WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A TV

Announcer?

I HIS IS a Democracy, ain't it? So if Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt can talk about "My Day"—why can't a guy like Tom Hatten, KTLA's staff announcer and the host of the popular Popeye cartoon series?

Probably more A-mor-icans (as the late Mr. Wendell Wilkie would have pronounced it) are interested in Mrs. Roosevelt's daily routine. But not those who would like to be a TV host and announcer some day, such as Tom is. So, to those who have such ambitions, and who realize them, here's what to expect as a normal day's work:

Unlike many late-night workers in show business, Tom is not a sleepy head. "I can't understand it myself," the good-looking announcer explains, "but I just can't sleep beyond eight o'clock. Even if I could, I wouldn't. To me, time is precious. If I sleep too late in the morning I have the feeling that life is slipping by."

So at eight sharp, up he bounces. Well, he doesn't exactly "bounce." Let's say he slowly rises.

Then comes breakfast. A big one. Some people are content with a cigarette and a cup of coffee. But not Tom. He heads for the kitchen, takes apron and skillet in hand, and starts to cook. Tom, you see, is a bachelor. He has a girl friend (her name is Mary Hennessey), but for now he lives alone in the home he bought several years ago in Burbank.

Cooks, Too

"Sure I can cook," he says, unashamedly. (Some men, you know, think it's an insult to their masculinity if they

admit their culinary skill. Liberate, excepted, of course.)

"I started out to be an actor, you know," Tom continues, "I guess I still would like to be one. For a while, the station policy at KTLA prohibited us from doing 'outside work,' but recently that has been changed and so now maybe I'll be able to land a few acting jobs here and there. Anyhow, I was a starving actor for quite a while before I landed the KTLA job four years ago. And you just can't be a starving actor, or a starving *anything* for that matter, without learning how to cook your own meals. I happen to enjoy it now. But there was a time when I was forced to do it."

Finished eating (and drying the dishes) he spends the next hour taking care of the usual bachelor chores—laundry, leaving notes for the maid, and other personal items.

But by 10 o'clock he's usually on his way to the gym for a workout. "I'm not the muscleman type," the trim, average-sized announcer explains, "but I do have a tendency to gain weight and I do try to keep ahead of the fat. If I put on a few extra pounds I look pudgy—especially on camera. As a matter of fact, I have to go to Palm Springs this week-end, and I'd like to take off another three pounds so I'll look right."

At Work

After his workout, Tom usually checks in at the TV station on Sunset Blvd. around noon. Then lunch. Then back to the studio.

Here his schedule gets a little complicated. If his "staff" duties start at 1 o'clock, he usually gets through at 8. If

the "staff" duties start at 4 p.m., then he's on and off the air doing commercials and station breaks and the newscast up until midnight.

Sandwiched between his regular announcing chores, he takes time out to "screen" his present pet project: the half-hour Popeye show. Along with artist Bob Dahlquist and director Bob Davis he plans the Popeye program for that evening.

"We try to give our show a little more production than the average cartoon series," Popeye's TV mate explains. "There are over 400 of these cartoons—enough for no repeats until next summer. Made between 1930 and 1952 some of them contain objective material—such as the wartime remarks about the Japs and Germans—which we now consider bad taste."

The Popeye show starts at 7. Each night Tom has a guest on the program, and a half-hour before each program Tom spends some time with the young boy or girl to make him or her feel more at ease.

This week, the lucky guest will be the winner of the TV-Radio Life contest on "Why I Would Like to Be a TV Announcer or Host—Like Tom Hatten."

Besides the guest appearance, the winner is spending an entire day with Tom—just to find out, first-hand what it would be like.

It'll be interesting to find out if he thinks Tom's job is a "snap," or "too tough to take." Tom, himself, has moments when he thinks it's a little bit of both. Naturally, however, he wouldn't change it for anything—except possibly that "acting" break he has always desired.

Why Howard Duff and Ida Lupino Chose

TV

HOWARD DUFF and Ida Lupino are starring in a new TV series called Mr. Adams and Eve. They are playing movie stars who are also married to each other. This hardly seems like unusual casting since they are movie stars and they are married to each other.

TV, of course, is not exactly new to either Howard or Ida. Howard has made several television appearances and Ida was one of the stars of Four Star. But still — their decision to do a regular series of their own for CBS-TV came as a surprise.

"There were several people who approached us about a TV series," Ida commented. "One idea submitted which rather interested us involved two characters — a Sam Spade kind of guy such as Howard played for years on radio and a kind of 'Lily the roadhouse doll.' This one never got off the ground.

"Then one day, Collier Young, prominent TV producer to whom I was once married, called Howard and me and asked us if we were going to be busy. It happened to be on a hot Sunday, we were just sitting around, so we told Colly to come on over. He did — and he brought with him an idea for a TV series. An hour later Howard and I were sold on it."

"It took a long time for things to get going," Howard put in, "but at least we had carefully solved all the pre-production problems. We launched our own company, Bridget Productions, named after our little daughter, CBS took the show, Four Star handled all the background production details, Frederick DeCordova was named producer, and Richard Kinon, with whom Ida had worked on Four Star, was given the directorial reins — at least he was to do three out of every four shows with Freddie doing one."

Sophisticated Comedy

Mr. Adams and Eve is not a domestic comedy, such as *I Love Lucy*. In fact, Ida laughingly said, "We have neighbors on our show but we hate them. We have only a sneering acquaintance with them." The only domestic thing about the idea is that the two stars are married.

"We like to think and we hope it is a sophisticated kind of comedy, showing the behind-the-scenes antics of a couple of movie stars," Ida smiled. "At first we weren't sure that teen-agers or anyone not very sophisticated would really enjoy the show, but a young teen-age girl took care of that doubt for us.

"She saw one of the earlier shows and sat down to write CBS a letter. In it she stated in the most positive terms that she liked the time slot for the program, (nine p.m. here) that it was a good time for teen-agers; she was tired of shows that felt they had to spell everything out for young people and Mr. Adams and Eve was not guilty of that; and then she added 'And this is the kind of comedy we dig.'"

"In case you don't notice it," Howard grinned, "we're really kidding ourselves in this show. Our tongue is in our cheek all the time. You'd be surprised how Mr. Adams and Eve has affected our relationship at home. When one of us gets annoyed at something we think of some scene in the show and we start laughing. It's almost impossible to get really good and mad."

"We do carry our work home with us, though," put in Ida. "We have to. If we're not shooting we're having some meeting. But we don't rehearse with each other at home. This we have never done. What could be worse for a director than to have two stars walk into the studio with their minds all made up about just how the scene would be done?"

Off-Beat

"All of the love scenes in this show are off-beat. They're not the 'Darling, I love you' type. We don't want to be two movie stars on TV acting like normal people since we don't think people would find this too interesting."


"We're off-beat characters anyway," added Howard. "Someone asked me once if I had read the book, 'Auntie Mame.' 'Read it!' I explained, 'I'm married to her!' I had been reading this book and suddenly, in the middle of a page, I stopped, looked at Ida, and said, 'My gosh — she is Auntie Mame!'"

"I must say that gave me a bit of a turn," Ida laughed.

Ida and Howard have apparently solved all the difficulties that once beset their marriage. They have at any rate learned to get along with some of each other's most confusing characteristics.

Why would two successful movie stars want to jump into the rigors and demands of a TV series? Mr. and Mrs. Howard Duff took the leap... and apparently are glad they did.

Both are absolutely unable, for some reason, to arrive on time for appointments — although they were right on the dot for this interview. They dislike making decisions, too. When they are going anywhere, each takes quite a long time getting ready.

"You'll never find Howard tapping on my door as I'm getting dressed saying, 'Are you ready yet, honey?' He's not ready either.

"That wouldn't work even if I tried it," Howard remarked.

"We never seem to do anything like anyone else," he went on. "Even our movie-going is strictly off-beat. We may let months go by without seeing a picture and then we get on a kick. Maybe the day is hot so off we go to an air-cooled theater. This gets us in the mood and we may see several pictures in a row. Often we have gone into one theater, seen a film, and then go down the street to see another."

Ida and Howard have a most interesting home life, especially with their four-year-old daughter, Bridget. The young lady has already decided she wants to be an actress and seems to take movie-making in her stride. When she first saw Ida working in a picture, however, her reaction was rather unusual. She cried because she thought her mother was being hurt. Now she refers to her school as "the studio."



"When she takes the bus for school, she says she's taking the studio bus," Ida laughed, "and when she comes home at night she says her feet are just killing her. Somewhere she must have picked that up — from me."

The main concern in the Duff house now is that Ida and Howard aren't separated by career demands. They have especially liked the TV series because they are able to be and work together. They have turned down several picture offers recently because the films involved locations — apart.

"No marriage can have a chance if either the husband or wife has to be away so much of the time," Ida said. "We've had that and we want no more of it."

There is little chance of Ida's and Howard's being apart now that *Mr. Adams and Eve* is on its way to being what looks like a healthy run.

CLOSE-UP OF KAREN SHARPE

TV's Busiest Actress

FOR A young lady who is only 23 years old, red-headed Karen Sharpe already has an enviable record in TV and the movies.

Her credits: over 150 filmed shows. Four major motion pictures: "The High and the Mighty" (1953); "Man and The World" (1954); "Man With A Gun" (1955); "The Man in the Vault" (1955). During the past year she appeared in more than 15 "live" TV dramatic roles, particularly on Matinee Theater.

Her pet in the TV world: producer Albert McCleery of Matinee Theater. "I think he has done more for young people than any one in the TV industry," she explains. "I know he has done more for me than anyone else—though, of course, I owe a great deal to many different people."

Karen's pet in private life (specifically referring to the romance department for the still unmarried): "None," she says, smiling. "At least, none I'd like to talk about."

Her home state of Texas . . . "It's just the biggest, and the greatest. Although I did like New York too, when I visited there last year. I saw the best places, and some of the lowest too—and all for free."

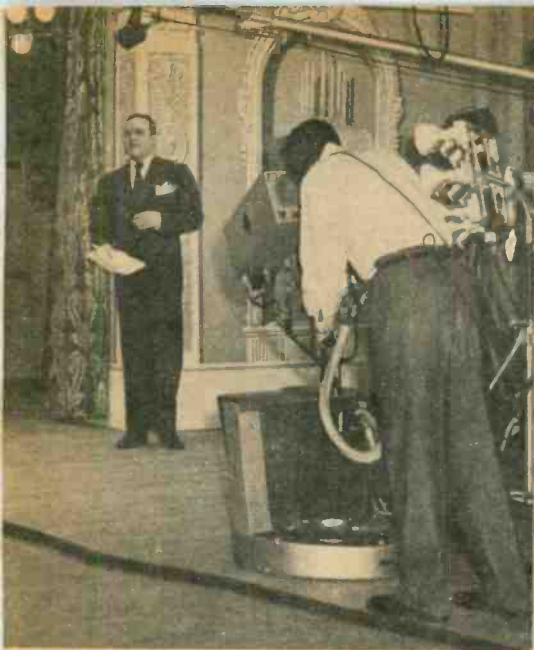
Her parents, Howard and Dorothy Sharpe . . . "I don't know how I got show business in my blood. No one, but no one, in the family has ever been on the stage. All I know is that I've wanted to act ever since I can remember."



So-called "dedicated" actors . . . "I've changed my mind in the past year. I used to believe in dedicated actors. But not anymore. At least, not completely. It's harder, I have found, to be a personality than a dedicated actor. Acting is more than merely being realistic about a certain part. You have to have the proper balance—both as a performer and a person. You have to have versatility, too. I'm tired of playing little girls."

Her future . . . "I'm still studying acting, and am concentrating on singing and dancing. I hope to incorporate all three in my future work."

Based upon her short, but active past in show business, the 5 feet 2 inch, 100-pound redhead may soon become TV's "best" as well as "busiest" actress. As the reader can see (by the picture), and as TV viewers can verify from her many appearances, she has *all* the prerequisites.

KTLA HAS HAD MANY "FIRSTS" ever since station started (non-commercial-experimental) as W6XYZ in 1942. Most historic and award-winning was coverage of atom bomb blasts (1951-52-53), an engineering and technical feat which won national acclaim for station and its manager Klaus Landsberg.

KTLA, Los Angeles' Oldest Commercial Channel, Marks

TEN YEARS OF TV THRILLS, TRIALS AND TRIUMPHS

TEN YEARS of television history. So brief, in some ways. And yet so long, in others. Especially when you review the milestones that KTLA, Channel 5, has created since it went on the air as the first commercial TV station in Los Angeles, in January, 1947.

KTLA's history actually began even five years before that when it aired as experimental station W6XYZ. A subsidiary of Paramount Pictures, the station was organized by the late Klaus Landsberg. Who can ever forget the imprint that he made on the pages of television history, particularly here in Southern California?

Up until the winter of 1956, when Mr. Landsberg died at the age of 41, his name and the history of KTLA are synonymous. They called Landsberg "Mr. Television." The official call letters meant more than "Television, Los Angeles." (The "K", of course, is used by all radio and



TV stations west of the Mississippi.) For most people it simply meant "Klaus Television Landsberg & Associates."

Back in 1941, Landsberg started KTLA with the parts of two TV cameras which he carried with him on the train from New York. Later, he set up the first studio in a converted sound stage on the Paramount Pictures lot in Hollywood.

Making a TV station work in those days was enough of an engineering accomplishment. In the early years of its operation, however, KTLA soon developed new programs and new talent. It was acknowledged, by friend and foe alike, as the "number one" station in Southern California.

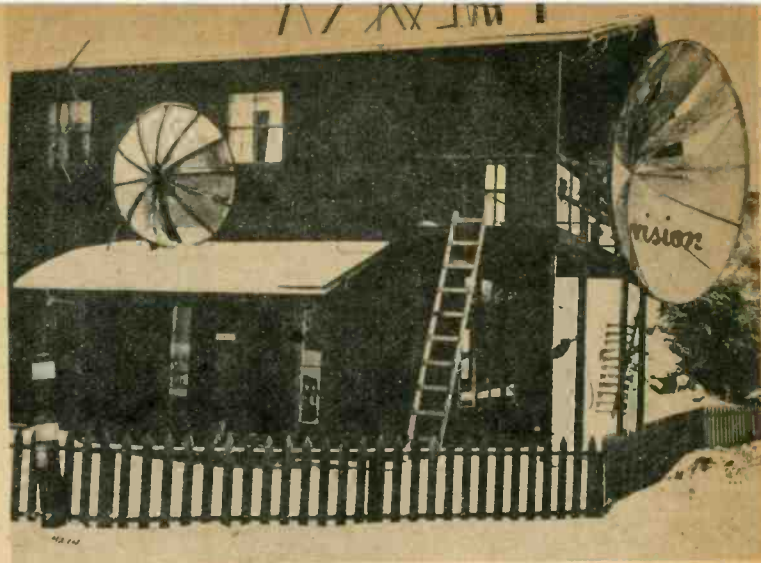

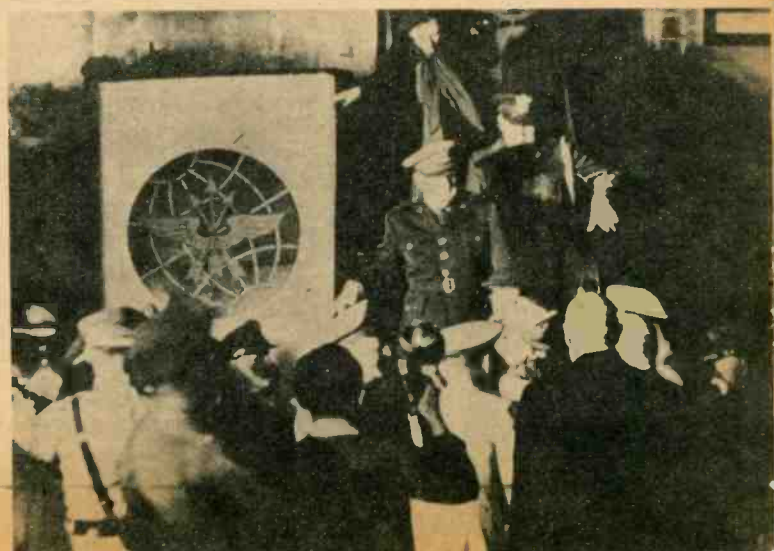

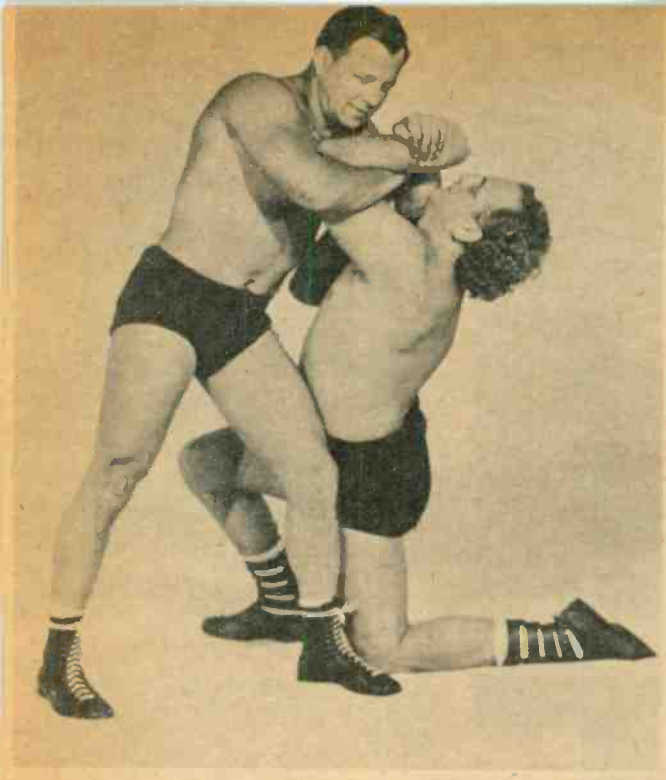

The tops in musical variety programs: Spade Cooley, Frosty Frolics, Bandstand Revue, Dixie Showboat, Ina Ray Hutton's All-Girl Show, Western Varieties, and of course, Lawrence Welk's Champagne Music. Except for still-fiddlin' Mr. Cooley and Western Varieties, the rest are gone from KTLA. But not the memory of them.

"On the spot" coverage: City at Night (still going strong) . . . the record-breaking 27½-hour coverage of the Kathy Fiscus tragedy . . . the telecast of which Landsberg personally directed . . . the telecast of the Departure of the Marines for Korea, which won a TV-Radio Life Distinguished Achievement Award for 1950 . . . the first telecast of the Tournament of Roses Parade . . . the wreck of the El Capitan Streamliner . . . the Santa Monica Reservoir Cave-In . . . the Hollywood Park fire . . . the world's very first telecast of an Atomic Bomb Blast . . . the Japanese Peace Treaty Conference . . . General Douglas MacArthur's arrival in San Francisco . . . the kidnap-murder of Patty

FIRST POOLED TELECAST ANYWHERE was formed when KTLA threatened to build its own microwave relay to San Francisco to cover arrival of Gen. MacArthur from Philippines if networks refused their holds on lines. Pool plan resulted, Channel 5 bringing its picture to Southern California.

Jean Hull . . . the local Kefauver hearings . . . the list goes on and on. All a tremendous tribute to the entire KTLA crew—and yes, to the infant TV industry.

Those were pioneering days. In years to come the "Big Budgets" took away some of the play from the smaller stations. But they can never take away the "glory that was KTLA's."

Today, with its new offices and studios on Sunset Blvd. and under the combined leadership of manager Lew Arnold and assistant manager Henry Flynn, the Paramount owned station is embarked upon a new era of sound budgeting, good all-around programming, and a creative spark that is not—that must not—be extinguished.



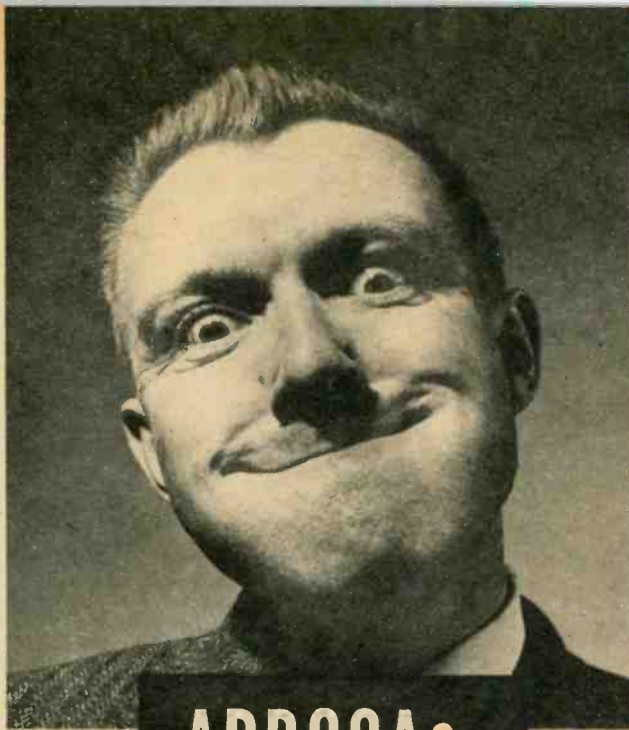

An import from Chicago, where he turned the Windy City up on its heels with a hilarious late-night d.j. show, Arbo now returns to his native Los Angeles, heralded with a splashy “teaser” promotion campaign which features irregular letters in the manner of the well-known “Plan ahead” gimmick.

Arbogast attended L.A. City College, was graduated from University of Arizona, is 30 years old, father of two children and has one of the most facile faces to be seen here on TV.

WANT TO PROTEST," a reader wrote me, "the nudeness of the dancer who was presented on City at Night. She was far more offensive to the public than the clothed body of Elvis Presley." Lifeliner did not see this show, but is sure that KTLA meant no offense, as it has always tried to supply family type entertainment and would not telecast anything questionable.

IN FACT I CHECKED WITH the station which informed that the telecast came from the only million dollar restaurant on the West Coast—The Caribbean. The outfit protested was authentic calypso and the same, according to KTLA, that is worn for network dance sequences.

SPEAKING OF ELVIS, wasn't it interesting the way Ed Sullivan's cameramen leveled their lenses at the singer only from the waist up? And did you notice the chaps who backgrounded Elvis—if so, how much did or could you watch them with Elvis holding forth? Surely they were TV's most ignored men!

JUST WHEN THE ACADEMY of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences and sponsors decided to drop the Oscar nominations and telecast only the actual awards, the TV Academy has scheduled both nomination and Emmy programs for television. Former is set for Feb. 16, which is a very poor time as far as news breaks in the Sunday papers.

TRYING TO GET BIG NAMES to expose themselves to TV viewers in hopes they'll get a nomination nod and again may not and end up with egg on their faces can carry presumptuous overtones for the stars and be productive of some pretty embarrassing moments unless this angle of the telecast is worked out with extreme care. Personally I wouldn't blame any TV star for not wanting to place himself in such a spot. It's a different matter after you've had the honor of a nomination and are competing for the final award.

NOMINATIONS AS HOOKS on which to hang a telecast have never seemed worthy. They are lacking in the excitement and distinction attendant on awards, if only because too many "names" are involved without a real payoff. There's no doubt, however, that many viewers will be interested to see their favorites at a nomination event and if a strong emcee is obtained and entertainment values assured, perhaps the telecast will come off okay.

WATCHED WIDE WIDE WORLD'S 90-minute program, "A Woman's Story," and enjoyed parts of it thoroughly, especially Senator Margaret Chase Smith, Marian

Anderson and Helen Keller. But with all due respect to the late President Roosevelt, the devotion of so much time of the program to him and Hyde Park was indeed a puzzle. I'd rather have had this segment incorporated in another Wide World and have seen two or three more outstanding women of our country instead. Locally a personality like Judge Mildred Lillie or Mrs. Spencer Tracy might well have been included on "A Woman's Story" and I can think of two or three outstanding American business women who would have represented their field beautifully.

IN THE RUSH OF THE NEW YEAR'S debut I overlooked mention of Tournament of Roses coverage. With six channels telecasting, it seemed to me that the looker's choice was influenced by the commenta-tion and that in this field the local stations

which made it more a straight reporting job than a glamour or wisecracking effort were superior. I am sure the day will be welcome when we'll all have color TV and thus eliminate the necessity for those elaborate descriptions of floats, gowns etc. The more the picture is left to tell the story, the better, unless an honest-to-goodness reporter with sense for news and human interest has a pertinent remark to spice things up.

Too bad Jack Webb's Noah's Ark is going off the air. Beautiful color, but had its problems. Replacing it is an excitement-packed series called Crisis. First show opens with a man rushing into the middle of confession and frantically informing the priest that he is about to kill a man with a bomb he has placed. He then drops dead, leaving the priest to find the lethal weapon!

Who's Playing

Hutton works hard — almost too hard — but she is a tremendous personality and the audience loved her! On the same bill were the Seven Ashtons who are simply terrific. Too bad they didn't show up better on the telecast. After the Hutton show we went over to the El Rancho Vegas to see Joe E. Lewis, who is a mere riot, and Lili St. Cyr, who left the male contingent hanging on the rafters with her highly daring and provocative act.

Saturday saw us all watching the rehearsal for the TV show and then we went to a cocktail party given by Milton Prell and his wife. Mr. Prell, a mild-mannered and very delightful man, owns the Sahara. Then came dinner at the New Frontier where the Salute To Cole Porter show was packing 'em in. Starring Dolores Gray, Dick Shawn, and Sally Forrest this was an expertly produced offering with Shawn stopping the proceedings cold a couple of times. As often as I have heard him do his Massa routine it is always funny. Sally Forrest was a surprise, however, in her role as dancer — and graceful and charming she was! I know of no other young person in show business who has set out to accomplish so much — and has succeeded — as has Sally. Once just another young actress she has proved herself in dramatic

roles on TV and now as a dancer. Her partner was George Chirkiris, who looked to me like a solid bet for real stardom. He has looks, he has a beautiful voice, and he can sing.

The evening ended with a trip to the Silver Slipper where you don't get art but you do get laughs.

Left on Sunday. Our thanks to the gang at KNXT for a wonderful trip. Now all we need is some sleep.

The news that Noah's Ark was being canceled must have been a real blow to Jack Webb who had great confidence in the property. Here again is another example of a show going off because of so-called ratings. Yet, most of the people I have talked to liked this program. But it's kaput. Maybe some day shows will no longer be at the mercy of these erratic rating systems. *Maybel*

Lots of complaints have come in about Ed Sullivan's praise of Elvis Presley on his last show. And others have complained because proper credit and praise were not given to Lonnie Satin on the program who apparently was very impressive. As for Ed's praise of Pelvis, he must have felt sincere about the guy or he wouldn't have made any such statements. The Presley controversy, however, will continue to rage unabated for some time to come. It is hard for anyone to sell him as a model for young American youth but, at the same time, as TV-Radio Life has pointed out in the past, perhaps as a person he is a much different kind of individual from that which comes across on the TV screen.

I'M no critic, as you know, but I just want to say that I thought the Phil Silvers show of January 8, wherein Bilko forced a society family to invite an army sergeant in his own son's wedding, was one of the funniest TV shows I've ever seen. And what this has to do with movies, you see, is that this program is on film, and that's why the pictures have motion.

"Canon City." (2) Jan. 25, 11:00. 1948. This extremely good documentary-style picture is based on an actual prison break from the Colorado State Prison in January of 1948. Released a mere six months after the break (the picture, not the convicts) this version hews closely to the known facts of the case and provides a thorough look at a desperate gang of inmates during the planning, execution and outcome of an escape from the penitentiary. Crane Wilbur wrote and directed and the competent cast includes Scott Brady, Jeff Corey, Whit Bissell, Stanley Clements and Mabel Paige.

"Winter Meeting." (5) Jan. 20, 7:30. 1948. When first reviewed, this movie received a merciless panning from the critics and chief target of the brickbats was Jim Davis, who was adjudged in over his head with the likes of Bette Davis, John Hoyt and Janis Paige. This, Davis has since freely admitted and has spent his time learning his business and working his way up again ("Stories of the Century.") You see, critics can seriously damage a career and drive an artist to the brink of despair, but they can't actually kill anybody.

"Fast and Loose." (11) Jan. 25, 10:25. 1939. The "Thin Man" series went so well that MGM decided to try another husband and wife sleuthing team in the persons of Robert Montgomery and Rosalind Russell. He is a book dealer and when a murder is committed over some rare books, he and spouse are off on the chase. There are lots of suspects, two more murders, some snappy dialogue and quite a few laughs.

"Bombardier." (9) Beginning Jan. 22, 9:00. 1943. Another in an endless series of movies depicting the training and development of some department of some branch of the armed forces. This time, it's the bombardiers who overcome pursuit wing prejudice and prove themselves with the destruction of a Japanese aircraft plant. With Pat 'Brien, Randolph Scott and Anne Shirley.

"English Without Tears." (7) Jan. 19, 7:30. 1944. Michael Wilding is a coldly indifferent butler who is loved by the daughter of an aristocratic family, but of course he won't say anything but "dinner is served." There are lots of European actors in this and that probably accounts for the European flavor of the picture (I have ways of figuring things out).

"New Orleans." (13) Jan. 22, 8:30. This movie tells you where jazz originated and is being brought back by popular demand. With Arturo De Cordova and Dorothy Patrick.

"Her Cardboard Lover." (11) Jan. 21, 10:15. 1942. Originally a Broadway play and then a movie, called, "The Passionate Plumber," with Buster Keaton, this one features Robert Taylor, Norma Shearer and George Sanders in a featherweight story about a young man who loses money gambling to a beautiful woman, becomes her lover in appearance only to keep away a superior wolf and finally wins her heart. Might be of interest to those who yearn to see Norma Shearer again but I wish KTTV were showing "The Passionate Plumber."



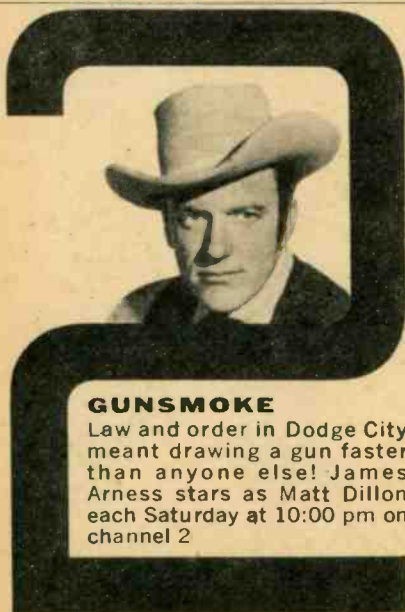

Review

The Boing Boing Show

CBS-TV, Channel 2

Sunday, 2:30 p.m.

All too rarely do we see on television a work of such poetic imagery, wit, charm, and entertainment as in the Boing Boing Show. The cartoon work of Producer tephon Bosustow is already known to motion picture audiences and his presentation on television will add another notch to his stature.

The Boing Boing Show is made up of different cartoons strung together by the device of Gerald McBoing Boing acting as master of ceremonies. McBoing is a welcome relief from the usual gabby master of ceremonies in that he communicates by sound effects rather than by speech.

Aside from the intrinsic quality of Bosustow's work, his creations are a radical departure from the banality of idea and art stereotypes that have come to afflict the common run of animated car-

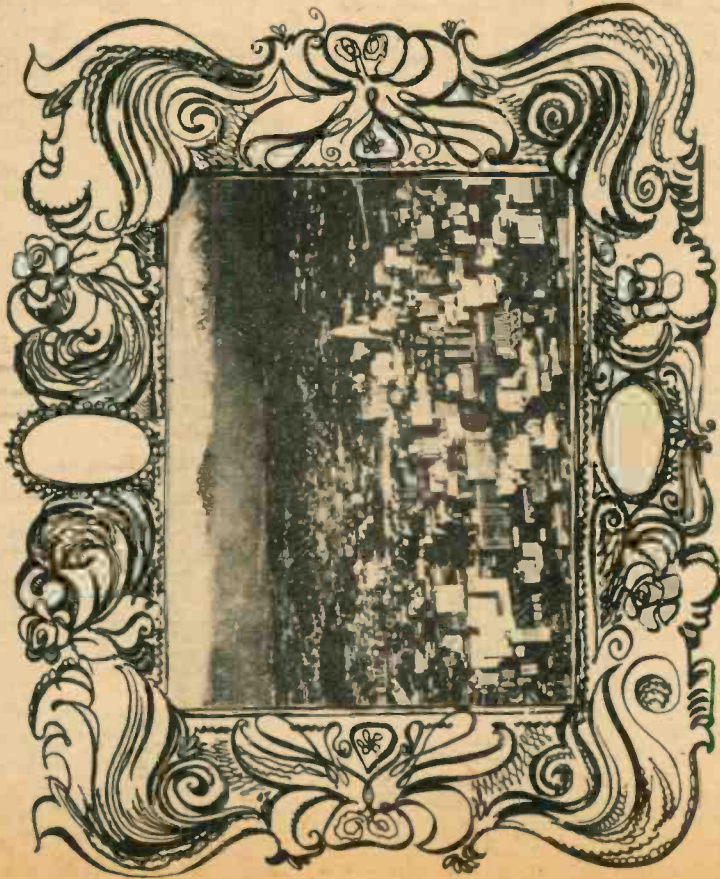
long restricted the animated cartoon. There is a recognition of the world of ideas beyond the confines of a studio.

No less important than the subject matter is the treatment given each episode. Bosustow has an uncanny knack of bringing home universal truths through an almost other-world realm of fantasy. Treatment is sophisticated in the true sense in that whether the viewer is eight or eighty he will find those elements with which he identifies himself, that delight and amuse him. Such a universality of appeal is nothing less than an artistic, or entertainment, triumph of notable achievement.

Although certainly not designed for children alone, the Boing Boing Show should be a rich and rewarding experience to young viewers. In the cartoon world of the Boing Boing Show, rich in imagination and artistry, there is solid substance which offers what might be termed "constructive viewing" to a young viewer in contrast to the "murder and mayhem" television shows now being inflicted on the American youngster.

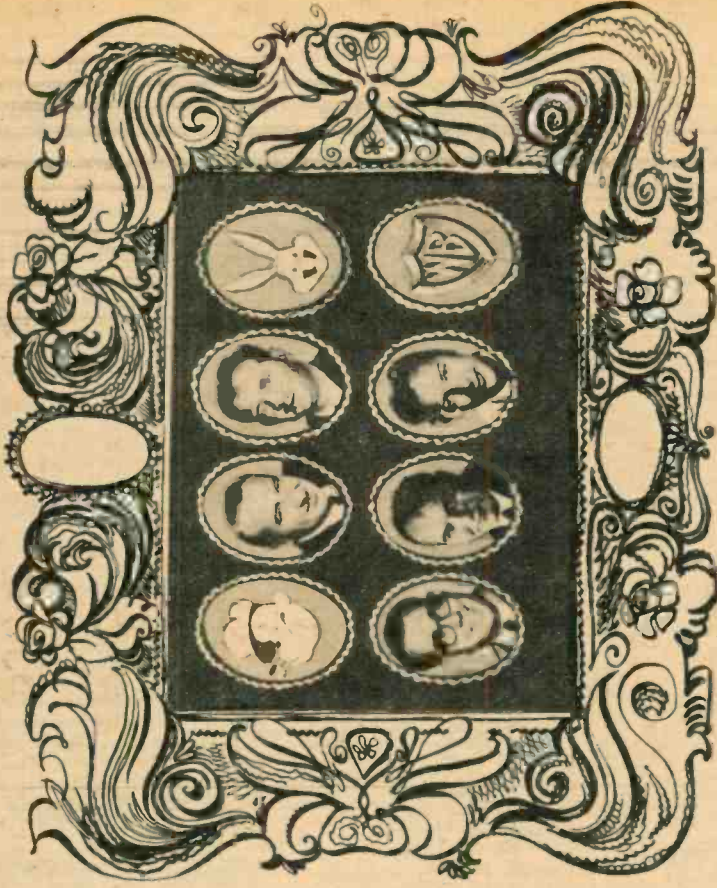

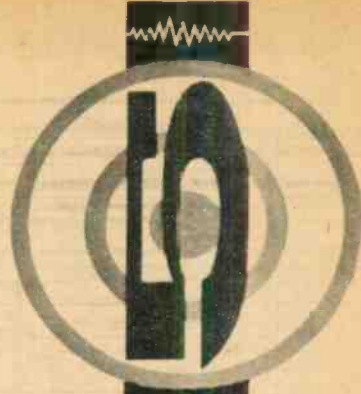

You'd never imagine that Alfred Hitchcock, master of suspense and chills, would be afraid of anything. But oh! the fears he has!

ALFRED Hitchcock, cherubic pixie and exponent of thrills, chills, and suspense, looks like a man who revels in the ghoulish. At least, such is the impression that could be gained from watching him each Sunday evening on his Alfred Hitchcock Presents CBS-TV show.

The gentleman may have made a career out of scaring audiences to death, but there are a few things that provide him with some good-sized chills.

It was Pat Hitchcock, his actress-daughter, who provided this new insight into her famous father.

"Why, you know, my father used to be frightened to death of television," Pat remarked recently. "He'd do almost anything to avoid making any TV appearances. But now look at him — enjoying himself hugely.

Policemen

"He may have overcome this fear, but there are others that still stalk him. Most notably of all is his very real fear of policemen.

"Any form of breaking the law is a horrifying thing to him. He's meticulous to the nth degree about observing every law in the books. Why, he wouldn't even try to get a pin in past customs on his way to and from Europe. And as for cars — well, it has only been recently that he has risked driving. Before he wouldn't get into a car simply because he was afraid a policeman would stop him for some minor traffic violation.

"He did teach mother and me how to

drive but for a long time mother had to drive him to work. Finally, she said she had had enough of this nonsense. He could very well drive himself. So with great fear and trembling he began manipulating an automobile himself.

"My father has rather odd tastes about cars. He drives an old Cadillac now, but his secret passion is for a Bentley, an English car. He used to own a Thunderbird but gave that up, so now he has decided he'd like a Volkswagen too. Mother has put her foot down on that one. In England during the war he did drive an Austin, which was no mean feat for him, but for practical reasons. He knew there was going to be gas rationing, he said. Mother and I just laughed at him, but he was proved right. The Austin, consequently, was an economical measure.

"Speaking of gas rationing, when we were in America during the war father finally got a C card — but only because everyone insisted he had a perfect right to one. Yet, he made an exact count of how many trips he had to make to his ranch to make proper use of his C card and he made just that many — no more. You see, he and mother were living at the ranch in Santa Cruz most of the time and getting back and forth was an absolute necessity."

Alfred Hitchcock is a man who budgets himself carefully, except for good wines and food, so you might imagine he was afraid of being without security. In a way, this is true. He has more life insurance than any ten people but his concern here is for his wife, to be sure she's well taken care of. That's as far as any fear in this connection goes.

Children

"He's a little afraid of children too," Pat went on. "At least he is when they're in the baby stage. He gets unnerved around babies because he doesn't know what to say to them. My little daughters, Mary and Terry, used to frighten him a good deal. They are now older and he's able to understand them bet-

ter. When they were small and cried he'd get quite upset.

"He also has a dog that he's a little in awe of. The animal has a peculiar habit of nipping at people, so my father tries to explain this by saying that the dog is just very smart. But I notice he treats him with the greatest of care — and respect."

Oddly enough, one of Hitchcock's biggest fears is that his next picture won't be as good as his last one was. He has a winner, from all reports, in his new one, "The Wrong Man," but he's already concerned about his next venture. It's rather difficult for him to keep topping himself since he makes one type of picture — the suspense variety. For a long time he was afraid to go to any of the previews of his films, but now he goes — although reluctantly.

"My father has none of the usual fears — such as fear of burglars or snakes or wild animals. His house was burglarized not too long ago, but he simply reasons that if it's going to happen again it will and there's no point in worrying about it. As for snakes, he isn't in the least bothered by them. One day at the ranch he saw a little snake hypnotizing a lizard, so he promptly went inside, got a hammer, and came out to hit the snake over the head. He felt sorry for the lizard — and that was the only reason he killed the serpent.

"Nor is he afraid of planes. In fact, he wanted mother and me to learn to fly, but we decided against this when we heard how expensive the lessons were. He's been in a few close calls in planes but none of these near brushes with death have bothered him. He does have, however, a fear of high places, which may seem contradictory. His only answer to this is that a plane has no direct contact with the ground, so there's nothing to worry about."

At least, Hitch isn't afraid of his own shadow. Not long ago he even played his own shadow in an opening to his TV show.

Curt Massey: MUSICAL CHEF

He prefers the extra work involved
in a four-a-week show . . .

THE STAR of the KRCA variety show knows the ingredients he wants—but he is proceeding with caution.

IT'S AN intriguing thought—and certainly a shrewd one.

It is Curt Massey's idea that "music is very much like food. Sometimes you want a Chinese dinner or a French dinner for variety. But basically your appetite is for meat and potatoes.

"And that is what we are trying to dish up on our KRCA show—meat and potatoes, only adding the exotic dishes as a pleasure."

Television is admittedly something new to the easy-mannered vocalist and musician.

"This is our first concerted effort in the medium," he claims, "and we have much to learn. It would be something like a housewife who is accustomed to cooking for two people to be suddenly put in charge of the kitchen at the Brown Derby.

"We know what we want to do, but we have to go slowly because the visual carries so heavy an impact. On radio, it was necessary only to present music, but now everyone in the cast is an actor, too.

"We are trying to reach Mom and Dad—if the kids like us, too, that's great—but they don't generally buy the sponsor's product, so our long-range view is get into the home, to become a part of the family and the routine of family life.

"That is why we are on four days a week, Monday through Thursday. A one-a-week show could never accomplish this becoming a member of the family."

Old Hat

If TV is new to Curt, however, music certainly is not.

His rather was an old-time fiddle player, and, remarked Curt, "If you think jazz fans are devoted to their art, you've never known an old-time fiddler. They would go hundreds of miles to hear a contemporary.

"I have six brothers and a sister, all of whom are musicians, but Dad taught me the fiddle—I guess because I was the weakest. But now I'm grateful because this is a part of America that is

gradually getting away."

Curt's first professional engagement was with his entire family when one of the producers of the Chautauqua circuit came through Roswell, New Mexico, heard of the musical family and auditioned them right in their own living room.

As a result they traveled through the Midwest and Canada as a family orchestra.

Later Curt enrolled at the Horner Conservatory of Music in Kansas City to study voice, arranging and conducting. But he was also playing on local radio stations and in the evening was a member of the orchestra at the Plamor Ballroom. It wasn't long, though, before he became the orchestra's leader.

"At the time," he recalls, "my ambition was to be a 'legitimate' fiddle player. But then I began to meet these guys who had studied in Europe, who were truly great violinists. They were making \$80 a week and I was earning \$300.

"This sort of dampened the ambition."

In 1933 he joined his sister in Chicago and they organized a group which came to be known as "The Westerners" and starred on the National Barn Dance, Dude Ranch and the Maxwell House Showboat which was one of the top shows in radio for years.

Westerner

He was known then as a Western singer and instrumentalist until he came to Hollywood in 1945 and made the switch to pop music with Red Skelton, the Andrew Sisters, and David Rose, among others.

But again he is grateful for his training in the western field.

"Western music has its feet on the ground," he avers. "America has always been such a hard-working country that the people have had neither the time nor the inclination to listen to opera and the classics. It is basic music, and in fact the stuff that is so popular with the kids today is fundamentally western music."

The Massey family includes wife Edythe and two sons, Steve, 15, and David, 10. They have a home in Beverly Hills, but whenever they can, they drive down to their 8,000-acre ranch in San Diego County.

"Of course, right now with the Channel 4 show," Curt continued, "I don't even have time to go down to get the eggs and fresh meat. But we always spend the summers there, and whenever we can, the boys and I go hunting."

Which gives a hint of how closely knit this family is. And which in turn gives a clue as to why Curt Massey is such a likable as well as talented guy.

A CAMERAMAN

TELLS ALL ABOUT THE TV Stars

Gert Anderson has photographed almost every major female star for Screen Gems' Ford Theatre. And he doesn't mind saying what he thinks about the ladies.

YOU wouldn't expect Gert Anderson to do much talking about the ladies. He's a quiet, unassuming, gentle kind of person. But in his years of doing the camera chores on ABC-TV's Ford Theatre he has formed a few impressions of the stars he has photographed.

"Take Betty Garrett, for instance," Gert began. "She's a real doll. You start lighting for a shot and it's hard to find a way to glamorize Betty. But most amazing things happen to her! She is remarkably beautiful. She is certainly the last word in cooperation and one of the women I most enjoy working with.

"Phyllis Kirk is easy to photograph. She is always concerned, though, about how she is going to look. I have no difficulty with her. It's true she works with terrific intensity, that she's a career girl, that at times she gives a director a little trouble if she doesn't happen to agree with him, but this is all because of her desire to do a good job. Everything about her, though, is easy to photograph with the exception of her short nose which at times gives you trouble in direct profile shots.

"Then there's Mona Freeman. Mona is the All-American girl. She is constantly having difficulty trying to look older. To give her maturity isn't easy because she retains that fresh, young girl look. She's always a pleasure to work with because she leaves the camera work up to you — unlike some stars I could mention.

"As for Zsa Zsa Gabor, she puts a great deal of faith in my opinion. I have found she looks better if you light her so that part of her face is in shadow instead of in full light. Naturally, she is very concerned about how she looks too. One day she came on the set wearing a \$3000 gown. She asked me what I thought of her hair. I told her it looked too tight. 'You're right, Andy,' she said. 'That's what I told the hairdresser.' And back she marched to get the change made.

"Zsa Zsa is easy to work with from my point of view because she has enough interest in herself and her career to co-operate 100 percent. And she's a lot brighter than most people think. She

surrounds herself with an attitude of naivete. She makes you think she's not quite smart but, believe me, she knows all the answers.

"Rhonda Fleming is another beautiful woman. No photographer can do her harm, but in order to do your best on her you have to work on her. I never use a haphazard lighting on her but one that is instead carefully controlled. It takes care to bring out the real and exciting glamour that is there. It's always struck me as odd that for a girl as beautiful as she is that she is so concerned about her appearance.

"One of my very special favorites is Irene Dunne. She was a beautiful young woman and she's beautiful now. Her background of nice living and her dignity shine through. She is not difficult to photograph and I work hard on her because I stand in awe of her and her great talent. I'd never want to hurt her in any shot. She is the most co-operative of all actresses. Everyone on the crew feels that when he's working with Irene he's working with a remarkable personality and a fine human being. There's a softness in Irene's eyes that shines through. It's like a mirror to the kind of person she is.

"Anna Maria Alberghetti is a bundle of talent, a dream as a person. She is so easy to work on you can almost turn on the light in the studio, go home, and phone in your job. She is destined to be one of the really great talents in this business. To be around her is a pleasure."

Gert, in addition to his 200 Ford Theatre jobs, has also photographed some of the filmed Playhouse 90 shows. He once wanted to be an actor but turned to photography. He has two sons, Jon, 18 and Eric, 15, and a daughter, Christine 10. His charming wife, who came from London, is named Olive.

Gert went back to the subject of the female stars with this comment: "We never photograph close-ups of any of these women unless gauze and glass diffusions are used. You get that close with anyone and you need something to soften the effects. But, you can take it from me, this is the kind of a job that is anything but painful! Who wouldn't like working with beautiful women all the time?"

HE LIVES WITH *Little People*

Wolo sounds like the name of a puppet, but he is really the master puppeteer who creates a fascinating world of his own.

WOLO, the delightful artist and manipulator of Aloysius and other little characters, was coming out of the KNXT studio where he appears on Panorama Pacific. A boy approached him and said, "Are you the guy who works for Aloysius?" Wolo answered that he was, to which the youngster replied, "Okay, so who's this guy Wolo?"

Well, Wolo doesn't mind this lack of identity. But for the facts, his real name is Baron Wolf Erhardt Antoine Trutzschler von Falkenstein. He was—and is—a noted artist who took up puppets for a hobby.

And he is also the man who won a recent contest to pick the best puppeteer. Out of 102,000 ballots cast, Wolo walked off with the largest number.

The Mayor of San Francisco, however, helped him. During the height of the political convention there, His Honor apparently got a little fed up with all the hot air, so he decreed a Wolo Day. This wasn't entirely unexpected since Wolo had been a very popular TV personality in San Francisco. About 7000 votes were cast on that day, of which Wolo received 6000.

Wolo is a quiet-mannered man with a delightful accent. And yet he has what is apparently boundless enthusiasm.

"I hardly ever sleep," he commented

with a smile. "You see, I build all my own sets for my shows as well as all my puppets and getting up as early as I do for Panorama Pacific—well, you can see that a man has his hands full. My sets, incidentally, are so built that any of my puppets can put them up with just two fingers."

His Story

Wolo was once headed for an agricultural career. He came here as an exchange student in 1923 from Switzerland. But he had always wanted to be an artist.

"My father, however, who was in the diplomatic service, decreed that I go into agriculture," Wolo recalled. He laughed, "When I came to America, he gave me a gun which he told me I was to use in case the gangsters in Chicago gave me any trouble. After six months here I gave up agriculture and got a job in a grocery store, then I went to Marshall Fields for a job. Seems that if you worked for Marshall Fields, the immigration office practically considered you a citizen," he added with a grin.

"But still art was my main interest. As far back as I can remember I wanted to be an artist. I still remember being in a park in Berlin when I was four. My nurse had taken me there and she was surprised to find quite a crowd around me watching me draw pictures of animals in the dirt."

When Wolo turned his attention to art, he became known primarily as a muralist. He did murals in many of the children's hospitals, telling a complete story in pictures on each wall.

"Puppets came in through the back door," Wolo explained. "I used to use

them to illustrate a story I was telling. I think I also turned to them because I got disgusted with adults and wanted to devote myself in any way I could to children.

"I worked for the State Department in 1953 as a puppeteer and did extensive work in Europe. Then came my entrance into TV. I had always been more interested, however, in movies and had done the puppet work in the picture, 'Lili.' I didn't want to do television. As a matter of fact, when I signed my contract with KNXT I thought it was for a movie. I was quite surprised when I learned it was for TV and live TV at that.

"I find black and white television very frustrating. I can't wait to get into color. Maybe that's the artist in me."

Wolo had Aloysius along with him and the two carried on quite a conversation. Wolo looks on his little people as though they were very real. He even said that Aloysius had a wife.

"I found her on a park bench one day and brought her home for Aloysius," he remarked. "Altogether, I have about 12 puppets."

Wolo has, of course, a personal life. He was married at one time and has a son, a daughter, and grandchildren. Recently, he married a school teacher from San Francisco and there was no doubting how happy he was. As he said softly, "To live alone is no life. When you're happy you have no one to share it with."

Fortunately, his bride likes puppets too—and children.

And what's even more important—Aloysius is very fond of his new mother
