



# Exclusive Interview... PERRY COMO ON TOUR

Interviewed by AL HAM

At 71, Perry Como is tanned, cleareyed, and always ready to break into a sparkling smile. Born Pierino Como in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, Perry was the seventh son of a seventh son, and although that fact was supposed to bring him great luck, it seems that Perry made his own luck and his own breaks, and became a superstar by simply being himself.

Perry has been a barber, a band singer, a radio singer, a recording star, a movie star, and a television superstar. He lives most of the year in West Palm Beach, Florida, where he plays golf, enjoys his family life, and, on occassion, even cuts hair...his grandchildren's. "They're terrible

tippers," he grins.

One of the wonders of Como's remarkable career is his splendid voice. It hasn't changed a whit over the halfcentury Perry has been a professional singer. It's a bit deeper and richer. but Perry can still go for the high ones and hit them cleanly and with plenty of power. That melodious voice will be on display this summer when Perry takes to the road with a retrospective of one of the most satisfying and rich careers in entertainment. Called, simply, "Perry Como, 50 Golden Years," the show will feature the music of Perry's life. It will, of course, also feature The "Music Of Your Life."

Al Ham met with Perry to talk about the tour, the golden anniversary, and the state of popular music in general. What follows are the minutes of that exclusive interview.

Al Ham: "Perry Como, 50 Golden Years" is going to hit the road this Spring, is that correct?

Perry Como: We start off the end of May, so we're going to do 8 to 10 weeks, depending on how long my body holds up. We're going to do a thing like you do. It'll be "Music Of Your life," but it's the Music of My Life for the past 50 years. That's what it boils down to.

Al Ham: Perry, have you firmed up where you'll be playing?



Perry Como: Yes. May 26th we start at the Sundome in Arizona. May 29th to June 3rd, we're in Westbury, Long Island. Incidentally, Mickey (Glass, Perry's associate—ed.) is getting all kinds of conversation about maybe doing extra shows, which kind of pleases me. Valley Forge on June 10th. Erie Crown in Chicago on June 12th to the 17th. From June 19th to the 24th, we're at the Carleton West Genessee in Bloomington, Minnesota. I've never been there before.

Al Ham: Do you get into the heart of the country?

Perry Como: Oh, yes. We have June 26th to July 1st at the Fox Theater in St. Louis. I've never been in it, but I'm told it's a very lovely theater. Then we go to the Premium Theater in Detroit July 6th and 7th. After that, we go to the Garden State which is a nice theater, July 9th to the 14th. After that, we go up to the South Shore Music Circus in Cohasset, Massachusetts. And that's a great theater.

Al Ham: That's in the arcade?

Perry Como: Yes. Then it's on to Saratoga Performing Arts Center, then Broom County Arena in Bloomington, then we go to Cleveland. After that, we'll see if we're still talking to each other and maybe we'll keep on going.

Al Ham: Do you look forward to hitting any of those cities again? I mean, do any have special memories for you?

Perry Como: I'm looking forward to Cleveland, the first band I was ever with was from Cleveland. You know, I got a big thrill one day recently. I got a phone call from a young boy from Minneapolis. He said "You don't know who I am; you probably don't even remember me?" So I said, "Well, that's a good place to start. Who are you?" He told me he was Freddy Carlone's son. Now Freddy led the first band I was with, from 1932 to 1935. And this is his son speaking to me. The boy said then that he had someone there who wanted to speak to me, and his father came on the line. Well, needless to say, each of us held the phone for a couple of minutes and there was nothing coming out. Imagine...we went back 52 years! That's a damn lifetime, isn't it?

Al Ham: It sure is, Perry.

Perry Como: We old folks hang on a little longer.

Al Ham: Perry, you were talking earlier about your tour being the Music of Your Life. How do you feel about the radio concept we call The "Music of Your Life?"

Perry Como: Well, I have to like it naturally, and I do like it because it's part of my life. You guys are really bringing back a lot of memories as far as I'm concerned. I go back quite a few years, as you know. And about half the songs I don't even remember recording. Do you believe that?

Al Ham: I do, Perry. But how do you feel about having your old and your new records guaranteed their place on the air?

Perry Como: It's a big kick to me, Al. It really is. Now, how long has this been going on?

Al Ham: 6 years now, believe it or not. You were one of the very first

In "Those Swinging Years" Luise King Rey also observes that the good days are "coming back on radio. In every city in the United States the old tunes are being played and we are hearing the big, beautiful sounds of the big bands!"-You're so right Luise!

### ARE THE BIG BANDS COMING BACK?



Veteran band booker Willard Alexander thinks so. In a recent conversation with Al Ham, Mr. Alexander said, "People say the band business is not coming back. I have to argue with them about that because they're not up on their statistics. For example, in your radio shows, I'm sure there would not be a demand for the music that you're giving them unless someone really wanted it. You can't do anything without an audience.

"When Benny Goodman was launched, we didn't at that time think of a 'swing era'. Some people feel that it was a staged thing when Benny played the Paramount Theater-that we had actually hired public relations people to stage the dancing in the aisle. I say without reservation—that's a bunch of crap!

"We didn't hire anybody. That was a genuine spontaneous reaction! People got excited. They got up and started to dance. The same thing happened when Sinatra played the Paramount. Sinatra blew out his audience and there was an audience there all the time for it.

"When Goodman started to break open the parade, other bands — Dorsey, Shaw, Basie, Miller — all followed. These people were all struggling when Goodman was struggling. The public reacted. We didn't create the audience. It was there all the time. We attracted the audience and got it interested.

"I think the same thing is going to happen again. There is an audience out there that is supporting big bands. They're in Philadelphia, they're in Wilmington, Delaware...they're all over!"





### The Glen Island Casino Returns To Life!

"And now, from the bandstand of the beautiful Glen Island Casino overlooking Long Island Sound in New Rochelle, New York, it's the music of..."

And you can plug in a memorybook of the great names in the big band world: Glenn Miller, Ozzie Nelson, Woody Herman, Larry Clinton, Glen Gray and the Casa Loma Orchestra, Charlie Barnet, Les Brown, Claude Thornhill, Charlie Spivak, Hal McIntyre...

The Dorsey Brothers had their famous final flare-up on the bandstand at Glen Island Casino in 1935, and went their separate ways to stardom.

Glenn Miller played there the entire summer of 1939, starting his engagement on May 17th as a promising young band and finishing the summer as the hottest band in the land!

Early this year, the Glen Island bandstand rocked to the sounds of one of the greatest big bands of all making its Glen Island Casino debut: Artie Shaw. The beauty of the newly-refurbished ballroom shared newspaper and TV space with the excitement of the new Artie Shaw Band.

Something wonderful had happended, twice. A great band and a great ballroom had returned to the scene.

Glen Island Casino began in the latter part of the last century as a restaurant for the crowds that came to enjoy the amusements and the shore at New Rochelle. It was built so solidly, that when the Westchester Park Commission acquired the property in 1929, it was not razed. Instead, it was remodeled in a plantation style as a restaurant.

When Prohibition was repealed in 1932, the building opened as a ballroom with Ozzie Nelson's Orchestra on the stand.

With network radio wires into the Casino, national popularity was virtually assured for any band that played there.

In 1939, as a classic example, Glenn Miller's band was booked in for the entire summer. The band opened May 17 and played through August 23rd. During that time a couple of extraordinary things happened. The Miller band recorded an instrumental that Artie Shaw had tried for several months with no success, and struck pay dirt with it. In The Mood became one of the anthems of the Swing Era, and even little kids could hum its licks.

The other event happened when vocalist Marion Hutton collapsed on the bandstand on a warm July 22nd night and had to be hospitalized until August 1st. Sixteen-year-old Kay Starr was flown in from Memphis, Tenn., to pinch hit for Marion. It was Kay's first big national break (the radio broadcasts...remember?), and her first opportunity to cut records with a name band. Which she did with Baby Me and Love with a Capital "You."

Glenn was so pleased with his long stand at the ballroom by the Sound that he immortalized it with an Eddie Durham instrumental,





# FRANK SINATRA GEMS REDISCOVERED

This column was born when I heard Linda Ronstadt's version of "What's New," and decided to hear again the Frank Sinatra version. Not to compare them, because different singers do different things.

I was so delighted with "rediscovering" Frank's version, that I set about playing a lot of our collection at random, gathering some new impressions of old friends along the way.

HERE'S THAT RAINY DAY—From the Capitol album, No One Cares, this Johnny Burke-Jimmy Van Heusen jewel is sung with a good strong bottom range, great projection, and with beautiful vocal texture. And the way Frank lets the word "cold" twist and bite at the end is a shocking reminder of the bittersweet nature of the song.

I DON'T STAND A GHOST OF A CHANCE WITH YOU—Again Sinatra is sure and resonant at the low end, and he uses vibrato masterfully to bring the lyrics alive. A further definition of the term "torch song" from Capitol's No One Cares, and a basic primer in pronunciation for anyone who ever sings in public.

I'M A FOOL TO WANT YOU—Recorded for Columbia on March 27, 1951, this song to me is the most passoniate of all the songs Sinatra has recorded. The electricity is there from the opening Sinatra note. And the voice is in transition; midway between the youthful big band Sinatra sound and the deeper, mature Sinatra sound of the Capitol years ahead. The climax is shattering. I can't hear this recording without feeling the

hairs rise on the back of my neck. A clear indication of the emotional performances that lay ahead.

MEMORIES OF YOU-From the Capitol Point of No Return, arranged and conducted by Axel Stordahl, this performance really made me stagger. I don't believe I'd played this album for 10 years. But I've played this song about 20 times since I rediscovered it, and the impact of it does not diminish. Now, everyone has favorite Sinatra performances (mine has long been a toss up between Dancing on the Ceiling and Change Partners), and the most-played Sinatra recording are considered his classics. But Memories of You deserves to be on everyone's list. Sinatra is in complete command. His bottom notes are full and resonant; the top notes ringing and rich. Yet nowhere is there any strain or any sense of pushing. And this vocal projection is a wonder. This song has a tough, demanding melody line, but Sinatra sings it easily and magnificently. A brassy orchestral interlude and a key change follow his first chorus, then Sinatra returns to sing a totally unexpected melodic variation of the last eight bars that will curl (or straighten) the hair of anyone alive enough to react to beauty-guaranteed! This performance is now my all-time favorite Sinatra performance. But the best part is that there are bound to be more "rediscovered" gems in our collection, and I can't wait to get to them. Maybe I'll find another all-time favorite.!

### Perry Como Interview...

Perry Como: I've got to say one thing: you sure play enough of my music. Where I live now, some of the people accuse me of owning some of the stations.!

Al Ham: The incredible part right now is that through all these years, you have had a major record label. Do you know that half of your peer group is not on records?

Perry Como: Well, a lot of them get a little unhappy and uncomfortable. I have a big investment in me, and RCA also has a big investment in me. Forty years is a long time. There is a lot of stuff there that sells every year; other boys don't have that. I've got the luxury of saying that I have 25, 30 albums, and things that sell every year.

Al Ham: For many years, singers like Tony Bennett, Vic Damone, Steve Lawrence, Billy Eckstine, and many others were unable to get recording contracts. Are you glad that the good music singers at last have found a place to be heard on radio?

Perry Como: Very much so. From all the conversation that I hear, and I'm not painting anything for you because you know what the numbers are, now they're listening to it. People over 35 or 40, they like to turn on the radio and hear some of the stuff that they can identify with, rather than what's being played today. There's a lot of good music out there, there really is, but it's so jumbled in with all that other stuff. I call it the 2 guitar lessons by mail and then give

it hell. Really, Richard Rodgers had a great line for what happened in music. He said this 10 years ago. He said, "This is the era of mediocrity. The kids can't play their instruments, they don't know anything about music, they buy a \$3 guitar and go in the bathroom and make a record and it sells nine million." It's crazy, but it's true.

Al Ham: But there are a good many young people in your audiences; how do you think they relate to your music?

Perry Como: I've been asked that question and I don't have an answer. I want to find an answer. You see them in the audience, and you'd think my audience would be the same group that Lawrence Welk has. But every now and then I'll pick out a youngster and ask how old he is. Usually he'll say he's 15. And I say "What the hell are you doing here? Is this your penance for the week?" But they say they enjoy what I'm doing. I can never really believe that because they're supposed to be out there listening to the Rolling Stones or whatever. But I think they are not ashamed of coming to hear me or Frank or any of my generation of singers. These kids are getting to the point where they're happy to hear a great song. Maybe even hungry to hear one.

### Glen Island Casino...

Glen Island Special, recorded on Bluebird and re-issued several times on LP.

The following year, another up and coming band got its first major national chance at the Casino. Les Brown and the Band of Renown were featured, with their vocalist, the pretty blonde youngster named Doris Day.

World War Two, with rationing and band personnel problems, helped speed the demise of both the big bands and the Casino. Bandleader Shep Fields took it over and renovated the interior right after the War. From 1948 to Spring of 1981, the Casino limped along with weekend dates and even rock concerts to pay the freight. Finally, it just closed, and stayed shuttered down for three years.

The current management put more than \$3,000,000 into renovations. The original Plantation-style Casino on the 26-acre waterfront site has been restored and redecorated. The Casino's original 60 by 124 foot dance floor has been retained.

Casino musical director Tony Cabot, himself a former RCA Records bandleader and recording artist, promises excellence in dance music. "It won't be a place for bands to learn their trade," Mr. Cabot said recently. "But if they can convince us they deserve to play at the casino, they'll play there."

Launched anew by the new Artie Shaw Band, The Glen Island Casino has been moving ahead on the planned track — catering to parties and luncheons and paying the bills, while hosting top quality bands and singing acts in short stays and weekend appearances. The road back is always difficult, and especially so in an era dominated by music of a totally different taste.

But if the enthusiasm that greeted both Artie Shaw's band and the Glen Island Casino's ambience is any indication, we could again be hearing that once-familiar introduction: "And now, from the beautiful shore of Long Island Sound at New Rochelle, the lovely Glen Island Casino proudly presents...."




