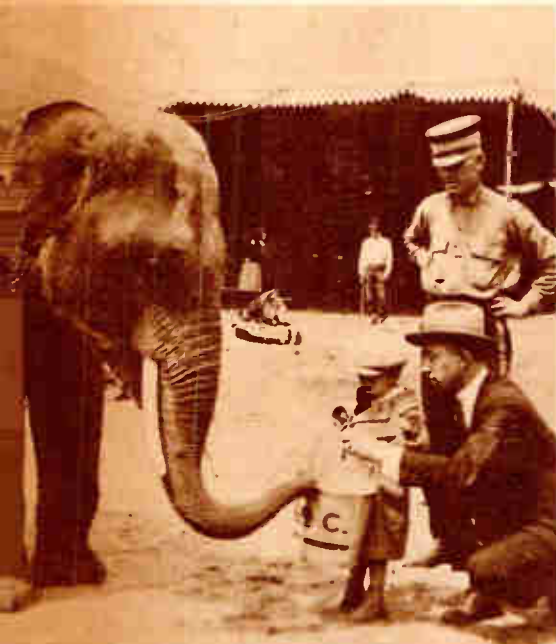
# Seen On The Video-Radio Scene

# Graydon Does It Again

*Local TV heart throb returns to videolanes and has daytime viewers glued to Channel 7.*

**T**HERE'S ONE thing about television," smiled handsome Joe Graydon. "People can't throw custard pies at you."

After almost a three years' absence, Joe is back on television with a daily KABC-TV musical variety show. He's a more mature Graydon and his baritone voice is even mellower than before.

Reminiscing about his early days in television (Channel 13 in 1949), Joe said: "Viewers would watch anything then. The novelty of television was at its peak. Housewives would forget about preparing supper and I received many a letter from an irate husband complaining bitterly that the can opener was being worked overtime because of television. How could the little hausfrau prepare a tempting repast and spend the afternoon watching our show? Somewhere along the line, something had to give and it was usually papa's supper that went by the boards.

### Maturing

"Television is growing up and viewers are becoming more selective in their programs. The carefree days of early television are a thing of the past. In 1949, an afternoon strip could be a hodge podge (it usually was) and still command an audience. Not so now. Today, a daily strip requires as much planning and thought as an evening show. Within our limited budget, we give our local afternoon variety

show as much staging and production as possible.

### Cast

"Our musical backstoppers, 'We Three,' worked with me recently in the Skyroom of Long Beach's Wilton Hotel. Virgil Sewell, Ralph Larrance and Don Beamsley play more than seven instruments between them. They are probably the most versatile group in the business, and I rely upon their flexibility to help spark the show.

"While the boys help me take care of the audio appeal, the Graydon Girls with femcee Barbara Blakeley fulfill the visual needs on the program. I'm certainly a lucky guy to have such lovely models as 'props' for my songs.

"The Graydon Girls are great to sing for but so is the television camera. The minute I see the red light on that camera and know I'm on the air, I feel as relaxed and comfortable as though I had a pipe in my mouth and an old pair of slippers on my feet. Most live television performers freeze up, but not me. I get my attack of nerves singing in a night club or on the radio. Some night clubbers sit looking at a performer with an 'Okay, go ahead and show me how good you are' expression. And that cold impersonal radio mike scares me silly. One fluff and you're dead . . . you can't smile your way out of a mistake . . . the mike just won't smile back at you.

"I'll take TV any time, it's much friendlier and safer!"

# The Story Behind Two EDDIES

*Eddie Cantor talks frankly about Eddie Fisher and tells what makes a young person a success in show business.*

**E**DDIE CANTOR has done more with those big eyes than merely roll them at audiences. He spots talent—and then works like a beaver to develop it.

Eddie's latest discovery is, of course, Eddie Fisher, who was his guest on a recent "Eddie Cantor Comedy Theatre" show over KTTV. With Cantor's series sold on a syndicated basis to different sponsors all over the country, this posed a bit of a problem for Fisher. Many of Cantor's sponsors are breweries. Fisher's sponsor is a soft-drink concern.

"What," whispered the ad agency executives, "will we do about this?"

"Nothing," said Fisher. "I couldn't care less who his sponsor is. Mr. Cantor asked if I'd do a show with him—and I certainly will!"

That's the kind of loyalty Eddie Cantor engenders in everyone—not just those whose careers he has furthered. Meet the man once and you're his fan for life.

## Eddie and Eddie

When you ask Cantor what specifically struck him when he first watched Eddie Fisher work, he says simply:

"It's hard to define personality, just as it's hard to define charm. I knew only that Eddie Fisher had what it takes to be a success and I knew he'd hit the big time! It thrills me more than I can tell you to see how well Eddie is doing. I maintain, as I always have, that if you have the real gift of entertaining people, you'll get your opportunity to do so—in a big way! Merely singing 'as well as' someone else, or being 'as funny as' the latest comedy rage won't do it.

"You've got to be better, far better than your nearest competition. And you must *want* to succeed in show business more than anything else. You can't let obstacles stop you—slow you down, temporarily, perhaps. But keep forging ahead, and with the proper mental attitude, you can't miss!

"To get back to Eddie Fisher—when I first saw him up at Grosinger's in New York State, what did I think? First, that this was a very personable-looking young man. Second, that he had a fine voice. But

it went beyond that. There is an honesty, a sincerity in Eddie that cannot be faked. He believed then, as he does now, in what he is doing. He's not a phony, in other words, and he never will be. This spirit communicates itself to audiences, and this in large measure will make or break a personality. The same can be said of Dinah Shore, whose career I aided, too, you know.

"I repeat, you must want to be a success more than anything else in the world. And you must work at it constantly. And at the same time, there's no vacation from show business. You cannot relax, you cannot let down at any time. For there are youngsters, eager and able, who are anxious to take your place any time you start to falter," points out KTTV's Eddie Cantor.

At the same time, Eddie is frank to admit that he is taking life a little easier this season, with his show on film.

"I couldn't see knocking myself out to do a live show any more," he confides. "Live TV can make old men out of youngsters. When boys the age of Jerry Lewis and Donald O'Connor have to take rests from TV, then it certainly isn't for us older boys," he laughs.

"The pressure of a live television show is murder for anyone, the nervous strain is just too much. Whereas on film, as we are doing our show now, we can strive for perfection without getting ulcers. If a scene doesn't feel right, we do it over again. We have the emotional satisfaction of knowing that we are doing our very best, and the advantages of film back us up."

Eddie isn't exactly loafing, of course, since he films one or two shows a week for the Ziv Television Programs company which syndicates his show, and in addition, he does a five-times-weekly half-hour radio series for the Ziv company. The radio show will be heard in a few months in the Los Angeles area.

In his "spare" time, he drives to Palm Springs to his home there, writes numerous magazine articles on a variety of subjects, and aids in practically every worthwhile fund-raising cause you can name. One of his pet charities is, of course, the March of Dimes, which idea he ori-

ginated along with the late President Roosevelt.

"Mr. Roosevelt's idea was that we get one million men in this country to donate a dollar a year to establish a fund to fight polio. I suggested we get 100 million to donate a dime—and raise still more money. And that was how it started," Eddie divulged. "The success of this is very heart-warming to me, believe me."

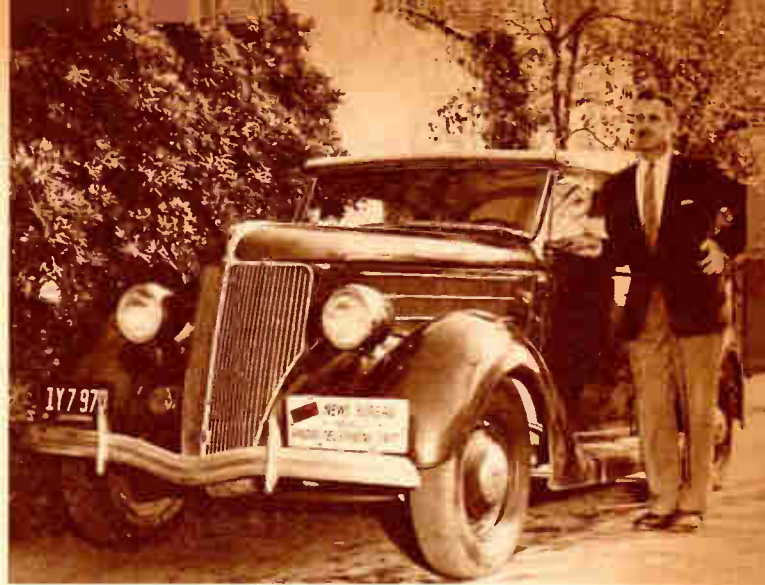
What's next on the new-talent agenda for Eddie Cantor? He'll never stop looking for promising youngsters.

"The dream of my life is to have enough time to tour high schools and colleges looking for new talent," he says. "But right now, I can't get away from Hollywood for a long enough time. One of these days—" he promises.

"Meanwhile, I know as sure as I'm sitting here that no one need worry about the television talent of tomorrow . . . it's in every city and town of our country, waiting to be discovered . . . but it must remember: don't just wait—work while opportunity finds its way to you, so you'll be ready for it," he warns—knowingly.

## Clete's Clunk

**C**LETE ROBERTS is a world traveler and a great reporter. He's gone all over the world for his stories and he's used every means of transportation ever devised by man. Planes, trains, ships, donkeys—you name it, and Clete has used it to get around.

But when Clete arrives back in his "native land," do you know what his favorite conveyance is? It's the old family car. Ordinarily that wouldn't sound too startling but in this particular case it really is "old."

It's a 1936 Ford. That's the year Clete bought it, brand new. It's a Phaeton model and approximately only 700 cars like it were built. The famed KCOP reporter has used the same car, for work and for pleasure ever since.

Clete also owns a 1951 Pontiac convertible, but the Ford, which is a sort of convertible because the top comes off, is still his favorite.

"I'm probably one of the few people in Hollywood who has two convertibles that are entirely paid for!" Clete says.

With the exception of a new 120-horsepower truck engine, seal-beam headlights, the transmission, and hydraulic brakes, the car is in the same condition as when Clete originally bought it for \$700. The brakes were installed in 1946, and the engine and transmission only two years ago. It has the original side curtains that came with it seventeen years ago.

"To show you how much our American society has changed in twenty years: I have many people come up to me and say, 'I sure like that foreign sports car of yours. I sure envy someone who owns a car like that.'"

"Some people think it's a French model, or a completely new style that's just come out. They have difficulty believing it when I tell them it's just a plain American 1936 Ford," Clete explains.

### Car With a History

To date, Clete has driven it approximately 205,000 miles. It's so old that the present-day Blue Book doesn't even list it. Registration fee for the year costs him seven dollars.

"I don't understand that," Clete smiles. "It used to be only six dollars. I guess that's because of the law of diminishing returns."

Clete's clunk has a great deal of history to tell. (From the way the Channel 13 commentator talks about it, you'd think the car actually could speak.)

It had one of the first radio-telephones installed in 1947. For both radio and television (with special facilities for his cameras) Clete has used the car on numerous occasions for his work.

One of the most memorable was the famed Overell murder trial when Clete hooked up microphones in the courthouse and was the first to broadcast the "not guilty" verdict from his famed Ford.

The mustached pipe-smoking reporter gets about three or four offers a week to buy the car; the highest bid, to date, was \$1400 in cash.

### Will Never Sell

"I'll never sell it," Clete explains. "I know that some people may think I could certainly afford a new car, and that owning my Ford is a definite contradiction to the American philosophy of 'keeping up with the Joneses.' However, if they don't know instinctively why I keep the car, then I couldn't possibly explain it to them."

"On the practical side, when I go out on a story I never have to worry about road blocks. Policemen and other law-enforcing officers have no trouble identifying me."

Probably the most important reason for keeping the old model car is that "it has attained as much personality as a member of the family."

"This car," Clete went on, "went through the rough times of the Roberts family when I was making \$27 a week, and when the kid used to sleep in a laundry basket. During World War II it gave wonderful service to my wife and family while I was away. Sometimes the friends of my sixteen-year-old daughter Penny call me a 'square.' But I really don't mind. No, I'll never sell the car."

There's one other final advantage to Clete's 1936 Ford: "When I visit a Ford agency I get as much attention as Marilyn Monroe walking through the Lockheed plant!"

# They All Like the Bishop

*They say only big people can laugh at themselves. Well, this makes Bishop Sheen a remarkably big person because he loves to tell jokes on himself. The things his young viewers say and do!*

**G**HOSE WHO watch Bishop Fulton J. Sheen on KHJ-TV have noticed what sheer delight he gets out of being able to tell some of the comments children in particular have made about him. His reaction to such anecdotes certainly is anything but an austere one.

#### His Cap

His cap, a zucchetto, has brought him many letters from viewers. One family in Iowa wrote that their youngest daughter had lost her cherished "brownie cap." The family gathered one night to watch Bishop Sheen's "Life Is Worth Living" show and suddenly the girl exclaimed, "Mommie—there's my hat! Bishop Sheen has it!"

Another youngster got tired of waiting for his mother to serve him breakfast. Finally, with nothing else to do, he took the empty bowl in front of him, set it on his head, and said, "Look, Mom, Bishop Sheen."

An executive from the midwest picked up the wrong hat in a restaurant and wore it home before he realized his mistake. While he put in a call to the restaurant his young son launched a more thorough examination of the hat. Spying the initials JMJ he promptly informed his father—"That's Bishop Sheen's hat. Those are the initials he writes on the blackboard every week!" (The "JMJ" naturally stands for Jesus, Mary, Joseph.)

One night Bishop Sheen was joking about his sponsor. He quoted a letter from a family. The three-year-old had shouted the news to his mother that "Admiral Sheen" was on.

Then there was the grandmother who told her young grandchild to watch the Bishop because he was a very smart man. The Bishop happened to write "Pride, sex, avarice" on the blackboard. There was a pause and finally the young boy exclaimed, "I don't think he's so smart—he doesn't even know how to spell six."

A Philadelphia boy, dressed up like the Bishop, went around his neighborhood soliciting funds for the missions. He collected twenty-five

dollars. His mother sent the money to the Bishop—and added that her son had also collected some cookies which he was keeping as a "commission." The Bishop wrote back, "We never have any homemade cookies—next time let him keep some of the money and send us the cookies. He happened to tell this story on his TV program and was so deluged with cookies he had to beg his viewers not to send any more."

It is not only his audiences the Bishop impresses. He has another fan in Frank Bunetta, Senior Director of the DuMont Television Network. It is his job to direct the Bishop's program.

#### Directs the Bishop

"My job on 'Life Is Worth Living' is the easiest and yet the hardest

I've ever tackled," Bunetta remarked. "There is only one man on stage and what he has to say is the most important thing about the show. He doesn't have any 'right' profile for us to capture and he doesn't care if we move in or out while he's making a point—though he once chided us for always moving the cameras in on him whenever he started quoting poetry, 'just when I have to concentrate most.'"

"The Bishop doesn't work from a script and we have no rehearsal... he has the amazing facility of being able to finish on the nose each show... because his talks are so detailed he has to be completely free to concentrate without worrying if he's moving out of camera range, so we tell him to move anywhere on the stage and we'll follow him..."

"Of course, we have to second-guess him all the time. I tell the cameraman it is important to watch his hands—if I think he is going to gesture I will tell the cameraman to come back to a long shot. If he starts smiling, I move in on him, because his smile is like the sun glowing."

"I've often compared my job on this show with that of a man looking through a keyhole into a library—only it's a library where you find an old friend with new ideas every week."

That's how most people feel about Bishop Sheen.

**WHAT'S AHEAD? FOR SUMMER... FOR FALL.**

**LIFELINER ASKED CBS VICE-PRESIDENT HARRY ACKERMAN**, in charge of TV programming, and he replied: "This summer will see a continuation of more existing big shows done as repeats." Until now, programmers were afraid that if summer repeats of fall-winter shows were used, the programs might wear out their welcome. Last year's experience seemed to prove otherwise. Said Ackerman, "TV has demonstrated that its appeal is not cut down as sharply during the summer as radio used to be. This speaks for the real hold TV has on mass imagination."

**WHEN SELECTED SHOWS** of the "Our Miss Brooks" series hit the screens as a repeat offering this summer, CBS-TV will be thinking that the spot is being kept warm in an effective way. Ackerman has very definite ideas that shows which stick to their guns during the summer do a better job of holding their audiences than those which let replacements carry on. He cites the outstanding accomplishment of Ed Sullivan in maintaining "Toast of the Town" last year and is convinced that this gave Ed a running start in the fall over "Comedy Hour," which the latter was never able to overcome. "Sullivan held listeners' viewing habits," he explained.

**CBS IS ALSO USING SUMMER** to test several high-cost programs for fall. Here are some of the projected teleshows:

**"THE MIGHTY O"**: Pilot is finished and in New York for sale.

**THE ALFRED HITCHCOCK** mystery series. Set for fall, with "Adventure Theater" moving in this spring as preliminary program.

**THE JOHNNY CARSON SHOW**. CBS-TV is confident it has hit on the ideal format for this young comedian. Show looks as if it's almost sold. Johnny has been cast in a one-man opus, an intimate family-type thing which Johnny himself is helping write. "We're very high on Johnny and would like to

put him on this summer," Ackerman stated. A daytime sponsor is so anxious to sign Carson that it's quite possible he may wind up doing both a day-time series and an evening show.

**"GUNSMOKE"**: Televersion pilot of this popular CBS radio program was just shot at a nearby ranch.

**"HART OF HONOLULU"**: An adventure series to be partly or wholly shot in The Islands. Direct outcome of Ackerman's Hawaiian vacation last year. Advance scouting has already been completed and shooting will start within a short time, some of the cast being chosen from location. I imagine there'll be a mad scramble among Hollywood actors and actresses for a running part on this series. Ackerman is especially enthused over moving locale of this telefilm to some place away from Hollywood. He is convinced that the success of "Lineup" is due at least partly to its San Francisco background.

**"THE ALDRICH FAMILY"**: Started filming late last month. Second pilot in works.

**"MISS PEPPERDINE"**: A new TV show for Marie Wilson. Pilot is slated to be this month. Auditions now being held for male lead opposite Marie.

**BING CROSBY (WHOSE BROTHER, BOB,** has a new night-time entry): Bingle has signed on the dotted to do two one-hour color specials in the fall. In addition, Ackerman, who spent two and a half days huddling with Crosby, says Bing grew excited over three ideas (for three different shows) proposed to him, especially as these would be filmed and Bing could later release them as motion pictures outside the country. Gary C. is slated for several TV guest shots and then?

**ADDITIONAL POSSIBILITIES**, probably first of the year candidates: "Girl From Staten Island," "No Way Out" (anthology of escape stories), "The Townspeople" on which Bretaigne Windust and Jean Holloway are working and which will focus on picture personalities. Ackerman is also mulling a youthful review to utilize talents of young personalities signed exclusively by CBS. These include Johnny Carson, Barbara Ruick, Bob Sweeney, Barbara Billingsley, Steve Dunne, and San Francisco's Mort Sahl, new comedy find.

**"THE NEW TREND IS TOWARD ADVENTURE,"** Ackerman remarked. "The various pressure groups against murder and violence are bringing this about." The general trend, however, is "a mixture, as before — anthology, straight comedy, fewer panel and quiz

shows this summer, and the strong leaning toward adventure."

**COLOR: "HART OF HONOLULU"** would be "a natural" for this treatment, but the network is still uncertain. It is very interested in tape for color and consequently hesitant about putting too much on film. For the time being, until this problem resolves and until more color sets are in use, CBS will continue to rotate its shows done in color, rather than pick a regular series to be colorcast.

**WILL CBS-TV PUSH THE SPECTACULAR-TYPE SHOW?** What does Ackerman think of NBC-TV's "specs"? Viewed on the basis of cost per thousand, it is his opinion that the rival net's "specs," with exception of two or three outstanding shows, have not been notably successful. "We will stress weekly programming and cut the number of our special shows next season," he explained. There will probably be anywhere from 13 to 20 "specials" on CBS-TV, all in the same time spot. However, Ackerman has this favorable slant on the spectacular-type of program: "It is inevitable that anything that will excite the critics and the public will upgrade TV programming."

This is first of a behind-scenes series which Lifeliner plans to present from time to time. Next: New trends in radio.

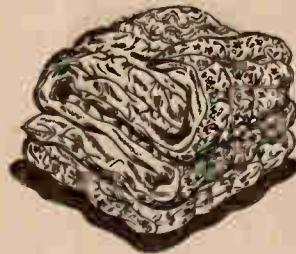

# Pick of the Pix

I have a few complaints about the Academy Awards. If they give one to Garbo, what's wrong with Toby Wing? She hasn't made a picture in 14 years, either. And I certainly thought the sound recording in "The Caine Mutiny" was as good as any. And shouldn't a technical award have gone to Kenny Scope, the man who invented the variable plot sprocket for the internal cathode TV mystery and/or comedy and/or dramatic program?



This little gadget is what makes you think you've seen the same show before, so you turn off the set and go to the movies, where you see the same thing, anyway, but you've paid, so you'll stay and pay some more.

"Japanese War Bride." (13) April 12, 8:30. This 1952 release becomes a TV first run with this showing. It features Don Taylor, Shirley Yamaguchi, and Cameron Mitchell in a story of miscegenation and the obstacles it encounters in our time. Taylor is wounded, is nursed back to health by a Japanese Red Cross nurse, falls in love and marries her. He brings her back to the States, where they run into all sorts of interference from a jealous sister-in-law and some neighbors with archaic ideas about racial separation. An ugly rumor about infidelity parts them, but the traditional Hollywood ban against miscegenation ending happily is flouted in this case and the lovers are reunited at the end. A fair film which should have done

a little more justice to its important theme.

"Derby Day." (5) April 10, 7:30. It's Derby Day in England and this three-in-one sequential film follows the fortunes of three different sets of characters. There is a tale of murder and the arrest at the Derby. And then there is the tale of the servant girl who realizes her fondest dream and goes to the Derby with her favorite movie star. And then there is the tale of the two bereaved people who meet at the Derby and find solace in each other. Anna Neagle and Michael Wilding (again?) are the stars of this last episode and Googie Withers is to be seen in one of the other tableaux. They're off and running!

"Charlie Chan at the Olympics." I kind of enjoy these old Charlie Chans. Warner Oland is the famed sleuth in this one, which must be about a track star spiking roomers. Charlie solves the mystery, of course, but I'll bet he couldn't solve the puzzle of why a major studio such as Twentieth Century Fox would release these old epics to television. It's just not being done, you know, although Republic recently sold 123 feature films to TV, of which 123 are old westerns. Those we need, of course.

Why this boy isn't kept busy here where so many TV shows are being filmed is a mystery. All he has is talent . . . In a recent issue TV writer Robert Dennis did a story about where writers got ideas. An "n" was left out of his name in the spelling. We were probably wearing glasses without the bifocals. For the record it's D-e-n-n-i-s. Everybody happy?

The team you're seeing against the Hollywood Stars on KHJ-TV, Channel 9, this week may have a familiar name—but some of the faces are brand new to Coast League fans.

Skipper Freddy Hutchinson is making his first Coast League appearance since 1938, when he led the league pitchers with a 25 and 7 record and was named "Player of the Year." He became something of a baseball rarity—a pitcher who became an American League manager. He was the surprise choice to succeed Red Rolfe in July of 1952 at the helm of the Detroit Tigers. Now he returns to Seattle, where he first gained national attention, as manager of that club.



The Seattle club you're seeing this opening home week is the team Hollywood skipper Bobby Bragan terms the "best he saw during the exhibition season." It boasts the best catching corps in the league from the standpoint of experience, with Ray Orteig and Hutchinson's old Detroit battery mate, Joe Ginsberg, leading the way. It has experienced pitching, with Al Widmar, Vern Kindsfather, Bob Hall, Jehosie Heard, Bill Kennedy, Elmer Singleton, former Trojan Tom Levrich, and newcomers Moe Savransky, Bob Kelly and Vic Lombardi.

Two of the newcomers are not new to the league—Kelly is the same one who pitched for the Angels a few years ago (not to be confused with the broadcaster of the same name) and Lombardi wore a Hollywood uniform in about the same era. Singleton, of course, is familiar as a former member of the San Francisco club, and among other pitching achievements, hurled more than 12 innings of no-hit, no-run baseball three years ago, only to lose the game in the 13th inning. Singleton has always been something of a hard luck hurler.

If pitching is 75 or 85% of the game as some observers claim, Seattle will be the most important factor in the pennant race next to San Diego, equally blessed. Bragan likes Sacramento and Portland as the most improved clubs he's seen to date, but chances are his own Hollywood Stars will take shape as they have in past years and become the club to beat after July 4th.

President Bob Cobb, of the Stars, returned from Florida a few weeks ago with a feeling that he had seen a tremendous amount of fine young baseball talent—some of which he was certain would help Hollywood where manager Bragan most needed strengthening. There is still tremendous interest in the first base comeback efforts of Paul Pettit, who has everyone pulling for him. Pettit shows power at the plate, and has become

quite adept around first base for a young man who hasn't spent much time there. Paul has never given up, and his fans haven't by any means given up on him, though he'll probably confine pitching efforts to batting practice from now on. (The printer and I didn't get together on the pronunciation of the other comeback kid, Ron Neccai, so we'll try it again. It's Netch-eye—to rhyme with ketch.)

Speaking Spanish came in handy for Skipper Bragan with the several Mexican and Panamanian boys on the roster, though outfielder George Prescott made an excellent interpreter himself.

Club secretary, Paul Jeschke, of the Stars, had a real puzzler this spring when burly Wilfrede Salas arrived in camp. He gulped twice when he saw the Mexican pitcher's expense account—then gulped again when he discovered it was in pesos! At the rate of exchange it proved to be a modest expense chit, at that.

The Stars spend only two of their first six weeks playing at home so you'll be looking at Bill Brundige and the Angels on KHJ-TV a little oftener than Hessler and the Stars, but one of the "road" weeks is the civil war series at Wrigley Field in two weeks, and may the better team (Hollywood) win!

# How to Pick a Pennant Winner

*KNXT's Gil Stratton, who made some remarkable predictions last year, gives some advice on how to pick a winner in the coming baseball campaign.*

**U**MPIRE GIL STRATTON seems to have a genius for not only "callin' 'em as he sees 'em" (a line he's made famous on his sports segment of KNXT "The Big News"), but for "callin' 'em right," even when his pick is a definite underdog.

Take last year, for example. When most experts were picking Brooklyn and Milwaukee to finish ahead of the Giants in the National League pennant race, Gil gave the nod to New York for the pennant and the World Series . . . and won.

And so, with a record like that, and the 1955 baseball season about to get under way, TV-RADIO LIFE couldn't resist the temptation to ask Gil how he does it. Here are a few of the check points that Gil uses. Perhaps they'll be of help to you in picking your World Series favorite in April.

**1. STRENGTH DOWN THE MIDDLE.** Defensively, no combination is so important as the catcher, pitcher, center fielder and the "key-stone combo" (the shortstop and second baseman). They're the heart—the nerve center—of a ball club.

**2. PITCHING.** A pennant winner needs four good starting pitchers and at least one strong relief hur'er.

**3. CATCHING.** An experienced catcher who can remember the hitting oddities of rival batsmen is "the peeping Tom" of baseball. If he calls the pitches that bother the batter, his pitcher always will start out "ahead" of his man.

**4. DEFENSE.** The important elements of defensive strength can be clicked off on four fingers. They are: speed in the outfield, players who know how (or rather, where) to play each batter, quick reflexes and "big" hands.

**5. BATTING.** But withal, you can't win a game in the field. A pennant club needs a lead-off man who can get on base (and remember little Eddie Stanky proved that a walk is as good as a single), a number two man who can bunt or hit behind the runner, and two long ball hitters for the number three and number four spots.

**6. SPEED.** Natural speed in the field and on the base paths isn't as important as quick reflexes, ability to slide, the alertness to get the

jump on the pitcher when going for a stolen base and knowing how to round the corners right.

**7. MANAGER.** Some managers say, in all humility, that all the credit goes to the boys in the field. But Gil says give him a manager (preferably non-playing) who's cool in the clinches and who knows the capabilities of each man and uses them accordingly and Gil'll tab him as the most important "tenth man on the field" in any league.

**8. KEEP AN EYE ON THE BENCH.** With all teams playing up to one hundred and fifty games in a season, depth on the bench is essential.

**9. WATCH OUT FOR "PAPER TEAMS."** Look out for teams that look good on paper early in the season, but don't have the youthful drive to stay "up" during the long pull through the hot summer months. Look what happened to Seattle in '53 and Brooklyn in '54 and you'll see what Gil means.

Finally, after you've checked out your team prospects on all of these points, drop all the names in a hat and pick one. It may be a winner, says Gil with a wry smile.

I'VE KNOWN Bea Benaderet for about fourteen years—and all I can say is that she is indeed *quite* a lady!

Our paths crossed long before I became her fourth "husband" on the Burns and Allen Show for CBS-TV. I was doing radio in San Francisco and this was Bea's home town. But we didn't meet there. We did work together, though, at NBC in Hollywood on such shows as "This Is Your FBI."

Until I became her "husband" with George and Gracie, I hadn't seen her for over a year and a half. She had gone on doing radio—playing the mother in "Meet Millie." I had gone into pictures. So it was quite an occasion when I walked on the set at General Service Studios to see Bea again—and to test for the part of her husband.

### The Test

Of course, I never expected to be on that set at all. I had run into Fred Clark a few weeks before and Fred had told me he was quitting the Burns and Allen Show. I told him I thought he was crazy, that he had the ideal job on all TV, that he ought to have his head examined. But Fred said he had to make the move because his wife was working in New York and he wanted no long-distance marriage.

I, of course, assumed the part had already been cast and then I talked to Roland Winters, another actor, who said it was still open and he thought the part was ideal for me. I told him he was out of his mind—that I wasn't right for it, that I wouldn't have a chance. But he advised me to call my agent anyway and have him see what could be done about getting me a test. Well, hesitantly, I did call my agent—and I did get a test.

Bea had been called to the studio several times in the past few weeks to test with various actors. She was very kind to me that first day—told me not to worry, to take it easy. With her help I got through the test.

When I got home I had a message to call Ralph Levy, who produces the show. He said he had liked my reading of the part but that I looked too dressed up. (I had worn my Sunday best.) I told him just to close his eyes and imagine me in a not-so-hot suit, but he wanted me to come by and test again. I did—wearing the same suit I had worn before but carrying an older one over my arm. I got the part.

### Talented

Working with Bea each week as I do has only cemented my first impression of her—that she has the greatest talent I've ever seen. She's far more of an actress than people realize. She could play "Camille" since she's a superb dramatic actress and yet she could also do low-down broad comedy. As a matter of fact, she is one of the best dialecticians in the business. No one should ever dare to tell a story in dialect around Bea. He'll be in for trouble. It's like telling Joe Louis how to fight.

Bea always plays "Blanche" with just the right touch. She treats Gracie with kindness and understanding. When I first began doing the show the part was written along the sarcastic line—and I played it that way. You'd be amazed how many letters I got berating me for treating "Blanche" so badly—especially when she was so nice to Gracie. I have since adopted a softer approach.

I have been out with Bea socially—she has visited my wife and me

too on several occasions. She's not much different away from the set from what she is on the set—except that perhaps she sparkles a little more on purely social occasions. But Bea is a completely genuine person. Let's go further—there is no one more genuine. She's honest, too. There's no apple polishing routine around Bea. She says what she thinks—but with tact.

I know the "homey" side of Bea and I know she's a wonderful mother. She lets nothing interfere with the time spent with her son and daughter. Her son is only fourteen and yet he's six feet tall—and a very handsome young man, too! Her daughter is seven and a half.

You can see there are several sides to Bea Benaderet, but she is, above all, the greatest craftsman I know. She has been of invaluable help to me on the show. I'm in fast company here. And I'm in a medium that is new to me. There's much I've had to get used to—such as learning to wait for laughs. In pictures we never wait for a laugh. If the audience doesn't holler it up when they should, they can always eat popcorn. In TV you have to know where to expect a laugh and to wait for it. I used to walk all over the laugh lines. I don't now—so much. Bea's been coaching me.

This is a fine "marriage" I have. Even my wife approves of it.

She is most nostalgic when she reminisces about the entertainment unit she and her husband, Phil Ober, headed during the war in Europe and North Africa.

**Is she the kind to fuss much about how she looks—about clothes, etc.?**

**Bill:** Vivian is a very casual dresser. Her rehearsal wardrobe is a rain-bow. She is an authority on Indian

clothes and jewelry because of her home in New Mexico and her friends, the Indians who live in the vicinity. On the show—well, there must be another word besides "casual" to describe her clothes, but at the moment I can't think of it. Just rest assured that she is comfortable at all times.

**Have you an example of her sense of humor? Do you like to tease her?**

**Bill:** Vir has a tremendous sense of humor and is as appreciative an audience as she is a great comedienne. She laughs at everyone else's horse-play and is a great sport about laughing at herself. She takes a lot of teasing, but no siree, I'm not the one who teases her.

"In one of the 'Daddy' episodes Sherry gets her own room and what's good enough for Sherry, Chrissy assumes, is good enough for her. She no longer wants to share a bedroom with Aric. Because her demands happen to coincide with our plans, Chrissy, too, is getting her own room. Her brother Aric will have to forego tangling his sister's hair ribbons and find some other kind of amusement.

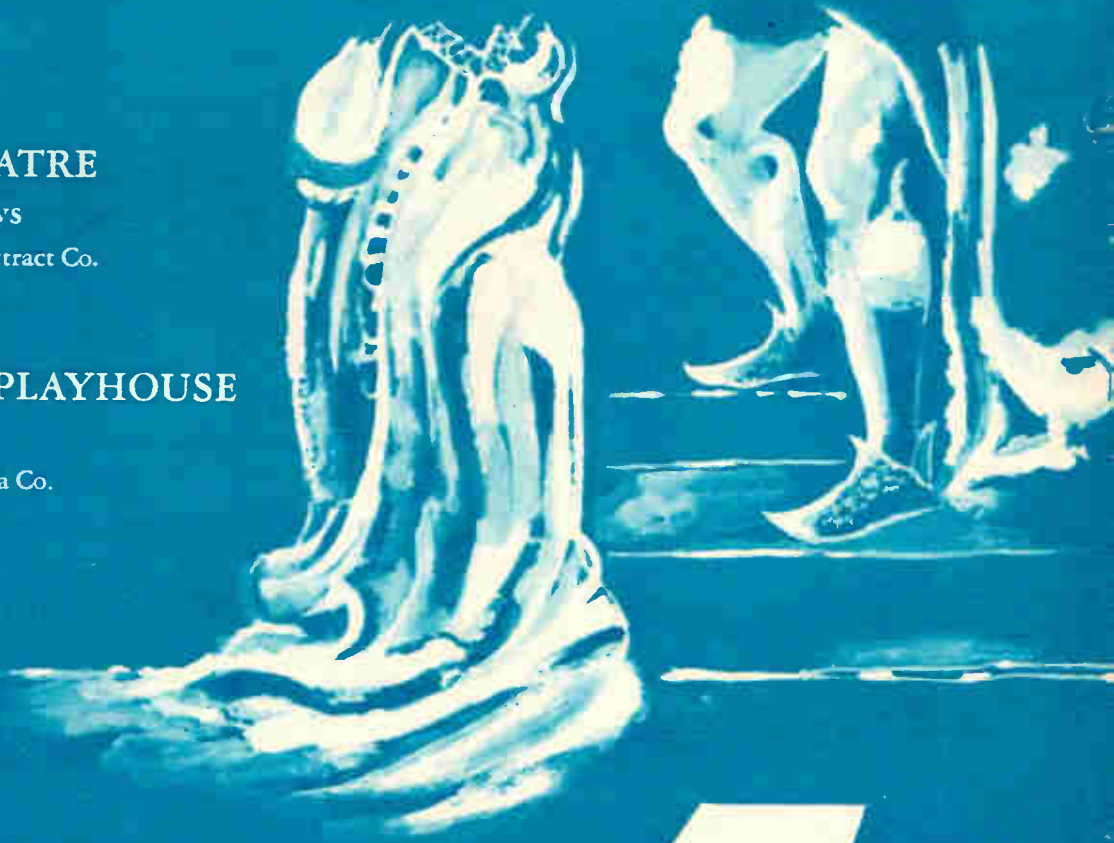
