




This is the first page of the Texas Ranger's new WDAY Radio Album and he hopes that you enjoy the book and that it will bring you many happy hours and also fond memories.


DOROTHY BLAKE LAVIN Secretary




HAZEL JOHNSON of WDAY


PAUL SCHLATTER Operator


GEORGE KOVELL Operator


CHARLES SNYDER




HARRY (Dad) HANCE Custodian


STUDIO LOBBY


MARY LOU


PEGGY LEE


ANDY ANDERSON


CHARLIE AND CEDRIC
