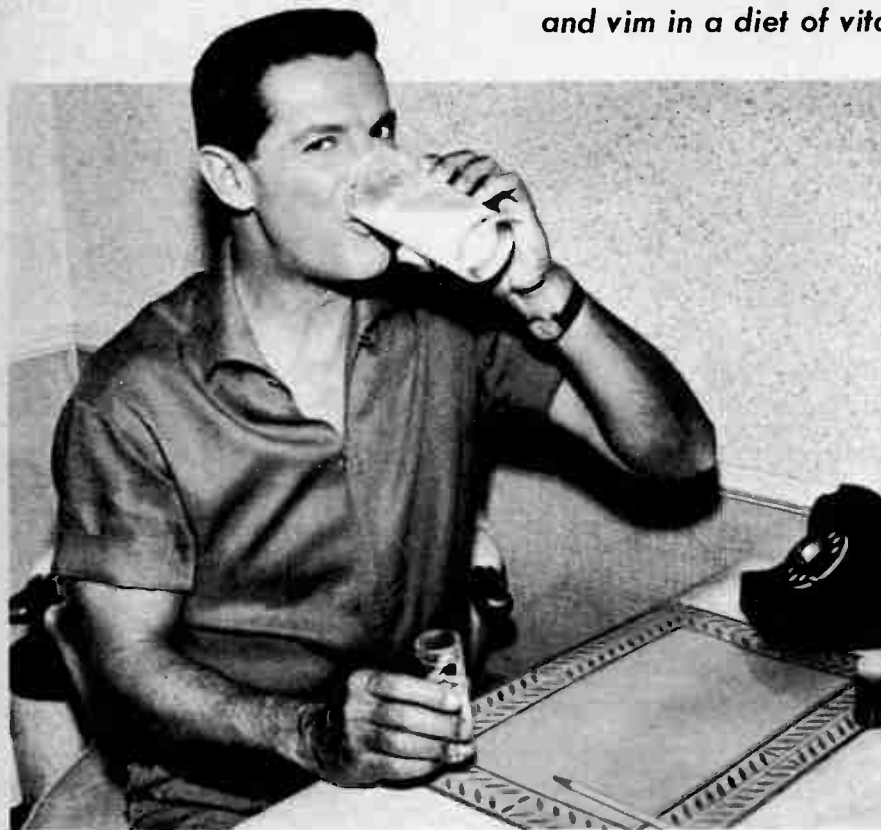

# The Secret of Bob Cummings' Vitality

This modern day Ponce de Leon has discovered health  
and vim in a diet of vitamins and high proteins

**B**OB CUMMINGS had adjourned to his dressing room for lunch. On the small square table was a plate of cottage cheese and pineapple—no lettuce—and a goblet filled with amber fluid. Plus some thirty bottles of varying sizes crammed with tablets.

"High protein," Bob explained with a casual wave of his hand. "The liquid in the goblet is protein-bound iodine."

He had had a steak for breakfast, crisply done on the outside and nearly raw inside. This was supplemented with 25 tablets which were an assortment of wheat germ, soy bean oil and rice bran; 10 hydrochloric acid tablets; four pancreas enzyme tablets; and one all-organ-ic vegetable tablet.

Bob paused now and then as he worked on his salad, uncorked one of the 30 bottles on the table, poured a quantity of tablets into his hand and tossed them into his mouth as if he were eating peanuts. "Yes, it is true," he ad-

mitted. "I do eat about 500 vitamin tablets a day. I'll have some again tonight with dinner. Dinner will be another steak."

It is not easy to disclose Bob Cummings' dietary "routine." To many it seems faddish and extreme, but Bob believes in it implicitly and his very looks attest its outstanding benefit. In spite of the fact that his eating habits have subtracted years and added endless energy, Bob understandably recoils from trying to convert others and from seeming to disparage usual eating routines.

His ideas on food, we learned, were first planted by his father, a Missouri doctor who was half a century ahead of the times when Bob was a child. Then it was believed that a high protein diet meant high blood pressure and perhaps death. Dr. Cummings, however, preached high protein diet and decried cooking of vegetables. There was always a howl when Bob's mother put stewed tomatoes on the table. "Protests

like this went through my ears for years," Bob recalled.

It was a couple of seasons ago that Bob wound up a trip abroad feeling below par. He concluded he must take better care of himself. Though he had always realized that "you are what you eat" and that your vitality depends on what you eat, he was in TV, and aside from brief vacations, was working long hours seven days a week. There was another angle, too. With taxes taking 90 per cent of what he was earning, he wanted to produce over a longer period of time, if possible, to compensate for what many in the business consider a "rap," due to the fact that a show business career usually "pays off" over a very short period before the actor is laid on the shelf. To maintain career peak, Bob decided to improve his physical condition.

#### Prescription

A Chicago trainer analyzed his habits and prescribed the "routine" by which Bob now lives. He drinks a minimum of liquids with meals, eats very little fruit and vegetables because the vitamin tablets supply him with these necessities and he wants to save all the room in his stomach for proteins.

"A person requires a gram of pure protein per day for every 2.2 pounds of his body weight," Cummings explained. "So if you weigh around 150 pounds, you'll need 70 grams of protein. Now the customary serving of liver yields only 18 grams, so you can see how deficient a person can be," he pointed out. "I'd say the average man is assimilating only 15 or 20 grams of protein a day."

To assure the Cummings family of protein-packed meat, Bob orders all cuts from a ranch near Santa Barbara (Cooper Marsh) where all cattle are fed organically grown foods. Bob buys his vitamins in huge quantities. His son makes his spending money by filling the vitamin bottles with their specified tablets each day. Travelling creates a problem. On the Cummings' trip to Europe, 135 pounds of their baggage was tablets.

As might be expected, attending banquets and cocktail parties raises problems for dieter Cummings. Even if the host has steak, it should not be cooked to speak of. Vitamin content would be damaged by the heat.

Emerging from his dressing room to the sound stage where a large cast had assembled for rehearsal, lunch-satisfied Bob surveyed the scene and the afternoon schedule, then exclaimed, "This job takes a meat eater!"

number of rounds which any contestant has reached was 16. The largest amount of money won by a studio contestant was \$6,480.

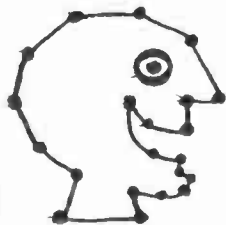
While viewers are keenly interested in the studio contestants, the game's plus for the home audience is a special feature called "Home Dotto." Viewers mail in cards with their phone numbers and each day Jack Narz makes one telephone call to a home contestant. In one day Dotto received 2,771,000 cards. The average week's mail is 4,000,000.

There have been nine home winners to date and their prizes are greatly in excess of the studio contestants: A trip around the world for two, with \$1500 expenses; three Triumph cars (including electric car for junior); one trip to Paris with side trip to Biarritz; Dior wardrobe; two Nash cars; fleet of boats (cabin cruiser, motor boat, and electrically controlled radar boat for junior); backyard set including swimming pool, portable dressing room, barbecue and lawn furniture; Hawaiian holiday for six, and two contestants won "fleet" of Edsels—two real cars and one electric.

Jerry Hammer, who is responsible for the drawings has this observation regarding the caricatures of personalities. "Since the show is built around the contestant's early identification of the celebrities without giving the solution away too easily, each line connecting the dots must capture some important characteristic of the celebrity featured." His approach is useful in remembering the names, faces and characteristics of the people you meet.

"First notice the most prominent features on the face of the person you are meeting," Jerry advised. "Of whom does he remind you? Association is very important. The same, of course goes for names. Then try to remember an expression. The reason we recognize caricatures so easily is that they reproduce and emphasize outstanding features, neglecting everything which seems to be normal or average."

Dotto is a fun game because most everyone loves to test his general knowledge along with the contestant and see how quickly he can identify the picture puzzle. And practically no viewer can resist the hope that his card will be the one in four million to be pulled out of the hopper to be called. With such fabulous prizes who wouldn't be willing to risk a two cent stamp?

## Quiz Show With a Twist

**ASSOCIATE PRODUCER HELEN WINSTON AND QUIZMASTER JACK NARZ** of CBS-TV — KNXT's popular Dotto. On July 1, Dotto also goes nighttime, NBC-TV.

**D**OTTS are the talk-of-the-town this season. Not fashion-wise but for entertainment. Transferred from the coloring books for children to TV, one

of the most recent and successful ideas for a quiz show is CBS-TV's Monday-through-Friday interest-holder, Dotto.

Following the apparent trend of daytime quiz shows which seem to require less specialized knowledge than the big money nighttime shows, Dotto depends on general knowledge questions and the ability of a contestant to visualize pictures from a few lines.

Quizmaster Jack Narz, a personable young man with an exceptionally pleasing voice, guides the contestants—a champion and a challenger, through the intricacies of Dotto in friendly fashion.

To play Dotto the two contestants are placed face to face, and each one has a screen on which is outlined with

dots a picture puzzle of a face. The screens are turned slightly so that each contestant can only see his own. Contestant's answers to general questions for a certain number of points fill in the outline. Breath-holding period comes when outline is traced by mechanical means—just how far will a certain number of points carry you. At the 25, 35 and 50 dot level a word clue is given, and if "A" contestant can identify the picture, "B" contestant (with a lesser score and therefore not as much of the picture filled in) is also given an opportunity to identify it. If "A" answers correctly and "B" does not, "A" wins the game. If both answer correctly the game is a tie. Sometimes "A" fails and "B" correctly identifies, making a new champion. If both answer incorrectly, a new set of contestants comes forward.

The average contestant lasts four rounds of questions. At the end of the fourth month on the air the greatest

# How Skipper Frank Influences Your Children

The reason for *Cartoon Carousel's* success can be summed up in two words: Frank Herman

FRANK HERMAN was thinking about performing a certain trick in which a lighted candle becomes a handkerchief on his daily 4 p.m. Channel 5 Cartoon Carousel Show. He let his thoughts be known to the Los Angeles Fire Prevention Bureau Chief Gus Degenkolb.

"Don't do it," Chief Degenkolb said, "because if you do my grandchildren will try to do it and if they do, thousands of other children will try the same thing. And, for sure, there will be a sudden outbreak of household fires in the country."

Frank didn't do the trick and there were no fires but Chief Degenkolb's fears were well founded. Frank Herman, alias Skipper Frank, like other children's performers on TV, does wield a good share of influence with the younger set.

Because of this influence, Frank feels that he — and other similar entertainers — share a huge responsibility: they must not only entertain but also must set an example of good behavior for their juvenile viewers.

As the father of four boys, aged seven through 13, Frank understands his audience's needs. He knows how to perform for them because he has been specializing in children's entertainment since the early 1930's when he broke into show business as the "Boy Magician" of his home town, Poughkeepsie, N.Y.

Since then he has worked continually as either a magician or an actor. He began his own show on KTLA four years ago and has parlayed it into one of local television's most successful shows. And he did it by following a few simple but effective rules which he had formulated during his years as a children's entertainer.

## Respect Authority

"Children," Frank explained, "respect authority and sincerity. You can't make idle promises — or idle threats — and expect them to believe you. You have to back up what you say with action. You can't cram things down their throats just because they are children — and you can't talk down to them

from your great adult world. That does not mean that you have to become a child yourself to communicate — it simply means that you have to treat them as equals. Incidentally, that is the greatest pleasure you can give a child — simply allow them into your adult world. But there is a very fine line.

"For example, if a boy is already somewhat of a fisherman and you take it upon yourself to teach him to fish — then you're intruding. If, on the other hand, he has never gone fishing and you invite him to go along with you, then you're doing something for him which, for a while, makes him feel that he is an adult.

"And here's another point," Frank went on, "the one sure way to lose an audience of children is to call them 'kiddies.' There is no such thing anymore. Children are very frank. They know what they want and, more importantly, what they need. If you don't give it to them, you might just as well talk to a blank wall!"

At this point, it was brought out that some Los Angeles parents complained to the stations about the cartoons being shown on children's shows — cartoons which are filled with various kinds of violence and mayhem.

## Cartoons Justified

"Cartoons," Frank stated, "can be compared to clowns — and the basis of all clown humor is violence of one sort

or another. A pie in the face or bucket of water on the head is a pretty funny thing when it happens to a clown — and the same thing goes for cartoons. The characters shown are complete creatures of fantasy — they are in no way real. As a matter of fact, I think a cartoon performs a valuable service by showing these things. For example, when we see a cartoon character eating with very bad table manners, it gives us a glimpse of what we may look like and teaches us etiquette in a reverse but nevertheless effective way."

"Because children's programs do influence their audiences — and Frank believes that perhaps that influence is often exaggerated by both performers and viewers alike — he makes a point of presenting educational features during each of his daily shows. "The only personal ax I have to grind," Frank admitted, "is my belief in the power of reading. Every chance I have, I recommend books — especially 'how to' books — because I am convinced that the greatest deterrent to personal loneliness is the ability to read."

Frank also goes out of his way to remind viewers, almost daily, that there are two magic words which can make everything in life easier or more enjoyable — whether it be in the classroom or on a trip in the country. "Those magic words," he said, "are 'pay attention.'"

# TV LET HER GROW UP... *And How!*

**A** NNA MARIA ALBERGHETTI seems, to the most astute observer, a young lady of charm, pulchritude, and talent — and a lady who has blossomed forth into maturity.

She has certainly grown up — and it all happened because TV came along.

Prior to her first break, an appearance on the Ed Sullivan Show a few years ago, which later led to a Paramount contract, Anna Maria was considered just a delightful little girl with a beautiful voice. But when Hollywood got a look at her on Ed's show, the reaction was something like: "Where has she been all the time?"

"That was the opening," said Anna Maria. "Then came my first really dramatic role in 'Bell for Adano' on TV — followed by my part as a gun moll in a Climax show. I really felt as though I had grown up with a vengeance after that.

"TV has definitely played the biggest part in my career, especially in the last four or five years. But in spite of that, I'm happy to be just about the only female singer in show business who hasn't her own show. I don't want my own production. There are too many gambles. You try your best to do a good job, but if the time slot is wrong or if the direction or script isn't up to par, you end up paying for the whole thing. It's just too hard to come up with a bang-up show week after week. So I feel it's better to pick what guest appearances I do and do my best on them."

Anna Maria, in addition to her TV and night club work, is also a hot record buy. Her Capitol albums have been notable successes. In all respects, then, her career is her primary interest now with her personal life suffering somewhat. As she says, "I'm playing it by ear. I don't think I'm ready for marriage. After all, I'm only 21 — so if I'm going to make a mistake I may as well wait a while and make it later," she added with a laugh. This could change, however.

"As a wife anyway, I think I'd be lacking a lot," she continued. "Take cooking, for instance. I don't do so well here. I usually buy dishes already cooked at a fine place near my house, so I will probably have to continue that practice when — and if — I marry. I doubt if my husband would even know the difference."

Some might say Anna Maria may have grown up but she will have a few lessons to learn in the care and feeding of a husband.

# Pick OF THE Pix

**M**ANY THANKS to drummer Bob Crane, Public Relations Genius Lloyd Brownfield, Chief Cook Fred Ruegg and entry hi-jacker Roy Rowan for finally relenting and awarding me a beautiful radio as a prize in their "I Like KNX Radio Because" contest. The crystals are in fine shape, the headset fits perfectly, and on a clear night I can hear Pasadena. Things are mighty quiet out there, too. Only trouble with the radio is that I can't get the darn thing to move off 1070 kilocycles.

**"The Magnificent Ambersons."** (9) Beginning June 30, 9:00. 1942. Well, KHJ-TV is sticking its neck out again and I'm proud of them. Their ratings were low on the Orson Welles production, "Citizen Kane," even though it was a great movie, and they're probably expecting the worst with this one, another Welles effort. "Amberson" is no "Kane," but it is an interesting experiment (and I don't mean that to be faint praise), needing, however, some judicious cutting. Adapted from the Booth Tarkington novel about an aristocratic American family and its ultimate fall from grace, it stars Joseph Cotten, Agnes Moorehead, Anne Baxter and Tim Holt and offers some notable scenes, e.g. a stairway argument between Miss Moorehead and Holt and a death scene by Richard Bennett that are indeed remarkable. It is full of Director Welles' special brand of flowing filmic imagery and I recommend it to the connoisseur.

**"The Assassin."** (2) June 28, 10:00. 1953. This British movie has Richard Todd as a private detective sent to Venice to locate a missing person. His first informant is found dead in a canal and attempts are made to convince him that his quarry died in an air raid during the war. He gets involved in political intrigue and an assassination before he straightens things out. With Eva Bartok and John Gregson and it's a pretty good suspenser of the type.

**"The Harvey Girls."** (11) July 4, 8:00. 1946. The story of the girls who work in the chain of restaurants connected with the railroads and how one of them, Judy Garland, reforms a saloon keeper, John Hodiak. She also sings "Atchison, Topeka and the Santa Fe."

**"Make Haste To Live."** (4) June 28, 11:15. 1954. This fable has to do with a cop killer who gets away with it and then is convicted of murdering his wife, who has merely run away. He serves eighteen years for this uncommitted crime, and when released vows to wreak revenge on his wife through her children. A rather sordid business, but fairly well done, with Stephen McNally and Dorothy McGuire.

**"Yellow Jack."** (11) July 2, 10:40. 1938. Adapted from the Sidney Kingsley play, this picture pays tribute to the work done by Walter Reed and his associates in stamping out malaria during the construction of the Panama Canal. Following the course of the triumph mainly through the tribulations and attitudes of a group of medical volunteers, headed by Robert Montgomery, the production does a quite decent job of dramatizing the great struggle. 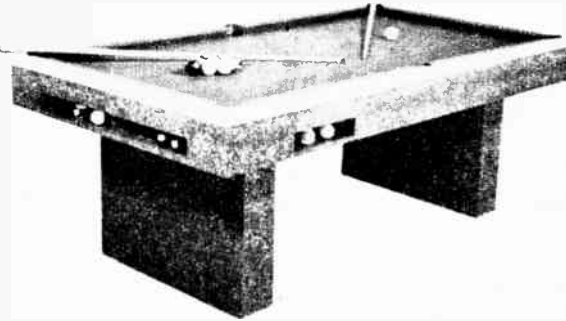

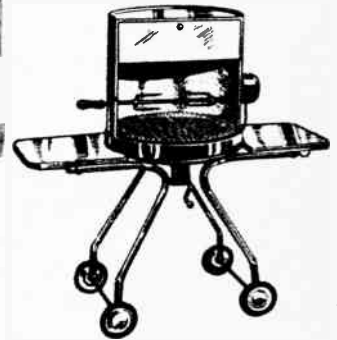

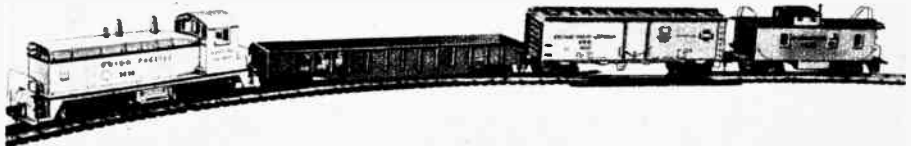

**E**VER wonder what happens to a personality when TV says it has had enough of him? Well, look at Pinky Lee. 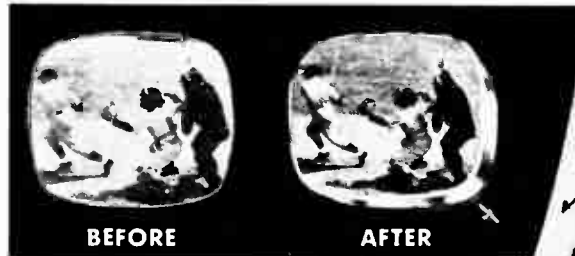

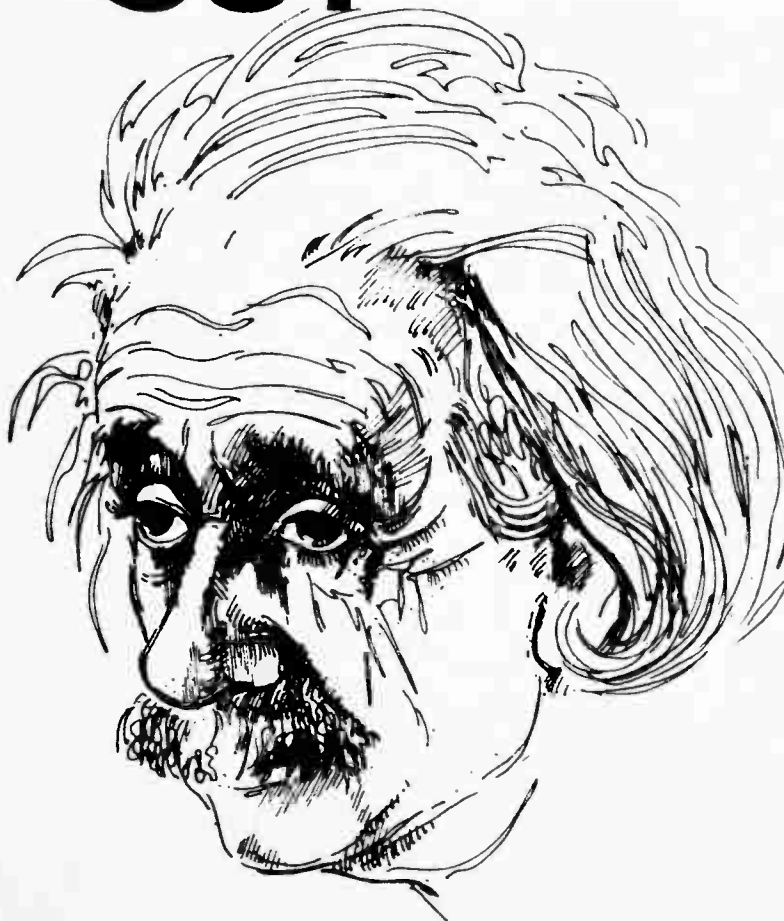

# "On Camera"

Since Matinee Theater is apparently doomed to oblivion with the end of this season, comment at this time falls under the heading of retrospection, with perhaps a glance into the future with regard to television productions of this calibre.

Few programs in the brief history of television have undertaken a task of such magnitude—the production of a one-hour drama five days a week. The very concept of such an undertaking required bold and courageous thinking. The payoff has been nothing but success.

Matinee Theater has not scored a triumph on mere size of undertaking. Behind the enterprise was the philosophy that quality was all-important, that achievement meant something more on television than filling in hours, grinding out material, and herding actors. Certainly not every production would rate a prize, but the overall picture week-in and week-out is nothing less than a heroic achievement that may well stand unchallenged in the future of television's dramatic productions.

Matinee Theater's important contribution has been due to its creative imagination, experimentation, and artistry. Thus, it avoided many of the pitfalls that overtook several of the hour-long dramatic shows that bogged down into patterns of heavy-handed soap opera.

The success of Matinee Theater has not been just an accident. For guiding the venture has been the strong hand of Albert McCleery whose schooling as one of television's most successful producers began years ago in the theater. Fortunately his production staff on Matinee were the same eager-beaver artists who saw more in the electronic tube than a Madison Avenue medicine show.

One cannot help but wonder whether Matinee is one of the last gasps in television creativity, whether a day of experimentation, innovation and originality is rapidly drawing to a close, whether the bold talents will wither and disappear.

Art, creativity—call it what you will—is never a thing of pure reason, but is the result of experimentation, trial and error. Teaming such an inexact and indefinable element with the cold-blooded statistics of sales charts and ratings creates an incompatibility which ultimately can result only in the death of creative endeavor, an expulsion of daring ideas, substituting only channeled patterns of cliches that are supposedly safe and sure.

Farewell to Matinee Theater might well be farewell to an era of television.

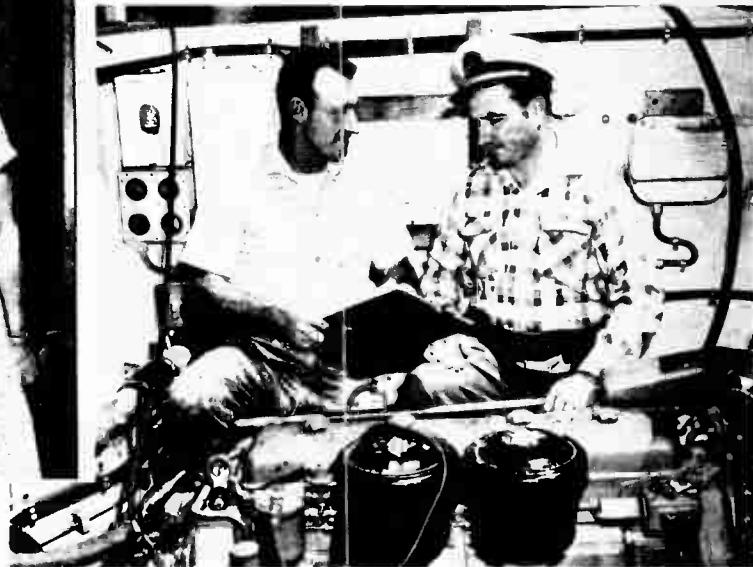

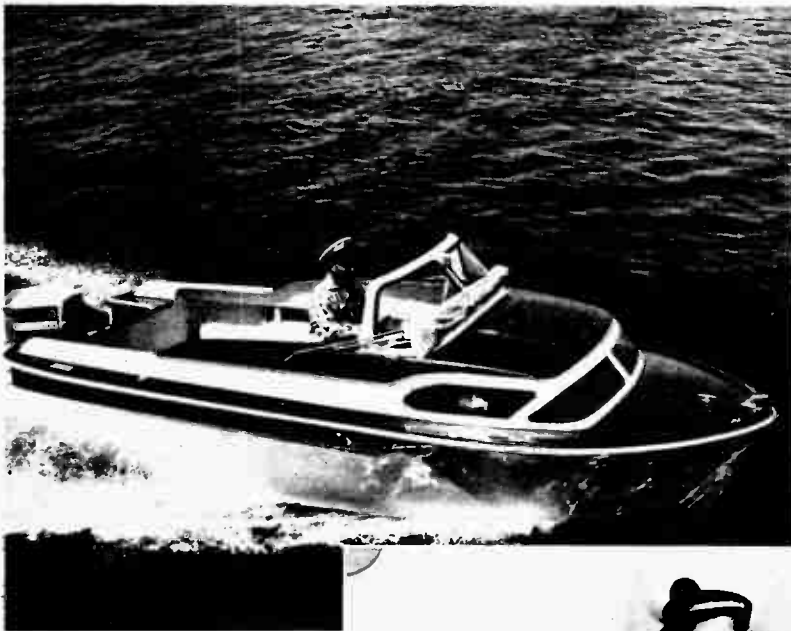

# The Man

# Behind David Niven

**D**AVID NIVEN, co-owner of Four Star, raconteur par excellence, a charming gentleman, and one of the most thoroughly likable men in this town, was getting ready to take off on the around the world trip with his wife. David, who was a very good friend of the late Mike Todd, had planned the tour for some time but it all took on new meaning with Todd's untimely death.

"You see how fast a man like Mike can go," David said somberly, "and you decide you better have what fun you can while you can."

"My wife, Hjordis, and I had discussed this trip for months. She was really the one to put the wheels in motion, but clever woman that she is she made it all sound as though it was my idea. The tour will be mostly pleasure, but I am going to do some research for my new TV series to be called 'Man in the Panama Hat.'

"This is the second summer I've taken off and left Dick Powell, who is the president of Four Star, more or less holding the bag. Our other partner, Charles Boyer, is in Europe making a picture. But Dick is so very capable there should be no problem. Besides, he does all the work anyway."

#### Four Star

"Actually becoming a part of Four Star was the best thing I ever did. I have no regrets whatsoever about it. Nor did I debate the matter for a moment. My debut into the company came some time ago when I was really at a low ebb. I was in San Francisco at the time playing in a stage version of 'The Moon Is Blue.' This was before there was any thought of making it into a picture. Charles Boyer was also in town appearing in 'Don Juan in Hell.'

"Dick Powell, Joel McCrea and I were going to form this TV company," Charles said to me at dinner on night.

"But Joel has had to back out and we're looking for someone else to take his place. I practically kicked Charles' shins off getting him to ask me to fill the spot. I joined that night — and to date it's been quite a company. We've never had one argument since we went to work together."

David acts as the public relations man for the organization, since no other titles were available. When asked about

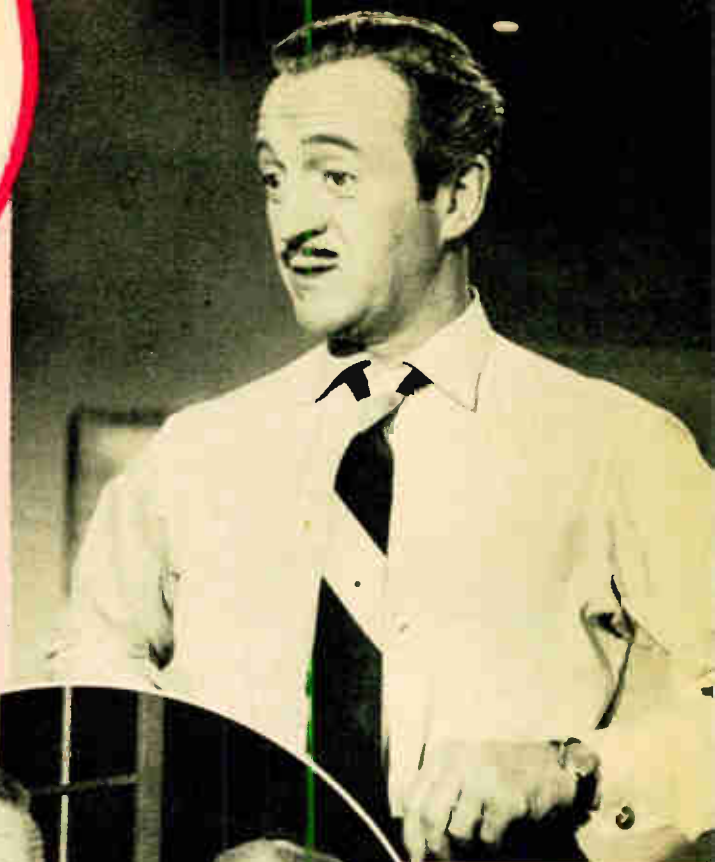
his duties he grinned, "When Dick opens his mouth and says the wrong thing I have to find a way to close it for him."

Four Star has really become a big concern in the last few years — and it has the reputation of never having turned down a TV series that later became a hit. Of course, it has had a few shows of its own that haven't been resounding smashes — as have all companies.

This is one side of David — the business man and astute one he is. But the man who is recognized as one of the greatest wits anywhere is far more than just a wit or a good actor, producer, and public relations expert.

**Beliefs**

He has certain beliefs which he lives by — and, of course, sense of humor is one of the most important.

“But even more I believe firmly in the word, ‘gentleman.’” David said quietly. “And position and money and social prestige have nothing to do with the word. To me, it means good taste, gentleness, consideration, all those things that somehow get bandied about and forgotten. It means knowing how to treat women, too. There is nothing more ghastly to me than to be at a gathering where all the men crowd into a corner and the women are left to stand idly by looking like misplaced persons.

“I have a complete and utter zest for living. The only thing that depresses me is the knowledge that life isn’t going to last for 150 years. I don’t allow myself to indulge in moods either.”

**His Problem**

With all of his good qualities, David has only one problem to face — he can’t bring himself to make a decision. He hems and haws, procrastinates, tries to run away from a matter, anything and everything to avoid saying a firm “Yes” or “No”. The notable exceptions were his fast agreement to go into Four Star and his taking the tour around the world.

“I absolutely can’t stand to interview an actor for a job,” he said. “I know how desperately he wants that part and I just can’t bring myself to turn him down, so I let Marge McKay, our casting director, do the job while I stand and look at the actors through a key-hole. The only decision I did enjoy making was that with David and Charles about what to do with all that lovely \$8,000,000 of other people’s money that we were going to spend on TV shows.

“This making a decision business is particularly fraught with terrible consequences at home. It is sheer murder for me to have to fire anyone. I keep people on even if I know they’re robbing me blind. But it is just as difficult for me to hire someone.”

The lack of aggressive action has at times put David into a spot. But he never bothers to explain away any embarrassing situation. As he puts it, “Why explain? My friends don’t need any explanation and my enemies wouldn’t believe it anyway.”

David’s life is centered on his wife and his two sons. When David and Hjordis were married she spoke no English at all.

“That’s the only reason I was able to talk her into marrying me,” he smiled. “But really — she is simply tremendous. As are my two sons.”

There is still one more rule which guides this fascinating man’s life — and this is to be honest and truthful. There is a prayer he taught his boys which pretty well explains how he feels about truth — and his sons:

“Please, God, help me to be brave and tell the truth, to be kind to animals and human beings and to remember that Daddy will send us to school and do his best and after that we’re on our own.”

The Niven boys live by that.

**S**OMEONE once described news as "anything you haven't heard before." In journalism schools much is made of the premise that a news story is made up of the five Ws and the H: Who, What, Where, When, Why and How.

KABC Radio in Hollywood aggressively follows this policy by the top-ranking newsmen hired by this station.

**Orval Anderson** began his radio career in 1938 and joined the KABC staff in 1951 and was quickly recognized as one of ABC's most reliable and effective newscasters. When Bob Garred died in December, 1956, Anderson was named his successor. One of the highlights of his career came in 1941 when as a special events announcer for WWL, New Orleans, he was sent to describe the dedication ceremonies of a new Leprosarium near that city. Originally planned as a simple remote broadcast, Orval's interviews with several lepers proved not only moving and dramatic but also helped to dispel many of the morbid and exaggerated tales of the disease which had existed for many years. He and his wife and daughter, both named Barbara, reside at Malibu Beach.

**John Daly**, Vice President of the American Broadcasting Company in Charge of News, Special Events, Sports and Public Affairs has been described, by the Peabody Award Committee in 1954, as "primarily a reporter — and a good one."

Mr. Daly started as a CBS radio reporter and commentator in 1937 in Washington, D.C., after leaving Boston College, and soon won an assignment as the network's White House correspondent. He served CBS through 12 eventual years, joined ABC in 1949 and was named to his present post in 1953. In 1941, he was transferred to New York to edit and narrate the first of his evening news roundups and commentaries. In late 1941 he went overseas, where, as a combat correspondent, his reports included eye witness accounts of the Sicilian campaign, the Italian campaign and the Anzio landing.

Since joining ABC he has directed or participated in the coverage of each year's greatest stories—from the Korean

crisis through the major sessions of the UN, 1956 political events, the inauguration of President Eisenhower, the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, the Army-McCarthy hearing in 1954 and the Suez invasion and Hungarian rebellion in 1956. Mr. Daly commutes to New York from his home in suburban Rye, N.Y. where he resides with his wife, Margaret, and their three children.

**Quincy Howe** is an editor, author, historian, and educator who has chronicled the American scene and world history since the early 1920's. Before joining ABC in 1954, Mr. Howe had been associated with the Atlantic Monthly, Simon and Schuster, book publishers, and CBS. One year after becoming a member of the ABC staff, Mr. Howe received the Peabody Award for "radio-television promotion of international understanding" via his documentary series, "Outside U.S.A." Mr. and Mrs. Howe, she is the former Mary L. Post, have a son and a daughter, Quincy and Mable Davis, and live in New York City.

**Paul Harvey** has a sure instinct for news, a deep human interest and a sense of drama — traits which have given him a meteoric rise in the field of newscasting since he joined ABC Radio in 1944. Paul stepped in front of a microphone for the first time when he was only 15 and still in high school. The station was KVOO, Tulsa. Mr. Harvey has the distinction of having had nine of his broadcasts placed in the Congressional Record within a 15 month period. He has received many citations and awards for his militant Americanism. Mr. and Mrs. Harvey, with their son, Paul II, maintain two homes, one in the Missouri Ozarks

and another in River Forest, Illinois, where he spends as much time as his busy schedule will allow.

**Edward P. Morgan** is another award winning ABC newsmen — he won the Peabody Award in 1956 for "the outstanding radio news program" of that year. A member of the network's Washington staff, Mr. Morgan has broadcast such special events as the political conventions, election night and the Presidential Inaugurations. His career began in 1932 with the Star in Seattle. He got his first taste of radio broadcasting while serving in Honolulu for the United Press where he did a news show on KGU. During the war years, Morgan was a roving correspondent for the Chicago Daily News. In 1946, he joined Collier's as an associate editor and in 1948 became associated with Edward R. Murrow and CBS, and eventually was named Director of News for CBS before joining ABC.

**John W. Vandercook** began travelling three weeks after he was born and hasn't stopped since. Present score: 81 countries. He has worked as a Broadway actor, roving newspaperman, feature editor of the New York Graphic, and photographer. All of his many experiences and his varied interests contribute to his writings and to his news commentaries. During the years which encompassed World War II, Mr. Vandercook's reports originated from North Africa, Italy, France, Spain and England and he broadcast such eye-witness accounts as the liberation of the Buchenwald concentration camp and the battle for Leipzig, one of the last engagements in the European phase of the war.

**William Winter** calls himself a "reformed lawyer." He gave himself that moniker after making the decision to give up a lucrative law practice to go into radio. Since making that decision he has traveled the world several times as war correspondent, radio and television correspondent, became the first "Voice of America" prior to Pearl Harbor and has been decorated with highest honors by foreign governments and has earned international fame as a lecturer on current affairs.

These then are a few of KABC Radio's men behind the news.

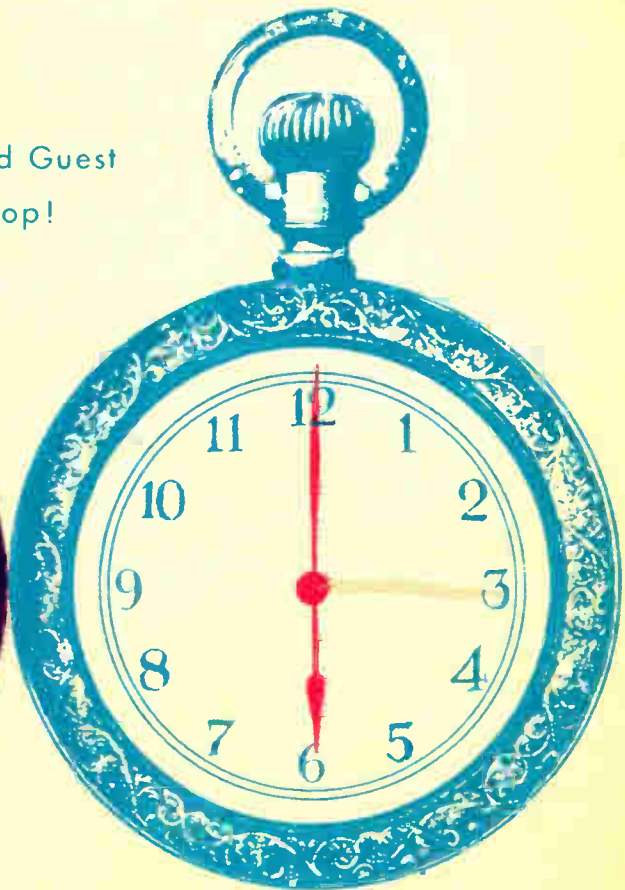
