Martyn's Meat

Is a One-Man News Assignment, Thick Enough to Get His Teeth Into. He Also Relishes Juicy Slices of Music, Medicine and Fashions, Both Male and Female

GIL MACARTHUR assignment was a one-man assignment. It was my meat," observed KTLA's ace newsman, Gil Martyn, still the highest-rated West Coast TV newscaster.

Martyn, you may recall, left Hollywood on a few hours' notice to fly to Honolulu to cover the MacArthurs' arrival there from Japan. He had to set up two camera crews; to persuade the mayor of Honolulu to open the Eastman store (so KTLA's cameras would have adequate film supply); to figure out a way to outsmart other reporters; and to worm his way onto Hickam Field. Gil achieved this last-named objective by throwing a luncheon Sunday noon at the Royal Hawaiian, to which he invited The Brass. This was his sesame to exclusive coverage.

Martyn relished every facet of his one-man assignment, even though he was batted down by the crush of MacArthur admirers, had the wind knocked out of him and had to climb on a wheel of the Bataan to get away from the crowd. He followed through on such small but important things as giving a chap \$5 to keep KTLA's cable line free and tipping another fellow \$15 to keep a car in the clear so that KTLA's film could be rushed to a waiting plane. Martyn's was the only voice on film from the Punch Bowl, where General MacArthur paid tribute at Ernie Pyle's resting place and again from the University of Hawaii when the General received his honorary degree. (Gil did a running description on a wire recorder as the cameras unwound, using a very low voice, as any sound had been forbidden with the films.)

To Mainland

KTLA's films, put on a plane at 3:30 a.m. Monday, ninety minutes after the MacArthurs arrived in Honolulu, were first shown on KTLA Monday afternoon, then repeated in condensed version Monday night.

Gil Martyn is hoping for more assignments like this, but meanwhile on his nightly news program, on "Magazine of the Week" and other KTLA telecasts he is trying to personalize the news. Gil feels that eventually only honest-to-goodness newsmen will handle TV news. "To know how to cover stories, you have to be

a reporter," he claims. He also feels that it is advantageous for the same person to follow through on a story from start to finish, as too much is lost when too many people try to edit someone else's work.

If a one-man MacArthur coverage is Gil's meat, then his delectable filet mignon could be any of three subjects: medicine ("I finished all but two years in medical school—had to give it up because I was paralyzed for awhile in both legs"); music ("I was a child prodigy on the violin at twelve years"); and fashions ("I used to do the New York Fashion Guild's shows at the Waldorf"). Gil worked for Paramount News in Manhattan, served as stand-by for Milton Cross at the Metropolitan Opera.

"TV has to go further than radio did," Martyn claims. "Radio did a great deal in the way of culture, but didn't do enough. TV has a bigger job than pitching commercials. You're going to see a lot of operations on TV," Gil said in shifting from music and art to the topic of medicine. "People are going to demand it. I

don't think such operations will be gruesome. After all, the surgeon doesn't have to take a scalpel and slice into a patient to show lookers an operation."

Adult Audience

"People are closer to the truth now with TV than ever before," Gil continued. "I believe in TV and that it is certainly beyond the plane set up by radio. I would like to think the TV audience has come of age."

As a former medical student turned TV newsman, Gil was questioned about his personal health. "I've never had a cold," he stated.

His music? "I've played a little boogie on 'Magazine of the Week,'" he confessed.

Fashion? Gil launched into an extremely intelligent and stimulating dissertation on what both men and women wear. "Too many people are trying to follow the styles," he remarked wryly. "The poodle cut is an example. It isn't becoming to all women. I think of women as flowers—each one different. One flower may

Elliott Lewis Answers 20 Questions About "Suspense"

1. How long has "Suspense" been on the air?

It was first heard as a sustainer in July of 1940; however, we celebrate our tenth commercial anniversary in June, 1952.

2. Do you find it difficult to direct a different guest star each week?

No. Different performers achieve a given effect in different ways. You must allow them their individuality.

3. Is the "Suspense" type show harmful to juveniles?

"Suspense" is an adult show. It is up to the parents to discipline their children regarding their listening habits.

4. Do you read lines for your performers to show them exactly what shadings you want?

This I try to avoid. I would rather try to explain what I want and let the performer determine how to achieve it in his own way.

5. Do you fit the scripts to the guest stars or vice versa?

"The play's the thing," as somebody once observed. The usual procedure is to try to find a good play, and then someone to fit it.

6. Why have so many comedians and singers been used in straight dramatic roles on "Suspense"?

We have operated on the theory that the public would like to hear its favorite performers in new kinds of roles. It must be true about all comedians wanting to play "Hamlet" . . .

because they all love to play heavies on "Suspense."

7. What do you consider to be some of "Suspense's" best efforts?

"Sorry, Wrong Number" (Agnès Moorehead), "Warworks" (Claude Rains), "Donovan's Brain" (Orson Welles), "Track of the Cat" (Richard Widmark), "August Heat" (Ronald Colman), and "Wreck of the Old 97" (Frank Lovejoy).

8. What qualities do you think have made "Suspense" one of radio's most award-winning shows?

Most "Suspense" dramas concentrate on a few characters and a single suspenseful situation. The best drama is still the simplest.

9. Who writes "Suspense"?

A staff of eight rotating writers, who work on original and rewrite material. We have also bought scripts

on the open market . . . from a deaf mute in Brooklyn, a night watchman in Chicago and a cowhand in Wyoming. I think this policy gives us the off-beat angles that only writers from widely different walks of life could provide.

10. Who reads all the scripts submitted?

I do . . . I'm interested in writers and stories and feel that maybe the next story I read will contain the greatest idea I've ever encountered.

11. Do you do any of the writing yourself?

Rewriting, mostly. I've contributed a few originals, but all I'm responsible for is script editing.

12. Are there any writing taboos on the show?

We're interested in scripts that live up to the title of the program. However, we don't like complicated whodunits, whereas we do like some emphasis on mood and characterization. As a rule we don't go in for supernatural stories. Our theory is that a story packs a lot more wallop if it remains believable throughout.

13. Have you earned your ulcer yet, which is so characteristic of the radio industry?

No. I guess there must be something wrong with me, because I can stand only so much pressure, and then I go to sleep.

14. What do you do for unsuspenseful relaxation?

Cook at the least excuse and at every opportunity. I also find fishing very relaxing.

15. Do you have any difficulty in lining up enough film-star guests to carry you through an entire season?

No. "Suspense" is pretty much a one-man show, with the star on mike about ninety-five per cent of the time. Perhaps this is one reason it appeals to the movie stars.

16. Now that you're producing and directing "Suspense" do you miss appearing on the show as a performer?

Yes, I certainly do. I have to hand out a lot of roles that I'd love to play myself.

17. Why haven't we heard Cathy (Mrs. Elliott Lewis) on the show for so long?

Cathy's been swallowed up by television. She used to be able to do half a dozen radio shows a week. But when "My Friend Irma" was converted to TV, "Irma" suddenly became her whole career, because it requires a full week's rehearsal.

18. Why have you turned down offers to direct and to act in television?

Because I don't want the same thing that happened to Cathy to happen to me . . . at least, not yet. At present, I'm producing and directing three CBS shows a week, playing "Frankie Remley" on the Phil Harris show, and have even had time to do a movie and a lecture series at UCLA.

IT'S BASEBALL time on Channel 9... that's been the daily call ever since the station announced it would carry all the home games of both the Los Angeles Angels and Hollywood Stars for the entire 1952 season.

And so with cameras and remote crew—plus sportscasters Tom Harmon, Bill Brundige and Lyle Bond—KHJ-TV is always on the scene when our local Angels or Stars take the field.

When the Stars are at home, Tom Harmon describes the play-by-play action from Gilmore Field. Bill Brundige, newly arrived from Philadelphia, where he called the games for the National League Philadelphia Phillies, is the TV voice for the Los Angeles Angels. Lyle Bond, who won wide acclaim for his work on KHJ-TV's beaming of the USC and UCLA basketball games this year, is the color announcer for both clubs.

Harmon on the Hill

Much has been said and written about the phenomenal football greatness of Tom Harmon, but few know that he was equally gifted as a baseball player. When just a high-school student in his home town of Gary, Indiana, Tom played on the town team as both a first baseman and a pitcher. Always a natural batter, Tommy soon proved a grand exception to the rule that pitchers can't hit.

But it was on the pitching mound that Tommy caught everyone's eye. During one season, he tossed three no-hit ball games, a performance that caused the mighty New York Yankees to sit up and take plenty of notice. He was offered a trial with

on football too, and for the past two years called all the sensational grid successes of the much heralded Dick Kazmaier and the Princeton Tigers.

He says his biggest thrill in sports—and he's had many—was when he received that long-distance call from Los Angeles telling him that he'd been picked from among hundreds of applicants for the Angels job. He had his taste of the Golden State during the war when he served in San Francisco as the director of the sports section for the Armed Forces Radio Service. He's been dying to get back here ever since, and his spot with the Angels marks a welcomed arrival to the local sportscasting gentry.

Bond the Ball Player

Whether the game be at Gilmore or Wrigley Fields, Lyle Bond is always on hand, for he's the color announcer for both clubs. It's like old times for Harmon and Lyle, for they called the Pacific Coast League games on TV back in '49. What's more, they were fellow students at the University of Michigan and formed a friendship that has lasted through the span of years.

Lyle carved a remarkable career as a baseball player too, and in 1940 he was named the outstanding pitcher in the highly competitive "Big 10" conference. But for an unfortunate baseball accident that hospitalized him for two years, he might well have made his career on the diamond.

Off the field, then, these three. Brundige-Harmon-Bond, have been clicking as a perfect play-by-play combination.

This Week in TV

CBS-Television City

BY THE time CBS-Television City makes its debut next October, the citizenry of Los Angeles, in true pilgrimage fashion, will turn the former Gilmore Island site into a kind of mecca. Public interest in the exclusively first and largest television studios in the world cannot be overlooked, and indeed the CBS publicity and promotion departments are happily well aware of this fact. It's a healthy combination.

Last February there was a press kick-off to orientate the fourth-estaters anent CBS-Television City. Then, while CBS-TV City was still in the steel-and-concrete stages, a city-wide photographic contest was launched. Imagination and initiative, prerequisites to photographic skill, were amply demonstrated by the winning contestants.

Police photographer Robert Praskin of North Hollywood scored twice in the professional division. He won first place with an entry captioned "Stairway to the Stars," and his shot of workmen's idle equipment called "Weary" took third prize. In the non-professional class, GI art student Hugh Richard Blackburn claimed first-place honors for his interesting entry entitled "Angles."

Fred E. Case, UCLA lecturer in real estate, took first prize in the color-photography class with a structural study titled "Going Up."

Sharing the spotlight and prizes with the top winners were a score of runners-up.

Attention has since been called to a fifteen-by-fourteen-foot working model of CBS-Television City, which was built by local industrial designers (Dale and his wife Mildred "Mike" Clark) and is now on display at the CBS headquarters in New York. After the Gothamites have had a chance to see that the West Coast and video are becoming synonymous, the model will be displayed on a nation-wide tour.

Throwing a little more light on the subject occurred when Lucille Ball and Mayor Fletcher Bowron pulled the switch that engulfed TV City with floodlights. Illuminating Television City for the benefit of nocturnal sidewalk superintendents seems to take in just about everything. We may not be as original as CBS in devising promotion gimmicks, but we are safe in our prediction that the new site will become a mecca for tourists and natives alike.—M.R.

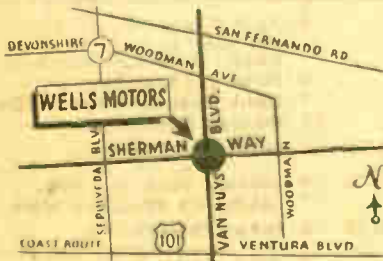

Then drill two holes at top of saucer, for your ribbon hanger. Add a decal to the cup for added decoration. You buy these plastic cups and saucers at any dime store and in any color.

IF YOU'RE STARTING A VEGETABLE GARDEN, THIS IS A GOOD IDEA. Instead of putting the empty seed envelopes on sticks at the ends of rows of newly planted seeds, mark the rows for identification with small cutouts of plywood or thin wood from an old crate. These are cut on a jig-saw to the shape of the vegetable and painted the proper color. When these are fastened to the sticks, they add novelty to the garden and are not destroyed by rain or sprinkling as are the paper envelopes.

PICK of the PIX

Well, I'm back from my holiday in Inglewood and I want to tell you that for rest, relaxation and an all-round contented feeling, there's no place like the cashier's window at Hollywood Park.

"That Hamilton Woman." This engrossing film is based on the historical affair between Britain's famous hero of the seas, Lord Nelson, and the woman who occasioned the really interesting gossip of her day, Lady Hamilton. Produced in a lush, romantic style, the picture is entirely sympathetic toward the dalliance of the noted pair, although it is forced by the custom of censorship to mete out the usual just deserts. **Laurence Olivier** and **Vivien Leigh** gave every indication in "That Hamilton Woman," made a dozen or so years ago, that they would one day be the leading actors of their time.

"The Ghost Goes West" is an excellent comedy about a member of a Scottish clan who is doomed to walk the halls of his castle as a ghost until the day when he can force a member of a rival clan to acknowledge him as the better man. The necessary complications arise when an American millionaire buys the castle and has it shipped, ghost and all, to the U. S. **Robert Donat** is extremely good as the spectre, while **Jean Parker** and **Eugene Pallette** contribute admirable support.

"Street Scene." Adapted from the fine play by **Elmer Rice**, who wrote it during the abysmal days of the early thirties, the story of this picture is more portrait than plot, outlining as it does a single day's trials and difficulties in the lives of the inhabitants of a dingy New York apartment house. Although these difficulties are numerous and considerable and culminate in a highly melodramatic double murder, Rice uses them primarily to underline his bitter criticism of the social forces which engender race prejudice and economic inequity. With **Sylvia Sidney** and **Beulah Bondi**.

"Operation Haylift." Made just a couple of years ago, this movie tells the factual story of the mercy flights which kept valuable livestock alive by dropping feed on the snowbound plains of the blizzard-ridden Northwest. With **Bill Williams** and **Ann Rutherford**.

"South of Pago Pago." **Jon Hall**, **Frances Farmer** and **Victor McLaglen** in a south-sea romance which led me to conclude that they do the same thing south of Pago Pago that they do north of San Bernardino.

"Yankee Fakir." An unpretentious, frequently funny little movie about corruption in a small Western town. With **Douglas Fowley** and **Clem Bevan**.

Lifelines

I DON'T KNOW HOW YOU FELT ABOUT IT, but to me the paradox of the week was the newspaper story on the Congressional probe into naughty TV. The probing lawmakers not only delved into all the luscious aspects of Dagmar, plunging necklines and other TV fare considered questionable, but one Congressman went so far as to throw dignity to the winds and pose for a hootchy-kootchy picture. Radio in Review

For Love o' Mike (General Comment)

Murrow on Censorship

Noted CBS newscaster Edward R. Murrow took issue with recent government orders and laws under consideration which would enforce censorship on radio or television. We believe some of his thoughts on contemplated restrictions on news coverage are worth quoting here because the subject concerns you, the listener or viewer.

He said, "They represent both a threat of censorship and a denial of the right of television and of radio to employ the tools of their trade, the microphone and the camera, to disseminate information. . . . Remember, this ban against cameras and microphones in House Committee hearings, and the proposed one against Senate hearings, applies to open, public meetings. I don't care whether it's McCarthy attacking, Owen Lattimore defending, Acheson explaining foreign policy, Lovett defending a defense appropriation. . . . I would rather hear the eloquent excerpts of their testimony in their own voices than to read it or hear it after it has filtered through the minds of reporters and editors, whether in newspapers or on radio. No politician or witness has yet claimed that his own voice misquoted him. . . .

"As one who has had some experience with government-controlled radio and press, I should prefer to take my chances with the sometimes raucous occasional bad taste and too frequently sensational method of disseminating news and information that we now have, for under this system, as a citizen I can take it or leave it alone, have a wide variety to choose from, and can complain or agitate for change with some hope of success. It is, I believe, in the national interest, necessary for us to turn over a substantial amount of what we earn to the government. But it is not necessary, and it is not safe, to turn over to the government increased control over what we may read, see and hear. What is required is more information, more widely spread, regarding what our government is doing, and that is the thing that is in danger."

Compare Hawthorne and Steve Allen

If you're one of the legion of radio listeners who have compared Hawthorne and Steve Allen (both radio comics), particularly in the way both have handled the midnight show, you'll soon have a chance to make a much closer comparison. Both gag men are airing new shows on CBS, one from New York and one from Hollywood. CBS is pitting Hawthorne, 9:30 p.m., Sunday through Friday, against Steve Allen, 6:30 p.m., this summer in a series of new shows that will have both comedians on the air doing the format of their midnight shows. It's a free country, so you can enjoy both comics in their respective battle of wits. Hawthorne will continue doing his afternoon and midnight shows, making him the Arthur Godfrey of KNX.

Record Notes to You

THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN: Bing Crosby-Peggy Lee's "Watermelon Weather" (Decca), Patti Page's "Whispering Winds" (Mercury), Guy Mitchell's "Day of Jubilo" (Columbia), Bill Farrell's "Stay" (MGM), Lawrence Welk's "Small Talk" (Coral), Les Paul-Mary Ford's "Smoke Rings" (Capitol) and Ray Anthony's "Scatterbrain" (Capitol).

Newest of the New Sounds is provided in a big way by Billy May's "Big Band Bash!"—six top Capitol instrumental dandies of "You're Driving Me Crazy," "When Your Lover Has Gone," "Perfidia," "Diane," "Please Be Kind," and "Tenderly." All feature the steady rhythm and fresh approach in arrangement that have proven so popular for wonderful dancing and thrilling listening. It's Billy May at his best!

In the jazz field, The Gene Krupa Trio (Krupa, Ventura, Napoleon) score heavily with concert jazz arrangements in varied tempo of "St. Louis Blues" and "Stardust." . . . Especially effective is Ventura's bass-sax work on the latter, while it's Krupa all the way on the flip (Mercury). . . . Bob Crosby's Bobcats (Capitol) could easily have another South Rampart Street in the Matlock original "Paducah Parade." . . . Its old New Orleans march swing has just what it takes to put this Bobcat waxing in the upper bracket.

Easily the best reissue of the week is the late Mildred Bailey's original 1937 Vocalion etching of "Rockin' Chair," now available on Columbia's special Black Label series. Flip is another Bailey classic, "Give Me Time," with Roy Eldridge and Teddy Wilson in the supporting cast. Nothing but great!

Peggy Lee (Decca) has one of the best in the new waxing of the perennial "Lover," but it's backer Gordon Jenkins who steals this record with his unusual continental arrangement that attracts equal, if not more, attention than the vocalist—and yet, without Peg's individual styling, all the noisy rhythmic accompaniment wouldn't mean a thing. Should be a big record.

We also liked Les Baxter's instrumental version of the seldom-waxed Ellington gem, "Lost in Meditation" (Capitol) . . . Bob Hope and Jane Russell's gimmicks on "Wing Ding" (Capitol) . . . Tommy Furtado's warmth and sincerity on the Puccini-inspired "You" (MGM) . . . and the unusual Eddie Heywood piano interpretation of "Black Moonlight" (MGM). . . . A.M.

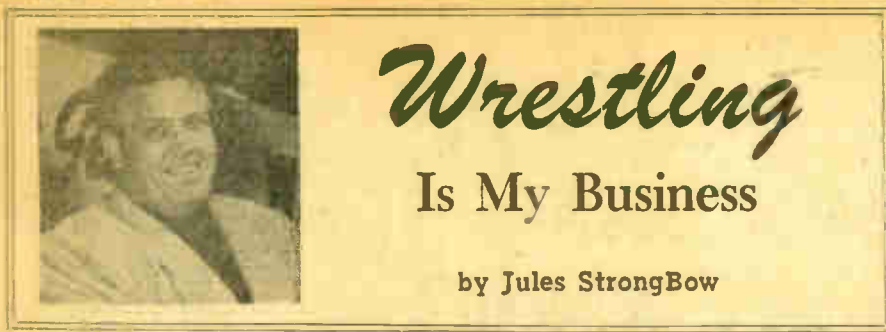

FREEMAN LUSK:

Not Afraid to Discuss Any Topic

I'LL DISCUSS anything on Freedom Forum," says moderator Freeman Lusk, "providing it isn't a breach of good taste." Glancing over the multitudinous subjects . . . from birth control to UNESCO . . . which Mr. Lusk has aired in the past four years, one is inclined to agree with him.

As a moderator, Freeman must discipline himself to use the utmost tact and remain impartial despite his own feelings on the subject under discussion. Keeping up with the diversified topics which are aired via "Freedom Forum" is a man-sized job. He subscribes to more than thirty publications, which help keep him informed on what's going on in the world. London's "Intelligence Digest," Freeman explains, "is one of the most informative periodicals on the market today. Their world-wide reportorial staff of historians and economists is able to get more news from behind the iron curtain than any other similar group." Reading thirty-odd publications religiously is

quite a chore, but it enables Freeman to gain "a smattering of ignorance" on most of today's vital issues.

Freeman is a sagacious moderator . . . permitting heated controversy among the panel members, but always keeping the premise of the subject in line with the discussion. Recently a group of state, county and civic officials feted Freeman Lusk . . . who does not hold nor intend to run for any office . . . for his public-service contributions to television. Public service has been his forte these many years.

Public Relations

As the son of a Methodist minister, Freeman first served the public as publisher of the "Park Sun," a community paper published in Huntington Park. Later Freeman sold the paper for \$2500 and entered USC, where he worked on the "Daily

The program has gone out on a limb many times. On one telecast they discussed the controversial Brink family . . . some thought them suckers, others humanitarians. The station received an unprecedented flood of letters criticizing the aimless arguments and vitriolic comments of her opponents.

"Some people accuse me, instead of the debaters, for generating more heat than light on a discussion. Not guilty on that score, judge," Freeman says, "although I may be guilty of barring 'known,' not doubtful, Communists from appearing on my program. Their very allegiance to Communism abnegates our freedom of speech, so why offer them what they denounce?"

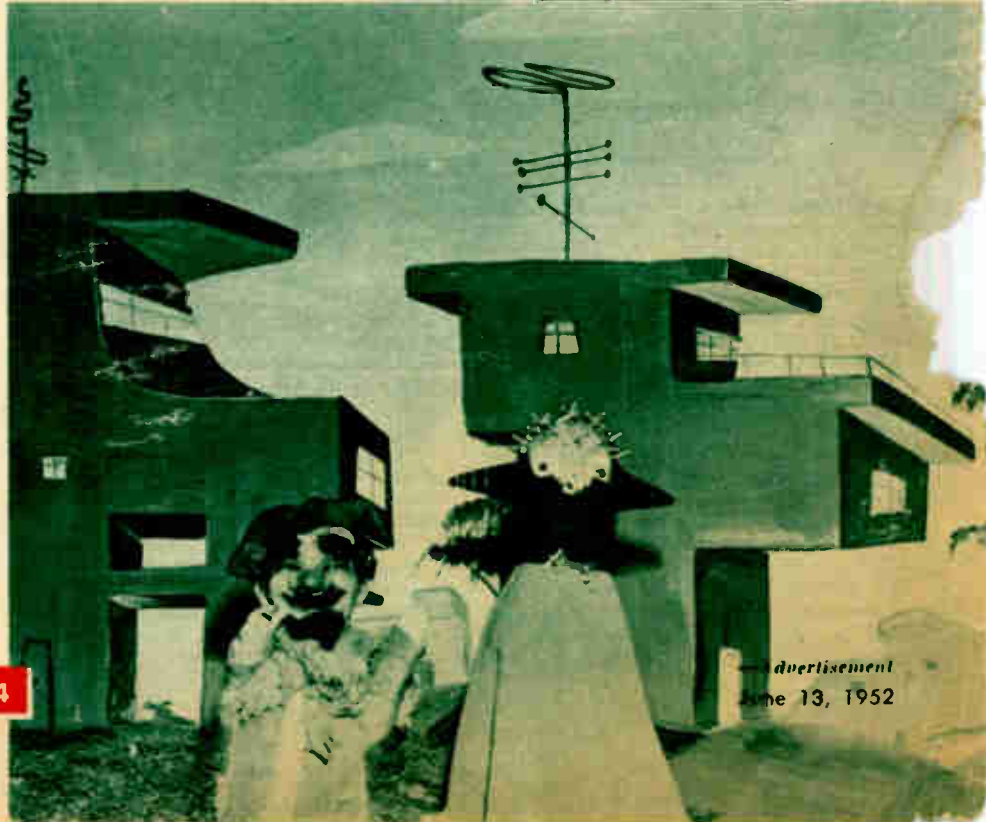

knew right then and there that this was for me."

Three-Year Hit

And so it has been! During the past three years, Liebman, Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca, and the entire cast of the Saturday hit show, have won more TV awards than Carter has pills.

What's makes this "genius of TV" tick? In New York recently, TV-Radio Life watched the short, smiling producer go through his paces at a dress rehearsal at the NBC-TV theater on Columbus Circle.

Unlike many other frenzied, nervous producers, the Vienna-born Liebman acts as nonchalant and relaxed as a tourist strolling through the corridors of a museum. This easy-going attitude in no way detracts from the quality of the performances.

Between skits, Max plunked himself in one of the studio seats and explained some of the secrets of his success.

"First of all, our one-and-a-half-hour time limit is ideal. It gives us an opportunity of getting variety, so everybody's taste is satisfied.

"TV, actually, was not new to me. I merely brought a whole organization from the theater."

"Dream TV Theater"

Contrary to the procedure of many TV programs, this discoverer of such stars as Danny Kaye, Jules Munshin, Betty Garrett, and, of course, Caesar and Coca, does not allow any teleprompters or "guide sheets" to be used.

"I believe you should know your stuff, and then there's no need to worry about it. It also allows a comedian, for example, to put more feeling in his animations."

Despite his overwhelming success, this slight, gray-haired man does not intend to rest on his laurels. He spent a great deal of time going into details about his "Dream TV Theater."

In brief, it involves having three different semicircular stages—with a revolving audience!

In this way, the various artists on the stages (comedy, drama, musical, etc.) would be able to concentrate on their work better. The audience, Max claims, would also benefit from this arrangement.

Twenty years from now, if you should attend a TV theater and, after being seated, start spinning around like a roller-coaster—you can blame this guy Liebman.

And don't be surprised if it happens. Geniuses have funny habits of making wild schemes come true.

Country Music: Barometer Of the Times?

years. This furthers the taste and mood of the public for this type of music."

Insofar as Cliffie is concerned it would be about as easy to get the California Chamber of Commerce to publicize Florida as it would be to classify "Western" music into strict A-B-C categories. "There's been so much cross-crossing and intermarriage of the types that a true mark of distinction is difficult to see."

Using a broad outlook, Cliffie suggested a start with folk music such as the English settlers brought with them to America. This is the music Burl Ives sings. These songs, in their earliest form, were not penned for drawing-room entertainment nor for commercial use, but were passed on from minstrel to minstrel and indeed were largely the equivalent of a newspaper in content. This music was amplified when new songs were conceived for the simple purpose of passing news from one community to another. This is how American folklore songs were born; songs such as "Barbara Allen."

From this folklore, Cliffie said, there evolved "country" music. Unlike folklore, country music is much more direct and to the point. According to Cliffie, "there's no beating around the bush in country songs."

"One distinguishing mark is that country music always has a steel guitar. However, in the South the guitar plays the melody while in the West it's part of the rhythm sec-

tion." Cliffie confirmed the theory that all of us have been touched by country music during the past ten years. He used "Tennessee Waltz" as an outstanding example of country music in its commercial and popular state.

Another aspect of country music is its division into sacred and secular factors. "From the secular branch of the music tree," says Cliffie, "comes hillbilly and Western music. Perhaps in hillbilly music we have the easiest and 'pattest' explanation. The most simplified explanation would be that hillbilly music is played and loved by people of the hills. That may sound ridiculous, offhand, but no other music can be explained in the same simple terms. No other music is so centered about so few.

"Let me put it this way," he continued. "Hillbilly music never has cowboys, saddles, plains, boots or spurs. This is Western music. Songs like 'Dust' and 'Tumblin' Tumbleweeds,' they're Western songs. But tunes like 'On Top of Old Smokey' and 'Let's Live a Little,' that's hillbilly." Cliffie thought a moment and added, "It's a matter of treatment too. When more instruments are added, the music becomes Western. It's the modernized, popular idea of hillbilly music. As far as the public is concerned, Western music covers just about everything from 'Home on the Range' to 'Tennessee Waltz.' I don't think you'll find anyone to argue the point. After all, if you like music, it's either good or bad. It's every man for himself."

WELL, THE EASIEST way to explain it, I think, is to point out that war has dislodged a lot of people from their native homes. Country folk began to work in industry and naturally brought their music with them."

That was Cliffie Stone's direct answer to a question concerning the steady rise in popularity of "country" music in the large cities across our nation. Country music, at one time touching only country people, now has become part of the life of almost every American. Cliffie knows about this kind of music because he's been associated with it all his life. Right now he records it for Capitol Records, plays it on "Hometown Jamboree" each Saturday over KLAC-TV and on his KXLA "Hometown Jamboree" radio show every day in the week.

Reasons?

"You know," he said, "music is a wonderful barometer of the mood of the people. People and music change with the world and national conditions just like everything else. Take today's troubled times: Religious music is on the upgrade throughout our great nation. Well, I guess the first thing many people would say is that more people are turning to God because they're afraid or because they need something to hang on to in perilous times. Maybe they're right. During troubled times people seem to lean to the simple songs of narrative quality rather than the up-tempo beat of the modern day.

"In addition," Cliffie continued, "radio and television and records must be looked to as having an important bearing on the popularity of certain types of music. True, it's a circle, but these media do further the mood of the public by carrying tunes and moods, through repetition, to those not initially affected. Disc jockeys are now playing country music; something unheard of in previous

It is living theater in the home, with almost unequalled production, scripting and casting. It is also theater that requires no baby-sitter and no box-office scramble for tickets. You sit back, smoke and watch. An arm-long list of TV awards substantiates the show's reputation.

Pill-gulping director Alex Segal is handicapped by having but one day of camera rehearsal for "Celanese." That means only twelve hours or so to see that lines are learned, rain

machines work, props are right. Of course the list of actors and actresses who have done "Celanese" reads like a who's-who of show business, and the scripts they do are their favorite works, so no problems of temperament ever arise over roles, dissatisfaction with lines, or a "brand-new approach" to a role. Segal has the best ingredients possible for his video treat.

Pulitzer Prize Winners

Many times the living playwrights are in attendance at "Celanese" rehearsal. If you have ever undertaken to read aloud the pennings of another person with that writer hovering by, you can imagine the additional strain. Imagine your awareness if that writer were a Pulitzer-prize-winning scripiter, such as Elmer Rice or Robert Sherwood.

But, according to TV Guide, Segal has one more saving device. It is based on a discovery of one of the "Theatre's" cameramen, who not long ago took candid shots of Alex Segal's beloved year-old baby, Cindy. Whenever the floor crew hear a hysterical edge creeping into the director's voice, one of these candid of Cindy is sent into the control booth. One look at it, and Segal breaks into laughter, thereby getting back on even keel. It's infallible.

This was the first telecast of a Eugene O'Neill play anywhere, and occurred in October of 1951.
