will tell you. "I know . . . I want and there are no short cuts. I want what I have—George and Missy." (Missy is short for Melissa, the Montgomerys' four-year-old daughter.)

Dinah has no hesitancy about discussing her marriage. "George and I love to be together. We like the

same friends . . . we have the same tastes, the same habits. Neither of us drinks. We don't stay up late. If we are up until 11 o'clock, we think it's the bitter end. We've never sat down to figure out our marriage. If you're in love, things fall naturally into place."

Stay Together

One thing George and Dinah never do is stay apart very long. Nor do they put long distances between themselves and Missy. The longest in point of time and space was one month, when Missy was seven months old. Dinah left her to fill an engagement at the London Palladium. Since then, three days has been the longest.

Despite their extreme compatibility, George and Dinah have no notions of collaborating on a TV show. Dinah is still quite enthusiastic about her video debut and loves the excitement of TV. "It's the closest thing to opening night," she believes. "You have to keep your wits about you." Asked which she would pick if she had to make her choice between TV, radio, pictures and records, Dinah pondered. Then she said, "I hope I don't have to make that choice. I guess I'll never give up records. They're the only annuity-type activity of the four. If anything should ever happen to radio, radio might be only records. But I don't want to give up radio until it gives me up."

One thing irking Dinah about her new TV show (which has been acclaimed by critic John Crosby, Billboard and other professional sources) is the fact that it is not seen in her home town of Nashville, Tennessee.

In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

Help Thy Neighbor

This week an incident occurred which proved once again how public-service-minded local TV stations are.

One day last week, a Mr. John M. Thomson entered the office of TV-Radio Life. He explained that the week of March 29-April 6 has been designated "Canadian Legion Week."

Since he was unfamiliar with the local TV situation, he asked advice as to how he might be able to get some TV publicity for the occasion. We recommended certain persons and shows to him.

This week, Mr. Thomson, along with other personalities such as members of the Northwest Mounted drill team, and the always-inspiring bagpipe players, appear on many local programs. Such shows as KLAC's "Eddie Albert Show" and KTLA's "Magazine of the Week" will use their time to explain to the public about "Canadian Legion Week" here in Los Angeles.

This is the sort of quick reaction to a public service of which the local outlets can be proud.

Still Moving

Despite the maze of antennas that dot the roofs of every street in every bourg of greater or lesser Los Angeles—and surrounding towns—the TV-owning potential apparently hasn't been exhausted by any means.

The Electric League of Los Angeles, Inc., brought out new set sales figures:

Something to Look Forward to

One of the executive vice presidents of Motorola, Inc., made some fascinating predictions about important TV industry changes to occur during the next five or ten years:

First of all, he predicts a compact, portable TV set powered with its own source of atomic energy (we already have a compact Pilot portable TV set powered by the simple process of stuffing an ordinary plug in a wall socket!); third-dimensional pictures (think what this will do for the commercials!); and finally, radically lowered prices resulting from such developments as the germanium transistor

and printed circuits. (These germanium transistors are what we want to see!)

Playwright to TV

It has long been our belief that the "new faces" looked for in TV should belong to the echelon of management who permit huge salaries for has-been stars while but little of the budget in TV goes to the writer. Some new faces fronting some new minds which realize a drama is only as good as what's on the pages of script, irrespective of any sacred presence who was once a movie name holding down the lead, seem to us to be in order.

NBC-TV seems to be taking a giant stride in the right direction. Net is currently dickering with eminent playwright Robert E. Sherwood to script four original TV dramas per year for the next three years.

The same net already has several fine dramas on tap weekly for viewers (e.g., "Philco Television Playhouse," "Robert Montgomery Pre-

TORPEDOED TO FAME

HAD AN under-age British sailor not been torpedoed from his seat at the radio-decoding desk of a Dutch ship in World War II, the United States might never have known two of its most colorful additions to the wrestling game.

Narrow Escape

Young Lord James Blears had lied about his age when he entered the Dutch Navy. His lifelong friend, Leslie Holmes, a few years older, had enlisted in His Majesty's service, so it was unthinkable that James Blears stay behind.

It took a few years for him to be literally blown from his work as radio liaison officer, and then he landed in the arms of the enemy. His escape from them was little better than an out-of-the-frying-pan affair, for Blears floated about the Indian Ocean for five days until a United States-bound ship picked up the survivor and brought him to these shores.

During the time it took him to spend survivor's leave, return to England, be decorated by Queen Wilhelmina and receive a discharge from the Navy, the picture of America persisted in the young lord's mind. Back he came.

Damon Joins Pythias

His friend, Leslie Holmes, had in the meantime completed seven and a half

years in His Majesty's service, received his decoration and a captaincy, and emerged from the Army. For eighteen hungry months he tried to establish his own business, that of construction engineering. But it seems that in England, to secure material, you must have "established a quota." Having spent years in the Army, Holmes hadn't had much time to establish a quota of anything. He began lending a receptive ear to the importunings of his friend Blears, who from foreign shores was writing about what a great business wrestling was in America. Finally, armed with the seventy-five dollars England allowed departees, he sailed for the United States.

Both Blears and Holmes are jubilant about America. As Blears explains it. "Why not? Simply because we were lucky enough to have swum and wrestled in England. America has been ours on a silver platter."

Opportunities Scarcer

"You know, there have been innumerable articles written about the Slavic fathers who poured over here in the early 1900's to carve a living from the soil with their bare hands. Of course their sons all wound up financiers and bankers. That was supposed to be hard. It's a good deal harder for anyone to come over here in the late 1940's and wind up even eating, much less the father of a financier! I'm very grateful to the wrestling profession for things I have."

On one occasion this outspoken enthusiasm won the two friends an unwarranted rap. While appearing in Chicago, they had been approached for an interview by the representative of a huge English newspaper.

"Lord Blears is now an American citizen, and I'm not far from my final papers," explained the good-looking young business manager. "But England will always be very dear to us. It was once home, and we were delighted that people there might still be interested in our welfare. So we happily told this English reporter of all the nice things that had happened to us, and of the money and friends we had made.

"When we saw his column we were stunned!"

And with reason. The article was headlined: "These Britons Should Be Brought Home." It implied that the two ingrates were living from the fat of foreign soil while their long-suffering families contributed to the empire through sticking faithfully around. No mention was made of the long and outstanding service records of the two men, nor of their respective decorations of merit. And certainly no mention was made of the fact that one of the duo risked crippling or being blinded to literally wrest a living from America, while the other worked just as hard at the business and promotional details of a vocation that can find you here today, gone tomorrow, more easily than almost any other.

women wrestlers. They harbor the same feeling for a becurled matman named Gorgeous George, who once threw Lord Blears against the corner of the ring and ripped his brow open. Many stitches were necessary.

They sincerely deny any knowledge of a match which they participated in or arranged being "fixed." "Wrestling doesn't work like that, any more than football or boxing."

But they do admit freely that a percentage of showmanship dresses up these matches.

"Sure, a wrestler may be grimacing and pounding the floor with his free hand so it makes a good show, but that doesn't mean he isn't trying desperately to break a hold. He may be in very real pain, too, and while he wouldn't act in just that fashion outside the ring, under the same pain, he knows the customers are getting a kick out of seeing him suffer a little!"

But most surprising is their adamant stand on talking about their work away from the ring.

As Lord James Blears succinctly puts it, "... it makes my head ache when people start that yakety yak about 'how did you do this or that' or 'tell me about the last time you and Red Berry met!'"

The newest feature of the program is a religious picture depicting Bible stories. A junior choir, led by Skeets Bennett, is featured as well as a discussion of religion as it relates to youth.

... The recent KECA-TV "Celanese Theater" we caught which starred Mickey Rooney. The opening credits happened to the TV set before we did, thus it was a full hour before we realized that Maxwell Anderson's "Saturday's Children," and not "Andy Hardy Comes to TV" was the play of the evening. Guess even "Celanese," usually superior entertainment from every angle, can pull a blooper now and then. And the star, to employ the term loosely, seemed to us to blame for this, principally through the muggings and camera seekings we thought had gone out with vaudeville.

... The seeming inability of some of the sponsors who appear before the TV cameras to deliver a simple three- or four-word message to the viewer. This was particularly noticeable to us when KLAC-TV's Wednesday evening "GE Academy Theater" ran Roberto Rossellini's "Paisan." Both sponsor representatives who appeared briefly had a mad, mad time with the simple messages of good faith they delivered. Oh, well, they were paying for the time!

PICK of the PIX

Interesting to note that the recent Academy Awards gave an Oscar for the best motion-picture story to "Seven Days to Noon," which appeared on television only a couple of weeks ago. Not so interesting to note, as far as I'm concerned, is that the excellent Rossellini film, "Paisan," played on TV last week and I failed to mention it. I hope you caught it, and that you catch some of the following:

"Nothing Sacred." The estimable Fredric March and the inimitable Carole Lombard in one of the best comedies ever to come out of Hollywood. Although it was made many years ago, this satire on the sensation-loving public remains as fresh and as funny as ever. Lombard, as a young girl who thinks she is about to die, and March as a cynical reporter who foists her story on his readers in the belief that he's committing his first honest and selfless act, give wonderful performances. Also in the cast and also excellent are Charles Winninger and the late Walter Connolly.

"T Men." Not a narcotics expose, but a very well done low-budget picture of fairly recent vintage about Treasury agents and their endless search for counterfeiters. In fast-moving, violent fashion, the film tells of one agent who joins the mob in an effort to capture the leaders... not an original twist, by any means, but handled here with intelligence and vigor. With Dennis O'Keefe and June Lockhart, one of today's better television actresses.

"So Ends Our Night." Fredric March, again, doing his usual fine job in a picture that deals with one of the modern tragedies, the people without papers, without countries. The setting is Europe in the early years of World War II, and the principals are fugitives from the Nazi machine, personified by the archetype of Prussian militarism, Erich von Stroheim. The all-star cast includes Margaret Sullivan, Francis Dee, and Glenn Ford.

"One of Our Aircraft Is Missing." A British semi-documentary about one of her missing aircraft. A good picture that boasts one of England's leading actors, Eric Portman.

"Dark Journey." Academy Award winner Vivien Leigh in one of her earliest, a tale of spies and intrigue. No streetcars or torn undershirts in this one.

NBC Easter Plans

Following its long-standing tradition, NBC radio will present a succession of Sunrise Services on Easter Sunday, April 13. This year special programs will originate from a hospital in Washington, D.C., Radio City Music Hall in New York, from a barge in Springfield, Illinois, from the Grand Canyon of Arizona and from Yosemite National Park in California. Also scheduled, in anticipation of the Easter services, are special broadcasts for Palm Sunday, April 6, Maundy Thursday, April 10, Good Friday, April 11 and Holy Saturday, April 12. All special broadcasts will be listed in TV-Radio Life logs.

Winchell Ill Again

Listeners who were all set to hear Walter Winchell's broadcast a week ago were shocked when the flash radio commentator's place was taken over by a staff announcer, Richard Stark. Winchell collapsed before the broadcast, suffering from a relapse after a siege of virus infection. It is reported that Winchell will be strong enough to continue his air show, but that Jack Lait, New York Mirror editor, will probably take over Winchell's syndicated newspaper column.

Ham Contest

A special release from Berne, Switzerland, announced the May ham contest. Hams (amateur radio operators) from all over the world are invited to try for a prize in the Swiss Shortwave Service contest over the twenty-four-hour spread of May 6 and 7, with prizes or souvenir prizes for all comers. This date was chosen because it is for all concerned just about the best listening time, when audibility should be at its best. The competition runs in all transmissions of the Swiss Shortwave Service DX-Programme.

The contest is a mixture of broadcast and ham radio, a kind of world-wide multiplex. It boils down to a race over the radio waves for hams. Three listening posts will be established in Switzerland, listening out simultaneously in the twenty-meter band. Their call signs and exact frequencies are secret. Shortly after the Swiss Shortwave Service's DX-Programme on May 6 and 7 begins in each transmission, a start signal will be given after announcement and explanation from the studio over the transmitter of Schwarzenburg.

It's then the job of the amateurs taking part to contact one of the three listening posts. The amateur who contacts any one of the three posts first, is the winner for the transmission. Logs should be sent in to the Swiss Shortwave Service before May 31, so that the result can be read out in the June DX Programme.

She has been a regular member of the hour-long morning program since 1947, when she was discovered at station KCBS, San Francisco. She was acclaimed as one of radio's top vocalists and as "one of the most refreshing personalities in any entertainment medium."

Patsy Lee is the fifth songstress to leave the "Breakfast Club" for marriage during the program's nineteen-year broadcasting history. Others include Annette King, Evelyn Lynne Nancy Martin and Marion Mann. Patsy's replacement as female vocalist in the popular air show has not been selected.

Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

"Pursuit"

Radio has gone overboard recently in airing supposedly fast-moving adventure tales, which usually introduce some private eye or detective-policeman as the hero. "Pursuit" is one of the better of such dramas, with actor Ben Wright playing the lead as "Inspector Black."

There is no doubt that this English setting used in "Pursuit" bears some resemblance to the familiar Scotland Yard type of mystery. Ben Wright's fine acting and the British flavor to all of these air escapades make this particular air show worth listening to, after one is sadly disappointed in the other so-called mystery-dramas.

In a recent airing, "Inspector Black" was called in to investigate a mine cave-in, where one of the men deep underground had been murdered, poisoned, only moments before the mine crash occurred. "Inspector Black" went into the mine depths to track down his criminal before the men were removed. This approach to what was not a particularly deep plot gave the air drama a realism which is often lacking in many radio tales. Action and dialogue, instead of stilted narration, helped to hold the listener's interest to the play's conclusion when one of the trapped miners confessed his guilt.

Each "Pursuit" broadcast concerns a different story line, but always for "Inspector Black." Every air show probably will not be as intriguing as this one or some of the others, but you will find that you will not regret becoming a regular "Pursuit" listener.—A.G.

We Point With Pride

To Jane Wyman's simple, heart-warming approach to a rather trite but true story, "Time Remembered," on "Hallmark Playhouse," KNX, 8:30 p.m. Thursday. Without appearing maudlin, she portrayed a mother who recalled all the happy and sad incidents that had occurred to her husband, son and daughter during the eventful years between World Wars I and II. The entire production proved that radio drama has the greatest impact when it is done simply, without the distasteful burden of the often present cliches.

"I won't feel I'm really on until it does go there," she avers. Her fan mail is heavy from both Memphis and Nashville and when she uses names of places (like the Cascade Plunge) familiar to residents of those cities, her mail jumps tremendously. As it is, her letters require attention of two secretaries.

Expert's Opinion

But asked "What was the nicest compliment you got on your new TV show?" Dinah happily cited several, then told what Missy said: "But Mommy, when is Bob Hope coming on?" Seems that Missy felt that it wasn't a real show until the comedian, with whom Dinah had done guest shots, joined Mommy in front of the camera.

Dinah and George never want their little daughter to feel that she has to keep up with her parents. "Such a thing can be tough," Dinah believes. "I don't want Missy to be conscious that she's the daughter of celebrities. It's better when people give her a break for herself."

To compensate for any time her work takes her away from Missy, Dinah makes up triplefold when she is home. She reads to Missy and "tells her stories." Only Missy usually outlines the complete plot (which usually has "a big wind" in it), then instructs Mommy to tell a story about the outline.

Dinah thinks the most important thing she has learned during the past ten years in Hollywood is "to be relaxed about my life and everything. I don't take as much for granted as I used to. But I still worry that I may forget my lyrics, get a frog in my throat or be at a loss for words. The most important thing I've learned in the past ten years is a piece of advice Eddie (Cantor) gave me. It's the greatest thing he ever said. I was jealous of someone getting credit for things I was doing, and worked myself up into a state. Eddie said: 'Did you ever see a guy win the 440 who turned around to see what the other guys are doing?'

"As the years have gone on," a serious Dinah mullied, "this advice of Eddie's has taken on more and more depth."

ley and many others gave the Roundtree-Spivak special its share of "scoops."

Beginning in November 1947, when it went on TV, the show really hit its stride.

Although each and every week the four crack reporters from the Fourth Estate and the distinguished guests furnished plenty of hot controversy, the publisher of Mercury Publications was particularly proud of certain history-making telecasts.

"In the early days of the program it was difficult to get the people we really wanted," Spivak continued. "We explained that there would be no holds barred. There's absolutely no rehearsal for this show, and once we're on the air it's every man for himself. Nowadays it's a different story . . ."

TV Comes First

The short, spectacled journalist and publisher was interrupted by the ringing of the phone.

It was a call concerning next week's program. At the time, the tax scandals in Washington were making headlines, and Spivak wanted "Mr. X," a very much involved government figure, to appear on "Meet the Press."

Spivak listened for a moment and then spoke: "You say 'Mr. X' is going to have a press conference only a short time before we go on the air? Can he postpone the press conference?"

Spivak waited for an answer. "You say he can't? Well then, I'm sorry but we can't use him on our show. We have an audience of ten million people, and if we can't have 'Mr. X' first, then we won't be able to use him at all. If there's any change in his plans, please let me know. Good-bye, and thanks for calling."

Spivak didn't have to finish his story. This incident showed us that neither "Meet the Press" nor TV in general is going to play second fiddle to other public media.

Politicians with presidential aspirations might bear this in mind when planning their forthcoming campaigns.

Someone goes off his rocker and shoots up his neighbor's TV set while watching *Dorothy Kirsten* . . . a small boy creates devilment after looking at cops 'n' robbers on TV . . . unhappy women seeking advice from the lovelorn editors complain about husbands slouching all evening in front of TV sets (it used to be the evening paper they retired behind) . . . youngsters confront parents with demands to buy products they've seen plugged on TV.

ADVERTISEMENTS EXTOL THE VALUE of TV snacks and drinks . . . of lamps, chairs, and other equipment for enjoyment of television . . . of hostess gowns to don for comfortable watching and suggestions for making guests feel welcome or otherwise as your case may be.

I DON'T REMEMBER RADIO CREATING such havoc; nor of even dreaming that TV would so quickly become part and parcel of everyday living. My daughter plans her whole evening around "I Love Lucy." You and your family are probably the same.

THREE YEARS AGO WHEN I TOLD my parents I was giving them a TV set for Christmas, my mother confided to my sister that she would rather have a new washing machine. Now

you can't pry her away from "Voice of Firestone." Fred Waring, Ralph Edwards and other shows too numerous to mention; and my father would rather sit in front of his set and watch a game than walk over to the Coliseum a few blocks away, to witness the fray in person. (And don't think I haven't had fun asking my folks if they're sorry I didn't get the washer!)

PERSONS LIKE DAGMAR, ZSA ZSA, Kefauver—from all walks of life—zoom to instant fame via TV (and I'm not telling you anything you don't know). Just sort of putting on paper the thoughts that drift through my mind as I realize that TV-Radio Life is now twelve years old and will celebrate next week with a gala 100-page Anniversary Issue. This past year has been the most exciting of all the dozen, because TV-Radio Life has had to keep up with good old radio and unpredictable TV which is growing like Jack's beanstalk.

o' the heap with 46.7; Spade Cooley was second with 36.7; then "Irma," Groucho, Martin & Lewis (on Colgate), etc., down to twelfth on the list, which was KTLA's Sunday movies with 21.4. Jack Benny, at No. 1 spot on the radio ratings, had 20.9. And twelfth on the radio list was "Big Sister" with 6.9.

SAME DAY THESE L.A. FIGURES were released, New York ratings showed Martin & Lewis number one with 56.9; "Godfrey's Talent Scouts" second with 48.4; and Berle in third place with 45.1. Godfrey didn't show at all in L.A.'s first fifteen, and "I Love Lucy," which everyone here seems to be looking at, was also nowhere in the first L.A. fifteen. But it showed up number four in New York, while Skelton was in eighth place in the Eastern city (and first here, or are you still following?)

THIS IS PRETTY CONFUSING AND makes one more dubious than ever about ratings of any kind. I can see where folks here and in N.Y. might have different tastes on two or three teleshows, but not on a list of fifteen. I don't think people, leveled today more than ever by watching TV, have that much difference in them.

ROBERT J. SHAW, WHO HAS WRIT- TEN "Mr. D.A." for the past six years and who is doing a video version now, too, has been lecturing this week in California before vacationing in Mexico. . . . John Guedel, the man behind scenes at "Houseparty" and "You Bet Your Life," was just as funny as his two stars, Linkletter and Marx, when the three made a Hollywood Ad Club appearance. John should have a show of his own. Guedel's "Dinky Foundation" Awards have been instituted to recognize outstanding public-service messages on radio and TV. Ken Murray's TV opus won first prize (\$1000) for a Red Cross integration during which Lew Ayres actually gave blood on the show. Radio program winning was "The Big Show" for a CARE appeal done by Tallulah backed by a choral group.

Can Dietrich Give Radio a Shot in the Arm?

*The Most Enchanting Grandmother in
The World Takes Over a New Medium.
Can She Lend Anything It Doesn't Have?*

CURRENTLY IN some of the Texas towns, an odious little tune entitled "You're Too Old to Cut the Mustard" is the big hit. Obviously the writer and the music men who beat it out never heard of Marlene Dietrich, a grandmother who has been the personification of sex and glamour since the day she was playing in movies with Emil Jannings. Remember "The Blue Angel"?

Now the grandmother, who is better remembered for her lovely legs than she is for being a grandmother, has taken to the airwaves in a series of torrid epics paraded under the title "Cafe Istanbul."

The Dietrich Songs

Cast in the series as "Mademoiselle Madou," a night-club singer who somehow has gathered enough money to run her own place, Marlene is the focal point of adventure in international intrigue. And there is always a spot in the scripts during which the throaty voice delivers a ballad or two for the patrons who gather at this world crossroads.

This meeting place of shadowy characters who buy and sell information they consider to be of interest to any of several governments is also a source of adventure for "Madou." She has, scriptwise, reached a point in life where nothing much matters except the excitement her patrons provide with their plots and counterplots. Scarcely type casting!

A romantic interest is brought into the "Cafe Istanbul" in the person of "Steve Lacey." Fittingly, he is an American with mysterious connections which seem to keep him provided with plenty of money. He is also the actual owner of the "Cafe Istanbul," which "Madou" operates. Their paths have crossed many times, and while he is fascinated by "Madou," he wouldn't hesitate to sacrifice her to a jail sentence if she got

in the way of his operations. Their ambivalent affection finds them madly in love one moment, and fighting the next.

Weekly Escape

The third "regular" in "Cafe Istanbul's" cast is Arnold Moss, who plays the role of "Colonel Maurice Lesko,

Prefect of the local police." In the best tradition of Eastern adventure, "Lesko" too, is infatuated with "Madou." But his affection is not returned. She could be the lower branch of a family tree ranging through a half-dozen generations, and still no one would be able to emulate the throaty quality and accent that makes her immediately recognizable to millions of fans.

Defends Home Cooking Via TV

YOU WOULD fully expect a gentleman cook such as KLAC's Mike Roy (who has probably tasted more than the average man's share of fancy cooking effervescent with foreign flavors) to do other than praise the all-American housewife's cooking. But when we put the question "What's wrong with the American housewife's cooking?" he pointedly answered, "I give her noth-

ing but credit. If she can plan her meals to give herself more free time, let her do it. Sure, I love a delicacy prepared by a French chef, but for a steady diet give me the American way of cooking."

But isn't there something wrong with American cooking? Too many seasonings? Too much fried food, maybe?

"No, I don't think there is a great



deal wrong with American cookery. The average housewife has to be a wizard with the buck. And she budgets her time so she can squeeze thirty hours of work into twenty-four hours."

Packaged Foods

Next we asked this manipulator of the soup bowl and baking dish if he believed frozen foods and canned preparations spoiled the hearthside cook.

Again he refused to do anything but applaud the homemaker. "Frozen foods? Housewives use plenty of them and they do a lot of interesting things with them. It's fabulous the type of dishes they develop with ready-to-use preparations, and they're economical, too."

What does it take to be a good cook?

This expert said, "You have to have a superiority complex, so when you prepare something new you have confidence in your own taste."

When Mike Roy talks about cooking at home, he speaks from experience. He is married to Allison, or "Ike" (which explains why they are known to their friends as "Ike" and "Mike") whom he taught to cook only four months ago. They have a three-year-old daughter, Robbin, who thinks her Daddy is the greatest pancake cook in the world. Another member of the Roy household is Goliath, a spaniel, who, Mike claims, is "the most awkward butterfly chaser in the world." Mike and Ike have been married four years, and when he isn't busy cooking for his TV stint he spends his time at woodworking, gardening or playing his own brand of seven-handed bridge.

Being a television cook is easy to take for Mike Roy, who has been at it for better than two years now, but he has ambitions for the future which have little to do with the delicate art of cooking.

"I just want to live. I'm a curbstone philosopher whose greatest wish is to just be the 'Squire of Northridge.'"

But what about all this fiddling with foods? Does he like it?

"You bet I do. You can have fun with food."

JUST THE other day I drove down to Palm Springs from Hollywood to spend a week end with my radio sister and brother-in-law, Alice Faye and Phil Harris, and as I swung into the driveway I was greeted by a bedlam of sounds that floated out to me from the open windows. Children were screeching, a vacuum sweeper was whining, and farther away in the background I thought I heard a triphammer beating a tattoo.

When I rapped on the front door there was a long pause, then a typical housewife from any typical town you'd care to mention unlatched the catch and welcomed me. She was wearing one of those nondescript house dresses made of gingham material, and her blonde hair was hidden under a flowered bandana. Except for a touch of lipstick, she wore no make-up.

"Come in," she said. "Isn't this a delightful madhouse? And I love it!"

There, in the best verbal nutshell I can repeat, you have the picture of Alice Faye as she really is. It's a far cry from the girl who at one time symbolized the epitome of glamour in filmed musicals, and who today is regarded as one of the most entertaining comedienne on radio. I'm sure she'd rather be on the working end of a vacuum sweeper than a microphone, with the sound effects joyfully supplied by her two daughters.

All this took me back to that day some six years ago when I received a call to audition for a role as Willie, Alice's radio brother. Alice was a top-ranking film star before I had started my acting career, and there was a general impression that she was about as antique as silent pictures. The concept about her husband was built on a premise that he was a loud-mouthed band leader addicted to bourbon and singing in a monotone, with a penchant for spending his wife's money.

Discoveries

So you can understand why I approached the audition with some trepidation. It didn't take me long to discover that Alice had been a cinema luminary when she was only eighteen years old, and that she was still considerably this side of any danger of creaking at the joints. Phil turned out to be a hard-working actor whose prime interest was to turn in a good, entertaining show, even if he were the butt of all the jokes and sly innuendos, and a murderer of the King's English.

In those six years I've learned to know Alice well. Perhaps it's trite

to say that she's totally unaffected by her remarkable record at the box office, but I think this is an important facet in her makeup. She's friendly and has gone out of her way many times to set up good acting breaks for me and for others in our radio troupe. She's intensely loyal, prompt, and so cooperative that at times it's alarming.

But to get back to the housewife I met in Palm Springs, I don't think Alice will club me over the head if I surmise—and these are purely my own conjectures on the subject—that if Phil felt the show would do without her, she'd be as delighted as a new bride to stay home and listen to her husband do his stuff via the parlor radio. She left the movies because they were too time-consuming, and upset the manner of living she wanted to enjoy. She felt it was impossible to have both a big film career and a big family, and do justice to them.

This, I believe, is one of the reasons Alice is hesitating to make the plunge into television. A radio show, in the matter of hours consumed, has an admirable advantage over TV. In radio, Alice can still have her cake and eat it, enjoying her family and homes in the San Fernando Valley and in the desert. Between the rehearsals and the broadcast, she can even find time to do a little shopping in Hollywood or Beverly Hills.

But once she gets into television, she's afraid all that will change, and she'll be too near to the very thing that influenced her to quit the movies. Phil realizes that anyone who wants to stay in the entertainment field must eventually get into TV, but of course this is no particular bait for her. Our show is practically ready to make the change, because everyone in the cast looks as well as sounds his or her part. Alice and I are of the same coloring, and we do look like brother and sister. Phil everyone knows, and Elliott Lewis as Remley, and Walter Tetlev as Julius, also fit their parts visually.

As in his glib manner of persuading Alice to do radio, don't be sur-



prised if Phil sells her on TV one of these days, and our show lands on your home screen next year. We've got the quorum, but we lack a leading lady at the moment. However, where Phil goes next season, I'll make you a bet that Alice goes. Anyway, we're all keeping our fingers crossed and hoping so!

Finally, whenever Alice hears me play her stuffy brother who thinks she made a horrible mistake when she married Phil in preference to Rudy Vallee or someone else equally well-heeled, I know she's probably thinking to herself, "I'm glad this pixilated, fussy character isn't my real brother!" And do you know, when I hear the rebroadcast, I must confess I agree completely with her.

When you see Willie in television, don't you believe it either!
