Of all the new artists we play on The WAVE, Enya is among the most asked about. WAVE listeners have called the station asking "Who is she?". "Where did she come from?". "What language is she singing in?". To get the answers to those

auestions and others, we sought with her during her recent stay in Los Angeles.

Q: Where do you come from?

ENYA: I come from the northwest of Ireland. It's a small town called Gweedore, in County Donegal,

Q: Some of your songs are not sung in English. What language are you singing in?

ENYA: My first language is Gaelic. There are only a few areas left in Ireland where Gaelic is spoken. I consider myself one of the privileged ones, because it is such a beautiful Celtic language.

Q: What lead you to take up music as a form of expression?

ENYA: I was brought up in a musical family. I was constantly aware of music from as far back as I can remember. My grandparents used to tour. Then my parents toured, playing hits from the '50's and '60's. My Mom played the piano and my father played saxophone and fronted the band. Then my brothers and sisters

Q: So you joined your brothers and sisters ENYA: No. It wasn't for me. I went to a convent for I years and studied musical appreciation. I was doing classical piano as well. I always figured I'd be an academician. Never a performer.

Q: How did you become a performer?

ENYA: I was finally persuaded to play in the family group. They called it Clannad and I played keyboards. had a lot of fun touring Europe, but musically it wasn't what I wanted to do. So I started developing my own music. Luckily I had strong support from my producer Nicky Ryan and his wife and my best friend Roma.

Q: If you had to use one adjective to describe your music, what would it be?

ENYA: Timeless, It's music that can be played at any time. It's got modern instruments but it also has the mixture of my voice and very strong melodies. My goal is to make music that will stay and be listened to for a long

CHRIS: I used to be a singer a long time ago. I used to write lyrics, songs and ballads. But I had not used my voice at all for six or seven years. Then one day when I was writing I found myself creating lyrics. I figured why not? "Walk With Me" and "Where The Angels Fly" were the

Q: Has living all over the world helped your

CHRIS: Without a doubt. My creativity is the sum total of ny experience. Having had the experience of living in different countries within a variety of cultures has had a strong influence on my music. I feel fortunate that a new openess towards universal consciousness and international music is happening right now. I feel very clear about expressing my ethnic roots. In my musical structures what naturally comes out is a romantic. European flavor.

Q: These days you're spending a lot of time in Los Angeles. How does it feel to hear your music on The WAVE?

CHRIS: It's really a thrill. I go back to when I originally recorded the music. I was very much alone with my inspirations. I was in a space where I was not watching TV. I was not listening to the radio. I wasn't even listening to albums. So as I'm driving down Sunset Boulevard stuck in traffic and I hear "Walk With Me" or "Where The Angels Fly" — I look at the cars around me and I wonder "Who else is hearing this?". I wonder what they're feeling. Are they feeling the warmth and the love that I felt when I was putting the song together? I can't be sure if they do or not, but I'm sure that's a part of it.


