



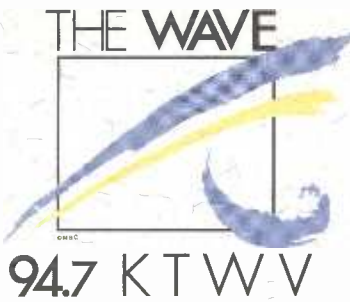

DAVID SANBORN

Fifteen years ago, David Sanborn sent Warner Brothers Records a demo tape which included the Leon Russell song "This Masquerade." The demo worked - he got a record deal. At about the same time, Tommy LiPuma had come on-board at Warner Brothers as a producer. He heard the Sanborn demo and thought "This Masquerade" would sound great on the George Benson album he was about to produce. Benson had a huge hit with it, and David didn't include the song on his first record with the label. So here it is, 1995 and David's latest album, "Pearls," on Elektra Records, is all interpretations of some of his

favorite songs. "This Masquerade" is included, and Tommy LiPuma, now President of GRP Records, is co-producer.

The saxophone is such an expressive instrument that a player's particular sound is referred to as their voice. David's voice is one of sophistication and passion. His musicianship and phrasing enable him to go from jazz to R&B to funk and blues - all the while sounding unmistakably Sanborn. On "Pearls" he chose a musical backdrop big enough to satisfy even his musical appetite. For the first time in his 27 year career the alto saxophonist shared the recording studio with a 60 piece orchestra. The result is an inspired collection of songs that range from chestnuts from the thirties to the title track, an interpretation of an emotionally charged song that appears on Sade's latest album.

"I think emotion is the cornerstone of everything I've done," says Sanborn. "I think

good music, any style of music, reaches people in a direct, heartfelt way. If people have heard a distinct quality in my sound throughout the years, it's been on that emotional kind of level."

Producer Tommy LiPuma is a master at capturing emotion in the recording

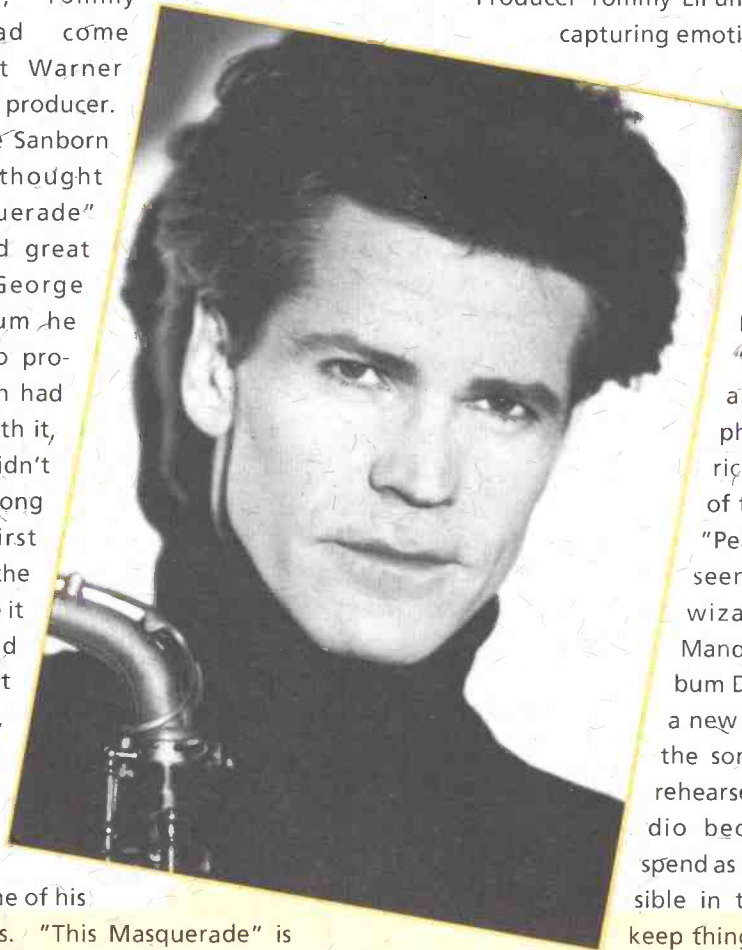
studio.

Along with his work with George Benson, he is the maestro who made Natalie Cole's "Unforgettable" an international phenomenon. The rich arrangements of the ten songs on "Pearls" were overseen by orchestral wizard Johnny Mandel. On this album David had to find a new way to rehearse the songs. "Normally I rehearse outside the studio because I like to spend as little time as possible in there. I like to keep things fresh and just

do it.

But when you have a 60 piece orchestra to consider you just can't find a place and say 'Let's rehearse.'" Sanborn did keep his signature quick recording style, however. "We recorded 'Pearls' in four days," laughs Sanborn. "But we were trying to keep in mind how a lot of these songs were recorded originally. A lot of material in the thirties and forties was recorded in as long a time as it took to sing it."

Sanborn is touring this summer, guesting with various symphonies around the country. The five-time Grammy winner says the challenge of playing with some of the greatest orchestras in the world should keep his creative juices flowing. "Playing this material with these orchestras would be a dream job for any musician." You can see David's dream come true August 4th at the Greek Theatre.

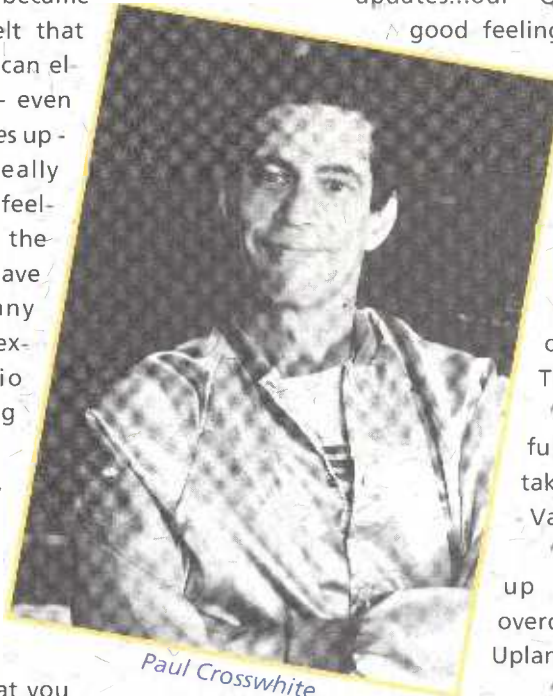

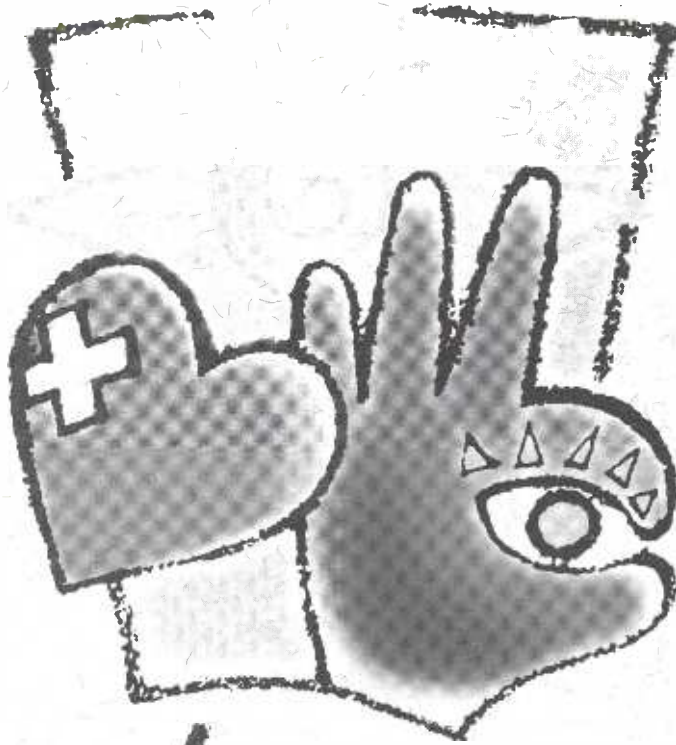

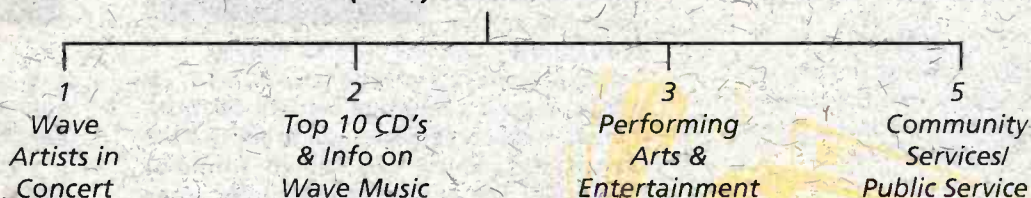

THE WAVE'S MUSIC NOTES

"The WAVE's MusicNotes", offers insight into the people behind the music heard on The WAVE.

Before becoming a solo artist, before his previous job fronting **The Police**, back when **Sting** was only a teenager, he was in a group called the Ronnie Pearson Trio. He was the bass player when they were the house band for the Princess Cruise Line, a.k.a. "The Love Boats." His latest project is a return to his nautical roots, sort of. He recorded the soundtrack to "The Living Sea" which was filmed for Imax Theatres. The soundtrack includes some recordings of his previous works.

After 25 years and 14 albums, **Tower Of Power** is probably best known for it's horn section. **Huey Lewis & The News** stole the section away for three years of touring, one of dozens of rock bands who have had their sound punched up by that famous big brass sound. The guy who stood at the very end of the Tower horn section is the one responsible for all the arrangements. His name is **Greg Adams** and the day after he left the band he was offered a solo deal by Epic Records. "Hidden Agenda" is his first album as a solo artist, and as you would expect, it is smooth,

sophisticated and packs some power.

Saxophonist **Sam Riney** has four great albums that have been the source of frustration for many WAVE listeners for some time now. His former record label went away and so did the albums. Fortunately, the albums have recently been re-issued on the Sin-Drome label and are back in stores.

The new **Lee Ritenour** and **Larry Carlton** collaboration, "Larry & Lee" showcases two of the most revered guitarists in contemporary jazz. Lee is featured on the right side of the mix and Larry is featured on the left side of the mix. Adjust your stereo system accordingly.

Guitarist **Chieli** (pronounced KEY-elly) **Minucci** co-founded the group **Special EFX** with percussionist **George Jinda**. After Jinda branched out to make two albums with his solo project, **World News**, it was only a matter of time for Minucci's solo debut. Chieli's album is appropriately titled "Jewels" on the JVC label.
