WHAT Makes a TV Personality?

Any of Us Could Have the Qualities That Seem to Turn Actors, Housewives, Musicians and Now a Car Salesman Into Welcome, Recognizable TV Figures

NO TELLING. One of the latest the public has taken to her bosom is a man who sells automobiles. (You all know Fletcher Jones.)

Of course his livelihood is contingent upon his Chrysler-Plymouth agencies, and these you don't get unless Mr. Chrysler, Mr. Plymouth and pals know you as a pretty solvent, responsible fellow who can ante up the gelt for every car brought to your lot. But Fletcher will be forever more known as a "used-car salesman" because of his three lots (one deals in used cars, too). To advertise them he starts parading them early on TV, during movie breaks, past the camera. Some of his best friends in the automotive world joined the parade, and pretty soon seemingly every movie on TV was sponsored by a "used-car salesman."

Self-Hired Spielers

Then these gentlemen started making their own pitches. But to our knowledge, only "Fletch" has been accepted by the viewers as a personality.

If you are one of the week-end horde who have tramped down to Jones's lot and met him, you know why. We know why because we met Fletcher Jones in the Brown Derby,

over a cup of tea. The chip fell from our shoulder the second the brown-eyed, healthy-looking young man opened his mouth about the people who buy his cars.

"They are real nice. The kind of people you like to think of as the backbone of our country. And their lack to the show," he referred to KNBH's Saturday night panel guessing game called "Anybody Can Play," "are just as nice. They come from the very young, it seems, or the very old." He grinned. "I guess I don't attract the in-betweeners."

"And how about the crank letters?" was a "must" question.

"Very few," enthused Mr. Jones. "They come from men who wonder why that joker isn't kept off the show. As long as he puts up the money, that's enough, seems to be their feeling," he laughed. "And I'm that joker."

"Well, why *don't* you stay off the air?"

"I'd enjoy nothing more," he explains earnestly. "I'm just as scared after more than 1,000 appearances as I was after one. My first camera appearance was to take the place of a sick announcer, and the response was so big that I just don't feel now I can afford not to go on. I'm a business man, you know, and every response I get to the television time I buy is money in the bank. It's not a matter of just 'getting to be on TV.'"

And you believe him. The thirty-three-year-old is as sincere as a Boy Scout after a Merit Badge, and at the same time has the easy assurance that comes with success and knowing he can maintain that success.

Lost His Girl

About twenty years ago, with his last ten dollars, Fletcher bought a chum's auto, a Model A. He fixed it up and sold it at a profit. It was fun.

That settled things for the Valley Junction, Iowa, boy. When he went away to school, he always had a car to drive—someone else's car, all fixed up and ready to be turned over to a new owner in exchange for cash. Fletcher put himself through school this way. And lost a girl.

"I can understand it . . . now," muses Fletcher. "She told me, 'Fletch, you're a nice fellow, but we never seem to go any place but on rides. And I'm tired of explaining to the girls in the house why we never get



to any parties." He laughed. "She was so right. I had all my money tied up in cars and *had* to keep driving them around so everyone would see them."

Found His Girl

Fletcher left Modesto Junior College, to which he had been sent by SC, which had imported him originally on an athletic scholarship, and went on to Berkeley and SC. He met an even prettier girl named Beverly one night at a church party. She is still riding in Fletcher's cars as Mrs. Fletcher Jones.

The young man who had to finance all his own cars in the old days because he had no established location the banks demanded, today golfs at Bel-Air. He learned to golf by caddying, and is today what envious fellow players call a "scratch handicap." That means no handicap at all, which in turn means that any day the bottom falls out of the car market, Mr. Jones can follow in the footsteps of another golfer named Jones. He can turn pro and live handsomely.

"Of course the market would never go to pieces on anything like Chryslers or Plymouths, and if it did on the used-car market, I'd have no one to blame but myself. It is up to me to keep up with the public—they control our prices—and the only way I can do that is by watching the public buy."

He watches the public by visiting his used-car lot as often as he does his agencies. That's every day. The Jones family have not had a vacation for three years. There's no day Fletcher can get away. If he could, he would choose the day of his Channel 4 show. Especially since the night he asked a contestant if she were married. "No." Fletch, pondering a possible divorce or state of widowhood, blurted out, "Any children?" The audience was delighted. Fletcher, nervous anyway, nearly died.

The friendly, straightforward Mr. Jones is the kind to whom you can relate Raymond Chandler's famous simile.

"Fletch, did you see the description Chandler employed in one of his mysteries a couple of years ago? He was talking about a pretty nasty character and said, 'The guy looked at me with the clear, innocent eyes of a used-car salesman.'"

Fletcher turned around the clear, innocent eyes of a non-smoker, an outdoor man and a thoroughly good guy, and chortled happily. "Say, that's wonderful!"

You Too Can Enjoy Jazz!

FOR SOME strange reason, jazz has always appealed to small, extremely enthusiastic minorities.

Rosy McHargue, the leader of the "Ragtimers" on "Dixie Showboat," doesn't like this situation. And for the past two years he has done as much as any musician in Southern California in trying to remedy it.

Modern jazz is a phenomenon of the American musical world. The southland, New Orleans to be specific, was its birthplace.

Through the years, various "schools" of jazz have evolved. To name just a few, there's the New Orleans school, the Chicago style, The Original Dixieland Jazz Band, and Bob Crosby's "Bobcats."

To get back to Rosy. His real name is James Eugene McHargue. As a young man in Illinois he once sang a song called "When Rosy Ricoola Do the Hoola-Ma-Boola." They nicknamed him "Rosy," and it's stuck ever since.

On His Own

Later, the talented clarinetist went on to play for many famous jazz combos and popular orchestras, including Ted Weems, Bob Crosby, Kay Kyser, and Red Nichols.

Just two short years ago, the KTLA star decided to go out on his own. His "Ragtimers" have been featured at Sardi's and The Player's Club, and had a long engagement at Hollywood's Hangover.

Officially, the critics have classified him as being in the "Chicago school."

"The only difference I can see between the various schools of jazz," explained Rosy, "is that the New Orleans groups come from New Orleans, and the Chicago school comes from Chicago. The critics, however, prefer to go into greater detail."

"I only want to play commercial jazz so the average person can enjoy it more. What Lawrence Welk has done for orchestra music, I want to do for jazz."

TV Big Help

In brief, the KTLA band leader wants to bring jazz to the masses, so that all ears can appreciate the melody, and all feet can beat to the rollicking rhythm.

More than any other medium, television has given the forty-five-year-old musician the opportunity to do this. Because of the "Dixie Showboat," he and his seven "Ragtimers" enter thousands of homes each Monday night.

Although Rosy wants to get new fans for his type of music, he doesn't want to lose the "pure jazz" enthusiasts. He does admit, however, that sometimes he has difficulty understanding their lingo.

"For example," Rosy declared, "one night a teen-ager came up to me after one of my shows and exclaimed: 'Say, man! That's psycho! Who's ram-rod-ding this field?'"

"I found out later that what the young man really meant was that he liked the music the boys played, and he wanted to know who headed the band."

No matter what language barriers might ensue, Rosy still wants to play good jazz that all of us can enjoy listening to.

Record Collector's Haven

*Andy and Virginia Mansfield
Whistle While They Work*

IF YOU Benny, Bing and bebop fans sigh enviously at Andy and Virginia's record haven, we'll go along with you.

The Mansfields have built a den-record library in their backyard that's worth shouting about. Andy started collecting records when he was attending high school. His "bug" started when Paul Whiteman was the rage, and number one on Andy's list of musts. In fact, still a Whiteman fan, Andy has the complete recordings of the maestro from the time he made his first disc. Andy's collection pyramided over the years, literally pushing the Mansfields out of their home, forcing them to build their record library so that they could house their more than 20,000 records.

Bow-tied Andy explains that the music, artist or period doesn't have as strong an influence on making a record a collector's item as does personal taste or preference. It's that old economic axiom, supply and demand, that tabs a record a collector's item, he claims. Trends are also important. A nostalgic trend will revive the "oldies."

Andy began his career in show business as a pianist with dance bands. Eventually he went to work for WLW in Cincinnati as an arranger and staff pianist. He met his wife Virginia, who was a staff singer at WLW. Both found that they had a mutual love of Bing Crosby recordings and they embarked upon serious collecting all Crosby recordings.

About this time (1933) they also embarked seriously on their marriage.

Asked about his favorite record, Andy hesitates, trying to think of one, then says he loves them all. However, he goes as far as to say he prefers the "personality" records, which he plays as frequently as possible on the couple's KFI ainer, "Turn Back the Clock." He likes the records that are associated with a high spot in the artist's life or have a story behind them, such as Fanny Brice's "My Man."

The oldest record in his collection is "Tell Me Pretty Maiden," made by the Victor Recording Company in 1901. The disc features Vess Ossman, a famous banjo player of that era. "Tell Me" was the song hit of that year when the Floradora Girl was at her zenith of popularity.

In addition to the records Andy gets from the recording companies, his collection continues to grow through the help of friends and listeners. He is constantly getting letters and calls from people who want to sell or give him their personal collections. Recently the Duncan Sisters, who are old friends, gave Andy copies of all their early recordings.

Jazz

Andy persuaded his lovely wife and D.J. partner Virginia, to bend an ear to jazz. She rebelled at first, but today she's a convert to the "hot licks." There's no longer a wide margin between the sentimental ballads and blue tunes for Mrs. D.J.

"There are no middle-of-the-roads

when it comes to jazz," says Andy. "Either you like it or you don't." He defies anyone to listen to a good New Orleans jazz band and refrain from tapping out the beat. "That primitive rhythm gets even nonconformists," he claims, "and when that band starts improvising, man that's music!" grins Andy.

It may be the fact that they were born under the same sign of the zodiac which accounts for the harmony and success of Mr. and Mrs. D. J. Andy and Virginia know doubly well what traits, mood and reaction to expect from each other. Their listeners have learned to expect the best from the pair who "Turn Back the Clock" of musical memories.

Will People Pay?

They will pay or else they will not see TV, according to H. C. Bonfig, veepee of Zenith, who designed the subscription plan of video watching known as **Phonevision**.

More than 20 million Americans will have virtually no TV service, or will be without a nearby TV station, unless some pay-as-you-see system is established to help finance small-town stations, Bonfig asserted.

Speaking before the Advertising Club of Boston, Bonfig said that although channels have been allocated to 887 American cities with populations below 25,000, there have been applications for TV grants in only 83 of these.

With subscription, everyone would benefit: station, personality, and ultimately the advertiser. Bonfig pointed out further that the average family would watch subscription programs

only two to four hours a week, entailing no great cost.

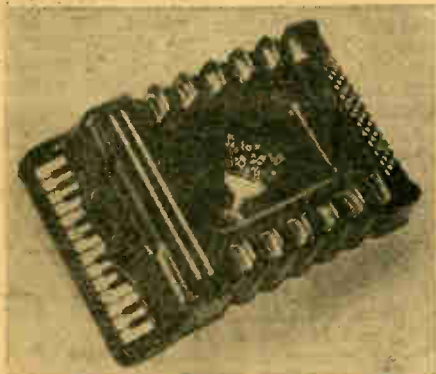

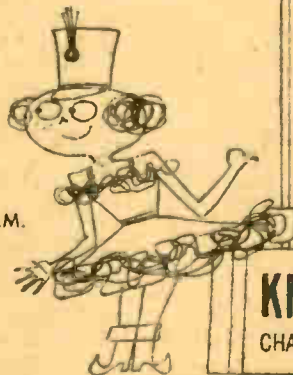

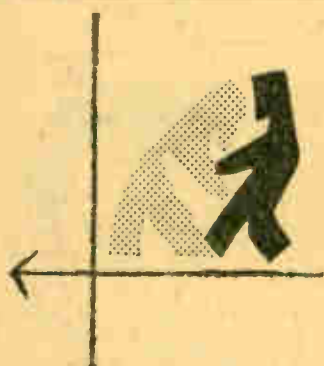

"BWANA DEVIL" STARTED IT and now Hollywood is full of talk about 3D (third-dimension) film. On the heels of "Devil" and its necessary polaroid glasses came announcement of Louis B. Mayer's Cinerama, and now 20th Century-Fox's Cinemascope. Latter method will be used to film the picture which has been "just around the corner" for ten years, "The Robe."

IN THE FUROR OVER THIRD DIMENSION there is an undercurrent of caution as studios realize the amount of film which has not been expended in current showings . . . not to mention the hundreds of millions of dollars worth of celluloid just freshly put into cans. Some ultra-conservative people may hesitate to embrace movies' third dimension, but the majority feel it is only the beginning for something very exciting in a cinemal-land left rather bleak by TV.

NOW, HOWEVER, COMES WORD that television is to have third dimension. Last week the trade paper HOLLYWOOD REPORTER stated that the Atomic Energy Commission had used a Dumont-developed third-dimension film process for the past year, and the same day a television producing company announced that it would film the "Cowboy-G-Men" series in third dimension. The company, Telemount-Mutual Productions, said, however,

that polaroid glasses would be needed to view the G-Men TV series properly.

THIS MADE ME WONDER WHAT standard equipment for the TV viewers might become within a few years. Of course, you have to have your TV-RADIO LIFE; your easy chair; your comfortable shoes; your refreshing drink and your snacks, but if pay-as-you go TV comes in you'll have to remember your telephone call or your right change in silver for the meter box. And glasses yet?

ALL OF THIS IS RIDICULOUSLY simple, in Lifeline's opinion, compared to sitting in a not-so-comfortable seat, dying of thirst, trying to hear the dialogue over the chomping of someone else's snacks and being able to shed tight shoes . . . not to mention the fact that after you've gone to the movies and paid your money you're stuck. But when you're

at home with TV-RADIO LIFE to guide your TV looking, if you don't like the program you've selected you can always switch it.

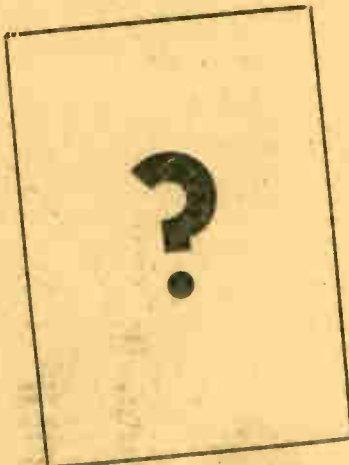
I RATHER IMAGINE THAT TO those in the television industry the Award dinner of the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences was a much more interesting affair than was the television segment beamed to the home lookers. Highly amusing when one considers the millions of dollars of talent sitting idly in the room with the inoperative equipment. I yelled over to KTLA's genius, Klaus Landsberg, and kiddingly asked him why he didn't get up on stage and fix the mike, and when Art Linkletter was able to re-

sume emceeing, he cracked, "If Klaus can bring you the Atom bomb, he can bring you this program!"

FRAN ALLISON IN HER LOVELY lavender-grey chiffon dress and silver mink stole was one of the prettiest ladies at the party and KNBH's Lee Hogan drew appreciative gasps with her pale blue lace gown and matching satin hat and white fox stole (the dress was the gown she wore for her marriage to Dr. Alonzo Cass last June).

HEARD SEVERAL COMMENTS ON how youthful Ina Ray Hutton looked in her raspberry and silver-striped halter gown. KTLA's Dorothy Gardner wore a very becoming kelly green strapless. Mayor Bowron rated a pretty big hand and Art Linkletter got a good laugh when he said "The Mayor is not going to run again for office . . . he's had a better offer from Burns & Allen." WHILE THE FIFTH ATAS AWARDS DINNER showed that Hollywood television activities had really begun to take on luster, I still feel as I did two years ago; that ATAS should make a choice between a cocktail soiree - dinner party and a television production. If the Academy is anxious to telecast presentation of its awards, it should forget the preliminary feasting, assemble at a "hired hall" which has every possible television accessory and advantage, and put on a topnotch TV show. Festivities should come after. Dan Jenkins of the HOLLYWOOD REPORTER, who sat across the table, agreed. In fact we cooked up a wonderful idea . . . to stage the ATAS Awards at the end of the TV season in June, rent the Hollywood Bowl, open the affair for a nominal fee to the public-at-large and take the money derived from such a presentation to endow a rest home for broken-down television actors and actresses!

His next venture was the forming of the second largest school of fine arts in the U. S., in Oak Park, Illinois, which he operated from 1929 to 1932. In 1936 he made seventeen motion pictures and some of them are now being shown on television. One night he and his wife were watching one of these old films and, not realizing Earle was in it, when he did appear Elizabeth said, "That man appeals to me." Hardy Stock

The theatrical vein is apparently hereditary, because her son Philip, who was graduated recently from Yale with a degree in engineering, is co-manager, with Charles Bowden, of three theaters.

BEST IN ALBUMS: "Mr. President" (RCA-Victor LP) covers the headlines of twenty years of politics with the chief players' actual voices. From F.D.R. to Eisenhower, from 3.2 beer and a depression to Ike's election, here are the historic statements of our statesmen over the past twenty years, gleaned from countless recordings and



welded together to produce, in documentary form, "Mr. President." . . . "The Desert Song" (Capitol) brings together Gordon MacRae and Lucille Norman singing the unforgettable melodies of the Romberg musical to rich backing by George Greeley's Orchestra and chorus. Both turn in fine performances on this uninterrupted LP version that presents the songs in the play's natural sequence.

TOPS IN SINGLES: For sheer beauty, here is one of the best in

record production in many a day: Bing Crosby with Waring's Pennsylvanians (Decca) and "Hush-a-Bye" coupled with "Mother Darlin'." Both are strictly ballads, with the Pennsylvanians adding a beautiful chorus background to Bing's warmth and effortless vocal. . . . On the lighter side, Desi Arnaz (Columbia) shows his fatherly pride in "There's a Brand-New Baby," and the vocal version of his TV show's theme, "I Love Lucy." . . . Les Brown (Coral) easily has the dance-disc of the week in "Ramona," with its solid beat emphasizing the band's fine arrangement. . . . "Pretend" and "Don't Let Your Eyes Go Shopping" (Capitol) could be another biggie for Nat "King" Cole, good material for this top vocalist. . . . Dinah Shore (RCA-Victor) takes her hair down for "Salomee," one of her best novelties in months. . . . Nice to hear Our Gal do something besides serious ballads, for a change. . . . After hitting several labels, Artie Wayne's "Rachel" finally lands on Mercury, with plenty of potential for becoming a hit. . . . Champ Butler (Columbia) strikes hard with "Fit as a Fiddle," a rhythm novelty with a hot-chimes interlude that doesn't require any hearing-aids, and "Kaw-Liga," another novelty based on the love of two wooden Indians. . . . Perry Como (RCA-Victor) does a bang-up vocal chore for "Wild Horses" to up-tempoed backing of Winterhalter's orchestra and chorus. . . . Frankie Laine (Columbia) uses his lucky "Old Sun" treatment on "I Believe," a similar type song that deserves hit returns for Frankie's styling of excellent material. No doubt it'll be too musical or serious, and the more commercial "Your Cheatin' Heart" will be the side. . . . (P.S. . . . Watch for Don Cornell's new Coral album, "For You," and Dinah Shore's new album of blues for RCA-Victor. . . . Both should be great! . . . A. M.)

TICKETS to the Groucho Marx Show are as sought after as Rose Bowl ducats. Not only the hope of getting on the show prompts audiences to scheme entry. They want to see him.

His ratings stay high, and people will laugh at anything he says. Most people. A lovely little dark-eyed girl of six and a half finds him funny only sometimes. But Groucho has a ready explanation for this.

In the Place Money

"Melinda thinks of me as her father. So sometimes I'm funny, sometimes not very funny. At the moment I'm running a close second to her toy dog as her favorite comedian, with Milton Berle breathing down the back of my neck in third position."

And what does Melinda say to her

daddy about his television show?

One night Groucho, proud parent to the end, had little Melinda sing on his "You Bet Your Life." He tries to sound off-hand about his satisfaction with her performance.

"I was perfectly satisfied with the way she handled her chores until her fan mail started coming in. She got more than I did. Hundreds of letters asked her to repeat."

And Melinda's reaction? "Very normal. She wanted money," quips her fond parent.

Won't Follow Own Advice

Children aren't a complete novelty to Groucho Marx. By a former marriage he had a son and a daughter. The now-grown boy is a national magazine writer, the daughter is tape editor of "You Bet Your Life." He has no particular hope that Melinda will go into show business, nor any hope that she will steer clear of it.

"My advice to others has always been 'Don't put your daughter on the stage.' However, Melinda's future is going to be up to her. I certainly won't discourage her, because I think she has definite talent."

"All women are born actresses whether they are six and a half or sixty. Melinda is no exception. She's not receiving any special training, but we do spend considerable time together singing. This isn't to train her, it is only because we enjoy each other's company."

But ask Groucho what is the cutest thing he thinks Melinda has ever done and he'll probably answer, "If I ever catch her doing anything 'cute,' I'll disown her."

Ask the same father, who isn't one

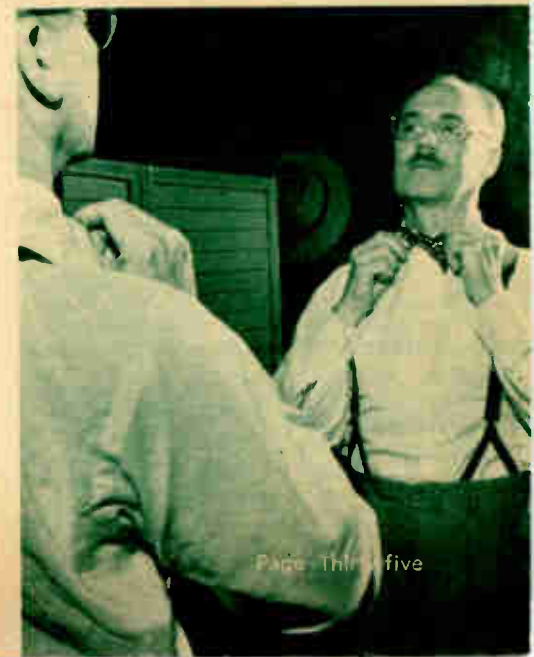

Is Your Personality

By Mildred Ross

BILL GWINN says "Yes, your personality is showing." And what's more he can prove it. In the five years he has emceed Don Lee's "What's the Name of That Song?" he has interviewed every conceivable type of personality.

"The contestants fall into certain personality categories," he explains. "There are the extroverts, who are anxious and aggressive during the tryouts (community sing). But when you get them up in front of the microphone they quiver and quake, and it's necessary to reassure them that there's nothing to be nervous about.

"Then," he continued, "there are the frustrated singers, whose friends have told them that they are another Lily Pons or Ezio Pinza. They want to sing the song they have identified in a special key. Despite all their bravado they are usually scared. I'm always kind to them because it would be very embarrassing if they failed to make the grade."

Parlor Comedian

"Another type of personality is the parlor comedian, who's a success at home, and usually a flop in public. He forgets he came to the studio to sing and wisecracks instead. I play straight man to this type because it would never do to top a con-

testant. I steer the conversation to the business at hand as quickly as possible.

"The well-adjusted people are easy to handle. They are natural and pretty much themselves without too much help from me. They may not be as entertaining as the others but they are a welcome relief for any emcee."

The professional TV-radio attendee has on occasion given this popular emcee some trouble. The "regulars" become aggressive in their desire to get on the show and then they become resentful if they are not selected. Yet on the other hand an emcee can always count on the "regulars" to rally around on an evening when the attendance is low. (A holiday eve or bad weather can drive away a potential audience.)

Bill frolics through a radio and a video version of "Song" twice a week over the Don Lee chain. His is not a simulcast, although the shows are alike in every detail. "Song" is one of the few radio shows that converted to the newer medium without a single change.

Briefly, the piano team of Lou Maury and Vic Piemonte, and incidentally a pair of fancy ivory ticklers they are, play snatches of three different songs for a contestant, who has been selected before air time.

All the contestant has to do is identify one of the three tunes. If he can sing the first line of the named song he receives thirty dollars in cash plus some incidental loot.

Usually when a contestant protests. "But, Bill, I can't sing," he really means it. However, in the spirit of good fun Bill coaxes him to try, and he frequently helps him stay on key by joining in with his fine tenor voice. Bill's friendly, relaxed, imperturbable manner is a sharp contrast to the nervous contestants groping for a song title. While they stand biting their lips during that mental block that overcomes most of them, Bill stands by nonchalantly encouraging them as best he can. If they get a few words of the title he bends over backwards to help them out.

When not busy with his professional "baby," as he terms his favorite show, "What's the Name of That Song," Bill is a happy homebody, husband and father. His family consists of wife Dorothea and sons Michael and Bill, Jr.

First Radio

Bill talked himself out of his academic activities . . . he was head of the drama and speech department at the College of Marin in Northern California . . . in 1945 by inaugurating his own radio show on KFRC.

Showing?

San Francisco. Subsequently he was the San Francisco half of the former radio ailer "Quiz of Two Cities," on which he opposed Stu Wilson from Los Angeles. When Bill replaced the late "Dud" Williamson on "What's the Name of That Song?" he decided to move to Los Angeles and stop opposing Stu.

Hunting

The Gwinns settled in Laguna Beach. Much to Bill's surprise he found excellent duck hunting just five miles from his new home. Dorothea claims there couldn't have been a happier coincidence.

Bill gets up at the crack of dawn during the season and heads for the duck blind. Normally not even an earthquake could make him rise before ten. If an art illustrator of a magazine were looking for the perfect subject to depict the modern-day hunter, Bill would fit the role perfectly. His rugged, loosely knit six-foot frame has that outdoor look.

"I acquired the hunting bug when a youngster," Bill explains. "My grandfather taught me to call geese and from then on I was captivated by the sport."

Bill enjoys hunting for many reasons. "The anticipation of the trip is stimulating, getting outdoors is exhilarating. It makes a difference too whether or not you voluntarily see the sunrise," he laughed.

"Hunting is a contrast to our conventional way of life with all its modern conveniences," he continued.

"The active participation in hunting gives you a feeling of doing something . . . the primal instinct of hunting is satisfying."

Comradeship

The comradeship established between father and son is another commendable aspect of hunting, as far as Bill is concerned. He is teaching Bill, Jr., age twelve, how to handle a gun. It's a serious business between them. Bill doesn't believe in smart-aleck stuff when firearms are in the picture.

Easy-going Bill becomes quite perturbed at poor sportsmanship. Lack of consideration for private property . . . leaving gates ajar, trampling on grain, and the unforgivable deed of leaving a bird in agony, suspended between life and death, arouse his anger.

Some day the outdoor man wants to retire to his own ranch. "I'll leave the running of the ranch in the hands of a capable foreman and concern myself primarily with—you guessed it—hunting and fishing," he smiled.

Perhaps it's the outdoor life that's a contributing factor to Bill Gwinn's relaxed personality. The stress and strain of television seems to have evaded him completely. It has, however, kept him on his toes. "I have to keep on top of it all the time," he says. "I must be kind, helpful without being partial, and keep the show rolling whenever the unexpected happens."

THE STRESS AND STRAIN of TV and radio seems to have completely evaded congenial Bill Gwinn. In the past five years he has interviewed every conceivable type of personality on Don Lee's "What's the Name of That Song?" program, and not one of the contestants has ever flustered the nonchalant Mr. Gwinn.

The successful radio actress is proud of her daughters. Two of them are fashion models, Gini Looke and Mary Fownes, who live near her in Westchester with their husbands. Her third offspring is movie actress Pamela Britton.

Ethel's friends vouch for her psychic powers. They say, "We defy anyone to beat Ethel at cards. She's never lost a game of canasta since she took up the game. We swear she's psychic."

Dwight Weist

Dwight Weist, the male lead in "The Second Mrs. Burton," was born in Palo Alto, California. He aspired to be a writer. As the editor of his college paper, he wrote articles and short stories which proved commercial. But much as he enjoyed the literary life, there was other hand-writing on the wall . . . radio.

He got the radio bug during a summer vacation relief-announcer stint. Subsequently he left college and tried his hand at acting. He auditioned as an impersonator for radio's "March of Time" series. "Time" was Dwight's first plum, and for the remainder of its thirteen-year history Dwight was on the show. "Time" was also his stepping stone

to greener pastures in radio and television.

Dwight lives with his wife and two children in Pelham, New York. He's an avid aviator and owns a Sea Bee amphibian. Aside from flying, he likes to ski or spend long hours playing records from a very large and varied collection. "It seems," laughs Dwight, "that I'm either in the air—or on it."

Patsy Campbell

Attractive Patsy Campbell had her eyes focused on show business from her earliest years. While attending Northwestern University she found time to enroll in a little-theater group. This was the first step in her thespian career.

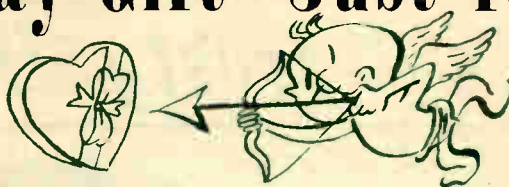
