

The new year marks the 200th anniversary of the death of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. Classical music lovers worldwide will commemorate the bicentennial year with a wide range of events including major concerts and productions. Mozart, arguably the greatest musical genius to have lived, the man and his music will be remembered on WWFM with a generous helping of his works during the next two months (and through the year.) In particular, you can enjoy his symphonies each weekday morning with Jack Perlstein. We'll also air each of his 27 Piano Concertos during Afternoon Classics, plus other selected works sprinkled throughout our broadcast.

Two new orchestra broadcasts make their debuts on WWFM this month. Concerts by the Minnesota Orchestra begin January 13 at 4 p.m. and continue each Sunday for the next 26 weeks. Music Director Edo de Waart has planned an exciting series featuring everything from Telemann to the twentieth century. Highlights include two operas, Verdi's Falstaff and Mussorgsky's Boris Godunov, Mahler's Second and Sixth Symphonies and Bruckner's Eighth.

Conductor Hugh Wolff is well-known in New Jersey and Minnesota, where he's Principal Conductor of the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra. We're pleased to bring you 26 concerts from the orchestra's 22nd season each Friday morning at 10. Together with Director of Music Christopher Hogwood and Creative Chair John Harbison, Maestro Wolff and the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra offer an entertaining collection of concerts.

WWFM offers something for the very young (and maybe old alike!) in CLAS-SICS FOR CHILDREN. This series helps to make classical music more easily understandable by telling about the people who created this immortal music. Six programs focus on Bach, Handel, Mozart, Haydn, Beethoven and Brahms.

In the personnel department we say good-bye to part-time announcer/board operator Lee Kohns, and wish him well in his new Florida home. We welcome back Janine Kallgren-Miller (after her maternity leave) and say hello to our new Saturday Classics announcer Dennis Moore (of the Beethoven Satellite Network, Chicago).
