GIL HENRY

IF YOU LISTEN to radio at all, you must have heard the voice of Gil Henry who does 15 weekly shows for KNX. Gil likes to consider himself a disc-jockey-husband-companion to the vast number of women who listen to his program regularly.

As a record spinner he believes the emphasis should be placed on music with a minimum of casual conversation. "I want to be heard but I don't want to be obtrusive about it. I think we deejays can provide background music which people will listen to hour after hour as they go about their daily routines. I know we can sell ourselves, our music and sponsors' products without pushing too hard."

Gil is enthusiastic and energetic and he's extremely civic minded. During one particular period he was active in the Chamber of Commerce, publicity director for the Boy Scouts, on the advisory committee for the Multiple Sclerosis campaign and radio director for the United Neighbor campaign (similar to our Community Chest). These extra-curricular activities augmented his regular radio chores.

Mrs. Henry decided to put her foot down and at the moment Gil is spending more time with his family and concentrating on his hobby of writing. Wife Martha knows once he starts warming up his typewriter his civic mindedness goes on a temporary vacation and his motor gets a chance to run down.

WHAT WOULD YOU DO if someone like Bing Crosby wanted to guest on your radio program and you had to turn him down? This is exactly the type of frustrating circumstances that have arisen on CBS' Amos 'n' Andy Music Hall program. The show has approximately 2,000,000 listeners each night and top caliber talent is standing in line waiting to guest on the program which literally reaches every corner of the country.

The public has accepted Amos 'n' Andy's new record format and their following is as large now as it was during the heyday of their situation comedy strip.

Affable Jack Daly, Music Hall associate, explaining the phenomenon, said. "When the program first started, I had to call the studios and various other contacts seeking guests for the program. Frankly we were turned down by many big stars or their press agents. Guesting on a record show didn't seem worth their while. But the tide changed once the program caught on. With such artists as Freeman (Amos) Gosden and Charles (Andy) Correll, how could the show not be a hit?"

"Soon we had the John Waynes, Alan Ladds and Danny Kayes on Music Hall. The celebrities were now trying to arrange their schedules so that they could attend our recording sessions. Music Hall was a family show and it reached millions of people weekly. A star couldn't find a more relaxed and better way of informing the public of his current movie or play than by guesting with the old reliables Amos 'n' Andy.

"That's why today the line forms to the right."



What I Know About

IF THERE IS any one thing that has contributed most to Ernie's success, I think it's that he just plain likes people. To be perfectly honest, before we were married, I didn't particularly care about anyone outside my circle of personal friends. I didn't bother especially to make new friends, and I was uncomfortable when I had to talk to strangers.

With Ernie, there are no strangers. When he talks to you, you know he's talking to *you*; and when he listens, you know he's listening to *you*. It's a habit I've learned from him, and I think it's a good one.

The first time I met Ernie was at the Victorville Air Base during the war. I was working in the bomb hangar and he came in with a requisition for carbon paper. I don't remember thinking anything in particular about him at the moment, except that he was cute. But so were a few hundred other cadets on the base.

He was a little shy, too, I remember, and he hadn't grown that romantic mustache.

It took him a while to get around to asking for that first date, and when he did, he didn't keep it. It seems the Army Air Force had other plans for him that evening.

and quite well, too. When he was only 16 months old he learned a lively little ditty. All day long we heard it—"Motorola T-V!"

One thing the boys have learned from Ernie is how to please a lady. Whenever I dress up to go out they always tell me, "You sure look pretty, Mommy."

And so does Ernie. Actually, he's something of a sentimentalist, even emotional at times, which I am not. He never fails to notice something new and to remark on it. And he has a vicious memory for birthdays. I've tried to forget a few but he won't let me.

Ernie loves to fish, hunt and play golf, but since he has been so in demand he really hasn't had the time for them. Instead, he works in the yard, mows the grass, does the minor repairs that need doing around a house.

He likes to experiment in the kitchen, too. We both are forever looking for new and exotic recipes which we brew up together. Sometimes I think Ernie would be just as happy if I left the kitchen entirely to him, but I like to have fun, too. Even when the experiments turn out like the suki yaki we tried a few weeks ago—not good.

Actually, though, it wasn't as weird as the sack of groceries Ernie brought home one time when he had gone to the grocery store. He found one of those shops that specialize in exotic delicacies, and the conglomeration of foods was just unbelievable. I was game to try the fried grasshoppers, but there I drew the line.

You can see Ernie likes a gag. One Christmas we bought a playhouse for the boys, and I thought he was being very mysterious about the whole thing.

Christmas morning we went out in the yard to view the new addition. My present was inside the house—a real, live burro!

The boys insisted on naming it "Jewel," and it really became very fond of me, and Bubbles, my bulldog. I sometimes wondered what the neighbors thought when they saw me

walking around the yard followed by Bubbles followed by Jewel.

But Jewel outgrew us. We have a home in the Friendly Hills section of Whittier, which has a country air but is still residential. Jewel now resides in Palm Springs.

I think Ernie's greatest thrill was playing the Palladium in London. I know it was for me.

Well, they loved him. And we loved them. We made some truly lasting friendships while we were there, and there is no one more loyal than the English once they take you to their hearts.

Ernie doesn't talk much about his disappointments. He began a course in classical voice at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music when he finished high school, but the money ran out and he had to quit. He offers no complaints.

In fact, he seldom complains. He loves show business and really works at it. There have been times when he was unhappy—like the years he was doing one-night stands across the country. He was on the road when our first son was born.

But on the whole, he feels that he has been very fortunate since he graduated from being an announcer and entertainer on the Cliffie Stone show to his current NBC-TV show.

And you know something? I think I've been pretty lucky, too.

Around TV Row

Noel Coward and Ford Jubilee have settled their differences and Coward's **The Happy Breed** has been set for May 5. . . . NBC is willing to renew **Margaret Truman's** contract if she wants to continue with her career after her marriage.

Elena Verdugo will be seen on upcoming **Skelton** show. . . . **Gunsmoke** resumes production but during its hiatus **Jim Arness** made two movies, **The First Traveling Saleslady** starring **Ginger Rogers** and a Western epic. . . . **This Is the Answer**, the Southern Baptist series recently completed by **Family Films**, makes its debut on 65 stations April 7.

NBC has acquired TV rights to college football games at a reported figure of about \$1.5 million. . . . **Spring Byington** will be honored for her portrayal of a lovable mother-in-law on national **Mother-In-Law Day** April 8.

Patty (The Bad Seed) McCormack did such a great job on the **Climax** version of **An Episode of Sparrows** that **Warners** has signed her to play the same role in their forthcoming movie. . . . Video version of **John Nesbitt's Passing Parade** comes to CBS airplanes under the title of **Telephone Time**. . . . **KTLA's Circus** telecast was an immediate success. After their first show they received 9000 requests for tickets.

Did you know **Queen For A Day** was the first radio show ever televised.

Launching several new shows in one week is quite an undertaking but **KCOP** is the kind of a station that likes to do things up in a big way. Last week was debut week for **Tom Duggan**, news and sportscaster; **Adventures in Hypnotism** featuring hypnotist **Emile Franchel**; **Motorcycle Race** remotes; **Piano Playhouse** starring **Mario Braggiotti**, one of the world's great pianists who was in the original **Piano Playhouse** radio series, and **Waltz Varieties** emceed by **Hal Peary** and featuring **Gil Bowers'** orchestra.

Tickets are available for **Adventures in Hypnotism**, **Piano Playhouse** and **Waltz Varieties** by writing to **KCOP**, 1000 Cahuenga, Hollywood 28.

Barbara Britton and **Barry Nelson** will appear in the forthcoming Broadway comedy **Wake Up Darling**. . . . Color TV is due for additional promotion through network backing of **Broadway** shows. NBC has backed **The Great Sebastians** and will carry it on TV at the end of its run. . . . **Tom Dixon** and his pets become a regular feature on **KNXT's Panorama Pacific**. . . . **Sid Caesar** after seeing Los Angeles' motorcycle force said: "Now I know where all the M.P.s went after the war." M.R.

Fair Trial

Paul Coates airs the problems of getting a **Fair Trial** on his April 6 telecast. Program attempts to show the injustice done to people who are brought up for trial and sometimes convicted of crimes they did not commit. Hollywood actress **Madge Meredith**, herself a victim of such an injustice, will appear on **KTTV's Confidential File**.

Threats and Thanks

Following the start of his preparations to "do" the life of **Mrs. Marian Miller** on his program, **Ralph Edwards** was the target last Wednesday for 16 telephone calls which emanated from disgruntled persons. These individuals, some of whom threatened the **This Is Your Life** impresario, protested presentation of the woman who had joined the **Communist Party** to aid the **F.B.I.** in obtaining valuable information. Their threats resulted in precautions being taken to assure safety of all appearing on the telecast.

Edwards' telephone was jangling again the morning after the program. This time the calls were from appreciative viewers who were of the opinion that this particular **This Is Your Life** was the best ever done.

Newsreel films made on the **USS Constitution** while **Miss Kelly** and her entourage are aboard will be flown to the states for release on **Today**.

Locally, **KFI** will air two special broadcasts. **KNX** airs **Kendis Rochlin's** special report on **Sunday Desk** and in addition will broadcast highlights of the proceedings Monday through Thursday (April 16-19).

Correspondents **David Schoenbrun** and **Blair Clarke**, of **CBS's** office in **Paris** fly to **Monaco** to cover the event for their network.

Film report will be released on the **Doug Edwards** newscast. Locally **KNXT** is planning two special fifteen minute programs.

Inez Robb, **United Features** columnist and **Robert Sturdevant**, **ABC** correspondent in **Paris**, will handle both television and short wave radio reports for **ABC**. Newsreel film of the event will be televised over **John Daly's** regular newscast.

The principality has received so many requests from network and newsreel film syndicates for camera positions that as of this date the allotment of this precious space has not been assigned. A **Monaco** news syndicate wanted to service the networks but they would have none of it.

Lifelines

WHAT A TO-DO THE MOTION PICTURE people are kicking up, all because they didn't take kindly to the Oldsmobile sponsorship of the Oscar awards! At a party the other evening at which top agency personnel predominated, the consensus was that if the movies don't like someone from the outside horning in on sponsorship of their TV extravaganza, the studios should chip in and themselves bankroll their big show. What's \$350,000 or more for a coast-to-coast spectacular?



The influx of interest in High Fidelity is fantastic! Unquestioned proof of this comes from the West Coast Electronics Manufacturing Association—sponsors of the recent Hi Fi show held at the Alexandria Hotel in Los Angeles. Mr. Don Larson reports there were approximately 19,500 paid admissions to the show. In spite of the fact that this was the first time an admission had been charged, the attendance was still the highest ever! And the people in attendance were not technical "bugs." These people were housewives, college boys, butchers, tile setters, etc.

Naturally, a great many of the systems demonstrated were far beyond the means of the average person, but by the same token, there are true Hi Fi systems available at a comparatively modest price. For instance, Cap Kierulff, of the Sound Corporation in Los Angeles, has a system which consists of a Harmon-Kardon 10-watt combination pre-amp and amplifier, a 15-inch co-axial Electro Voice speaker, a bass reflex enclosure and a three-speed Webcor record changer with a G.E. variable-reluctance cartridge, a diamond microgroove stylus and a sapphire standard stylus. The price is \$179.50. For a true Hi Fi system this is a good value. With the exception of the unmounted speaker, these components are entirely assembled.

Now, if you happen to be handy with a soldering iron, you can do it yourself by sending for the popular Heath Kit and actually build your own system a little at a time at a great saving. The plans for a Heath Kit FM tuner look less complicated than some model airplane kits I've seen! It's really a matter of spending the time to put it together. If you're willing to do this, I'd say the Heath Kit is probably the most economical way of obtaining a good Hi Fi system.

I'd like to thank Art Herr for the fine demonstration (stereophonic and all!) at Kierulff's. I really enjoyed it. Until next time, when we'll concentrate on Jazz, I hope you'll be tuning in KHJ Radio (930 kc. or 101.1 mc) Monday through Friday afternoons from 1:30 to 3:00.

I AGREE WITH THOSE WHO FEEL Oldsmobile could have improved their pitch. Granted the auto maker took only about one-tenth of the total 90 minutes to plug the product, it would appear that more goodwill might have been generated by consuming even shorter time. Then there's the question of the actual commercial, which many feel wasn't "glamorous" enough for such a gala occasion. People watching the telecast in their homes and figuring they were getting a choice show "free" may have reacted differently from those sitting in the Pantages Theater. There, the audience practically booed the commercial and Jerry Lewis pointed up the situation by assuming boredom and mugging. You may recall that his crack, which followed one pitch, provoked a huge reaction when he said, "And now for a few words from the Academy!"

FOR THOSE WHO HAVE CALLED me because Jimmy Dean did not receive a posthumous award, the word is that such an accolade was not possible, due to his being a nominee for a regular award this year. He would conceivably be considered next year.

MEDIC MAIL: (FROM MRS. P.F.D., TORRANCE: "I am certainly happy to see that there is a great rebellion against the cancellation of the Medic film of a Caesarian section. . . . If Father Flynn wishes to tell the Catholics what to do, that is undoubtedly within his right, but I think the rest of us should have a chance to decide for ourselves and our children whether or not we want to see the program.")

FROM MISS S.B., DUARTE: "I am sure NBC would lose very few viewers and no doubt gain more by showing the film. In this way those of us who enjoy Medic may see it as is. I agree with Mr. LaTourette—don't cut or edit the show. Come on, NBC, where is your backbone?"

FROM MRS. M.I., LOS ANGELES: "I speak from a viewpoint of a Caesarian mother, having both of my daughters by a Caesarian section. . . . I am a Catholic and I cannot see why our church members would put the hush-hush on a program of that nature. As to invading sex province, the whole program would be for these who respect motherhood and the (medical) profession. . . . It would be wonderful and I would be 100 per cent for NBC to put (the film) on."

"Dead of Night." (5) April 13, 10:00. This is an intriguing exploration into the supernatural that has inspired much discussion in the 10 years or so since its release. Merwyn Johns is invited to a country estate for the weekend where he experiences the appalling realization that he has dreamt everything that is happening and is going to happen. His fellow guests believe his clairvoyant misfortune, which foretells an ultimate murder,

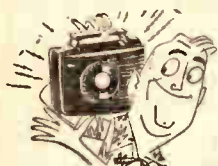
"The Well." (13) April 10, 8:30. 1951. Harry M. Popkin is responsible for this well-made little thriller and I congratulate him. A little Negro girl disappears one afternoon and sheriff Richard Rober is inclined to dismiss it as a usual lost-and-found case until he

discovers that the girl was seen in the company of a strange man a short time before her disappearance. When the man is found to be white and that he bought her some flowers, an ugly tenseness creeps into the situation. The suspect, well played by Henry Morgan, denies any crime, but a race riot is in the making when the girl is found alive at the bottom of a well. In a rescue operation reminiscent of the Kathy Fiscus tragedy, everyone bands together to save her and the cooperative effort introduces an element of brotherhood where before there was hate. The film gives its plea for understanding a generous dash of melodrama but I think it quite in order that a moviemaker should capture his audience's emotions if he wants to tell them something. And this is a story that should be told and told and told.

"Adventure in Baltimore." (9) Beginning April 10, 10:00. 1949. Here is a harmless little family item that moves its story leisurely around the turn of the century in Baltimore. Robert Young is a Protestant minister who spends most of his time trying to cope with the adolescent capers of his daughter, Shirley Temple. Shirley is a devoted worker for woman's suffrage

His ambitions always come in pairs. The moderator of KNXT's Words About Music has a good reason for his career juggling; here he explains it

FRANK DeVOL'S DOUBLE LIVES

FRANK DeVOL chats with the master wit, Oscar Levant, before showtime. Levant has been a regular panelist on the program.

EVER SINCE he was a boy, Frank DeVol has been troubled by double vision. There's nothing wrong with his eyesight. It's just that there always have been two things he wanted to do simultaneously.

The first of these plural ambitions was to be a musician—and burlesque comedian.

"Burlesque wasn't nudity in those days," he explains quickly. "Actually, it was variety with scenery bought from some Broadway show of the previous year. It was clean. Really, the first time I saw an inch of bare midriff on the stage, I was shocked."

This was in Canton, Ohio, where his father was leader of the pit band at the Grand Opera House and where young Frank went to every Saturday matinee, with his grandmother.

"I still catch a performance at the Follies downtown," he confesses, "whenever I see one of those old comedians on the bill. They were great. And you'd be surprised how many of them are still working."

Something Less

But DeVol had to settle for something less than burlesque for his comedy instincts.

Having become a master musician, mostly self-taught, he was ready to try his hand at the business of being funny. He began his stage career with the George Olsen-Ethel Shutta troupe as a sideman in the band, doubling over in novelty songs and comedy routines.

While doing one-night stands with this group, he and his wife Grayce, a former dancer, cared for two small daughters on the road.

"It used to take me an hour and 15 minutes just to load the trailer," he recalls. "It was one of those one-

wheel affairs that hook onto the bumper. We had 11 pieces of luggage to be strapped into it—including a bassinet and a portable organ."

The pleasant-voiced, brown-eyed DeVol has always been wary of being typed in music, too. "Just like an actor, you can become typed as a musician. And it's even more difficult to change your musical billing."

So, once he had settled in Hollywood and was established on the Jack Carson and Jack Smith shows in radio, he was ready to build a second musical career.

Started Young

When he was a boy, DeVol had learned arrangements by transcribing notes from records by Louis Armstrong and others. When he was 14 he had completed his own first arrangement, and by 16 had written his first original composition.

With this natural talent fortified by experience as a band arranger, he turned to the movies. He was soon no longer "just a musician," but a capable background composer. His most recent credits include the scoring of "The Big Knife" and the yet-to-be-released Dean Martin-Jerry Lewis picture, "Pardners."

He has a large workroom over the garage in his Burbank home, and when he has a picture assignment he likes to start working at four o'clock in the morning.

"That way, I've put in eight hours before noon. As often as not, I work 18 hours at a stretch, and I have gone as long as 48 hours without stopping.

"I never get tired when I'm working with music," he adds, needlessly.

New Career

With the advent of television has come the opportunity for DeVol to ride double harness again, this time as moderator of KNXT's panel show, Words About Music, which presents

well-known composers and lyricists who offer their latest songs for evaluation by a panel of four.

"We try to have a balanced panel," DeVol explains. "Someone who knows classical music, someone who knows the popular field and one or two to represent the public in that they aren't familiar with the commercial side of the business."

Words About Music began with Oscar Levant and Elsa Lanchester as regular members of the panel. There are probably no two sharper wits in show business, and when they start bandying high-fidelity humor, DeVol sometimes has trouble inserting the commercials where they belong.

DeVol, too, has a reputation for being quick with repartee.

Careful Emcee

"However," he says, "an emcee has to be careful not to take the play away from the panel. On the other hand, he doesn't want to become a nonentity. Consequently, I don't prepare my 'ad libs,' and frankly I think it comes out much better that way.

"I've had more fun on this show than any other I've ever worked," he goes on. "I'm with people I know, talking about things we know. It's a show about music, but the musical performance is incidental to the business at hand."

Possibly the only singular side of Frank DeVol's double lives is his temperament. It's even.

"I work best under pressure," he says. "For some reason, when things go wrong, it always strikes me as funny."

He denies any hobbies, "unless you call mystery novels a hobby. I read two or three at a sitting when I'm not scoring a picture."

The big mystery is, of course, how a man can be so completely relaxed in a business that has crushed so many with pressure.

"Pressure?" he says. "I like it!"

Don't Call Them Teen-agers!

That's what Alex Cooper, KTTV's emcee of Spotlight on Youth, has to say about high school students. He also has a lot more to say about Al Jarvis, Gene Norman, rhythm and blues, and the "war" between radio and TV.

I DON'T CALL them teen-agers I call them young people." Alex Cooper explains.

"I think the high school students of today deserve far more respect and far more credit for intelligence than we give them.

"Besides that," Alex continues, "if I call them 'young people' instead of teen-agers I cover a lot more ground. Then I can include in my audience all those in their early twenties."

It was this kind of talk, plus a business sense, which convinced the Coca-Cola people that Alex Cooper was the man they wanted for their new KTTV teen-ager's (oops, "young people's") show called Spotlight on Youth.

Always on the lookout for smart and worthwhile promotions, last fall the Coca-Cola Bottling Company approached the Board of Education in Los Angeles and the various high school principals and convinced them of the merit of a TV program designed especially for local students.

Spotlight on Youth, they said, was to be designed to bring the TV audience a true picture of high school students with their typical activities and talents. Not just an amateur contest restricted to dancers and singers, but a show to encompass other interests such as sports, sciences, public speaking and other extra-curricular activities.

After the educators said "okay," the sponsor looked for a capable emcee. Who could be better than Alex Cooper?

Alex had not only gained a reputation as a top decjay at KLAC (where he has been ever since January, 1952), but he had done much to foster good relations between both the pupils and the school officials.

His "Top Tunes" portion of his radio show (during which he salutes a different high school each day); his personal appearances at various "assemblies" throughout Los Angeles; and probably most important of all his campaigning for teen-age dances for the Milk Fund and the Crippled Children's Fund had given him both popularity and poise with the younger generation.

Next—KTTV was only too happy to carry the sponsored program. Up to this time KTTV did not have a program specifically directed at the vast teen-age audience. Channel 7 had Al Jarvis; Channel 9, Gene Norman.

"I find no fault with the type of shows Gene and Jarvis put on, but I do feel," Alex says, "that our show is a little more high class. We don't have the kids hopping around to a bunch of rhythm and blues numbers.

"As a matter of fact, I think that's one of the big reasons they wanted me to handle the program. I don't play any R & B records on my KLAC radio show. I don't intend to, either.

"I not only think it's bad music for them to listen to, but I also think it's bad business for me. The kids who listen to my show, as well as others, don't have the spending money. But the grown-ups do. I have to also get them to listen. And I can't do that with a bunch of rhythm and blues tunes."

One final interesting point which Alex points out is that he cross-plugs his KTTV show and his KLAC radio show "like crazy."

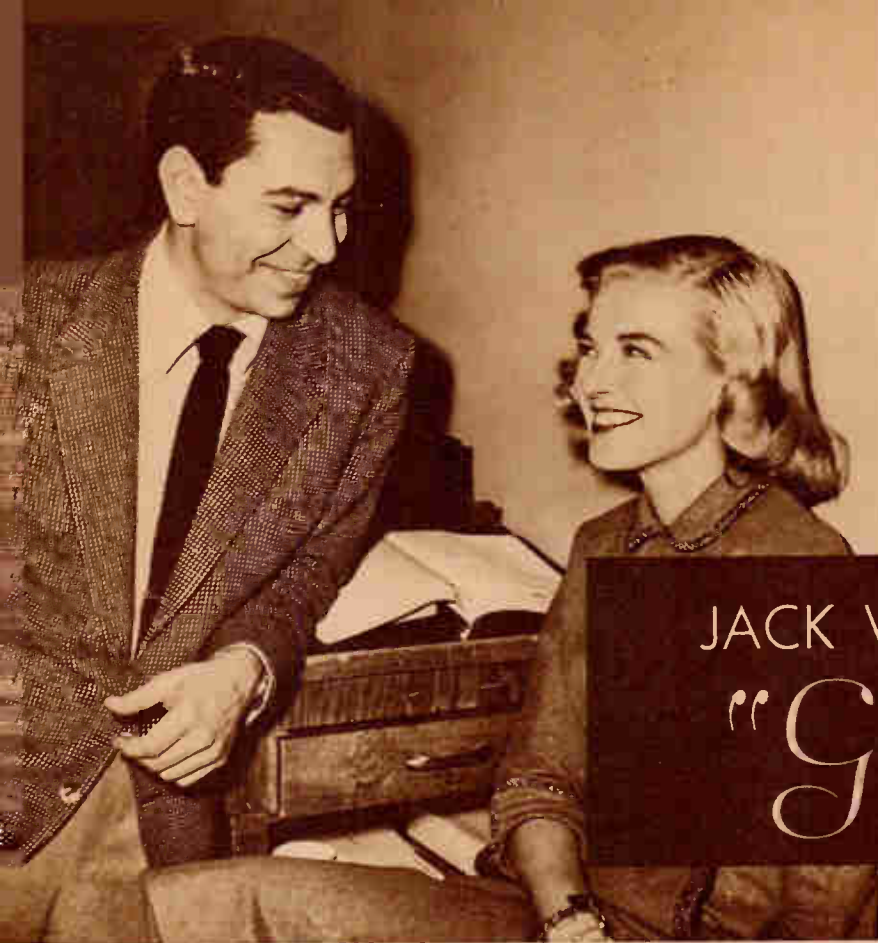
"The war between TV and radio is ridiculous. There's no reason why a TV station and radio station can't live side by side."

And in Alex's case he's putting into practice what he says in words.

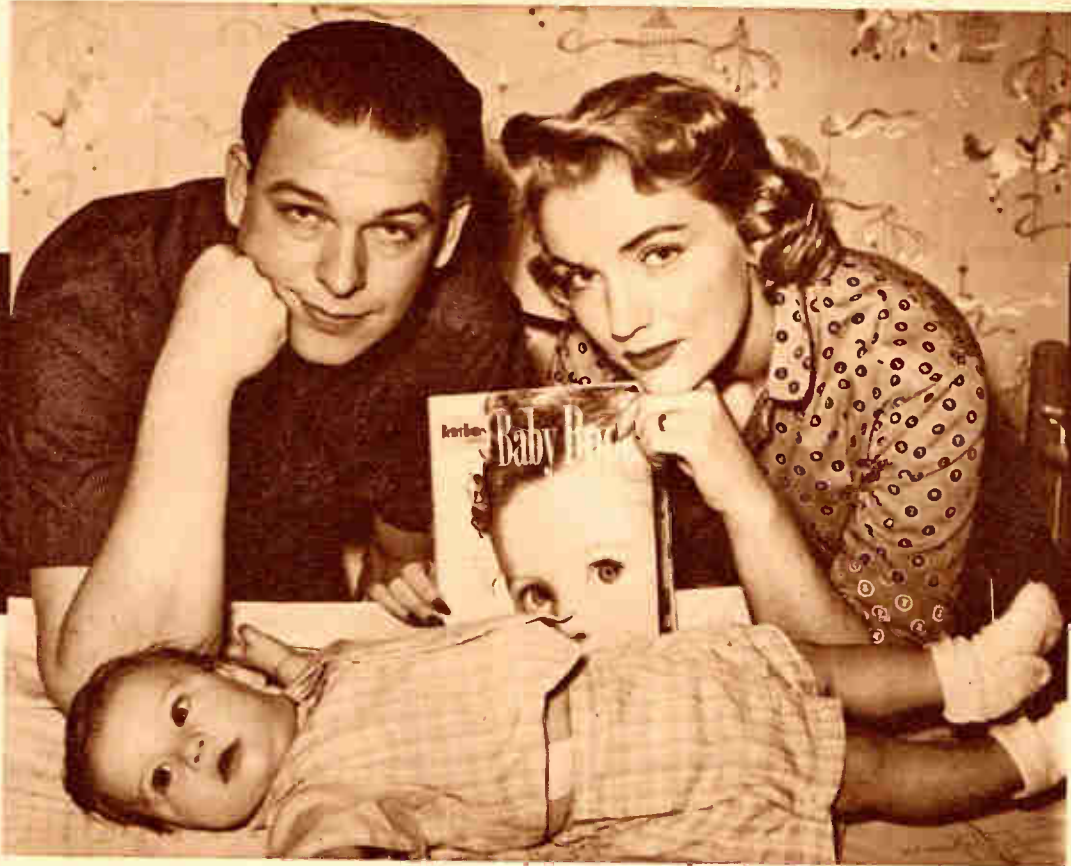
