KYOK will become the second Houston area radio station and the first Black Formatted AM station in the country to begin broadcasting in AM stereo.

KYOK will be on in stereo for two days starting this Sunday (October 17) for two days of testing and evaluation and then back on in stereo permanently approximately one week later.

WILLIE DAVIS - Owner and President

Willie Davis, the former All-American and Hall of Fame Football Great has purchased KYOK. Mr. Davis studied under the guidance of Vince Lombardi for some ten years and during that time received four world championship crowns.

Mr. Davis now owns a total of four radio stations: KACE-FM, Los Angeles; WLUM-FM/WAWA-AM, Milwaukee; KQIN-AM, Seattle and his most resent acquisition KYOK-AM, Houston.

In addition to Mr. Davis' radio station ownerships, he owns Willie Davis Schlitz Distributing Company in Los Angeles, part owner of a school supply office and is on three boards of directors - Schlitz, Fireman's Fund and Alliance Bank (an institute he helped found).

JIM MADDOX - Vice President and General Manager

.....Jim Maddox is the gentleman who was responsible for the successful programming at KMJQ/Majic 102 FM.

In 1977, Maddox was asked to be a consultant at Majic 102 FM, where he eventually became Majic 102's general manager....and the rest is history.

After Mr. Maddox had fulfilled his obligations at Majic 102, he went on to WBMX, Chicago to achieve major success.

Mr. Maddox has brought his expertise back to Houston - and is now applying his MAGIC at 1590 KYOK.

RICK ROBERTS - Operations Director

Rick Roberts, a native Houstonian, began his broadcast career in 1961 at KYOK. Rick Roberts has been an announcer, music director, program director and is now KYOK's operations manager.

Travis topped all announcers in the country with the 1979 Billboard Air Personality of the Year Award. A true professional and one of the finest voices in Houston, Travis can be heard from 6:00AM-10:00AM Monday through Saturday on the all new KYOK.
