Why I'm Unhappy

IN THOSE dim days only a few years ago when I was reluctantly holding down a job as a bus boy in the Pump Room in Chicago, I once listened with considerable annoyance to an actor who complained about his lot in life. Squinting at the grousing star over the pile of dishes I was transporting into the kitchen, I muttered something like: "Brother, you never had it so good. I wish I were in your place!"

I was fresh out of high school then, with a meager theatrical background that included the lead in one play at my Detroit high school, but it was enough to whet my appetite for the colorful life behind the footlights. This was the world I had marked out for myself, and try as I might, I couldn't find one single disadvantage in it.

The fact that I got nowhere when I tried to break into radio acting in both Detroit and the Windy City didn't deter me one bit from my goal. I believed those movie-magazine stories about sticking to my guns with an unwavering persistency, and that if I wanted something badly enough, it would eventually come my way. So, feeling as I did, I resolved it would be only a matter of time before I'd hit those enviable show-business heights myself!

In Case

A war came along to disrupt my prearranged plans, and in the course of the three years I put in with the Naval Air Force I came to a slightly more mature conclusion that a solid training was the best background I could have to help me along when the breaks would come, so I enrolled as a GI student at the Pasadena Playhouse. I took the full treatment there, from spear carrier to comedy leads, and when graduation day finally loomed around the corner and the Hollywood talent scouts hadn't beaten down my door, about ten days before sheepskin day, I found myself a job in a Pasadena restaurant as a waiter—just in case!

About the same time, I heard via the actors' grapevine that a new television show was in the making, a space-ship-cosmic-energy sort of deal, and that they were looking for actors. I hustled over and read for the producer, and in the long pause that followed I imagined all sorts of things, including the thought that maybe I should have stood in bed.

It was all over very quickly. Said the producer, "You're exactly what I had in mind for Cadet Happy in

this script I've written. The part's yours if you want it."

It took me a fast two seconds to stammer out my answer, and it's old news now that the show caught on, that it's seen on some twenty-five TV stations throughout the country and heard on more than 300 radio outlets. Probably every kid in the country is familiar with the character names such as "Commander Corry," "Cadet Happy," "Tonga," "Carol" and "Major Robertson," and they pack atomic pistols now instead of the once-popular Old West six-shooters.

So, as I said originally, I never had it so good, but I've got one complaint to make. And mind you, I'm not hollering too loud, because despite my personal moaning I wouldn't change one thing that's come my way. Yet now I understand about what that actor in Chicago was complaining, and I've revised my opinion concerning the incident.

The Dream

Here's what I mean. All my life I've been a dyed-in-the-wool movie fan, and I looked forward to the day when I'd be in Hollywood, a part of the fascinating scene, meeting all the people who make the headlines. I visualized myself talking show business with stars, sunning beside a beautiful swimming pool, and enjoying week-end trips with glamorous people to equally glamorous resorts.

So what happened? I've played "Cadet Happy" about 600 times and the kids everywhere wave to me, call out my name, and when I'm within talking distance they ask me for an autograph. That part's fine, a portion of the pattern of the acting profession, and naturally I love it. This adulation makes you feel as though you're doing at least an adequate job as a performer, and this attention is one of your rewards.

When any of us in the "Space Patrol" gang go out on a personal appearance, we're usually rewarded with a big, enthusiastic turnout. The youngsters gather around with their routine of questions, and when they're through the parents step up and tell us anecdotes about the effect our show has on their home life. Everybody has a good time, and we finally leave with the feeling that it was an afternoon or evening well spent.

But despite two years of this, I still have to enjoy my first entrance into the Hollywood scene. I haven't sat down to a chat with the Barrymores.

for instance, and no lovely dish of cinematic feminine pulchritude has decorated my doorstep. About the only tan I've picked up is from TV lights, and I haven't had one glamorous week end even to nearby Palm Springs, since we work approximately seven days in the week!

Let me tell you more of my troubles. Jack Benny, one of my idols, is a regular viewer of our show, but the closest I've ever gotten to him is the nearest radio or TV dial. In an article he wrote a while back, he quipped that our show was strictly for the juvenile mind, but maybe he'd appreciate it more when he got his disintegrator ray. Then he added, "Due to the early hour, I've missed three of the past fifty shows."

Ethel and Lionel Barrymore watch the program, but since it's like asking for the moon to try to meet them, I was happy to settle for John Barrymore Jr., whom a friend promised to bring to the studio. That was about a year ago, and I'm still patiently waiting.

One day Pat O'Brien dropped in, and I closed in to meet him. Instead he pushed his son Butch forward and left the two of us together for a verbal session. The next time I saw him, he was leading Butch out of the door. All I got to say to Pat was a hello and a goodbye.

Tony Curtis, I'm told, puts his household in a virtual suspended animation while "Space Patrol" is on his TV set, and I suppose lovely Janet Leigh sits obediently by, indulging his flight into our fantasy, and probably darning his socks so that the time won't be a complete waste for her. I don't know—I'm just guessing, because I haven't met them either.

Foiled Again

I was a judge on a television ama-

PEGGY GORDON is a typical TV chorus girl—or a “gypsy,” as they are known in the trade.

The pictures on this page demonstrate far better than mere words what her life is like.

Nevertheless, after following Peggy during one of her routine days, we gleaned some interesting sidelights of which most people (ourselves included) have little knowledge.

Peggy herself comes originally from Little Rock, Arkansas. “My folks were in show business, and even as a kid I traveled all around the country with them. We played in every wide spot in the road.”

“Gypsy” Groundwork

Peggy got her first job “in the line” when she worked at the Latin Quarter in Boston at the age of fourteen.

This twenty-three-year-old brunette explained that in order for “gypsies” to obtain work they have to belong to at least two guilds for TV jobs, and two more for any film spots. The total quarterly dues for these organizations come to about \$26, or approximately \$104 per year.

The minimum wage for a chorus girl on the Coast here is not too bad—\$125. “Sometimes you can hit the \$150 mark,” she said.

Peggy admits readily that she has definitely been one of the lucky ones.

Next Year—Depression?

“It’s easy to get bookings now, because most girls don’t know what channels to go through. But next year the squeeze will really be on.”

This comment led to the question of whether or not she considered the Hollywood TV chorus girls below the standards of those in New York. Many viewers have commented on this point.

“I think the girls out here have more talent and are better looking than the ones back East. It’s like I’ve said. They just haven’t learned the ropes yet on how to break into TV.”

How did Peggy get her big break?

Last year, Jimmy Durante saw her one night when she was doing an act at Ciro’s. He sent word back to her to work on his NBC-TV “Colgate Comedy Hour.”

Peggy has been a “TV gypsy” ever since.

Around the Row

Want a sewing machine? Free? The jovial master of whatever ceremonies are stood upon during a happy daily KTTV hour known as "Ladies Matinee" is giving one away. All you have to do is be correspondent No. 250,000, and mail-king Jack Rourke will search you out, lugging the beautiful machine behind him. It shouldn't be long before the number is hit, because Jack currently averages 3,500 pieces of mail a week.

Mrs. Lena Rallins of Maywood, California, will from this time forward take up the cudgels against any disgruntled non-owner who chants the themes of most of the TV-less: "Ah, there's nothing good on TV, anyway!" Mrs. Rallins had witnessed, on KLAC-TV's "Hollywood on Television," a practical demonstration in artificial respiration. There is something new under the sun. International TV. At the end of this summer Tijuana's XEAC-TV takes over a nice middle channel with one of the most powerful transmitters in the world. The signal, flung out from the hilltops outside of Tijuana, will throw a beam from there to Santa Barbara, and much of the novel fare on what will literally be the first international commercial station will keep dials rooted onto Channel 6.

According to Ray Garcia, Tijuana's colorful Jal Alai caller and publicist for "Empese Tourina de Tijuana" (bull fight, to you!), George Rivera, who for twenty years operated XEAM radio at Tijuana, had quite a time getting his Channel 6 allocation for XEAC-TV. Rivera applied to and received his al-

location from the Mexican FCC. But this allocation was subsequent to and dependent upon a U. S. FCC approval, from Washington. But the freeze was on.

Weary of waiting, and leery lest—when the freeze did come off—his application be lost in the shuffle, Rivera took his plight to the World Court in Berne, Switzerland. That was a year and a half or two years ago. Today Rivera is securely and happily putting up his Channel 6 transmitter.

The station will carry most of the local south-of-the-border sports, complete with pari-mutuel. So all the north-of-the-border sports can now sit home and knock themselves out betting with one another! Or they can watch bull fights, popular little sagas of annihilation which currently drag half of Hollywood down to the bull ring twice a month.

Cloying plots, rite dialogue and obviously fragile settings again switched our channel away from "Studio" to Anna May, the "Cisco Kid," the first "Million-Dollar Movie" and "Walkin' Charlie Aldrich." All appear at the same time. Now, however, "Westinghouse Summer Theatre" takes over Channel 2 at 7:00 p.m. Mondays, and ten top-flight dramas have been promised. On July 7 the Republican Convention interrupts; on July 21, the Democratic.

... The disparate camera treatment given a new girl on TV. On KLAC-TV, where she made her debut, Gypsy gets the full treatment. Her tiny dog's head fills the camera, and viewers in turn fill the station's mail bins with delighted reaction. On another station, at another hour, Gypsy is scarcely ever in evidence as owner-co-star Ted Lenz tells people about the movie they are seeing. Gypsy would have a fit if she knew this, being all ham and loving that camera far more than Lenz does, actually!

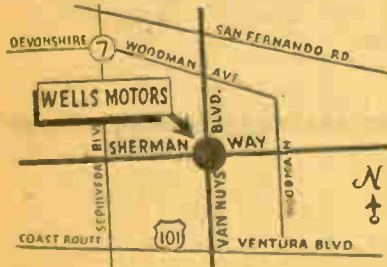

Here's a good idea to keep in mind the next time you go camping, hiking, etc. As you know, flashlight bulbs have a way of "quitting" just like batteries. So why not carry a spare? Just wrap spare bulb in tissue paper and place under reflector, in the space between reflector and reflector case.

THIS HINT IS FOR THE MEN WHO HAVE THOSE CREPE-RUBBER SOLES ON THEIR SPORT SHOES. To clean, simply use an "art-gum" eraser. You'll find it works like a charm. All that is necessary is to make certain that the edges of the soles are first cleaned of all loose dirt and dust. Then rub briskly with the gum eraser, just as though you were using it on paper. The result is a clean, fresh looking surface that does not detract from the appearance of the shoe.

When closed it looks like any other drawer and you can put hardware on it to match the rest. It's very easy to clean, too.

HERE'S A USE FOR A DISCARDED WINDOW-SHADE BLIND. Carry one in the trunk compartment of your car and you will be glad to have it the next time you change a tire or make an emergency roadside repair. Unroll the shade to serve as a mat; it offers excellent protection against damaging your clothes. It's especially nice to have along on an extended trip.

"The Private Life of Henry VIII." This admirably done film biography of England's profligate king established Charles Laughton as among the foremost screen character actors, and also gave boosts to the careers of Merle Oberon, Binnie Barnes, Elsa Lanchester and Robert Donat. Notable sequence: Lanchester and Laughton, forced to marry for royal and political reasons, admit on their wedding night their lack of passion for each other and proceed to have a wild time playing cards.

"The Private Lives of Don Juan." Another film based on the life of a famous roue, this time played by Douglas Fairbanks, Sr., which pictures Don Juan as a rather comic opera figure past his palmy days, plagued by his reputation, and desirous only of his wife. This intriguing version of the famous lover and his amours has many amusing moments, and a couple of lovely paramours in Merle Oberon and Binnie Barnes, who also lost their heads over King Henry.

"Clouds Over Europe" is a very entertaining movie with a somewhat humdrum plot about disappearing airplanes and saboteurs. The entertaining aspect of things is contained in the wonderfully comic performance of Ralph Richardson as the detective assigned to the case. Also on hand are Laurence Olivier and Valerie Hobson.

"The Red House." Edward G. Robinson as a cruel old farmer in a rather eerie picture about a red house, the deaths connected thereto and the mysteries attendant thereon.

"Sanders of the River." A story of tribal warfare in Africa and the efforts of British colonialism to keep the peace. An interesting picture, with some excellent singing by Paul Robeson.

"Poison Pen." The workings of a diseased mind (always a good phrase) prompt the villain of this piece to write anonymous letters which cause

THIS WEEK'S NATURAL SEVEN: Ames Brothers' "Auf Wiederseh'n, Sweetheart" (Coral), Patti Page's "Once in a While" (Mercury), Nat "King" Cole's "Walkin' My Baby Back Home" (Capitol), Rosemary Clooney's "Botch-a-Me" (Columbia), Bing Crosby's "Just a Little Lovin'" (Decca), Billy May's "Easy Street" (Capitol), and Toni Arden's "Take My Heart" (Columbia).

In the Jazz Department, Capitol's new series of albums, "Classics in Jazz," should find many takers among connoisseurs of this gentle art. Here you'll find the boys and bands who were responsible for this phase of American music at their best as "Small Combos," "The Modern Idiom," "Coleman Hawkins," "Bobby Sherwood," "Woody Herman," "Piano Stylists," "Trumpet Stylists," "Sax Stylists," and "Dixieland Stylists." While each item is outstanding in its own field, our preference leans in the direction of New Orleans. With names like Pete Daily, Armand Hug, Sharkey, Pecora, Marvin Ash, PeeWee Hunt, Bauduc, Miller and the other Bob Cats, here is Dixieland at its best—so turn up the volume and hold on tight! This stuff is right from Canal Street!



"Rhapsody in Blue," Gershwin's pioneer concert jazz classic, has been recorded many times, but we'll still take the version waxed by Paul Whiteman for Signature in 1947. When reviewed at that time, we gave as our reasons that it was the first complete recording, that the Whiteman interpretation was more authentic, and that the inclusion of voices blending with instruments added immeasurably to its beauty. If you overlooked it then, it's again available on Coral LP Microgroove.

In the vocal field, Capitol's new discovery, Al Martino, debuts with "Take My Heart" and "I Never Cared," and lives up to all advance info. This boy sings with full voice and confidence, plus the ability to sell his songs. . . . For novelty, there's Frankie Laine (Columbia) and "Rock of Gibraltar," an up-tempo'd opus with heavy guitar rhythms, new sound, and plenty of punch swingin' with the Laine. . . . Bing Crosby (Decca), to full backing by the Camarata Orchestra, still tops the quieter-voiced troubadours with "Just for You" and "Flight of Fancy" from his forthcoming picture, "Just for You."

"It's a Tough Life"

*Says "Whistler" Sound Man Berne Surrey,
Who Literally Knocks Himself Out Working*

BERNE SURREY, sound-effects man for the KNX-Columbia Pacific Network's top-ranking dramatic program "The Whistler," estimates he's walked hundreds of miles just doing the sound of footsteps called for by the script over the eight years he's been with the show.

Of all sounds, Surrey says, the one most often called for by the action of the mystery drama is that of walking or running footsteps—and as a result, he has the most decrepit pair of shoes of all the men in the sound department.

All sound men have special shoes they wear for producing footstep sounds, and Surrey has orders not to have his pair fixed up—orders straight from the show's director, George W. Allen. Berne's old, battered brogans give director Allen just exactly the sound he wants.

Despite the fact that almost every "Whistler" script calls for action, frequently criminal, the program's policy of "Velvet Violence" minimizes all unpleasant sounds and practically eliminates "on-mike" killings or violence. Surrey is top man with

director Allen for creating the sounds that accompany fast action.

All sound men shudder when, after reading a script, they learn that there's a fight sequence calling for the sound of hard blows to the head or body. This is because a sound man will actually pummel himself—often to the point of being black and blue for days—trying to produce the exact sounds of a fist fight.

Nowadays more sound effects are produced manually than by recordings, and in many instances Surrey has had to devise apparatus which will produce a "Whistler" effect when it's something new or so unusual that the sound department hasn't had a previous call for it.

When he isn't a "Whistler" sound man or transcription operator at the KNX radio studios in Columbia Square, Berne is attending medical classes at the University of Southern California, where he has just completed his pre-med course. In four years he'll achieve his goal—that of a doctor, majoring in psychiatry. Maybe working on "The Whistler" programs will give him a new understanding of this subject.

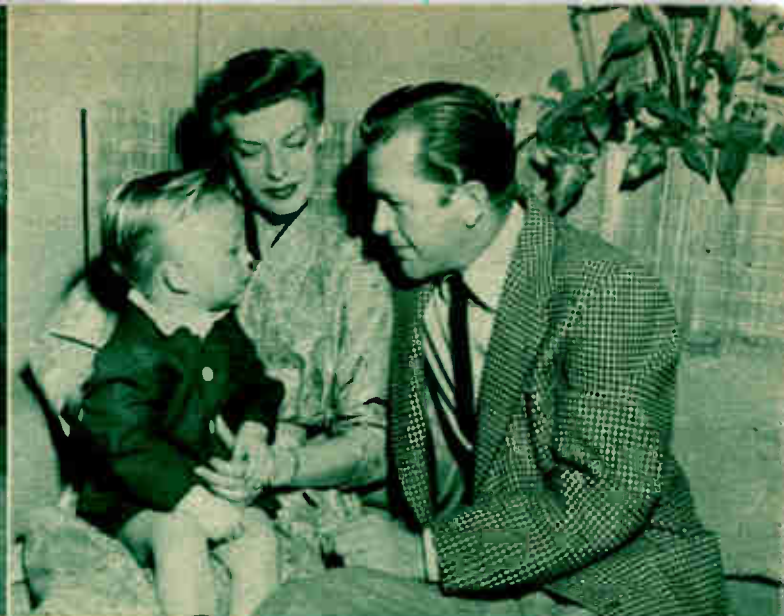

Calling Him Names

Criswell believes that "everyone is more or less a Messiah." He has been called various names by those friendly and those hostile to his type of predictions and advice to the troubled. He has been labeled a "mail-order Messiah, a mental mystic, a man who possesses a most magnetic personality, a soothsayer, a circulation builder, and an adviser on love, marriage, sex, business and miscellaneous matters." It is reported that the Wall Street Journal has quoted him as being 87.6 per cent accurate in his predictions. One theater manager said about Criswell, "A mental mystic? If so, Criswell has no wires, no confederate in the audience and never uses plants, but gives a bang-up performance."

More than 400 newspapers throughout the country carry Criswell's syndicated column, "Criswell Predicts—An Accurate Glimpse of the Future," based on his calculations and his answers to the thousands of letters he receives from people who have troubles. Features by Criswell appear regularly in magazines, and he once gave a lecture at Carnegie Hall. Localites may hear him daily on his KFVD broadcasts.

A Driving Force


Criswell claims there is a driving force behind him which has guided his mind in channels especially suited to impersonally analyzing and soothing human mental disturbances. He would not go so far as to say he was "gifted." One of his famous sayings is, "We can not doubt the honesty of God." Another Criswell quote is, "I advise fearlessly, even though you will not like what I tell you." He has delivered lectures on such subjects as "Success Without Struggle," and "The Seven Secrets of Charm—How to Snare a Man and Hold Him—For Women Only."

He claims to have no hobby because "My hobby is my work." His family consists of his actress wife, Halc Meadows, and a fifteen-year-old dog, Perfect.

"Think straight and be impersonal," has been Criswell's self-acclaimed secret to his success in radio, writing and lecturing. But who, we asked, advises this Mr. Criswell, who spends his life advising other people?

His answer. "My wife. She advises me, as all women do."

CRISWELL, the predictor, and his sponsor, P. J. Williams Company, make no bones about the fact that they have the answer to your ills. Criswell claims that "no problem is without its solution," and he has, he claims, a "knack for solving other people's problems." His backer, Williams, offers a neat package containing a month's supply of his vitamins to set one right with the world.

Criswell, who is forty-five years old and doesn't look it, has what he thinks is a sure-fire formula for happiness: "Right diet, right thinking, and don't say a mean thing about anyone." His blondish hair, clear blue eyes and energetic physical manner certainly speak well for this advice. He started, as he expressed it, "declaiming or orating in front of the wheat fields," when he was a boy in Indiana. At one time he wrote soap operas for radio, but gave that up because he felt it was "a long lane that had no turning."

His Predictions

Today Criswell predicts everything from the outcome of the political campaign to the probable break-up of the most recent Hollywood marriage. About the Presidential race, he made this unprecedented prediction (March 24, 1952): "Eisenhower will be our next President and Mar-

garet Chase Smith our next Vice-President."

Since he is apt at predicting (having done it for fifteen years) we asked this "poor man's Drew Pearson" to make some conjectures on the future, of radio and television. He didn't hesitate.

"Radio will be good only in the morning. There will be a TV set on the market in 1952 that will sell for \$50 and that will throw a picture on the wall. It will be about the size of a sixteen-millimeter film projector. It will project on the wall a five-by-seven-foot picture in color. High-budget shows are going into the ash can. TV will use more intimate shows, featuring one man or woman. Video films will have only two or three characters in them. Crime programs will take a back seat because of constructive work done by such organizations as the PTA and church groups. TV sponsors will tend to take only performers who are instrumental in getting box tops. Programs will live or fall on mail pull. The day of institutional advertising will be over. Color TV will be in the homes by the end of this year. Theater TV must prove itself, as its very dubious quality will not pay off. If people go to see anything they will go to see flesh shows. Hollywood motion pictures will go through a twilight period be-
