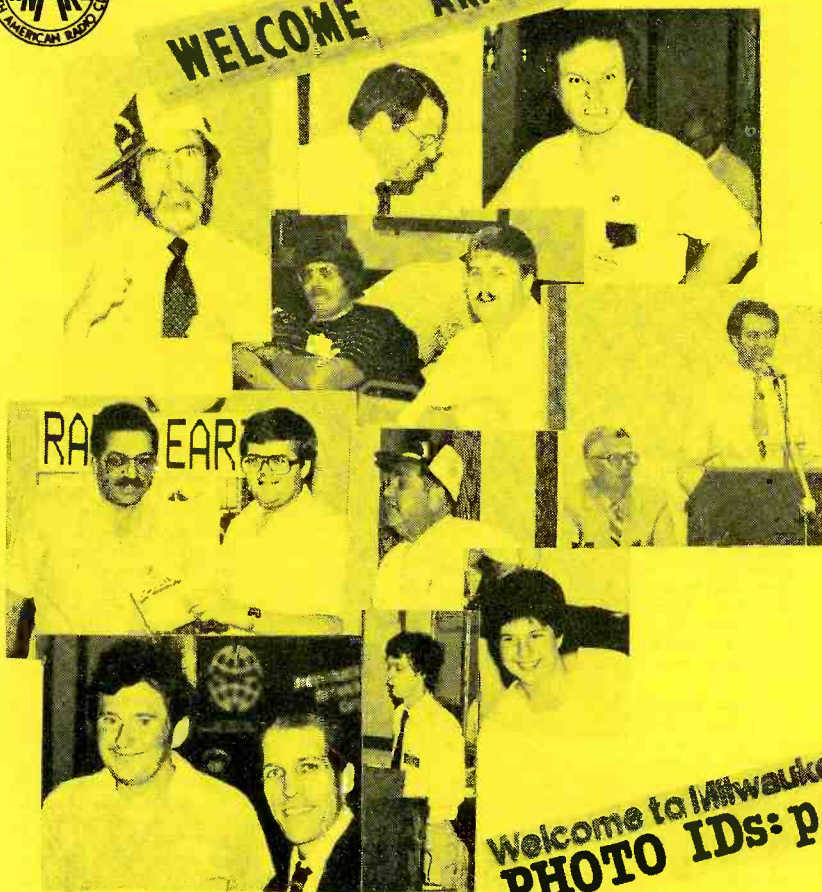

## THE SPEEDX REPORT

The Board of Directors would like to thank all those who resounded with comments, pro and con, on this topic, first raised in the July issue. The vast majority of letters expressed support for "The SPEEDX Report" as it currently exists.

It is the unanimous decision of the Board of Directors to continue to make "The SPEEDX Report" available to any station that will use it to 'promote the hobby' and 'promote SPEEDX', which are the only legitimate goals of the program. However, if a station uses "The SPEEDX Report" in a manner inconsistent with those goals, then that station's right to the program will be reconsidered. All of the international broadcasters currently using the program have agreed to and are in compliance with these goals.

Again, thanks to the approximately thirty-five members who made their opinions known. The Board of Directors now considers this matter closed, reaffirming this Society's policy to remain neutral on all issues regarding politics, religion and ideology.

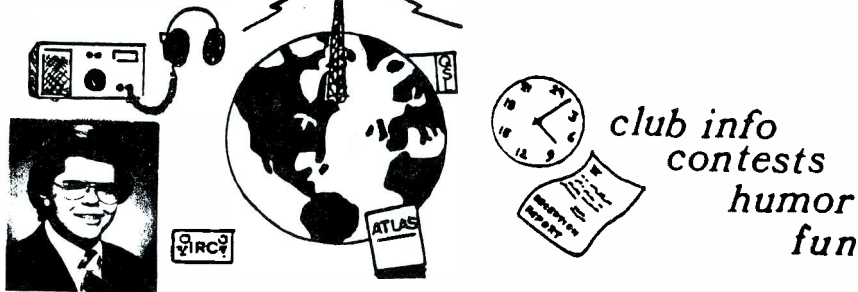

DXM Station Review: WMLK, by: Richard D'Angelo-PA: Recently, I heard a test transmission from America's newest entry into the SW spectrum- WMLK in Bethel, PA. In only three days I had a QSL verification letter and a place on their mailing list. About a week later I rcvd the May edition of "The Sacred Name Broadcaster" which had a background article on WMLK.

Upon completion WMLK will be the first SW station in the U.S. to be wholly built and operated by a nonprofit religious organization. It's only the 7th SW station in the U.S. Since most people in the United States listen to AM and FM, WMLK was built to reach an international audience.

The transmitter is a 50 kW RCA Ampliphase system that was built to transmit on the AM band. The Assemblies of Yahweh purchased the unit in 1981 and proceeded to completely dismantle the unit and recondition every component. It took about 1 year to disassemble, clean, test and catalog all the parts and reconstruct the xmtr for SW transmission.

The Assemblies of Yahweh will broadcast to the Middle East and Europe with "spiritual outreach" programs to "assist Bible students in their pursuit of understanding the Bible and scriptural truths." Low power testing has commenced and the signal strength is being increased continually until the 50 kW level is reached. WMLK invites listeners to write; their address is: c/o Assemblies of Yahweh, P.O. Box C, Bethel, PA 19507. (Tks to Richard for this station review! ds.)

VOA Plans New Service: The Voice of America is making plans for direct broadcasts to Western Europe for the first time in 30 years. "The European audience we hope to reach suffers from many misunderstandings about America; they are eager to learn more about this country," a letter sent to free-lance contributors said. The proposal came out of VOA's growing efforts to reach the so-called "successor generation" overseas which Rogene Waite, a VOA press aide, described as "the group of people in Europe that did not live through World War II..." The new service will have a small permanent staff and depend heavily on free-lance contributors. (Via the St. Petersburg Times; forwarded by John Williams-FL.) ds.)

We're sorry that we're not able to bring you our usual programmes. This is because many staff in the external services, and throughout the BBC, are striking for 24 hours. As you have heard earlier this week, this action is in protest against the decision by the BBC's Board of Governors to withdraw a television documentary about extremism in No. Ireland following a request from the British Home Secretary..." # Product Profiles

After another month of poor conditions on the HF bands, I just couldn't take it any longer, so I bought myself the Yaesu FT-209RH 2 meter HT. Really a nice radio with 10 memories and 5 watts of power. This is not a ham magazine so I won't review it here other than to say it's a darn good rig.

## YAESU FRG-8800 General Coverage Receiver

Carrying on in the tradition of the FRG-7 and the FRG-7700 is the new FRG-8800 general coverage receiver. The frequency range includes 150 Khz to 29.999 Mhz, with a 118 to 173.999 Mhz optional converter available. If desired, a special version can be ordered that excludes frequencies below 2 mhz, presumably for commercial use, so their employees who should be monitoring the business channels, won't be able to goof off a little by tuning in on Wolfman Jack.

The main tuning dial can step in 5 khz or 100 hz increments, or a numeric keypad can be used for exact frequency entry to the VFO. A 12 memory channels can hold as many frequencies and modes. A small knob near the main dial controls the fine tuning but does not affect the frequency readout. Even with this knob centered I couldn't zero beat WWV on any freq and get an accurate readout.

Receiving modes included as standard are AM, CW, LSB, USB and narrow band FM. A wide band FM unit is available at extra cost.

A large LCD screen displays the frequency, memory channel number, mode, scan function status and a graphic S meter. It occupies the center of the radio above the tuning dial for easy desktop observation. Readability across the room with LCD (liquid crystal display) is never as good as with LED's (light emitting diodes).

Thoughtfully included are not one, but two 24 hour real time clocks with a timer feature to wake up the radio from its "sleep" mode to tape record for time shift listening. The clocks keep going even with the power turned off because of the internal 5 year battery that also keeps the memory data intact.

The audio from the speaker is about the same as the FRG-7700; clear and readable. The audio power was enough to drive a pair of headphones and an RTTY demodulator with no problem. A headphone jack and a tape recorder jack is located on the front under the speaker, near the power switch and squelch control.

Scanning is done through the memory channels or between two pre-defined frequencies in the mode reception mode desired. The squelch control is a necessity for VHF FM scanning but won't be used too often for scanning the HF bands.

There is a graphic S meter that aspires to be a SINPO indicator. The DB units are scribed on the bottom of the dial with a vertical scale using a graphics bar chart to display the signal strength.

Although I only had about 3 days to borrow the radio for this review, 14 hours of hard DX'ing put the rig through its paces and left me with some very definite impressions. 3 different antenna systems were used at various times and were resonated with an MFJ transmatch.

The Yaesu FRG-8800 is a good radio for casual listening and is easy to use. The front panel layout of controls is simple with plenty of room to work one control or push one button without pushing others alongside it accidentally. I've got big fingers, you see.

Sensitivity is very good but not as good as the ICOM R71A or my reconditioned R-390. In side by side tests with a recently aligned

FRG-7, I could notice no real difference in sensitivity between the two in terms up bringing up weak stations out of the mud. In short, it has decent sensitivity, but somehow, by looking at the impressive looks of this radio you seem to expect a little more.

The radio has two bandwidths set at 6 Khz and 2.7 Khz, and for all modes except CW I found these filters to be adequate. After trying to maintain a couple of CW ham contacts on 10.125 Mhz I had to give up because there was no way to cut down on adjacent freq QRM. It was then that the lack of a notch filter and passband tuning also became conspicuous by its absence on this radio.

Much to my dismay, the FRG-8800 I used did not have the CAT computer interface installed, so I am unable to report anything about it except that it appears to be a serial port.

Standing on its own merits, the FRG-8800 is a nice desk radio with most of the features that we now expect. A good radio for the beginner or the SWL who wants something a little more dignified than a department store receiver. Once you find out that the price is only about \$100 less than the ICOM R-71A, the bang for the buck ratio and the performance percentage becomes undesirable. For the actual performance it delivers, regardless of the clocks, timers and digital readout, it's just plain overpriced at the average discounted price of \$525.00.

Readers who have the FRG-8800 radio are encouraged to contradict or confirm the above with a few sentences or a page of your prose. No doubt I have ticked a few of you off or made you wish you hadn't bought one. Perhaps the unit I used was built on a Monday morning. A copy of this review has been sent to the rep at Yaesu HQ along with the invitation for their reply, if any, to be printed here.

As always, the opinions expressed in this column are those of the writer doing the review, and not necessarily the opinion of SPEEDX.

Have you ever monitored an RTTY transmission only to get what looks like garbage? Unless your setup is buggy, it could be an encoded message or it could be in the Cyrillic alphabet which is a little different than our alphabet.

Most home computers have a utility program available to allow one to redefine the character set that gets printed on the screen. It is meant to run "transparent" over other text oriented programs such as RTTY software.

The 6th edition of the Confidential Frequency List has a section on Russian RTTY register codes. Using this information with a character generator would allow you to copy plan text Cyrillic transmissions. Even though you may not know the language it does make it easier to pick out names, call signs and the nature of the message.

RUBE GOLDBERG DEPT: An odd numbers station with a drunken sounding OM reading 4 digit groups turned up recently on 7.410. There was no apparent DTF sked and I had no intention of monitoring the radio for hundreds of hours. The signal, because of its strength, might be groundwave, and more than enough to open the squelch relay on the R71A to activate a tape recorder. No problem in taping each transmission, but how do you know what time each transmission began and ended?

My solution was to run a software time clock and voice synthesizer on my TRS-80 shack computer. The dry loop of the recorder activating relay in the R-71A was set up to activate the coils of two external relays. One relay turned the tape recorder on and off. The other sent a pulse to a joystick port which triggered the voice to speak out the time. The audio output was then patched into the tape recorder's input, along with the audio from the receiver. The result is that every recording has a voice leader and trailer announcing the GMT time and date.

Due to the intense QRN and poor propagation n 40 meters, the SPEEDX Ham Radio Net has been unable to meet regularly. We hope to get it going again in early fall when hopefully conditions will be better.

How about one of you lucky folks with an NRD 515 receiver doing a review for us? The same goes for any new radio or shack gear you may purchase. Let the rest of us know what you think of it. 73! N6LUU

## OHIO COUNTRY MUSIC ASSOCIATION QUEEN REIGNS AT WNCO AM AND FM!!

Barbara Jean Lykins, better known as B.J. the D.J. won the distinguished honor of being chosen Queen of the Ohio Country Music Association during the reign of 1973. Her story book dream come true did not stop there but went on to touch her life in other areas.

Her scepter is now a microphone as she talks to a listening audience that covers a wide area. From 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M., she is heard spinning country and western platters over WNCO FM 101.3 MHZ and again from 1:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. over WNCO AM on 1340 KHZ playing Stardust music via satellite. She loves her listeners and they love her. When she is not heard, listeners will phone the station asking about her. Other deejays filling in for her will often tell the listening audience just where she is when she goes on vacation so no one will worry about her. This was especially evident on July 3rd when she took a group of listeners to Nashville and Memphis which the station hosted. She loves the interaction she has with the listeners.

Carol Burkholder of Republic, Ohio a devoted listener to Barbara Jean described BJ the DJ as having a soft and low pleasant sounding voice that is relaxed yet containing the right amount of enthusiasm that often makes the listener picture her as always smiling.

A listener in Wellington, Ohio says, "B.J. is a very nice person. She has a deep voice and is very interesting to listen to. She gives the news, weather, community announcements and plays the best music there is".

A Pennsylvania listener tells, "She has a nice voice for radio and is fun to listen to. She often tells the listeners about the performers of the music she plays".

When asked about her experience in radio, Barbara Jean responded by saying, "I love all of my listeners. I started in radio six years ago at WNCO. I had no previous experience. I did not study broadcasting and I had no radio training. I just knew, that's what I wanted to do. I first became interested in radio while listening to Gary Gott, known as the... "Red Bird" on WNCO and later we became friends. One day he invited me to work at the station and I started right away and have been there ever since".

In addition to her on the air spots, Barbara Jean serves as the Farm Director as well as the Public Service Announcement Director at the station. She also operates the computer and does production work.

B.J. was asked what made her so successful and she simply said, "When doing my radio show, I try everyday to do the best I can because my listeners deserve the best I can give. I give them alot of music, information about the songs and the singers. I also give sports, weather and news. I like radio and I love people". Perhaps the secret of her success is her love for the listeners because they love her.

When Barbara Jean Lykins leaves the station at the end of the day, she does not forget her love of radio or music. She sings with the country and western band, John Lykins and the Better Ideas where she wears her crown and holds her microphone. When there is free time at home, BJ can be found in front of the radio listening to distant reception, a hobby shared by many.

WORLD BROADCAST STATION ADDRESS BOOK REVIEW ..... John Demmitt, PA

The fifth edition of the World Broadcast Station Address Book by a name known to many in the shortwave community, Gerry L. Dexter is available from Gilfer Associates, Inc. at a cost of \$8.95.

The smartly done book which measures 6"x9 1/4" and is approx. half an inch thick with 128 pages is bound so the complete book is flat unlike the earlier editions which were somewhat difficult to stack or keep in place when stored with other books in the DX'ers library.

The publication is arranged in an easy-to-see format with plenty of white space for the DX'er to make notes of the dates of reception and a separate column for the date of receiving the QSL. There is plenty of space for keeping a total count of the stations and QSL's you have on the inside sturdy covers.

Each entry is divided by solid lines. There is no confusion that was evident in past editions. Everything can be seen at a glance. The columns are arranged as follows:

**STATION** - This column will list the country in a dark underlined print. Next to it is the continent and in some cases, additional information is provided to locate the lesser known countries. Under a station entry is the complete name of the station, full address and the names of the verification signers. If the station uses other addresses in target areas, this information is also provided.

**GRADE** - This reference will give the QSL seeker an idea as to the chances of receiving a QSL from each of the listed stations. A grade of A suggests that chances of getting a QSL for a properly prepared report is about 90%. A D would suggest that only one out of four reports are QSL'd. An F tells the reader that a follow-up may be needed while an X shows that little is known about that stations QSL policy.

Two remaining columns are Date Heard and Date Verified which were mentioned earlier in this review.

The author in his introduction provides the reader with plenty of information that will tell how to improve his or her chances of getting the QSL's.

Plenty of QSL's and reception reports are shown throughout the publication along with charts, guides, abbreviations, etc.

LOOKING WHILE LISTENING TO SW ..... Betsy Robinson, TN

I selected brochures from countries I frequently listen to and spread them out as I listen to those countries taking note of the spelling of the cities, rivers, mountains, etc that are mentioned. The photos, maps and information adds to the flavor of the broadcasts.

DX PROGRAM OVER RSA ..... F.A. Dunlap, TX

Duke Alexander's DX Report is aired (usually the 3rd week) each month on Radio South Africa as part of the DX Corner Program. The program is aired to the USA and Canada at 0243 UTC each Sunday (UTC). A program & frequency schedule is available from RSA at PO Box 4559..... Johannesburg 2000, Republic of South Africa.

GOONIES ON SHORTWAVE ..... John Friberg, NH

John wrote TNT saying he was listening to 2940 KHZ when he heard an invite to come to the refreshment stand to pick up icy cold jumbo Coca-Cola and pop corn. To his delight, John was picking up a harmonic of a drive-in theater. Lots of great DX available in this area.

FANTASY BROADCASTING STATION RETURNS ..... Magic Man, AZ

Magic Man, owner and operator of F\*B\*S reported to TNT that he is once again back on the air. His current frequencies are; 20621 KHZ, 21533 KHZ, 23172 KHZ, 23398 KHZ and 24080 KHZ on shortwave. Those in the area of F\*B\*S may also hear Magic Man on 103.3 MHZ.

EXPERT ON BIRDS & ANTENNAS OFFERS SOLUTION ..... Ed Noll, PA.

Ed who has published books in both fields has suggested that one may be able to resolve this problem by placing one foot strips of cloth 10-20 feet apart on the antenna to keep the birds from flying into it. He also mentions that he uses black or red vinyl-covered antenna wire which is more visible than exposed copper or metal in the sky.

BASEBALL NEWS RETURNS TO CUBA ON RADIO MARTI ..... David Claytor, MI

From the Ann Arbor News in the June 8, 1985 edition comes word of sports being transmitted on the VOA's Radio Marti service to Cuba. The very first transmission of the station provided round-by-round descriptions of the Larry Holmes - Carl Williams fight until the station went off the air at shortly after 11:00 PM.

Guillermo Portuondo who use to be a sports writer in Cuba until Castro came to power is now giving four seven minute sportscasts over Radio Marti each day. He concentrates on the Cuban passions for baseball, boxing, track & field and amateur basketball and soccer.

It is thought that the New York Yankees, formerly a symbol of sports success in baseball-rich Cuba, might regain some of their lofty stature on the island as a result of the Radio Marti sports broadcasts.

RADIO MARTI GIVES U.S. LEVERAGE WITH CASTRO ..... Marc Schlossman, CA

The June 3, 1985 edition of the L.A. Times provided an interesting insight of the political aspect of Radio Marti with Cuba.

In Radio Marti, the U.S. now has a possible mechanism for leverage providing its news programming is accurate and well executed, with which to oblige Cuba to modify its behavior and ultimately avoid a possible military confrontation with the United States.

SMALLER SW RADIOS LINK AMERICANS ABROAD ..... David Claytor, MI

The Ann Arbor News on June 19, 1985 printed an article telling how convenient it is to listen to shortwave in this age where microprocessors replace the bulky equipment found in the older sets. Also mentioned is the ease of operating the radio simply by pushing buttons and watching the frequency appear on the display. The size was the biggest factor & several sets were mentioned including the Sony ICF-2010 and ICF-2002. The article went on to say how diplomats and journalists favored these sets since they could easily be carried in a small suitcase.

HIDDEN BROADCASTS ON THE FM BAND ..... David Claytor, MI

In the June 26, 1985 edition of the Ann Arbor News come word that about 1,000 of the 4,500 FM radio broadcast stations in the United States lease their subcarriers earning about \$20 million a year and expected to earn over \$100 million in 1987.


The frequency used is the unused part of the allocated frequency assignment issued by the Federal Communications Commission. For example a station transmitting on the assigned frequency of 91.5 MHz has authority to operate from 91.4 - 91.6 MHz but broadcast stations do not require that much bandwidth so a portion of the frequency that is not in use can be rented out to the business community to serve their needs.

Some of the users of the subcarrier service are Muzak, Physicians Radio Network, Mutual Satellite Services, Dow Jones and others.

With a decoder on your current receiver you are able to pick up these interesting transmissions.

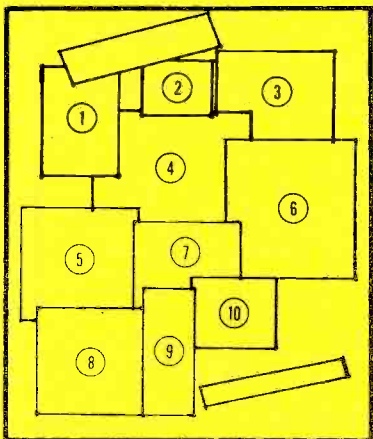
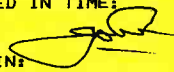
