

HEN JOAN CAULFIELD decided against doing any more of the My Favorite Husband shows for CBS-TV, things were slightly up in the air for a while. There was even talk about the whole affair being canceled. But then Vanessa Brown was contacted, agreed to do the part of the delightful Liz, and the show rolled once more—this time on film.

Vanessa is no new figure to TV. She has done several dramatic shows and she was also one of the regular panelists on the former stalwart, Leave It to the Girls. However, it was her performance on Broadway in "Seven Year Itch" that led to her getting the nod for My Favorite Husband. Producer William Dozier saw her work and asked her to take over the vacated role of Liz.

"Actually, the present series is an all-new one with no relation to the other show." Vanessa remarked quietly. "Besides, all this talk about my replacing Joan is a little pointless. When she did My Favorite Husband on TV, wasn't she taking over for Lucille Ball who had done it on radio? It didn't make any difference then who played the part so it certainly makes no difference now.

"I'm having a ball doing the role.
I especially like it because each

week there is something different to do. Certainly there's a lot of work but I love to be busy. It's not work when you're having fun.

"My Favorite Husband is, to me, a delightful slice of life. Movies usually stop after 'and they lived happily ever after.' Our show goes on to show what 'ever after' is."

In a way, it is odd to see Vanessa playing Liz. When she was younger she was known for her high LQ. She was practically a child brain trust by herself. She dropped that mental kick to become an accomplished actress. Not that she has stopped thinking. It's just that she is more concerned with practical matters in living, such as being a wife.

She is married to a prominent doctor and they have apparently found a very happy life together. At least, her husband has enough of a sense of humor to be able to view her career with a grin instead of with a frown.

Home Life

"My husband has one theory about TV." Vanessa laughed. "He can always turn off the sound if he doesn't like what he hears—and that includes me and my work too. He lets me have my career, but he doesn't think he has to watch every show I'm on. In the first place, I wouldn't ask him to be that devoted.

"My Favorite Husband is a favorite of mine because I'm inherently a romanticist and the show stresses romance and sex after the conquest—or, translated, after marriage. Also, it makes fun of everyday tedium. As such, it serves a purpose in that it reminds married couples that marriage needn't be a routine matter.

"I'm not exactly like Liz, the girl I play in the show. She is entirely domestic. I'm not, I know how to boil eggs and how to make jello. I'd like to learn how to cook, but I can never seem to get any closer to real domesticity than being a pretty good housekeeper, I guess you could call my domestic instincts a cross between Bohemian and conservative.


"I'm afraid, though, I'm more Bohemian by nature. I have a picture of the girl I'd like to be—one who keeps regular hours, who bathes at certain times, who loves to shop. I'd love to be like that picture but it's a lost cause.

"But, you know, it doesn't really worry me. I manage to enjoy myself regardless."

The Human Side of

A Hoosier Humorist

What is Herb Shriner's home life like? What 'new doors' is he trying to open? TV is murder to comedians-but what is Shriner doing to combatthis? Why doesn't he want to be son as a second Will Rogers?

ERB SHRINER is one country boy who hasn't let the Big City or show business get the best of him. As mil-lions can testify who have seen or heard him on his personal appearances, on record, and of course, on his CBS-TV quiz show, Two for the Money, the Hoosier humorist has the same charm and wit which skyrocketed him to fame some four years ago.

When you visit him in his New York office at 133 East 54th Street as we did-you see Herb away, so to speak, from the stage spotlight. He strikes you as being an average. conservatively dressed businessman. working quietly and alone in his small office the same as millions of other white collar workers.

Although he has become wellknown as a comedian, he doesn't try to be funny when he's talking informally. Especially when the subject gets around to his family life with his wife Pixie, and their three children. Indy, 4, and the twins. Kin and Will, 2.

"I suppose some men like o be the big boss in the family. Bunot the way with me. My 1a, runs me, I don't run them. My wife is not the type who follows me with a broom in her hand ready to comply with my every wish. She's too independent for that, and I like her that way.

"She does have a habit of surprising me with little gifts such as a record album, or like the other day." he laughed, "when she bought me a peanut machine. The craziest little thing you ever saw. One peanut pops out at a time. Once you start eating them you can't stop. I'll have to admit I like the idea of surprise gifts, especially when I'm on the receiving end.

HERB SHRINER and his handsome family-wife Pixie, daughter Indy, and twin sons Kin and Will

regular househ old shopping terned, we don't hav'e a chance to go topether except in the summertime when I'm on vacation. My wife would probably even buy my own clothes-because I'm always forgetting. It would be easy if I could wear regular cuits but I have to have them all tailor-made. Not because I think they're better or richer, but it's my long arms, explained, as in ape-fashion he dangled them to his knees.

Not Boss At Home

"I'm the boss at work, but not when I come home. That's when the wife takes over. Even when it comes to talking about my work. My wife was formerly in show business as a dancer, you know, and she has been more help to me than you could possibly imagine. A lot of people say a man in my line of work should marry a person who knows nothing about show business. I don't agree. She's both critical and praiseworthy; but no matter which. I know she's being honest and trying to be constructive.

"You're always under pressure in

roure always under pressure in this business—especially before a prograin—and at those times you need all the help you can get.

"And no matter how you feel 'the show must go on.' I'm not being trite; that's just the simple truth. It's not like a factory or some other It's not like a factory or some other place of work where, if a man is sick, someone else can take his place. In show business, too much depends on one man. If he doesn't

do the job, the job doesn't get done.
"As a general rule, I don't think I'm difficult to get along with-even when the pressure is pretty great.

I hope I always stay that way."

As the reader has surmised by now, Herb Shriner makes no attempt

at always being funny. Oddly enough, he's also tried to apply this to his work while on stage.

Other Fields

The harmonica - playing humorist from Indiana is as aware as anyone that TV is murder on comedians.

"It's not only tough, it's impossible

to be funny all the time. If TV personalities could do the same as the motion picture stars did for so many years—that is, do one or two big shows every year—we'd last a lot 1 onger.

"That's why I've been trying for a lon g time to 'open the door' to other fielo.'s. I think I have achieved this to so me extent on Two for the Money, "the CBS-TV star explained. "I try as often as I can to have attention for used on other people on the program rather than myself. It helps me, to thave them look good."

Actually, Here's revealed, he would like to do the same kind of a format that he formerly died on his program. Herb Shriner Time.

No.* Second Will Roge. *S

"It was the type of thing—I though George Burns does it very well— where you speak directly to the audience and invite them to almost participate in the program while you're sitting in their living rooms.'

Finally, there's one other topic that Herb has always had on his mind. Ever since he started to chat between his harmonica solos ("That's the way I began in this business, you know.") he has always been compared to the immortal Will

"It's not that I blame the press because I realize that in writing up a performer they have to give the reader some comparison. But I never have and never will try to be a second Will Rogers. No one could ever really do that. He was too great.

"As a matter of fact, I even turned down the offer to do his life for motion pictures because I was trying to get away from any similarity be-tween us. I think if I had appeared in public 20 years or more after Mr. Rogers' death, the comparison never would have been made in the first place. I remember a fellow who did a 'Second Will Rogers' act and he never got anywhere.'

The same thing hasn't happened to Herb Shriner, the First, and he's glad of it.

Fiver since Mark Stevens took over the reins of Big Town things have changed considerably. For one, a young lady named Doe Avedon is now decorating the scenery.

shake-up for Big Town

FEW. MONTHS back thee popular KRCA-N.BC-TV offering. Big Town, get itself a new look—and, a man named Mark Stevens was responsible.

Mark, a prominent motion picture and TV actor himself and now a producer and director of TV and movies, his latest motion picture being "Timetable," was handed the reins of Big Town. He had directed a few and starred in several of the series for Gross-Krasne. But then came some differences of opinion between Mark and Gross-Krasne. Mark thought the program should be made one way, and the company thought it should be done another. So the matter was turned over to Lever Bros., who sponsor this show. They liked what Mark had done and they turned over the package to him.

Changes

This was a rare thing in the business. But it only pointed up how far Mark had progressed. He immediately went to work giving Big Town a face-lift. One of his first moves was to spend a good hunk of money on the set for the city room. Here is an exact replica, to the last detail, of an actual city room in a big newspaper. Then he turned his attention to more timely topics for Big Town. Subjects like illegal entry of aliens, sleeping pills, gambling empires, withholding sources of information were dealt with on the show. In other words, Big Town began playing catch with dynamite.

Among other significant changes is the emphasis Mark is putting on scripts. To him, the writer, actor, director and producer are important in that order. He feels that the right story is the important element because without that neither the actor nor the director can do much. Other actors like to work under him as director too because they know he is an actor and can therefore understand their problems.

Two other changes are Mark's decision to make a new commercial for each program, a radical departure for filmed shows, and the introduction of Doe Avedon as the romantic interest.

Doe Avedon

Mark refers to Doe as a lean gazelle, and this tall, lean young lady is just about that. She had made a good dent for herself in such pictures as "The High and the Mighty" and "Deep in My Heart," but had confined her TV appearances to one pilot film with Keenan Wynn which so far has not been sold.

She wasn't thinking much about TV. In fact, she recently took herself to Europe for a three-month vacation. When she returned to New York, she was visiting a friend in a hospital when a call came for her from Mark Stevens' company. Would she be interested in doing Big Town? Doe thought for a few seconds and said, "Yes."

Doe hasn't changed much with all of her success since she first came here in April of 1953.

"I have my same car, I live in an apartment, and I have my same dog," Doe remarked in her flip manner. "And I'm still single—with no marriage plans.

"I owe a great deal to Mark and to Eddie Rissiener of the company. They are great people to work for."

Doe operates on a free-wheeling basis in that she likes to do things on an impulse and in that she doesn't believe in planning too far in advance.

"Things change too fast," she said with a smile. "It's not a matter of living st for today but I'll be around

ig time and where I'll be or nat I'll be doing a few months from now I don't know. So I don't believe in tying myself down unnecessarily to schedules. The only commitment I have now is Big Town, and that's a pleasure.

"I also have no goals set up for myself. Whatever comes along is okay with me. In that respect I'm not a girl passionately devoted to anything—even a career. Sure I like to work and I shall probably work a long time, but my career isn't my whole life by a long shot."

Doe likes the simple kind of life. She dislikes parties intensely and she has no time for fuss and folderol. Her casual and careless hair-do is a pret by good expression of the uncomplicated life she likes to lead.

With Doe around Big Town and with Mark Stevens at the helm, a lot more than new life is being breathed into this TV stalwart.

NO MORE TV REPAIRS?

Transistors are now replacing all receiving tubes with good results in newly designed radios of various sizes, including "All Transistor Car-Radios" which reportedly will be used in most of the 1956 car models.

Designers of TV sets are also experimenting with transistors and it is believed that they will be used in Color TV Sets at a later stage but not in Black and White sets.

The advantage of using transistors is two-fold: Firstly, cut down of the breakdown ratio of the now very sensitive tubes and secondly, conservation of space.

But as long as you have to be satisfied with your present TV set, you should realize and face the maintenance problem involved.

The most reasonable service plan was worked out by Television Industries in 1949 and is still considered the best available. Television Industries will write a Parts Warranty on your set for only \$15.00 for one full year, on a two year basis covering any and all parts including the large picture tube up to and including a 21 inch screen.

He plays a shy, circumspect little fellow who dreams of grandeur and concocts a scheme to rob the Bank of England of its gold bullion, transmute it into little replicas of the Eiffel Tower and transport them out of the country, where he expects to live a life of conspicuous consumption the rest of his days. He enlists the aid of small time toy manufacturer Stan. ley Holloway and together they lure a third fellow into their enterprise, a burglar who can give it the profes-sional touch. The robbery is carried off successfully, the gold is changed into small Eiffel Towers, and then everything goes awry. Some of the towers fall into innocent hands and the two conspirators have a devil of a time getting them back, summoning all their small reserve of courage to deal with the series of unexpected and thoroughly maddening setbacks that threaten their mission. Guinness and Holloway are surely the two most engaging fellows ever to rob the Bank of England, and the delightful screen-play of this 1952 production was good enough to win an Academy Award.

"The Little Fugitive." (5) Nov. 20, 7:30. Once again a difficult choice has to be made between watching this film and the aforementioned. Produced in 1953 by Ray Ashley and Morris Engel. who also directed, "The Little Fugitive" shows what can be done by a couple of guys with a camera, a little money and a lot of taste and creativity. Done in a semi-documentary fashion, the story follows a little boy through a day's experiences at Coney Island after he has run away from home under the mistaken impression that he has killed his brother. He spends all his money doing the usual things at an amusement park and then is forced into the bottle collecting business to finance further debauchery. The wonderful thing to watch is the abandon, the energy, the pure sensuous enjoyment of the boy as he gorges himself on unfamiliar pleasures, and the periodic fits of

depression as he realizes that he is, indeed, an outcast. Richie Andrusco plays the boy with a naturalness that is approached by no professional actors performing today, so I suppose it isn't fair to call it acting. Let's just say that he is the boy and that he is a warming and touching person to watch.

"Christopher Columbus." (13) Nov. 22, 8:30. This 1949 J. Arthur Rank production tells in rather commonplace fashion the story of Christopher Columbus, his trials at the Spanish court, his tribulations on the high seas and his final ignominy. What could have been a grandly exciting adventure becomes here a turgid, finicky presentation of the facts known to every schoolboy and is dwelt on at such length that the new world grows old in the process. Fredric March struggles against the script with a scenery chewing performance that must be chalked up as one of his less than inspiring jobs.

Stars on Radio; Angels on TV

The biggest news in the TV-radio world this week was a radio scoop.

KFWB President Harry Maizlish announced that his station has purchased exclusive radio rights to all the Hollywood Star baseball games for 1956.

There will be no TV of Hollywood games at home or away. The Los Angeles Angels will televise their home games on KHJ-TV, Channel 9, except on Friday. The remaining weekday games will be televised in the afternoon, rather than in the evenings as during the previous seasons.

Maizlish said, "Past history shows that radio does not hurt attendance but instead stimulates it." He de-clared he was confident that the "no-TV" policy would reflect increased attendance at Gilmore Field and prove that baseball still was America's number one sport.

The announcement, made at a press conference at the Los Feliz Brown Derby, was unprecedented in baseball in the TV era. During the past four years, the Stars have allowed all of their home games to be telecast. The 1956 policy is a return to the 1948 program when all Twink games were released over radio but a blackout was observed on TV for home games.

KFWB has been broadcasting Star

games, home and on the road, since

It was believed that all baseball would watch with great interest the result of this policy on the Twink box office in '56. On the Pacific Coast, only two league clubs—Portland and Sacramento—had no TV whatsoever in 1955. All of the other teams followed a program of releasing all home games or releasing a limited number.

Douglas-Israel-Tapes

Hugh Douglas' trip to Israel last summer produced some very pertinent tape recordings which CBS-KNX news editor Barney Miller presented on recent Sunday Desk broadcasts. The new Israeli-Egyptian flareup has focused the headlines in the Far East and Miller plans to use more of Hugh's tape-recorded interviews on upcoming Sunday Desk airers.



After having talked to the people of import in the New York television eircles, you get the feeling that most of them are refusing to admit that Hollywood as a setting for TV shows exists. There is a definite tendency to look upon Hollywood efforts as mediocre, pointless, not in a class with the production in New York. Yet. you know that such an attitude is mere bravado. You know that whether the people in the Big. City like it or not. Hollywood is becoming more and more the center of TV activity. New York holds the edge only when it comes to live shows. And there are very few good live shows left. Playwrights '56 is one program that does recognize the existence of Hollywood and appreciates its contributions since it is dividing its time between New York and Hollywood. Some shows will be done in the east, some here. You imply to some of the producers of live dramatic shows that drama in Hollywood can be as effective in the west as in the east and you get horrified expressions.

In no way is this meant to minimize the fine efforts of New York pro-

ducers. But it is amusing to see the last ditch battle being waged, the battle to prove that Hollywood is a setting for morons, mediocrity, and the haven for men who couldn't make good in New York or as producers of pictures for the motion picture industry. In fact, one noted New York personality said that those making films for TV in Hollywood are the ones who couldn't make the grade as producers for feature motion pictures. That, alone, should be proof of the jaundiced attitude the east has of the west.

In New York, the talk was primarily about the successful Noel Coward-Mary Martin show done on Ford Star Jubilee. There were those who made some cynical comments about Mr. Coward's personality, but those who are in the know recognized this show as one of the major steps ahead for TV.

There is much talk in the Big City now too about Paul Coates since his show became syndicated. It has caught on as fast there as it did in Hollywood. There is a growing interest too in Lawrence Welk's program. although the interest is not as pronounced as it is in Coates. But I have a hunch that Lawrence will soon be riding the same successful bandwagon that launched Liberace into national fame. Another interesting observation was that Lucy and Desi were again being talked of a lot—and most people felt that they were going to have another hot season.

As a final recap of the New York vs. Hollywood set-up, looking over the New York TV logs points up one thing -if it weren't for the Hollywood out, put, there'd be some mighty scarce fare offered. About three-fourths of the evening shows are recognizable Hollywood products. You can take that as an indication of what to look for as far as the future is concerned if you wish. So let's just settle for this-New York offers shows of real importance and so does Hollywood. And neither should refuse to admit that the efforts of both are necessary if TV is to advance.

At any rate, it's good to be getting back and it's nice to remember all the fine people who were so cooperative and who helped to make this a pleasant trip. And one of the most pleasant memories of all will be seeing the play. "No Time for Sergeants," which began as a TV show with Andy Griffith starred, and wound up as a smash hit on Broadway with Andy and Roddy McDowall carrying the ball. This is the first TV play to be taken to Broadway and turned into a hit. There may be others but it will take a lot to equal "Sergeants." Paddy Chayefsky may be enjoying a success on the stage, though, when Edward G. Robinson stars in February in his new play.

Give Your IQ a Lift With Television

Wise and witty Dr. Frank Baxter punctures the captious critic with a non-Shakespearean barb.

NDISCRIMINATE criticism of television is easy. Who can deny there isn't a lot of room for improvement? But can't you say the same about life? The self-appointed television critic has merely to single out his pet peeve and sound off—without, of course, evaluating the medium in its entirety. It's very much like the person who is of the opinion that life is a sorry mess. Beginning with such a philosophy he has little trouble in finding specific cases to illustrate his viewpoint. But to illustrate a viewpoint does not mean that it is proved. So it is with television—an epicurean feast of communication with an appeal to every taste magnificently spread before us every day. It is our task but to choose, to select. If criticism must be made, isn't it perhaps wiser to criticize the selectivity of the viewer?"

Wise and witty Dr. Frank Baxter leaned back in his reading chair and puffed on his pipe. The learned professor who somewhat resembles a whimsical kewpie with a towering IQ and whose twinkling blue eyes are as eloquent as his command of the language, was discoursing on the contributions of television to learning and the eventual probability of lifting the general level of cultural appreciation.

"I don't think we should worry about steam-rollering the public with culture. Unlike selling the mechanical marvels of this age such as washing machines and ice-boxes, cultural appreciation is not a high-pressure commodity for selling. It is a thing of gentle acquisition, like acquiring a taste for fine wine. One cannot hurry such things. And it must be remembered that rather than a must, a thing of compulsion, learning must be a pleasurable and enriching experience. Development of tastes and appreciation is therefore a process of evolution."

The professor, who perhaps more than anyone else has shown via television that learning is enjoyable through his KNXT programs on Shakespeare and literature, started his career as an ardent foe of Shakespeare.

"The teaching approach to Shakespeare in my high school days was the torturous one, where, like an overlong-embalmed cadaver, the plays were laid out before us for dissection—the majestic beauty of the poetry reduced to parsed fragments, the almost unearthly insight into the human mind and heart that is Shake-speare's great genius wasn't available even in fragments. It was non-existent."

It was not until years later on attending a small production of a Shakespearean play in a high school auditorium that the Shakespearean bug bit the man who has become the Bard's greatest exponent in the twentieth-century theater, television.

"You see, that's one of the great things about television, too. It enables the student to escape the teacher," Dr. Baxter chuckled.


"Think of the youngsters today who have the great heritage of our Western world brought into their homes. An eight-year-old child rarely gets to the theater. Yet in his home he can witness the finest productions of Shakespeare to a greater advantage than sitting in a crowded auditorium. Through the intimacy of television the play is brought to him for his inspection at close range, and though he may not realize the full import of the language, the concomitant gestures and facial expressions of the actor carry the meaning. He is learning, enjoying, tasting, savoring one of the great geniuses of all time. Shakespeare, of course, is but an example, an example which can be multiplied on all fronts of the horizons of knowledge. But it is an indication of the tremendous impact television is having to awaken the curiosity, to stimulate the mind, to roll back the horizons of our world in both space and time, the sweeping panorama of all mankind. Considering that evolutionary process, television is a limitless realm for developing the most widely learned and intelligent public in the history of man.

"I don't know," smiled Dr. Baxter, "but I rather think that many of our indiscriminate critics of television are probably the same breed who once upon a time sounded off when another great development in human communication made its first appearance—the invention of printing from movable type. I am inclined to believe our critic of television is in the same vulnerable position.


"I suppose you might say," Dr. Baxter's eyes twinkled, "that I believe television is here to stay."

BACKSTAGE WITH THE

Queens

Behind the smooth Queen for a Day broadcasts are two backroom operators who frantically plan the individual prizes for Her Majesty.

BACKSTAGE visit to Queen for a Day proved just how hectic life is behind the scenes of a television program. On stage, the Queen cast go through their paces

Queen cast go through their paces at a comparatively relaxed tempo while those backstage work themselves up into a nervous frenzy.

Within seconds after the queen is selected her wishes, plus some additional gifts, are fulfilled. Did you ever wonder what behind-the-scenes magic was being worked to produce these fast results? A well stocked store room and the team of a prolific writer, Bill Lutz, and an ingenious merchandiser, Charles Forman, form the winning combination that work these wonders on the KHJ show.

Wandering backstage through the labyrinth of merchandise piled mountain high is something like Alice in Wonderland's trip. You find yourself surrounded by rugs, stoves, freezers, washing machines, baby carriages, TV sets, radios, pots and pans, luggage, baby furniture and small appliances. Every bit of merchandise is allocated to an exact spot so that it can be hauled on camera at a second's notice. An agile stage hand rules this domain and his word is law.

Off-stage, just a few steps from this simulated warehouse, is a dress-

ing room equipped with a special loudspeaker. Closeted here during airtime are two geniuses, Bill Lutz and Charles Forman. Their routine is a sure-fire prescription for developing a case of ulcers. With loudspeaker tuned up high, they listen attentively while Jack Bailey pries useful information from each contestant. Jack's pointed questioning reveals interesting material which helps these two backroom plotters.

If there are four contestants there are four "Your wish shall be granted" speeches written backstage while the program is on the air. The afternoon we were eavesdropping, one woman needed a new transmission for her car, one wanted the program to find her missing son, another wanted a fence for her backyard, and another needed a water heater. While these women were telling their stories things were happening fast in operation backroom. From a master file, Charles yanked cards containing a list of the things that would fulfill each of their wishes. From these cue cards, Bill quickly composed little speeches for Jack.

Then came the critical moment when the audience picked the winner by metered applause. It was contestant number three who wanted a fence so that her children could play safely in their backyard. Quick as lightning, Chuck and Bill discussed

the pay-off prize, wrote the speech, whipped it out of the typewriter and rushed it on stage just in time for Jack to say: "Your Majesty, in addition to getting the fence for your backyard and all these wonderful prizes, we would like to add a little something for your children... an outdoor gym apparatus, a tricycle and a rocking horse." As Jack concluded, the curtains parted and the pay-off prizes were pushed into camera's range by the ever-alertful stage hand who bad been in constant communication with the two backroom plotters.

There is no pre-arranged planning on the pay-off prize. It's decided upon the moment the winner is announced. By carefully appraising Jack's line of questioning with the winning contestant and by being fully acquainted with the merchandise setup. Bill and Chuck come up with wonderful pay-off surprises for each and every happy queen.

Although it's a nerve wracking task, the pair have never been stumped in granting the queen her wish. Sometimes when the requests are rather far fetched Her Majesty has to wait for the fulfillment of her wish. Bill and Chuck admit that they don't keep a supply of electric eels or wooden legs for pet geese on hand, but they've come up with things just about that fantastic.

Cold Facts About A

Hot Star

Hugh O'Brian is now portraying Wyatt Earp for ABC. But just what is this young star really like? What is his TRUE story?

ONE OF THE MOST PROMISING of young Hollywood stars, Hugh O'Brian, has joined the ranks of TV regulars with his own series, Wyatt Earp, on KABC-TV. It is among the best of the new type of western TV shows.

T'S INTERESTING to read a prepared biography of a star you know personally.

My first meeting with Hugh O'Brian, who is essaying the colorful role of Wyatt Earp for the benefit of the new KABC-TV series, was back in 1947. At the time I had a little theater group known as The Stagelighters. One day Hugh walked in to read for a part. He had done one role in a play before—and that was the extent of his theatrical experience.

He was pretty rough around the edges. But he wanted to act and he worked hard. Soon he was showing promise. He had learned how to walk across stage without looking like a lumbering giraffe, he played enough different parts so that he knew how to do a scene effectively, and he was becoming more and more dedicated to the premise of being an actor.

(His biography, however, claims that he had no intention of being an actor. If this is so, he put on a good performance.)

Hugh did several shows with us and finally came into his own with a memorable performance in "Mourning Becomes Electra." This was his baptism under fire. And he came through with flying co.ors.

As the months pasted Hugh changed—primarily in new self-assurance. After a couple of more shows with us he left to do other productions elsewhere. Little by little he worked into TV—and then Universal-International took him under its

wing. He was on his way.

Those early days working with Hugh provided some not so gentle memories. There were times when he had to borrow money to buy gas for his broken-down car. There were days he had nothing to eat. There was one romance which looked promising but ended suddenly. There were disappointments, frustrations, and yet he kept on trying. His perseverance would be a lesson to any hopeful young actor.

Certainly, as his success grew, he went through the stage where he "went Hollywood." Things got a bit grand around the O'Brian front, but this has happened to all young actors who suddenly find dollars in their pockets where there used to be holes.

About his early work with The Stagelighters, no reference is made in his biography to this particular phase in his life. The only comment is: "Opportunity came to replace a friend who had become ill in the cast of a play staged by a little theater group." Nothing is said about the struggles he went through. Nothing is said about the many people who believed in him and tried to help him.

Then there is this line: "One of the jobs he undertook was selling haberdashery in offices. After he had gotten an order, Hugh would invite the customer to come to the theater to see him act, for he was then also playing with various little theater groups."

At the time Hugh was selling hab-

erdashery—out of a suitcase—he was still with The Stagelighters and most of the kids in the company were buying ties and things from him. But Hugh would take almost any job so he could eat while he tried to get a break acting. There was no false pride in him.

Nor did he stop trying to get an education. He did go to Los Angeles City College for a while but when his acting break came along he naturally left school.

TV Got Him

His entrance into TV with his own show was to be expected, for you can't keep an ambitious careerminded guy down. He is an intense actor and, as such, should do nicely as Earp.

So far, Hugh is still unmarried and likely to remain that way for some time. He dates most of the Hollywood stars and apparently enjoys the single bliss. But those who knew Hugh in the years back hope that someday he'll find the right girl and settle down. For the present, Hugh simply wants no marital responsibilities.

It's a long road from the night Hugh received his acclaim for his work as Orin in "Mourning Becomes Electra." There have been many detours. Success is resting nicely on his shoulder. Let's hope he never forgets the kind of guy he was then—earnest, loyal, sincere. Let's hope that success doesn't make him forget his long climb up the ladder—or the people who believed in him when he was not a star.
