I've had loads of fun and I've learned a lot from dad about show business. I think a little of his ease and sincerity has rubbed off on

me because I feel more at home now than I did twelve short months ago.

There's a big advantage in working for your dad. After all who knows you better than your own parent? We can level off with one another without causing any hard feelings. Fortunately, he doesn't believe in the Svengali treatment and leaves me to my own decisions. Of course, dad gives me a certain amount of guidance and supervision but he isn't constantly bossing me around.

Our different tastes in music help to strike a balance in formatting the show. I'm always urging dad to play tunes with a little more bounce. He counteracts my modern tendencies in music with standards and more conservative pop tunes—the kinds of tunes that are played and remembered a year after they've been introduced.

However, we agree on our favorite duets. . . . "You're Just In Love," and "I Don't Know Why." Whatever our differences might be we always work them out with no resentment or ill will between us. If I can dote on Stan Kenton, Lena Horne and June Christy, he's entitled to his preferences. Dad is far from being a "square." After all, he composed the "Hut Sut Song" and no "square" would ever do that.

## Advantage

Another advantage in working with dad is the assurance he gives me. If I ever should fluff I know that he'll take over without causing me any further embarrassment. This feeling of security goes a long way in helping to give me poise. Dad has never pushed me into the business. I just grew up with it sort of naturally. I've even had my own record player since I was three. Although the rest of the family—Noel, eleven, Jack Jr., fifteen and Cynthia, three—appear on the show, they are envious of my featured spot. But who knows? One day we might all get star billing. Dad laughingly admits that having us on the show is job insurance for him. The most flattering thing he has ever said to me was that if for any reason he had to discontinue the show he felt confident that I could carry on.

Of dad's many accomplishments, I'm proudest of his note from the late Mark Hellinger. He's so talented, in

addition to singing and composing beautiful songs he can write wonderful stories. Several years ago he entered the Mark Hellinger Short Story Contest and won fifth place. Mr. Hellinger sent dad a note telling him that if he were the sole judge dad's story would have won first place.

By now I'm sure you realize that I think dad is a wonderful guy and I'll never be able to thank him enough for all the help and encouragement he's given me along the way. There's only one thing that keeps him from being near perfect. It's something that worries me too, invariably fifteen seconds before air time he's casually chatting off stage unmindful of that threatening second hand. And his reassurances that he hasn't missed a cue in twenty years are not very convincing. I hope when he sees this in print he does something to mend his ways.

# Is TV Heading for More Censorship?

*Last week the views of the public about censorship were presented. In this, the concluding article, the leading personalities from the industry itself give their opinions.*

**M**R. JAMES T. AUEREY, JR., General Manager for KNXT and eleven other Columbia stations: "All TV stations in Los Angeles except one have adopted the National Association of Radio and Television Broadcasting code. Our policies are even more strict and we invite comparison of our programs with any others. It may not be widely known but L.A. stations have a 'cross-reference' system and we check with each other when questionable material is submitted to us. If one turns it down, we all do. I can see no reason for further censorship."

MR. EARL ZEIGLER, of NBC: "It is my belief that television censorship is satisfactory as it is. I can't see that a separate censorship board would prove any more satisfactory than the appointment of myself as an authority on jet planes—I just don't know anything about them. As a father, I think parents should exercise more censorship of TV in the home."

MR. GORDON WRIGHT, Head of Production for KTLA: "Each station should maintain its own censorship. Of course, we need a bible—or set of rules—to go by, but the NARTB does a good job of providing this. Interpretation of the rules is bound to differ, which results in some variation, but it would be impossible to have a 'seal of approval' on each show, as they do in the movie industry, because of the number of live shows on TV."

MR. HARMON NELSON, Program Manager for KNBH: "I feel we are already giving real service to the community in this respect. If we weren't doing a good job, we would be getting complaints—such organizations as the FCC and PTA keep a sharp eye on things. There is no greater censor than public opinion. I see no reason for a change."

MR. JIM HIGSON, TV Production Co-ordinator for KHJ-TV: "Stations are capable of policing their own programs. We came out very well in NARTB's survey of children's shows,

and we show no packaged films. Educational programs are next to impossible to sell to a sponsor, but I believe we've found the right slant in our new City College course on world affairs. This is an accredited two-hour weekly course, the last half hour of which will be televised. Between two and three hundred students have enrolled for the course, and the classroom is listed in the college catalog as: 'Television Station KHJ-TV.' I feel this is top programming in this field."

DOROTHY BROWN of ABC and KECA-TV: "We try always to stay within the bounds of good taste. We cooperate with the NARTB, Trade Advertising, Better Business Bureau and other organizations."

(The National Association of Radio and Television Broadcasting (NARTB) has no local representation. All its offices are in Washington, D. C., and could not be reached for comment. It is to be assumed the organization operates on the "honor system" theory.)

SAM FROELICK, acting head of CBS-TV editing department, Hollywood: "We are not headed for more censorship. We read all of the scripts and see most of the films before the shows go on the air and always have the interest of the public in mind. Many of the people who make our films have had long experience in motion pictures and, hence, are very aware of what's in good taste."

MR. DICK MOORE, Vice-President, KTTV: "In the long run I think the only 'censor' of television will be the American viewer, by exercising the simple but fundamental privilege of flipping the dial from a station or program that chooses to present material which violates the standards of good taste and fair play. The viewer and his family will always be the final arbiter. For those who might need censorship—a quick turn of the wrist will censor the program."

MR. DAVID LUNDE of KLAC: "I believe that every one should subscribe to the NARTB code and abide by its rules. This should be all that is necessary."

# The Inside Story of the Comedy

**I**'VE BEEN CASTING director for the "Colgate Comedy Hour" telecasts for several years now. I've worked with all the top names. And I've come to know them personally. All of which makes my job an interesting and a somewhat confusing one.

## Martin and Lewis

I probably know Dean and Jerry better than anyone else on the shows. I knew Jerry long before he and Dean joined up. In fact, I met him about ten years ago. I was his agent when he was still a singer doing a record act. And I was with him when he

and Dean negotiated their original deal back in 1947. I was also responsible for booking them into the Chez Paree in Chicago in 1947. The booking was to be for two weeks but at the end of eighteen weeks we had to beg the management to let them go. They were that popular.

Not long after I got them their first TV show. They were guests on Russ Morgan's television program for Admiral. They did so well I booked them for the next two weeks on the show.

Dean and Jerry are two of the most understanding boys in the business. They love to clown around, yes, but not at the expense of the show. And they will never hesitate about arguing a point if they feel they're right. Yet, if they're wrong they'll give in quickly.

The boys' clowning makes them completely unpredictable to the av-

erage person. They can give a guy heart failure by some of their stunts, such as their telling the producer they won't be back in town in time to rehearse their telecast. Naturally, they always show up on schedule but in the meantime a few ulcers have been born.

One of their pet passions is ripping shirts off guys' backs. In New York during a rehearsal for the Comedy Hour, they went around ripping off shirts. I was left with my tie clasp and an undershirt on. Of course, after the show the boys went out and bought new shirts for everyone—except me. None of them fit me.

The unexpected is always the usual with the boys — even to their changing the dialogue in entire skits during the dress rehearsal. There's no telling what they'll do so the cameras are focused in the general direction of the theater where the boys are performing—and everybody just hopes for the best.

I keep telling them that they'll clown so much in rehearsals that they'll make mistakes on the actual shows, but somehow they never do.

## Eddie Cantor

Eddie Cantor always has a high rating on the shows—simply because he's a down-to-earth entertainer. He's one of the few performers left from the old school and there's still a large viewing audience who loves that kind of show business. Actually, Eddie is the only one of the stars who has the right to go back and reminisce about the old days in show business since he's a direct product of it. Jimmy Durante, of course, has been a headliner for years but mainly in the night club days of Clayton, Jackson and Durante.

## Jimmy Durante

Jimmy is without a doubt one of the sweetest guys in this business. He's so cooperative. You never see him get temperamental. He feels

that Joe Santley, the director, is capable of handling the show and so he never interferes.

Jimmy works hard, tries hard, and can laugh at his own mistakes. He legitimately breaks up at times—especially when he's given words to say that he can't pronounce.

Everybody on the show loves Jimmy. Perhaps that's the biggest tribute that can be paid any star. And not many can rightfully claim that sort of tribute.

### Abbott and Costello

Abbott and Costello are easy for me to work with. They usually ask me to get talent who used to work with them in the burlesque days, but if I suggest an actor they'll go along with me. Bobby Barber, Sid Fields, Milt Bronson, Tommy Turner and the Hollywood stunt men and women are almost always on their shows.

Lou clowns a lot during the rehearsals, but Bud just sits quietly at a table when he's not working. When it comes time to do the show, Lou is usually the one who blocks out the various routines.

### Donald O'Connor

Donald O'Connor is the only star in the Comedy Hour line-up who does an actual show in the rehearsals. He's the hardest-working kid I've ever known and I've known him since he was in vaudeville with the O'Connor Family. Don had a brother, Bill, who, if he had lived, would have been one of the funniest men in the business.

Donald has great talent. I thought that ten or twelve years ago and the more I see him work the more convinced I am of his ability. He has so much to rehearse he hasn't time to clown around, for not only does he have to memorize lines and songs but he has to learn all these strenuous dance routines.

He's a very gentle and sweet guy. I wish there were more like him.

As casting director, my main prob-

lem is fulfilling the talent needs of the stars. Naturally, the big headache is getting the right guest stars.

Each of the Comedy Hour headliners use their guests differently. Jimmy likes to do a sketch with them, Dean and Jerry prefer a singing star who can work alone. Abbott and Costello will occasionally work with the guest, according to who he or she is, and Donald will always do a skit with the person. With Eddie Cantor, the system varies.

I spent an entire week trying to find a man to play a tailor on a Martin and Lewis skit. The boys didn't like anyone I brought for approval so finally I got the tailor who had a shop near the theater. When Jerry saw him he said, "He looks less like a tailor than the other guys." We finally cut out the skit.

The other major headache is acquired by the stars' happy habit of

recommending that I get guest stars whose tariff is way up there. They forget all about the budget.

However, I love my job. I liked dealing with people even in the days when I was an actor. I'm one performer who knew he'd never make the grade as an actor and got out in time. Since then I've reasoned that if it couldn't happen to me I wanted to do what I could so it could happen to others.

Maybe that's why I feel that at times headaches have real compensations. I'm certainly spending my life with a bunch of great guys.

# Is Berle Through?

*The big question in TV circles these days is whether or not Uncle Milton can regain the top position he lost last year. Is the public tired of him? Or is he going to surprise a lot of people who have said he's washed up?*

**M**ILTON BERLE was the kingpin of TV for a good many years. Last year, however, saw his show go up and down, then climb back up again, and yet it failed to rank in the first five in Los Angeles. It even fell below the first ten in some sections.

"Uncle Miltie" is now back on NBC-TV again with a show that is showing signs of life. But is it too late?

The TV public has long been known as a fickle group of people. And it gets tired of its favorites with great ease. Since the day when Milton Berle lost his Number One spot, a new flock of stars has arisen to take his place. And, after all, there is just so much that any performer can do to hold on to the public. He has just so much talent and so many tricks. Once those are gone and everything about him is too familiar, he is usually as dead as yesterday's headline.

Milton Berle is probably one of the hardest working performers in TV. He is like a bomb ready to explode. He is one guy who loves every inch of show business and gives it his all. But he made mistakes because of that very enthusiasm, and those mistakes may keep him from re-establishing himself as TV's Number One attraction.

## Refusals

Many stars who appeared on his show had great respect for "Miltie" as a performer, but almost all agreed that he ran things much by himself. It was a nerve-wracking experience to be on a show with him. Some stars refused to go on his program because they knew they would inevitably play second fiddle to Berle.

It is well known that he had him-

self in every act. He even took on such jobs as the music. There was scarcely an item connected with the show for which he wasn't responsible.

Now, too much of anything can get dull. Towards the end of last season, there was an attempted change in format on Berle's show. Situation comedy took over in part, instead of the frantic antics of the star himself. He became a little more subdued. So far this season he has continued to be not quite so exhausting and he has given his guest stars some decent breaks. Look what he did for Frank Sinatra on the opener, for instance, and for Tallulah.

There is no doubt but that Milton has learned a few lessons. He does not exude nearly as much conceit as he used to. He's doing a more solid job. But the changes may have come too late.

Check your recent ratings. "I Love Lucy," "Dragnet," "Groucho," "What's My Line?" and others are leading the field. Milton Berle is not in the select group—as yet.

Whether or not he pulls a rabbit out of the hat and soars back up the ladder depends on how anxious the public is to accept him. And it also depends on how willing the same public is to forget Milton's past mistakes and give him a new look. On the basis of conjecture among those in the know, the public has already turned to other fields and isn't interested in going back.

Milton Berle did TV a great service for several years. He gave it "class" shows when the industry was little short of a mess. He pulled his boners, yes, but can he be erased from the scene? Is he old hat now? These questions would be easy to answer if you were dealing with any-

one but Milton Berle. He's not only a real performer—he's a fighter. And he might show the doubting Thomases that he isn't ready to be counted out—yet.

Berle may have a fight on his hands, but one thing is sure—if he goes down, he'll go down swinging.

# Will Godfrey Be Hurt by the LaRosa Fight?

A couple of days ago before the headlines screamed the news about Arthur Godfrey's and Julius LaRosa's split, this reporter was in CBS Studio 50 in New York watching a rehearsal of the not there—Robert Q. Lewis was taking with a kind of tension you couldn't put were rehearsing a song—and they went over it repeatedly. LaRosa was sitting in the theater. Not much time had passed before LaRosa was called to the stage, and the way in which he responded was anything but friendly: You could feel his impatience, his trigger-like tension as he barked back an answer. This was certainly not the happy, friendly atmosphere sold so consistently on the Arthur Godfrey Show!

Some pointed questioning brought to light a variety of opinions and statements about the situation. One was that no one on Godfrey's program could be interviewed without his consent, and that at intermittent periods he put the clamp down on ALL interviews. During these periods of imposed silence none of the performers could "give out." (This sidelight checked with my experience, because TV-RADIO LIFE had requested a LaRosa interview and had been told that the ban was on—a rather surprising restriction, for as far as this reporter can check, no other star in the business holds such tight reins on his "family.")

Godfrey is a tough taskmaster, so I was told, and all the "little Godfreys" are supposed to do all expected of them or be called to account.

## His Reins

Naturally, there are some who feel Godfrey should run his shows more or less the way he wants to. After all, there is no disputing the phenomenon of Arthur Godfrey. His rise and continuous dominance in the radio and TV fields have probably been unequalled in show business annals. His fans are legion and his fans are loyal. Besides being a power to reckon with among the lookers and listeners, Arthur Godfrey is an important man in the CBS radio and television empires. He alone accounts for more than \$15,000,000 in annual billings for the two operations. His friends in the higher echelons, not only of radio and TV, but here and abroad in many fields, are many and mighty.

Considering these accepted facts, it is not difficult to see why Godfrey would be in a position to control his radio and TV presentations with a tight hand. He is in a position to ask that everything be done according to his wishes. It was remarked that the cast had even been asked to take up his hobbies—it was said that because Godfrey found swimming beneficial to his health, the rest of the cast also took it up. He has also been known to sit down with members of the cast and carry on lectures about such a thing as the kind of gear navy pilots wear. Apparently, being a rabid fan of aviation, he also wants everyone to feel the same way as he does about it.

Further carrying out his control, Godfrey has "asked" cast members not

to talk about their private lives. Then came along a young singer, name of Julius LaRosa. Here was a young chap with talent who apparently felt he couldn't submerge himself to the dictates of another. He was also ambitious and proceeded to show signs of getting out of line with the Godfrey dictates. In other words, he lost his "humility."

Then the keg of dynamite exploded! LaRosa, as I was told, had sensed that Godfrey was mad at him. He had tried all week-end to talk to him at his hotel or to see him, but could not reach Godfrey. LaRosa sang his number on the show and then the situation burst wide open. Godfrey started out complimenting him and then began reminiscing about the many years the singer had been with him. The chit-chat was all friendly and in typical Godfrey fashion—even the blockbuster—when Godfrey said (and this is the verbatim transcript of the show released by CBS): "Thanks ever so much, Julie. That was Julie's swan song with us. He goes now out on his own, as his own star, soon to be seen in his own program, and I know you wish him godspeed, as I do. Bye, bye." To say that Julius was surprised would be putting it mildly. The remarks sounded too homey for words, but those in the "know" knew that Godfrey was boiling inside.

The hassle made headlines the next morning, and for two or three subsequent days. Lookers and listeners greeted the news with mixed emotions. A straw-in-the-wind survey by TV-RADIO LIFE indicated that many a woman in the home, considered to be the typical Godfrey fan, sided with Godfrey. Many fans, however, felt that LaRosa had been given a very raw deal in the WAY he had been fired. Those on the inside, in radio and television, were more on LaRosa's side, presumably because they had more inside info. Everyone agreed, however, that LaRosa conducted himself in unimpeachable fashion. He lost neither his temper nor his prestige by confused explanatory remarks, and he gained stature by expressing his appreciation to Arthur Godfrey for all that the association had done for him.

By the following Sunday night, October 25th, when LaRosa made a guest appearance on the Ed Sullivan show (he received \$3,000 for this one-time shot as against \$1,200 a week for his multiple appearances with the Godfrey shows) more fans had been attracted to Julius LaRosa than ever before. A Trendex rating for that evening showed a 47.9 for Sullivan's "Toast of the Town," which whittled the opposition "Colgate Comedy Hour" with Donald O'Connor down to a new low of 11.2. By the week's end, CE Radio had already scheduled a Monday, Wednesday, Friday program with

LaRosa, starting November 9th and going coast-to-coast.

Friday night after the firing, Ed Murrow's "Person to Person" had as its chief feature a visit to Arthur Godfrey's farm where Godfrey was shown on his crutches. This re-impressed viewers' minds with one thing which many had forgotten—that Godfrey has not been a well man for some time. His repeated operations and his many visits to the hospital for checkups may have taken a heavy toll, for no man can suffer as much as he must have without ill effect. This fact could conceivably hold the kernel to the LaRosa hassle. It could very well be that Godfrey's illness may have tinged his perspective, else how, some persons point out, could LaRosa's reported missing of a ballet lesson, ordered by Godfrey, cause Godfrey so much unhappiness? So much for each side of the controversy; so much for the facts we dare print. The question now is, has this fight hurt LaRosa? Has this fight hurt Arthur Godfrey?

As for Julius LaRosa, his popularity can't be denied. When he appeared on the Ed Sullivan show he was greeted by thousands of screaming fans. He should rise to tremendous heights now if given the chance. The outburst that sent him scooting off the Godfrey shows may have shot him straight into stardom.

As for Arthur Godfrey there undoubtedly be many fans who feel as usual about him. He is on and on, ever popular. Many may feel that their idol has humbled himself in an extremely poor way. Some have talked with some who presented his remarks about for to many persons humil' not only modesty, but w and tolerance. One chap man like Godfrey can humble. At first **Godfrey** hemmed and hawed and instead of talking his way out of it he became further embroiled.

**Murrow**, the reporter, seemed equally relieved when the cameras were transferred to a **Greenwich Village** apartment, where he interviewed a young comedian, **Bob McCullough**, and his wife. The couple graciously invited **Mr. Murrow** into their one-room apartment and discussed, with humor and faith, the problems of a struggling artist.

The co-ordination and production behind the scenes of these live remote-studio interviews is tremendous. The engineers and technicians are to be commended for a superior job, and **Mr. Murrow** for coming up with another "adult" program.—M.F.

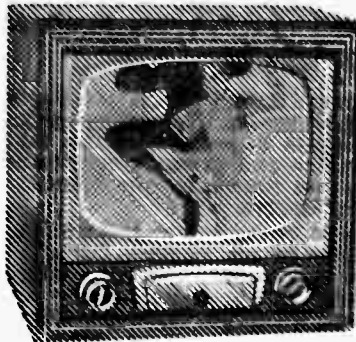

# Lifelines

THIS PAST WEEK WHEN THE UNSAVORY domestic headlines of the Waynes, Haymeses and Sinatras hit a nauseous peak, I thanked TV's lucky stars that none of the involved parties were big-time television performers. For years, movies have gotten away with stuff like this, but it's my opinion TV won't be able to, due to the greater degree of intimacy of performers virtually stepping into the lookers' living room. Let's hope no one ever has to put viewers' discrimination to the test.

OF COURSE THE BOB MCLAUGHLINS, though not making headlines, did attract news stories—he used to be a cop in Beverly Hills. Danny Thomas was sued for over \$1,000,000 by a writer who claims the "Make Room for Daddy" show was his idea—this sort of thing seems to happen quite often nowadays when somebody is scrambling around trying to come up with something different for TV. Newspapers were also devoting quite a bit of space to civic leaders who viewed dimly the recruiting of children to help put over the telethons.

THIS WAS ONE FACET LIFELINER'S article last week on telethons covered only to some degree. I am surprised certain groups haven't howled sooner over the youngsters' going out ringing doorbells to collect nickels and dimes.

YOUNG PEOPLE TODAY, according to Harry Babbitt, are just as talented and maybe more so than those of a decade or two ago. The other noon over a quiet luncheon, Harry and I discussed junior talent, a subject with which he comes in weekly contact on his Tuesday night KNBH program. Harry, who came up the long, hard way before hitting socko, is convinced that young folks in Southern California have plenty of wares and that the talent pool is far from being exhausted. He doesn't think a junior talent show's primary objective is to "discover" talent as such... most of the talent is too tender for full-fledged performance. What he does believe is that a show such as his singles out and offers encouragement to promising performers. All that most of them need to carry on is a pat on the back. "I'm happy we're helping to do that," Harry added. Incidentally, he's one of the nicest guys in the business—a sincere family man, devoted to his three sons and very proud of his fifteen-year-old, who is an Eagle Scout.

IMPRESSIONS: The script's still the thing, as witness the rather sad TV greetings of Bogart and Bacall last week. Jack Benny has had lots better shows with just his regulars, and though it was very clever the way Benny extracted the "confession" commercial from Bogey, I've already gone on record against any stars delivering sales pitches. Sy Oliver lends good backing to the newcomer who sells these biscuits like hotcakes . . . . **The Voices of Walter Schumann**, now on RCA-Victor, offer a fine chorale version of Bedlin's "All Alone" in medium rhythm tempo, but their smooth harmonies are lost on the mediocre flip, "I See The Moon." . . . . **Patti Page** (Mercury) has a nostalgic EP version of four hit songs of 1936 - "It's A Sin To Tell A Lie," "Did I Remember," "No Greater Love," and "Until The Real Thing Comes Along," - with all the natural warmth, simplicity and sensitivity for which That Singing Rage is justly famous . . . . He got mad and I don't blame him. Frankly, I think Art got a real, raw deal. I guess no one had the nerve to go up and tell him what the score was.

After McShain finishes up this week's bookings he is leaving for the Middle West where he feels he has a better chance of tracking down the shaggy haired Continental Nobleman.

Raphael Halpern, the young Jewish heavyweight, will be gone for a few weeks. He flew to New York to wrestle in a big charity show at Madison Square Gardens and to fulfill other bookings. Halpern is a physical culture expert and holds the title of Mr. Israel. He has a remarkable grappling record—he has never even lost a fall in over a hundred matches in this country. He has a refreshing, different style of combat and certainly deserves the popularity he holds.

I received a letter from the Brooklyn bombshells, George and Bobby Becker this week. They are doing very well in the New York, Brooklyn and Richmond, Virginia areas. # Hunting Tips By Waggy

**H**UNTING time is fun time. But even the best of hunters, if they don't take the proper precautions, can get into a lot of trouble.

Waggy Wangenheim of KNBH knows just as much about hunting and fishing as any guy around town. He should. For sixteen years he was the hunting and fishing editor for the Los Angeles Examiner, and he has had his own show on the local NBC-TV outlet ever since January, 1951.

As Waggy himself puts it: "There isn't a place in the West where I haven't dunked a line or carried a rifle."

A native Californian from San Juan Capistrano, he learned to shoot a rifle at the age of six. He can remember the times when he shot birds just a quarter of a mile from Wilshire Boulevard and LaBrea Avenue, and when he could catch plenty

of fish in the neighboring—and now fishless—streams.

## Conservation Problem

Waggy has always been a great booster for the preservation of wild life in Southern California. "It's a great problem," he commented. "Unfortunately, the population has become so great out here, that the Fish and Game Commission has not been able to keep up with the ever-expanding needs of the local hunters and fishermen. What happened to the buffalo on the Great Plains of America is happening to the deer in Southern California. All the wild game is slowly but surely moving north."

## Hunting Tips

But that's all another very involved subject. For those who do have hunting ambitions this winter, Waggy has the following very helpful tips:

1. Carry a piece of newspaper in your pack. When you have shot an

animal, and want to clean out the entrails, do not use water. Dry the carcass with your newspaper.

2. When you pack birds to take home use dry leaves or green grass. They'll keep better this way.

3. Remember, that hunting season is always rattler season. Be on the lookout for them.

4. Above all else, keep your gun handy at all times.

Waggy, who prefers a 300 Savage gun, knows how important this is. One time while hunting near Mount Baldy he spotted a big buck a few hundred yards away across a ravine. He had his gun ready and started shooting. Every shot hit the mark, but the big animal kept charging forward. Finally he stopped. Right at Waggy's feet.

"I've been shot up during the war, and I've had some narrow escapes while hunting. But that one time was the closest I have come to death."

# Who Are the Greatest Modern Negro Musicians ?

**T**HE NEGRO RACE has long been known to be a leader in the field of music. But who are the really great Negro musicians of modern times?

It's not an easy question to ask. So naturally, we asked it. We put it up to a gent who should know—Hunter Hancock.

For the past five and a half years Hunter has been spinning discs on stations KGFJ and KFVD, averaging over thirty-five hours a week of solid music on his "Harlem Matinee," "Huntin' with Hunter" and other programs. In addition he has emceed various programs at different theaters and clubs around Los Angeles, particularly at the Club Alimony. He was the first disc jockey to play all negro music exclusively on his broadcasts.

## Picks Favorites

"My programs have been stressing Negro music for the two simple reasons that first, I enjoy it, and second, my sponsors are directing their products to the Negro market."

Who then are Hancock's favorites?

"I could not, in all fairness, go out on the limb and pick the greatest Negro musicians of all time. There are so many of them, and the situation is so complex, that I don't think anyone could really pick the 'greatest'. But I can tell you some of my favorites.

"My personal choice, as a band leader, has always been Duke Ellington. He has the top arrangers and the top side men in the business.

"As far as vocalists go, my personal tastes lean toward Billy Eckstine and Nat King Cole. For the female classification, I like Sarah Vaughan and Ruth Brown.

"Oddly enough, I very seldom play these real popular entertainers on my own program because they are so fully exposed on other shows."

## Hancock Helps

During his activities as emcee and deejay, Hunter has helped many newcomers get started in show busi-

ness. A few of the local favorites include Mel Walker with the Johnny Otis band, Little Esther, The Lamp-lighters (a quartet) and The Flairs (a quintet).

Asked if he has seen any "great" prospect around, Hunter replied:

"There are several. One is a young man by the name of Lawrence Stone, who could develop into a big artist. I never saw audiences react the way they do to his singing. He really loses himself. He sings with a feeling that comes from the heart and that really counts.

"Shirley Gunther is little known now but she is a gal with a rare quality of voice. There are many others."

Strange as it may seem, Hunter does not play too much Dixieland music on his program. "My audience doesn't go for Dixieland or for sweet, sophisticated ballads. They love a more basic type of music. They enjoy music more with a feeling, rather than music with only a sound.

"It is this kind of music with a 'feeling' that I play. It can run the gamut from be-bop to ballads, from swing to sweet, from blues to boogie."

# I Came to My Senses

**L**ET'S BE honest about me. Not too many years ago I was heading for the rocks. I was an alcoholic. I had no faith in anything.

At this time I was also busy with my race horses. Every time one of my horses would win I would celebrate. Whenever one would lose I'd drown my sorrows. I simply could not turn down a drink.

One day I realized that this could not go on; that something had to give, and that something was me. I started going to hear Billy Graham, the evangelist, and some of the truth he presented began to soak in. You can say what you want about Billy, but he helped me.

My life suddenly changed. I began to hit the sawdust trail. And in a miraculously short time I completely gave up drink and horses. It may sound corny to some, but those who believe will know what I mean. I changed when I honestly accepted Christ as my personal Saviour.

My change was a remarkable thing. Before I had thought that Christ was merely a wonderful man who had been crucified. Then I began to see what great things He could do in a person's life, once His claims were completely accepted. Since then I have gone back into bars deliberately to see if I would take a drink. I found I didn't even think of wanting one.

I have traveled over 650,000 miles in the last three years, talking, in part, to the youth of America about alcohol. I've seen a lot of terrible things about juvenile delinquents and I hope I've helped some of them. I could at least tell them what happened to me and hope that my experiences will be of help to them. What this country needs, I'm firmly convinced, is an educational program

about alcohol for the youth of America.

There is a tendency today for people to shy away from alcoholics. Instead, people should warm up to them to give them aid. I have often gone down to Skid Row to talk to the alcoholics there, and I know how much a little interest means to them. And I have also learned what a really great job the Salvation Army is doing for those people there.

## Example

Some time ago I had conclusive proof that I not only had overcome the desire for drink, but that I had really been an A-1 alcoholic. Some friends and I went on a hunting trip. I opened up my sleeping bag, one I hadn't used in a long, long time, and out rolled a bottle of bourbon. I had hidden it there during my drinking days, and when a man hides drinks he's really gone. One of the men laughed and said, "Hamblen thinks of everything." But I didn't even want one taste.

All kinds of things have happened to me since my change. I have only missed two planes in all of the miles I have traveled by plane—and those two crashed and burned. I missed one because the hotel clerk forgot to call me in time, and I missed the other because a wheel came off the taxi on the way to the airport.

There was also the evening I went to see my friend, John Wayne. "Hear you've stopped drinking," he commented. "Then he said, 'Don't you ever even want one?' I told him I didn't, adding, 'It's no secret what God can do.'" I forgot about the remark, but as I was leaving John said, "You know, Stuart, you ought to write a song about it's no secret what God can do."

I went home, and all of a sudden I felt I had to write a song. I sat

down at the organ at midnight. I remember because the clock was telling off the hours at the time. The words and music began to flow. When I finished, I thought it was about three or four in the morning, but I called Suzie, my wife, to come hear the number. It was then I learned it was exactly twelve-seventeen. This song was really inspired.

"It's No Secret" has been quite a success. It has been translated into thirty-seven different languages and is just about the only international hymn. And yet for a while it didn't do so well.

It had only sold about 10,000 copies. I was working at KFWB at the time and the station told me they had a new sponsor for my show—a brewery. I told them I couldn't take that kind of a sponsor. Well, the upshot of it was I did or I was fired. I was fired. That very same day Columbia Records got between 25,000 and 50,000 orders for the song. This was only another thing to prove to me there is a plan in all life.

I should like to say here that there are four men who have more to do with the thinking of the juveniles in this country than any other force—they are the heads of Decca, Columbia, RCA, and Capitol records. That's why I'm so glad to see the popularity of such songs as "I Believe" and "Crying in the Chapel."

Now that I have my own show on KTTV, with the "Cowboy Church" a big part of the show, I am very contented because perhaps I can do some good in this way. I am not interested in making any money out of Christianity and never have done so. I just want to do what I can to make others feel the great peace and contentment and richness that come into a life when Christ takes over.

If I could change, anybody can.
